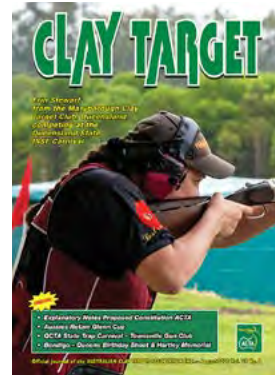

# ACTA REPORT

**Mal Dyson – President    Paul Gilbert – CEO**



*As some parts of the country are, again, experiencing heartache following a third or fourth bout of floods since the start of the year, our hearts go out to you. A large number of shooting clubs and members are located on lower-lying areas, and we can only imagine the distress and major interruptions these flood events are causing.*

## **Constitution**

*Firstly, a brief history lesson; After 12 long months since the 2021 AGM where the Motion was carried for the ACTA to become a Company Limited by Guarantee but the associated proposed constitution fell short by 7 votes, the ACTA's Constitution Sub-Committee went back to work to revise parts of the proposed constitution that clubs had felt necessary to fail to align with. This occurred via the engagement with CPRGroup where we took a lot of the solicitor-speak out of the document and made it more affinitive in wording with our ambitions and objectives as a sporting body, (not a corporate enterprise). We also sent emails directly to all clubs in mid-2021 requesting feedback on how we could address concerns, (where only a small number of responses were received), following which club surveys were sent out and our member clubs again had the opportunity to lend input. We then worked together with a "shared document" where revisions were implemented via track-changes in response to all appropriate suggestions. Towards the end of last year we finally cleaned it up, following which we then commenced cross-referencing the document with By-Laws that would enable the final document to be acceptable for member states and prepared an "Explanatory Notes" document that articulated the changes and the reasons pertaining to each. Finally, at the start of June we redistributed the documents, (proposed Constitution, Explanatory Notes and associated By-Laws) to all States and Member Clubs for review.*

*Moving forward to today, we now have evident positive feedback that it is ready for overwhelming acceptance, with only one minor definition needing finessing in order to address that single concern. We therefore contend that it is now ready for its adoption and need to put in action the process by which this will be achieved.*

## **Notice of Motion**

*As a consequence, a Notice of Motion was sent to States*

*and Clubs on 7 July 2022. It reads:*

*That Member Clubs and States accept the proposed Constitution (attached) as the Rules governing the Australian Clay Target Association Ltd. Once approved, this constitution will come into effect at the close of business of the Australian Clay Target Association Inc.'s 2023 Annual General Meeting.*

*If carried, we anticipate that we will then be able to embark upon a nomination process that will enable the election of our first two member-club elected Board Members at the AGM of 2023.*

## **Sporting Clays Nationals**

*Just a reminder that our next National Championships, the ACTA Sporting Clays Nationals, will be conducted at the Wagga National Grounds, (shot for the first time since 2019), on 26, 27 and 28 August. This will also be the first time the Carnival has had a 3-day format, being Sportrap / Fri, Commonwealth Championships / Sat, National Championships / Sun. High Guns will be awarded on the combined results of the 3 events.*

## **2022 Glenn Cup Trap Competition – Australia v New Zealand**

*With travel restrictions lifted between Australia and New Zealand, the ACTA sent a team to compete at the New Zealand Nationals in the Glenn Cup Team competition.*

*Congratulations to our team members Darryn Nicholls, Glenn Barton, Ash Hawker, Greg Coleman and Ben Woodhouse on their success in retaining the Glenn Cup Trophy. A full report on our team's success can be found on page 14 of this edition.*

## **ISSF World Cup**

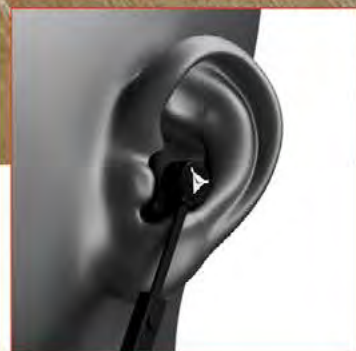

# EXPLANATORY NOTES PROPOSED CONSTITUTION ACTA

## Preamble

In May of 2021 the affiliated Clubs of the Australian Clay Target Association approved the adoption of a Company Limited by Guarantee structure by a margin of 76% for and 24% against. At the same time the proposed constitution to support that transition was defeated by a very small margin 70% for and 30% against. The approval required to go forward with the proposed change is 75% for the proposal.

Since that time the ACTA has surveyed both Clubs and individually registered shooters to determine how they would like to see the Australian Clay Target Association evolve into the next phase of the Associations existence. As is always the case, there have been numerous views put forward by both Clubs and individuals and we believe that we have responded positively to the feedback.

In these explanatory notes we have endeavoured to identify those legitimate concerns and point out the changes in response to those concerns.

## Concerns As Identified

### **Concern 1. That the ACTA wished to control all shotgun sports within Australia.**

While this was never the intention, we did identify that concern as something that should be addressed and have specifically done so on page 6 of definitions under;

*“Sport means only those Clay Target Disciplines as recognised and regulated by the Company from time to time and includes sport for athletes with disabilities”.*

*“Sporting Power means that power held by the Company for the exclusive control and management of only those disciplines recognised and controlled by the ACTA in Australia”.*

By inserting those definitions within the document it is clear that we concern ourselves with only those disciplines we hold the rights to domestically and internationally, the ACTA has no control or interest in any other shotgun sports outside of our own.

### **Concern 2. That the ACTA wanted to force all individual shooter members of Clubs to join the ACTA.**

That has been explicitly addressed at 5.6 g) Registration with the Company on page 13;

*“Member States and Clubs are entitled to register individuals other than those accepted by the Company, but those individuals may only participate in disciplines not under the jurisdiction of the Company”.*

This means that dual affiliated Clubs may register shooters that are not ACTA members, and to allow those members to compete in disciplines other than those controlled by the ACTA.

Simply put, if you want to compete in any of the ACTA registered disciplines, you need to be a financial member of the ACTA.

### **Concern 3. That the ACTA could and would limit the ability of Clubs to conduct promotional days, corporate shooting events etc.**

This constitution specifically allows such days at 5.6 g) Registration with the Company on page 14;

*“Clubs may conduct come and try days, coaching sessions for new shooters, and corporate shooting events for the development and promotion of the Sport”.*

By inserting this section into the constitution, it is very clear that Clubs may host non-members for the promotion of the Sport.

We understand that these types of promotional and corporate shooting days are of great benefit to clubs and the ACTA does not want to restrict their ability to promote the sport, especially, to new shooters who are key to our long-term growth.

### **Concern 4. That individual States have no input or control over major changes to the way the “Board” conducts business or enforces changes on States or Clubs.**

These concerns have been addressed by stipulating within the constitution that specific areas of

concern come under By-Laws that require a majority of ALL States to agree to any changes.

5.1 Categories of Members page 10;

*a) "Member States, which subject to this Constitution, shall have the right to receive notice of and appoint a delegate to attend General Meetings and the right to debate and vote at General Meetings, and the right to vote on proposed changes to By-Laws".*

21.1 Board to Formulate By-Laws page 32;

*"The Board may (by itself or by delegation to a committee) formulate, issue, adopt interpret and amend By-Laws for the proper advancement, management and administration of the Company, the advancement of the objects of the Company and the Sport as it thinks necessary or desirable. All By-Laws must be consistent with this Constitution and be approved by a majority of the Member States (Clause 1) a)".*

By inserting these clauses into the document the States retain the right to collectively decide on the By-Laws proposed by the "Board". If the States do not agree they cannot be changed.

### **Concern 5. The rotation of National Championships.**

This concern is dealt with at 2. OBJECTS page 8 by specifically including the control of major championships under a By-Law that must be approved by the majority of States.

2. OBJECTS m) page 8;

*"Promote, encourage, manage, and conduct interstate, national and international Clay Target Shooting events, competitions and championships as set out in the championships By-Law"*

To change the rotations of National Championships the "Board" will need the explicit approval of the States. The "Board" has only the ability to recommend changes. Nothing changes without the majority of the States voting in favour of any such change.

### **Concern 6. That the Disciplinary procedures could be determined exclusively by the "Board" as it was listed as being that controlled through By-Laws.**

This concern is addressed at 7.1 last paragraph, Disciplinary Action on page 15;

*"The Board in its sole discretion may reference such allegations (which in the opinion of the Directors is not vexatious, trifling or frivolous) for investigation and determination under the procedures set out in the Disciplinary By-Laws".*

As all By-Laws must be approved by the majority of the States, the procedure comes under the Control of the member States.

The Sub-Committee has agreed to adopt the current Disciplinary Procedures with a view to superseding that document with a new Sports Integrity document with the support of the States within 12 months. The current Disciplinary Procedures were drafted in 2004 and will need to be updated to reflect changes to member expectation, technology (including social media) and penalty outcomes.

### **Concern 7. That the "Board" would have far too much power to commit the ACTA to financial obligations.**

This concern has also been addressed at 14.2 Specific powers of Directors page 26;

*"Without limiting clause 14.1, the Directors may exercise all the Company's powers to borrow or raise money, to change any property or business or give any security for debt, liability or obligation of the Company or of any other person subject to the limitations set out in the Financial Control By-Law".*

This means that for any major financial undertaking above the limit as set by the Financial Control By-Law, the "Board" would need to have the approval of the majority of member States.

### **Summation**

This proposed constitution provides for the appointment of an independent "Board" of the most capable individuals elected by the member Clubs and States. It further provides for the controls where deemed necessary by the member States to ensure that each State still has a voice in any major decisions that may affect the operational fairness of the Association.

The current ACTA Executive have unanimously endorsed the document and recommend that it be adopted by the Association.

## 2022 NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1 All competitors must present their current shooting licence/permit to the events office before competition. **Failure to do so will incur a penalty loss of one target.**
- 2 Any shooter wanting to compete in the “2022 Sporting Clays Nationals” must be a registered competitor of the ACTA for the financial year 2022, or a bonified International competitor.
- 3 Entry is by pre-nomination only through MCMS (MyClubMyScores). The closing date for nominations is 5.00 pm Thursday the 25<sup>th</sup> August 2022.
- 4 Entries are limited to a maximum of 120 per event, late nominations will be taken on the day for an additional charge of \$20 per event **but only if there are vacancies available.**
- 5 Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to it commencing will be eligible for a refund less a \$10 administration fee. Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.
- 6 MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data the decision will be made by the National MCMS Handicap Supervisor.
- 7 Squads of up to 5 competitors will shoot brackets of 25 targets per visit to the traps.
- 8 Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations.
- 9 Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at the 25 Targets.
- 10 Shooters who miss their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is possible. **If a shooter is able to be re-squadded a penalty loss of one target will apply to that event.**
- 11 Should a shooter be late for his/her squad and elect to withdraw from the event they will not be eligible for any refund. It is the shooters responsibility to make sure they are where they should be and when.
- 12 All competitors are to check and sign the score sheet after each bracket. Once a shooter has signed their score sheet, the score is accepted. Any score sheet not signed by the shooter will be credited with the score as checked and recorded.
- 13 Competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, **the penalty of a loss of one target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person.**
- 14 **Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalized five targets for that event.**
- 15 All appeals must be lodged in writing with the tournament director together with a \$50 appeal fee. The Tournament director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned.
- 16 Eligible competitors are entitled to receive awards in Open, Women, Junior or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 17 There must be a minimum of three competitors in sections or grades, for any prizes to be awarded.
- 18 Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, their decision shall be final.
- 19 ACTA dress code is to be adhered to, Tournament Director is to adjudicate.
- 20 All competitors must comply with the Firearms Laws of the State hosting the National Championships.
- 21 Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.
- 22 Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.
- 23 A junior who has not previously competed at any National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to shoot for the cost of the admin fee of \$10 per event paid at the time of entry.
- 24 The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Shoot Marshall. No further adjustment will be made without authorization of the Tournament Director and Shoot Marshal.
- 25 The National Sporting Clays Championships will be conducted under the NSW Covid protocols in force at the time. Good luck to all and stay safe.

# Bendigo's Queen's Birthday Shoot Honours the Memory of Geoff Hartley

On Monday the 13th June, Bendigo was the venue to attend for the Annual Queens Birthday shoot. Some 70 shooters took the opportunity to shoot and share in trophies on offer and to remember Geoff Hartley. Geoff was one of the most popular and respected gun dealers known throughout Australia. Geoff's involvement with the club was legendary and it dates back over 50 years with his father, Rupe, being the Club President when the Club moved to its current location in 1971.

Geoff was a bootmaker by trade but his love was with the family business, selling firearms and fishing gear.

He had a wicked sense of humour as is borne out in the following story. A group of us headed off on our annual hunting and fishing trip to Western New South

Wales. Geoff and I were sitting in camp on the edge of the Barwon River when along came a fishing inspector. On sighting us, he pulled into the bank and grabbing his notebook and pen came straight up and said, "Do you have fishing licences?". Geoff wandered over to his Land Cruiser, reached under the seat and pulled out his book of NSW fishing licences he sold in his shop, walked back to the Fisheries Officer and calmly asked, "How

many do you want?" The look on the face of the Inspector was priceless.

It was great to have Geoff's two daughters and their families at the Club. Both Dianne and Meredith had abundant stories to tell about their times spent with Dad at Bendigo and other clubs throughout Australia. Geoff was also a very competitive shooter with an unbelievable second barrel. Older shooters will remember one occasion at Bendigo when a gun was the overall trophy. Geoff won the event with a score of about 45 (old angles naturally) and he pulled no less than 40 seconds, totally frustrating the others in the shoot-off.

With practice over, the first event, the Queen's Birthday Double Barrel, got off on time and it was Chris Brown, Maryborough (more noted for his Sporting Clays ability) who claimed the Overall sash and trophy with a score of 129/29.

(MCC). B Grade required a shoot-off and Angie Dillon (Colbinabbin) emerged victorious on 30/32 with Warren Williamson (Noorat) taking second. Thomas Jones (Werribee) picked up his second C Grade title for the day with 28/30 from Robert James (Kerang) 27/30.

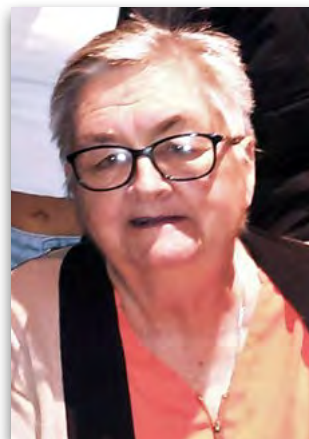
## Vale

### Mary Fox

Mary Fox (wife for 53 years of former Vice-President Rob Fox) passed away on 30 May 2022.

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

## Attending

For a couple of months last year, I explored attention and attending to the target. The articles involved attending to detail and paying attention. I explored the notion of attending and how concentration is really being able to focus your attention on the job at hand and not be distracted by either internal or external variables. This month I want to explore the errors of attending. Using the metaphor of a searchlight, Abernethy, outlines the concept of selective attention and explains the three common errors associated with selective attention.

Firstly, if the searchlight beam is too broad, then you are failing to focus all your attention on the limited essential elements for success.

Next, if the searchlight beam is pointed in the wrong direction, then you are being distracted from relevant information by irrelevant information.

And finally, if the searchlight beam is too narrow, then the athlete is unable to move from one stimulus to another rapidly enough.

In this article, I will explore these three errors more fully.

Imagine the shooter who after the possible, stands in front of the scoreboard and looks at the other scores, especially those in red, to see who he or she will be shooting off against. As the shooter is going through the list, he/she is making a mental note of their ability, what have been the results of previous shoot-offs, etc. The shooter may have also spent time looking at the trophy display, and sees him or herself with a particular trophy or sash. As the shooter moves out on to the layout, he/she notices the crowd, the flag that is now showing the winds picked up and the people about half a kilometre away in front of the layout.

It is likely that this shooter will miss. This is because although he/she is concentrating on irrelevant clues and placing a great deal of attention to these irrelevant clues: especially the scoreboard, which will then cloud the task at hand, which is seeing and shooting the target. For this shooter, the searchlight is too broad. Being

too broad allows the shooter to focus on either the past (making judgments about previous shooters and previous results) or the future (worrying about hitting the target so you can win that prize). In this case the shooter will shoot to try not to miss, rather than shoot to hit the target.

Shooting, and this can be any discipline: DTL, Trench, skeet or sporting, provides us with an excellent example of the second error. Because of grade or handicap, most of us know what our ideal performance level is so when we are shooting, we often compare how we are going with how we usually perform. For example, a AA trap shooter should get 25/25, but if his/her skeet grade is B, then a score of 22 or 23/25 might be expected, or a B grader in trench, a score of 19/25 or 20/25 might be expected. This is similar to the par in golf: "par" is the artificial score that each golfer is trying to achieve or get close to.

Focusing on the "expected" score, takes the shooters concentration way from shooting the target. The goal for every shooter should be to hit the target they have just called for. If, however the shooter is focusing on the whole round, he/she has increased the effort needed because attention now has to be given to the target and the process of shooting it for the whole round. To maintain concentration for such a length of time will be tiring and risky. It is now that the shooter is making the second error. The searchlight is now focused in the wrong direction. The single target is the focus not the whole round. Focusing on the whole round also takes our attention away from the present. The one target is the present task, but is we think of twenty-five targets we can drift back to thinking about the past (previous targets we missed or previous targets from this station, or we can project our thinking and attention to the future and start thinking about what our total score might be. Thinking about the future will lead to anxiety and will probably cause us to miss because our attention is now focused on the wrong target. When you think about the whole round of 25 you have become outcome orientated.

To shoot one target 25 times you need to be process orientated.

The final error involves being unable to divide your attention among stimuli that needs to be processed concurrently. This is a difficulty for novices, especially in complex ball sports such as rugby or AFL, where there is a need to have a high capacity for attention coupled with an ability to switch the focus of attention often. It is often thought that if you are under pressure, then by narrowing your focus, you will perform better. This is not always the case and can lead to choking, because you become unaware of the other aspects that are important in the game. This narrowing of focus can also lead to fatigue and self-doubt, which in turn limit the body to move efficiently or the mind to consider taking risks.

There are several external and internal distractions that limit our ability to attend effectively.

External distractions include noise or lack of it, gamesmanship, weather and playing conditions and visual distraction. There are ways to turn off these distractions, Perry states that before the 1988 Olympics in Seoul, the hockey teams practiced on fields that had loudspeakers around them playing Korean drums throughout the practice and announcements constantly in English and Korean. The internal distractions such as fears, worry, thoughts, etc. are much harder to have mastery over. According to Perry, in reality there is no distraction until we recognise it internally.

Even though our perceptual field (vision, hearing, touch and smell) receives the information about the external environment, it doesn't mean that the information is perceived and processed as a negative. Shooters must distinguish distraction from valuable performance cues, then use this information to enhance self-efficacy, self-confidence and performance strategy. If you are unprepared for the competition: and this can involve any or all of the physical, technical or mental skills categories, then you may become preoccupied with the distraction, rather than the task at hand, and this will lead to choking.

Using Abernethy's metaphor of the searchlight, next time you practice or train, examine what your searchlight beam is doing (what are you attending to.)

# What's happening in the VCTA

So, have you nominated for the Commonwealth Titles yet?

They are now only a few short weeks away and they promise to be a very exciting event. For those who have not attended this event before, all activities are shot off 18m (except for the Handicap, of course!).

The three days of competition include Double Rise, Double Barrel, Single Barrel, Points, Champion of Champion and Handicap events. The prize pool is an excellent \$12,000 as well as considerable support and prizes from sponsors. For further information, please see the advertisement in this magazine.

There have been a couple of important communiques from the Licensing and Regulation Division of Victoria Police in recent weeks.

Firstly, there was an email sent out, which was distributed to Victorian clubs, regarding the spate of thefts of firearms. The email was:

*The Licensing and Regulation Division (LRD) would like to bring to the attention of all licenced firearm holders the importance of being vigilant in the safe keeping of firearms. There is an emerging trend within the state, whereby organised crime groups are utilising online firearm sale portals as a scoping mechanism to gather intelligence and identify individuals with firearms. This is resulting in licenced firearm holders who are selling firearms or firearm parts and clubs that have a large portion of firearms on site becoming targets of organised crime.*

*LRD would like to emphasise the importance of maintaining the safety of all firearms in your possession and recommends that if selling a firearm or firearm parts on an online portal that you meet a prospective buyer at a Licensed Firearm Dealer (LFD) or Firearm Club. This will ensure that you can maintain both your privacy and the safe keeping of firearms in your possession.*

*Additionally, licenced firearm holders should be aware that only authorised personal, meaning Victoria Police members from LRD or local police stations, can undertake firearm safe inspections. Non-authorised personal cannot legally inspect*

*your firearm safe and should be prohibited from entering your premises. If you are approached or directed by a non-authorised person, please contact LRDs Compliance Enforcement Unit ([LRD-REGULATIONSSUPPORTUNIT-OIC@police.vic.gov.au](mailto:LRD-REGULATIONSSUPPORTUNIT-OIC@police.vic.gov.au))*

Further to this, there is a reminder to all Victorians that the Amendments to the Firearms Act come into being on the 30th August, 2022. Essentially, the new regulations outline the changes for the storage of all category A, B, C and D firearms. These include:

- Firearms must be stored in a purpose-built steel storage receptacle
- The steel must be of a thickness of at least 1.6mm (which complies with Australian/New Zealand Standard 1594:2002).
- If the receptacle weighs less than 150 kilograms when it is empty, it must be bolted to the structure of the premises.
- The receptacle must be locked with a lock of sturdy construction when the firearm is stored in it.

All clubs have been sent copies of the email and the latest "Firearms Bulletin" – check with your club secretary or check out the Police website.

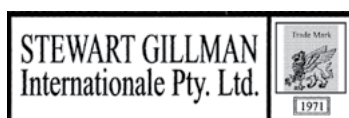

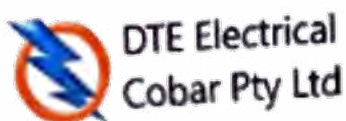

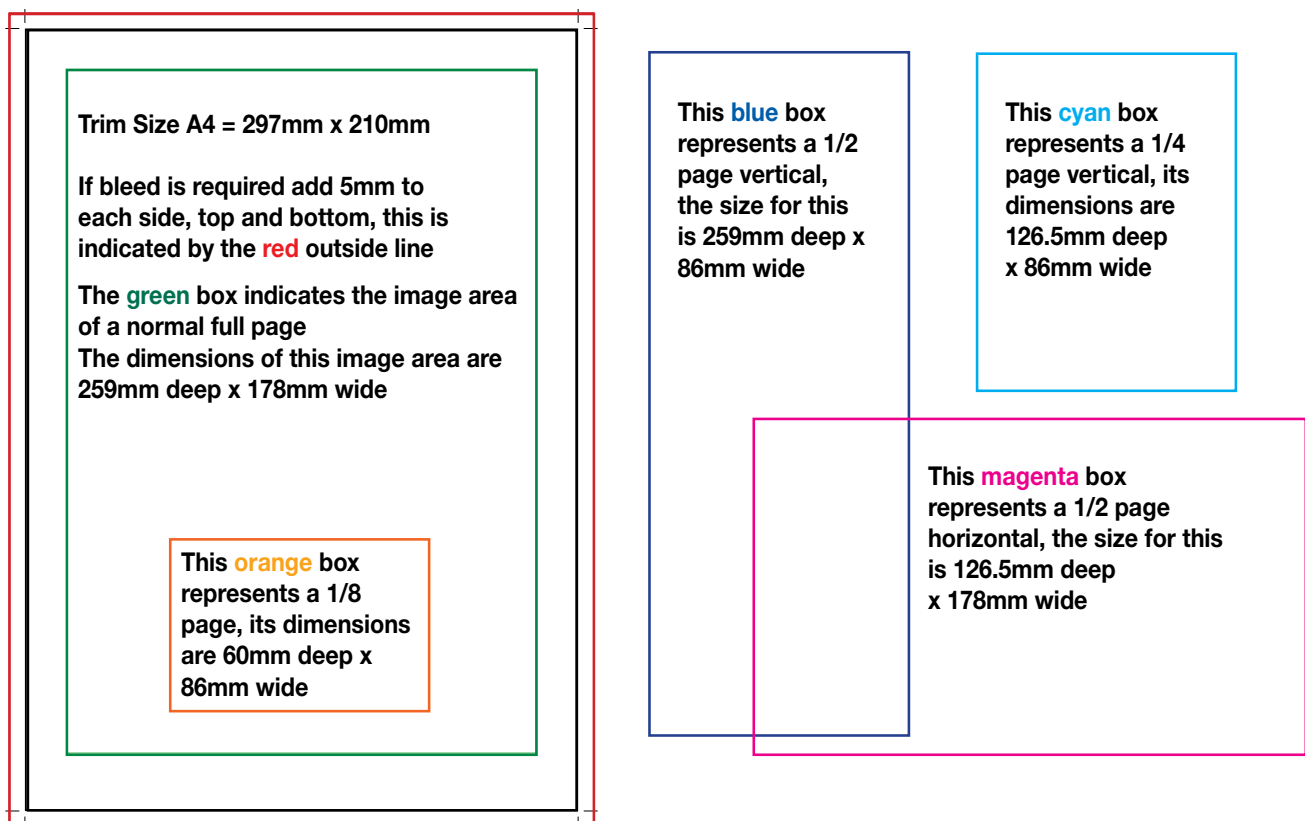
