ACTA REPORT

Mal Dyson – President Paul Gilbert – CEO



As we move into the first grips of winter in 2022, we hope you are remaining safe and healthy, especially with the current bout of Covid and Flu diseases circulating. Please remain aware that these viruses appear to be fairly infectious at the moment . . . continue to look after your own well being; if you feel unwell, stay home, recover and keep your fellow club members safe.

Constitution

On June 3, we circulated to all of our Affiliated States and Member Clubs the revised, proposed Constitution. This document has had significant changes made to it following feedback from our members. The email to clubs included the revised Constitution, By-Laws referred to in the Constitution and explanatory notes that detail the revisions that have been made to enhance it. We take this opportunity to thank the Constitution Sub-Committee for all the time, effort and devotion that has been taken preparing this document.

As you would be aware, the decision to move to a Company Limited by Guarantee was approved at the 16 May 2021 AGM and it is now a requirement that the previous Constitution be amended to provide an appropriate transition across to this revised governance structure and a more competent delivery of this sport to our members. We look forward to winning your acceptance of this amended document.

National Appointments

The Executive have recently appointed Colin Kneebone as the National MCMS Handicap Supervisor. Jim Shepherd will remain indefinitely as the National Rules Supervisor.

2022 Skeet Nationals

This year's Skeet Nationals commenced on May 16 with cold and wet conditions to greet competitors

on their arrival in Wagga at the start of the Carnival, but thankfully, the weather did improve during the week. This situation should be effectively eliminated with the Skeet Nationals moving to the new timeline of March in 2023. Consequently, this event will be held in the first month of Autumn instead of the last month in Autumn moving forward. A full report on the Skeet Nationals is in this edition. A number of ACTA Executive Committee Members who attended the Carnival took the opportunity to meet with members of the Australian Skeet Shooters Association (ASSA) and from this meeting came positive discussions and a greater respect and understanding of the ASSA's role with regard to this discipline of our sport in Australia. A number of ASSA Executive Members also accepted an invitation from the ACTA Executive Committee to attend and meet with the full Committee in their August face-to-face meeting.

Following both Nationals, debrief meetings were conducted immediately following each competition where issues relating to the event were discussed. Topics included staffing, event scheduling and delivery, facilities and potential upgrades, trap machine and voice system maintenance, presentations, Arms Fair location, sponsorship, costs, fees and charges. The addition of evening entertainment during both the Skeet and Trap Carnivals was also considered a high priority for 2023.

2022 Sporting Clays Nationals

Please be advised that the Sporting Clays Nationals will be the next event at the ACTA National Grounds. This event will be in a 3 day format for the first time, being Sportrap on Friday, Commonwealth 5 Stand on Saturday and the National 5 Stand on Sunday 26, 27 and 28 August. Keep an eye out for nominations through MCMS.

2022 NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1 All competitors must present their current shooting licence/permit to the events office before competition. **Failure to do so will incur a penalty loss of one target.**
- 2 Any shooter wanting to compete in the “2022 Sporting Clays Nationals” must be a registered competitor of the ACTA for the financial year 2022, or a bonified International competitor.
- 3 Entry is by pre-nomination only through MCMS (MyClubMyScores). The closing date for nominations is 5.00 pm Thursday the 25th August 2022.
- 4 Entries are limited to a maximum of 120 per event, late nominations will be taken on the day for an additional charge of \$20 per event **but only if there are vacancies available.**
- 5 Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to it commencing will be eligible for a refund less a \$10 administration fee. Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.
- 6 MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data the decision will be made by the National MCMS Handicap Supervisor.
- 7 Squads of up to 5 competitors will shoot brackets of 25 targets per visit to the traps.
- 8 Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations.
- 9 Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at the 25 Targets.
- 10 Shooters who miss their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is possible. **If a shooter is able to be re-squadded a penalty loss of one target will apply to that event.**
- 11 Should a shooter be late for his/her squad and elect to withdraw from the event they will not be eligible for any refund. It is the shooters responsibility to make sure they are where they should be and when.
- 12 All competitors are to check and sign the score sheet after each bracket. Once a shooter has signed their score sheet, the score is accepted. Any score sheet not signed by the shooter will be credited with the score as checked and recorded.
- 13 Competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, **the penalty of a loss of one target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person.**
- 14 **Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalized five targets for that event.**
- 15 All appeals must be lodged in writing with the tournament director together with a \$50 appeal fee. The Tournament director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned.
- 16 Eligible competitors are entitled to receive awards in Open, Women, Junior or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 17 There must be a minimum of three competitors in sections or grades, for any prizes to be awarded.
- 18 Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, their decision shall be final.
- 19 ACTA dress code is to be adhered to, Tournament Director is to adjudicate.
- 20 All competitors must comply with the Firearms Laws of the State hosting the National Championships.
- 21 Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.
- 22 Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.
- 23 A junior who has not previously competed at any National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to shoot for the cost of the admin fee of \$10 per event paid at the time of entry.
- 24 The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Shoot Marshall. No further adjustment will be made without authorization of the Tournament Director and Shoot Marshal.
- 25 The National Sporting Clays Championships will be conducted under the NSW Covid protocols in force at the time. Good luck to all and stay safe.

On Day 1 104 shooters fronted for the first event of the National Championships, the 7th National Skeet 28 Gauge Championship. There were 22 shooters from NSW, 1 from NT, Qld 25, SA 2, Vic 39, WA 3 and 12 International competitors. Making up the sections were 12 women, 2 sub-junior, 2 junior, 25 veteran, 63 open. 39 shooters were AA grade, there were 26 in A grade, 27 in B grade and 12 in C grade. Jack Stockdale first started shooting with his father in the field, shooting rabbits. His first connection to the clay target sports was at the Inverloch Gun Club in 2013, as a junior shooter. Jock Bradley, the President of Inverloch, spoke highly of Jack and mentioned his first round of skeet was a 1 out of 25 targets. With some coaching from mentor, Max Oakley, Jack soon began to perform at a higher level and was soon on the board at Inverloch with a 25 straight which put him in the draw for the club championship. 2014 saw Jack attending his first National titles at the National Ground at Wagga and saw Jack winning the 2014 Sub-Junior High Gun at his first National Championships. 2015 saw Jack attending coaching clinics for more mentoring with names such as Todd Bender and locally, from Michael Buttigieg. Jack spent time competing at local and interstate ACTA clubs and was able to qualify for the Victorian Junior Team to attend the Skeet Nationals.

Jack competed in the 2015 Vic Junior Team with Aislin Jones and Max Sammon, who would become lifelong friends with Jack.

2016 was a pivotal year in Jack's success story. Jack attended the 2016 NZ Skeet Nationals in Hamilton, New Zealand. Jack kicked off his campaign by winning most of the events at the NSSA pre-national shoot, winning the 20g, 28g and the HOA. Buoyed by this success Jack went into the NZCTA Nationals and won his first National title, the New Zealand 28g. Jack then went on to win the NZ Skeet Doubles and the New Zealand High Gun. Jack's first National titles came when he was just 16 years old!

2017 saw Jack visit the USA to compete at the 2017 World Junior Championships. Whilst Jack didn't perform as well as he hoped, he came back from the trip armed with much more knowledge and determination to succeed further. 2017 also saw Jack winning his first State titles in Western Australia and NT and then travelling to New Zealand again and winning the NZ 12g National Championship.

2018 saw Jack's successes further culminate in gaining a position in the Australian Skeet Team

to travel to the USA in late 2018. Jack was able to run a perfect 100 straight in the Mini World 12g and found himself in the main shoot-off stadium, shooting for the overall title amongst such big names as Riley Chaddock who actually won the world championship HOA that year. Jack finished O/A 3rd in the Mini World 12g Championship on his visit to the USA which is an incredible feat for an 18 year old.

In 2019 Jack was able to gain his 'Skeet Grand Slam' award and he also won the Adrian Cousens Medal at the Hall of Fame. Jack won the National Doubles title and came runner-up in the Overall High Gun at the Australian Skeet Nationals. Jack had gained enough Hall of Fame points at that time for entry into the Australian Skeet Hall of Fame, being just 19 years old. Jack is the youngest ever shooter to be inducted into the Skeet Hall of Fame.

Jack is really starting to build his life, together with Aislin Jones, and Aislin kindly spoke on behalf of Jack's family. Her speech was very heartfelt and conveyed to the audience how proud of Jack's achievements the family was and not only has Jack turned out as a great skeet shooter, they were also very proud of the young successful man that Jack is today. It was very

fitting also that one of Jack's early mentors and coaches, Max Oakley, was able to present Jack with the Green Hall of Fame jacket

At the time of his induction Jack had amassed 300 Hall of Fame points in his 9-year shooting career.

Notable scores from our Australian Team at the ISSF World Cup Junior held in Suhl, GER resulted in Gold, Silver and Bronze medals across both Trap Junior individual and team events.

The Australian Shotgun Team consisted of Kiara Dean (Trap Women – VIC), Renae Jones (Trap Women – VIC), Molly Bretag (Trap Women – SA), Gabe Sensi (Trap Men – VIC), William Freni-Lizzi (Trap Men – WA), Marco Corbo (Trap Men – NSW) and Mark Du Rose (Skeet Men – VIC). Deserie Baynes (SA) and John Maxwell (NSW) led and supported the team throughout competition, sharing a plethora of knowledge and experience.

In the Trap Women Junior qualification, Kiara Dean scored 112/125 and entered a shoot-off where she shot a further 1/1 cementing her place in Semi-Final 1 wearing Bib number 7 (7th place). In Semi-Final 1, Kiara shot 22/25 single barrel finishing in first position in that semi-final

Marco dominated in the Medal Match, shooting an impressive 32/35 single barrel and at his debut international competition, won the Gold medal for Australia. William Freni-Lizzi scored 113/125 in qualification, placing him 23rd overall.

The Trap Team events saw Gabe, Marco and William team up in the Trap Men Junior Team, and Kiara, Renae and Molly Bretag team up in the Women Junior Team. Both teams qualified for

Gabe Sensi scored 121/125 and 119/125 respectively, both qualifying

the Bronze medal matches with scores of 203/225 and 196/225, respectively. At the conclusion of the Men's multiple 5 target series, Australia and Italy were tied with 5 points each, resulting in a 'miss and out' shoot-off that saw Italy victorious and taking the Bronze medal. The last Trap event was the Junior Mixed Teams which saw the teams of Gabe with Kiara and William with Renae competing. Both mixed teams finished with qualifying scores of 134/150. A shoot-off saw William and Renae progress to the Bronze medal match and Gabe and Kiara finished in 7th position. William and Renae left the Bronze medal match in 4th position.

To finish the World Cup shotgun events, Mark Du Rose, made his international debut in the Skeet Men Junior event where he shot 103/125 placing him 58th overall.

She also loved football and would frequent games to watch her beloved North Melbourne play.

Pam had an exquisite attention to detail when it came to the manufacturing of the plethora of shooting jackets she produced . . . all by hand from her sewing room at home! If you had a shooting jacket made



by Pam, even though you may have had to wait months or even years on occasion, you knew the wait was worth it. Vision and Shooting

So you are on stand one, it's a shoot off, you have practiced your technique, you have a great gun that fits perfectly, muscles are coiled like a spring waiting in anticipation, you call for the target and everything waits for you to SEE the target !!

Vision is the trigger to the entire process of shooting a clay target, the experienced shooters do not move a muscle until they see the target, then lock onto it, track it and bring the gun up to position and pull the trigger. This is all done in one smooth movement and in less than one second.

We can make sure that we have a good gun and make sure it fits, practice our technique and have coaching but what can we do to maximise our visual performance??

There is a concept worth being aware of called "Visual Hygiene" and it relates to external and internal factors that can influence visual performance.

I am always amazed at how often a shooter comments on not seeing the targets well after a disappointing score.

So, what could influence vision on the day and what can we do to maximise our visual performance?

Here are my top 10 tips:

1. First and foremost, get an eye exam regularly and, if you could benefit from a distance prescription, get some shooting glasses with a suitable tint for the light conditions you shoot in.



2. Deal with glare properly. Decent quality shooting specific tints with good glare reduction and contrast enhancement can make a dramatic



difference to visual comfort and being able to see the targets. If you get a chance have a look at the new Randolph RIACT A.I.™ lenses as a prime example of what new tint technology can do. Always try to wear the tint you will be shooting in for 20-30 minutes before you shoot. The retina will balance light out as part of the light/dark adaptation process but can take a while to do so.

3. Understand your eye dominance and the impact it may have on your vision for shooting. Seek professional advice if you are not sure.

4. Never underestimate the potential impact of Dry Eye. Many shooters particularly as we get a bit older, suffer from fluctuating vision due to



dry eye. Have a good preservative free eye drop and use it 30 and then again 15 minutes before you shoot. We have always found Hyloforte shown below to be a good option but there are many others.

5. Diet is important. Individuals with diabetes will tell you that if their sugar levels are high their vision can be very blurred compared to normal, but you do not have to be diabetic to have a reduction in your vision with too much sugar.

Sugar highs will often lead to sugar lows not long after, so try to keep your energy intake constant through the day.

Hydration is obviously very important and insufficient hydration will cause or exacerbate dry eye and slow reaction time.

6. Sleep is particularly important for quick visual reaction and change of focus.

7. Alcohol unfortunately does have a measurable impact on the transfer of neural information from the eye to the brain and then to the body. Even more unfortunately, the effects of alcohol can last for 72 hours or more after a heavy night at the bar.

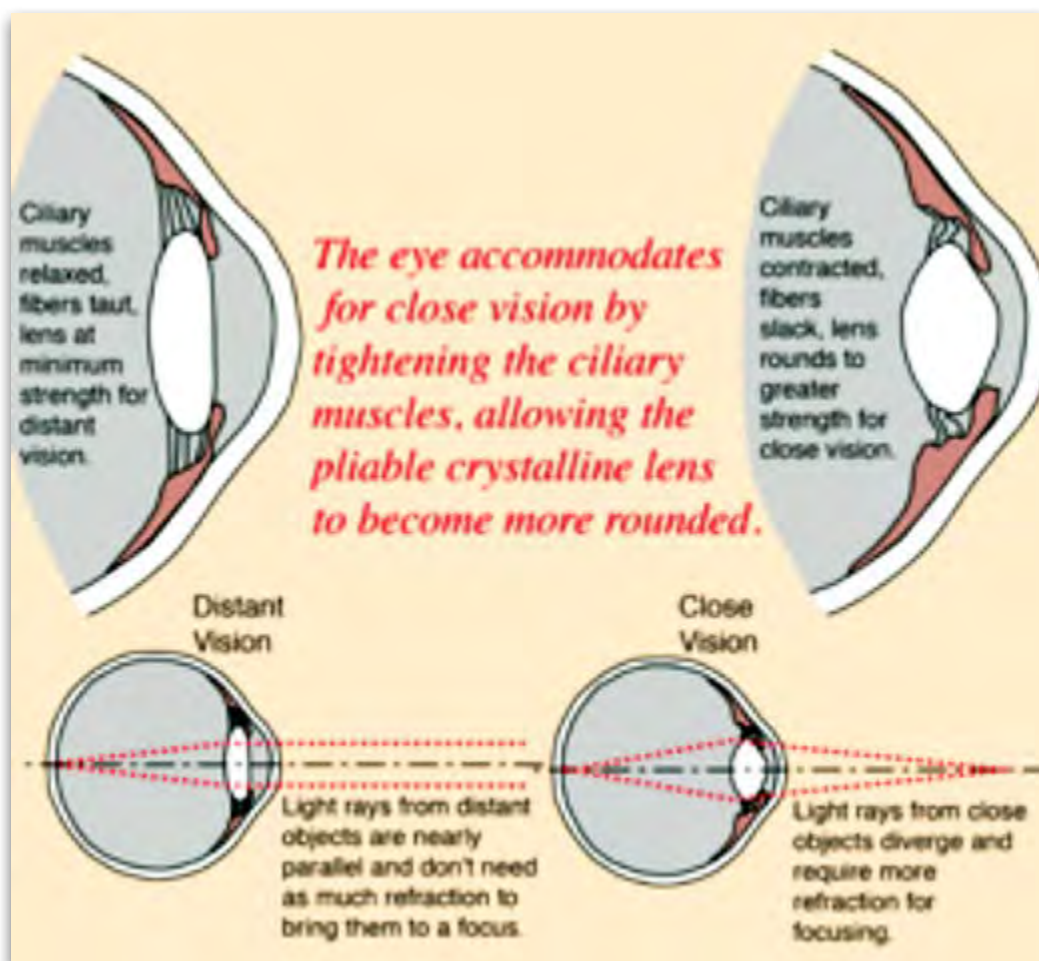
8. Medication can have a definite effect on visual performance. Blood pressure medication can cause dry eye, as can antihistamines, decongestants, Beta Blockers and anti-depressants, which can also slow your accommodation and visual reaction time. These can be life saving medications so please consult your doctor before considering any changes to your medications.

9. Distance versus near focus. For most of us

particularly as we get older (recurrent theme here I am afraid), it is not a good idea to sit looking at your phone just before you go and shoot. Near vision requires a lot of accommodative effort and your eye can take 10-15 minutes to relax back to clear distance vision after a period of near focus. During an event I have a habit of looking down at the cartridges in my gun while I wait to shoot, probably also not a great idea as that likely stimulates near accommodation.

While you wait for the squad before you to finish, keep your focus relaxed by looking in the distance as much as possible.

10. Last but very definitely not least, consider practicing acquiring, locking onto, and tracking a target just like we would practice any other skill. I find that the best way to do this is to go onto a layout and go through your entire routine without putting ammunition into your gun. If you are practicing with some friends, they probably would not mind you just occupying a stand if it is not a full squad. You will be amazed at how you can concentrate on your sight picture and visual skills when you know that you are not going to be pulling the trigger.

Furthermore a big thanks to Lee Berger from Outdoor Trading for his generous sponsorship, which was greatly appreciated by the club and all the winning competitors.

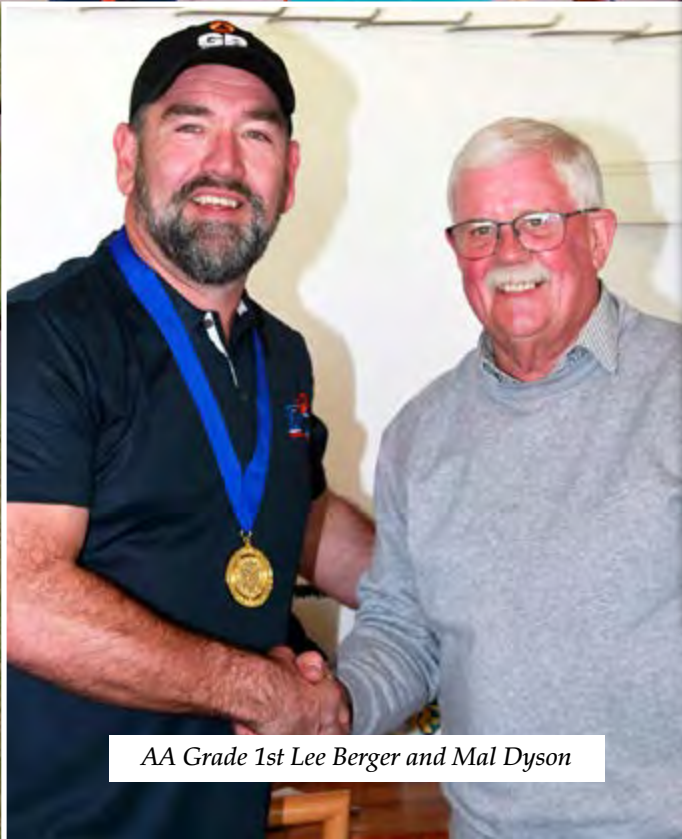

Australia Dominates in Granada

The Australian Senior Shotgun Team continued their International campaign by competing at the ISSF Grand Prix in Granada, Spain, 20-29 May, 2022. The team, comprising of former Olympians Catherine Skinner, Laetisha Scanlan, Penny Smith, Thomas Grice, James Willett and Mitch Iles proved to be strong competition for the rest

of the field as they dominated throughout the competition, collecting individual and team medals along the way.

Thomas Grice qualified with a stellar 124/125 in Mens Trap, leading the field and bettering his personal best qualification score by an impressive 3 targets. Qualifying for semi-final 1 together with Mitch (QF 120/125 + shoot off) and James (QF 120/125 + shoot off). At the conclusion of semi-final 1, Thomas was only one target down (24/25) and progressed through to the medal match. Mitch finished that semi-final in 3rd place (22/25) and James in 4th place (12/15), meaning both, unfortunately,

missed a place in the medal match. Through to the medal match, Thomas continued to impress with 31/33 (Golden Hit) to claim the gold medal for Australia, beating Spain and Sweden for the accolade.

In the Women's Trap individual event, it was Australia Gold, Silver and Bronze! At the end of the qualification stage, the Australian women finished as top three qualifiers with Penny Smith on 121/125 and Laetisha Scanlan and Catherine Skinner each finishing with 119/125. All women progressed through to the semi-finals and then further qualified for the medal match. Penny shot 21/25 and won the bronze medal with Catherine and Laetisha both finishing on 30/35 and entering a sudden death shoot-off to determine the gold and silver medals. Catherine was victorious after one target, winning the gold medal and Laetisha took the silver.

Off the back of his individual Men's Trap gold medal, Thomas lead the Australian Men's Trap Team to a top qualifying position with a team score of 218/225. The trio qualified for a place in the gold medal match against Spain. At the end of the 5-target series, both teams were tied at 5 points each meaning a sudden death shoot-off was needed to determine the gold and silver medals. After 6 targets in the shoot-off, Australia was awarded the silver medal, with gold going to Spain.

The ISSF Grand Prix in Granada was a dominant display of shooting from the Australian Shotgun Team and we congratulate them on their successes.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

Is Mindset the same as Skillset?

The recent ACTA Skeet Nationals provided a wealth of subject matter for these articles. Part of the atmosphere of these larger competitions is sitting around the fire buckets of an evening with a drink or two and listening to the banter, the success and horror stories, knowing that the next day we will try again, target after target. During the Nationals a friend gave me the latest editions of the US magazine, *Clay Target Nation*. In one of the magazines was an article by Gil Ash, *Mindset Matters*, which explores the ‘mindsets’ we carry with us. Originally the concepts of mindsets came from the work of Carol Dwerk, *Mindsets: The New Psychology for Success*, but it is now a common teaching and learning style.

A **skillset** is about your capabilities. For the shooter it involves the physical, technical, mental and competition skills required to compete week in and week out. A **mindset** is about beliefs systems. Dwerk states there are two mindsets we can navigate our life with: growth mindsets and fixed mindsets.

According to Dwerk, A **growth mindset** is the understanding that abilities and understanding can be developed. Therefore those students with a growth mindset can believe they can get smarter, more intelligent and more talented through putting in the time and effort. For the sportsman, this means that you can increase your ability if you adopt a learning mindset, train and try new ways of achieving better results. A **fixed mindset**, on the other hand assumes that abilities and understanding are relatedly fixed. Those with a fixed mindset may not believe that intelligence can be enhanced, or that you either ‘have it or don’t’ when it comes to abilities and talents. The main difference between the two mindsets is that one views everything as permanent with little room for improvement or change in

either direction, while the other views it as more flexible and changeable, with opportunities for improvement

The two mindsets have features that can be represented in the following table:

Fixed Mindset

Ability and talents is static

Looks to a desire to look smart or competent

Avoid challenges

Give up easily

See effort as useless or fruitless

Ignore negative feedback

Feel threatened by the success of others

Achieve less than their potential

Confirms a deterministic view of the world

Growth Mindset

Abilities and talents can be developed

Looks to a desire to learn

Embrace challenges

Persist in the face of setbacks

See effort as a path to mastery

Learn from criticism

Find lessons and inspirations in the success of others

Reach higher levels of achievement

Have a greater sense of free will

For the shooters, Gil Ash argues that those with a fixed mindset want to look good in front of other shooters, but rarely get better because they do not want to leave their comfort zone. Shooters in the growth mindset are willing to take risks and learn from the direction of others who can guide their improvement.

Although I enjoy shooting skeet, I also shoot other disciplines: trap, sporting, and field and game, so when a squad member (and experienced coach) suggested some changes to my stance, gun hold, and execution, I jumped at the chance to improve: and by improve, I mean to shoot the targets more like a proper skeet shooter. On reflection, I was making sure I was adopting a growth mindset. I was moving away from what

I knew to trying something different. After a few rounds at the practice trap, the 'something different', I was doing felt more natural and I was breaking targets with less effort and at the correct break point.

Part of the coaching involved 'breaking the targets over the middle' or over the DTL trap house. By taking note of my stance and having the proper hold-point, seeing and swinging through the target became easier and predictable. This is what Gil Ash refers to as the performance mindset. A positive about skeet shooting is that the targets are known. Therefore the pre-shot routine can be very specific and precise. Skeet also allows for accurate and exact visualisation for shooting, in your mind, each target in the correct sequence. Skeet also allows for greater interaction between shooters and I really appreciated the positive affirmations from fellow squad members. This involved simple focus statements such as 'keep your head on the stock' or 'In the middle, Michael'. These comments were designed to narrow the focus, quiet the mind and help with pre-shot set up. Other comments were often an affirming statement if the target was hit or a rallying cry if the target was missed.

Whilst it is impossible to have more than one winner for each National Championship, everyone goes to the competition with winning in mind. For me this year, these championships gave me the opportunity to learn, move way from my comfort zone and set a plan to master every target and be a more competitive force at the next skeet competition and at next year's nationals.

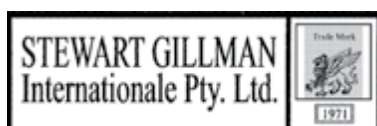

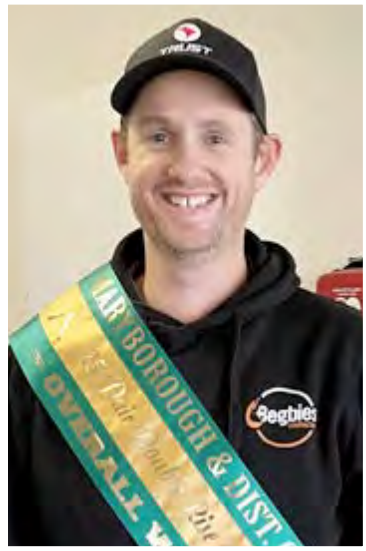
