ACTA REPORT

New Constitution

We are pleased to advise that, following the close of vote on 28 September,

Sunday 2 October's Special General Meeting announced that the new Constitution for the Australian Clay Target Association to become a Company Limited by Guarantee was finally approved by the member Clubs. (This important next step followed the March 2021 AGM where the Membership at that time voted for the Association to Become a Company Limited by Guarantee, however the accompanying proposed Constitution was not accepted at that meeting). As you are all aware, a number of important changes were made to the draft Constitution during the second half of 2021, leading to the acceptance of revisions in the document that have now been approved. That said, we wish to thank our clubs for working with us through this entire process, for supporting the approval of the new Constitution, and for accepting the changes that needed to be made to our rules that will ensure our viability as a sport.

What this now means is that:

- *the new Constitution will be adopted as of the 2023 AGM, and*
- *two newly Board Members will be elected to commence a 3-year tenure as of 2023 AGM.*

The Elected Director Nomination Process Moving Forward

We are now entering the Transitional Arrangement for the adoption of the new Constitution. This entails that four members of the existing Executive Committee, (as selected by the existing Executive Committee immediately prior to the approval of this Constitution), shall be deemed to be Transitional Elected Directors of the Company. In order to bring the number of Elected Directors up to the mandated six, two new Elected Directors will now also be elected under clause 13.4.

For this to occur, all clubs will, by now, have received an email that contains the Elected Director's Nomination Package. We encourage clubs to provide this package to any of our ACTA-Registered-Shooting Members or Life-Registered-Shooters that wish to nominate for an Elected Director position. Interested candidates can also contact the ACTA Head Office or their State Office directly to obtain a Nomination Package up till the close of nominations. The acceptance of Nominations by State Association Secretaries will commence on

17 October 2022 and continue

until close of business on Friday

23 December 2022. All validated

nominations will then be assessed by Affiliated State Association Executive Committees for them to approve / rank. The top three, (if that many), endorsed from each State will then be returned to the ACTA on 17 February, following which, on 24 February, the Candidate's Nominations Packages will be forwarded to all Member Clubs for them assess and rank their top two candidates. The Electoral Platforms will also be published in the April Clay Target e-News, (March edition). Club votes will need to be returned by 21 April so votes can be tallied and announced at the 2023 AGM.

We look forward to delivering this exciting and critical next chapter as we reshape our governance structure and build a better future for our sport. We also welcome applications from any shooting members who have the ambition of contributing to our sport through the provision of time, leadership and energetic ideas. If you feel that you can make a significant commitment and provide a positive legacy to this sport, please consider lodging your nomination.

ISSF Trap Shooting Included in the 2026 Commonwealth Games

We received the great news on Wednesday of last week from Shooting Australia that the Commonwealth Games Federation (CGF) announced that Shooting will be included in the Victoria 2026 Commonwealth Games event program. This followed a vigorous campaign to have shooting events included on the 2026 program following their initial exclusion from the first phase of selected sports at the start of April.

The 2026 Commonwealth Games are to be conducted across a number of hubs in regional Victoria, and it is currently proposed that the ISSF Trap Shotgun and other shooting events will be hosted in the Gippsland area. Congratulations to Shooting Australia, our Commonwealth Games Clay Target Shooting Focus Group, the VCTA Executive and State Secretary Jeff Bell on their enormous efforts to support Shooting Australia and win the bid . . . well done! Also, a big thank you to Nick Dean and Echuca Clay Target Club for lobbying so strongly for the event, (even though it now appears apparent that the chosen location has not turned out as we initially envisaged).

NOTICE OF MCMS

SKEET GRADING CHANGES

As previously advised the following changes have now been implemented to the MCMS grading system for skeet shooting disciplines, effective immediately.

There have been two independent disciplines created within the Skeet shooting sports conducted under the ACTA rules in Australia.

1. Skeet singles with the grades calculated across all gauges to include a difficulty uplift factor for each of 20 Gauge, 28 Gauge, .410 Bore shot over full rounds of standard skeet.
2. Skeet doubles with the grades calculated exclusively from rounds of Skeet Doubles only.

Shooters may check the MCMS App to see their split grades as applicable. *To view all the algorithm % floors please visit the [ACTA website under Referees and Rules](#).*

NOTICE OF MCMS

UNIVERSAL TRENCH GRADING

We also wish to advise that as of today, the automated MCMS grading system has been implemented for the Universal Trench (UT) discipline as requested by the UT administrators. Those individual competitors who have sufficient data from January 2021 will have an MCMS automated grade in the same manner that all other disciplines are graded.

The ACTA Executive are pleased to advise that we do not see any further changes to the % floors of any disciplines until our next yearly review in mid-2023.

NOMINATIONS ARE NOW OPEN FOR THE ELECTION OF DIRECTORS TO THE BOARD OF THE ACTA Ltd

The ACTA is now seeking suitable individuals to nominate as candidates in the forthcoming election of Directors to the Board of the Australian Clay Target Association Ltd.

The procedure for nomination is as follows:

In the first instance all interested parties should approach their ACTA Club to obtain a copy of the nominations package. This package will outline the requirements of Directors, an application form and the code of conduct form.

When an individual has decided they would like to nominate, they should fill in the appropriate application form, have it signed by both the Club President and Secretary (or equivalent).

Once the nomination has been completed it should be forwarded to the Secretary/Administrator of the State Association they are a member of, by not later than the 23rd December 2022, together with the signed code of conduct and a description of their background/skill sets (no more than 500 words) for endorsement by the appropriate State Association.

For any further information please contact the Secretary/Administrator of your State Association, or the CEO of the ACTA.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – 2023 ISSF CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1 *All competitors must present their current shooting licence/permit to the events office before competition. **Failure to do so will incur a penalty of one (1) target in each event.***
- 2 **The National ISSF Championships will be conducted under the ISSF rules governing International Competitions. ACTA dress rules to apply.**
- 3 *Any shooter wanting to compete in the “2023 ISSF Nationals” must be a registered competitor member of the ACTA for the financial year 2023, hold a current shooting licence/permit (all Junior Shooters must hold a valid Junior permit), or be a bonified International competitor holding Australian documents that allow the use of firearms for target shooting.*
- 4 **Entry and pre-squadding is by pre-nomination only through MCMS (MyClubsMyScores).** *The closing date for nominations is 5.00 pm Friday the 13th January 2023. Squadding will be published on MCMS Saturday the 14th January 2023.*
- 5 *Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to it commencing will be eligible for a refund less a \$10 administration fee. **Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.***
- 6 *MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data for a competitor they will be graded after their first four (4) rounds.*
- 7 *Squads of up to 6 competitors will shoot a total of 125 targets per event, in brackets of 25 targets, shot one visit to a trap each 25.*
- 8 *Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.*
- 9 **If a shooter misses their squad they may be re-squadded, however that is not guaranteed and will incur a three (3) target penalty if they are re-squadded.**
- 10 *All competitors are to check and sign the score sheet after each bracket. Any score sheet not signed by the shooter will be credited with the score as recorded.*
- 11 *All competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. **While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, the penalty of a loss of one (1) target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the loss of one (1) target in the next event. Should a competitor not be shooting a following event then the penalty will apply in the event concerned.***
- 12 *No competitor may interfere with or attempt to interfere with the traps, any competitor doing so will be automatically disqualified.*
- 13 *All appeals must be lodged in writing with the Technical Director together with the \$80 appeal fee. The Technical Director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned. If the appeal is not upheld the ACTA will retain the fee.*
- 14 *Entrants in the Mens and Womens Championships are entitled to receive awards in Junior, and Veteran sections as well as grades if applicable.*
- 15 *There must be a minimum of three competitors in sections or grades, for any prizes to be awarded, and a minimum of 10 entrants to constitute a sectional National Championship.*
- 16 *Section prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd with placing for 2nd and 3rd decided by count back.*
- 17 *Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.*
- 18 *Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.*
- 19 *The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Technical Director prior to the start of the events each day. No further adjustment will be made without the authorization of the Technical Director.*
- 20 *A junior who has not previously competed at any National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to shoot for the cost of the admin fee of \$10 per event paid at the time of entry.*
- 21 *The ACTA reserves the right to alter any conditions of the competition should it become necessary. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the ACTA Executive Committee, their decision shall be final.*

GIPPSLAND SET TO HOST SHOOTING IN 2026 COMMONWEALTH GAMES

The Victorian Government has today announced that Gippsland will host Shooting as part of the regional 2026 Commonwealth Games.

Last Wednesday the Commonwealth Games Federation confirmed the Phase 2 sports that would be added to the program in 2026 which included Shooting events comprising Shotgun Clay Target Trap, 10m Air Pistol and 10m Air Rifle. For the first time in a Commonwealth Games Shooting sport program, Para Shooting will also be included.

In response to today's announcement Shooting Australia's Chief Executive Officer Adam Sachs said "We are delighted that Gippsland has been identified as the host for Shooting at the 2026 Commonwealth Games and are looking forward to working closely with the Victorian Government and local Shooting organisations towards the development of international standard (i.e. ISSF and WSPS) facilities that will enable us to showcase our amazing athletes and our sport.

Any investment by Government in new or upgraded facilities will have a significant impact on the long-term growth of Shooting in the region and will support the engagement and development of future world-class athletes from Gippsland and Victoria for years to come. This will be the legacy of Shooting's re-admission to the Commonwealth Games and is something that we can all be very proud of."

Further details regarding the specific locations for Shooting's 2026 Commonwealth Games events are anticipated in the coming weeks.

Australian Shotgun Team Win 5 Medals and an Olympic Quota at 2022 World Championships



Australian Shotgun Team

The 2022 year of international competition culminated at the ISSF World Championships (Shotgun) in Osijek, Croatia, where the Australian Shotgun Team produced more incredible performances. Their efforts resulted in 1 gold, and 4 bronze medals across Junior and Senior Trap individual, team, and mixed teams events as well as an all-important Paris Olympic Quota; the first to be won across all disciplines.

The Australian World Championship Team consisted of: Mens Trap (Senior) James Willett, Nathan Argiro, Thomas Grice. Womens Trap (Senior) Penny Smith, Catherine Skinner, Laetisha Scanlan. Mens Trap (Junior) Acacio Mota, William Freni-Lizzi, Gabe Sensi, Marco Corbo. Womens Trap (Junior) Kiara Dean, Molly Bretag, Breanna Collins, Georgia Pistone. Womens Skeet (Senior) Aislin Jones.

In the Junior Trap Women qualification, Kiara Dean shot 110/125 to finish in 3rd position qualifying for Ranking Match 1, with Breanna Collins shooting 109/125 entering a shoot-off

where she shot a further 3 targets to finish in 5th position also qualifying for Ranking Match 1. Dean went on to shoot 21/25 to qualify in first place for the medal match, with Collins shooting 20/25 qualifying in second position for the medal match. In the medal match, Dean shot 30/35 tied with Ting Han from China, with the two entering a shoot off where Dean shot a further 4 targets to win the gold medal for Australia. Collins shot 19/25 to claim the bronze medal for Australia. Molly Bretag shot 102/125 to place 16th, with Georgia Pistone shooting 100/125 placing 18th.

In the Junior Trap Men qualification, William Freni-Lizzi shot 112/125, narrowly missing out on a shoot off for the final by 1 target placing 10th. Marco Corbo shot 110/125 to place 17th and Acacio Mota shot 106/125 to place 35th. Unfortunately Gabe Sensi had to withdraw from competition after day 1 of qualification due to medical reasons.

In the Junior Trap Mixed Teams, Australia was represented by two teams; Marco Corbo and Kiara Dean, and William Freni-Lizzi and Breanna Collins. Corbo and Dean shot a combined qualifying total of 130/150 to place 7th, and Freni-Lizzi and Collins shot 128/150 to place 11th.

In the final event for the Juniors, Marco Corbo, Acacio Mota, and William Freni-Lizzi teamed

up for the Trap Team Men, with Kiara Dean, Breanna Collins, and Molly Bretag teaming up for the Trap Team Women. The Junior Women shot a combined total of 191/225 and after a shoot off qualified for the bronze medal match. In the bronze medal match, the Junior women scored 6 points to the USA's 2 winning the bronze medal for Australia. The Junior Trap Team Men shot 196/225 to place 9th.

At the conclusion of the Junior Trap events it was

Laetisha Scanlan shot 11/15 targets to place 4th in Ranking Match 1, unfortunately missing out on a place in the medal match. With the ranking matches, athletes who qualified for the medal match were awarded a

quota for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. Catherine Skinner shot 21/25 targets in Ranking Match 2 and with the four athletes who qualified for the medal match awarded a quota place for their country for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, Skinner secured the first quota for the Australian Shooting Team. In the medal match, Skinner shot 10/15 targets to place 4th. Penny Smith unfortunately had to withdraw from qualification for medical reasons.

In the Trap Men qualification, Nathan Argiro shot 120/125 where he entered a shoot off for a place in the Ranking Matches, finishing in 15th. James Willett shot 119/125 to place 18th, and Thomas Grice shot 109/125 to place 110th.

In the Trap Mixed Team qualification Australia was represented by James Willett and Laetisha Scanlan, and Thomas Grice and Catherine Skinner. The team of Scanlan and Willett shot 142/150 and after a shoot-off qualified for bronze medal match 1. The scores were tied at 5-5 in the medal match between

Australia and Bulgaria with a sudden death shoot off required to determine the bronze medallists. Willett and Scanlan hit a further 2 targets to Bulgaria's 1 to win the bronze medal for Australia. Grice and Skinner shot a combined 135/150 in qualification placing 30th.

Closing the events for the Senior Australian Trap Team was the Trap Team Men and Trap Team Women events. Nathan Argiro, James Willett, and Thomas Grice teamed up for the Trap Team Men, and Laetisha Scanlan, Catherine Skinner, and Penny Smith for the Trap Team Women. In the Trap Team Women, Australia shot a combined 202/225 to place 4th, qualifying for the bronze medal match. In the bronze medal match, Australia scored 6 points to the People's Republic of China's 4 points to win the bronze medal for Australia. In the Trap Team Men, the Australian trio shot 209/225 to place 16th.

The Senior Skeet Women event closed out the ISSF World Championships campaign for Australia with Aislin Jones shooting 111/125 in qualification to place 33rd.

The 2022 ISSF Shotgun World Championships in Osijek, Croatia was successful for the Australian team, collecting not only a swag of medals but the all important first Quota place for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

Gold for Western Australian Para Trap Shooter in Italy



Nige Young, a dedicated Para Trap shooter from Perth, Western Australia, is the latest of the Australian ISSF competitors to make a name for himself and win a Gold Medal against some of the best para trap shooters in the world at Lonato, Italy.

Nige competed in the 2022 Open European Para Trap Championships, including the Grand Prix, that were recently held at the Lonato, Italy ranges, where notable ISSF World Cups and

Championships have been held. This time it was a WSPS event conducted over the period 29th September to 2nd October 2022.

Being that Para Trap is not yet an Olympic event, the only support from Shooting Australia was Nige's IPC Card. Nige now joins Scotty Brydon, the only other Australian to have won a Gold Medal at an International Para Trap Championship.

In Para Trap competitions, there are various categories for the competitor's disability and Nige was classified as a PT1 – SGS (Para Trap1 – Shotgun – Seated) as he requires a wheelchair for stability to shoot. Over the course of the 125 target event, Nige shot 20, 20, 21, 18, 22 for a 101/125 to put him in 2nd position from the 15 "wheelies" in attendance. At



the completion of the 125 targets, Nige was 1 target behind the leader. At the completion of the Final 5, Nige shot a 29 to come out with the Gold Medal.

Nige said regarding his performance that his thoughts throughout the competition Final were, to trust his processes, taking one target at a time. Then as he progressed, his emotions running high started telling him that "I could get Bronze" and congratulating himself on every hit. But as the last 10 targets came into play, he then said "I could get Silver". It all came down to the last target off Pad 1 and his thoughts were "if I miss, it's a shoot-off and if I hit, its GOLD for Australia". Gold is what it was and he now says that at the end his feelings were of relief that it was over, joy at having achieved such a huge result for himself and being part of the para shotgun competition amongst the world's best.

Nige now hopes that his win at Lonato will pave the way for inclusion at the WSPS Para Trap World Championships that are due to be held at Al Ain, UAE from the 3rd to 18th November 2022 plus that his achievement will assist the Para Trap movement in Australia develop. Clay Target shooting is a sport for all people.



43RD CENTRAL VICTORIAN GRAND PRIX

September 24th & 25 2022

2022 witnessed the running of the first ever two-day shoot for the Maryborough Gun Club. The Grand Prix, first run in 1978, has been held as a one-day event and until 2020 when covid necessitated its cancellation, had never missed a year. In 2021, also due to covid, the event was rescheduled from its regular June calendar date to November. Realising that November was possibly too late in the year and scheduled around many other notable events, the committee decided to move the shoot into September and to add a second day to the program. The addition of a second day had been a subject of discussion for some time and it appeared that from shooter requests and the success of other 2 day shoots that it would be worth trialing.

Whether it was because of the second day's shooting, or because we had the misfortune for the shoot day to fall on the AFL Grand Final public holiday weekend with an additional holiday declared on the Thursday, the Grand Prix for the first time ever did not run at a profit. With many thousands of dollars worth of cash

and cartridges for prizes, including \$1500 for overall in the Grand Prix and \$1000 for the overall high gun, you could describe the result was demoralising. Only 62 shooters nominated for day one and 56 for day two.

That aside, those shooters who did compete, shot in the best weather we had had for weeks with

both days sunny, warm and with only slight breezes to contend with.

The layouts were presented in immaculate condition, the old fencing along the trap line gone and the grass cut like lawn right out beyond the 50 metre pegs. The five Laporte traps performed without fault over both days and the Promatic soft-red trap targets were easy to see in the sky and broke well.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

More questions?

Over the past few months, I have had several questions from readers regarding a range of topics: gun fit, trigger freeze, concentration, etc. One of the readers was concerned about stopping his mind wandering when he was shooting well. He said that as a result this caused him to miss, and often miss again. He finds it difficult to put twenty-five together regularly, because his mind gets in the road. When we spoke, I pointed out that missing a target or two and coming in with 24/25 or 23/25 did not indicate poor shooting; it indicated a lapse of concentration.

Being able to hit every target, means being able to concentrate on each target, one at a time, rather than trying to remain focused on all 25 targets: that is, focusing on one target 25 times, not 25 targets in one go. It would be impossible to stay focused on the whole twenty-five targets without ending up with an excruciating headache. Therefore, to shoot each target as it is presented involves staying in the present; the here and now. But for most human beings this is difficult to do for more than one minute. Most of us chose to resist the ability to stay focused on the present and at that moment when we let our mind wander, we usually miss the target. Why, because the target is in the here and now and when we think of the past, about the target we may have missed in the last event or last time we shot at this club, we are shooting in the past. When we focus on the past, we make judgements about our ability or our self-worth based on previous performances.

When we focus on winning the event or getting the high gun trophy then we are shooting in the future and again are likely to miss the target, because we worry about the outcome and develop anxieties that will create self-doubt about our ability to perform well.

Thinking about both the past and the future can deny us the ability to stay focused and enjoy the perfection of the moment.

According to Caroline Robertson, writing in *Well Being Magazine* (2003) in her article Moment

Meditation, states that ascertaining whether we drift to the past or the present indicates our personal psychological tendency. She describes the following exercise to see if you lag in the past or flee to the future. You will need to carry around a small notebook and whenever you are aware of your thoughts categorise whether you are thinking about the past, moment or the future. Write down P for past, M for moment and F for future and at the end of four hours tally the results. Robertson claims that while there can be a productive side to our time travelling inclinations it can also perpetuate negative patterns of thinking and feelings. An abundance of F's you may have excessive future consciousness and you may be more prone to anxiety, frustration, anger, worry, restlessness, irritability, impatience, fear and dissatisfaction. Those with a majority of P's are more attached to past concerns and experiences and this can be a disposition to depression, guilt, judgement, bitterness, hopelessness, self-pity, and a judgemental outlook. (It must be remembered that these observations of Robertson's are generalisations and it doesn't mean that you will necessarily feel these ways if you think in the past or the future.)

Robertson continues by saying that these negative feelings will dissipate when you refocus your mind back to the present. She believes that predominately happy people have the ability to spend a majority of their lives in the present, thinking about the moment in which they are living right now. Happy people she believes make friends with the present and do not allow the pressures of time to impinge on pleasant pleasures. When we live in the present, we experience pleasure with our full presence. When we mentally remove ourselves from the present (here and now), we are unable to appreciate the fullness of now and we become dissatisfied with life. For the shooter, when we mentally remove ourself from the present we are unable to focus on those important things; targets.

Robertson's article is interesting in that it is trying

to teach the reader that to be fulfilled and to reach your potential one should remain anchored in the present. This is vital for the sportsman; when we ponder the past or fret over the future, we lose our present power and we create confusion which affects our ability to make decisions at this moment. The secret to empowerment is to focus on what we can influence rather than worrying about what we can't. We can influence the present but there is nothing we can do about the past and if we think we can influence the future we will only develop fear of what might happen. So, what can you do to stay focused in the present? Firstly, breathe. For human beings this is one thing we can only do in the here and now. So, focus on your breathing. Feel each breath and what effect it is having on your body and mind. I take several deep breathes between shots; this allows me to stay focused on what I am doing and where I am at this moment. A common sport psychology technique is called Centreing. This was an approach developed by American Sport Psychologist Nideffer. Basically, it is taking several deep breathes and as you breath feel where the breath starts from in your body. You should practise this technique whenever you can; for

example, when lining up at the checkout, post office or bank, etc. The second thing you can do as your about to shoot is focus on a part of your body as it feels at this moment. For example, feel the pressure on the soles of your feet, or the feel on the gun in your hand. You can also focus on the pressure of the pad against your shoulder or the feel of the gun as it recoils. This is mindfulness.

Think about your personal tendency; it is for the past or the future. Look at what you are doing when you are shooting and develop ways to keep yourself focused on the here and now. Being focused on the 'here and now' will quieten the mind and allow you to concentrate more fully on the target you are shooting at the time.

It is with great sadness that the Wangaratta Clay Target Club informs the shooting community of the passing of Ernie Williams, a universally respected and much-loved member of our club. Ernie was an inspirational figure at the club and his unceasing efforts and his wisdom made it

and the world a better place.

Ernie grew up in Wangaratta and joined the National Bank after finishing high school. The war interrupted that career path and Ernie served briefly in the army. He soon discovered that soldiers spent far too much time marching, so he transferred to the RAAF, eventually qualifying as a flight instructor. He taught basic flying in Tiger

Moths, but was certainly versatile and could fly many different types. He could crash them too, managing to walk away from wheels up forced landings in a Beaufighter and a Wirraway.

After the war, Ernie went into the poultry farming business with his father, but also pursued his love of outdoor activities. He and his wife Jean were involved in building the Wangaratta Ski Lodge on Mount Feathertop, sometimes trekking to the site on horseback. His favourite outdoor activity was hunting though, and he was particularly keen on the ducks.

Ernie was kept busy enough with the poultry farm and raising daughters Jan and Dianne, but he'd long fostered a dream of running his own gun shop. In the early 1970s, he and Jean started running a licensed guns and ammo business from the corrugated iron chook sheds on the farm at North Wang. The business thrived and Ernie & Jean soon expanded the business into the famous purpose-built log cabin shop beside the family home. The business is long gone, but the log cabin still stands, complete with the 'Guns & Ammo' sign, hand carved by daughter Dianne and son in law Mike.

Ernie came to competitive shooting relatively late in life, joining what was then the Wangaratta Gun Club in the 1970s.

He certainly made up for that late start though, and was soon winning major events, taking out the prestigious 1971 Budgewah Night Handicap at Hay. Ernie was among the twenty three shooters scoring 15/15 and going into the shoot-off. The opposition dropped away one by one, but Ernie held his nerve and finally took the win with an impressive 102/102. He pocketed the princely sum of \$250 and also scored a "Special sash" presented by Mr J Houston, the owner of Budgewah Station and sponsor of the event.

From those early days, Ernie dedicated his time and energy to the club for the rest of his life. He was the club handicapper, a committee member, tireless volunteer and life member.

His sharp eye and even sharper mind were in action until the very end of his extraordinary life, guiding the club and its members and issuing orders, cleverly disguised as advice. It was only a couple of years back that, for his own birthday, Ernie bought himself a lovely old Beretta SO3 that soon became his pride and joy. He was fond of bringing the SO3 out to the club so he could

have a shot with the young blokes, anyone under about 80, that is to say.

Ernie was fiercely independent, still living in the family home beside the old log cabin and making his own way to the gun club twice a week to run the practice book right up until a week before he passed away at the far too young age of 101 years.

Ernie's funeral service took place in Wangaratta on the 28th of September, after which his cortege drove through the grounds of the Wangaratta Clay Target Club. One last visit for Ernie and the end of an era for the club.

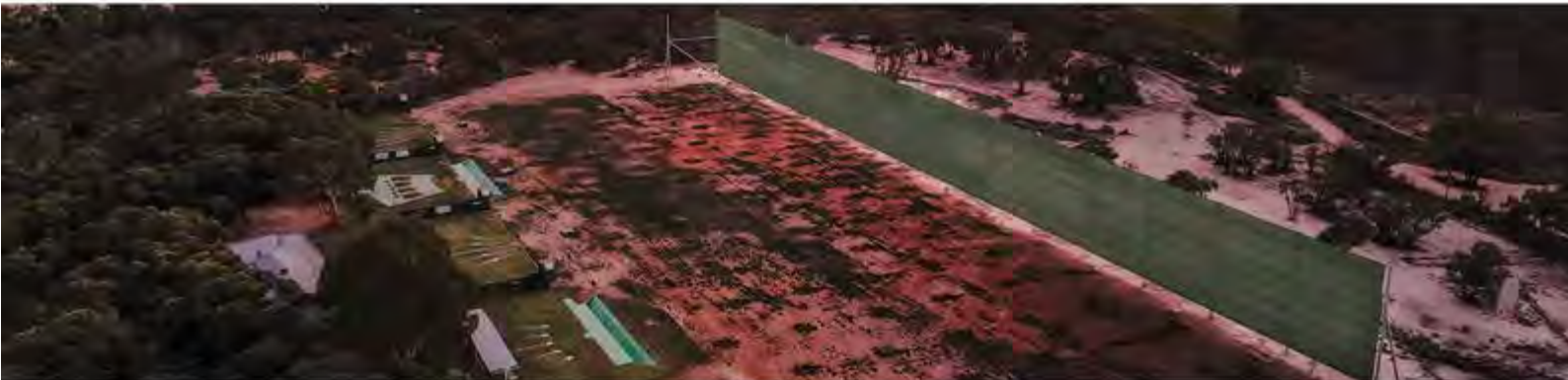

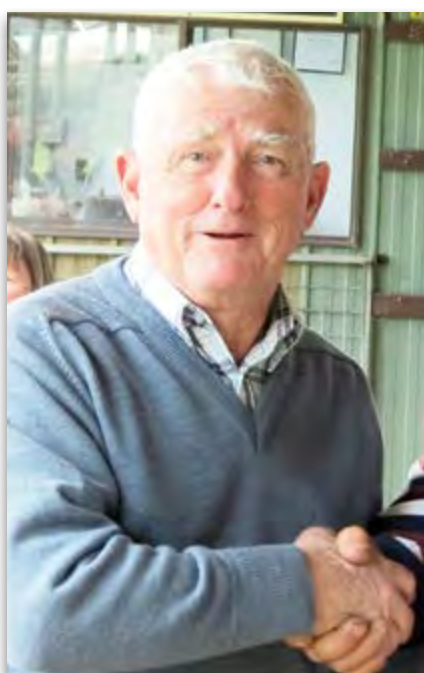

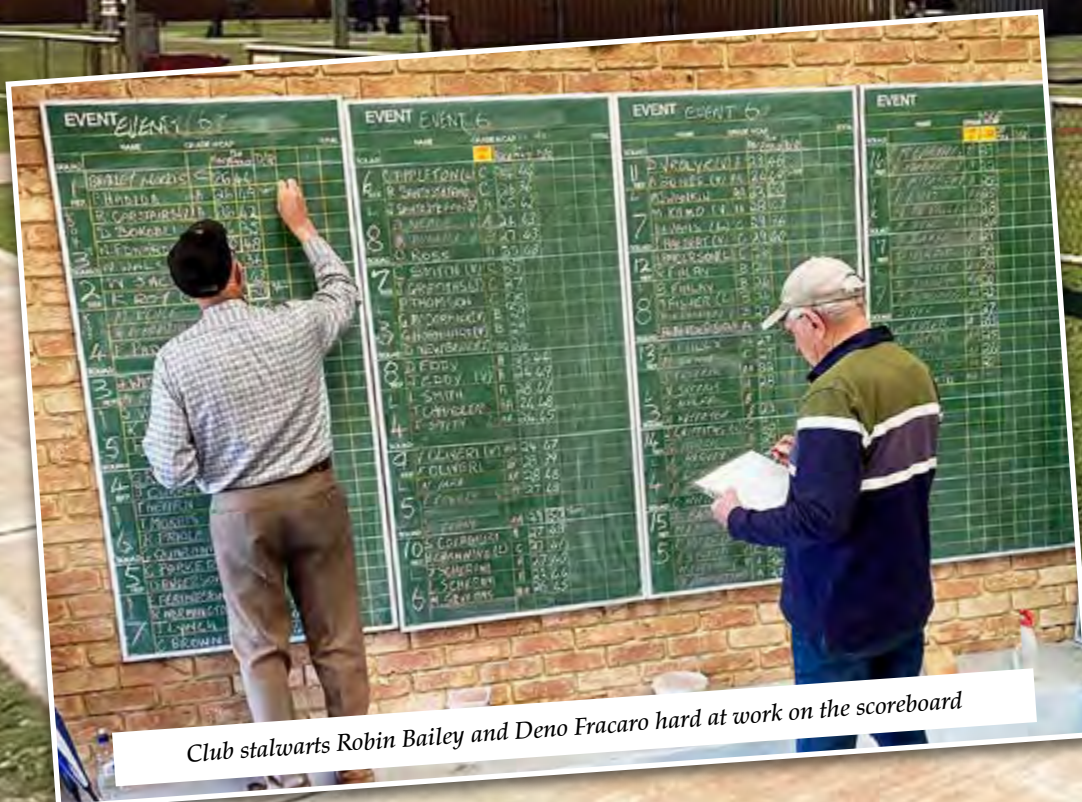
WA GUN CLUB TRAP CARNIVAL

Whilst on the subject of thanks, these carnivals don't just happen and an "army" of volunteers is needed to arrange the sponsorship, prepare the grounds, set up the equipment, arrange and prepare the catering, prepare score sheets and process the scores and finally make presentations.

The lead up to the carnival was witness to probably some of the worst weather experienced during Perth winters – strong winds, driving rain and at times, even hail! Thankfully the forecast was for a dry but overcast weekend and so it turned out.

Friday afternoon saw the lead-up event of a 60 target Medley sponsored by Knight Group and Jerry Mercer contested by 67 shooters. Whilst dry as mentioned previously, cold (by Perth standards) and overcast conditions made shooting a little more challenging than normal but some good scores were still posted. Mallala Gun Club Inc.

LAST SHOOT

It is with great sadness that we announce the end of an era for the Mallala Gun Club Inc. In 2021 we were requested to vacate the property we had leased for the last seventy-four years. Once we were faced with this dilemma, we were generously invited by Monarto Clay Target Club to relocate to their venue and continue to retain our club status, all be it with a reduced shoot program. This offer had worked well for most of the year with the club finally deciding that it was no longer viable to continue. Monday October 3rd, 2022 was to be the last shoot conducted by the Mallala Gun Club. We had \$5,000 up for prizes and a bang-up BBQ. The weather was kind. Fifty-nine shooters turned up from all over the State, we all had a great day.

Let us for a moment, visit the humble beginnings and history of our beloved club. Soon after the end of WW1 there was a need for the local community to engage in activity to mend the terrible years of war and help bring the community together. 1909 saw the opening of the Mallala Football Club, known as the Magpies. That club lives to this day with a very proud tradition of local football. The only thing missing in the town was a Gun Club. There was no surprise that many of these footballers were keen on the idea of the shooting sports. There is also no surprise that the very same names appear on the life member honour boards of both clubs.

So, in 1923 in the South Australian rural town of Mallala some fifty kilometres north of Adelaide, there was a gathering of esteemed

gentlemen desiring the formation of a gun club with the intention of shooting live birds. This was the practice in those days. Among these gentlemen there were Messrs T. Arnold who was elected President, A Weatherill, who took up the secretarial job with N. Irish, A. Driscoll, F. Baker, S. Williams, C. Temby, W. Curnow and J. Baird who were enthusiastic members. The club was duly formed and took up the practice of shooting pigeons on land at the rear of the Mallala Hotel. One can only imagine the satisfaction that members took from those heady days of shooting, and the occasional bevy from the pub. Hardly acceptable practice today. Very appealing though.

At the advent of WW2, the club disbanded and donated their assets to the Red Cross Society. In 1947 after the war, the club reformed but this time, they had located to the farming property of the Irish family. This was the beginning of a new era for the Club but by this time, the RSPCA frowned on the practice of shooting live birds, so the alternative was what we now know today as clay targets. In 1950 the club erected a new shed as clubrooms. That same shed has been used as club rooms to this very day. There have been a few modifications since then. In total, the club has existed for ninety years and must be one of the oldest clubs in South Australia.

The Mallala Museum has requested that we entrust them with the future care of our honour boards, shields and any other memorabilia that is worthy of being displayed.

This level of respect is not lost on the membership, and we are thrilled that there is an institution of dedicated folks, that wish to

perpetuate the memory of our club.

As a club we would like to take this opportunity to thank all members, sponsors and members of our neighbouring clubs who have put in many hours of hard work to build this club and our sport. Hooroo and see you around the traps.

A grade was won by Ryan Smeda from Southern CTC, 111/112, with Rick Zupanic from International second and Jeff Higgins also from Southern third. Finishing first in B grade was Greg Tapscott 97/100 from Lower North with Deb McPherson, Lake Albert second and Kirk Robinson International, third. Russell Stopp from SA Sporting won C grade shooting a great score for a C grader of 97/100. Coming in second was Andrew Winen, Southern Yorke and Steve Haggerty placed third. Vicki Batten, 92/100 from Wilkawatt picked up the Junior prize, Tracey Haggerty shooting a 91/100 won the Ladies and the Veteran award went to Steven Chambers from the Mount Gambier Gun Club shooting 97/100.
