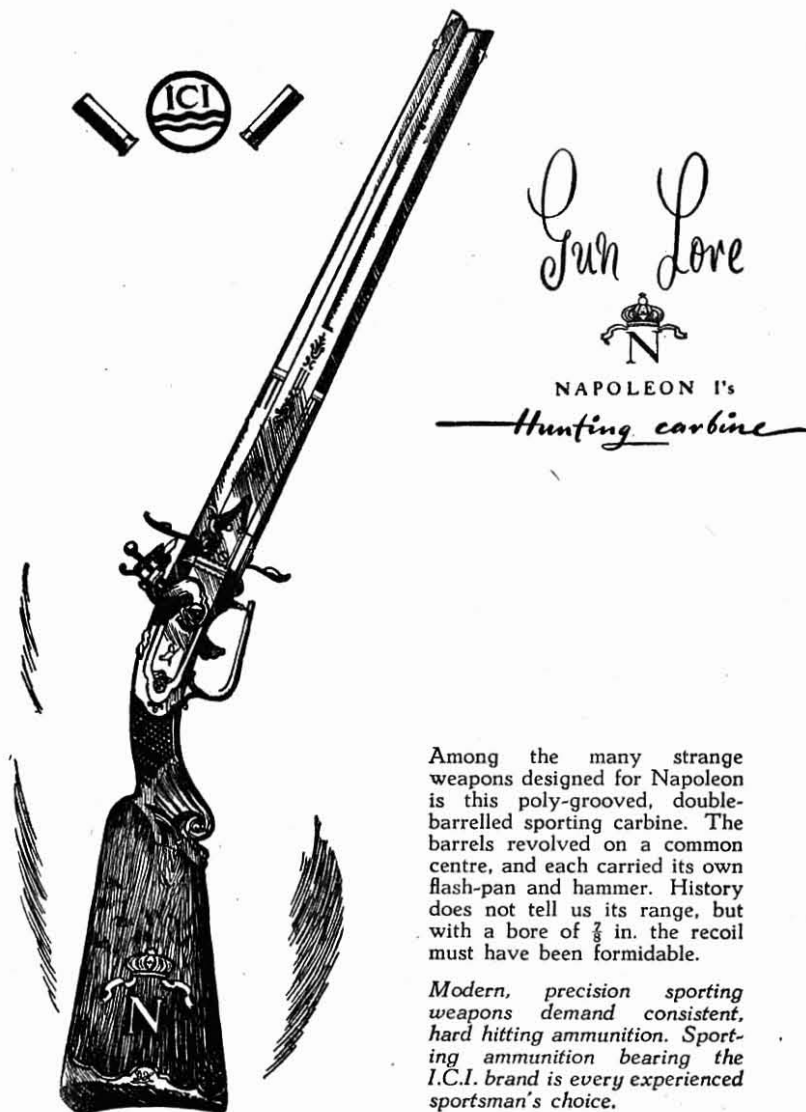

THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

The importance and popularity of clay pigeon shooting as a national pastime has never been better exemplified than during the recent Association Champion of Champions Cup and International meeting at East Burwood (Victoria).

Included were competitors from all Eastern Australian States, from as far north as Townsville, and as far south as Hobart. During the series no fewer than 220 guns took part. An all time record for any type of trap shooting in Australia.

The spectacular individual efforts of H. R. Donnelly (Bruthen) and J. A. McCraith (Essendon) were worthy of the great occasion and those privileged to see these fine shooters in action will long remember their sterling performances. Donnelly and McCraith, collectively, had 300 clay pigeons released to them in the two major events, they missed only nine birds out of the aggregation. In the Champion of Champions Cup, Donnelly stopped 49/50 and McCraith 48/50, whilst in the International contest McCraith grassed 98/100 and Donnelly 96/100—such scores have seldom been

bettered anywhere in the British Empire.

The Association will hold its final shoot for the season on King's Birthday Holiday, June 14th on the Blackburn Club's grounds at East Burwood—ground use again by kind permission of the Club.

The two main events will be the revival of the important pre-war "Intermediate Championship"—a 20 bird championship contest restricted to shooters whose Association handicap does not exceed 16 yards. This will be followed by a £100 Handicap for Association registered shooters. The winner will receive £40 in cash plus a trophy valued at 12/10/-. Association official handicaps will be in use throughout. During the shooting of the Intermediate Championship, in the forenoon, provision has been made for back-markers to enjoy a series of sweepstake events. The £100 Handicap will follow after lunch.

Shooting sportsmen throughout the Commonwealth will regret to learn that Mr. W. P. Grosvenor, the famed English shooting authority and coach,

SUNDAY SHOOTING

Many New South Wales Clubs are unhappy about the restrictions placed upon the holding of properly organised clay pigeon shoots on Sunday. Secretary, Les O'Donaghue of the Bathurst Club, has forwarded the following letter—

"I am forwarding you copy of a circular which our Club has distributed to clay pigeon shooting clubs throughout N.S.W. in the hope of having this antiquated law amended. We would be very grateful if you would endeavour to give this matter a little publicity through Association "News," hoping that it will create similar interest in other States."

Copy of the circular mentioned follows:—

"Our Club would like to bring the following matter before you,

and in turn we sincerely trust that you will do your best to have the subject discussed in your club and individually take same up with your local Member of Parliament.

"The Bathurst Club, after careful consideration, has decided to make an effort, along with the co-operation of all gun shooters and gun clubs throughout N.S.W., to have the Act amended to allow Sunday shooting. This means taking into consideration the Police Offence Act No. 5 of 1901, Section 19, prohibiting the use of firearms on Sunday.

"With this object in view, we are circulating throughout the State a copy of the proposed amendment, with the request that Officials of each Club, and individuals, make representation to their State Member of Parliament, and that a copy of this proposed amendment be attached, with the request that it be given consideration, with the object of allowing Clay Pigeon Shooting Clubs, like all other Sporting Bodies, to be legally entitled to enjoy their chosen sport on Sundays.

"We trust you will give this matter your immediate attention and have the proposed amendment presented to the correct quarter at your earliest opportunity."

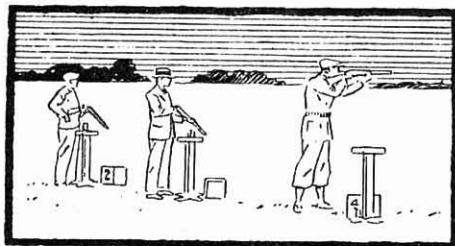

AROUND THE CLUBS AND MEETINGS....



ATHERTON G. C. (Q.).—John McDonald has taken over the secretarial reins at Atherton (Q.) from F. Gay. The club has applied for the North Queensland Mixed Birds and North Queensland Deauville Doubles titles for 1948. These will be shot on dates to be fixed.

BARELLAN G. C. (N.S.W.).—E. E. Alberts and Jack Semmler are the men behind the effort to reform the Barellan Club which has been in recess since early days of the war period. This was one of the pioneer organisations affiliated with the A.C.P.T.S.A. and it is hoped that Barellan will return to its former status. Cartridge supplies will govern the re-organisation details.

BERRIMA DIST. G. C. (Bowral, N.S.W.).—The South Coast and Tablelands D.B. Championship will be shot at Wongabri Corner on December 11. Details will be advertised later in "News." The Club's monthly meeting report is that augmented membership is noted at every meeting. The Club's most recent shooting series brought shooters from Sydney, Goulburn, Wollongong and Bathurst. Secretary, W. A. Palmer, advises that his members prefer to shoot for trophies rather than cash, although all club events have an attached sweepstake. Sid Lamb, of Goulburn presented a special trophy for novices to be shot over three meetings. Results were—No. 1, 10 birds, D.B., div. S. Lamb (Goulburn) and J. Berry (Hornsby) 15/15. No. 2, 5 birds, div. A. Shepherd and M. Fuller 10/10. No. 3, Novice, S. Lamb Cup (first round), G. Robinson 5/5,

BLACKBURN CLUB (V.).—Due to the Blackburn Club's generous co-operation with the Association the club was restricted to one Saturday shoot during April. On the club's regular alternate Saturday the entire grounds were placed at the service of the A.C.P.T.S.A. for its big fixture. DENILQUIN G. C. (N.S.W.).—Denilquin Club and its strong band of enthusiasts are not too happy in their allocation of weather conditions for championship meetings. At the big fixture in October indifferent weather prevailed and again last month when the club staged the Commonwealth Mixed Birds Championship it was unfortunate enough to strike the first real break since the summer and the autumn rains poured down unceasingly. Daly, the Denilquin President, was runner-up, 13/20, and his brother Ted Daly third 12/20. The local shooters Fred Robertson and J. Howe tied for the forward mark prize. Daly was top scorer in a £50 Handicap 19/20, and John Bryant (Jnr.), Frank Brown and John Houston (Hay) cut a £20 Handicap on the opening day.

GILGANDRA G. C. (N.S.W.).—The biggest clay pigeon shoot ever held in Western New South Wales was conducted by the Gilgandra Club last month. Nearly 50 shooters competed. Gross takings over two days amounted to over £500. Gilgandra Hospital, Public School Library and

MYERS FLAT G. C. (Vict.)—Bill Santon, well known secretary at Myers Flat Club advises that his organisation intends introducing a modern down-the-line and skeet lay-out. In pre-war years some good clay pigeon shoots were held on these grounds and with a modern ground big events can be looked forward to in the future. The club has re-affiliated.

NHILL G. C. (Vict.)—Clay pigeon shooting in the Wimmera District (Victoria) will be revived when the Nhill Club shoots the two (double and single) Wimmera Championships on the local enclosure. L. G. Love (brother of the 1939 International high-gun shot Athol Love) is the Nhill Club secretary.

ROCKHAMPTON G. C. (Q.)—An automatic trap has been installed at Rockhampton with a reinforced concrete trap house. It was used for the first time last month when the club conducted the single barrel Championship. Ken Moffat the club's efficient Secretary was returned winner 16/20, from J. Harris 14/20, and W. Black third. The latter won the trophy for the best 12 yard shooter, 14/20. B. Woolf and W. Black combined well to win the Deauville Doubles event 4/4 pairs. Clay Pigeon Shooting in Cairo

(By Leo. Ridge, Deniliquin, N.S.W.)

After escaping from Greece in 1941 I managed to secure 8 days leave in Cairo. Being a student of form and on the look out for something to do, I noticed in an Egyptian paper that clay pigeon shoots were held each Monday, Wednesday and Friday at Shoubra, a few miles out of Cairo. Journeying out to Shoubra I received a most hearty welcome—apparently everybody was pleased to see Australian shooters. An Englishman, a Mr. Evans, who used a Purdey fitted with Beretta Stainless Steel Barrels, kindly gave me permission to use his gun whilst I was there. I thoroughly enjoyed three days of good shooting, without winning, although I managed to get expenses plus each day.

Clay pigeon shooting I found to be very cheap at Shoubra. The principle adopted there is as follows, each shooter is required to lodge £1 covering all his nomination fees for the day, that also included 2¾" cartridges and clay pigeons. All events were either missout or double-rise and rarely went beyond three rounds. The winner received £1. When the shoot is over the secretary calls up all competitors in order of names on the board and collects all cartridges not used. For example, say Evans had started with two boxes and his record showed 32 shots for the day, the secretary would say "Mr. Evans, 18 cartridges please." This made for cheap shooting. For instance, 7 events, £7 prize money, clays £6, cartridges £10, shooters 35, leaving balance of £12 for club. (If club showed £3/10/ profit per day, £10

per week would be a very financial club). Not much prize money, but they run a Pari-Mutuel a French type of totalisator with a 2/- minimum investment. They employ stewards whose wages would be light, but they make good sums from tips. My friend Mr. Evans proved a very worthy adviser and as a result I was close to the winners with my bets all the time.

They only serve soft refreshments, hard stuff was barred as a result of a shooting accident some years ago. Monsieur George, President of the Club and manager of Mena House hotel, provided the afternoon teas and gave us a further effusive welcome when we visited his hotel later.

I might mention that the shooting tracks are arranged one track with foot release on each yard—that is as one stepped on the mark he placed his foot on the button which had two pressures. This enabled one to get nicely set, then with a slight lean forward and foot pressure the clay would be released. I found this principle greatly speeded up shooting and obviated any confusion about a puller not hearing the call.

After one had finished shooting spacious lounge chairs were provided and shooters merely had to beckon a steward who would place a bet. It was shooting de-luxe.

I notice in Association "News," No. 1139, G. Gall (Moree). On one of the days I was shooting there was a Gerry Gall from N.S.W. present. That would seem to be the same sportsman, so I hope he reads this—best regards to you Gerry. Another really good shooter I met there was named Edwards, a member of the Egyptian Air Force. He told me he was coming out to Australia after the war and intended living in Queensland.

THE ASSOCIATION

Champion of Champions Cup - - Dinner - - International

The 1948 Champion of Champions Cup, 50 birds from 18 yards, on April 24, shot for the first time over the Blackburn Club's East Burwood lay-out, had the unique distinction of being the first major contest in the Commonwealth to be decided over three automatic traps. It also enjoyed the further distinguishing aspect of attracting a field of 128 guns—this again being an Australian record.

The only feature in the preliminary estimates of attendance and satisfactory running of the meeting which were in any way disturbing to Association officials was the possibility of wet weather. The Association has been singularly unfortunate since the resumption of competitive shooting in that indifferent weather has to some extent marred every one of its big meetings. Saturday morning, April 24, was presaged by a hopeful Weather Bureau forecast. Alas, even with the prophets on the Association side, the morning dawned to drizzling rain. This continued intermittently until about midday, and doubtless cost the event at least another ten entries. As may be imagined the preliminary taking of entries, arranging the draw and actual getting of the big field on its way, took quite an appreciable slice out of the morning. Ultimately the first squad stepped on to the mark at a few minutes to ten o'clock.

The first man drawn to shoot was K. Cross of Gilgandra (N.S.W.) and his squad mates provided an interesting cross section of interstate sporting atmosphere, the No. 2 man was W. J. McPhee (Dubbo, N.S.W.), No. 3, Wal Eather (Boggabri, N.S.W.), No. 4, "Jock" (J. M. Wilson, Association President) and No. 5, Rex Powell (Cressy, Tasmania). None of this squad returned possibles. Altogether 27 squads faced the mark. Those who recorded scores of ten straight on the first visit were—H. R. Donnelly (Bruthen—ultimate winner), Jim Smith (Townsville), Newton Thomas (Townsville, Q.), J. R. Meehan

(Blackburn), Les L. Schilling (Ormond), J. Bryant (Blackburn), W. Rainbird (Launceston), Norman Guy (Flemington), A. C. McDonald (Grenfell, N.S.W.), and R. Frean (Bentleigh, Vict.).

Second round possibles came from the guns of Donnelly, "Peters" (Peter White, Brunswick), "Dubs" (Vic Fankhauser, East Burwood, Vict.), Geo. Bell (Young, N.S.W.), J. M. Tyquin (Hobart, Tas.), N. Guy, J. A. McCraith (Essendon), F. E. Brown (Dandenong Vict.), D. B. O'Callaghan (Brighton, Vict.).

Third round possibles, W. J. McPhee (Dubbo), E. G. Biggs (Elsternwick, Vict.), "Bendigo" (Harry Ceresa, Coburg), Donnelly, H. McIntosh (Seymour, Vict.), J. Smith (Q.), Tom Connor (Moonee Ponds, Vict.), Bruce Hill (Hornsby, N.S.W.), Geo. Purcell (Launceston, Tas.), R. W. Grossman (Wangaratta, Vict.), W. Bates (Sydney), G. Bell (N.S.W.), G. G. Beaumont (Young, N.S.W.), Luke Hughes (Sydney, N.S.W.), J. A. McCraith, F. E. Brown, D. B. O'Callaghan, "Gippsland" (Vic. Fraser, Windsor, Vict.), A. F. Burns (Footscray, Vict.).

Final round possibles, "Bendigo," H. McIntosh, N. Thomas, "Calrossie" (J. W. Sutherland) Bruce Hill, J. Thomas (Hornsby, N.S.W.), J. Bryant, John Bryant, W. R. Johns (Malvern, Vict., present Commonwealth Champion), McCraith, A. W. Hall (Coburg, Vict.), and T. Spall (Coburg). This left H. R. Donnelly outright winner with a total of 49/50.

It is somewhat coincidental that Donnelly missed his 41st bird—which is the exact release missed by the 1947 winner, "Doch-an-Doris" (Dave Watson) when he also scored 49/50 to win outright in that year.

Donnelly has been a top flight clay pigeon shot for many years and held the Champion of Champions Cup in its last year before war time recess, 1941.

In his response, after being presented with the winning trophies by the Association President, Mr. J. M. Wilson, Donnelly said that he had looked after the Cup all through the war years and he felt now that it was returning to its old place in his home. Donnelly is a modest sportsman and richly deserved his success. He served with the A.I.F. in the first World War.

The runner-up, J. A. McCraith, missed his 6th and 34th birds and finished with 48/50. W. R. Johns (third) put in his usual strong finish to record 47/50. He failed to cover his 6th, 19th, and 31st birds.

Other trophy winners down to the scheduled 8th position and sectional awards resulted, (after series of tie shoots—G. Bell (Young, N.S.W.), 67/71 (4th); J. Smith (Townsville, Q.), 66/71; A. F. Burns (Footscray) 63/68, E. G. Biggs (Elsternwick)

59/64; F. E. Brown (Dandenong) 50/55. Best interstate shooters not winning any other trophy, G. G. Beaumont (Young) 1st, 47/52; W. Rainbird (Launceston) 46/52. Best 12/13 yarder, A. Lansell 41/50, 14/15 yarder, "Gippsland" (V. Fraser) 45/50; 16/17 yarder, "Bendigo" (H. Ceresa); 18 yards and over, D. B. O'Callaghan 46/50.

The 20/-, 10/- sweepstakes attached to the Cup event totalled £72 and £46 respectively and were taken by the place-getters. The 5/- restricted sweepstake was cut by A. H. Brenk (Burwood), J. J. Dawson (Beaumaris) and Harry McIntosh (Seymour).

The Association Toast was ably proposed by Des O'Callaghan. The festivities lasted longer than many of the participants—in fact one of the revellers stated later that he arrived home "in time to milk the cows."

On Sunday April 25 many shooters enjoyed a quiet day (or did they?) and came along refreshed for International Day on Monday, April 26.

No. 2, 20 bird handicap, 7 possibles, tie shoot, W. F. Robertson (Deniliquin, (N.S.W.) 33/33, Bruce Hill (Hornsby, N.S.W.) 32/33, "Apex" (Harry Mills) 23/24. No. 3, missout, div. Fred Skate, H. R. Donnelly and A. Hamilton (Dandenong) 6/6.

With the shooting of these events concluded the best meeting ever conducted by the A.C.P.T.S.A. Thanks for this great success are due in no small way to the willing hands who assisted throughout. The Blackburn Secretary, Aubrey Johnson, neglected his own shooting to make sure the office administration was functioning satisfactorily.

The chief "hustlers," "Jock" (J. M. Wilson, President) and Bill Rainbird (Vice-President) did a first class job.
