# President's Notes

Shooting Australia (SA)

A forum of SA members concluded in Brisbane yesterday the 10th of May with all member bodies represented except Sporting Clays Australia. Former Commonwealth

Games rifle shooter, Bruce Scott, who has served as a Director for seven years retires on the 12th of May and I take this opportunity to thank him for his contribution to the sport. His position has been filled by well-known ACTA member Desiree Baynes. Congratulations to Desiree in being offered this role. I am sure that Desiree will bring a balanced and practical view to the SA Board table.

*The forum touched on many issues and positively addressed several of them.* 

Sport Australia, the operating arm of the Australian Sports Commission, now has no requirements for National Sporting Organisations (NSO) in our case Shooting Australia to be involved in the coaching accreditation area. This matter was raised by Pistol Australia who shares common ground with ACTA on this issue. ACTA do not support another level of unnecessary administration in an area that was successfully handled in-house for many years. The ACTA will now look at what is required to re-introduce our own coaching accreditation scheme.

## **Gender Equity**

Information was provided to the forum that as of the 1st of July the Victorian Government will not fund any sports whose governing body does not have 40% representation of women at the highest level. This issue will not go away and as a male dominated sport we need to look at ways to include more women in the future. With 15 seats around the Executive table I think the most female representatives I have seen at any one time since 1990 is 2.

# Paratrap

Although not yet proposed as part of the Para Games program, Para Trap will now feature at Para Worlds going forward. The ACTA may now need to look at ways of including this and other Para events within our various National titles. Any suggestions regarding this would be welcome.

# **Constitutional Review**

The Sub-committee formed to consider this issue, chaired by Vice President Mal Dyson will meet at Wagga Wagga on the 24th of May. The members of this body represent all sides of the argument as we saw it evolve last time.

It is hoped over time that consensus can be reached on a document to eventually be presented to the members at an AGM for adoption.

# Office Review

The CEO has conducted an office review, as supported by

the Executive at its last meeting, with some changes already being made. With changes in most areas of administration arising from more use of electronic media, digital platforms, online nominations and membership it was inevitable that job descriptions within the office would have to change. Existing staff have all been provided with the new job descriptions for their consideration.

Advertising has also begun for a new position of a Media Officer. Those of you who followed the recent DTL Nats with scores online, live streaming, regular Facebook updates and website links to thousands of photographs daily would acknowledge that this coverage was the best to date. Many who could not attend commented that it made them feel they were there. Unfortunately, from an ACTA perspective the only content produced and disseminated by the ACTA was the Live Scores. Most other content was provided by QCTA State Administrator Debbie Young and Roma members Pat Magee and Sharon Purcell, with photographs by Luke Luckhoff. The new position created will ensure that the ACTA is in control of its own destiny in this area in the future.

# Negative Social Media

I am often made aware of negative media posts and normally choose to ignore them. However, posts leading up to the DTL Nats were not only misleading and in some cases defamatory, they also affected attendance. eg: Those responsible for posts advising all camp sites were booked out, caused much confusion and angst for no good reason. However, the positive posts from so many sources soon shut down the negative comments once the event started.

# **Rules Supervisors Meeting**

The Rules Supervisors meeting to be held in June will not only include State Rules Supervisors but also State Handicappers. It was raised at the last Executive meeting that handicappers should be included, and ACTA has notified all states accordingly. Known agenda items and a request for new items from the states has also been advised. This meeting will be held in late June and funded half by the states and half by ACTA.

# **Executive Meeting**

Set down for July/August with exact dates to be confirmed, these meetings will be over 3 days and will include all subcommittees and the full Executive. This is also when our elections are held. States should be finalising any agenda items they wish to have on the table soon.

## Mackintosh Teams

An anomaly in the selection policy that arose out of the World DTL team selections has been considered and addressed by the Executive. The top 25 qualifiers were not recorded as such when some were transferred to section teams prior to shooting the Mackintosh. Most of the Executive believe the top 25 is the

# SOUTH AUSTRALIAN STATE DTL CARNIVAL

Well, another year has come and gone. Yes, almost 12 months to the day, we were all here at the South Australian Clay Target Association State DTL Carnival. This year from Thursday January 31st through to Sunday February 3rd sees our 3rd year that the Carnival is extended to be 4 days of competition, based on the success of the reintroduction of the State Champion of Champions. A good decision on behalf of the State Board.

By Wednesday afternoon, the grounds of the State Shooting Park were already buzzing with activity as the usual caravanners and campers arrived, getting themselves a favourable vantage spot for the 4 days of shooting competitions. All the Trade stands were being erected with lots of great goodies on show for everyone to feast their eyes on and buy. Competitors from nearly every State this year, over the 4 days of events, were all vying to try their skill at claiming one of the many Red State sashes that were on offer.

Temperatures for the 4 days were going to be reasonably comfortable in the high 20's to low 30's. The days leading up to the Carnival were quite scary earlier in the week with temperatures reaching 43–46 degrees only a few days ago, and we all had thought of how awful it was a couple of years ago when the Carnival had to be run in similar temperatures. In the background, everyone was out there practicing to make sure they had a psychological edge and to be sure they were used to the background of the various layouts that were being used before the competitions starts tomorrow at 11am.

Early on Thursday morning the officials were running around in a scurry of activity while final checks were being done to the layouts angles, heights, distances and speeds. To this part, a word of thanks has to go out to the Shoot Marshall (Steve Baynes) and his committed team for overseeing trap set-ups over the 4 days. Friends that hadn't seen each other for ages were seen all over the park having a good laugh, telling stories and catching up on the last 12 months. Most interstate visitors came in with their families for the events, and this certainly made for a large crowd of onlookers and a great ambience at the grounds. Even the office was a flurry of activity as we made sure everything was in readiness, especially the important stuff like all the lollies being in their respective bowls for the staff (very important)!! The grounds had been manicured nicely for our competitors, so that everyone could have a great four days of competing without a worry in the world. The office was prepared for the rush of shooters at the ticket window and with nominations

and squadding on cue, right on 11am sharp, 107 competitors (18 squads) started to get called and filed out to the walks to contest the first event which was the 75tgt State 'Champion of Champions' title off 18m. Lurking around every corner and walking amongst us you could see some of the best shooters in Australia waiting to pounce and claim one of the available Red State title sashes. Blowy conditions greeted the shooters with temperatures in the mid 20's. Squads shot their whole 75 targets in 1 visit to the trap with just a reload in between 25's. After shoot-offs, when all had gone quiet, the results were counted and came out as follows: C Grade 1st went to Charlie Noto 103/125, and 2nd was Malcolm Williamson. B Grade 1st went to Kyle Chapman 107/125, and 2nd was Dale Reyne.'A'Grade winner was Wayne Reed 119/125, followed by Anthony Varchione in 2nd place. AA 1st was taken by Acacio Mota with a well shot 103/125, with Peter Winser 2nd place. The Junior category also went to Acacio Mota, Veteran winner was Gary Hayden and the highest scoring Lady was Deserie Baynes. Overall Open for this event was taken by a very happy Darryn Nicholls 142/150.

Presentations were all over by 3.15 and a great day was had by all. Most competitors headed out to the practice trap for some Double Rise practice before everyone started to head to their accommodation for a relaxing break before tackling tomorrow's events.

Friday morning came around and everyone was excited about the next event which was the 25 pair State Double Rise Championship. 127 shooters came out to contest the event in near perfect conditions, which were calm with only a light breeze and temperatures around the low to mid 20's. However, by the time the shoot-off's started, it was a bit blowie which made the targets a little tricky for the shooters. It was over fairly quickly and when the final results came in, they looked like this: C Grade winner was a very excited Rebecca Clinton 38/50, and 2nd went to Matthew Arnold. B Grade was won by a Shannen Gallagher 39/50, while Trevor Scarff took 2nd. A Grade 1st was taken by Sam Daou on 43/50, with 2nd place going to Elio Marianello. AA was won by Ash Hawker 56/60, and 2nd went to Nathan McDonnell. Veteran winner was Colin Dunn, Ladies was Molly Bretag and the Junior winner was Acacio Mota. The Overall State title went to Steve Haberman with a near perfect 48/50. Congratulations Haby!

No sooner had the shoot-offs finished, the first wave of squads were called out for the 50tgt State Handicap. Squad sheets were already out for the competitors so everyone started getting kitted up and at 11.30 we started the rounds to get through 29 squads of shooters. Conditions started to change as we got a bit further into the day with the afternoon winds that prevail here to contend with. As everyone came off, they were 3 and 4 deep at the scoreboard to see what the damage was, and how they had fared up. Eventually, everything went quiet and the shoot-offs went



to the grounds to decide the top 5 positions. Targets were starting to head up to the heavens a little, with the gusty breezes swinging around to be face on.

There were no perfect scores, but 2 competitors shot a 49 and went to face it off for positions 1 and 2. The final results were: 5th Matt Wilson 60/64, 4th Eric Parletta 61/64, 3rd Ash Hawker 48/50, 2nd Billy Baynes 51/53, and then finally the Overall winner of the South Australian State Handicap title for 2019 was Stephen Reyne with a well shot 52/53 and also earning himself the privilege of an extra metre. Congratulations Stephen!

Most of the competitors got to have a small break here while the South Australian Zone teams came out to contest their titles. The 25 target event was shot as a Double Barrel with a point's countback and the final count's look like this: Open winners were Eastern Zone with 123 targets shot out of 125. Team members were Tom Jenkins, Ash Hawker, Dougal Simson, Michael Raper, Andrew Hoare and Gavin Height. The Veteran Team winners were also the Eastern Zone with 73 targets. This team was made up of Bob Andrews, Max Medhurst and Kat. The Junior winning team came from Western Zone on 65 targets. This team was Darcy Claughton, Clay Agnew and Lachlan Koch. Central Zone took out the Ladies with 69 targets and. Team was made up of Sue Byrnes, Layne Pontifex and Molly Bretag. Well done to everyone that competed and congratulations to all the Zone winners.

Another great day and everything done and dusted by 5.15pm. As the 2nd day drew to a close, everyone headed out to some of the local hotels and eateries for a well earned break and to get refreshed for the Saturday morning.



State Ground, Echuca


2019 Victorian State ISSF Championships

It was with a high degree of pride that I rocked up to the State Grounds at the Echuca Clay Target Club and surveyed the venue for the 2019 VCTA State ISSF Carnival. Held form the 3rd-5th of May, the Echuca facilities looked an absolute picture, even though a little wet under foot from recent rain (the first in quite a long time!).

96 competitors from Victoria, New South Wales, Western Australia, South Australia, Queensland, the Australian Capital Territory and even some from New Zealand arrived at the venue and took advantage of the facilities provided. There is no doubt that all the ground's work done by Conrad and Graeme, especially the dispersal of stone and sand in appropriate places and the mowing of the lawns, have helped keep the facilities in pristine condition. Many of the competitors arrived early on the Thursday and the equipment ran full-on throughout the afternoon as people took advantage of the practice facilities.





- No cover will be provided under this policy where the insured, or any other person or entity the equipment has been entrusted to, has breached any law relating to either the storage or use of the firearm(s.)

This insurance is designed to protect each financial member up to \$12,000 with the option to increase this limit to \$25,000 for an additional \$10 payable by the member.

The policy has an excess of \$50 each for every claim and protects members anywhere in Australia 365 days of the year plus overseas for 21 days in any one year.







# Psychological Skills for Shooting

# **Questions?**

Recently I had an email from a shooter asking for my top five psychological factors/hurdles to a shooters performance on the range, and a small insight into how you can train to overcome these.


As questions go this is a lot more complex than it seems. New shooters are going to have a different set of factors and hurdles to that of the experienced shooter. The veteran shooter who isn't shooting up to their previous standard because of age, physical ability, changes in their ability to maintain attention or health problems, will also have a different set of factors from the others. So, too will the shooter who is returning after a break or coming back from an illness or accident.

1. Goals. Regardless of your ability and experience (or inexperience) having map of where you want to get to with your shooting is important. Set goals: make sure they are *Specific* to you and your sport. Make sure they are *measurable, achievable* and *realistic*. Finally, there should be a *time frame* where you can so that you can evaluate your performance and the appropriateness of the goals. Coupled with goal setting are two other important aspects: making a plan to achieve these goals and committing to the plan.

- 2. Keep a Journal. You cannot effectively evaluate your goals unless you have the empirical data to go back through and see where you performed well and not so well. What needs to be kept and what needs to be changed, trained for and practised.
- 3. Pre-shot routine. Whether you shot trap, skeet, sporting or field and game, whether you play golf, bowls, snooker or darts, you need to have a routine before every shot. A pre-shot routine enables you to go over the basics. Are my feet

usual great effort from Pauline and Tracy in the kitchen, lunch followed the first two events. Then it was Fimac 25T handicap time.

Just to make things easy, squad one went to the field with the rain doing its best to hide the targets. It did amazing things for concentration. Fortunately, it eased off by about halfway through and some good scores were had. In a B Graders' day, Lindsay Blewitt scored 24/25 to win round two, with John Walker, 23/25 taking out second place and Keith Pearce, 22/25, gathering up third place. So, at the halfway mark in the Fimac competition, there are still a large number of competitors in the mix to win.

High Gun went to Phil Body with a score of 190/200, whilst Shane Platts proved kind to the treasurer by missing his first target in the shoot raffle. He graciously accepted the meat tray and left the cash to increase for next shoot.

Next month, sees one of the feature events of our year with the contesting of the RV Repairs 100T Continental Open Championship. Once again this event is sponsored by Pres Phil and Treasurer Pauline Body, their sponsorship raising the profile of the event. Practice begins at 9.30 with competition beginning at 10.00. in the right position? What is my gun hold position? What is the point where I will see the target clearly and be able to focus on the target? Where is the kill point? Where do I followthrough to? Sometimes the pre-shot routine might involve a relaxation strategy such as centering, or a visualisation technique, or a key word or phrase.

- 4. Keeping the mind quiet. You cannot focus on the target if there is a continual dialogue going on in your head. Your mind giving you instructions on what to do will not help you hit the target. Negative self-talk that focuses on past failures or judges your self-worth based on your score will not help you hit the target. Techniques such as visualisation (see the pictures of you hitting the target), humming, focusing on some sensory experience in the here and now, and catch phrases all help to keep the mind quiet.
- 5. Staying in the here and now. To shoot well you need to be in the **Present**.

When you let your mind go back to some other time, some other shoot or a target you missed five targets back, you will be shooting in the *past*. Shooting in the past leads to you making judgements about your ability or your self-worth as a person and a shooter. When you focus on what happened in the past you will miss, because you are not focusing on the target in the air. Shooting in the *future* can also be a problem. Thinking about the score, the result, the trophy or the prize money, will also take you a way from the job at hand, which is hitting the target in the air. Shooting in the future leads to anxiety and worry.

- 6. Be process orientated. If you focus on the process the product will look after itself. By this I mean that if you only thinks about the process of shooting the target, you will most likely hit it. The process involves the pre-shot routine, making sure you are set up properly, staying in the present, having fun and enjoying the sensory aspects of shooting, such as the feel of the sun on your back, the wind, the noise, smell of the shell being fired and the recoil. The opposite to being process orientated is to be product orientated. This is where you are focus on the score, the prize or on the feeling you get from winning or beating others. Focusing on the product will take you away from the present and you will be shooting in the future.
- 7. Shoot one target at a time. Rather than expect to shoot 25/25 or 50/50, go into the competition with the expectation to shoot one target, twenty five times. This will keep you in the present and focusing on the process.

- 8. Breathe. This should be self-explanatory but when people choke it is because they do not breathe. As you are reading this take three deep breaths: breath-in and out, breath-in and out, breath-in and out. Now do that for the rest of your life! Breathing and relaxation go together. Relaxation is a good method of staying in the here and now.
- **9.** Have fun. Remember shooting is a sport. Have fun, be sporting and enjoy yourself and do not interfere with others enjoying themselves.
- **10. Perfect practice makes perfect.** If you are going to practise make sure it is perfect practice. Do not practice mistakes or poor skills. Make sure you also know the difference between practice and training. Training is about learning a new skill or technique and practise is generalising that skill or technique into your shooting.

The question asked for five factors, but the above ten are really important. However, no one factor is more important than any of the others. You need to accommodate all ten factors and make sure that are integrated into your sport each and every time you compete or practice. There are probably heaps more factors but these are the ones that come to mind.

### ACTA NATIONAL RULES SUPERVISORS' MEETING The National Rules Supervisors' meeting is scheduled to be held on June 28–29, 2019

Members wishing to submit rule changes for consideration for inclusion in the 2020 Rule Book should discuss these with their State Rules Supervisors who will prepare a briefing paper for presentation at the meeting.

This is also an opportune time for State Associations to put forward any agenda items for discussion.

Papers submitted by Rules Supervisors should be submitted to their relevant State Associations for consideration.

### CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Sporting Clays Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held or a member of another ICTSF affiliate.
- Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 3. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
- 4. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
- 5. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
- Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
- 7. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 8. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
- 9. Shooters who fail to appear on time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
- 10. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 11. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 12. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
- 13. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 14. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 15. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 16. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 17. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 18. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 19. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$10.00. Nominations will close daily at 10 .00am.
- 20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to juniors. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 23. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.
- 24. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
- 25. Upon application to the A.C.T.A office, refunds less a \$5.00 administration fee will be available. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with these conditions of entry.
- 26. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by prenomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
- 27. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade prior to entering State and National Championships.
- 28. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorisation from the Tournament Director or Shoot Marshal.


