# ACTA CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

## **Travelling**

*With the time and opportunity available to attend a couple of Trap Carnivals, firstly I travelled to Wagga Wagga for the Wagga Clay Target Club Veterans Games event held over 5 days. This carnival was once again well attended, with competitors shooting 75 targets each day. The program consisted of 3 days of Trap, 1 day of Skeet and 1 day of ACTA 5 Stand Sporting. This year we trialed a set of BRB Voice Release during the Skeet event, and I am pleased to say this equipment performed very well.*

*Moving on, I attended the Anzac weekend carnival at the Cohuna Clay Target Club, which attracted 116 competitors over the 3 days of shooting. Congratulations to Kevin Gillespie on winning the weekend High Gun scoring 269/270, an excellent display of marksmanship.*

## **Northern Territory Ammunition Permit**

*During the past week I became aware of a story circulating around the traps, which implied that shooters intending to compete in Northern Territory competitions did not need to apply for a permit to purchase ammunition. I contacted Darwin Clay Target Club Secretary, Tania, and she advised me that this is definitely not the case and that shooters need to apply for the permit if they intend to purchase ammunition in NT.*

## **Smoking and Vaping Rule**

*On another subject, during my travels, it has come to my attention that some competitors and referees are smoking or vaping on shooting layouts. This is not permissible under rule – MANAGEMENT 1.14 (i) – which states, “smoking or vaping is not permitted on shooting*

*layouts”. I sincerely hope that these individuals will in future adhere to this rule, having consideration for other competitors.*

## **Club Competition Results**

*Over the past months I have noticed a continuing drop-off in the number of clubs that are reporting their shoot results in Clay Target e-news. Club management should realise that for the sake of their history, just how important it is to use this space as a record for future reference.*

*With the magazine history going back as far as 1947 it seems a great shame that this resource will not be available to club members and their families in the future.*

*To supply these results for publication Club secretaries only need to visit the ACTA website, go to the Results tag and find the form “Submit Club Results” and fill in the details – a simple process.*

## **ACTA Membership**

*For members’ information, as at the end of March 2024 our membership totaled 11,862. When compared to the same time last year our membership was 12,182 showing a difference of –320 against the previous year. To date in 2024 we have registered 1150 new members with our Association. As I have previously mentioned, if we could re-register ALL of the previous year’s members, we would have a significant continuing increase in our total membership.*

# 2024 SOUTH AUSTRALIAN STATE DTL CARNIVAL

Well, a cheerful 'Hello' to everyone again. Yes, exactly 12 months to the day, we are all here at the South Australian Clay Target Association State DTL Carnival. From Thursday February 1st through to Sunday February 4th sees our 8th year that the DTL Carnival is extended to 4 days of competition, based on the success of the reintroduction of the State Champion of Champions.

By Wednesday afternoon, the grounds of the State Shooting Park were already buzzing with activity as the usual caravanners and campers arrived. Our State

Shooting Park had put on some practice for the shooters to get familiarised with the background. The ones that did make it were all getting themselves a favourable vantage spot for the 4 days of shooting competitions. Trade stands were being erected with lots of great goodies on show for everyone to browse and buy. Competitors came from almost all States this year, and over the 4 days of events, were all vying to try their skill at claiming one of the many Red State sashes that were on offer.

Temperatures for the 4 days were going to be reasonably comfortable in the mid-high 20's with maybe just Sunday being in the high 30's. There had been the odd day leading up to the Carnival where the daytime temperature spiked upwards of 38–40 degrees with intense humidity, however the afternoon winds were going to be pretty awful and play havoc for the competitors. In the background, everyone was out there practicing to make sure they had a psychological edge before the competitions started the following day at 11am.

Early on Thursday morning the officials were running around in a scurry of activity while final checks were being done to the layouts – angles, heights, distances and speeds. To this part, a word of thanks has to go out to the Shoot Marshal Andrew Hoare and Cockles, for overseeing trap set-ups over the days with assistance from a few extra helpers. Friends that hadn't seen each other for ages were seen all over the park having a good laugh, telling

stories and catching up on the events that had transpired over the past 12 months. Our interstate visitors came in with their families for the events, and this certainly made for a decent crowd of onlookers and a great ambience on the grounds considering the warmer blustery weather conditions forecast.

Even the office was a flurry of activity as we made sure everything was in readiness, especially the important stuff like all the lollies being in their respective bowls for the staff (very important)!! Hopefully everyone would have a great 4 days of competing without a worry in the world. The MCMS pre-noms process had made the job at hand so much easier in the office avoiding the large crowds at the window early each morning. on 11am sharp, 80 competitors – (16 squads), started to get called and filed out to the walks to contest the first event which was the 75 target State ‘Champion of Champions’ title off 18m. Lurking around every corner and walking amongst us you could see some of the best shooters in Australia waiting to pounce and claim one of the available Red State title

sashes. Calm conditions greeted the shooters with temperatures in the low 20’s. Squads shot their whole 75 targets in 1 visit to the trap with just a reload in between 25’s.

Shoot-offs went to ground in near perfect conditions making for some very tidy targets for the competitors. After shoot-offs, and when all had gone quiet, the results were counted and came out as follows: C Grade 1st went to Jaikara Stainer 132/150 and 2nd was Alex Souter. B Grade 1st went to Nicola Dunn 118/125, 2nd was Razor Marshall. A Grade winner was Sam Daou 122/125, followed by Richard Warden in 2nd place. When the shoot-off's got started, the weather Gods were still being kind to us with moderately warm conditions and very little breeze which made for some great targets.



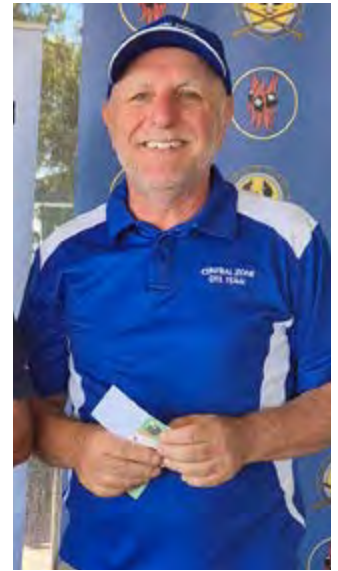

the first wave of squads were called out for the 50 target State Handicap. 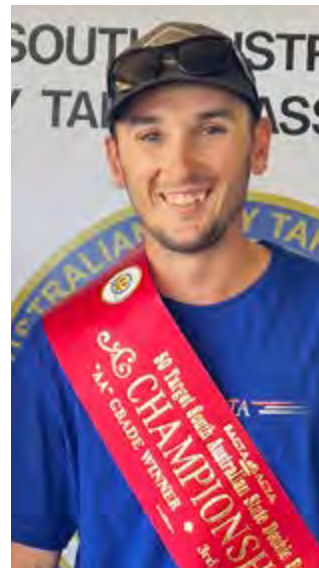

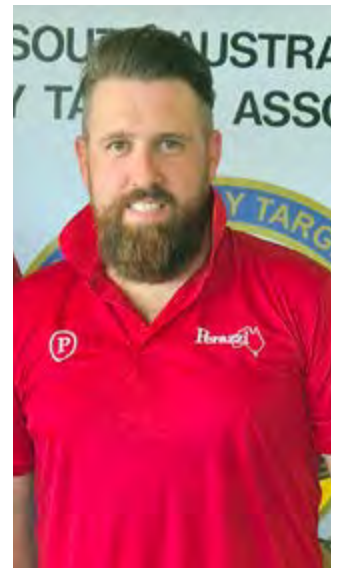
The sun had decided to come out and play for the 3 days so far, but tomorrow the conditions

# WORLD CUP GOLD AND SILVER FOR JAMES WILLETT AND PENNY SMITH



The Australian Shooting Team is celebrating some success after securing two medals at the ISSF World Cup in Baku, Azerbaijan. Newly ranked world number 1, James Willett, secured the gold medal in the Men's Trap event, while Penny Smith, current world number 11, secured the silver medal in the Women's Trap event.

Willett shot 121 out of 125 targets during the two days of qualification, and went into the final as the 5th highest qualifier out of the six male finalists. Willett was too strong in the final, missing only a couple of early targets and then an additional two later in the final, as he increased his lead over Slovakian, Filip Marinov. Willett closed out the final with a score of 46 out of 50. Marinov won the silver with a score of 42. The bronze medal went to Jean Pierre Brol Cardenas (GUA).

This is Willett's 16th World Cup medal and 7th gold medal.

After winning a bronze medal at the ISSF Final Olympic Qualification Championships in Doha less than two weeks prior, Smith finished

as top qualifier in the Women's Trap event in Baku, with a score of 116 out of 125 targets.

Smith had a strong start to the final, not missing until the unlucky 13th target. With ten targets to go in the final, Smith was tied with Lebanon's Ray Bassil, and with just five targets to go, Bassil managed to take the lead on Smith and retain this until the end. Bassil claimed the gold medal, and Smith the silver. Italy's Erica Sessa won the bronze.

This is Smith's 11th World Cup medal.

The Australian Shooting Team will continue their campaign in Baku, as part of the Paris 2024 Olympic nomination process, with shotgun, pistol and rifle events still to be competed in.

# ***Psychological Skills for Shooting***

by Michael Kruger-Davis

## **What is postprandial somnolence?**

At shoots on days when you are shooting over 100 targets, at some stage throughout the day most of us stop for lunch. One of the side-effects of eating is postprandial somnolence: that feeling of being tired and deflated after eating a meal.

To break it down: **‘postprandial’** refers to after a meal and **‘somnolence’** refers to sleepiness. Postprandial dip is a normal experience.

### **Why do you get postprandial somnolence?**

There is limited conclusive scientific evidence about postprandial somnolence. Feeling a dip in energy or feeling sleepy after a meal varies from person to person. You might experience sleepiness, or just a lack of energy, or maybe both. It is a mild form of hypoglycaemia caused by the digestion of a heavy meal.

#### **1. Your brain's sleeping centre is being stimulated**

One of the most recent theories about postprandial somnolence is that it is influenced by a combination of neurons, the so-called Arcuate Nucleus (ARC). This group of neurons is located in the hypothalamus, which is an area close to the centre of your brain (see image below to find out where it is located). The ARC regulates your appetite, in response to the different signals that your body communicates to your brain.

Your appetite is primarily regulated by signals that your body gives you. An important indicator are peptides, which are short chains of amino acids.

Peptides are created when you eat food that contains proteins. Your body produces different chemicals during digestion. These substances break the proteins up into small chains of proteins, which are the peptides. Once these

proteins are small enough, your body can absorb them.

After your ARC is done evaluating your body signals, it sends the signals to the hypothalamus. At this point the ARC could stimulate the sleeping centres. Another possibility is that the sleeping centre gets activated via the signals in your body without the ARC as a mediator.

#### **2. The flow of blood to your brain changes**

Of all the theories that explain postprandial somnolence, the most prevalent one says that blood flow is redistributed after a meal. Blood is redistributed from the blood vessels around your brain to the blood vessels around your intestines.

#### **How can we prevent an after-dinner dip?**

Preventing it is very difficult but there are things you can do to limit the effect.

##### **1. Watch your food intake**

Don't eat huge meals when you want to be productive after. Besides this, make sure you drink enough water. So, eat light meals that provide you with a sufficient amount of energy for the tasks at hand and drink enough water throughout the day.

##### **2. More specifically, balance out your macronutrients**

You tend to feel sleepy after eating high-fat-low-carbohydrate meals in comparison to low-fat-high-carbohydrate meals. Simply said, if you eat meals higher in carbohydrates rather than fats, you're more likely to prevent an after-dinner dip. On the other hand, you should also try to prevent meals that are high in carbohydrates, since this could also increase chances of feeling sleepy. Not to mention, you should also gauge your activity level. So it is important to think ahead. It's all about balance.

### 3. Get enough sleep

The sleepiness that you naturally experience because of your circadian rhythm is worse with a poor night of sleep. There is a connection between your sleep (or lack of it) and the size of your meals. It is said that a lack of sleep, in combination with a heavy meal during the day makes you feel extra sleepy.

### 4. Portion control

You might think this is a no-brainer but it is one of the things that most of the studies point out to as a good way to reduce your chances of getting a food-coma. Remember why you get an after-dinner dip in the first place? You need to eat to sustain energy levels. Eating too much can trigger feelings of postprandial somnolence.

### 5. Be active after a meal

Get your blood flowing right after you eat a meal. Go for a walk or just be active, especially before you are needed to go back on the tracks. Once you get your blood flowing you might decrease your chance of getting a post-lunch dip.

### 6. Stay in the sunlight

This is not really an issue for shooters but getting out in the sun and fresh air is better than staying in the clubhouse.

### 7. Stay hydrated.

This is an important aspect of performing well in all sports and should not be overlooked.

At significant competitions such as the nationals or state titles, it is important that we are aware of the influence of postprandial dip when we have to go and shoot after lunch. This also means we have to be mindful of what we are eating when we are competing.

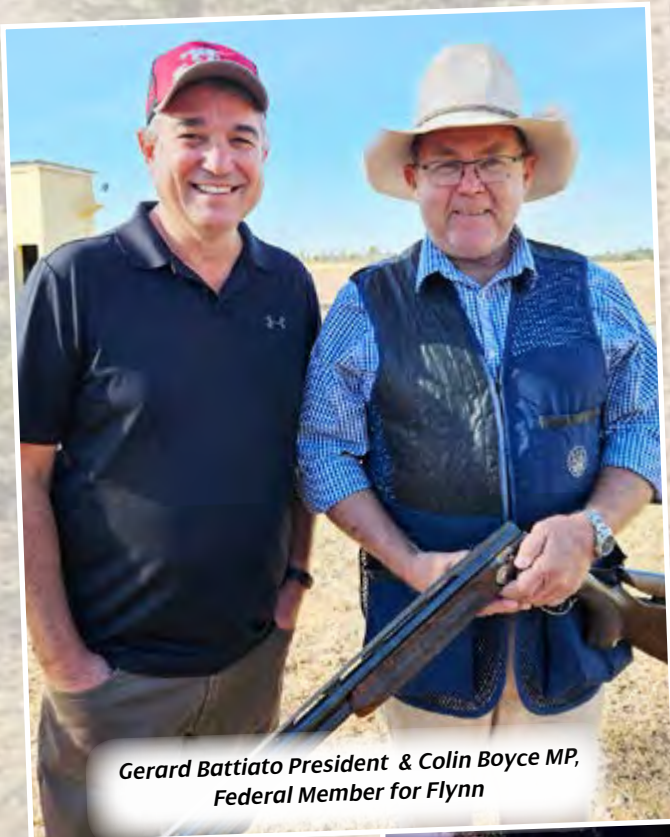

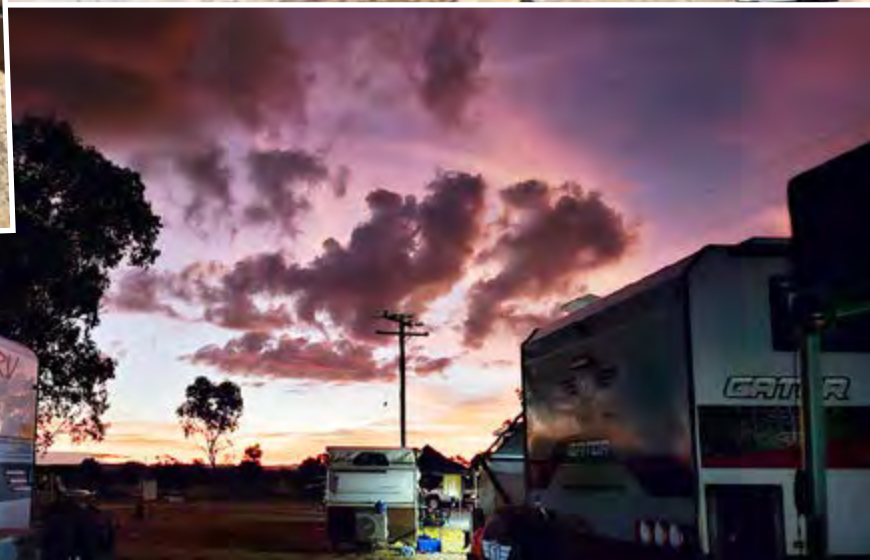
