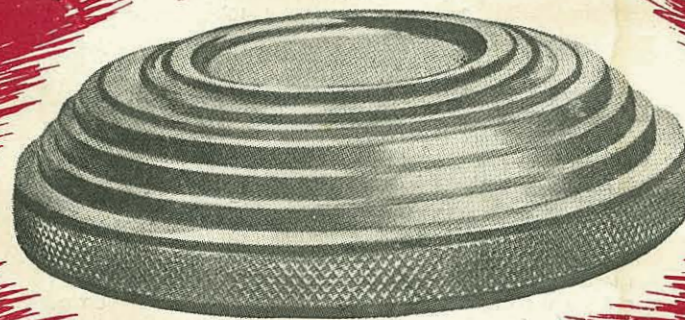

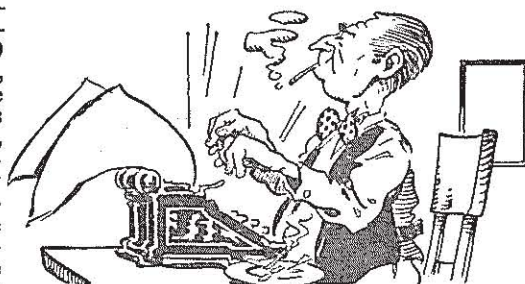

THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

The 1951 Association programme of shoots, extending over four days, March 9 to March 13, 1951, inclusive, are fully listed in the advertising section of this month's issue. The series, which will be the most comprehensive undertaken by the A.C.P.T.S.A., will provide shooters with the greatest array of competition ever presented in the Commonwealth. The series will commence at 12 noon on Friday, March 9, with the opening rounds of the Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship). This event is a 60 birder and competitors will be required to shoot at 20 releases each before shooting ceases on Friday. Intending competitors should take particular note that no entries will be accepted for this event after 1.30 p.m. on Friday, March 9, which should be understood to mean that no entries will be accepted on Saturday, March 10, and no competitor will be permitted to "shoot-up" who has not lodged his own individual entry by 1.30 p.m. and taken part in the opening rounds on Friday, March 9. This arrangement has been made to ensure that the event is completed in a period of "comfortable" shooting without undue rush to any section of the competitors. The usual Australian Teams' Championship will be shot in conjunction—teams of four men representing a club or clubs. No entry will be accepted for the Australian Teams' Championship where a combination seeks to enter as a "State" team. Shooting will resume at 9.30 a.m. on Saturday, March 10, and competitors in the Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship) will shoot at 40 targets for the day in this event. The arrangement of shooting the contest over two days should allow for a reasonably early finish and adequate time for presentation of awards. The Association annual dinner will follow at night. The dinner is restricted to donors and competitors only. On Monday, March 12, the



A.C.P.T.S.A. Intermediate Championship will start at 9.30 a.m. The Fifth International Teams' Match, between teams representative of England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and Australia, is also listed for this day. The Australian Team scores will be sealed until the Great Britain teams shoot later in the year. The Australian Team will comprise the 20 highest scorers in the Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship) 1951 and each man gaining a place in the Australian International Team will shoot at 100 targets from the International mark of 16 yards. The Australian team will shoot at period of the day to be decided upon by the Executive Committee on March 12. A special Open Handicap, from Association marks, will be shot, together with other minor events on Monday, March 12, should time permit. On Monday evening, March 12, the 1951 Annual General Meeting of affiliated club delegates will be held, of which all affiliated clubs will have due notice in accordance with the rules. Affiliated clubs should take particular notice of the date of this meeting and do their utmost to ensure that their club is represented by one of their own club members resident in the area of location. If this is carried out, it will enable every club to have direct representation, instead of proxy delegates, which it has been found in many cases do not reflect the actual views of the club concerned. The fourth and final day will be Tuesday, March 13, when the Third Grand Australian Handicap, shot at 40 targets from

Association handicaps, single-barrel, will be decided. Should time permit, a Special Farewell Handicap will also be included on March 13, together with minor sweepstakes. Shooting will again commence at 9.30 a.m. Four automatic traps will be in operation—this total is one in excess of the previous number used. Should circumstances warrant, the Executive Committee reserves the right to vary the conditions of any event.

Intending competitors resident outside Melbourne should make immediate arrangements for their accommodation. The A.C.P.T.S.A. will be unable to assist in this regard in future—due chiefly to the fact that accommodation in Melbourne is always difficult and the period of the shoot (which includes a holiday week-end) make it more so.

Clubs are officially notified that all down-the-line open championships—that is Commonwealth, State and District double and single-barrel championships—are in future to be shot under the "SQUAD SYSTEM" and not "single-track" as formerly. This decision was arrived at during the recent annual meeting of delegates.

Some confusion appears to exist in regard to the Association's ruling on break recognition. For the information of all interested, the ruling as it appears in the records of the Association is appended. It reads: "Breaks to be recognised only when shot under double and single-barrel conditions and in competition—break may be carried from one day to another, provided the shooter does not compete in any other type of event or events or shoot in practice. Handicaps and championships, down-the-line shooting only. Should a shooter take part in other type of event, his break ends and scores registered in other type of event or events do not register for the break."

Shooters and clubs are reminded that fees for the 1951 season are now due and payable to the Secre-

tary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.I. The fees now are: club affiliation (clubs only), £1/1/- per annum. Shooters' registration is now fixed at 20/- each per annum—includes free issue of Association "News" each month and a new badge for 1951. Prompt payment greatly assists Association administration.

In view of the large amount of organization necessary to ensure the success of the Association's big four-day carnival in March, it is important that engagement of referees and scorers should be completed with the minimum of delay. Persons desirous of taking over referee and scorer duties are therefore requested to advise the Secretary A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.I, as soon after reading this intimation as possible. This will enable completion of the referee and scorer panel to be finalised in plenty of time.

14th Annual Meeting of A.C.P.T.S.A.

The 14th Annual Meeting of affiliated club delegates was held at the usual venue, Scott's Hotel, Melbourne, on Wednesday evening, November 8, 1950. The attendance was excellent, more than 50 being present. The Chairman and Association President, Mr. J. M. Wilson, opened the meeting and welcomed all present. He added that the attendance reflected the great interest being taken in the sport of clay pigeon shooting and also in the affairs of the Association.

Election of Office-bearers. — The election of office-bearers resulted: President, Mr. J. M. Wilson; Vice-Presidents, Messrs. J. W. Bienvenu, A. F. Johnson, A. E. Poxon, W. E. H. Rainbird and J. M. Tyquin; Executive Committee, Messrs. E. G. Biggs, L. Bourbaud, A. H. Brenk, V. Dudley and H. G. James.

The following were appointed Hon. Vice-Presidents of the A.C.P.T.S.A.: Messrs. Fred. Brook (Gilgandra, N.S.W.), R. A. Byers (Burdekin, Q.), W. J. Hanran (Townsville, Q.), L. P. Hughes (Sydney, N.S.W.), R. A. Miles (Spokane, Washington, U.S.A.), H. Rogers (Edgware, England), and G. C. Rutledge (Brisbane, Q.).

Several important decisions were reached during the meeting. The first of these is the alteration to Rule 27, that portion having reference to the date of the holding of the Annual General Meeting has been altered to read: "The Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held at a date to be fixed in each year by the Executive Committee for the purpose of." This rule then continues to read on as formerly, with its several clauses dealing with the conduct of such meetings. The reason for this change, which was sought by the Executive Committee, was to enable that body to hold the Annual General Meeting at a period when it was considered many representatives of distant clubs would be present in Melbourne. The idea being to seek their attendance

as direct representatives of respective clubs, instead of proxy delegates. The new scheme will be introduced with the 1951 Annual General Meeting, which is set down for holding on the evening of Monday, March 12, 1951. This date is the evening of Intermediate Championship and International Day of the Association's four-day meeting in March, 1951. It is expected that the changed period of the year for the holding of the meeting will find favour with the majority of clubs and delegates.

Another important decision agreed upon was an alteration to Rule 33a, that portion having reference to shooters' registration fees. This portion of the rule is now to read: "The subscription payable by a registered shooter shall be 20/- per annum." It was considered that the present survive, particularly concerning Association "News", could not be maintained satisfactorily on the previous figure.

The meeting agreed to instruct the Executive Committee to take up the matter of clubs failing to submit handicap returns for open handicapping. This matter will be dealt with at a later meeting of the Executive Committee.

A recommendation from a Tasmanian club that State and Commonwealth double-barrel and single-barrel championships be shot under the "squad" system, was adopted. A suggestion from the same group that the Commonwealth double-barrel championship be shot at 50 birds instead of 25, was left, after much discussion, to the incoming Executive for finalization. (The Executive later decided to allow the number of birds—i.e., 25—to remain unaltered as at present.)

A Queensland delegate stated that he felt—and he was speaking on behalf of a number of Queensland clubs—that all clubs should have some say in the personnel appointed to the Executive Committee of the Association. He recommended that the incoming Executive Committee

No entries for this event will be accepted after 1.30 p.m. on Friday, March 9th, 1951.)

The event is open to any shooter registered with the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association who is a member of an affiliated club in any part of the Commonwealth of Australia. No championship qualification is necessary.

PRIZE LIST — CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS CUP (AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP)

The winner of the Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship) event will hold the Donald Mackintosh Perpetual Silver Cup (valued at 75 guineas) for 12 months and will also receive the following awards—

- Replica of Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship)
- A.C.P.T.S.A. Champion of Champions (Australian National Championship Sash)
- Special Winner's Trophy, valued 35 guineas.

Trophies will be awarded to the next highest scorers, down to tenth position. Four special trophies will be awarded to competitors registering the best performance whose Association handicaps come under the following categories: 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 yards and over. Also a Ladies' Trophy. (A competitor finishing anywhere in the first ten will not be eligible for the sectional trophies.)

Three Interstate competitors (resident outside Victoria), (one to each State of Queensland, New South Wales and Tasmania) registering the best performance in the Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship) and not winning any other award, will be allotted special trophies.

A special trophy will also be awarded to the best Victorian Country performer (resident over 50 miles from Melbourne) not winning any other trophy.

A special trophy will be presented to the lady drawing the winning shooter.

ENTRANCE FEE.—Entrance fee for the Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship) will be 60/- (birds free). Optional sweepstakes of 20/- and 10/- will be conducted in conjunction with the Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship). In addition an optional 5/- sweepstake, restricted to shooters whose Association handicap does not exceed 15 yards, will also be available. All sweepstakes above will be divided (without deductions), First 60 per cent., Second 30 per cent., Third 10 per cent.

consider the whole of the Commonwealth in zone areas, each zone to have representation on the Executive Committee and that return plane fares should be paid by the Association for such appointees. This was generally approved and left to the Executive Committee for action.

A N.S.W. delegate considered that shooting was interrupted too frequently by the use of the loud-

speaker system during Association shoots, and this action had proved detrimental to shooters on the shooting tracks.

During the meeting all present stood for one minute's silence in memory of the late Claude Abell, of Hobart (Tas.), a one-time Hon. Vice-President of the A.C.P.T.S.A., and one of the founders of clay pigeon shooting in Tasmania.

A.C.P.T.S.A.

14th Annual Report

Conditions governing all Association Championships are published in this issue. This action has been taken to enable every shooter to have a copy for reference and guidance at any time.

The period under review covers 11 months only, following the resolution agreed to at the 13th Annual Meeting, that the books of the Association should close on September 30th each year. Notwithstanding the shorter period of activities, it is pleasing to report continued Association expansion and extension of the sport which the A.C.P.T.S.A. has the honour of governing.

The International Match for 1950 was won by England, with Australia in second place, followed by Scotland, Wales and Ireland. Following Australia's win in 1949, runner-up position to such an accomplished combination as was put into the field by the Home Country, was indeed a notable achievement by the Australian team. Many of the Australian team were somewhat handicapped on International Day, due to having to fight out a finish for places in the team on the morning of the shoot. This was occasioned by the heavy entry received for the Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship) and

consequent inability to finalise the latter event in one day. The first 20 highest scorers in the Champion of Champions Cup form the nucleus of Australia's International Team. Australian High-gun in the International Match went to J. Smith, of Home Hill (Qld.), with a creditable 94/100.

The Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship) was won outright by J. A. McCraith (Essendon, V.), with the good score of 59/60. The record entry of 215 was received for this event—this total was 62 in advance of the previous record registered in 1949. Having in view the possibility of an even greater entry in 1951, the Executive Committee will probably decide to shoot the event over two days instead of the usual single day in earlier years.

The premier double-barrel championship of the year was decided under the supervision of the Hobart Gun Club on its Brighton (Tas.) grounds and was won by Anelson, of Collinsvale (Tas.).

With a break of 104 straight, compiled in successive shoots at Wangaratta (V.) and East Burwood (Australian Club) (V.), A. J. Russell, of Eltham, wrested the Aus-

tralian Break record from the previous holder, V. Eather, of Bogabri (N.S.W.). The total of 104 now stands as the official Australian record, having been recognised by the A.C.P.T.S.A.

Congratulations are extended to winners of all Commonwealth, State and District championships, shot under A.C.P.T.S.A. auspices.

Affiliated clubs and registered shooters have increased considerably since the presentation of the previous report. Affiliated clubs since the resumption of competitive activities for the post-war period total 122, of which, for the review period covered by this report, 107 are recorded as affiliated. An increase of 27 in 11 months, with at least another eight pending. Registered shooters total approximately 2,400, an increase of 600, allowing for those dropped from the records as unfinancial.

The Association's official journal, "Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting News," is continuing to extend and commenced the fourth year of publication in October, 1950. Included in recent improvements to the publication is a special coloured cover, which it is intended to maintain for the future. This service has proved most popular with shooting men throughout Australia.

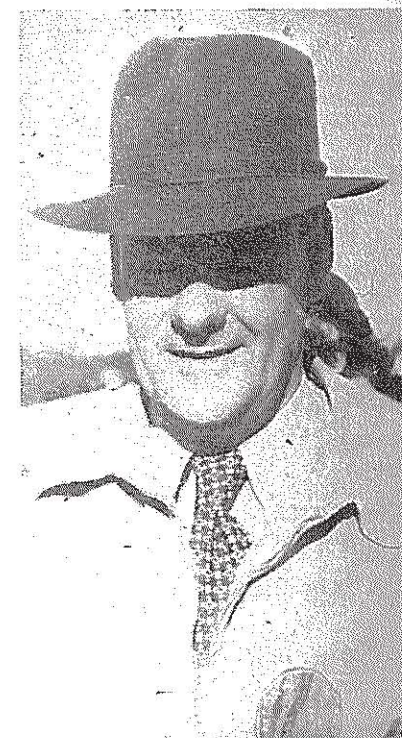

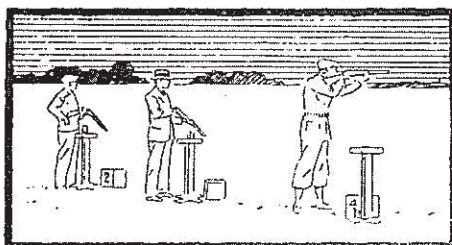

Night shooting will be held on Wed., Dec. 20; Wed., Jan. 3, and Wed., Jan. 17, and each alternate Wednesday until further notice.

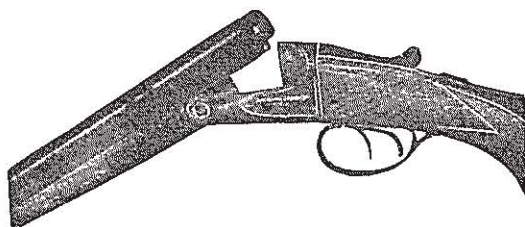

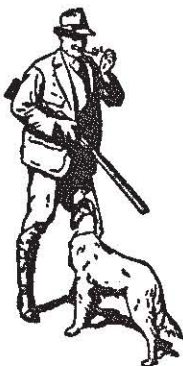

Tommy Hughes, the Welsh International shot, in an interesting note written at the end of October, says: "Just a line hoping you clay busters down under are looking forward to a very good season and that the weather conditions will be

kind to you. We here had a very good season, all meetings being well attended. The Welsh Captain, during the International shoot, arranged a friendly match with the Irish boys in September, and over to Dublin we went, 14 of us, and what a time we had. We stayed at Freddie Moran's Hotel, the Irish lad who took the British Open Championship this year to Ireland for the first time. We shot 100 birds each, and Ireland beat us by 7 birds. It was a very near thing all through. At half-way there were only three birds between us. After the match we were entertained by the Irish Association, followed by a sing-song, during which the composers of the 'Clay Busters' Ballad sang their now famous song. One of the Welsh boys remarked on the way home that his face was the only honest-looking face amongst us, but, alas, he was the only one to pay out to the Customs Officer! 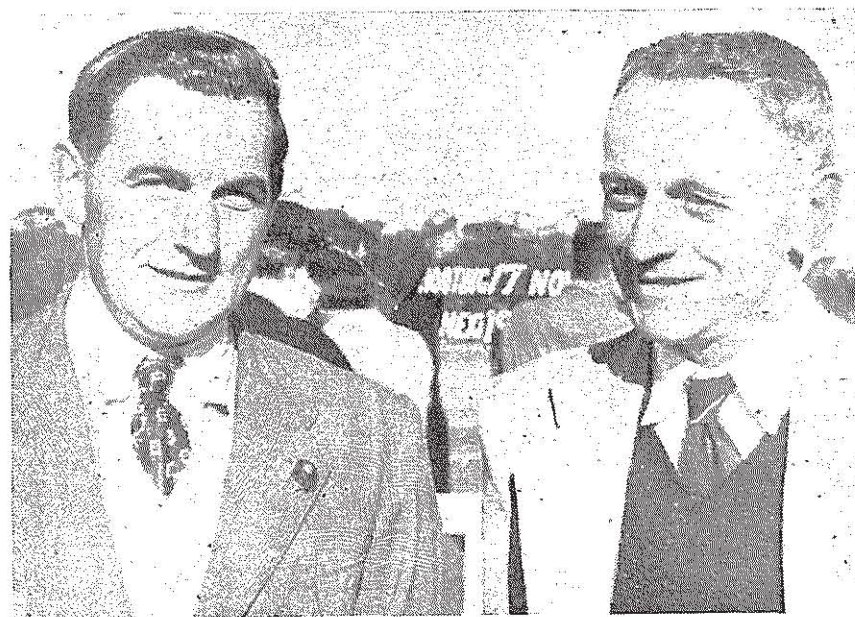

Recently at Stonehenge Club (N.S.W.) a prominent shooter was given a lost bird when he had claimed a balk, because of the failure of his second barrel to fire. The shooter's explanation is that he "did not in his opinion open his gun (an under and over) sufficiently to cock his second barrel." It is understood there was some difference of opinion as to the referee's decision—there can be no question but that the referee's decision was correct. Shooting Rule 9(b) covers the query very clearly; it reads: "The Referee shall declare the 'pigeon' lost, (b) When the competitor fails to shoot because his gun was unloaded or uncocked, or because the safety was faultily adjusted or jarred back, whether

from his own oversight or not, or because of any other cause chargeable to his own oversight or neglect."

A new clay pigeon shooting club is likely to become an established fact at Lakes Entrance, the famed Eastern Victorian holiday and residential centre. The organization should have a bright future. A well-known clay target shooter is the sponsor.

An interesting and somewhat amusing sidelight of the recent Association Annual Meeting on November 8 was the combination of "Black & White"—not the popular mellow heather dew so revered by many of our shooting sportsmen of Scottish origin, but an actual real-life combination of Dick Wightman and Fred Blackman, sitting side-by-side during the full course of the meeting. Very few noticed the pair with the black and white sounding names adjacent to each other, but those who were sufficiently observant enjoyed quite an amount of amuse-

The plane had just switched on its landing lights when a flying fox cannoned into the port wing light and caused a short circuit. Happily, the worst that happened was the blackout of the light—the pilot came in safely on his remaining guides and all ended well. The plane, however, was delayed until 2.15 a.m. (from 7.30 p.m.), and Jack Page, on the last 180 hop to Atherton, ultimately reached the ground at his home stop at 3.20 a.m.

U.S.A. Shooting . .

(From REX MILES)

"Thanks for the magazines, have read them from cover to cover. Note where you have a photo of a squad of Australian beauties in the last "News" received. You want to watch these girls; they can make it tough for the boys when they get going. We have a little lady here who has made at least five world records. I refer to Ruth Ray, of Eugene, Oregon. This is what she has done: At the Montana State Shoot last July she broke 200 x 200 at 16 yards (world record); at the Grand American in the women's National Championship she broke 199 x 200, the highest score ever made by a woman. At the Pacific Zone Championship she won with 197, tied for high gun on all mixed targets, 16 yards handicap at 22 yards, and doubles in the shoot-off, 15-16 yards, 15-22 yards and 10 pairs; she broke them all, 50 straight—another record. Ruth Ray is the only lady shooter who shoots in Class AA, the top class, so in the class events she has to shoot on even terms with Arnold Reigger, Bill Meyerhoff, Joe Hiestand, Vic Reinders. Joe Devers and the other top-notchers. Shooting in the Sierra-Nevada fixture at Reno Trap and Skeet Club on September 24, Arnold Reigger stopped 398 x 400—16 yards, 92 x 100—25 yards. In fairness to Ruth, I want to say that she was ill when the Oregon State Shoot was on and did not compete, so at the Grand this year she was not eligible for any of the Champion of Champion races. As you know, another girl, Joan Pfeuger, of Florida, won the Open Champion of Champions race, broke 100 straight to tie with four men, all State Champions, of course, and Joan won the shoot-off.

My prediction on trapshooting for next year and a few more depends on the war situation. Things are going to be tough, shells will be hard to get, and the prices will be "out-of-sight". The military comes first; already they are clamping down. Don't think that there will be many large shoots and the programmes will be cut. During the

last war we held small shoots, with instructions to bring your own shells. If you had shells, you could shoot; if not, you couldn't find any for love or money. All the best to my Australian shooting friends and the Season's Compliments".

Ten Years Ago . . .

Winning the Victorian Skeet title of 1940 in December, 1940, at Coburg, H. Waight (now of Ballarat) completed a treble for skeet events in that year. He had previously won the Commonwealth and Metropolitan titles. Mention in the records of 1940 show that a "Victorian Ladies' Clay Target Club" competed in a series of matches at Bentleigh in December, 1940. A ten birder was won by a Mrs. Munro, of St. Kilda, 10/15, from Miss Browne, 9/15.

Shooting at Holbrook on Boxing Day, 1940, Roy Grossman and S. J. Kneebone, the then holders of the Victorian Deauville Doubles Championship, won the Riverina Deauville Doubles title.

How Many Shots per Bird?

If you can average four shots a duck over the shooting season, you are apparently doing better than most shooters, for figures taken by five reliable and independent parties over the past two seasons indicate that the average shooter does not bag one duck for every four cartridges expended.

One party of seven, shooting on a lagoon, reports firing 448 cartridges over a period of two days for a total of 193 birds. This is exceptionally good shooting, and such a large total could probably not have been bagged on larger waters where many winged ducks get away. Shooting on the Wairarapa Lake a party of five really good shots only accounted for 78 in two days for 310 shots, the fine weather conditions being against much close-range shooting.

The Sporting Gun in England Its History and Development

There can be little doubt that the hand-gun was first used for sport in the pursuit of wild duck. The earliest sporting writer in this country to deal with the use of firearms in killing game, was Gervase Markham writing in 1621 his "Hungers Prevention, or the Whole Art of Fowling." The writer is not particular as to the methods he applies to fill the larder and he considers other methods far easier and less expensive than the "birding piece" which he suggests should only be used as a last resort.

The use of firearms for sport had not become general by the beginning of the 17th century and this may be seen by the very interesting illustrations which are here given by the kind permission of the Mayor and Corporation of Hertford. These are contemporary illuminations of the margin of the Charter by James I to the town of Hertford. They illustrate all forms of sport, but, except in the case of bull-baiting, no firearms are shewn, and even then only as a reserve. It will be seen that the cross-bow, the pike and hounds of various descriptions, are employed.

In 1631 the first official step was taken to improve the manufacture of firearms by the appointment of a committee of gunmakers, armourers, pikemakers and bandolier makers, to carry out the important work of examining, proving and (where necessary) ordering the repair or replacement of the arms of the Middlesex Militia, or trained bands as they were then called. The significance of this step was that although the Act of Henry VIII had not yet been repealed, the government was tacitly countenancing the manufacture of small arms and taking steps to see that those used by the armed forces were efficient

for the purpose. There can be little doubt that the manufacture of the service weapon encouraged many to buy and use the short gun for sporting purposes.

In 1637 the King granted his royal charter to the Worshipful Company of Gunmakers, whereby they took over the responsibility of proving and testing firearms which six years earlier had been made the function of this Committee.

The improvement during the 17th century of the lock (the English lock) and methods of ignition of the charge by the "snaphance", together with the introduction of breech loading, just before the outbreak of the Civil Wars, made the hand-gun more adaptable for sporting purposes, but even then its use was confined almost entirely to the sitting bird or to deer.

So established was the professional wild-fowl shot in the Fen country that in 1634, when the "Bedford Level" scheme was first put into action, the inhabitants and tenants formed an armed opposition, assaulting the company's work people and destroying their works. In this they were led by a "Mr. Cromwell" of Ely, who a decade later was destined to take up an even more belligerent role.

By the time of the outbreak of the Civil War, both armies were equipped with hand-guns. This fact had a far-reaching effect on the development of this weapon for killing game, as it was no difficult matter to convert the army ammunition to sporting purposes. It also resulted in widespread destruction of game and wild-fowl, especially in the areas most affected by military occupation.

Gun Gossip . . .

(By "NORTH COUNTRY," of the British Shooting Times.)

We are not a nation of revolver shooters in the sense that America is, nor under the present restrictions are we ever likely to become one. But a certain amount of such shooting goes on, and some of our readers abroad are able to use hand-guns in a quite unrestricted way. Apart from the reasons that the police authorities have for limiting the number of revolvers in private possession, there are reasons why the ordinary citizen should feel more concern over these than other firearms. For a revolver or pistol must be, by its very nature, a more dangerous weapon than either gun or rifle. By which I mean that accidents in or about the home can more easily happen. The slightest movement of the wrist and the muzzle is deflected from a safe to an unsafe angle. The shorter the barrel, the greater the chance of the muzzle coming into line with somebody, or some portion of your own anatomy. Even the comparatively long 5½ in. or 6 in. barrelled weapons are very dangerous in this respect. You have only to handle one as you sit in your chair to see how easily that barrel can be pointing at you. And as there are 6 shots to be accounted for, the odd one left in a chamber, or in the barrel, may be forgotten.

An acquaintance of mine met his death in this way. He was examining an automatic pistol, supposed to be unloaded, when suddenly it went off. The magazine was unloaded, but there was still the cartridge in the chamber. Of course he should have made sure of this before playing about, and he should have kept the muzzle away from himself. However, there it was. The least flexion of the wrist and you are covered or covering somebody. All the same, pistol shooting is a great art and it would be a tragedy to see it go or pass into the limbo of half-forgotten sports or pastimes. I do not agree with a friend who over

a drink the other day said that the only people who wanted pistols were potential suicides or gangsters! This is largely nonsense. Just because a weapon is dangerous is no reason for its complete taboo. Indeed, training in its use is of all the greater value in that it has to put the accent on safe handling. What man who has had a proper grounding in pistol or revolver handling is likely to be careless with gun or rifle? If you can handle those little weapons, you can surely handle the big ones.

FAST FLIERS

Many shotgunners do not realise just how fast a bird can travel, consequently they little realise the great distance it can cover between the time they actually see it and when it connects with the shot charge—that is, if it does. A crossing bird travelling at 60 miles an hour, or 88 feet a second, just across your front at a range of, say, 20 yards, will travel approximately 60 feet from the time you see it to the time the shot charge reaches it. Tests have shown that it takes the average shooter approximately one-fifth second to get set, another one-fifth to swing on and past the bird, and another fifth to pull the trigger. This is reaction time, but don't forget the bird is still flying. This totals three-fifths of 88 or 54 feet, and if the shot charge velocity is 900 feet per second, it will take approximately one-fifteenth of a second to reach the crossing point where we hope to contact the bird. Meanwhile the bird has travelled six feet, which, added to the 54 given for reaction time, makes 60 feet.

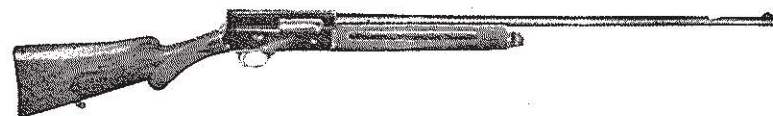
