ACTA CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Mal Dyson

2017–18 New South Wales Government Grant to ACTA

The NSW ICAC's report is now published, with findings that conclude that the ACTA be completely exonerated of any inappropriate undertakings. I can assure members that the ACTA Executive and Management dealt with the grant procedure as prescribed and as required with no impropriety.

At the ACTA 2022 Annual General Meeting, held on the 27th March and documented in General Business, the ACTA's auditor, Mr Andrew Reynolds, was invited to address the meeting regarding the allocation of the grant and expenditure for the funding of the Range Function Centre. The Auditor confirmed that the Annual Financial Accounts of 2017 and 2018 had been accurately reported and appropriately receipted, with all funding correctly allocated and acquitted in accordance with the instructions and requirements attached to the grant.

ACTA National Sashes for Junior and Sub-junior Categories

I have been aware of member concerns in regard to National sashes for junior and sub-junior sections from this year's National Skeet and Trap events. These sashes were ordered and many should by now have been delivered. With our office staff down to only Judy and Jenny we have already ordered sashes for both the Commonwealth and National Sporting events. Perhaps for our ill-informed critics a call to the office could put social media gossip to rest.

From the ACTA Board Meeting 15th June 2023

Club Secretaries would have now received

notification that nominations are now open for the election of two Directors to the Board of the Australian Clay Target Association Ltd. Interested persons should contact their ACTA Club to obtain the appropriate application form. Nominations close on the 31st of August 2023.

Please note: It is compulsory for all ACTA Clubs to take part and vote in the election of new Directors. Voting for new Directors will take place at the same time that Club's affiliation renewals are paid. The date for the payment of renewal fees and voting has been moved back to the 31st of December 2023.

I can also confirm that the final paperwork for the ACTA to be registered as a Company Limited by Guarantee, has now been signed off by ASIC.

After supporting the Junior Skeet Incentive for a number of years the Australian Skeet Shooters Association (ASSA) have officially approached the Board to support this Junior Incentive once again. The cost is \$1500 to be equally shared between the ASSA and the ACTA.

A request from the Amateur Trap Shooters Association (ATA) to hold a two-day event at the National Ground in late October has been received. The Board see this event as a chance to further promote trap shooting, and as such should be supported.

These Sub-committees will ideally comprise of 3-5 members and their following titles will be reviewed and ratified at the next Board Meeting.

- 2 Marketing & Communication (Chair Les Kadziela)

- 4 Coaching & Sports Support (Chair Garry Read)
- 5 Hall of Fame (Chair Glenn Kable)

Two new staff appointments have been made. Firstly, we have employed Stephanie Lynch. Stephanie will join Judy and Jenny in the office, please make her feel welcome. The second appointment is that of our current catering manager Nathan Gale, to Range Function Centre Manager. Nathan has over 30 years experience in hospitality and catering and will now be responsible for the promotion and management of the entire Centre.

Referee Courtesies

While visiting clubs during my travels, one rule that I have witnessed as being more or less ignored, is the correct procedure following a malfunction. The correct marking on a score

sheet with a "M" to attest to the fact that a malfunction has occurred is important, as the fourth and subsequent malfunctions within an event or after 100 targets in any one event will be declared as "lost target". Although not written, common courtesy would suggest that a referee, having observed 3 malfunctions being recorded, would inform the shooter that the fourth malfunction will be a lost target.

Sporting Nationals

Nominations are now open through MCMS for the National Sporting Championships. This event is being held on the 25th, 26th & 27th of August at the National Grounds, Wagga Wagga. Competitors should be aware this event is limited to 120 competitors.

2023 ACTA NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1 All competitors must present their current shooting licence/permit to the events office before competition. **Failure to do so will incur a penalty loss of one target.**
- 2 Any shooter wanting to compete in the “2023 Sporting Clays Nationals” must be a registered competitor of the ACTA for the financial year 2023, or a bonified International competitor.
- 3 Entry is by pre-nomination only through MCMS (MyClubsMyScores). The closing date for nominations is 5.00 pm Thursday the 24th August 2023.
- 4 Entries are limited to a maximum of 120 per event, late nominations will be taken on the day for an additional charge of \$20 per event **but only if there are vacancies available.**
- 5 Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to it commencing will be eligible for a refund less a \$10 administration fee. Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.
- 6 MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data the decision will be made by the National MCMS Handicap Supervisor.
- 7 Squads of up to 5 competitors will shoot brackets of 25 targets per visit to the traps.
- 8 Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations.
- 9 Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at the 25 Targets.
- 10 Shooters who miss their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is possible. **If a shooter is able to be re-squadded a penalty loss of one target will apply to that event.**
- 11 Should a shooter be late for his/her squad and elect to withdraw from the event they will not be eligible for any refund. It is the shooters responsibility to make sure they are where they should be and when.
- 12 All competitors are to check and sign the score sheet after each bracket. Once a shooter has signed their score sheet, the score is accepted. Any score sheet not signed by the shooter will be credited with the score as checked and recorded.
- 13 Competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, **the penalty of a loss of one target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person.**
- 14 **Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalized five targets for that event.**
- 15 All appeals must be lodged in writing with the tournament director together with a \$50 appeal fee. The Tournament director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned.
- 16 Eligible competitors are entitled to receive awards in Open, Women, Junior or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 17 There must be a minimum of three competitors in sections or grades, including High Guns for any prizes to be awarded and a minimum of 5 entrants to constitute a sectional National Championship.
- 18 Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Board, their decision shall be final.
- 19 ACTA dress code is to be adhered to, Tournament Director is to adjudicate.
- 20 All competitors must comply with the Firearms Laws of the State hosting the National Championships.
- 21 Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.
- 22 Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.
- 23 A junior who has not previously competed at any National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to shoot for the cost of the admin fee of \$10 per event paid at the time of entry.
- 24 The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Shoot Marshal. No further adjustment will be made without authorization of the Tournament Director and Shoot Marshal.
- 25 The National Sporting Clays Championships will be conducted under the NSW Covid protocols in force at the time. Good luck to all and stay safe.

After 71 years it was something different to host a King's Birthday shoot and it was quite funny to hear many still talking about the "Queen's Birthday" on the day. Takes a little bit of getting used to.



As with any sporting competition there are little issues that arise at the beginning of the day, and tend to continue to pop up during the day to make the running of the event challenging and to test the patience of Officials. Very early on we lost trap 1 and had to move to the 4 remaining traps for the day. Despite this

everyone, competitors, spectators and staff all pitched in to ensure everyone enjoyed themselves. To our hard working shoot Marshall, Darren Knight our thanks for calmly getting things in order.

Many took advantage of the time allotted for practice to test the conditions, targets and to get themselves in the right frame of mind for the day ahead. In keeping with the modern trend, the Double Barrel Championship was the first event

to be contested. At the end of qualifying there were 9 shooters recording 50/50. Some 40 targets into the shoot-off, Peter Attard (Echuca) was able to claim Overall and AA Grade honours. Second place in AA went to Bernie Pay (Bendigo). The A Grade section was taken out by Ryan Logan (Numurkah/Shepparton) on 87/88 followed by Scott McKenzie (Mathoura) 86/88. The winner of B Grade was Liam Marsh (Bendigo) 49/50 with Jo-Anne Ford (Yarrawonga) on 53/55 in 2nd place. C Grade resulted in a great win for Bendigo's Treasurer, Chris Jones recording 47/52 followed by Castlemaine's David Mannix (46/52). Event two on the program was the 30 target DRC Imports Single Barrel Championship and there were only 2 shooters to finish with 30/30, AA graders Steve Atkins (Echuca) and Bernie Pay

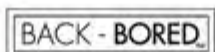

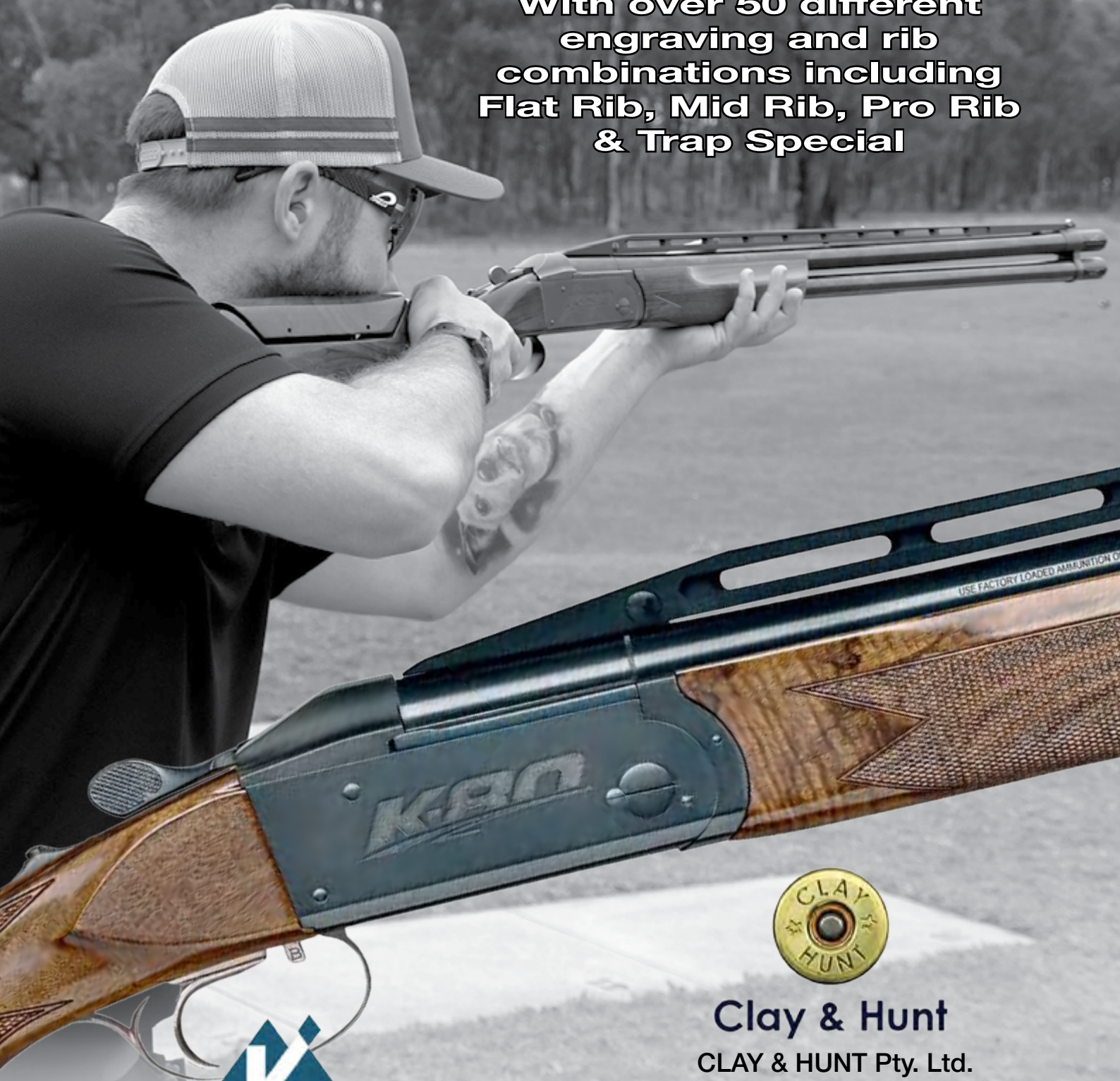

QCTA State ISSF Carnival

Brisbane Gun Club, June 15-18, 2023

Is it a bird? Is it a plane? Oh, wait, that was just a super-fast clay flying through the air at the QCTA State ISSF Carnival. Brisbane Gun Club was filled with avid clay target shooters from the 15th – 18th June 2023, testing their skills and gunning to be the overall winners of the weekend. This year our State Carnival was endorsed by Shooting Australia, and we believe it was a great turnout. From the moment you stepped into the Brisbane Gun Club the atmosphere was buzzing.

Kicking off the week was the Olympic Skeet Championship, which commenced on the Friday with the conclusion and final shot on Saturday. 14 Men and 5 Ladies nominated and chased the clays until we had an Overall Champion. Joshua Bell from Cecil Park, NSW won the Overall Championship shooting 113/125 to qualify and 49/60 in the final – an impressive finals performance. Following in 2nd place was Matthew Everingham from WAGC, WA with 107/125 and 47/60 in the final. Third place we had Frank Morris from NLMCTC, NSW shooting 111/125 and 35/50.

Grade prizes went to Joshua Bell 1st place for AA with 113/125, Darren Perkins from

Brisbane took out A Grade with 103/125, B Grade winner was Geoffrey Matthews from Brisbane who shot 100/125 and C Grader Bob Faunt from NLMCTC shot 80/125 for 1st place. Junior shooter Doyle Yoannidis from Mt Gambier, SA, won with a 99/125 and the Masters winner from Brisbane, Geoffrey Matthews, came 1st with 100/125.

In the Women's Skeet, and after an exciting final, Aislin Jones from Bairnsdale, Vic, won back to back titles, winning the sash and Overall. Shooting 108/125 to qualify and 45/60 in the finals, Laura Coles from West Australian Gun Club claimed 2nd with 103/125 to qualify 44/60 in the final. Brittany Melbourne from MCC – ACTA placed 3rd with 108/125 to qualify and 28/50 in the finals. Hannah Munro from Mount Gambier, SA shot an 80/125 and a 20/40 claiming the Junior prize. Well done to all the Skeet shooters, especially those shooting competition for the first time.

Sunday was day 3 of the Trap competition, with the last 25 targets and mens and womens finals.

16 ladies contested the Women's Trap Championship, with Catherine Skinner and Penny Smith having to shoot off for bib #1 for the final. However Laetisha Scanlan from Frankston Vic, came home with the Overall shooting a qualifying score of 113/125 and a final of 42/50. 2nd was Penny Smith from

Colac Vic, with 116/125 and 40/50. 3rd place was Mansfield shooter Catherine Skinner, with 116/125 and a final of 30/40. Junior 1st place was won by Kiara Dean from Echuca Vic, with 110/125.

The fun did not end there; next up was the Men's Trap Championship. The competition was intense, with clays flying but Luke Cassar from Cecil Park Clay Target Club took out Overall with 109/125 to qualify and 41/50 in the finals. 2nd overall was Sydney's Thomas Grice who shot 119/125 to qualify and a

39/50 in the finals. After excellent shooting in the qualifying event, Gabriel Sensi from MCC-ACTA took out 3rd place overall 112/125 to qualify and 32/40 in the finals.

Grade results were as follows: AA 1st Thomas Grice, Sydney 119/125, and a tie for 2nd with Catherine Skinner and Penny Smith, both shooting 116/125, sharing the prize. A Grade 1st from Morwell, Vic, was Lucas Furlan with 108/125, A Grade 2nd Campbell Taylor from Brisbane with a 107/125. B Grade winner was determined from a shoot-off between Bree Collins from Chinchilla and Jimmy Furini from Mackay Sarina. After 5 targets, Bree took out B Grade 1st place with 99/125 and 4/5 with Jimmy coming 2nd, close on her heels with a 99/125 and 3/5. Last, but not least C Grade 1st place was won by our international friend from New Zealand, Chris Robinson who shot 101/125, closely followed by Gold Coast's junior shooter, Ryan Chouding with a total score of 99/125. Best Overall Junior was Gabe Sensi from MCC-ACTA with a 112/125 with Brandt Woodward from The Forest, NSW, winning the Masters 102/125.

SHOOTING AUSTRALIA ANNOUNCES 2023 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS TEAM

Shooting Australia has announced a 14 person team which will compete at the 2023 ISSF World Championships in Baku, Azerbaijan in pistol, rifle and shotgun events.

Following their medal winning performances at ISSF World Cups this year, Penny Smith (Shotgun Women's Trap and World Ranked 1), James Willett (Shotgun Men's Trap and World Ranked 2), Catherine Skinner (Shotgun Women's Trap) and Sergei Evglevski (25m Rapid Fire Pistol) were the first athletes selected to the 2023 World Championships team. As a finalist at the Cairo World Cup in May, Nathan Argiro also qualified for his position on the team. The additional 9 team members (Laetisha Scanlan, Mitchell Iles, Aislin Jones, Joshua Bell, Elena Galiabovitch, Bailey Groves, Dane Sampson, Jack Rossiter and Elise Collier) secured their positions based on where they placed on a performance leaderboard after a four competition domestic selection series of events that concluded earlier this month and in addition to also meeting the minimum performance standards outlined in the World Championships team selection criteria.

As the athletes prepare to contest the most significant competition in 2023, and a crucial competitive opportunity against the world's best in preparation for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, Shooting Australia's High Performance Manager Kathryn Periac says "Our goal is to support our World Championships team to enable strong performances by each of the athletes at this event, which will in turn support critical Paris Olympic qualification requirements such as winning quota places and securing individual qualifying ranking points for the Olympic Games (QROG's.).

Our athletes have developed and prioritised team values and behaviours to create the environment they want to be part of, and in

which they can excel, and we will be working with them to deliver an experience that is successful and positive for everyone."

This Australian World Championships team brings together those who have had multiple World Championship appearances and medal wins with those who are making their World Championship debuts. Periac says "2016 Rio Olympic Gold medallist Catherine Skinner has been part of 5 senior World Championships teams since 2011, securing an individual silver and bronze medal, and during the 2022 World Championships in Croatia finished 4th in the Women's Trap event, securing the first Paris Olympic quota for Australia. Catherine will join 10 other Olympians (Rio and Tokyo) on this year's Australian Team."

Of the two athletes making their World Championships debut, Periac says "It is particularly exciting to see several athletes step up their performances to meet the criteria for selection to their first World Championships team, including Joshua Bell who has competed well in World Cups this year, and Bailey Groves. With the Paris 2024 Olympics just over a year away, the 2026 Commonwealth Games in Victoria and the Brisbane 2032 Olympics, there are many wonderful and exciting opportunities ahead for our sport and for our athletes."

Shooting a personal best in the last selection event Bailey Groves said "I didn't realise until after the competition in Brisbane that I had qualified for World Champs. That moment I got the news was simply unreal".

The official arrival day for the 2023 World Championships is 14th August with competition scheduled to commence on 17th August.

The nomination criteria for Paris 2024 will be released following the World Championships.

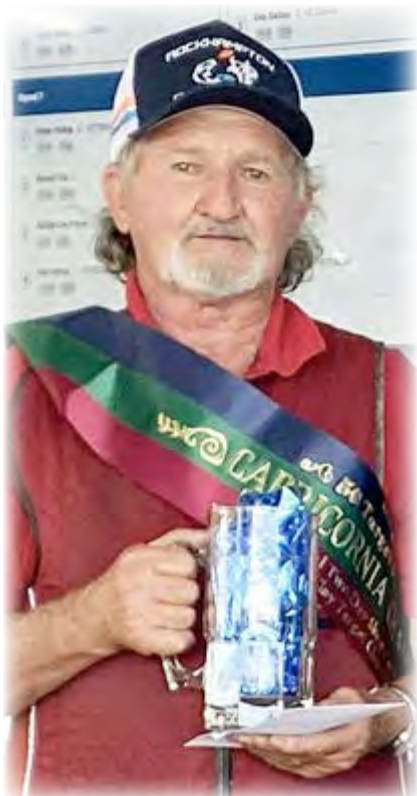

Psychological Skills for Shooting

How To Be Composed?

In last month's article, I explored becoming more confident. This month, I want to look at another component of mental fitness: composure.

Composure is the state of being calm and in control of oneself.

Regular readers will recognize when I say only worry about the things you can control and ignore the things you cannot control. This is the secret to staying composed. Patrick Cohn of Peak Performance Sports, argues that composure in athletes includes the following elements.

1. The ability to think calmly and rationally when under stress.
2. The ability to react calmly and rationally to errors during competition.
3. The ability to rise to the challenge with confidence when called upon or as needed.
4. The ability to identify and quickly extinguish mental barriers that undermine composure and cheat you from peak performance.
5. The ability to believe that there is no better person to win than you.

To develop these elements, we need to be calm, patient and poised. We also need to have a relaxed but confident disposition and we need to be able to give ourselves positive self-talk and reassuring affirmations. We also need to be able to stay focused on the present, enjoy the performance or process, have a desire to compete and perform well, be a consistent performer, play to win and be a strong finisher.

The first step to improve your composure is to identify the mental breakdowns that cause you to lose emotional control in sports. For example, an athlete with very high expectations

for his performance is likely to become easily frustrated, lose control emotionally, when he believes that those expectations are not being met.

Both Edger and Cohn believe that the following things can get in the way to us being composed?

- a. **Perfectionism.** It is an irrational belief to think that you can be perfect or that your world should be perfect. Being human, means that we make mistakes, misread the situation or make faulty assumptions that get in the way of our achieving our best.
- b. **Worry too much about what others think.** If we judge our performance by what we think others believe, then we will always fall short.
- c. **Irrational beliefs.** The following irrational beliefs are unhealthy and will stifle your effort and limit your potential. *"I must be perfect all the time". "I'm only as good as the quality of my performance", "Others are watching and judging me", "I think past events dictate how I perform in the present", I label myself with ineffective names", "I must either succeed or fail: there is no middle ground, such as achieving a personal best."*
Believing that you must be the one who wins, that your world will only be perfect if you're on top, that people will only like and admire you if you are the champion; beliefs such as these will prevent you from having the necessary level of composure to win consistently.
- d. **Fear of failure.** This is the main fear that confronts any athlete and can be extended to *"fear of losing the match", fear of being*

embarrassed by a poor score or performance”, fear of letting others down”, fear of not performing to one’s potential”, fear of not meeting the expectations of others”, fear of not achieving anything for all the hard work involved”, fear of negative social evaluation” and “fear of not gaining approval”.

- e. **Self-doubt.** This is probably the most important aspect of poor performance. It is probably what cause us to miss targets more than anything else. Self-doubt come from a number of causes but what it does is to allow our muscles to tighten and tense up. This stops us from being able to move in a fluid and easy manner and as a result we can’t execute the swing and follow through as we would like and we miss. The same thing happens to golfers but instead of missing, they miss-hit the ball.
- f. **Comfort zones.** This means that when you are playing with a lead you play safe. This prevents you from taking necessary risks to maintain or even widen your lead. Trying to play safe will lead to you tensing up and starting to doubt your ability.
- g. **Dwelling on errors.** Because you focus on past mistakes, you are not able to stay in the present or stay focused on the process. Thinking about the past draws your attention to previously, lost targets, trophies, glory, etc. Unless you are in the present you can’t shoot the target that is about to appear when you call “pull”.
- h. **Feeling intimidated** or inferior because of the beliefs I have constructed around the ability of others.

Cohn has an eight-step plan for maximising composure;

1. **Discard your expectations.** Enjoy the game. Remember it is a sport and there are lots of benefits to be achieved even if you don’t win. By this I do not mean disregard your goals. Your goals and expectations are two different things.
2. **Stop mind reading.** Don’t think about what others think about you. Focus on your

goals rather than other people’s expectations. Remember your competitors want you to fail so they can win. What other people think about me is none of my business.

3. **Strive for success.** Have a success-driven mindset that allows you to set positive, growth orientated goals.
4. **Reinforce a positive self-image.** View yourself as a composed athlete and visualise yourself performing with composure.
5. **Disregard your preconceived ideas about your abilities.** Focus on what you can do not want you cannot do.
6. **Do not compare your skills with others.** Achieve by focusing on the strategy for the competition, focus on the process and let the product look after itself.
7. **Let go of judgements.** Trust and let go.
8. **Prepare coping strategies for dealing with mistakes and errors.** One strategy is to look at how you think about your performance. Remember that it is a sport and that there will always be another competition.

To be composed we need to learn the 3 R’s for composure to help us maintain composure after making a mistake or error.

The 3 R’s for composure stand for: *Recognize–Regroup–Refocus.*

The first step is to recognize that you are dwelling on the mistake, which limits your ability focus on the next target.

The next task is to regroup by interrupting the chain of thought. This requires you to battle your own emotions and dispute your irrational thinking. For example, you may say, “I can hit this target, stay patient and wait for my turn to shoot.”

The last step and most crucial is to refocus on the next target. Ask yourself what you need to focus on right now to do your best: stance, pre-shot routine, focus, swing, follow through, head on the stock . . .? The answer will help you re-focus on the task-relevant cues for the next shot.

PRODUCT REVIEW

Confidence in your ammunition is essential

During the Field and Game National Championships at Wodonga-Albury in November, 2022 one major sponsor Bronzewing/NSI offered a 'special deal' for all entrants: buy 2 packets of any of their shells for \$5.00 a packet. Basically, shells for less than half their cost. The idea behind this was to give shooters the opportunity to try for themselves some of the Bronzewing/NSI range that they may not have tried yet. This also brought shooters to the trade site where they could look at the other merchandise and see what other shells were on offer.

I took advantage of this offer and bought a packet of Quattro Fluo and Quattro Premium in 7.5s to take to the practice range to see how they performed. Anna Shredrina,

General manager of Bronzewing/ NSI then offered some other shells from their range for me to try including Desert Rats 8's (1250fps), Due Europe (1295fps), Multitarget (1328fps), Quattro Fluo (1345fps), Quattro Compak (1378fps) and Exclusiva (1378fps).

Unfortunately for me at the time of the Nationals, I was evacuated from my property due to the Murrumbidgee River flooding, and did not return home until the second week in December. The flood meant that I had a big clean-up task so I wasn't able to spend the time setting up a pattern board and 'testing the patterns' of any of these shells. I also wasn't able to set up my traps and have a shot and 'try them out' as the paddocks were still waterlogged.

For both trap and skeet, shooters need to have confidence in their shells. For common mark shooting, I like a low recoil but consistently patterning shell in 7.5s. For handicap, naturally it needs to be a bit punchier. For skeet, where they are known targets at about 20m a nice light shell in 9s will break most targets. Unlike trap or skeet, I like to use a variety of shells of different shot sizes and speeds to 'help' me out so to speak, when I am shooting





field and game, 5 stand or sport trap (compak). I find it less of a worry if I use the same chokes and just vary the shells: 1200/1250 9's for anything close resembling a skeet target, 1250/1300 8's for longer crosses, battues and teals and 1250 7.5's for close going away targets, or faster 7.5's 1300/1350/1375's for long rabbits, long range targets going away or from a tower. So armed with Anna's shells and some Bronzewing 9's and Stingrays in 8's I had at home, I ventured off to a 50 target five-stand event and 50 target Sport trap event. I was using a KM4 Kemen with 32" barrels with bore diameters of 18.7 and Teague chokes: 3/8 and 1/2.

Shooting impressions: Wow! Firstly, I tried some of the sporting shells. On the first 50 target sport trap, I came in with



49/50. The second 50 target five stand I shot 46/50. But this was not about me.

The shells hit hard and hit well. There was never any doubt that the targets were hit. It appears that the pattern and shot string remained stable time and time again. Regardless of the speed of the shell or the distance of the target, the shells broke the targets consistently and cleanly. There was very little felt recoil even with the fastest shell – Exclusiva. The bore of the gun stayed reasonably clean. I chose to keep using the shells until I ran out and was happy with the results both out from the trap and my scores. I used some of the Quattro Fluo in the first barrel and Exclusiva in the second barrel from 24 metres DTL and again was pleased with the results: the number of targets hit, how they broke and the fact that gun didn't kick or the barrel unduly flip when I had to use the second barrel.



Bronzewing/NSI shells and as we know, confidence in your equipment is a big factor in shooting well. Selecting the right shell and having confidence that it will perform the same way, over and over again, is one variable that you can be in control of. You cannot control the weather, the light, the background conditions or behaviour of other shooters, but having confidence in your shells is one less thing to worry about when you go out to shoot.

Do I have a preferred shell from the Bronzewing/NSI range? Not really, they all performed well for the targets that were presented. The reason there is a range of shells with different, speeds, weight, shot

I also tried the Desert rats, Due Europe and Multitarget on DTL targets from 15 metres. The results were impressive, with the Due Europe and Multitarget probably a bit fast for common mark shooting but they left no doubt in my mind that the target was hit.

At the ACTA Skeet Nationals, thanks to Bronzewing/NSI sponsorship, I managed to win some of the new Bronzewing Mach 1 Bantamweight (1125) and Super Bantamweight (1150) skeet shells. Both these shells were a delight to use: no noticeable recoil, targets breaking convincingly and with a 25 on the second round they proved their worth. Up until now I have usually used 1200 9s for skeet but I doubt I could tell the difference between 1200s and the Bronzewing 1150s. I am absolutely certain I didn't change anything when I was on the layout. I think I have now tried nearly the whole range of Bronzewing/NSI target loads and I must say none were a disappointment. I have full confidence in any of the

sizes, is so you can customize your shooting to meet the types of targets suitable to the discipline you are shooting. I like to shoot everything: trap, skeet, sporting, field and game and the Bronzewing/NSI range caters for every target presentation with shells matched for speed, hardness of shot and recoil. Anna and the Bronzewing/NSI team has everything covered.

Would I use these shells again? Most definitely, and I still am. I am looking forward to purchasing some when I need more ammunition.

Bronzewing/NSI provided the shells, at no cost for me to try and review and I have no other association with the company, other than I have known Anna and her staff for some years now.
