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National President's Notes



The Association board met in Brisbane on the 12th and 13th of September to conduct all manner of ongoing ACTA business. The Championships report in this issue reflects the general satisfaction by members of the Nationals Programs currently being shot and therefore they remain unchanged.

What I will try and do with this column into the future is stimulate some discussion to help us over some of the hurdles we face. Constructive input on these matters is always welcome.

I have recently attended three annual shoots where numbers exceeded 100 and the atmosphere was great. Sponsors heavily contributed at these venues and certainly made the events worthwhile for the shooters. The small cost load on the club for

trophies resulted in the clubs being able to provide better catering, hospitality and in one case entertainment at well below the real cost, and still achieve a strong financial return for the club. A win for all. Most sponsors at these local and regional levels seem to be coming from within the membership base, but at National level this is not the case and except for the exceptional sponsorship provided by Casella Wines over the last few years our Nationals sponsorship (although from our membership base) is mostly firearm industry related. It is a priority for the Association to generate more sponsorship from outside of the related industry and to date we have been successful with a major sponsorship for next year from Coopers Tyres and a smaller deal with AVIS. Anyone with other possibilities please contact Tony at the office.

A recent mail out to non-rejoining members revealed some interesting trends. Some had joined other Associations, some had passed away and a small amount cited finances and cost for not rejoining. A large number had paid their club months ago, and some said they had not received an account. It appears that if more effort was put into retaining members we could grow our Association at a reasonable rate. Some clubs are great at chasing non-renewing members and some clubs do nothing. Some question the need for growth, but government funding, at all levels, political clout regarding proposed firearms legislation and sponsorship are all numbers games. Increased participation is of course the greatest resulting benefit to all sections of our sport.

Should we consider a new method of collecting subscriptions, so we can deal direct with ACTA registered shooters, without our member clubs in the middle? We would need to be careful that we don't dilute the screening that prospective members are exposed to by having to initially join through a club, but perhaps after being through this process the Association could then deal with them direct. The ACTA sending an account and collecting club fees, or renewing on our website could be possibilities. I welcome any suggestions on this matter.

The support received from Tradesite holders at Nationals Championships is greatly appreciated, and I am sure we all want to see them there each year. We need to look at some way of getting more people through their tents, as it is expensive for them to be there with tent hire, security, freight, staff costs etc. We all know the costs of accommodation and travel these days. Shooters need to consider their purchases throughout the year and support the sponsors and tradesite holders, whenever possible. I also welcome any suggestions on this matter.

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CLUB, ZONE AND STATE SECRETARIES AND PUBLICITY OFFICERS

Electronic Reports and Results/The New Age

With further development of our website facilities and the requirements for this and printing the CTSN our ACTA Head Office will commence moving towards electronic reporting. This process will start immediately with our template already available on the website <http://www.claytarget.com.au/acta-results/club-shoot-results-submission>

Once you enter the information you can save it to your computer and/or print it out in hard copy. Then just hit the send button.

This process will assist us in the office in compiling the Magazine and getting results on the WEB quicker. Your cooperation in providing these electronic results will be greatly appreciated.

At this stage it will be progressive however those results sent via the electronic medium will be given priority. By December 2010 the office will phase out all hand written and faxed results.

We are also currently updating our data base with an expanded capability being developed for the start of 2011 nominations in October 2010. It is envisaged nominations for National events will be available on line as well as access to Secretaries of Clubs to access their members registrations for renewal and updating. States will be able to access their coaches and referees details as well as the State membership. This will be strictly controlled via a login and password system similar to electronic banking. We are working on many new concepts to make the volunteers job easier and having a seamless change over that most members will not be aware of.

Executive Officer's Report

The National Office is busy gearing up for the opening of the new membership year which commences on the 1st of October. The Secretary's pack will be updated and sent during that time with updated information provided in a number of areas. The cost of membership remains the same as last year.

We are also currently putting together new ACTA Shooting Rules Book which will reflect the changes made through the Rules Committee and endorsed by the National Executive in June 2010. These books will be ready for distribution later in the year and will come into effect as at the 1st of January 2011. In addition there will be new handicap books which will start to be released to new and renewing members requiring a new book from October.

The Association has already received a number of enquiries regarding assistance with promotions in a number of areas. These promotions mainly include field days, a popular place for shooters to be found. We have "packs" which will provide pamphlets, pens, key rings and banners etc to promote the sport. If you wish to use these packs for promotional purposes please contact the Association to book. We will send all of the gear out for you prior to the event.

Clubs should have receive and filled out a survey of information to be provided to our insurers to ensure coverage of as many events as possible being conducted by Clubs. Currently we have to advise the insurer of "Extra" events not associated with the sport. We hope to be able to simplify this to cover the majority of events, however we will be guided by the returns and negotiations with the insurers.

The National Sporting Clays Championships have been conducted with a disappointing field of less than 80 shooters. Those who did attend were in contention for selection for Australian selection for the World 5 Stand Sporting Clays Championships being held in New Zealand in February 2011. More details will be provided in next month's magazine.

The National ground is struggling to handle the enormous amount of rain we have received over the winter months. On the plus side the ground is the greenest it has been in ten years. The recent sealing of the roadway and car parking area has at least allowed us to get out of the mud.

Many States are now gearing up for their Championships. With many experiencing record or near record numbers last year it will be interesting to see if the trend continues. With fine weather and strong competition the State showpieces should provide some excellent shooting. All the best to those volunteers running the Championships and to the shooters attending. Good luck

CHAMPIONSHIPS COMMITTEE REPORT

Your National Championships Committee tabled its reports and recommendations before the full National Executive meeting held at our National Office in June and are now pleased to announce the following amendments to our National championships. It was the overall view that our 2010 championships were a resounding success and that pre-nomination and squadding is the way forward in providing a proficiently administered event. All National Championship dates and programs for 2011 are now available for viewing on our website.

Pre-Nominations and Pre-Squadding

Entry into all our National Championships will be by pre-nomination, each championship will have advertised maximum entries per event, and nomination close off date. When pre-nomination close further entries may be taken on the day only if maximum numbers have not reached. Entries on the day will incur a \$25 per event additional premium. Competitors wishing to be squadded together in events may do so if their entries are received as a group (this condition does not apply to ISSF events).

Maximum entries per events

Trap:	576 entries
Skeet:	160 entries
Sporting:	120 entries
ISSF Trap:	125 entries
ISSF Skeet:	No Limit
ISSF Double Trap:	No Limit

Reserve List

When entries have reached their respective maximum numbers as set out above a further number of entries will be placed on a reserve list to fill any withdrawals from the championship.

To assist our National Office with processing of nominations options will be available on the nomination entry form to indicate when to process their payment.

Option One: On receipt of the nomination form.

Option Two: Two weeks prior to the event.

This will hopefully ease the rush of entries received in the final days. Full refunds will be given to all entries who wish to withdraw from the championship when a minimum of 48 hours written notice is received by our National Office prior to the event.

National Trap Championships

The 2011 National Trap Championships will be conducted from the 2nd to the 9th of April over 16 competition layouts, with a further 2 layouts for practice. The final shoot offs of each event will be conducted on layout 5 (Beretta) and layout 6 (Casella). Every opportunity will be given to finalise all events in daylight, for the Double Barrel championship this event will be conducted over 50 targets which will allow the shoot off to run for five hours, then if numbers permit the shoot off will recommence on the layout 5 (Beretta) and layout 6 (Casella) the following

morning whilst the next day's championship is underway. The National Executive has approved the recommended 2011 program and that it remain unchanged for 2012 and 2013.

A Written application was received from the West Australian Clay Target Association to hold the 2014 National Trap Championships in Perth, which gained the full support of the National Executive.

National Skeet Championships

The 2011 National Skeet Championship program will remain unchanged from the 2010 championship and will be conducted from the 15th to 22nd May.

National ISSF Championships

The 2011 National ISSF Championships will be held at the West Australian Gun Club in Perth in January, the program will remain unchanged from the 2010 championship. After discussions with Nick Sullivan the CEO of AISL we are pleased to announce that all of the championships in the National program now qualify for PQS scores this will allow our members more opportunities for selection and also give our National Championships more kudos.

National Sporting Championships

The 2011 National Sporting Championship will be held at the National Grounds in August and the program will remain unchanged.

COOPERATION REQUIRED: CTSN CONTENT AND DEADLINES

The ACTA CTSN has grown substantially in 2010 with advertising and editorial content as well as Club reports continuing to exceed expectation.

A decision to only accept CTSN content via email or the web will take effect as at the 20th October 2010. This includes Club results sent to the National Office. These report templates can be accessed through the ACTA web site www.claytarget.com.au or contact the office and we will email you through the electronic version or you can simply provide the report in WORD format via email.

We have to cater for everyone fairly and equally. There is a limit to what we can do, if you leave your ads, reports or content until the last minute there is every chance we may not be able to publish it.

Closing day does not mean we have finished our work at the office in relation to the CTSN. Collating and sizing the ads, stories and content is an arduous and complex task. Between Maureen and Ironbark Graphics they achieve a great deal in a very short time frame.

As well as performing other duties the staff at the National Office have to compile all of this information and have it to the typesetter, have it set (including photos & touchups, amend ads where necessary), proof read, make corrections where necessary and then send to the printer. This then has to be sent to our Mailing House for distribution.

Increasing the size or page extent of the magazine is ineffective due to cost. We have strict weight guidelines for the magazine that cannot be exceeded. The reason is that we are then thrust into the next category of postage effectively doubling our postage costs.

If your ads, report, and shoot results are not in by the due date they will not be published. Get your ads, report, and shoot results in early to ensure you receive the coverage you want.

If every Club was only late once every 5 years, we would have 4 requests per month for special treatment. Not fair to other Clubs nor our staff and contractors.

This was a joint venture between the WA Gun Club Inc. and the State Association, the WA Clay Target Association. It was an extremely well organised and run carnival and sincere THANKS to all those wonderful and integral people who had a “can do attitude” and made things happen. Without this support and all the cooperation and cohesiveness of working together such a great weekend could not have happened.

This carnival will long be remembered as the “Carnival that broke the drought here in WA.” If the farmers didn’t get rain by the weekend some were facing financial hardship. Having White Flyer targets being thrown from the Canterbury Traps made a huge difference. The targets were very stable, consistent and there was no shortage of “soot balls” even in the wet conditions.

The Opening ceremony was held on Day 1 and opened by Mr Peter Michan of the Department of Sport and Recreation. The ACTA was represented by Mrs Elaine Forward and Mr Lynne Curtis and the Western Australian Clay Target Association President Terry Marsden along with the WA Gun Club President Robin Bailey welcomed everyone to Perth. With the Trap carnival officially opened the first event got underway.

Event 1 was the 75 Target Champion of Champions proudly sponsored by Winchester Australia and as the weather just kept getting worse the event was re-named to the “75 Target Hurricane Hail Champion of Champions”. Event 2 was the Spartan Global Handicap and with the weather not improving it was time to find the gum boots and wet weather gear and brave the elements. Some shooters turned religious praying that the rain would ease but the Farmers just kept seeing dollar signs in those clay targets with every mm of rainfall!

Hobart shooter Thaine Browning came across to Perth to defend his 2009 Commonwealth Handicap Title and it got down to a shoot off with fellow Tasmanian Dennis Whitely with Thaine achieving back to back Titles with a score of 57/57 off 19 metres. By the end of the Carnival Thaine became a AA Grade shooter off 21 metres. 2nd place went to Dennis Whitely off 21m, 3rd place was another Dream Team

All the winner were very pleased to receive so much cash as prizes as shown by the smiles all around. Thaine as the overall winner received a shotgun donated by Global Spartan.

With the end of Day one everyone went home to dry out and hope that surely the weather must improve for day two of shooting with the main events being the Single Barrel and Double Barrel events.

With the dark skies looming over Perth and the continuing rainfall day two got underway with a hearty breakfast cooked by WA Gun Club members Rocco and Giovanni with most sitting in front of the open fireplace.

Event 3 was the Commonwealth Single Barrel. Our major sponsor for the 3 days was Canterbury Trap International and a huge thank you

The next event, the 50 Target Commonwealth Double Barrel Championship was the main event everyone was waiting for, again proudly sponsored by Canterbury Trap International. By this stage nobody cared about the weather conditions because there were 22 possibles shot after the 50 targets. Great results under very testing conditions and a credit to all those competitors who shot the possible.

Well 22 competitors went out and they were dropping out as fast as the rainfall! One by one they sought refuge back in the clubhouse near the warm cosy fire and then it got down to only 3 competitors. Tony Papandnakis from Darwin, David Fox from Collie and Arthur Pagett from Salmon Gums and there was no typical long shot off. Darwin AA Grade shooter Tony Papandnkis won with a perfect score of 161/161. 1st in AA Grade was David Fox 160/161 2nd AA Grade Brett Kuser 109/100 and 3rd AA Grade Jarrad Baker 106/107. Psychological Skills for Shooting

THE INNER GAME: IT IS IMPORTANT

Back in 1999 I started writing these articles for the CTSN. Initially, I was armed with an extensive knowledge of psychology and had been shooting most of my life and whilst I knew

a lot about psychology and a lot about shooting, I quickly found that I needed to learn about the psychology of shooting.

When I started to research "sport psychology" for shooters, I was directed to *The Inner Game of Golf* by Tim Gallwey. Regular readers will know I found this book fascinating as it seemed to explain what was happening when each of us play the outer game of golf or shooting and the Inner Game of golf or shooting.

Recently after a clinic I ran for the Southern Sports Academy golf squad I received this email from one of the team:

"I bought the book 'the inner game of golf' and I find that it is really improving my head game and teaching me skills I didn't know there were."

I recently received a CD from the Inner Game foundation in USA which was a "conversation with Tim Gallwey" in which Tim talked about his books and the philosophy behind the inner game. It is interesting to note that the Inner Game Books were originally written in the seventies.

Shooting, like all sports, involves two games; the outer game and the inner game. The outer game involves the sport itself; shooting the target. The outer game involves physical fitness, well fitting gun, reliable ammunition, correct stance and gun hold and all of the variables that are outside the shooter. The inner game involves mental fitness and relies on the individual to have trust in their own ability to do what is required. Inner game strategies involve concentration, mental rehearsal, awareness, attention, relaxation, goal setting, etc.

The problem with either trap or skeet shooting is that an error will usually cost you the game or the match. There are rarely, second chances. In tennis, you can be down forty - love and still win the game; one or two poor strokes in Golf doesn't put you out. However, depending on the day, 24/25 or 49/50 may not be good enough. If a person can do something as difficult and as complicated as shoot a small moving object 49 times out of 50, then the problem is not with their technique, equipment or ability. The problem is most likely involves the inner game. We miss because we doubt our own ability.

To understand self doubt it is necessary to look at how the brain functions. Basically and for the purposes of this discussion, the brain is divided into two halves; the right side and the left side. These different sides play an

important role in our ability to shoot, play golf, tennis, etc. The right side of the brain is responsible for muscle movement and co-ordination. In shooting this involves seeing the target, identifying it, tracking it, moving the body, holding the gun correctly, pulling the trigger and following through. The right side of the brain does and can continue to do these functions effortlessly and continuously. All that it required is that the muscles need to be relaxed.

The left side of the brain however, houses our language, analytical and judgemental skills. The left side also believes that our right side is incapable of doing what is necessary and therefore provides it with a barrage of instructions and "coaching tips" so that it can do it properly. In his book, *The Inner Game of Golf*, Tim Gallwey identifies these two sides of the brain as ego states and calls them Self 1 for the left side and self 2 for the right side of the brain. Gallwey found that when he was involved in a competition he would have to continually listen to a range of self-instructional thoughts. On closer analysis of these thoughts he determined that it was self 1 doing the talking, it thought he knew how to play and was supervising self 2, the one who had to hit the ball or hit the clay target in respect to shooting. Self 1 did not only give self 2 instructions but criticised self 2 for past errors, warned self 2 about probable future ones, and harangued him whenever he makes a mistake. These instructions and judgements lead to an increase in tension, which in turn tightens the muscles; the result, is that we are no longer fluid or relaxed and therefore we cannot perform to our potential.

To summarise self 1 - the talking, thought producing self - is a lousy boss when it comes to control the body's muscle system. When self 2 - the body itself - is allowed control, the quality of performance, the level of enjoyment and the rate of learning are all improved. Self 2 is the total human organism, the natural entity. Self 1 does not have a physical existence; it is a phenomenon of mental self-interference who can and does interfere with our ability to perform.

For the brain to function closer to its potential the interference needs to be minimised. This means that the basic premise of the inner game is; Performance = Self 2 (potential) minus Self 1 (interference). The object of inner game is to limit the interference of self 1 and trust in self 2 to perform and achieve.

Inner game techniques involve applying mental training skills that enable the shooter to maintain concentration, optimise performance and achieve results. These skills are not just the province of elite sportspeople; they can be learnt, so we can increase our performance, enjoyment and fun involved in competition.

Every time we compete, we make judgements as to our performance. When we are winning, we enjoy the handshakes, pats on the back and as a result we see ourselves and what we did as good. However, when we lose a competition or miss a shot, it is just as easy for us to judge what we did as bad. This value judgement of our performance has wide reaching implications. For example, for a right handed shooter, missing a hard right hand swinger from lane five. It is possible that self 1 will say something like: "...you missed again, you always miss those right hand swingers, you're really no good at these." If left unchecked and you miss that shot again, self 1 will increase the criticisms and begin to make it personal; for example, "...you missed it again. You're just no good at all." We now see ourselves as the problem not just the fact that for some reason or other we missed that target.

The first step to inner game success is to let go of the judgements. It is important that we see our performance as simply that: how we performed today. We must let go of the need to base our self image/esteem on what we have achieved or what we think others will think about us as a result of our performance.

The second step is to trust self 2's ability and to stop trying. When we give ourselves the instruction to try harder, what we are really doing is tensing and tightening our muscles. In short; trying fails. Once we can let go of our judgements and trust in self 2 we can go onto to quieting the mind.

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HARASSMENT IN SPORT

Harassment in sport can serve to drastically undermine the benefits of involvement in clay target shooting. The unfortunate reality is that clay target shooting, as a sport, is not immune from acts of discrimination, harassment and abuse, rather the contrary, sport provides an environment which in many cases lends itself to conduct which is not only inappropriate, but also unlawful.

Depending on the nature of the case, instances of harassment or abuse in sport can have devastating effects for not only the individuals involved, but also the sporting organisation itself. Apart from exposing the club or association to potential legal liability, officials may be faced with low morale, an unpleasant environment, higher turnover of volunteers and the prospect of long-term damage to the organisation's image and reputation. These are all unnecessary harms which the Australian Clay Target Association is anxious to avoid.

All Clubs are required to abide by the Australian Clay Target Association Member Protection By-Law which reflects to serving and protect its members and participants throughout all levels of the sport. However, the adoption of the Member Protection By-Law itself is just the first step in affording our members and participants the protection they deserve. The successful implementation and enforcement of this Member Protection By-Law requires the cooperation and commitment of the Australian Clay Target Association members and participants at all levels.

What is Harassment

Abuse is a form of harassment and includes:

- Physical abuse (eg. assault)
- Emotional abuse (eg. blackmail, repeated requests or demands)
- Neglect (eg. failure to provide the basic physical and emotional necessities of life)
- Abuse of power which the harasser holds over the harassed (eg. coach-player or manager-player relationship)

Discrimination

Discrimination is treating or proposing to treat a person less favourably than someone else in certain areas of public life on the basis of an attribute or personal characteristic they have.

Attributes and characteristics include:

Age, disability, marital status, parental, physical features, political belief/activity, pregnancy, race, religious belief/activity, sex or gender, sexual orientation.

All Clubs, Zones and States should appoint a Member Protection Information Officer (MPIO) All State Sport and Recreation departments offer training. This is not an onerous task.

What is the role of the MPIO?

The MPIO is there to support the person making the complaint and suggest how to best solve the situation. IT IS NOT THE ROLE OF THE MPIO to investigate. The MPIO should listen to the complaint and make suggestions on who to approach and how, also to assist the person to find the appropriate avenue for this process.

To prevent these destructive and harmful

outcomes from occurring, your club needs to implement and maintain practices and procedures which:

- Protect your club's members – including athletes, administrators, coaches and officials – physically and emotionally from harassment
- Endeavour to get the right people involved in your organisation ie good recruitment
- Protect your member's personal information.

Member protection is also about effective risk management of two of the biggest risks to your club – losing participants and harming members.

The benefits of this approach are:

- it is an effective deterrent to harassment
- it promotes awareness of appropriate behaviour
- it ensures that complaints can be dealt with quickly, responsibly and effectively
- it is often a requirement of funding organisations
- it promotes compliance with the law.

Benefits:

- member protection information officer would ensure your club handled complaints in an appropriate and consistent manner. They do not investigate complaints but help the person with the concern to deal with what has happened.
- Appointing someone in the role who is approachable, accessible and able to maintain confidentiality ensures people in your club have someone supportive to go to with their concerns and to access information.

ROY HOLTRETER (The Sheriff)

In almost any organisation you care to mention, you will find some person is the driving force that makes the enterprise successful, Roy was such a person.

The Holtreter family arrived in Northam in 1945 and established Holtreter Engineers. There was Roy's father, Max and his two brothers, Denny & Brian. The business subsequently became one of the largest employers in Northam and a most successful enterprise.

Little wonder then that the organisations that Roy became involved in, felt the benefit of his ability; such as the town's football club (Secretary for four years), foundation member of the Northam trotting club, foundation member of the Northam rodeo committee and member for seventeen years.

In 1952 Roy became interested in clay target shooting, which turned out to be very fortunate for the sport, not only in Northam, but in Western Australia and Nationally. In 1953 he convened a meeting to form the Northam & Districts Gun Club and has been a committee member since its inception and president for five years.

At a meeting in Geraldton in 1955 he assisted with the formation of the West Australian Clay Target Association and was the Northam club's delegate to that Association till 1992 and it's president from 1965 to 1968. 1979 saw him elected as the West Australian delegate to the Australian Clay Target Association and then to its management committee. Then in 1981 was elected vice president and president in 1984 a position he held till 1988.

Life membership was bestowed on him by the Northam Clay Target Club

and the West Australian Clay Target Association in 1979 and in 1982 the Australian Clay Target Association also made him a life member.

Perhaps the greatest honour he received was in 1988 when the Australian Clay Target Association awarded him the presidential medal in recognition of his contributions over the years to the sport.

In 1991 Perth was selected to run the World Trap & Skeet Championships, Roy was elected chairman of the organising committee.

1980 he was manager of the WA team at the Sultan of Jahore's birthday championships, held in Malaysia, 1985 manager of the Australian skeet team to San Antonio Championships in Texas U.S.A.

Other position he held were Australian Handicapper 1979/81, Australian Rules Supervisor 1982/85, WA Referee Examiner, Westralian Sports Person of the Year (Clay Target Shooting) 1991, Northam Sports Star (Senior) of the Year 1986, The Fred Killick community Service Award 1991 & nominee 2000, elected first life member of the Northam Club Inc (Est 1901) in 2003.

While all this was going on, one could be excused for wondering how he found time to compete, somehow he did, and there would be no doubt in the minds of the other competitors that Roy was in the event he would be hard to beat, especially if there was a shoot off.

To list all the events Roy won would be difficult indeed, however it can be said with reasonable accuracy that around Australia he won: 34 Club Championships, 31 District or Zone Championships, 17 State Championships, 7 Commonwealth Championships, 6 National Championships, 4 Field Championships. In addition to these he qualified for the Australian Trap team 3 times, Australian Skeet once, State Trap team 21 times, State Skeet team 13 times & State ISU Skeet team once.

The Sherriff: How Roy came to be affectionately called The Sherriff is somewhat of a mystery, but somehow it seemed to fit, and when problems arose, as they often did, either at events or meetings, The Sheriff was always there to help get things back on track.

To be extremely competitive and at the same time be a true sportsman is not always easy, but Roy fulfilled both these attributes, and was never heard to find excuses when beaten, sometimes he would say "I just didn't shoot good enough" and was always the first to congratulate the winner.

Roy will be remembered for many years in the shooting fraternity for his honesty, sense of fair play, sportsmanship and his capacity for sheer hard work, and not the least, when shooting was over his fellowship.

We will miss The Sheriff.

NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. **Note:** A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 25 Pair (50 targets) with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
3. Nominations to be received by close of business Friday 31st December 2010. **There is a maximum 125 competitors for ISSF Trap. If Pre-nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$25.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the Championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if vacancies exist.**
4. Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event. Any withdrawals after an event has started will forfeit their nomination.
5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.
6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the **LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.**
7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may **INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.**
10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised up to **FIVE (5) TARGETS.**
11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun.
15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their section and grade. Except in Double Trap.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events.
18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate. As per ISSF Rules (clothing).
21. **All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws etc. In WA a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into the State.**

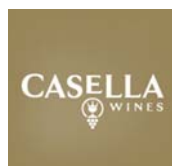

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

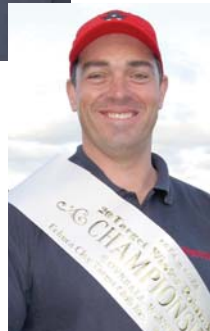

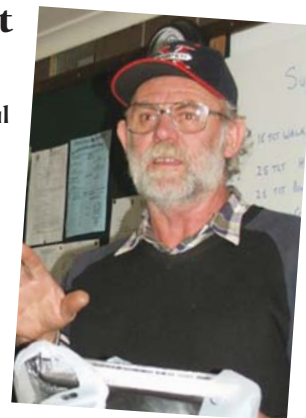
