ACTA REPORT

Mal Dyson – President Paul Gilbert – CEO



On behalf of Paul and myself, I would like to wish all our members a happy and prosperous new year and trust we have a much better year going forward than the past couple of years. Thankfully the Federal and State Governments (give or take 1 or 2), are becoming more rational and realistic about the Covid situation and appear to have dispensed with their previous automatic mass-lockdown reactions and restrictions. While this is the case, can I please request to you all continue to keep yourselves protected and safe? Being a sport with a large number of older participants, protection measures are still necessary and need to be delivered / complied with by clubs and participants.

As you would be aware memberships for 2022 were due by 31 December. Club Secretaries should be endeavouring to ensure that all members are financial before allowing them to compete in competition. If an accident were to occur with an unfinancial competitor involved, your club would not be insured for this competitor which could lead to considerable costs to the club and committee.

2022 Events

We trust that this year's National Trap, Skeet and Sporting events will go ahead and not again be cancelled due to the virus circulating throughout the community. Our Trap Carnival is scheduled to commence on 25 March this year, the first two days being the Pre-Nationals will also incorporate the NSWCTA 2021 State Titles. In doing so, this will give NSWCTA the opportunity to select a State Team for the 2022 Nationals as NSW was the only state who missed running their State Titles during 2021. We also wish to advise / remind competitors that the ICTSF World Down the Line Championships are scheduled to be held in South Africa in late March 2023, so our Teams for that event will be selected at this year's Trap titles. The program for the National trap event is posted in this edition.

VCTA are hosting the National ISSF Championships at their State Ground at Echuca in mid-January. We trust that this event runs smoothly and all enjoy this carnival. With the introduction of the MCMS Grading and Handicapping algorithm on 1 January most clubs throughout our Association found this new program

to work well and made the office extremely easy to manage. We intend to monitor this program over the next few months and take the opportunity to rectify any issues within the program by mid-year.

The 2022 Skeet Nationals will also be hosted in Wagga from 15 to 21 May. More on that event to follow.

A guide to the current transition period from ACTA to MCMS Grades

As we have been advertising for the last year now, My Clubs My Scores grading and handicapping went live on 1 January 2022. Currently grades and handicaps are in a transitional phase while competition results being obtained through MCMS are accumulating and viable algorithm thresholds reached. In order to gain further clarification on this transition, please read and follow the instructions in the article "A guide to the current transition period from ACTA to MCMS Grades" which can be found on page 4 of this e-News. This will ensure that your grades remain accurate at this time.

New ACTA Member Card App

Another late arrival in 2021 was the ACTA Membership App. This item had been in the pipeline for over a year but somehow it stalled with our Database providers. When we asked for a push to completion and following a couple of further bouts of testing, the database platform wouldn't talk with the app and we had to submit more call sheets in order to finally get it across the line. Hopefully most of the kinks have now been ironed out and you now have a smart phone-enabled electronic membership card available containing your personal information. The app provides proof of membership, your handicaps and grades, accreditations, barcode of your member number and you can edit your personal details via the app by logging into your My Page.

That said, if you haven't already done so, the ACTA Membership mobile app is now live and available for download. It is called "ACTA Member" (green and gold logo icon) and is available via the google play store for android users and via the app store on your iPhone. After downloading and opening the app, simply type in user name (member number) and

password that you have registered / use with your ACTA MyPage and you're in. Once in, if you wish, you can use the settings icon to enable face / fingerprint ID. Please note that logging out will disable face / fingerprint ID so to keep this functionality, simply close it without logging out of the app.

Debunking the Myths – Part 5

OK . . . so here's one that is both factual and a myth . . . the ACTA isn't active in political lobbying.

There are a number of reasons why our exposure on this issue is measured. Firstly, we fundamentally believe that clay target shooting is a sport; the incidental equipment used to interact in the sport being a registered shotgun. We therefore legitimately argue that only people who have a heightened level of respect for, compliance with and safe custody through firearm licencing rules should be able to obtain and keep a registered firearm for sporting pursuits. As such, owning a current Firearms Licence is a mandatory requirement for ACTA Shooting Membership. We have both metropolitan and rural participants. In the case of both city and rural dwellers, local affiliated and rule-compliant clubs create a safe and appropriate space for the legitimate delivery of and participation in our sport. Obviously, many farmers use registered firearms for vermin eradication as well as social usage, again, within a safe and controlled environment. Our argument is that firearms licencing makes individuals who obtain a licence acutely aware of the safety requirements and high level of responsibility associated with registered firearms ownership and this heightened awareness makes their owning of a registered firearm safe and valid.

Whenever a mass shooting occurs, there is no doubt that some members of society will react adversely and call for political intervention and a banning of all firearms. Unfortunately, the perpetrators are, in most instances, persons who are not licenced firearms owners. We therefore choose not to enter into irrational debate about such incidents as they have nothing to do with the sport of shooting and are therefore also not in the best interest of protecting and healthily promoting the sport. This is because we recognise that licenced firearms ordinance is not the root cause of the problem and, beyond that, the political parties know and appreciate that the rural and sporting sectors are valid consumers who are served by a legitimate, ethical and financially viable segment of industry and employment.

On the other hand, we are involved behind the scenes with the Federal Government and NSW State

Government (the State within which our National Grounds are located). At the National level, we attend and add input at the Minister for Customs, Community Safety and Multicultural Affairs, the Hon Jason Wood MP's Biannual Firearms Stakeholder Consultation Meetings, while at the State level, we meet with the NSW Firearms Registry and interact and comply with the directions of the Manager, Industry Regulation & Engagement Unit. We also have occasional dealings with pro-sports shooting politicians such as Senator Bridget McKenzie who, prior to Covid 19, would host her annual Parliamentary Friends of Shotgun Shooting Christmas Event with Politicians and Press at the Canberra International Gun Club. Our Paron, Kay Hull, also superbly represents us at all political levels.

We do also have another layer above us that is also politically active and persuasive . . . Shooting Australia. Their involvement is at the Olympic, World Championships and Commonwealth Games level and is therefore connected via Sport Australia and Federal Government Funding of the sport. While some may view their involvement as elitist, their representation of and lobbying for the sport of shooting is made even more robust given our fine tradition of achieving podium shotgun outcomes at major world competitions over the last 50 years. That said, we rely heavily on successful medal-winning campaigns in order to substantiate the legitimacy of shotgun shooting as a high-priority sport in Australia. Shooting Australia is also required to meet all statutory obligations imposed on it by Sport Australia as a National Sporting Organisation, and as a Member Organisation, we are also held jointly accountable.

Keyboard Warriors

We continue to receive comments from concerned members calling out the keyboard warriors that appear to delight in criticizing all we do through the Australian Clay Shooters Facebook page. I am sorry to advise but this sport just doesn't want or need individuals who wish to find fault with all we do and talk things down when we are doing everything within our power to attempt to improve your sport. Like it or not, the Committees and Employees of the ACTA are all giving their 100% and constant condemnation is not warranted, useful or acceptable. If you really have something productive to say, please address the conversation through the correct channels. To those that this issue pertains, stop finding fault and present yourself instead as an asset rather than a liability. Quite frankly, everyone's really over it and it has to end!

A Guide to the Current Transition Period from ACTA to MCMS Grades

ACTA My Page and App

All ACTA members should ensure they have logged in to the My Page on the ACTA website at <https://mypage.claytarget.com.au/> as this will allow them to reconfirm all of their personal details as well as view their ACTA grades as at 31st of December 2021 and if needed pay for their membership.

If you are unable to login your club secretary or the ACTA office will be able to help you. Once you have been able to successfully login you will be able to use the same username and password to access the ACTA app which can be downloaded from:

It is very important that you check the grades held by the ACTA for all disciplines as these grades will be used until MCMS has sufficient data to calculate a grade for you. They will also allow MCMS to identify any earned meterage (eg AA22) you may have and lock it in.

The window to correct any errors in the grades and earned meterage held in the ACTA database will only be open until early February. After that time your MCMS grade will be pushed to the ACTA database and the two systems will align.

MCMS Handicap Page and App

Currently your MCMS grade can be viewed at <https://handicaps.myclubsmyscores.com/>

The grade shown on that page is the grade you will shoot in the next time you nominate. Where no grade is shown you will "fall back" to your ACTA grade from the 31st of December 2021.

Where you have a MCMS Trap grade the meterage you will shoot at will be the benchmark meterage for that grade unless the ACTA database handed over "earned meterage". For example, if the ACTA has you as AA21 and MCMS has you as A you will initially shoot off A19, however if the ACTA has you as AA22 and MCMS has you as A you will initially shoot off A22.

Where multiple skill grades are shown (eg DB, SB, PS) on your MCMS grading page for a discipline (eg Trap) then the highest grade of the skills shown will be the grade you will nominate into for all events of that discipline regardless of the skill being shot in that event. For example, if for Trap you are A for DB, and B for PS and SB (NB DR is a separate discipline and not part of Trap so will not appear as a skill in Trap but as a skill under Double Rise which is graded separately) you will shoot A grade for all Trap events regardless of whether that event contains DB, SB or PS.

MCMS has now released an upgrade to our Android and Apple apps that will allow you to view your grades through the history button on the ME page within the app. We will now work on improving the data displayed to make it easier to understand how a particular score is utilised.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Planning for 2022, COVID or no COVID

The start of every year is an interesting and challenging time for most sportspeople. With last season over, it is time to look ahead and focus on what will be important for the coming year. Because of the disruption to both 2020 and 2021 by COVID-19, it is timely to look at how we can set ourselves up for a competitive 2022.

Because most states have opened up and the majority of people are vaccinated, some with a booster, it is likely that significant competitions, such as zone, state and nationals will take place this year. In this article, I want to explore how we can get ourselves off to a good start for the year ahead.

It should come as no shock that our first task needs to be **goal setting**. Take a few minutes to evaluate what you achieved in the past few years. You may want to go back to 2019, the last uninterrupted year we had. Did you achieve what you set out to achieve? Did you have to change your focus during the year? If you have a lifetime, five year and yearly plan: did your achievements in 2019 (and 2020 and 2021) meet your expectations?

Now is the time to evaluate and start again: what do you want to achieve in 2022?

As part of your evaluation leading up to 2022, it is important to focus on your previous personal achievements. Did you achieve **personal best scores or performances**? These should not just be your highest breaks but can also be good scores in difficult conditions. For example, if at a shoot the wind was measured at 90k/h then your score on that day might not be as good as usual but you now have a baseline for shooting in poor conditions. The next time you shoot in wind that strong you know what you should be able to achieve. So as you go into the new-year, what gains can you make on previous personal best scores and performances.

Remember your goals need to be SMART: specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and have a definite time frame.

The next part of your evaluation should involve a **skills audit**. There are four levels of skills that need to be addressed: technical, physical, mental and competition skills.

Technical skills involve the fundamentals of shooting: for example, stance, lead, target acquisition and follow through. If you need help with any of the technical skills then some time with a coach maybe worthwhile.

Physical skills, for example, involve those aspects such as strength, agility, stamina, muscle memory, dealing with fatigue, hydration and nutrition. Sessions with a dietician, strength and fitness coach or masseur may be appropriate.

Mental skills involve concentration and attention, visualization, mental rehearsal, relaxation and goal setting. Finally, competition skills involve dealing with competition anxiety, arousal control. Confidence, Competence, Focus and pre and post shot routine. All the elements of last month's article on mental toughness fits into the area of competition skills. The best way to do a skills audit is to look at each of the areas and identify what you can do and what you are good at and what you need help with. Then work on those things that need improving, focusing on one area at a time and give yourself time to adjust to a new technique and generalize the changes.

Being in the **right time** (that is the here and now or present) should be the next part of your plan for the new season. It should be to let go of the **past**. Let go of the judgments about yourself and your previous poor performances. The past is over, so do not dwell on it, and when you are competing make sure thoughts of past performances (either good or bad), past situations, etc, can be replaced with thoughts and actions about the present.

Just as the past can be problematic, so too can be thinking about the future.

Thinking about the **future** leads to worry and

anxiety. Believing that you have to be perfect or always winning, will lead to fear of failing. Focusing on the outcome, or the trophy, before you have actually qualified, is future thinking and will lead to failure, as you are not dealing with the process of actually shooting the target. This will lead to self-doubt and you will tense up and your muscle movements will not be fluid but will be jerky and haphazard. Self-doubt will cause you to miss.

To stay focused on the **present**, concentrate on your breathing or attend to what is happening right now to your body.

The next step in your evaluation and planning for this year is to examine if you are **mentally tough**. Do you have the skills and beliefs that will keep you on top. Mental toughness factors are consistency, composure, confidence, commitment, courage, competitive and in control. Being mentally tough involves not only playing the game on the tracks but also being able to play the inner game. Being able to relax, focus your attention, visualize, mentally rehearse are all part of having the skills to be mentally tough. A quick reread of the December article may help here.

What is your **motivation**? Are you ego-orientated or task orientated? Ego-orientation involves focusing on yourself, your performance and what you might win rather than focus on the task or the process at hand. In ego-orientation you focus on the outcome: winning, the trophy, perceived glory. Task orientation, on the other hand focuses on the process. Actually enjoying what you are doing: shooting for shooting sake, not just to win the prize. Shooting is a sport and like all sports there are certain reasons for doing it: to stay fit and healthy, being outside, doing something you like, to improve, to have fun.

What **inner game** activities will you use to help you this year? There are some inner game techniques that are essential and then there are others that may be useful if needed. The essential inner game techniques are goal setting, visualization, including the "Black Box Technique", mental rehearsal and relaxation.

These four skills should be the minimum mental skills that each of us has in our toolbox. Goal setting, well it's self explanatory, visualization and mental rehearsal will help train the mind that you have or are able to achieve your goals. The "Black Box" will help with distractions and relaxation will

make you calmer and more focused on the tasks at hand.

So, in a nutshell, this is a basic blueprint for setting yourself up for the year ahead. Many of these concepts I have written about in the past and some will be expanded upon in the future. In the meantime, remember that shooting is a sport and we do it because we love doing it. We have been limited in the shooting we could do in 2020 and 2021. We were also limited in the contact with our friends and especially those shooting friendships we have developed over the years. Hopefully, in 2022 we will be able to get back into the swing of shooting regularly, and attending significant events. Everyone should have a goal to do better, to learn, to improve and to have fun.

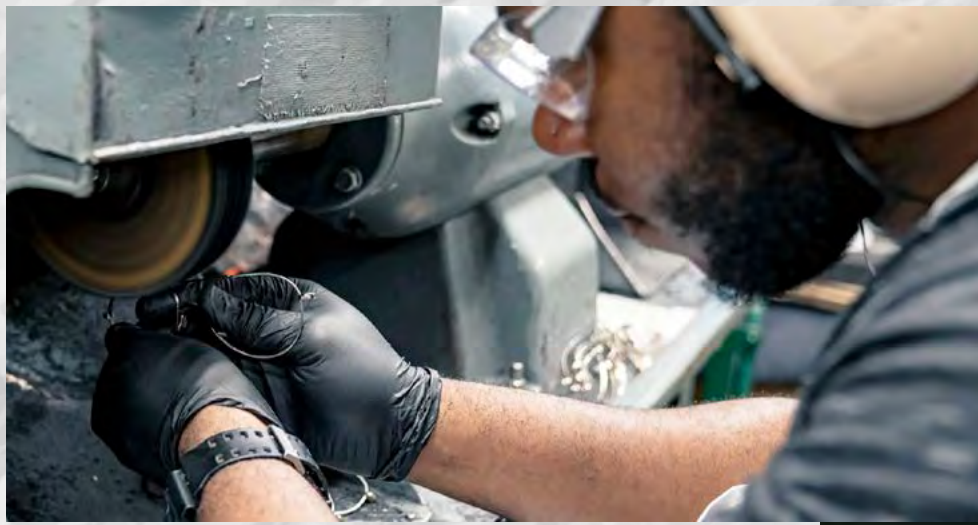

Les Aberley



My name is Ed Smith and I represent Les's second family, the Bathurst Clay Target Club.

After listening to a lot of anecdotes from long-time Club members, I've come to realise that I can only offer you a glimpse of what Les did for our Club and clay target shooting in NSW generally. Les's full story would be best suited to a book which hopefully someone will write one day.

Briefly, Les Aberley was a very successful pistol and rifle shooter in Bathurst and, luckily for us, he also joined our Club in 1981 where he was quickly elected to our Club Executive. By 1985 Les became President, a position that he held for over 30 years until 2015. Les continued to sit with the Club Executive after that and served as our Club Coach until 2020. For over 40 years Les supported our Club in every way and helped to develop and encourage many shooters, some of whom have gone on to shoot for our State and our Country. Grady Evans who shoots for Australia is one of those people.

Although Les worked very hard to support and promote our Club for more than 40 years, he also found plenty of time to shoot. He hadn't been able to fire a gun for some time in recent times, but Les was still rated as AA Down-

The-Line and A with Skeet. An exceptionally talented shooter and a skilled, compassionate and very popular manager of people.

The Bathurst Clay Target Club is 131 years old, the second oldest clay target club in Australia and Les Aberley was by far our longest serving and our most important and successful Club President to date.

Les and a few others built our clubhouse on Mt Panorama. When the Council resumed our range over 20 years ago and asked us to move to our present site, Les and a few others dismantled the clubhouse and relocated it to its present position. Over the decades we were very lucky to have had Les Aberley, Ian Cunningham, Mick Harber and a few others in our ranks, all of whom freely gave their time for a huge number of ground works, construction and modifications to our clubhouse and trap houses etc. We owe Les and those people our sincerest thanks.

In 1988, while he was President of our Club, Les was elected to the NSW State Executive and served with the NSW State Executive Committee for 25 years until 2013. At the 2009 State Skeet Carnival in Wagga, Les was presented with a Life Membership of the NSW Clay Target Association. The man that made the presentation to Les that day is another long-time Club member and also a NSW State Life Member, Peter Haley.

I have spoken with Kathleen Dawe at the NSW Clay Target Association and I would like to quote her words:

'Les was well loved. He was quite cheeky and was always up for a good laugh in the Events Office of the State Skeet Carnival. He lit up every time we asked him how his wife and kids were going and would always share updates on how they were all going. At presentations he was always quick to jump in the photos, especially with the ladies.'

Les was a great story teller who often used a long story to illustrate a short point. For example, most of us will have heard Les's story about how he became so proficient at Skeet. Les explained that he and a friend worked out that Skeet targets always travel along exactly the same path. They therefore selected a number trees in the distance and picked out various branches or forks in trunks etc on those trees that the targets would travel past. All they had to do then was hold their guns against those exact positions and shoot

each target as it passed. Les and his friend very quickly became so proficient at shooting Skeet in Bathurst that they decided to travel to Sydney to compete in a major Skeet competition which they were confident they would easily win. Les and his friend were sent in to shoot with the first squad and Les was the first shooter. He explained that when he got to station 1 he raised his gun then froze in disbelief. His tree wasn't there. By all accounts it was not a very successful day for our Bathurst champions. The moral to Les's story, treat every target with respect and don't think that you can take short cuts. I heard that story a lot of times from Les which probably says something about how I shoot Skeet.

I could tell a lot more of Les's stories but recognise that I should probably leave that to better qualified people.

Before I finish, I would like to confirm something else. Our Club Executive has considered how we can honour the man who was the backbone of our Club for decades. Annual memorial shoots are the way that we generally do that but this time that doesn't seem to be enough. Although we can't control the future. We want to do something that, for now at least, is a lot more permanent. We've therefore decided to re-name our major two-day annual event in October from the **King of the Mountain**, to the **Les Aberley King of the Mountain**. To Bathurst members, Les is the King of the Mountain.

I have already spoken with Bron and told her that we want to honour Les in some way and she has said that she would like to help us organise that. Thank you on behalf of the Club Bron.

Also, thank you to Dorothy, Bron and all of your family for lending Les to us for so long over so many years. I can't begin to tell you how much we all appreciate that.

Finally, I am sure that Les is already settling in to his new Club wherever that is. Being the thoughtful person that Les was I'm also sure that the President of that Club has already been told to plant trees behind the Skeet layout. I imagine that Les will already be accumulating new stories for us and I can almost hear him practising those stories on his old mates at his new clubhouse. I guess that all sounds a lot like Valhalla, without the alcohol.

As Bron said 'We haven't lost him, he's just gone shooting'.

2022 National Trap Championships

27th March – 2nd April 2022

OFFICIAL PROGRAM

To be staged at the National Ground, Tasman Rd, Wagga Wagga, by the Australian Clay Target Association.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2022 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2022 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their current firearms licence before competing.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors, Veterans and Super Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open Section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans sections; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, the top 25 shooters from the Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Points Score events will make up the Open Team. Sections teams will be selected from those eligible from the next highest scores. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Competitors must be over the age of 12, compliant with state laws.

Veterans – are those competitors who, will be over the age of 55 years and under 65 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Super Veterans – are those over the age of 65 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Juniors – are those competitors who, will be under the age of 21 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 16 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations. Shooters who miss their squad and require re-squadding, will be penalised with the loss of one target. This will be at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the ACTA Executive. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified – an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice may be available throughout the championships.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off,

they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

The shoot offs will continue under the event format until a winner has been determined or at the discretion of the Tournament Director a different format is required to finalise the event. Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament director decides. In such a case the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Authority

This program shall control the 2022 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2022 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 1.20 (a) & (b)

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – 2022 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete in the “2022 Trap Nationals” must be a registered member of the ACTA for the financial year 2022, or a bonified International competitor.
2. **Entry and Pre-Squadding is by Pre-nomination only through MCMS (MyClubMyScores).** The close date for reduced nominations is the 20th March 2022. Nominations received after that date will not receive any squadding preferences. Entries will be accepted on the day at an additional \$20 per event.
3. MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data the decision will be made by the National Executive.
4. All shooters must present their current shooting licence/permit to the events office before competition.
5. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50/75/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be shot 5 (five) person squads, 5 targets per lane.
6. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
7. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50/75 targets or 50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each bracket of targets. Should the time limit be exceeded the a penalty of the **Loss of one target will occur.**
8. **Any shooter missing their squad and requiring re-squadding will be penalized one target.**
9. Should a shooter be late for his/her squad and elect to withdraw from the event they will not be eligible for any refund.
10. All shooters are to sign the score sheet after each bracket. Once a shooter has signed their score sheet, the score is accepted. Any score sheet not signed by the shooter will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
11. All competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. **While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person.** Failure to either referee or score **will incur a penalty of the loss of one target** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty will apply in the event concerned.
12. Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap **will be penalized five targets.**
13. All dispute appeals must be lodged in writing to the tournament director together with a \$50 appeal fee. The tournament director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned.
14. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
15. All eligible competitors are entitled to receive awards in Open, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grades prize.
16. There must be a minimum of three competitors in sections or grades, for any prizes to be awarded.
17. Section prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd with placing for 2nd and 3rd decided by count forward.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
19. ACTA dress code is to be adhered to, Tournament Director is to adjudicate.
20. **All competitors must comply with the Firearms Laws of the State hosting the National Championships.**
21. Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.
22. Squadding details will be published on MCMS 21st March 2022.
23. A junior who has not previously competed at any National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to free nominations.
24. The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Tournament Director and trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustment will be made without authorization of the Tournament Director or Shoot Marshall.
25. **The National DTL Championships will be conducted under the NSW Covid protocols.**

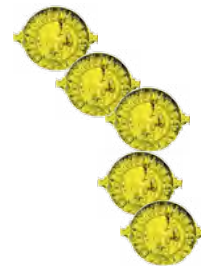

The CLEANAWAY – Roman Bounty Shoot Rules

The six events will be conducted and finalised as normal. The High Guns will be finalised as normal. Presentations for the 6 events and High Guns will be conducted in the Hall as normal.

To shoot for any portion of the \$50,000 (Fifty Thousand Dollars) Cash: (1st – \$30,000, 2nd – \$8,000, 3rd – \$5,000, 4th to 10th – \$1,000)

There will be 40 spots. To be considered for a spot you must have entered every event (6) prior to the first event starting. Overall and Grade winners in events 1 to 5 plus first 5 in the Handicap get automatic entry to the Cash shoot-off.

Any shooter so qualified and then qualifying again will be replaced by the next shooter in order in their grade if a graded event or in placing if in the handicap event. Any shooter winning the Overall or any Grade High Gun who has not qualified in an event will get automatic entry into the Cash shoot-off.

Finally, any remaining spots to make up the Cash shoot off field of 40 will be auctioned. Payment by the winning bidders must be immediate upon the fall of the hammer.

The 40 shooters will then be squadded as follows:

- Squad 1 Overall qualifiers as selected above from events 1 to 5.
- Squad 2 AA Grade qualifiers as selected above from events 1 to 5.
- Squad 3 A Grade qualifiers as selected above from events 1 to 5.
- Squad 4 B Grade qualifiers as selected above from events 1 to 5.
- Squad 5 C Grade qualifiers as selected above from events 1 to 5.
- Squad 6 Handicap qualifiers as selected above from event 6.



Squad 7 & 8 will be filled from the OA and Grade HG winners as selected above who have not already won a spot and then filled in order by the successful bidders for any remaining spots. Squads 1 to 4 will be the first wave. Squads 5 to 8 will be the second wave. Wave 1 will shoot a round of ten targets handicap – miss and out. Wave 2 will follow. Squads will be re-squadded after each 10 targets when possible. The 10 placings will be decided using normal shoot-off rules. Last person standing wins the \$30,000 1st prize. The 10 Cash prizes will then be presented.

As detailed above, to create greater interest, a number of spots for the final will be auctioned. 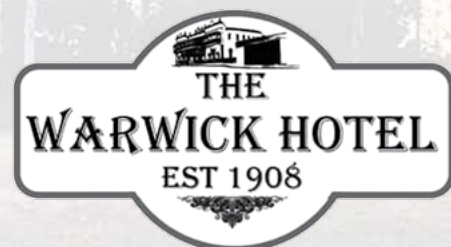

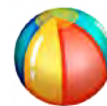
