Congratulations to Darryn Nicholls, newly crowned World DTL Champion. A very unassuming person Darryn (Broken Hill) excelled when it counts most to take out the Championships, whilst Australia has a new world Champion. Well Done Darryn.

Jack Collicoat (Deniliquin) also reached the pinnacle of his short career by taking out the Junior World Championship. Jack has been a member of the ACTA Junior team for a number of years and all of those around the young man knew his potential. Jack also underlined his potential taking 8th overall. Tim Catling (Katanning) finished 3rd overall Veteran, Craig Fitzgerald (Echuca) finished 4th overall, another fine effort on the world stage.

The full Australian Trap team travelled to South Africa for the World DTL Championships to compete in the Teams event conducted at the Valley Gun Club in Cape Town. The teams achieved 3rd in the Open, 5th in the Ladies, 4th in the Juniors whilst the Veterans took out 2nd place. Congratulations to all who travelled and represented the ACTA with distinction.

The Nationals Championships are in full swing with the ISSF Completed and the Trap Championships beginning in the next few days. Numbers for the trap carnival reached over 500 by close of nominations on the 12th of March. The Championships are preceded by the AGM on Sunday the 11th of April.

The Skeet Championships Nominations close on 23rd April. The

With further development of our website facilities and the requirements for this and printing the CTSN our ACTA head office will commence moving towards electronic reporting. This process will start immediately with our template already available on the website @ http://www.claytarget.com.au/acta-results/club-shootresults-submission

Once you enter the information you can save it to your computer and/or print it out in hard copy. Then just hit the send button.

This process will assist staff in the office compiling the CTSN and getting results on the WEB quicker. Your cooperation in providing these electronic results will be greatly appreciated.

At this stage it will be progressive however those results sent via the electronic medium will be given priority. By December 2010 the office will phase out all hand written and faxed results.

We are also currently updating our data base with expanded capabilities being developed for the start of 2011 nominations in October 2010. It is envisaged nominations for National events will be available on line for members. Secretaries of Clubs will be able to access their member's registrations details for renewal and updating. This will save a great deal of paper work. States will be able to access their coaches and referees details as well as the State membership. This will be strictly controlled via a login and password system similar to electronic banking. We are working on many new concepts to make the volunteers' job easier and having a seamless change over that most members will not be aware of.. event starts on the 17th May preceded by the Pre Nationals on the 18th of May. The Sporting Clays Championships are the 28th / 29th of August at the National Ground. As a guide all nomination close a month out, so check the nomination form to avoid disappointment.

In addition to these National Championships the Commonwealth Championships are being conducted at the Western Australia Gun Club in Perth commencing on the 9th – through to the 11th July.

The new BBQ area and seating behind layouts means more facilities for members attending the National ground. The new upgraded electrical supply has been installed ready for the Championships which should ensure no further disruption through inadequate supply.

Add to this the upgrade of lighting on four layouts including the Beretta (Layout 5) and Yellowtail (layout 6) then we are ready for the Championships to proceed.

We have lost a member of staff in Accounts with Ally Taylor leaving us for the USA. Judy will fill that role at this stage as cover for the Accounts position whilst recruiting commences. Judy has extensive experience in that area coming from management in the Sports industry previously.

STOP PRESS AUSTRALIA PRODUCES TWO MORE WORLD CHAMPIONS

Australian Clay Target Association members Darryn Nicholls from Broken Hill and Junior, Jack Collicoat from Deniliquin, have both won world championships in South Africa at the World DTL Championships. They join many illustrious names before them.

Darryn Nicholls from Broken Hill, took out the World Down the Line Championships from Northern Ireland's Neil McKeown, by one target overall. Fellow Australian, Craig Fitzgerald from Echuca, finished 4th.

Australia followed this up with Jack Collicoat from Deniliquin taking out the Junior World title in a very close contest with local South African star, Chris Davel.

At 17, Jack highlighted his potential finishing 8th overall in the event just 6 targets behind Darryn Nicholls. Jack has been a member of the National Junior Development program for the past three years and immediately rang National Coach Graeme Boyd, elated with the news.

The Two World Champions were part of the Australian Trap team that travelled to South Africa for the World DTL Championships conducted at the Valley Gun Club in Cape Town, South Africa. The Australian Team also achieved 3rd In the Open, 5th in the Ladies, 4th in the Juniors, whilst the Veterans took out 2nd place in the Teams events.

Callawadda - Stawell Clay Target Club INAUGURAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP



espite very warm and windy conditions at Callawadda on Saturday shooters posted some excellent scores. The day started at 11.00am with the Mayor, Cr. Kevin Erwin, firing the opening shots on the club's new skeet range. He was thrown 'flash' targets which are full of bright pink powder. When hit they explode leaving a large pink 'cloud' which makes it easy for spectators to see if the shooter has been successful.

Cr. Erwin congratulated the club on its new range and gaining outright ownership of the club grounds. He declined the offer to shoot in competition. The Baker Automotive Skeet Championship saw four shooters tie on 24/25. In the shoot off only two shooters got off the first station. Consistent local Tim Hughes and Alex Loubey a B grade 'skeetie' from near Geelong continued the struggle until Tim dropped a 'low house 3'. Alex took home the first sash given for skeet at Callawadda.

Hughes took out first in A grade with 33/35 and Greg James won C grade with 24/25. At 1.00pm the 'down the line' program started. Seven squads of shooters had nominated. Seven shooters shot the possible in the 10 Target Points score eye opener.

The 25 Target Points Score Championship that followed saw only two possibles - Jim Sawyer and club secretary Colin Dunn. The shoot off didn't last long. Sawyer 'wallyed' his 16th target, leaving Dunn the overall winner with 123/123. Ararat's Bill Harris claimed A grade; Bill Jorgensen took B grade with 74/75 and Alex Loubey won C grade.

In the 25 Target Double Barrel event eight shooters posted 'red ink'. Bill Jorgensen outlasted shooters from all grades to claim a fine victory with 94/94. Hopetoun's Wayne Sanders pushed Jorgensen but had to settle for a win in AA with 93/94. St. Arnaud's John McVitty took out A grade and Warracknabeal member Lisa Sanders claimed C grade.

In his win Bill Jorgensen established his first '100 break'. For the second month in a row Kate Mulvenney shot a 50 break.

The final even was the 25 Target Handicap. The club's oldest member Laurie Hemley shooting off 17 metres was the first to post a possible. Dave Lanyon on 17 m [St.Arnaud], Gary Hargreaves on 21m [Ararat] and Greg James on 19m [Horsham] also managed the 25.

The shoot off didn't last long. Lanyon won with 32/32, Hargreaves was second and James had to settle for third.

S OME 54 KEEN SPORTING SHOOTERS attended the Bendigo Clay Target Club on Saturday the 6th March to decide who would be named Victoria's #1 Sporting shooter for 2010.

The weather conditions were good and the Bendigo set up crew came up with 2 competitive but challenging layouts. Targets were excellent and our thanks to the sponsor of the 2010 Victorian State ACTA Sporting Clays Championships, GB Corsivia. Competition was keen in all grades to secure the cartridges on offer as well as the State medals.

The extra challenge on the day for the shooters was to gain selection in the Victorian 3 person team to compete at the National ACTA Sporting Clays Championships to be held in Wagga on the weekend of August 28-29.

The outstanding shooter on the day was John Younger finishing some 5 targets clear of the field. A shoot off between Rodd Flower and Marty Seymour decided 2nd placing in AA Grade. After 15 targets Marty took the silver, Rodd the bronze.

The irrepressible Bill Eagle with an 88/100 claimed gold in A grade. Greg Shelton took silver and Ron Purss bronze.

A shoot off was needed to determine B Grade with the victor being Peter Finn (coached by Weagle) over Dominic Azzopardi with Mark (now A Grade) Stuchbree in 3rd placing.

Tied scores in C grade between Brad Woolley and Colin Finn saw these 2 shooters back on the layout to sort out gold and silver. Brad triumphed leaving Colin with the silver and Colin Repacholi (also coached by Weagle), bronze.

Bryan Rafferty 81/100 was the victor in the Veterans section, Angela Marris also 81/100 in the Ladies Division with Christian Sammut 74/100 being the top Junior.

he WACTA State Carnival for 2009 was again held on the September long weekend. The skeet and trap disciplines were both contested over the weekend. However, this was to be the last time that WACTA will hold a combined carnival. Next year will see the long weekend being used to contest Double Rise, Handicap, Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Double Barrel Points Score.

WACTA State Skeet Carnival

Whilst Geelong were cruising towards another premiership, the skeet shooters of WA were treated to a beautiful day for shooting. The first event of the day was the Zone Teams event where the Metropolitan team were the winners with a score of 116. The team comprised of Mike Voke, Ray Wendt, Steve Saunders, Colin Gilbert and Marco Ponta.

The zone teams shoot was followed by the WACTA 50 Skeet Championship which was sponsored by WACTA Inc. Martin Perry was the eventual winner with a score of 60/62. Bunbury's Amanda House took out both the Ladies and Juniors prizes in this event, whilst Alex Harvey, also of Bunbury took out the Veteran's section. Grade winners were Phil House (the Bunbury Phil House) for AA, Steve Saunders won A grade, Max Pedri took out B Grade and C grade was won by Luke Wakeling.

Event 3 for the day was the State Skeet Championship, sponsored by Wesfarmers Insurance. John Rourke from the Kojonup Clay Target Club managed to sit back and enjoy his red sash while many shoot offs took place to decide minor placings in the grades. The winner of the Junior's section was again Amanda House. Laura Coles managed to slow herself down from her usual discipline of ISSF Skeet to win the Ladies section. Ray Wendt won the Veteran's State Skeet title. Steve Saunders again took first in A grade, whilst Martin Perry was the AA grade winner. Greg Wulff won the B grade and Luke Wakeling won C grade with a blistering 49/50.

The day concluded with the State Skeet team selections. After the final 50 targets were shot, the final 15 for the Open Skeet team were decided as follows – Martin Perry, Steve Saunders, Luke Wakeling, Colin Gilbert, Phil House, Steve Rados, Peter Shuttleworth, Max Pedri, Ken Green, Marco Ponta, Keith Wakeling, Greg Fleay, David Fox, Bruce Wellington and Ray Hawke. Colin Gilbert was awarded the RJ Franklin Perpetual Trophy for the Open Team High Gun.

With a small number of juniors competing, Busselton's Josh Fleay won the Keith Barker Perpetual Trophy (sponsored by Winchester) for the Junior State Skeet Team High Gun. He won this by the narrowest of margins over Amanda House.

The State Ladies Skeet team finished in the order of Laura Coles, Amanda Stokoe, Melissa Deegenaars, Denise Page and Carolyn Woodland. Amanda Stokoe shot well in the final 25 targets to be awarded the Helen Wiesse Perpetual Trophy (sponsored by WOW Inc and WACTA Inc).

The State Veteran's Skeet team was very tightly contested with Ray Wendt finishing first in the team and also taking out the team high gun which was sponsored by WACTA Inc. The remainder of the team are Bob Benjamin, Alex Harvey, Peter Iley, Robin Bailey and Ivan Halbert.

After shooting well all day and finishing with a score of 98/100, Martin Perry won the Overall Skeet High Gun. This was sponsored by Geraldton Sheetmetal and Roofing.

2010 will see the State Skeet Carnival being contested separately from the State Trap Carnival. There will be four state titles on offer at this year's State Skeet Carnival. It will be held at the Peel and Districts Gun Club over the weekend of August 21st and 22nd.

WACTA State Trap Carnival

Whilst the skeet shooters of WA got to enjoy some marvellous weather, the skies turned overcast for the 2 days of the state trap carnival. With nominations increasing every year, the number of shooters participating is approaching 200. Some interstate shooters stayed in WA after trying their hand at the Geraldton Crayfish Carnival the weekend before. Ideally more interstate shooters will make the journey across the Nullabor for 2010 when the State Trap Carnival will run for 3 days and have five state titles up for grabs.

The trap shooting got underway with the Zone teams event where the South West team of David Fox, Phil House, Terry Shine, Mark Evans and Josh Fleay had the narrowest of wins over the Great Southern Team. With both teams coming in with an ordinary score of 122/125 a count forward system was used and the South West were deemed the victors.

After the Zone teams event, the WACTA Inc sponsored event of Champion of Champions was contested. There was not a state title up for grabs with this one, but it provided the opportunity for shooters to get into the swing of things before the red sashes came out. WAGC's Terry Hearn appeared to not need any practice as he shot the only possible of 100/100. AA Grade was contested between Josh Fleay and Jarrad Baker, with Baker letting the young pup win. Fleay also won the Juniors prize. Kevin Nisbett won A grade, whilst Boyup Brook's Terry Shine took out B grade. Cody Sutton from the Eastern Goldfields won C grade after a shoot off. Collie's Ash Chester won the Ladies with a score of 97/100 and the Veterans winner was Dino Fracaro.

The first state title contested was the Double Barrel, which was sponsored by the ever generous Pine Hauliers. WAGC's Tony Burnard managed to hold off the great Geoff Faulkes to win his first state title in WA. The pair shot off into the early evening with Burnard's score finishing at 249/249. This left Faulkes to take out the AA grade prize. Boyup Brook's Wade Robertson won the A grade section. Luke Smith, all the way from Carnarvon, won the B grade. Growing your club and growing our sport

Following, you will see a report from the Canberra International Gun Club on initiatives implemented to attract new members. Perhaps these idea's may be useful in assisting your club or zone attract new members. If you have any innovative ideas we would be happy to publish your strategy to the rest of our member clubs.

f you look around the demographic of our sport, let's face it, the average age is on the older side of 40. When it comes to Canberra International Clay Target Club our average age has been close to 55 for a while. When I took on the role of President last year I had my own ideas on which direction we should start heading. As such I gave an undertaking to actively market the club in an effort to increase our membership base. I will share with you what the Canberra International has achieved in the last 8 months or so.

The legislation in the ACT permits unlicensed shooters to actively participate if they are under direct supervision of an "authorised instructor" (authorised under the ACT Firearms Act), provided they are using the instructors gun or a gun the instructor is lawfully entitled to possess. To start the ball rolling we managed to get six committee members to complete an instructor's course and gain their authorised instructors qualification.

Once that had been completed we advertised via word of mouth in the workplace we would hold a "come and try day" at the club. The instructors generously donated the use of their personal firearms and we had about forty people come to the day at short notice. On offer was a basic 5 stand setup, DTL and Skeet. The process was simple – the participants purchased a ticket at the office and went to whichever layout most appealed to them and shot their round of targets. An interesting observation was the 5 stand layout was very crowded, the DTL attracted very few and skeet was somewhere in the middle of the two. From this day we received some feedback on how to improve things and we took that on board for continuous improvement.

Next came updating our website. In the 21st century, just about everyone has a website. We listed on our site the fact we could host "corporate days", "group shoots" and we encouraged new shooters to come and have a go with one on one lessons. We took it a step further and offered "gift vouchers" for birthday or Christmas presents which proved a hit. We hosted our first "corporate day" which was a work group of 10 wanting some "team building". They spent the morning using the clubhouse to do work related activities; they used the BBQ for a social lunch and then finished off the day with two rounds of skeet each. This resulted in one person taking up membership.

Word had spread, and soon we began to field enquiries on a regular basis. It became apparent word of mouth was a very powerful advertising strategy, although the website enquiries continue to tick along quite nicely thank you. The next step was club guns, so we approached Fyshwick Firearms and Highland Sports and purchased three Miroku Model 10 sporters with screw in chokes, along with a safe to keep them in. A "corporate" shooters licence was also obtained during this period.

During the lead up to the Christmas period we fielded a lot of enquiries regarding hosting of work Christmas parties. We became solidly booked during this time, with our instructors putting in a lot of time and effort hosting groups ranging from 8 to 30 people. Bucks parties are also very popular, obviously a strict no alcohol and drug policy prior to shooting is in place. The club decided to obtain a liquor licence and began offering cold beer and pre mix spirits at the conclusion of shoot days. This has been a great success and provides a much appreciated service to both members and visitors.

We have seen quite a lot of residual business from our group activities. Participants at buck's parties and work functions have come back out to the club and taken up membership. We then started to offer firearms safety courses to equip people with the necessary qualifications in applying for their shooters licences. For those that join the club this has been conducted free of charge, for those that don't join the club there has been a fee attached.

As it stands I am receiving at least one telephone call per day from people wanting to come and try our sport, either individually or as part of a group. It is a lot of effort to travel to the club and set up for one person to shoot a round or two, but I am a firm believer we must make this effort. A lot of people are quiet shy, and are scared of failing in front of a crowd the first time. One on one coaching has paid huge dividends, with many people making return visits or joining our club. In addition to the phone calls, emails just keep rolling in with enquiries. I estimate in total I am probably getting 15-20 contacts per week by people wanting to arrange trying clay

target shooting. It is getting the stage where demand is starting to outstrip our ability to host the numbers we are being requested to. This is a very nice position to be in from a club perspective.

Mostly we use Skeet as the discipline to introduce our new shooters. The reasons for this are simple – we have 4 layouts with the corresponding number of guns. We can also have 24 people "shooting" at once with just 4 instructors and most importantly there is only a single gun loaded with one cartridge on each layout. It goes without saying safety is absolutely paramount.

Since commencing this endeavour we have offered the opportunity for unlicensed shooters to come out on competition days and shoot with a squad under the supervision of an instructor. This has also proven to be a massive success, with a number of licensed shooters bringing their friends and family out for the day to have a go.

The benefits of putting in the time and effort, and believe me there is a lot of that, far outweigh the negatives in my opinion. The more members we have the more enthusiastic hands we have to make less work. The more membership fees we receive the more financial clubs become which provides an ability to upgrade club facilities and equipment. Clubs must remember this part - if people pay membership they deserve to get returns on that investment. If clubs are prepared to take people's money and not upgrade their facilities their members will rightly become disillusioned with them and either seek another club or leave the sport altogether.

I will leave you with a couple of things to think about with regard to your club facility. Almost all of them will sit there vacant for at least a week or even a month in some cases. Give some consideration, if the facility is in good order, to offering it as a function type facility – even if there is no shooting undertaken. People will pay to use a decent clubhouse for work functions, and you will be surprised at the number who appreciate rural or semi rural settings for this activity.

With regards to hosting group shoots and prospective new members – make every effort you can to provide more than one discipline to choose from. People appreciate choice, and as can be seen from the first ever day we held they will gravitate to what appeals to them most. We have had some start their shooting career with skeet and go across to sporting clays. Some start out and go towards DTL. A lot have stayed with skeet and it is important to not be a "one trick pony" when it comes to growing our sport.

As an idea, I will give you some rough figures as to what we have done in the past essentially six months. We have had over 300 first time shooters come through our facility - and thrown about 15,000 targets for them. We have increased our active membership by 20-25%. In particular lately we have seen incredible interest from ladies and younger shooters wanting to get involved.

A final thought for you – however you choose to conduct your clubs activities for new shooters they MUST walk away with a positive exposure to clay target shooting. It is absolutely detrimental to your club and the sport to give someone a shotgun, a box of shells and tell them where the target comes from. You MUST spend time with people coaching them to get them hitting targets and you must supply a friendly person to make them feel welcome. Although the money from these new shooters supplements a clubs income, to take their money and have them get no assistance in achieving any sort of results will hurt you in the long run. I have seen this occur at other clubs and in my opinion it is disgusting. We have received overwhelming positive feedback from everybody who has ever visited us and this must be your goal if you want to go down this road.

Promote your club and provide a friendly face and encouragement to prospective participants. Grow your club and grow our sport. Let's encourage participation and let's get the next generation of clay target shooters walking up to stand on the podium. I don't believe in keeping secrets when it comes to raising the profile of clay target shooting, and as a result I am happy to share this whole experience in much more detail with clubs wanting to expand, all you need to do is contact me.

OPEN LETTER TO ISSF SHOOTERS

There has been a lot of discussion and opinions aired about the current administration of ISSF shooting in Australia. This letter has been prepared in an attempt to answer some of the issues raised and to dispel the mis-information.

However before commencing on the details it is important to clarify the respective responsibilities of the ACTA, Australian International Shooting Ltd (AISL) and the Australian Sports Commission (ASC). The ACTA has the responsibility for administering the sport of clay target shooting across Australia. ISSF is but one of the four ACTA disciplines including trap, skeet and sporting clays. While ISSF undeniably includes the elite of our sport it is also the smallest discipline in terms of competitor numbers and ACTA administrators need to balance their effort with regard to the respective demands. ACTA is a not for profit organisation, volunteer based with a management executive based on state & territory representation. This structure means that all those people working for the shooters are volunteers who give up their time and work days to work for the association. Our National Office has a dedicated staff of three permanent and two part time people to run the office. The national ground has one full time employee plus volunteers.

As most of us are aware the AISL has responsibility for running the high performance program including selection of teams for Olympic Games, Commonwealth Games, World Cup, World championship and Oceania Championships to represent Australia. AISL sets selection criteria, provides high level coaching for the high performance group, organises international level events and finally sends teams overseas. Whether our association likes it or not that is the current situation which we all have to live with for the foreseeable future. Whether the implications of the Crawford report may eventually affect the current balance of responsibilities is at the moment a matter for speculation. It is unlikely that the recommendations of report will be implemented until it receives endorsement from Council of Australian Governments (COAG) and funded by the federal government. It is our understanding that the Crawford report has yet to be listed on the agenda of future COAG meetings. Given that there will most likely be resistance from state and territory governments to certain aspects of the report our advice is don't hold your breath! However notwithstanding, the implications of the report will be studied by the ACTA Executive at its next meeting with a view to best positioning ACTA for future possible developments.

It is important to understand that the selection criteria applied by AISL are approved by ASIL High performance joint management committee which comprises members of the various member bodies and the Australian Sports commission which are subsequently ratified by the AISL board. The policies are set in line with the aim of the program which is to medal at the Olympic games. The funding of the program is reliant on the results achieved measured against the agreed performance indicators.

As implementation of the criteria is a matter for AISL I will not comment further beyond saying that the AISL endeavors to give maximum opportunity to those they believe can win medals. Please remember ACTA does not run AISL and ACTA does not run Australia Cup events.

The discussion on whether women shooters should compete alongside men has not been helpful. As many people are aware AISL can only accredit events for PQS provided they are run in accordance with ISSF rules. ISSF rules are very clear – women events must be run separately. If ACTA agreed to allow women to compete in open competition with the men it is our informed advice that the AISL would be bound to remove PQS accreditation not just for the women but for the entire ACTA ISSF nationals. Unfortunately there is little ACTA can do to alter the ISSF rules at an international level. Non PQS events such as state, zone or club championships are another matter.

Rumors and misinformation are in circulation regarding recent AISL grants to ACTA. Firstly let me state that the grants that our association received from AISL were never for running the ACTA ISSF nationals. This event has been funded entirely from the nominations received from the shooters. When you take into account the cost of targets, range fees and

administrative costs there is remarkably little left. Yes ideally we should have paid referees including side referees but the funds are just not available. It is worth noting that ACTA does not employ paid referees for any of its national championships so ISSF is not discriminated against. It is also worth noting that the ACTA ISSF nationals are the only Australian accredited PQS event that offers cash prizes to the winners. ACTA is continually reviewing the formula used for determining cash prizes and is well aware of the problem of small cash prizes (due to the small entries) for some ISSF national championships.

In 2007 the ACTA Executive approved a proposal to seek funding for a two year grant from AISL. The AISL Board approved the proposal and provided \$35,000 in 2008 to be spent in accordance with the program proposed by and jointly funded with an extra \$30,000 by ACTA. The crux was to provide talent development pathways for promising ISSF shooters. Five separate but interrelated pathways were identified:

- PQS Events and ACTA ISSF National Championships
- ACTA development squads aimed at junior shooters
- Talent spotting at ACTA National Championships funded by the Suzy Balogh/Perazzi sponsorship
- State based ISSF Development Centres an entirely new program
- Talent Identification from other Sports another new idea.

Of the above, the last pathway was not followed up as well as it should have but the emphasis was on state based ISSF development centres. All state and territory associations were invited to submit programs according to a set of guidelines approved by the ACTA executive. With the exception of Tasmania all states and territory submitted programs. These were assessed by the International Shooting Committee which made recommendations to the executive for approval. All submitted programs were funded to varying degrees and that accounted for the majority of the year 1 grant from AISL. The ACTA portion was spent on junior and intermediate development.

AISL provided a second grant of \$35,000 in 2009 similarly matched by ACTA and this time the emphasis has been on developing a national ISSF development and coaching program. The program has a number of initiatives which are too numerous to be list here. Unfortunately the AISL does not provide an "annual grant" to ACTA and it is not anticipated that further grants will be available. Audit of the expenditure of the two grants received is undertaken by the ACTA appointed auditor and undoubtedly expenditure by the states is also audited at that level.

Comments have been made about the non-attendance of ACTA executives at the shooters' meeting in Brisbane. The facts are that the executives were of the understanding that it was a shooters' meeting and that they would be invited if needed. The national president, three executive members and the ACTA executive officer stood by waiting for the invitation that never came. It may have been the result of a misunderstanding but it is not true that they "did not want to attend".

It is worth noting that ISSF shooters were granted the opportunity in 2009 to form their own athlete's committee to represent ISSF issues to the ACTA. Other clay target shooters have not been afforded that privilege. It is disappointing that the shooters' meeting in Brisbane produced neither formal minutes nor recommendations – ACTA cannot formally consider emails from individual shooters particularly those that verge on the slanderous. At this stage I have doubts that the Executive Committee will agree to the continuation of the ISSF athletes' committee unless those responsible deliver a product that the executive can seriously work with. We all understand that there are problems with ISSF but we all need to do things properly to effect change.

ACTA has continuously modified the program for the ISSF nationals mainly in response to shooters' demands and ACTA remains prepared to modify the program again if considered responsible suggestions are

formally proposed by the ISSF Athlete's Committee. At the risk of repeating myself if ISSF shooters will not use the due process especially set up for them then they cannot reasonably expect change. The ball is firmly in the ISSF Athletes Committee's court.

The ISSF nationals program was shortened by one event because shooters said the week was too long and expensive but it is interesting that some shooters are now demanding that the extra event be reinstated. All I can say is please have a regard for those who volunteer their time to run the nationals. The word is "volunteer" as no one is paid to do the work. Officials attend early each morning to check targets in accordance with ISSF rules before shooters arrive and are still working every day long after shooters have departed. Twelve hour days are the rule rather than the exception. If the extra event for all disciplines was re-introduced plus extra practice days also demanded in the various emails the ISSF nationals would extend to at least 11 possibly 12 days for the officials and administrators. This would not be the case for the competitors as each discipline comes and goes within these championships. The authors of these emails should take this into consideration and ask where are we to find officials prepared to volunteer their time on that basis for that period?

Pre-nominations have been set in place by the ACTA Executive for all ACTA national championships which brings us into line with international events. Of course there have been a few hiccups but I am confident that the obvious advantages of pre-nomination will easily outweigh any disadvantages and that the system will settle in well in the future.

ACTA is well aware that there are problems with ISSF and your executive looks forward to working positively with both the ISSF Athletes Committee and AISL to effect needed changes. However the current atmosphere of rumor, distrust and misinformation is not to anyone's advantage. I trust that the above has helped dispel at least some of this.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2010 Australian Skeet Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2010 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2010 registered shooter record book before nominating.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the National Skeet Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Womens, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Australia/New Zealand Skeet Postal team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, on May 17, 2010 will be over the age of 65 years.

Juniors - are those competitors who, on May 17, 2010 will be under the age of 18 years.

Sub Juniors - are those who, on May 17, 2010 will be under the age of 15 years.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the National 20 gauge Championship, load size is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.7. For the National 20 gauge Championship load size is limited to 24gr struck measure shot size not larger that No.7.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Management Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard. This applies to skeet grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans divisions.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

GENERAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

- 2. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred.
- 4. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management
- 5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 7. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 8. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility will be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 10. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 13. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
- 14. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 15. Nominations will close at 5pm on Friday 23 April and no late entries will be accepted.
- 16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
- 20. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 21. Squads of 5 to shoot 50 targets targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps.
- 22. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.





(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

IT'S YOUR CALL by Bill McCarthy

The following two scenarios relate to situations which are not uncommon in double rise events.

You are the referee for a double rise event where a shooter calls for a pair of targets. The first target he fires at is an illegal target (not a broken one) and misses it. The other target in the pair is quite legal and he declines to shoot at it. A delicate situation has now arisen.

He claims he has refused the target under Rule GRTS 17. You are convinced that the second target is legal.

It's Your Call

What is the ruling?

If you said "Lost" and "Lost" you would be quite correct under the note to Rule 1.07 (g), which states that if a shooter fires at the second target if the second target is a legal one. Hence, he missed with the first barrel and declined to shoot at the second under Rule 1.07(g), by shooting at the first target he is deemed to have accepted the pair and must abide by the result of his actions for the second shot.

pair of which the first target is illegal, he must also shoot at

Naturally, some doubt may have been in your mind about your decision, but in the absence of any cogent evidence of a legitimate reason for refusal of the second target, Rule 1.07(g) should stand. Obviously, an allowable baulk would alter the situation but the rule is quite clear on what procedure we are to follow.

Now if the reverse applies he is not compelled to shoot at an illegal second target even if he had fired at an illegal of legal target with his first shot.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

SELF-TALK

I've been asked on many occasions, "What should I think about while I'm shooting?" The short answer is nothing. However, because we are human beings this is practically impossible, because as humans we think almost every waking moment.

Have you ever tried to stop thinking: have a go, for the next thirty seconds try to think about absolutely nothing. Cast out all your thoughts and clear your mind of all conscious activity.

(30 seconds later) How did you go? Tough wasn't it. For most of us it is absolutely impossible.

These thoughts can be described as self-talk. According to Burton and Raedeke, self-talk is a steady stream of thoughts and internal dialogue in our minds. Used purposefully, it can be a versatile and powerful technique for improving performance. When you tried to clear your head of thoughts a minute ago, what happened? Any attempt to clear your mind usually prompts a flood of thoughts to rush in and fill the void, often causing us to think about the worst possible things at the most inopportune times. Burton and Raedeke, go on by stating that this continuous stream of thoughts, positive and negative, is self-talk, and it plays an important role in determining moods and emotions. It also plays a big role in developing both confidence and/or self-doubt. Positive self-talk can encourage a positive mood and maintaining your confidence and improving performance. Negative self-talk on the other hand, can lead to self-defeating thinking, that focuses our attention away from the here and now, to either the past or the future, which then leads to self-doubt and eventually failure.

If thoughts are repeated enough they become beliefs. This is true for both positive and negative thoughts. Albert Ellis, an American Psychologist who developed Rational-Emotive Therapy, describes the process as ABC. A is the Activating event: in shooting this might be missing a particular target, for example, a right had swinger from lane 5, high house 2, or a rabbit in sporting. Because of this activating event, the consequence, C, is a lower score. This may cause us to lose the event, not make the shoot-off or lose the high gun. These consequences can be negative and might include emotions such as stress and anxiety, leading to disruptive behaviours such as poor concentration, etc. Positive consequences might lead to emotions such as challenge or excitement which would in turn lead to successful behaviours such as good concentration, anticipation, quick reactions, etc. Finally the B represents your beliefs about the situation or what you are thinking between A and C. Burton and Raedeke argue that the B is your interpretation of the situation and it determines your emotions and behaviour to a much greater extent than does the situation itself. Positive thoughts (I've prepared well, I am confident, I have always shot well at this ground, etc) should lead you to feel positive emotions and perform well. Negative thoughts on the other hand, can lead to unproductive consequences. Negative thinking (He's a better shot than I am, I hate rabbits, I've never shoot 100 straight before) will cause unproductive emotions such as anger, frustration, which will lead to self-doubt and choking.

The basic principle of self-talk is that you may not always have control over what happens to us but we can control how we respond to uncontrollable events. This principle, which was first written about by Shakespeare in Hamlet, (it is that old), states "It's not the things in life that effect us, but the way we think about them."

Self-talk can have positive thought patterns, negative thought patterns and can be intertwined by irrational belief structures.

Positive thought patterns help create a flow mindset by boosting

confidence, maintaining an optimistic attitude, promoting concentration, enhancing motivation and facilitate mental toughness, whilst negative thought patterns involve drawing incorrect or faulty inferences based on inadequate or incorrect information or the inability to distinguish between fact and fantasy.

Before I conclude, go back and try and stop your thoughts for another 30 seconds. It should still be hard, because as I said earlier our mind doesn't like the empty space and will try and fill it something. This time, instead of trying to stop your thinking, focus on something that will keep you focused but will not affect how you feel. Think of and hum a song, think of and visualise a picture or scene of some sort, mentally rehearse something over in your mind. You can't stop self-talk and where possible it should be positive and focused. But if you are trapped by negative thoughts and irrational beliefs then put some other bland thought that is not related to your performance in its place. This technique should be practiced in conjunction with breathing and relaxation. This will keep you focused on the present and limit the opportunity for your mind to wander into the past (where it will form judgements about past mistakes and failures) or into the future (where you will become scared and worry about failing).

Over the next couple of months I will explore these thought patterns. Starting next month with positive thought patterns, then negative though patterns and finally irrational beliefs.



From the Past

This story comes from the writings of George Biggs, the long time Australian Clay Target Association historian and relates to the great Doc Carvers visit to Australia in the early 1900's. Carver was certainly the best trap shooter in America at the time and Barney Meadway was a 6 time Australian trapshooting champion of the 1920's.

This yarn was from C.B. (Barney) Meadway. Barney came from the Benalla district. He was a smallish fellow with a handy way with words. His shooting days were tapering off when I knew him, but he was always on for a yarn.

Anyhow, as Barney told it, the great Doc Carver from the US of A, with his reputation as the greatest wing shot in history, arrived at the New South Wales Gun Club in Sydney and challenged any person in the world to shoot him a match from 30 yards, 100 birds up, and \$100 a side.

He was challenged five times and won each time. Although, Jack Neeld ran close when he shot 93 to the Docs 94. I knew Jack Neelds son, another Jack, and I had discussions with him about it, but he lacked a sense of history and was only mildly interested, although Errol Bullen, another member of NSW Gun Club of my days there, confirmed Barney's story.

Carver then came to Melbourne Gun Club and challenged anybody in the land to shoot against him on the same conditions as Sydney. There were several takers and once again Carver won each match. In one of these matches, after he had shot about 20 birds straight, the Doc walked off the mark and called for a strip of lead, he said he felt he was over swinging and wanted to wrap the lead around his barrels to slow himself down a little.

After packeting the loot and running out of challengers, Carver issued an open challenge of \$500 a side, 100 birds up. This offer went untaken for a few weeks while Carver won about every event he wanted to win in the daily competitions of those days.

Then one Friday, the Grant brothers from Skipton walked into the club on one of their occasional visits. They worked as rabbiters on very ordinary wages and their ability to shoot at the club was limited.

According to Barney, they were "pretty fair shots" and had never heard of Carver, but when told of the challenge they had a little discussion, pooled their money and drew straws to see who would do the shooting. Bobby drew the long straw, and after checking that the Carver money was up, they paid their \$500 and the match was set for the Saturday a week away.

A great crowd came along for the event and over 50 bookmakers stood up to do battle with the punters.

Anyhow, with much excitement, huge betting, and a break for lunch, the big day saw Carver shoot 99 out of 100, and in Barney's words, "It wasn't bloody well good enough, Bobby shot the 100."

What George didn't mention in this little story was that the Grant brothers were probably the best live pigeon shots in Australia at the time and both won the Australian Pigeon Shooting Championship on multiple occasions.

For the Record

In January, Roger Duthie became the first person to shoot the possible in the Handicap and Double Rise at a State Championships. He achieved the feat whilst competing at the Tasmanian Trap Championships held in Launceston.

Trap shooting in the period 1860 – 1900 rivalled both golf and tennis. The top trap shooters earned massive salaries and attracted huge crowds to the competitions of the day. When Doc Carver and Captain Bogardus travelled through the USA competing in a series of one on one trap shooting events, they attracted crowds in excess of 50,000 people. They travelled from venue to venue by trains dedicated to the shooters and their entourage and enjoyed first class facilities in every location they visited.

Professional trap shooters existed throughout the world and Australia was no exception, in fact at the turn of the century Australia boasted the greatest trap shooter in the world, Donald Mackintosh.

Mackintosh Reunion

This will be the largest function ever run by the ACTA and we would like as many Mackintosh team members as possible to attend. It will be held on the closing Saturday and Sunday in 2011 and will be a highlight of the 2011 Trap Nationals.
