*Christmas shoots and summer socialising. The Association is currently ramping up for 2023 and we hope to provide more detail in this regard over the following months.*

### **Membership Renewals**

*Just a friendly reminder that the annual membership year officially closes on 31 December and the 2023 membership year opens on 1 January. That said, 2023 Renewals commenced being processed by the National Office on 1 November so are now open. The easiest way to re-join is through the Mypage portal which is located on the website under Quicklinks. The web address link is at: <https://mypage.claytarget.com.au/> We encourage you to renew via this method as it allows you to take control and review any personal details that require updating on the database at the time of re-joining. (It also reduces the load on Club Secretaries!)*

### **Bigpond Subscribers**

*It has been brought to our attention that many Bigpond internet subscribers have, in recent months, failed to receive the e-News. ## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – 2023 ISSF CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1 *All competitors must present their current shooting licence/permit to the events office before competition. **Failure to do so will incur a penalty of one (1) target in each event.***
- 2 **The National ISSF Championships will be conducted under the ISSF rules governing International Competitions. ACTA dress rules to apply.**
- 3 *Any shooter wanting to compete in the “2023 ISSF Nationals” must be a registered competitor member of the ACTA for the financial year 2023, hold a current shooting licence/permit (all Junior Shooters must hold a valid Junior permit), or be a bonified International competitor holding Australian documents that allow the use of firearms for target shooting.*
- 4 **Entry and pre-squadding is by pre-nomination only through MCMS (MyClubsMyScores).** *The closing date for nominations is 5.00 pm Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> January 2023. Squadding will be published on MCMS Saturday the 14<sup>th</sup> January 2023.*
- 5 *Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to it commencing will be eligible for a refund less a \$10 administration fee. **Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.***
- 6 *MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data for a competitor they will be graded after their first four (4) rounds.*
- 7 *Squads of up to 6 competitors will shoot a total of 125 targets per event, in brackets of 25 targets, shot one visit to a trap each 25.*
- 8 *Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.*
- 9 **If a shooter misses their squad they may be re-squadded, however that is not guaranteed and will incur a three (3) target penalty if they are re-squadded.**
- 10 *All competitors are to check and sign the score sheet after each bracket. Any score sheet not signed by the shooter will be credited with the score as recorded.*
- 11 *All competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. **While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, the penalty of a loss of one (1) target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the loss of one (1) target in the next event. Should a competitor not be shooting a following event then the penalty will apply in the event concerned.***
- 12 *No competitor may interfere with or attempt to interfere with the traps, any competitor doing so will be automatically disqualified.*
- 13 *All appeals must be lodged in writing with the Technical Director together with the \$80 appeal fee. The Technical Director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned. If the appeal is not upheld the ACTA will retain the fee.*
- 14 *Entrants in the Mens and Womens Championships are entitled to receive awards in Junior, and Veteran sections as well as grades if applicable.*
- 15 *There must be a minimum of three competitors in sections or grades, for any prizes to be awarded, and a minimum of 10 entrants to constitute a sectional National Championship.*
- 16 *Section prizes will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> with placing for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> decided by count back.*
- 17 *Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.*
- 18 *Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.*
- 19 *The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Technical Director prior to the start of the events each day. No further adjustment will be made without the authorization of the Technical Director.*
- 20 *A junior who has not previously competed at any National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to shoot for the cost of the admin fee of \$10 per event paid at the time of entry.*
- 21 *The ACTA reserves the right to alter any conditions of the competition should it become necessary. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the ACTA Executive Committee, their decision shall be final.*

# Rule Questions Answered

**Two quite straightforward questions were recently asked of me, this small Q & A article may enlighten other members.**

For reference the 2022 ACTA Rule book is available on the ACTA website, I encourage members to become more conversant with our rules and to avail themselves of this resource.

## **Question 1.**

**How many malfunctions can a shooter have during an event.**

### **Rule 5.7(f), 7.9(e) LOST TARGET**

- (f) The fourth and subsequent malfunction in any one event occurs. However, at the end of each 100 targets in any one event, the malfunctions that have occurred shall be cancelled, and the count shall recommence from zero.

You will notice that there are 2 provisos within this Rule.

1. A competitor may have 3 malfunctions during an event, with the fourth being called lost. Read literally this does not mean every 25 targets, this means per event regardless of the number of targets.
2. At the end of any 100 targets the malfunctions will be cancelled and the count will restart from zero.

Malfunctions may be “cartridge” or “firearm” related, there is no distinction within the Rule. To be clear, any three malfunctions whether they are gun or cartridge or a combination of both will render the fourth malfunction a LOST target.

### **See also Rule 6.5.12(b) for ISSF:**

Only 2 malfunctions only are allowable per round.

## **Question 2.**

**Can a shooter simply call for a target to look at after 2 consecutive broken targets.**

### **Rule 1.19 MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS FOR OFFICIALS.**

.5 (Trap vi), (Skeet vi) TARGETS TO BE SHOWN BY REFEREES

- (vi) If a competitor receives two broken targets in a row.

The answer is NO. A shooter must seek permission from the Referee to call for a target to look at after 2 broken targets. The Rule clearly defines that the responsibility is with the Referee. If the Referee does not comply with the Rule, the shooter can certainly request that a target to be shown.

As it was the first year shooting an expanded program to include the sub-gauge events as State Championships, we were pleased with the number of visiting shooters who travelled to attend. The weather did not disappoint and the conditions promised to help deliver a high standard of competition.

Leading off with the 28g Championship, Glenn Walker started strongly taking the Overall sash with 49/50, closely followed by Cecil Park's John Rodden, 1st in AA with 50/52 after a shoot-off with Antony Ballarino 2nd on 49/52. 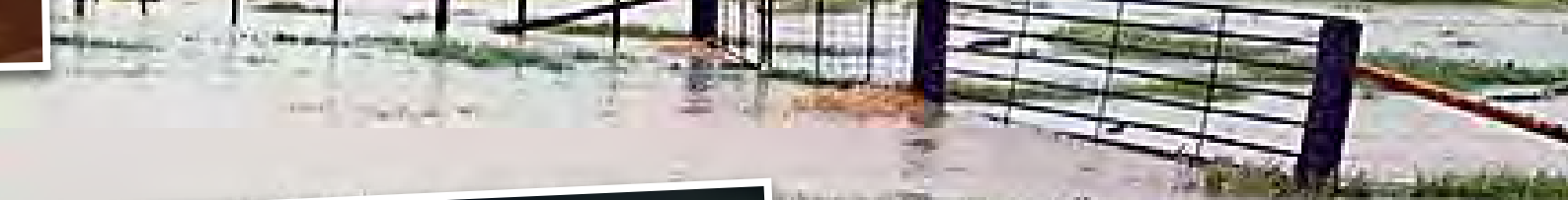

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

## The floods, death and grief

This was not the article I was intending to write, but it seems very timely.

Like many people in NSW and Victoria, I have evacuated from my home. I live on the Murrumbidgee River at Gillenbah and since the 15 October, I have not been able to get in or out of my property, and it is likely to be another 2–3 weeks before the flood waters recede enough to return home. I am lucky: I get cut off but my house and sheds are still well above the flood height so there is little to worry about. Just a big clean up when I get home.

If the floods aren't bad enough, the continual news coverage, photos, reports of river heights, etc, bombard us and maintain the trauma that we are going through. Whether we are directly impacted by the floods, or know someone who is, we are still experiencing the trauma. The central theme in dealing with traumatic events is to get the community to understand what is happening to them during events such as floods or fires. Traumatic events have three determining aspects: Firstly, **they challenge your sense of justice**; this isn't fair, why is this happening? Secondly, they **expose your own vulnerability**; we immediately think it could have been me that died, or my family or children, and finally, they **overwhelm us**; because the event is so outside what we usually experience we cannot get it out of our head.

The interesting thing about humans is that the range of thoughts, feelings and reactions will be varied. There is no right or wrong way to respond. Some people appear as if nothing happened, whilst others are unable to function as normal. The whole range of responses is normal but because the experience is usually outside our sphere of normal and everyday experiences, we often have no way of knowing that what we are going through is a natural response to an

abnormal event and our mind quickly tells us we must be losing it or cracking up.

The "cracking up" is merely the expected short term psychological effects of dealing with trauma. These come in four areas; cognitive (to do with our thinking), affective (to do with our feelings), psychophysiological (to do with our bodies) and behavioural (to do with our reactions). Cognitive problems may include difficulty in attending, concentrating, sleep disturbances, recurrent and intrusive thoughts, dreams and nightmares. Affective problems may include feelings of rejection, overwhelming sadness, worthlessness and feelings that the situation is hopeless and therefore I must be helpless. Changes in moods and feelings of depression and anxiety are affective responses. Psychophysiological problems can be real symptoms such as pains in the chest, tingling fingers, butterflies in the stomach, headaches, dry throat, etc. These are the physical indicators of the flight or fight stress response. Finally, behavioural problems may lead to alcohol and drug dependency, withdrawal from sport and social groups. For the majority of the population, if they receive appropriate counselling or even just talk it over with friends and family, then these problems will disappear but for a small proportion of the population, they may develop symptoms of post traumatic stress disorder. Appropriate counselling gives the person the opportunity to have their thoughts, feelings and reactions validated, legitimised and normalised. The central theme is to get the client understand that their reactions are a natural response to an abnormal event.

It is possible that some readers are now thinking; I've been feeling a bit like this but I didn't think that the floods would have that effect; I feel safe, I didn't know anyone there, etc. What the traumatic event has done is trigger a grief response in you because of some other event previously in your life.

Yesterday for me the flood became horribly worse. Barbara has a good horse-riding friend in Wagga. She and her husband offered us the cottage they have on their small farm and a paddock for Barbara's horses and were happy for us to bring our dog. The husband of Barbara's friend and I have become good friends and every day we have a good laugh about something. The other day it was "If this rain keeps up, what do you want to do for Christmas?" When we first moved in, he proudly showed us around and was keen to show me his collection of motor cycles. Yes collection: several Harley-Davidsons, Triumph and even some trail bikes. Sadly, on Friday evening he was involved in a motor cycle accident, and air-lifted to Melbourne with serious injuries and has undergone brain surgery and is in a coma. His family and friends are eagerly hoping that he will come out of the coma with hopefully no damage.

This is a stark reminder of how precious life is. Today I awoke feeling grief struck. I know this is normal but it feels wrong.

All humans experience grief when something or someone of value leaves or dies. Grief is "the pain of letting go". How much we grieve is dependent upon how close we were to the person. The more central the person was to us the more we will hurt and the greater the pain of letting go. The grief response follows a series of not so discreet steps. All grief responses follow a similar pattern but not all people grieve in the same way, or for the same time, or with the same intensity. The initial phase of grief is shock or numbness. When we first hear that someone has died, we are shocked because up until that moment, in our mind, they were alive. The second phase is anger. It is not unusual for someone grieving to be angry at the person who died, themselves, their God, everybody and anybody. Anger is a normal part of the grieving process. The next phase is denial, where we refuse to acknowledge our thoughts, feelings and actions regarding the way we are feeling. The next stage is depression, which is more of an intense sadness than a clinical form of depression. The final stage in the process is acceptance, where we realise that we can live with the grief as the companion instead of the person.

My friend has a large family, so there will be plenty of support. His wife is able to rely on my wife and I to look after her horses and animals while she is away and getting things organised.

In conclusion, it must be remembered that grief is a normal human response. It is painful but will over time diminish. Grief is the pain of letting go of someone we love and because we do not want to let them go, the pain is often very intense. The way each of us grieve is personal and different, so there are no rules. We must take it slowly and be prepared for a rough ride. The best way to deal with it is to talk it out.

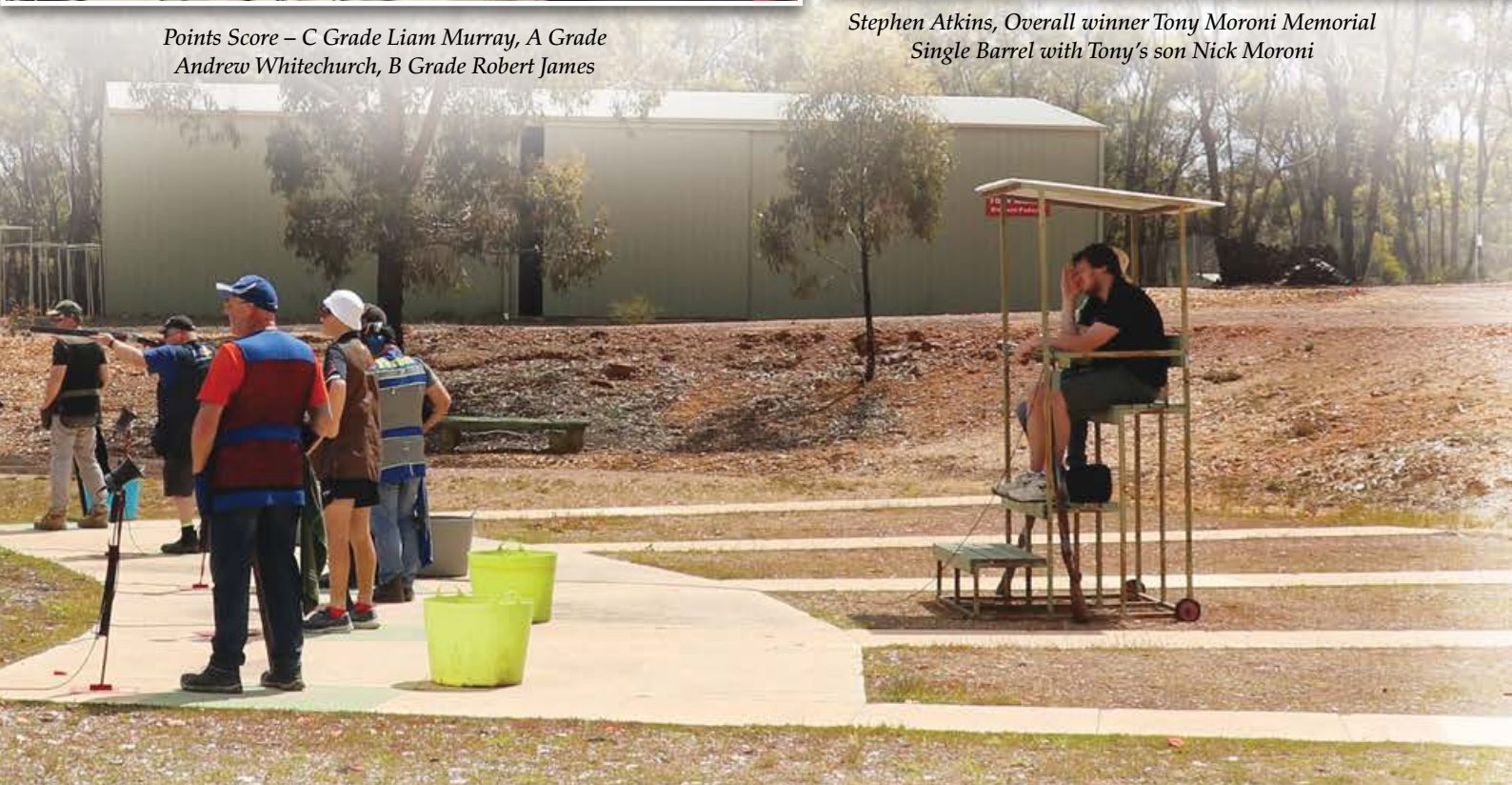

Sunday arrived and the final 50 of the Skeet qualifiers get under way.

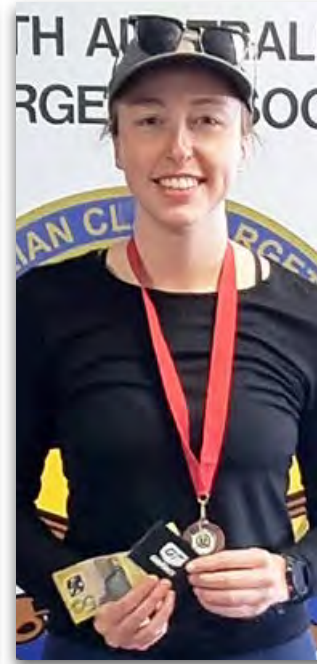
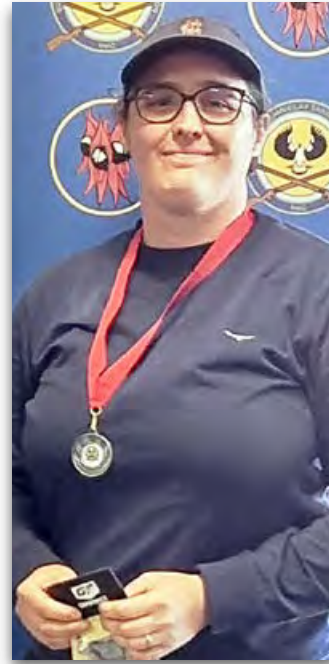
