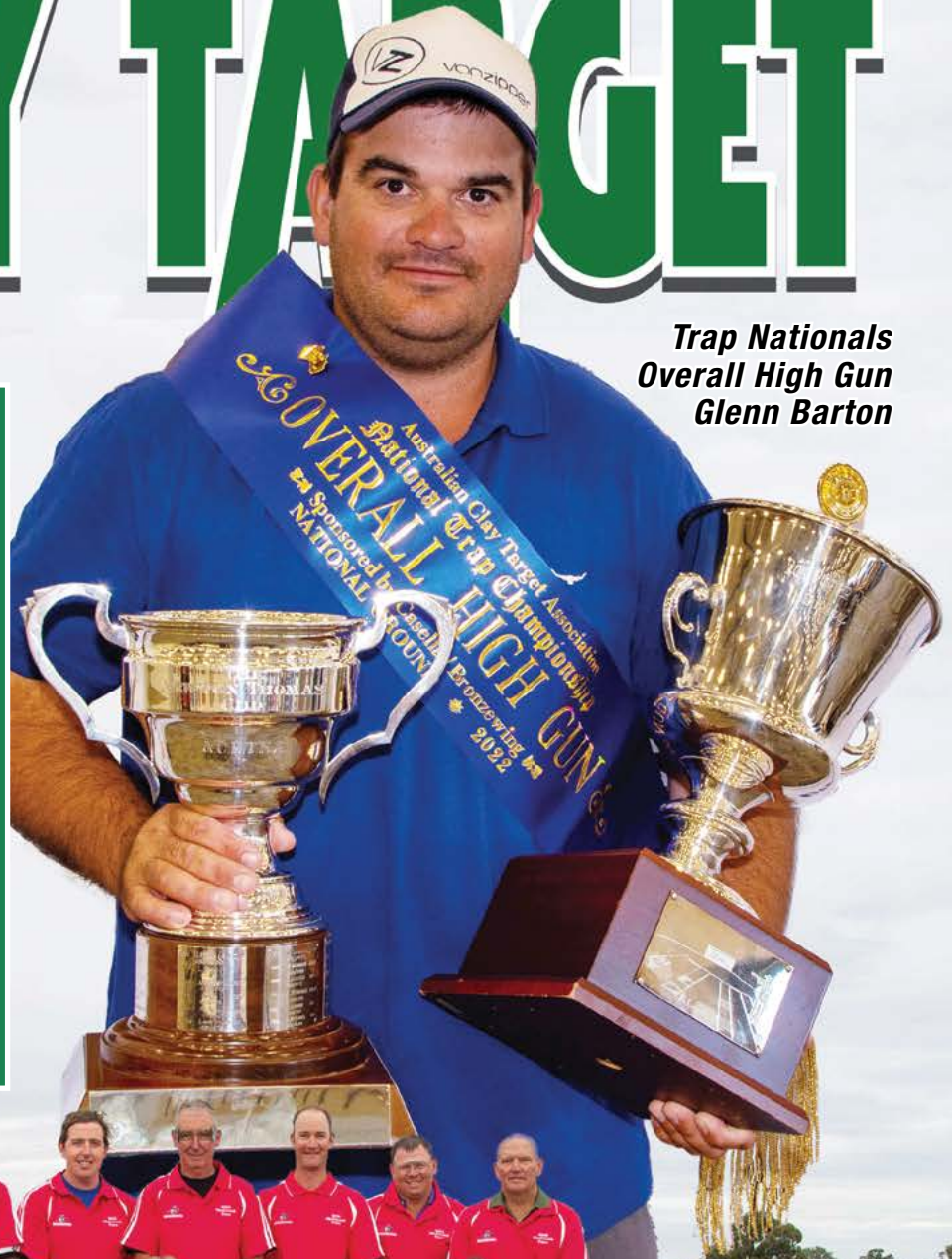

ACTA REPORT

Mal Dyson – President Paul Gilbert – CEO



Having held our last Trap Nationals at the Roma Clay Target Club back in 2019, three long years transpired before we had the opportunity to finally deliver the 2022 Trap Nationals again in Wagga Wagga at our National Grounds between 25 March and 2 April this year. Many of you will recollect our last minute cancellation in mid-March 2020 when, after planning the entirety of the event, the onset of Covid 19 restrictions terminated that Nationals just one week prior to their commencement. Although numbers attending in 2022 were down on previous years with just under 390 participants competing, a very successful event was still achieved.

Due to Covid virus restrictions throughout 2021, NSWCTA had no opportunity to hold their State Carnival, and consequently, no chance to select a team to shoot the State Shoulder to Shoulder event. They therefore took the opportunity of using the Pre-National Points Score and Handicap events to select their 2022 State team.

We are now busily planning and looking forward to hosting the 2022 Skeet Nationals again at the Wagga National Ground between 15 May and 21 May . . . under 4 short weeks from now. (Please see pages 11–13 for more details on this event). Pre-Nomination for this event through MCMS is now open. During these Nationals, two teams will be selected; one team to travel to the USA in 2022 and another to represent Australia at the Glenn Trophy event in New Zealand in 2023. The USA team selection will be over 350 targets, while the Glenn Trophy selection is over 250 targets.

The ACTA Annual General Meeting was held on Sunday the 27 March, where business arising asserted that the Constitution Committee has been re-established by the Executive Committee to revisit the document based on feedback and input from clubs. This document, (which had been approved by the Executive at their Executive Committee earlier that day), will be circulated to all clubs in the coming weeks with explanatory notes to articulate all revisions and changes to the previous document. Following the 2021 NSW ICAC enquiry that was

investigating whether the State Minister / local member had improperly obtained Grants for Wagga Wagga recipients, some individuals within the ACTA were inadvertently expressing concerns regarding our expenditure of the grant monies that had been allocated to us. Andrew Reynolds, representing the ACTA Auditors Bush & Campbell, gave a summary on the ICAC investigation, informing the membership that in no way had the ACTA misappropriated any funds during the building and completion of the Range Function Centre.

We would like to take the opportunity to thank retiring Queensland CTA Executive Member Mr Malcolm Collins. Replacing Mal, we welcome Mr Geoff Moore. We also welcome Mr Allan Kenny, Tasmanian CTA as their new Executive Members.

The Annual Trap Hall of Fame Induction and Awards dinner was held in the Range Function Centre on Monday evening, 28 March. The 2022 worthy inductees to the ACTA Hall of Fame were Mr Arty Del-Ben and Mr Glen Castellaro. Matthew Stokes was awarded the Masters Award, Phil Grainger took out the 2019 Long Break shooting 827 targets and 2021 recognised Andrew Brady's 412 targets. The 25 metre Long Break for 2019 was awarded to Kim Nealon with a total of 88 targets. 2020 saw Matthew Stokes shoot 106 targets and in 2021 Andrew Fiek shot 79 targets. Finally, in the Double Rise Long Breaks, Frazer Roberts shot 123 targets in 2019, 2020 saw Dan Power shoot 82 targets, and in 2021, Matthew Schiller produced an 80 target break. The Doug Smith Medal for 2019 was awarded to Darryn Nicholls and the Presidential Medal for 2022 was awarded to Mr David Coleman. Please see a full report of the Hall of Fame presentations later in this edition.

During the National event, the Executive took the opportunity to conduct a face-to-face meeting. Items to note from this meeting are the dates for 2023 National events. In a revised format, the National Skeet will commence on Sunday the 5 March and finish on Saturday the 11th. Sunday 12 and Monday 13 March will then be changeover

days between the two National events prior to the Trap Nationals commencing on Tuesday 14 March, concluding with the Mackintosh on Monday 20 March. Due to strong feedback from some States concerning a prior Executive Committee decision RE: discontinuation of 32gm shot shell load from 31 December 2024, the Executive felt it necessary to revisit this issue. A motion to rescind the previous motion was moved and carried. The new decision is that the option for a shooter to use 32gm load in Handicap and Sporting events has been unconditionally reinstated, (as was previously in place).

Can we take this opportunity to remind Club Secretaries that for the sake of securing our

history for future generations of members, it is still necessary that shoot results are forwarded on to the ACTA for inclusion in the results section of the Clay Target e-News. This has been made a simple task for Secretaries and easy to follow instructions are published in the Secretaries Handbook, available on the ACTA website.

Clubs are also reminded that our Rules designate that when conducting Commonwealth and Interstate Team matches or State Championships they are obliged to advertise these programs in the Clay Target e-News. The cost of advertising has recently been drastically reduced to enable any club to advertise even minor club shoots at very little cost.

Australian Shotgun Team Returns to International Competition

The Australian Shotgun Team returned to International competition at the ISSF Shotgun World Cup in Nicosia, Cyprus between the 8th and 14th March. The competition was a display of multiple successes for the Australian Team, after a pandemic impacted break from the International circuit since late 2019, outside of the Tokyo Olympics.

The travelling team, competing in the individual trap events (Mens and Womens), consisted of James Willett (NSW), Mitch Iles (VIC), Thomas Grice (NSW), Catherine Skinner (VIC), Laetisha Scanlan (VIC) and Penny Smith (VIC). The athletes were accompanied by National Shotgun Coach Richard Sammon and support coach John Maxwell. James and Laetisha teamed up to compete in the Trap Mixed Teams event, as did the team of Mitch and Penny.

The athletes managed to acclimatise to the extreme weather conditions, picking up a Gold, Silver and Bronze medal along the way.

The first event for the Australian team saw all six athletes compete in the individual Trap event. Held over three days comprising a program of 50 targets qualifying day one, 50 targets qualifying day two and 25 targets qualifying plus finals on

day three, the team battled through some intense weather which they hadn't experienced before and included 40 km/h winds, and snow fall. James Willett said 'it was the coldest I've ever fired a gun in, and I had snow landing on me', before adding 'that is honestly the coldest I have ever been. I've never shot in snow'.

In the Men's Trap, Thomas Grice finished qualifying on 106/125 placing 82nd, and Mitch Iles qualified on 116/125 narrowly missing out on finals contention by 2 targets (finals cut off 118/125) and finished in 15th place. James Willett was the highest qualifier for the Australian men finishing with 119/125 and finishing in equal second with two other competitors from Croatia and Great Britain. A shoot-off determined which position James would take

up in the semi finals and missing his first target out, saw him allocated bib number 4 in semi final 2. After the 25 target single barrel semi final, James finished with 22 hits, progressing through to the medal match with three others. After the first 15 targets in the medal match, James had shot 12/15 and was eliminated in 4th place.

In the Women's Trap event that saw the same three day competition format as the Men's event, Laetisha Scanlan finished qualifying with a score of 104/125 to place in 27th. Penny Smith shot 112/125 which landed her and five other competitors in a shoot-off to determine the last two positions in the semi finals. Unfortunately, Penny did not progress and finished in 11th place overall. Catherine Skinner finished as equal second qualifier on 116/125 and after a shoot-off with a Spanish competitor (0/1), she progressed through to semi final 1 with bib number 3. After the first 15 single barrel targets, Catherine shot 8/15 and left the semi final in 4th position.

It was then on to the Trap Mixed Teams event where the team of Laetisha Scanlan and James Willett continued their team partnership success. Laetisha and James finished as fourth top qualifiers with a combined team score of 135/150, progressing through to the semi-final and medal match where they claimed the silver medal. The world record holding team of Penny Smith and Mitch Iles also put on a strong display, qualifying in top position with a score of 138/150 and progressing through to the semi finals where they won the bronze medal!

The final event of the Australian Trap Teams program was the Trap Teams event with the Men's team consisted of James Willett, Mitch Iles and Thomas Grice

and the Women's team of Penny Smith, Catherine Skinner and Laetisha Scanlan. A new event for the competitors with Penny noting 'it's something that we haven't shot before, so it'll be good to get out there with Teash and Catherine and have a crack and see how we match up'.

And match up they did! The three ladies put on a great display qualifying in top place with a score of 206/225 and an impressive 8 targets ahead of the USA team. Team Australia and USA met in the medal match with both teams putting on the pressure! Australia finished the match strong, dropping only 3 targets in the last bracket to win the gold medal!

The Men's Trap Team scored 204/225 during qualifying, missing out on a chance for a medal by 3 targets.

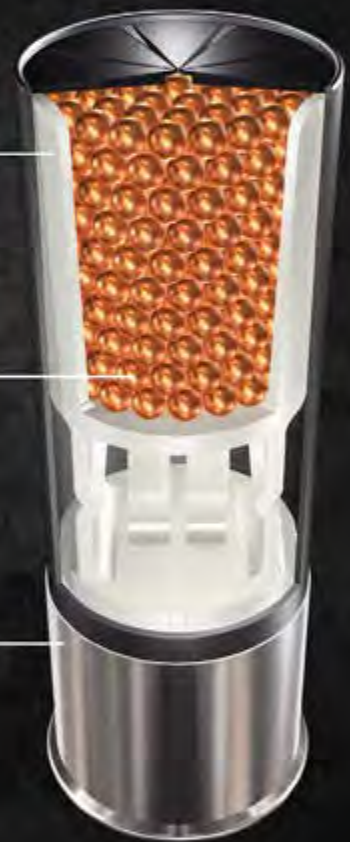

Vision and Shooting

A question that I often get asked by clay target shooters of all levels is "Should I learn to shoot with both eyes open?"

The answer is obviously always "yes" but the more pertinent question could possibly be, "Can I learn to shoot with both eyes open?" The answer to this is far more complex because it involves eye dominance.

I think that every shooter understands the basics of ocular dominance, where similar to handedness, we tend to have a dominant eye. However just like with handedness, the extent of that dominance can differ, some people can still do quite a bit with their non-dominant hand or could be completely ambidextrous, and others feel their non-dominant hand is all but useless.

Vision is very much the same in that you can be very dominant in one eye, moderately dominant, centrally dominant or even cross-dominant. A concept to consider is that eye dominance has the characteristic of depth not just direction.

How do we measure ocular dominance?

When we use the traditional methods of deciding dominance, using a card with a hole in it, or making a gap with our hands, or even just covering a distance target with your finger, we can very easily determine which eye is dominant, but, it is very important to note that with these techniques, we are measuring a kind of "forced" dominance, in that we are forcing the brain to choose an eye.

This gives us an indication of which eye is dominant if the brain is forced to choose, but by no means tells the whole story. Evaluating dominance in free space with a method like the one using your phone camera, shows us there are degrees of dominance and that a person can in fact be centrally dominant or have no real dominance at all.

This often undetected central or lack of dominance explains why many apparently symmetrically dominant shooters still can not shoot with both eyes open.

This "free space" technique involves getting the shooter to stand directly in front of you and then getting them to point (with some intent), at a spot on the back of your phone with both eyes open. Take a picture and you will see that the pointing finger will be positioned either under the right eye, under the left eye, or somewhere in between. This gives you a measure of your free space dominance.



This is a classic right eye dominant result, with the pointing finger below the aiming eye. When this shooter pointed with his left hand the pointing finger will also be positioned directly under the dominant right eye.



This relatively new shooter is a great example of someone who is centrally dominant and would have genuine difficulty shooting with both eyes open. This central dominance would simply not be detected using the more traditional methods of measuring dominance.



This is the same shooter mounted over her gun, when we blocked off the left eye she mounted perfectly straight.

Depth of dominance has the potential to have a huge impact on a person's likely ability to shoot with both eyes open.

The ideal scenario would be that the shooter has a symmetrical dominance with eye and handedness on the same side and also a very deep dominance, so that the non-aiming eye does not come into play at all when shooting.

In reality having such a strong and symmetrical dominance is not a given in any individual, and shooters could have a moderate or weak symmetrical dominance, a central dominance, a weak crossed-dominance or strong crossed-dominance.

How does this relate to shooting with both eyes open?

The less dominant your aiming eye, the more likely it is that at some point, when shooting with both eyes open, the non-aiming eye is going to come into play and create confusion in the sight picture.

Many shooters with relatively deep but not complete dominance, still find that with stress, or fatigue, or even just with targets that are more difficult to see, the non-dominant eye comes into play and targets are missed. This can be very frustrating as it is very unpredictable and is often characterised by the shooter having no idea why they missed the target. These individuals will also often perform less well as the shoot goes on.

Why does the non-aiming eye get involved?

This is not fully understood but many factors seem to be able to reduce the depth of

dominance. Age, stress and visual acuity are common culprits. Research has indicated that ocular dominance becomes shallower with age.

Shooters with a symmetrical but shallow dominance are more difficult to identify but can have as much difficulty shooting with both eyes open. With the "free space" test their finger will often be positioned close to but not quite under the dominant eye as in the image below.



These individuals will often have some success shooting with both eyes open but struggle with consistency, hitting many targets and then for no apparent reason missing multiple targets in a row.

So why is there sometimes confusion over this issue?

If you are a strongly dominant shooter and shoot with both eyes open, as many coaches and very good shooters are, then it can be very difficult to grasp the challenges faced by shooter struggling to shoot with both eyes open.

I am a centrally dominant clay shooter and must shoot with one eye closed no matter which shoulder I shoot off. Even as an optometrist, I struggle to describe the sight picture I get with both eyes open as anything other than "confused or jumbled".

The only way for a strongly dominant shooter to replicate this confused sight picture, is to put their gun (as uncomfortable as it will be) onto the other shoulder and try to shoot a series of targets with both eyes open. Concentrate on the site picture, this seems to go some way to replicate the challenges crossed dominant, shallow dominant, or centrally dominant shooters face when trying to shoot with both eyes open.

With all of this in mind there may be a sliding scale of probability of being able to shoot with both eyes open dependent on ocular dominance:

EYE DOMINANCE	LIKELIHOOD OF SHOOTING WITH BOTH EYES
Deep symmetrical dominance	Almost certain
Moderate symmetrical dominance	Almost certain but may fail under stress
Shallow symmetrical dominance	Possible but likely to be inconsistent
Crossed dominance	Very unlikely

Having said this there are always exceptions to the rule and there are many ways to give your dominance a nudge in the right direction to reinforce a moderate or shallow symmetrical dominance and we will discuss these in a future article.

So back to the question:

Should I learn to shoot with both eyes open?

Absolutely yes! But, try to get a good understanding of your ocular dominance, be aware of the possible limitations and that it may take many months to change. Get someone to go through the options available to you to manage your type of dominance, try them all and go with whatever feels most natural.

Remember that should you not be successful at making shooting with both eyes consistent and reliable, there are very many great shooters who shoot with one eye closed.

A very well-known Australian Trap shooter and good friend of mine, once said to me that the very best way to put a sight onto a target is with one eye closed.

I feel that there is possibly too much emphasis on the need to shoot with both eyes and that it can put unnecessary pressure on everyone to master this technique. Many shooters have proven that you can shoot to an A or even AA Grade level without having both eyes open. You may not make the Olympics but I wonder if many of us would benefit from learning how to shoot well with one eye rather than constantly wrestling a dominance problem?

There is a YouTube video called 'You'll never hit anything closing an eye, featuring Ed Solomons', that I highly recommend anyone with an eye dominance issue should watch.

2022 SKEET NATIONALS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1 Any shooter wanting to compete in the “2022 Skeet Nationals” must be a registered competitor of the ACTA for the financial year 2022, or a “Bona Fide” International competitor.
- 2 Entry and pre-squadding is by pre-nomination only through MCMS (My Clubs My Scores). The closing date for reduced nominations is 5.00pm Friday the 13th May 2022. Pre-squadding preferences will only be accepted through online nominations up until 5.00pm Saturday the 14th May 2022.
- 3 Entries on the day will be taken in the events office at the Carnival for an additional \$20 per event, however squadding preferences will NOT be permitted. Such entries will close prior to the advertised starting time for the day.
- 4 Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to it commencing will be eligible for a refund less a \$10 administration fee. Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.
- 5 Squads who hold up following squads by taking longer than normal (20 minutes) will be sent to the practice trap to complete the round. Rule 7.1(d) (ii)
- 6 No competitor is entitled to view targets outside of the prescribed rules 1.19 5. Those competitors who do so will be penalized two targets.
- 7 MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data, the decision will be made by the National Executive.
- 8 All shooters must present their current shooting licence/permit to the events office before competition. Failure to do so will incur a penalty of one target.
- 9 Squads of up to 5 competitors will shoot 50/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps as designated by the Tournament Director.
- 10 The National 28 Gauge Championship cartridge load is limited to a maximum of 21 Grams (3/4 oz), shot size not larger than no 7. The National .410 bore Championship cartridge load is limited to 14 Grams (1/2/oz) shot size not larger than no 7.
- 11 Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at the 50 targets or 50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each bracket of targets. Should the time limit be exceeded a penalty of the Loss of one target will occur.
- 12 Any shooter missing their squad and requiring re-squadding will be penalized one target.
- 13 Should a shooter be late for his/her squad and elect to withdraw from the event they will not be eligible for any refund. It is the shooters responsibility to make sure they are where they should be and when.
- 14 All competitors are to check and sign the score sheet after each bracket. Once a shooter has signed their score sheet the score is accepted. Any score sheet not signed by the shooter will be credited with the score as recorded.
- 15 All competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, the penalty of a loss of one target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the loss of one target.
- 16 Any competitor interfering with or attempting to interfere with the traps will be penalized five targets.
- 17 All appeals must be lodged in writing with the tournament director together with a \$50 appeal fee. The Tournament director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned.
- 18 When Team selection is involved shooters will automatically represent in the highest team they qualify for. Team selection criteria available on the ACTA website.
- 19 Eligible competitors are entitled to receive awards in Open, Women, Junior or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 20 There must be a minimum of three competitors in sections or grades, including High Guns for any prizes to be awarded.
- 21 Section prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd provided they meet clause 20.
- 22 Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, their decision shall be final.
- 23 ACTA dress code is to be adhered to, Tournament Director is to adjudicate failure to comply will result in disqualification.
- 24 All competitors must comply with the Firearms Laws of the State hosting the National Championships.
- 25 Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.
- 26 Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.
- 27 First time juniors who have never competed at a Nationals in any discipline previously will be entitled to shoot for FREE. A claim for this concession may only be made through MCMS when nominating.
- 28 The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Tournament Director and trap mechanic prior to the start of the events daily. No further adjustment will be made without authorization of the Tournament Director or Shoot Marshal.
- 29 The National Skeet Championships will be conducted under the NSW Covid protocols in force at the time. Good luck to all and stay safe.

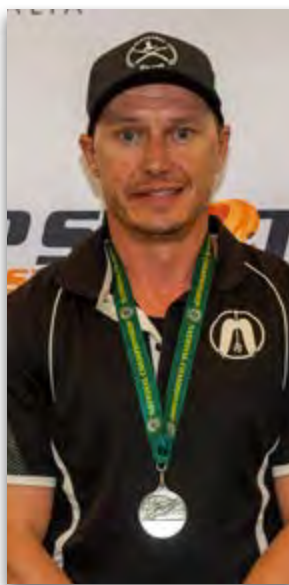

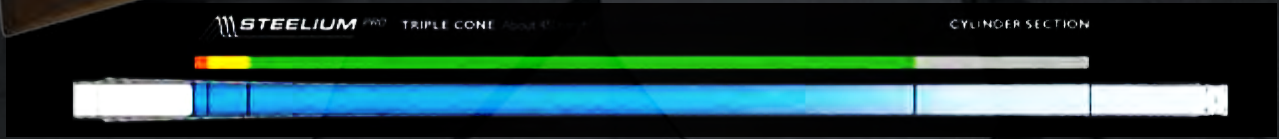

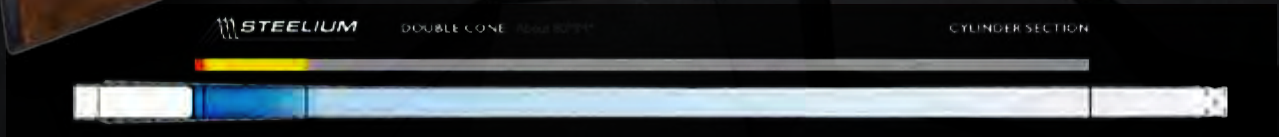

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Enacting your plan

In the week prior to the Down the Line Nationals, the latest edition of Gunshot, the New Zealand Clay Target Association Journal arrived at home. I usually enjoy reading the magazine, vicariously catching up with the achievements of some of those friends I have shot with from New Zealand over the years. The magazine regularly features articles from Phil Klinner and Todd Bender.

It was a very interesting article from Todd Bender, Focusing on Execution and Process, that caught my eye and that I found fascinating reading. Initially, I thought this is great because Bender is mentioning all the things I often refer to in these articles or concepts I use to explain the psychological aspects of sport with others. The significance of this article didn't hit home until I was at the Nationals and met up with friends from past shoots and some new ones, who wanted to talk about their performance and analyse their shooting.

The first aspect is the confusion that occurs when you are shooting very well and after the break for shells your shooting takes a dive. For example, let's say you shoot 25/25 in the first round of the handicap but only 19/25 in the second round. It is likely that you were trying to 'protect a score you didn't have'. This concept was explained to me by Craig Bentley some years ago, who often noticed that shooters who were shooting well suddenly changed their speed, style and execution only to miss and then miss again. Bender explains that in the first 25 targets you were shooting to 'break the targets', but in the next 25 you were shooting 'not to miss'. Bender continues by stating that there is a big difference between the offensive manner of shooting to break targets and the defensive manner of trying not to miss targets. When you try not to miss you are also likely to be impacted by negative self-talk or anxiety about your score or your performance and you will tense up and become

less fluid due to the ever-building self-doubt.

What leads to changing your position from 'shooting to break targets' to 'trying not to miss' shooting? Firstly, focusing on the product rather than the process. To shoot well you have to focus on the process of shooting. Your pre-shot routine, your stance and foot placement, target acquisition, focus and attention, swing and follow through. To focus on the process you have to be in the present; the here and now. When you focus on the product or the score you are projecting yourself into the future. When you focus on the future; worrying about how many you have shot, your score on the scoreboard, thinking of the trophy or the glory of winning, you run the risk of developing anxiety and this will lead to self doubt and will interfere with the process of just shooting the target. If you only focus on the process you can execute your plan and hopefully shoot each target one at a time. By shooting one target at a time, the product, your score, will look after itself.

Secondly, you need to go into the competition with a plan and stick to it. Make sure your pre-shot routine is thorough and suits you and your needs. Do not over complicate your pre-shot routine, keep it simple but achievable for each and every shot. The pre-shot routine needs to be the starting point for narrowing your focus for the target and part of the process for shooting each and every target. Bender describes this plan as "a system that is choreographed, programmed set of physical and mental routines, orchestrated and executed in a consistent manner each and every time we compete. Imagine a haphazard approach when expecting a spectacular and consistent performance." A consistent performance cannot happen if the plan is haphazard and slipshod.

Bender continues by adding, "Having a routine that you stick to come hell or high water tends to immunise you from that which confounds others in competition. When we are focused and concentrated, the same goings on are oblivious

to our conscious mind because the mind is absorbed with the activity that you are consumed with at that particular moment." This is actually a definition of concentration. If you are fully immersed and focused on the process of the activity, you will be unaware of everything outside the activity of focus. This is Zen: whatever you are doing at the moment is exactly what you are doing at the moment, and nothing else.

Bender acknowledges that the ability to concentrate fully is not easily obtained and must be developed through practise and discipline. If you have a sound routine and you have committed and rehearsed your plan, then the execution of the process, shooting the target, will become simple and reproducible.

The take home messages from the article by Todd Bender are:

- Shoot to hit the target as opposed to shooting not to miss.
- Do not try and protect a score you haven't already shot.
- Have a systematic and programmed set of physical and mental routines.

- Commit to executing these routines each and every time.
- Focus on the process.
- Stay focused on the present and what you are doing.

I would add it is still necessary to enjoy your shooting.


To those old and new friends who took time to stop and talk during the Nationals, thank you. It was a pleasure meeting you or catching up again. To those shooters who wanted to buy my gun when it was on the rack at Hunts Shooting Supplies, no it is still not for sale.

TOOWOOMBA TRAP CARNIVAL

The Toowoomba Trap Carnival was run from Friday 11th March until Sunday 13th March. Much work had gone into the preparation for this event and the Committee was feeling a bit nervous with rain still threatening and the memory of the flooded out February Skeet Shoot still very fresh.

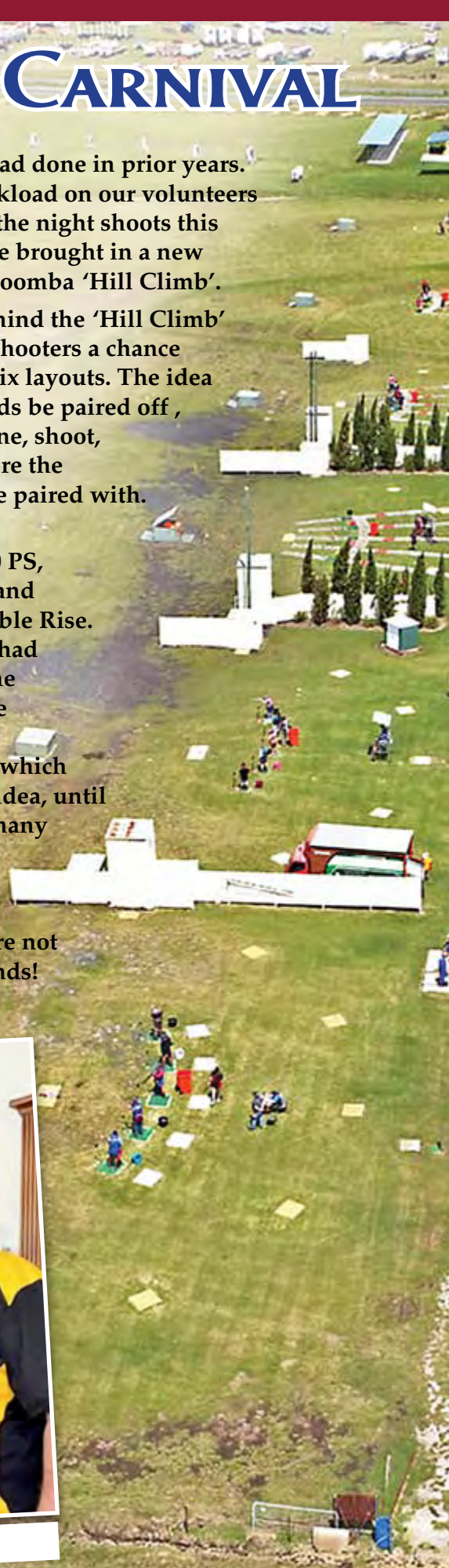
run late as we had done in prior years. To ease the workload on our volunteers we did not run the night shoots this year. Instead, we brought in a new event, the Toowoomba 'Hill Climb'.

The concept behind the 'Hill Climb' was to give all shooters a chance to shoot on all six layouts. The idea being that squads be paired off, start at layout one, shoot, then ref and score the squad they were paired with.

The shoot was 10 DB, 10 SB, 10 PS, 10 Continental and then 5 Pair Double Rise. One hiccup we had was that with the pending rain we decided to start an hour earlier, which seemed a good idea, until we found that many shooters had self-nominated and were on MCMS, but were not yet on the grounds!
