I take this opportunity to congratulate Lee Fitzgerald and Graham Smith on their appointment to the ACTA Board. Lee and Graham will take up their positions on the Board following the Annual General Meeting of the Australian Clay Target Association scheduled for Wednesday the 9th of April at Whiteman Park, Perth.

COMPAK SPORTING

For ACTA member information, a copy of the letter received from FITASC President, Jean-Francois Palinkas is included on the opposite page.

ACTA Clubs can now start shooting Compak Sporting. It has come to my attention that some members are under the misapprehension that you are required to have a Skeet layout to shoot this discipline. I can assure you that is not a requirement. Clubs do however need to set a layout that uses six traps. If your Club has a Skeet layout and DTL trap you only need to add an additional three traps.

The ACTA Board have committed to expanding Compak Sporting in Australia for the FITASC organisation. We trust clubs will embrace and support this discipline of shooting.

In deference to the ACTA taking on the FITASC Compak discipline, the ACTA Board has introduced an introductory membership for SSAA, Field & Game and Sporting Clay members for the first year, that is 2025, to shoot Compak only. The cost of this membership will be \$10 for ACTA membership, plus State and Club fees. This membership will also be available to any ACTA past members who have been unfinancial for the last three years.

SKEET & TRAP NATIONALS

With the Perth ACTA Skeet and Trap Nationals now not far off, Nick Melanko, Western Australian Gun Club President, has informed me that the club has completed 2 extra layouts, bringing the total Trap layouts to twelve. To ensure a trouble free running of the Championships, the Club at considerable cost, has sent all their Canterbury Traps for a full overhaul by Canterbury Australia.

If you intend to attend the Nationals and at this point of time have not applied for a permit to take your firearm into Western Australia, I suggest you move quickly and apply. Personally I found the WA licensing very helpful in supplying my permit. As I have previously mentioned there will be cartridges available for purchase on the grounds.

Dear M. President.

Following the meeting of the FITASC Management Committee of 27th December 2024, after assessing the relevance of ACTA's application as well as SCA's arguments, the following decisions have been taken in agreement with the article 3.3' of the by-laws:

- Suspending the delegation for Compak Sporting to SCA, from 1st January 2025 and until the General Assembly on 25th June 2025;
- Approving the provisional affiliation of the Australian Clay Target Association Ltd (ACTA) as FITASC member, from 1st January 2025;
- Approving the attribution of delegation for Compak Sporting to ACTA, from 1st January 2025 and until the General Assembly on 25th June 2025;

According to our by-laws, the attribution of the discipline Compak Sporting to the A.C.T.A. will be confirmed by the 2025 Ordinary General Meeting once it has approved the withdrawal of the delegation for Compak Sporting to SCA. During this OGM of FITASC on June 25th, 2025 (by video conference from 2p.m.), please be informed that SCA will be able to exercise its right of defense with the possibility of being assisted by their lawyer, subject to sending to FITASC, no later than May 25th, 2025, a copy of their written note detailing their defense arguments.

I personally wish to welcome you in our Federation, and I am very happy of such new reorganisation in view of the development of Compak Sporting in Australia.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY 2025 NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. All shooters must present their current shooting licence/permit to the events office before competition. Failure to do so will incur a penalty of one target.
- 2. Any shooter wanting to compete in the "2025 Skeet Nationals" must be a registered competitor of the ACTA for the financial year 2025, or a "Bona Fide" International competitor.
- 3. **Entry and pre-squadding is by pre-nomination only through MCMS (MyClubsMyScores).** The closing date for reduced nominations is 5.00pm Monday the 31st March 2025. Pre-squadding preferences will only be accepted through online nominations up until 5.00pm Tuesday 1st April 2025.
- 4. Entries on the day will be taken in the events office at the Carnival for an additional \$20 per event, however squadding preferences will NOT be permitted. Such entries will close prior to the advertised starting time for the day.
- 5. Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to it commencing will be eligible for a refund less a \$10 administration fee. Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.
- 6. Squads who hold up following squads by taking longer than normal (20 minutes) will be sent to the practice trap to complete the round. Rule 7.1(d) (ii)
- 7. No competitor is entitled to view targets outside of the prescribed rules 1.21.5. Those competitors who do so will be penalized two targets.
- 8. MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data, the decision will be made by the National MCMS Handicap Supervisor.
- 9. Squads of up to 5 competitors will shoot 50/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps as designated by the Tournament Director.
- 10. The National 28 Gauge Championship cartridge load is limited to a maximum of 21 Grams (3/4 oz), shot size not larger than no 7. The National .410 bore Championship cartridge load is limited to 14 Grams (1/2/oz) shot size not larger than no 7.
- 11. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at the 50 targets or 50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each bracket of targets. Should the time limit be exceeded a penalty of the Loss of one target will occur.
- 12. Any shooter missing their squad and requiring re-squadding will be penalized one target.
- 13. Should a shooter be late for his/her squad and elect to withdraw from the event they will not be eligible for any refund. It is the shooters responsibility to make sure they are where they should be and when.
- 14. All competitors are to check and sign the score sheet after each bracket. Once a shooter has signed their score sheet the score is accepted. Any score sheet not signed by the shooter will be credited with the score as recorded.
- 15. All competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, the penalty of a loss of one target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the loss of one target.
- 16. Any competitor interfering with or attempting to interfere with the traps will be penalized five targets.
- 17. All appeals must be lodged in writing with the Tournament Director together with a \$50 appeal fee. The Tournament Director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned.
- 18. When Team selection is involved shooters will automatically represent in the highest team they qualify for. Team selection criteria available on the ACTA website.
- 19. Eligible competitors are entitled to receive awards in Open, Women, Junior or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 20. There must be a minimum of three competitors in sections or grades, including High Guns for any prizes to be awarded and a minimum of 5 entrants to constitute a sectional National Championship.
- 21. Section & grade prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd provided they meet clause 20.
- 22. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, their decision shall be final.
- 23. ACTA dress code is to be adhered to, Tournament Director is to adjudicate, failure to comply will result in disqualification.
- 24. All competitors must comply with the Firearms Laws of the State hosting the National Championships.
- 25. Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.
- 26. Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.
- 27. A junior who has not previously competed at a National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to shoot for the cost of the administration fee of \$10 per event. Claim for this concession can be made at the event or within 14 days of the completion of the event, ie; by Wednesday 23rd April 2025.
- 28. The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Tournament Director and trap mechanic prior to the start of the events daily. No further adjustment will be made without authorization of the Tournament Director or Shoot Marshal.

- 3. **Entry and pre-squadding is by pre-nomination only through MCMS (MyClubsMyScores).** The closing date for reduced nominations is 5.00 pm Monday the 7th April 2025. Pre-squadding preferences will only be accepted through online nominations up until 5.00 pm Tuesday the 8th April 2025.
- 4. Entries on the day will be taken in the events office at the Carnival for an additional \$20 per event, however squadding preferences will NOT be permitted. Such entries will close prior to the advertised starting time for the day.
- 5. Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to it commencing will be eligible for a refund less a\$10 administration fee. Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.
- 6. MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data the decision will be made by the National MCMS Handicap Supervisor.
- 7. Squads of up to 6 competitors will shoot 50/75/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. The National Handicap event is to be shot as 5 (five) person squads, 5 targets per lane then change lanes.
- 8. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 9. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at the 50/75 targets or 50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each bracket of targets. Should the time limit be exceeded a penalty of the **Loss of one target will occur.**
- 10. Any shooter missing their squad and requiring re-squadding will be penalized one target.
- 11. Should a shooter be late for his/her squad and elect to withdraw from the event they will not be eligible for any refund. It is the shooters responsibility to make sure they are where they should be and when.
- 12. All competitors are to check and sign the score sheet after each bracket. Once a shooter has signed their score sheet, the score is accepted. Any score sheet not signed by the shooter will be credited with the score as recorded.
- 13. All competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, the penalty of a loss of one target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the loss of one target in the next event. Should a competitor not be shooting a following event then the penalty will apply in the event concerned.
- 14. Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap **will be penalized five targets.**
- 15. All appeals must be lodged in writing with the tournament director together with a \$50 appeal fee. The Tournament director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned.
- 16. Mackintosh and World DTL selection will be as per ACTA selection criteria listed on the ACTA website. Shooters will automatically represent in the highest team they qualify for.
- 17. State shoulder to shoulder representatives may only represent in one team section.
- 18. Eligible competitors are entitled to receive awards in Open, Women, Junior or Veterans sections, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 19. There must be a minimum of three competitors in sections or grades, for any prizes to be awarded.
- 20. Section prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd with placing for 2nd and 3rd decided by count back.
- 21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Board, their decision shall be final.
- 22. ACTA dress code is to be adhered to, Tournament Director is to adjudicate
- 23. All competitors must comply with the Firearms Laws of the State hosting the National Championships.
- 24. Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.
- 25. Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.
- 26. A junior who has not previously competed at a National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to shoot for the cost of the administration fee of \$10 per event. Claim for this concession can be made at the event or within 14 days of the completion of the event, ie; by Wednesday 30th April 2025.
- 27. The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Tournament Director and trap mechanic prior to the start of the events daily. No further adjustment will be made without authorization of the Tournament Director or Shoot Marshal.

Bendigo Clay Target Club - 27th January 2025



2025 ACTA National ISSF Championships

Sydney International Shooting Centre January 14 - 19, 2025

This year saw the ACTA formally resume the operation of the ISSF Nationals, which were conducted at the Sydney International Shooting Centre (Home of the Shooting at Sydney 2000).

Relevant permissions were sought of both the Ground Operators and the EPA to allow for 9am starts each morning and to allow operations on days normally closed for shooting, and for an extra Skeet ground to be employed. These permissions allowed for extra numbers to be included in the field, so 7 waves for the Trap (126) and Skeet (54). The numbers attending meant that the trap was duly full for the National event, while numbers in the Skeet were a healthy 39.

The Skeet commenced competition on Wednesday 15 January with the Commonwealth Title, and the Trap commencing a day later (each event conducted over 2 days).

It is worth mentioning at this time that there was controversy as to the awarding of the Sash in the Women's ISSF Skeet section as there were only 4 competitors. It was decided that the sash should be awarded as regardless of the numbers of competitors, Aislin was the Commonwealth ISSF Skeet winner. The ACTA rules, published under the entry criteria, does stipulate that a minimum 5 competitors are required for the event to be regarded as a competition. With that in mind the relevance of the conditions of entry have been deemed to apply for medals in the minor placings. This proved to be the case for the National event also. Potentially there may be some impact on Hall of Fame points, but this will be a discussion with the Hall of Fame sub-committee and existing Hall of Fame members.







Psychological Skills for Shooting

Perfecting practise

As we prepare for the skeet or trap nationals, many of us will hit the practise traps to try and perfect those technical skills that we will need when we get to the competition.

The majority of us shoot well in practise. We can shoot long breaks, we smoke the targets and the whole process of shooting feels effortless. We often feel like we are in the zone.

Why do we then 'choke' when we get into the competition? Missing targets that you have shot thousands of times before is due to self-doubt. When self-doubt sets in, you tighten or freeze up, this means that your muscles are not able to move as fluidly as they can, and, as a result, you miss the target.

The reasons why a shooter fails in competitions could be due to following:

- You take things cautiously due to a subconscious fear of failure. Sometimes if you have shot well in the first 25, you subconsciously try to protect the score that you think you have. To shoot well, you have to shot to HIT the target. When you change your mindset to shoot not to MISS, you will tense up due to subconsciously developing self-doubt.
- Fear of disappointing a parent or coach and as a result you play it safe. Playing it safe means that you are unable to deal with anything that is out of the ordinary.
- You want to win too badly and you can't stand losing. Placing too much importance on winning means that you are product or outcome focused rather than process focused. This means that you are moving your thinking into the future: when you do this, your brain gives subconscious messages that turn into worries and fears. This leads to self-doubt and again your muscles tense up and you miss.
- You doubt your abilities, and distrust your

- skills when it is essential to blindly rely on your abilities. You need to trust and let go of your subconscious judgements.
- Trying too hard. Trying fails because it leads to self-doubt which leads you to lose selfconfidence. This then generates negative self-talk that makes you want to try even harder but you are already tensed up and you struggle to move freely and hit the target with ease. This compounds the self-doubt, and you end up in a vicious spiral that will only take you down into what feels like a bottomless hole.
- You expect to perform perfectly and you become frustrated when you cannot. Expectations are not goals. Goals are what you plan for.
- Worry too much about your competitors. You feel intimidated by the level of competition.
- You become too analytical about your performance. This will lead to making judgements about your ability and /or your past performances the next time you compete.

Whilst these are some of the reasons why we fail, our brain then uses ego defence mechanisms such as intellectualising, or rationalising to limit the anxiety, embarrassment or shame.

- 1. We may blame our faulty technique. There may have been a range of reasons why we missed that may have nothing to do with out technique. Blaming your technique and making hasty adjustments will only lead to you missing more targets.
- 2. We often blame the weather, the light, the changing light, the clouds, the wind, the targets.
- 3. We often blame our equipment. The gun, the stock, our ammunition or the targets. Some shooters search for the perfect gun: the one doesn't miss. If the gun fits then it should hit the target if the shooters technical skills are adequate.

We miss because of self-doubt or lack of mental toughness. These things are inside us: in our head, they are a part of our thinking.

- 4. We often blame others for our inability. We blame our parents, coaches, partners, etc for putting us under too much pressure.
- 5. We blame others. The referee, other shooters, someone in the background.

From the above two lists there are a number of things that get in our way, but it is ourselves and more specifically our brain that sabotages our ability to move from perfect in practice to dismal in the competition. We need to understand and accept that we get in our own way.

What can we do to take what we do in practise to the competition?

- Trust your physical skills. Make sure you are competent in what you are doing.
- Trust your ability and let go of the value judgements and worries. Let the competition happen. Have confidence in your ability.
- Stay focused in the here and now. Let go of how well you are performing and avoid over analysing targets you have missed. Focus on one shot at a time. Ignore past mistakes and avoid worrying about the future.
- Keep your performance simple. Focus on the process. Stay composed and relaxed.
- Commit to winning and don't worry about what it looks like. Avoid chasing the perfect performance.

Commitment, confidence, composure, competency and competitiveness are all feature of mental toughness. If you are able to cultivate these mental skills then you will be able to move effortlessly from high achieving practise to high achieving competitions.



The canteen duties were ably carried out by Club President, Robert Ross, who ensured everyone was well fed and hydrated.


David Evans – 100 years

Shooting for Para and Disabled

Nige Young, WACTA member, last year put together a competition that encompassed both scores from home club shoots (postal) and physical attendance at a major 2 day Carnival location, which included more competitions, finals and presentations. It was designed to identify Para or Disabled members within our sport but without them having to incur major financial or discomfort in travelling distances. The Para Shotgun Series consisted of 2 parts:

Postal competition, whereby members could send their best DTL DB/DB Pts and SB scores for registration with presentation at the 2 Day Carnival at Melbourne Gun Club at end of year.

The start-up was slow, but it gained momentum when the 2 Day Para Shotgun Series Carnival was held at Melbourne Gun Club, which included able bodied shooters as well in a separate competition.

The Australian Sports Commission has recently announced the para-sports unit and a significant focus on enhancing the opportunities for para-athletes to compete at Olympic level with an eye on Brisbane 2032. 

Queensland Northern Zone Wet



It's the Wet season up here in far north Queensland. In a good year that means things are just a little bit extra challenging... the heat, often coupled with punishing humidity, grass that needs mowing every third day or so, a new pothole here or there.

And then there's this year – and perhaps last year, as well. These are those "once-in-ageneration-timeframe-weather-events" that have made things next-level tough.

The Bruce Highway, the major highway in this part of the country, is garbage at the best of times. Now it has been cut, substantially – washed away no less – between Ingham and Townsville. Shelves in the "Big Two" supermarkets to the north of this disaster are almost completely bare. Fresh produce and meat sections were stripped in the early stages of a deluge

that began in early February. Tens of thousands of residents to the north and many to the west of Townsville get by as best they can, with little indication of when the situation might improve. Dramatic flood levels of major river systems in the region compound the problems caused by the washed-out highway.

Amidst this, running a clay target club takes time, energy and effort from a (usually) small band of dedicated volunteers. If you've ever been involved at the grass-roots level of a club, you'll know exactly

how this plays out. There are traps to maintain, grounds to mow, clubhouses to tidy, food to sort – all to have

everything ready for shoot day. Weather events, the likes of which Northern Zone clubs are presently coping with, stretch valuable human and financial resources to breaking point.

Prime examples are the early January storm which tore through the Charters Towers Clay Target Club, west of Townsville, bringing winds of 100km/hr plus. Trees and buildings alike were badly damaged. Thankfully the skills and machinery of


some club members, together with assistance from a generous sponsor, meant that things were soon tidied up.

Learning valuable lessons from the devastation that Cyclone Yasi brought them in January 2011, the Herbert River Gun Club (Ingham) developed a flood plan and rebuilt their clubhouse on a mound high above the level of the 1967 flood. If a picture is worth a thousand words, then the photos of their grounds and clubhouse taken in the first week of February 2025 and posted to their Facebook page, make for devastating viewing. At the time this magazine was published, access to the grounds to assess the full extent of damage had not been possible.

In December of 2023 Cyclone Jasper brought minimal wind damage to the Tropical North Coast, but it did bring relentless rain. Water levels rose so quickly that the Silkwood Clay Target Club experienced water lapping at its clubhouse slab, right after its traps were submerged. In the weeks and months that followed, the rain barely stopped

for more than a few days at a time; 2024 had an exceptionally wet start.






