President's Notes

Executive Meeting Outcomes

Recently the full Executive met and all Executive Members were present except Mr. David Howe who was excused due to ill health.

Western Australian delegate Mr. Ian Watson and Northern Territory delegate Mr. Ray Niven

were welcomed to their first face to face Executive Meeting.

Elections were conducted for those positions vacant and Mr. Garry Read was elected Vice President, Mr. Alan Styles Treasurer and Mr. Gary Hayden Secretary.

Many decisions were made, and these included:

Cessation of CTSN Production in Hard Copy

Production and postage costs for the magazine have now reached an unsustainable level. Postage has seen monthly mailing costs rise to between \$14,000 and \$15,000. We believe these monies would be better spent elsewhere. The CTSN will now be produced electronically and all members with email addresses provided to ACTA will be sent a link to access the magazine. The current months magazine will also be sited on the home page of the ACTA website. All copies will continue to be archived in the members section ongoing. Electronic media allows unlimited pages, more pages for the advertising dollar and a greatly reduced lead time, hopefully resulting in a much more relevant and current magazine.

Reduction in Subscription Costs

The savings generated by ceasing production of the CTSN are being used to fund a reduction in the full adult membership fee. This follows the strategy we have adopted to closer align our membership costs with that of other Associations over time. The Full adult fee will now decrease from \$138.00 to \$120.00 effective from the 1st January 2019.

Removal of the \$5.00 State Rebate

States are all capable of raising their own subscription fees and most already do so. It was thought that as at the time this rebate was introduced States were not charging individual member fees. Now that most do they can best set their fee where they need it to be themselves.

Reduction in Club Affiliation Fee

Savings from the removal of the State rebate will be used to reduce the club affiliation fee by one third from \$360.00 to \$240.00 per annum.

ISSF Nationals Dates

Submissions had been received from a large group of ISSF shooters via the VCTA to change the Nationals dates to later in the year.

2019 and 2020 will be held in January with proposed roster and dates supported as below.

Rotations for ISSF National Championships 2020–2024

2020 - New South Wales

2021 - Western Australia 21ST - 27TH Nov TBC

2022 - Victoria 20TH - 26TH Nov TBC

2023 - Queensland 18TH - 24TH Nov TBC

2024 – New South Wales 24TH – 30TH Nov TBC

The ACTA/ASSA Junior Skeet Initiative

Following a suggestion and offer from the ASSA the following terms have been agreed to between Associations for this initiative.

A joint venture as equal funding partners to promote junior participation for Skeet Shooting in Australia. PRIZE: Ist - \$1000, 2nd - \$500.

ELIGIBILITY: Under the age of 18 at the start of the Skeet Nationals and an ACTA Member.

CRITERIA: Any one hundred target score from any State or Territory 12g State Title of any State Carnival. Submit as many State 12g scores as you like and use the best one. PLUS: The combined scores of the National Handicap, 20g, Commonwealth and 12g events. E.g.: 100 + 350 = 450 targets total, best scores win. COMMENCEMENT: Starts 1st June 2018 until the completion of the 2019 Skeet Nationals - (for a 5-year trial).

Traders Area

A Development Application is being presented to council for this area. Once approved it will sit on the table as a shovel ready project awaiting any viable funding stream that may become available.

National Grounds

Work has now commenced on the new entry roadway from Copland Street beside the National Office. A two-lane concrete roadway will run into the western carpark adjoining the Range Conference Centre. This is the final works required to receive our Council occupancy certificate. Council had previously issued an interim occupancy certificate, allowing the Association to use the facility to date. It is expected to have this work completed prior to an official NSW Government opening in October/November.

Audits

The Association has now been advised by the NSW Government that all Grant acquittal documentation has been checked and approved. Final payment of grant funding to the Association has now been made. Along with this audit and our normal annual audit we have also been audited by NSW Treasury continually during the construction period.

A Little Thanks

I write this at the last spot with phone service prior to leaving for Dirk Hartog Island from Steep Point, the most westerly point on the Australian mainland. We travelled here straight across the country and spent a few days camped at the Geraldton club. They had just completed another successful "Shoot" which due to a planning error on our part we missed. Donna and I would like to thank the club and its members for the hospitality shown us during our stay.

Along the way we passed the Leonora club and being right on the roadside we couldn't just drive past.

The new caretaker Alec was only too happy to show us around.

Retirement of Executive Officer

Mr. Tony Turner will be retiring from work by Christmas of this year. The vacancy created has been advertised nationally with specialist Sports recruitment agency, Sportspeople.

At the time of writing applications have just closed and 12 suitable applications have been received. These are now in the hands of the management sub-committee who will consider and short list those

Executive Officer's Report

The focus for the ACTA National Office is squarely on 2019 with a number of changes to the way we operate within the office to be implemented over the next few months. See the Presidents report for a summary of these changes.

Club Secretaries will now be able to reinstate lapsed members (inside a 5 year period). This means that new member applications, ACTA Life Members, Club changes and category charges are required to be sent to the ACTA National Office for processing. This will allow a more timely processing of members who have not re-joined by the 28th February deadline.

Clubs should now have directions from the National Office to login to their Club through the data base and adjust their fees for 2019. The ACTA will update its fees in line with the National Executives decision to lower the price of full membership. The new price of \$120.00 per full membership provides the member with all of the full benefits of the Association.

Club affiliation costs have also dropped as the Executive look to encourage clubs and new members to the Association. The new fee is \$240.00

The Association will conduct an official opening of the National Clubhouse/ Function centre in October where the NSW Coalition Government will be represented and asked to open the building. It goes without saying without the government funding the ACTA would not have been able to deliver the World Championships, National Championships and other private events as we currently do.

A plaque recognising the Government's contribution as well as one recognising the builders and those involved including ACTA Members and Executive of the Association will also be unveiled on the day.

The new Function Centre is now completed and all of the grant money paid to the Association. Infrastructure NSW had an audit of expenses throughout the project as well as the NSW Treasury department. Independent Auditors

RSM also conducted an audit of the accounts and costs as well as the terms and conditions of the grant. Additionally the ACTA Auditors conducted the 2018 Audit and provided the ACTA with a report showing the processes followed by the ACTA were in accordance with the requirements.

The ACTA was compliant with all of the requirements of these audits and the grant.

There are a number of individuals who will be disappointed by the results, unfortunately there are those in the Association who are opposed to the development of the asset and as is common "if we don't know, we will make it up" syndrome is prevalent amongst this group. These audits show the ACTA have the right reporting systems in place. This may disappoint some people however the rank and file member can judge for themselves based on the FACTS provided.

The ACTA has delivered a \$7m asset that provides a second income stream for the ACTA. This will in the future allow flexibility with how the surplus money of the Association is directed. It is a shame a small amount of keyboard warriors with no real knowledge of the Association continue to question and denigrate the ACTA (and therefore the sport) and its Executive Members. The amount of misinformation on some of these social media sites far exceeds anything positive or informative, just more unadulterated and unsubstantiated rubbish.

Authorities who monitor this type of social media must think this is amusing to have some from within trying to tear down the sport and save them putting restrictions on firearms in place. They are just wishing for the sport to implode.

A National Junior Camp was conducted at the National Ground for aspiring juniors over the week leading into the NSW Championships. These athletes were selected as potential leaders of the sport in the future. Potential is one thing, as is talent, what you do with that potential and talent will be determined by the amount of hard work you put in. Over my 30 years in sport administration and development I can assure you some of the most talented juniors have not made an impact at senior level for many reasons including other interests, leaving the sport or they decided not to pursue the sport at this level, there are others who just lack work ethics. This group of young adults displayed plenty of talent and potential, it will be worth watching their progress to see where they end up.

AGM 2019

It is a timely reminder that the AGM will conducted at the Club Hotel in Roma Queensland on Sunday the 31st of March. Agenda items and Notices of Motion need to reach the Executive Officer by the 30th of December 2018 to be included on the Agenda.

I have had numerous discussions over the past two months with our Insurers, Solicitors, Executive of the ACTA and members in relation to the constitution. I will not enter into debate or discussion on the constitution other than to say the contents of the constitution should be read in their entirety when seeking to put points of view forward, particularly taking notice of the Objects of the Sport. The most important issue is the relationship between our insurance and the duty to follow the Constitution and Rules.

The Constitution relates specifically to the Registered Members of the ACTA, its Clubs, Zones and States. It was developed specifically for the betterment, administration and conduct of business for the Australian Clay Target Association.

CHANGES IN OPERATIONS

The National Executive meeting in August resulted in a number of changes to the way the ACTA operates in a number of areas.

The CTSN will be produced in its current form until the December issue, however it will not be printed as at the 1st of January 2019. The magazine will become a **digital publication only** with some additional benefits and options for Clubs, Zones, States and advertisers. The new digital CTSN will be available through a number of mediums, the first will be through the delivery of a link through an email to those who have an email address in the data-base. If your email address is incorrect in the data base then you can change it simply by logging into the data base through mypage or contact your club secretary to update it.

The other option will be to go to the website and click on the current CTSN cover to open the document. This form of delivery will offer the most relevant and current information available. The ACTA will also be able to offer bigger opportunities for Clubs, Zones and State to report on their activities. Competitions will be able to accommodate more photos and recognition of the winners, participants and the Club, Zone and State.

Sponsors and advertisers will be offered the opportunity to add value to their existing advertising with product reviews offered as part of the advertising package. The CTSN will still be the one stop shop to know what's going on in and around the ACTA, its Clubs, Zones and States.

With the new format comes new opportunities, we are not restricted by size, previously because of postage cost the ACTA has had a very strict size allowance available each month. This digital option allows the ACTA to allocate larger advertisements at the same price as 2018. This is a win win for all concerned. The CTSN will be available earlier in the month without having to wait for Australia Post. The cost of these services was considerable taking into account the printing and postage of the magazine.

The Executive also decided to remove the State per capita rebate paid to States for all full members. This rebate was instituted to provide money to States before state affiliation fees were implemented. Given the fee is paid on top of State fees it was abolished in favour of States charging an affiliation fee, that being once only.

FULL MEMBERSHIP AND CLUB AFFILIATION REDUCED

In light of the savings from above the full Executive voted to lower the cost of Full Membership to \$120.00 to encourage further membership of the Association. The Full Membership benefits do not differ from the other categories except for Juniors where the firearms insurance in not available (due to the fact under 18's cannot own a firearm). All other benefits are the same, so a reduction will assist Clubs in gaining and maintaining members.

All other memberships categories are to remain the same as 2017 / 2018 where no CPI was added.

The cost of running a club was also considered with the new Club affiliation set at \$240.00 per year.


Over 90 Shooters at Townsville Annual


Townsville Gun Club July 14 - 15, 2018







Psychological Skills for Shooting

Hypnosis for sport, again

At this years trap Nationals, a reader asked if I could reprint the four articles about hypnosis for sport, especially the scripts. This is the first of the four articles, which outlines what hypnosis is. I need to point out that I have completed a Diploma in Clinical Hypnotherapy,

and as result I see hypnotherapy as a valuable technique in either general therapy or specifically for sport.

Hypnosis has quite a long past and was originally used as an anaesthesia for surgical operations prior to chloroform and other chemicals. The original process was called mesmerism and was developed by Franz Mesmer in the 1700's. Hypnosis took another blow when it was rejected by Freud for psychoanalysis and then hypnosis became commonplace in theatres and with entertainers. Following the Second World War, hypnosis had a revival because of the move away from the lengthy process of psychoanalysis and the need for effective, short-term therapeutic interventions.

There is a general lack of understanding of what hypnosis is in the general community. Stage shows, television and the movies have portrayed a distorted view of this valuable technique. It is necessary to deal with some of the misunderstandings before I deal with the subject in general.

According to Winter & Martin, hypnosis is not sleep. Sleep is a state of reduced consciousness whilst hypnosis is a state of heightened consciousness. Hypnosis is a natural state of mind that we all feel from time to time. Those times when you are so engrossed in a book you do not hear someone at the door or you are driving and you can't recall going past a particular landmark or over a bridge. This is how you can expect to feel as you are hypnotized and it is likened to that feeling just before you go to sleep.

Hypnosis is not a state of being out to it or being in a trance. Actually you are just relaxed. Sometimes, this relaxation can be very deep, but for performance hypnosis there is no need. So as a result you will remember everything that happens to you whilst you are hypnotized.

Because of showman hypnotists, as seen on television, people often think that the hypnotherapist will make them do things that they do not want to do. This is not really possible and will not happen with a psychologist because they are bound by a code of ethical practice. It must also be remembered that hypnosis in sport is used to improve concentration and confidence, reduce anxiety, or to help clients change behaviours such as quitting smoking or losing weight.

Hypnosis in sport had been widely used for sometime in the Eastern Bloc countries. The first scientific report of its use in the Western world was in 1943 when Professor Dorothy Yates used hypnosis to assist a squad of university boxers. In the 1940's-1950's there was widespread use for sports such as basketball, baseball and ice-hockey. In the early 1960's hypnosis was used to assist a Red Sox baseball player, Jackie Jensen, of anxiety due to flying. He was about to give up baseball because he could play away games because of his fear of flying. In Australia, Dr Guy Grant, used hypnosis to help North Melbourne football team win their first-ever grand final.

Athletes, in general have been reluctant to confess that they have been using hypnosis for performance enhancement. This is possibly due to a misguided belief that "tampering with their psyche" is a reflection of a basic weakness, unnatural or unethical. These beliefs cannot be further from the truth. Firstly, there is nothing weak about striving to improve or to enhance your performance. Secondly, it is entirely natural. There are no performance enhancing drugs involved, because in the main it is relaxation with carefully placed

positive suggestions and affirmations. Finally, if practiced by a psychologist, under a rigid code of conduct, and if it is available to all athletes then it can't be considered unethical.

Most people are surprised when they experience their first session because they realize that they weren't asleep and that they could hear everything around them or that they could have opened their eyes. This helps the client better understand that they are in control of their behaviour and environment. It is possible to go into deeper states of hypnosis but still clients are aware of the noises and things around them. Actually, under hypnosis clients are three times more aware of the noises and things around them.

According to Winter & Martin, our normal alert state of consciousness acts something like a watchdog to incoming ideas; it screens what it will let through. This watchdog might often stop positive thoughts from getting through and allows you to dwell on negative judgements about yourself or your performance from the past. Hypnosis helps get the watchdog out of the way so that you can get your message through to the part of the mind where images, attitudes and memories are stored. Hypnosis helps you do this through a combination of physical relaxation and mental concentration.

Over the next few months I will focus further on hypnosis and will include some self-hypnosis strategies for readers to try.


The event was shot in two rounds of fifteen targets, all single barrel, with the final score out of 30.






42nd Anniversary for Wilkawatt


A huge thank you to all the shooters and their families who travelled to join us for the weekend, your support and the generous contributions from our sponsors made our shoot a great success.

End of an Era Interclub Challenge

Eastern Goldfields Clay Target Club Western Australia 2018

There has been many a story of rival clay target competitors and clubs throughout Western Australia, which has been passed down from one trap carnival to the next. Many carry on to achieve almost mythical renditions, but the interclub rivalry and sportsmanship shown year in, and year out, between the Leonora and Eastern Goldfields Clay Target Clubs at their combined closing day shoot will sadly cease to exist. After nearly thirty years of this combined shoot, the lack of new members from the Leonora region has unfortunately seen the end of one of the highlights of the Northern and Eastern Goldfields clay target calendar.

Originally started way back in 1968 as a Northern Goldfields and Eastern Goldfields interclub challenge, it also included in the mix the Kambalda, Laverton, Leinster, Leonora and Southern Cross Clay Target Clubs. The clubs have slowly folded and the members have moved on, or joined the more financially viable clubs as the cyclical nature of gold and nickel industries and the emphasis on FIFO work, has changed the sporting landscape throughout the region.

In the last decade or so, the closing day has been seen as a fun and family-oriented day, with many coming along to spend a day of cheer or to catch up with old shooting friends and share stories of years past. The main competition had usually been shot in the sequence of a 25 target skeet, 25 target tower and 25 target double barrel and then 25 target handicap (for the Ken & Sue Green Closing Day Perpetual Trophy), and lastly, a 25 points score (for the Mazza Perpetual Shield). Variations on this sequence caused all sorts of chitchat over the years. The relevant trophies

that made up the whole event were as follows; the Bernie Mazza Perpetual Shield, a Zone Six (which ceases to exist), Interclub Teams Match consisting of the 25 points score between Eastern Goldfields CTC and Leonora CTC; the Rogers Shield, consisting of a 25 double barrel match between the Eastern Goldfields CTC and Leonora CTC; the Joe Pintaudi Cup, consisting of a 25 target handicap; and the Ken & Sue Green Closing Day Perpetual Trophy, consisting of 25 handicap, 25 skeet, 25 tower and 25 double barrel. These trophies held pride of place over the years at the relevant winning clubs. The establishment of the Ken & Sue Green trophy was to commemorate the toil and determination of a few dedicated members of the Eastern Goldfields CTC, who resurrected the club after fire, destroyed the previous clubrooms.

In its most recent form the closing day shoot has been sponsored by Ken and Sue Green for over a decade. As is the norm in the Goldfields, most people are in Goldfields due to the work opportunities. They were based in Leonora and together with a core group of eight members ran the Leonora club. Through support of the surrounding mines and community, they managed to build the club up to thirty or so members. It was during this time that Kalgoorlie members had dwindled to a handful in the immediate aftermath of the destruction of the Eastern Goldfields CTC clubrooms (and the council-imposed exile to a new block of land outside the city limits), that Ken and Sue got to know many of the Kalgoorlie members. A number of these members would venture up to Leonora and compete, as they had no grounds. Ken and Sue, president and secretary respectively of the Leonora club at that time, had also noticed the mutual support between both clubs. As years passed the new Eastern Goldfields clubrooms was

rebuilt by a small group of dedicated members, many of whom had become good friends with the Leonora shooters, and some have sadly passed on. Of those dedicated members, Mick Rowell, Russell Day, Merv and Toni Wright, Bruce Hooper, Hazel and Merv Neve, Jim Neve, Shane O'Brien and Bruce Pritchard (deceased) need mentioning, amongst others, I have been assured. It was for this reason the unrelenting desire to support, and put in when the chips were down and rebuild the Eastern Goldfields Club from scratch, that Ken and Sue have, and have continued until recently to support and sponsor the clubs closing day shoot. A shoot where the champion was decided over trap, skeet and tower.

The club would like to thank Ken and Sue Green for their generous sponsorship over the years and to acknowledge their dedication to our club, and that sponsors like Ken and Sue have, in no small part, enriched the sport of clay target shooting. Today the club continues the tradition to improve its facilities and foster great camaraderie.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."
