

National President's Notes



Skeet shooters would be aware by now that the ACTA currently has ICTSF approval to host the ICTSF World Skeet Championships back to back with the Skeet Nationals in 2012, at a date to be confirmed. Following the disastrous attendance at the last World ICTSF Skeet and the resultant large loss it is imperative that we host a financially successful event. If England and then Australia, the two largest members of the ICTSF, both run the event at a large loss it could possibly be doomed forever.

We were originally under the impression from previous ICTSF meetings we attended that the event would be

conducted using the host countries rules, and have recently been trying to confirm this. At this stage we cannot say under which rules the competition will be conducted. ACTA will be represented at the next ICTSF World meeting which is to be held prior to the ICTSF World Sporting in New Zealand in early February 2011, and we have requested this matter be placed on the agenda.

It is our intention to get the feeling at this meeting of the other countries that make up the World ICTSF and then come back to discuss the matter fully at an informal meeting of Australian Skeet shooters during the National Skeet in May. We know that without a large attendance of Australian shooters the event will be a failure, and if skeet shooters don't intend supporting the event, we must ask ourselves – why host it? There is a lot of pressure on the ICTSF body not to support us hosting the event using American Skeet or similar rules as opposed to the English Skeet rules. The NSSA already run an American Skeet World Championship event and we can understand why they would be upset if we held a World Championship using the same or similar rules. Either way following the informal skeet meeting we should be able to make a decision in late May as to how the event will be conducted, giving skeet shooters at least a year to prepare. Please be aware that the ACTA has spent a lot of time and effort to bring this event to Australia and ask that skeet shooters understand that some of these decisions may be beyond the control of your Association. I would welcome any constructive input on this matter from shooters via email.

The Commonwealth Games are now a distant memory in most of our minds, and it is disappointing to have to report that despite numerous requests we have received few photographs and hardly any report from AISL for publication in our CTSN. I apologise to our Commonwealth Games Team members for this, especially our medal winners, and assure you all that our dissatisfaction with this matter has been brought to the attention of the AISL board as it is simply not good enough. The lack of photographs and reports from an event at the highest level in our sport cannot be accepted.

Graeme Boyd our National Coaching Director is currently preparing a submission to the Executive for a new ISSF Overseas Team selection process separate to those conducted by AISL, and aimed at younger and currently unfunded ISSF shooters. Briefly he hopes to select two groups of shooters to attend two overseas events annually starting in 2012 at the latest with selection from a mix of State Titles in 2011 and the 2012 Nationals.

This program will hopefully be ongoing and the Association is currently actively seeking an Association Team sponsor, with discussions with prospective supporters taking place at the moment.

Graeme also believes the Australia Cups should be held whenever possible within our existing State Titles not as stand alone events, which stretch both our shooters and volunteer finances for no apparent good reason. When completed and approved by the executive we hope this proposal will encourage development in our ISSF ranks, and put some life back into ISSF State Titles and the Nats.

National Coaching Director's Report

2011 will without question be the most important year I will have in a number of different ways. I have a number of projects that need to be up and running smoothly by December 2011 in coaching accreditation, junior and 18 to 23 year old coaching and international experience, ACTA ISSF International teams and ISSF team selection. To improve any of the above will require the support of all the States and the ACTA Executive.

In coaching we have looked at and trialled a number of coaching ideas over the last two years and I am not satisfied with the way things are moving. We are not increasing the number of coaching camps held or the number of coaches in our sport. There are a number of reasons that have created this problem and they need to be addressed. I have arranged a meeting of the ACTA coaching committee in January to look at some new ideas and address the problems we currently are experiencing. I am very confident that with a few changes and lifting the profile of a coach in the shooting world we will be able to help our members improve their shooting skills.

To all the juniors we have been involved with during the last year I want to congratulate you all on your achievements, from Jack Collicoat's World Championship Gold Medal, to Emma Cox, Kayla Grassi and John Duryea your success and the representation for the ACTA in Somoa was outstanding, to (skeetie) Eddie Elder shooting his first 100 straight in trap. Every improvement, no matter how small, is a step closer to your goal. Jack did not go from shooting tomatoes in his back yard and a junior school boy trophy winner to world champion the next day, but these were steps towards his Gold Medal. We all must keep giving these young shooters opportunities.

MEN'S TRAP

Extreme heat and humidity could not distract Men's Trap Pair Michael Diamond and Adam Vella from a prized gold medal. Michael shot four flawless rounds and Adam dropped just two targets overall for a joint score of 198 to set a new Commonwealth Games Record and snatch the gold medal away from India and England.

"It's been exactly 10 years since I have done something like this," Michael said. "That was back in Sydney, at the Olympic Games in 2000."

The second-placed Indian pair was hot on the heels of the Australians. The local favourites faltered early and finished with 197. England finished wih bronze, scoring 193.

"We knew they were quite close," Adam said. "But all you can do is keep doing your best and it all worked out in the end."

Adam and Michael have now won the Trap Pairs event three times in a row, previously in Melbourne in 2006 and Manchester in 2002.

Michael added a silver medal to his collection in the Men's Trap Individual event. He placed 2nd behind England's Aaron Heading by just one target, scoring 146.

"I know this one is going to mean a little more to me," he said following his performance. "To shoot that many targets, you really do have to be in competition shape . . . I'm happy with how it all went."

Both Aaron and Michael smashed a Finals Record in the Commonwealth Games. Previously, it was held in a three-way tie at 138 targets. Bronze went to India following a shoot-off with Australia's second competitor Adam Vella, both initially shooting 144 targets.

WOMEN'S TRAP

Laetisha Scanlan and Stacy Roiall were unable to qualify for the finals of the Women's Trap Individual event, placing 11th and 16th respectively. Englishwoman Anita North broke a Commonwealth Games Record with her gold-medal-winning score of 93, previously held at 92 targets by South Africa's Diane Swanton.

However, not to be outdone by their male counterparts, the ladies did win gold medals in equally tough conditions in the Pairs competition. As a Commonwealth Games debutant, Laetisha said she was "very happy" with her win.

"Trap is a sport where you miss targets in the hot and humid conditions ... confidence helped me a lot," she said.

Both Stacy and Laetisha were able to overcome fatigue to score 94, two ahead of their closest competitors in England and three ahead of bronze medallists in Canada.

MEN'S DOUBLE TRAP

Russell Mark gave winning a medal in the Men's Double Trap Individual event a solid attempt, but was ousted to 5th place with a score of 183. The three position winners above him all scored 186 in the final and participated in a shoot-off to decide the silver and bronze medal winners. Englishman Stevan Walton won outright with 190, followed by Ronjan Sodhi of Indonesia and Timothy James Kneale from the Isle of Man.

Russell and Double Trap teammate Nicholas Kirley missed out on a bronze medal for the Pairs event by 2 targets to a Malaysian pair. The duo hit 184, but the winning team from England managed five more hits with a score of 189. India won the siler medal just behind on 188.

MEN'S SKEET

Clive Barton was just barely out of the running for a shoot-off to decide the bronze medal winner in the Men's Skeet Individual component. His 142 targets was just 1 point from the 143 required to compete for 3rd place. Fellow Aussie Anthony Sottosanti was further down the field in 12th place after hitting 115 targets.

In the Pairs event, Cyprus equalled the Commowealth Games Record of 194 set in 2002 to win the gold medal. Australia's Clive and Anthony placed 6th with a score of 184. Canada won wilver and England claimed bronze.

he Patrons Trophy is one of our clubs most prestige and honoured events on our shooting calendar. This is not a particularly large event with regards to targets shot but normally well attended because of the variety of the events and the exceptional trophies donated by our Patron Mark Stoneman.

Mark set the competition program with his choice being five events of 20 targets from double barrel, points score, single barrel, continental and double rise.

The early morning rain may have prevented some local people from attending or others travelling from our neighbouring clubs but 56 shooters turned up and the rain cleared. Under cloudy conditions but still good light the shooting began the red targets looked great on the green background of the hill.

Event 1 20T DB had progressed well with six possible scores, a possible in each grade well done to the B & C graders Rob Dwyer, Jim Davis and Steve Goss.

Event 2 20T PTS didn't produce any maximum scores and only three shooters came close with Joe Davis, Ant Hanna and Alan Bosworth achieving 59/60.

The weather was kind for the shooters throughout the night, staying mild and calm for the entire shoot, making some good scores possible, and providing the opportunity for several shoot offs, needed to finalise placings. Echuca member, Drew Healey was the shooter on fire, entering three of the shoot off's out of the four events and winning the main event, the 25 target Double Barrel "Club Champion",

Drew needed to be a paid up member of Mathoura Gun Club to be eligible to win the Sash, and he was! And he also had to survive an onslaught from another Echuca member, John Berryman, who is also a paid up member of the Mathoura club,

20/20 result collected the 1st place trophy, Drew Healey in 2nd place, one target down on a 19/20, and Euroa shooter Laurie Fitzpatrick, taking 3rd place with a result of 17/20

A ten target Single Barrel was next, and needing only two targets more to collect 1st place, Drew Healey, again triumphant with a score of 12/12, Mathoura President, Roger Kerslake, taking 2nd place after missing his 12th target to end on an 11/12 score, and Cobram member Brian Hoyland collecting 3rd place with a 10/11 result.

Ten targets of Points Score was event three, and Mathoura shooter George Bradley was the designated 1st place winner with a score of 39/45, B Cook designated 2nd with a 30/30 result, and Trevor Berryman, another Mathoura member, shot a score of 36/45 to put his stamp on the 3rd place trophy. Some of these scores may not look right, but as with most clubs at their Christmas shoots, they do not allow a shooter to collect a 1st place trophy more than once in the short events.

With four full squads of shooters to shoot 55 targets, plus shoot offs, and including eating a very enjoyable evening meal, it was always going to be a late night, but because the whole shoot ran so smoothly it surprised all that virtually everyone had left the grounds no later than 30 minutes after midnight.

Juniors shoot the lights out in Australia Cup Final

USTRALIA'S JUNIOR SHOTGUN TEAM have shown they are ready to take the next step in their careers after a string of impressive performances over the weekend at the 2010 Australia Cup Final and Grand Prix event in Melbourne during December.



2010 Australian Junior team members Teegan McCloy (NSW), Michael McNabb (NSW) and Anthony Sottosanti (VIC) all shot Performance Qualifying Scores (PQS) in their respective events, while dual Olympic Gold medallist Michael Diamond also shone in the men's trap.

McCloy, 16, held off a quality field in the women's trap Australia Cup Final after setting a score of 69 from 75 targets in the qualifying rounds, a personal best for the New South Wales youngster.

In the final, McCloy faced 2004 Olympic gold medallist Suzy Balogh (NSW), Commonwealth Games gold medallists in the women's trap pairs Stacy Roiall (VIC) and Laetisha Scanlan (VIC), 2010 Junior World Championship silver medallist Catherine Skinner (VIC) and the rapidly improving Michelle Beecham (VIC). McCloy shot 17 targets from

In the men's trap event Michael Diamond (NSW) showed he is still at the top of the sport in Australia with an impressive performance that saw him shoot a total of 144 after the final to win the gold medal by two targets from Todd Malone (VIC) and Adam Vella (VIC), who was one target back in third place.

Diamond shot a PQS score of 121 in the qualifying rounds

which gave him a three target lead heading into the single barrel final, too much of a lead for his opposition to make up.

New South Wales junior Michael McNabb, who had not qualified for the Australia Cup Final and had to settle for a place in the Grand Prix field, also impressed with a PQS score of 121, showing that he is ready to challenge perennial favourites Diamond and Vella in the future.

Craig Trembath (VIC) took the honours in the men's double trap after a score of 46 in the final was enough to reel in Russell Mark (VIC) by one shot.

Mark held a two shot lead heading into the 50 target final but could only manage 43 targets, to finish one behind Trembath and four ahead of third placed Nicholas Kirley (VIC).

In the men's and women's skeet events, Laura Coles (WA) and Kieth Ferguson (VIC) took the honours after recording totals of 143 and 86 in their respective competitions.

The next major event for the Australian shotgun group will be the ACTA National Championships, being held in Perth from January 17-23, which serves as an important PQS event for all Australian team hopefuls.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. If a vacancy exists in any events at the Championships a person must nominate for all events they wish to shoot at the nomination window in one visit. To be eligible to shoot in any event the nomination must be received before 10.00am on the day of the event.
- 2. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 3. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- 4. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event should (if possible) be done giving 48 hours notice in writing (if possible) prior to the event or by ringing the National Office and leaving a message after hours.
- 5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred.
- 6. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
- 7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 9. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade and section prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
- 21. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 22 Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

ATTENTION!

Following on from last month, I intend to explore the mental skills that athletes need to have available to them to be able to perform to their maximum level. I have already touched on goal setting so this month the focus will be on attention.

How many times when we were at school did a teacher say "pay attention", or your mother or father mutter, "I wish you'd pay attention". So what did our teachers and parents want us to do, and why is it so important. This concept of paying attention jumped out at me recently when I was helping a shooter: I was trying to get her to understand being in the here and now and used a mindfulness technique. To make sure that she was focused on what was happening for her right here and now, I asked her to focus on the feelings of her weight in her shoes, could she feel where the pressure was? Was it her toes, was it the balls of her feet, was it her heels feeling the weight and pressure? I then asked if she could feel the collar of her shirt against her neck, the brow of her hat against her forehead, the feel of the hem of her skirt against her legs. She replied: "I can now because I'm paying attention to them." That is the secret of staying in the here and now: pay attention to what is happening to you.

According to Burton and Raedeke (2008) Attention is the process that directs our awareness to information available through our senses. Great sentences, but what does it mean? Most of the time our senses are attacked and bombarded with stimuli. For instance you may be reading this article but you might also become aware of external stimuli of something cooking and you may feel hungry. You might smell something burning and you might feel worried. When you notice certain sensory information you must a decision on what action to take and this process requires attention. Thus, according to Raedeke and Burton, attention involves perceiving sensory information and using it to make decisions and choose responses.

Each sport is unique in the sensory information that needs to be attended to for an Ideal Performance State (IPS). Nideffer (a renowned US sports Psychologist) has developed an applied theory of concentration, which should be considered by all athletes and coaches. To understand this theory it is necessary to realise that for each of us an optimal level of arousal will coincide with efficient use of attentional capacities; this is referred to as our ideal performing state (IPS). At this IPS, we efficiently match the attentional demands of the situation with use of appropriate type of concentration. When we are not at our ideal performing state it is because the types of attentional focus becomes inefficient and mismatched with the situational demands. Nideffer believes that we all have an individual concentration style, which means that we have characteristic ways of using our attentional capabilities. Nideffer describes concentration as being either broard or narrow. An analogy here is like a torch with a variable beam: broad type of concentration is when the beam is broad and wide and narrow type, is when the beam is focused on a small point. Jeffery Bond argues that Nideffer also sees influences on concentration as either external or internal. We can now measure our concentration style in each of these types of concentration:

- Broad -External: awareness of everything that is going on around - seeing, hearing, feeling. Necessary for good court/field vision. Probably more critical in team sports than individual
- 2. Narrow External: Abiltiy to concentrate in a focused way, to focus

- on the one thing, to narrow onto the relevent aspects of a task. Very useful in target skills and as a way of blocking distractions.
- 3. **Broad Internal**: Need to analyse, organise and plan. The ability to mix it with what is going on and draw some logical conclusions. Being able to deal with a large number of ideas at the one time.
- 4. **Narrow Internal:** Ability to focus on a single thought or idea and stay with it. Needed to enhance awareness of aspects of body reactions to stress (tight muscles, too high heart rate, etc) Usually indicates extreme dedication and capacity to follow instructions, to stick to a performance plan.

Beyond focusing on the task relevant cues (attention) athletes need to be able to block out all internal and external distractions. This ability to sustain focus and effective block out distractions is called concentration. Effective concentration allows athletes to apply appropriate attention to the internal and external cues. According to Perry, an athlete that who can focus, or pay attention, on the task at hand and avoid distractions enjoys the greatest possibility of success.

It is difficult to differentiate attention from 'focus' or 'concentration', and it appears that psychologists have struggled for hundreds of years to come up with a common understanding and definition. Bruce Abernethy, from the University of Queensland, has identified three major uses of the term attention;

Firstly, attention as alertness. This includes concerns with the development and both short-term and long-term maintenance of optimal sensitivity and readiness to respond. The best example I can think to describe this would either be walking through a paddock and you flush a quail or waiting for the target in a ISSF skeet. As an athlete your alertness and readiness depends upon your emotional state: basically being either too relaxed or too anxious. Anxiety tends to restrict your attention span, that is, narrowing the focus, which may lead to missing important cues that would have contributed to a successful performance. Anxiety also has the effect of shifting you from the automatic and subconscious, to the controlled and conscious processing, which would lead to the phenomenon called choking. Also the anxious state makes the task involve more effort which will increase fatigue and increase the likelihood of developing self doubt because you will be over analyzing every shot and movement, and in the process tighten up your muscles, so that you are unable to perform to your ideal state.

Secondly, attention as a limited capacity or resource. For the shooter, this means the ability to have a broad focus whilst you are waiting to shoot and being able to shift your attention to a narrow focus when it is your turn to shoot. It would be impossible to maintain a narrow focus throughout a whole round of 25 targets. There is no need as this would be very ineffective and would lead to a severe headache among other things. This is why shoot off conditions often seem easier, because you are only focused on one target.

Finally, attention as selectivity. By this I mean that that some information is selected as important and some stimuli are ignored because they are irrelevant. Effective selective attention begins with an understanding of how to differentiate between distractions and the relevant cues.

Abernethy describes the concept of selective attention by using the metaphor of a searchlight and describes three common errors: If the searchlight beam is too broad, then you are failing to focus all attention on the limited essential elements for success. If the searchlight beam is pointed in the wrong direction, then you are being distracted from relevant information by irrelevant information. Finally, if the searchlight beam is too narrow, then the athlete is unable to move from one stimulus to another rapidly enough.

So if we look at attention, focus or concentration, what should we know and what should we do to use it to maximize success. Be aware that attention involves being alert, being able to shift and being selective. You need to know when to have a narrow focus or a broad focus and when to focus on external stimuli or internal stimuli. You should be attending

to the process of what you are doing and not the product you wish to achieve. And finally, you should stay focused and attend to the present. The past will only allow judgments to cloud your thinking and focusing on the future will lead to anxiety.



Clarrie Barnes 19th July 2010

Clarence 'Clarrie' Lindsay Barnes was born on 5th May 1919 to Denholm and Lizzie Barnes. Clarrie grew up on Lethro station in New South Wales with his brothers and sisters.

The Barnes family is well known, brothers Albert, Alec and Frank transformed the outback country and established some major grazing stations including Mungo, Joulni, Lethro whilst



Clarrie owned Leaghur. Lethro station still remains in the Barnes family whilst the others are now government managed.

Clarrie had 3 loves, his wife Gladys, his property Leaghur and clay target shooting.

Clarrie and Gladys were married in 1945 and celebrated their 65th anniversary in March 2010. For the first 10 years they were on Lethro property until 1954 when they put a deposit on Leaghur Station, 40 miles east of Lethro and moved outback away from the Darling River in New South Wales. They were diligent towards paying off the debt owing on Leaghur and achieved this within 7 years – a wonderful feat. From there they built up the stock and land holdings to make Leaghur a very large and well run property. In 1988 Clarrie had a heart bypass and recovered so well he could return to Leaghur and continue working.

Despite many years of fires and drought followed often by floods, Leaghur was always loved by Clarrie. He reluctantly left 43 years later at the age of 79. Clarrie and Gladys retired to Mildura on August 1st 1997.

Clarrie always loved shooting and he first shot competitively well before World War two and became a foundation member of the Mildura Gun Club in 1953. Clarrie represented Australia as a clay target shooter on four occasions; 1957, 1958, 1963 and 1968. The highlights of Clarrie's shooting career included in 1967 winning the State Single Barrel Championships, in 1970 whilst in Adelaide winning the 100 Target Skeet Championship and in 1999 the Banrock Masters Games winning 5 medals which also coincided with celebrating his 54th wedding anniversary. Apart from his badges he has many trophies and numerous sashes.

Clarrie may have been small in statute but he was a giant among the shooting fraternity. Clarrie was considered to be Mildura Gun Club's best second barrel shot at long distance. Clarrie and Gladys are life members of the Mildura Gun Club.

A memorial shoot for Clarrie has been planned by the Mildura Gun Club on Saturday 16th July 2011.

IT'S YOUR CALL by Bill McCarthy

As Referees we are almost certain to come across a situation where there is difficulty whether a target is hit or missed. It is probably more related to what is dust and what isn't and the interpretation some shooters have of what constitutes a broken target and what doesn't.

As the Referee in a squad you have observed a target that has had a significant amount of dust come from it after being shot at. You rule "Lost Target" (Rule 1.08 (g)). However, three other shooters in the squad put their hands up and claim that there was indeed a lot of dust from the target and it should be called as "One". They have argued that it was obvious that the target had been hit by the shot from a competitor's gun.

It's Your Call

If you stick with your original ruling you would be quite correct. There is absolutely no provision in our rules to allow for a dusted target (irrespective of whether it was a lot of dust or a little dust that came from it) to be given as "One". In simple terms, a target must have a visible "chip" come from it. Dust is not considered to be a chip.

Rule 1.08 (g) states very clearly that a "Dusted Target" is a Lost Target.

Rule 1.04 clearly defines a broken target and Rule 1.05 clearly defines a "Dusted Target".

However,t here are occasions where some of the shooters may claim that there was a chip that came off either their target or the target of one of the other competitors in the same squad. You as the Referee have not seen a chip and have ruled "Lost Target".

This is sometimes a dilemma for most of us. Consultation with the scorer and other shooters in the squad is very necessary. To deny a shooter a target that he may have hit is one thing, but to give a target to a shooter on unclear evidence is another. In the latter case you have effectively taken a target off each shooter in that person's grade. Equity and fairness are always at stake in these situations. Therefore your decision must not be taken lightly.

Under Rule 4.16 (b) the ruling made by the Referee as to whether a target has been missed or was legal is final and can't be appealed against in a Jury. Move over, under Rule 4.17 (e) the Referees decision in all cases coming under his jurisdiction if final.

It is incumbent upon us all to make our decisions equitably, sensibly and wisely within the scope of the many rules which apply to the situation encountered, but do not be afraid to rule "Lost Target" if you feel absolutely sure that the target fired at was not broken in the terms laid down in our rules.


would like to thank Robert and Libby for their generosity and this competition will again take place in 2011.

2010 a successful year

A second big shoot is planned for late January 2011 – hopefully it will be well patronised and the start of another successful year for the Callawadda-Stawell club.




