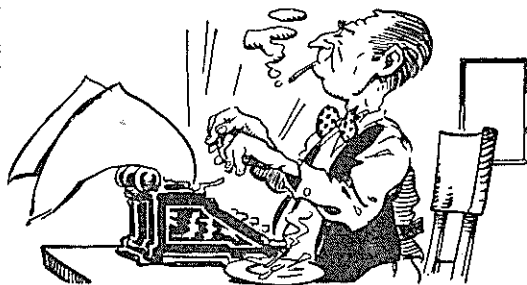

The Editor's Notebook

The annual Interstate Match, for the honour of holding the coveted "Great Britain and Ireland" Trophy for the ensuing twelve months, has again gone to the Queensland representative team. The Queenslanders' shooting at Roma registered 483/500, with four possible scores of 50 straight in their team aggregate. Congratulations are extended to the winning State. Second placing was shared by New South Wales and South Australia, each with 477/500. Both teams had possible registrations and both are also congratulated on a fine score. The New South Wales team shot at Hay late in September, whilst South Australians battled for ascendancy on the Mount Barker club's grounds. It is worth recording to note the splendid progress made by South Australia in this year's contest. From a lowly position in previous years South Australia has come right up to the leaders in 1954. The development augurs well for the sport of clay pigeon shooting in that State. Tasmania registered 472/500, quite a good score. The Tasmanians struck a little trap trouble during the contest, otherwise the Apple Island State team may have been closer. Victoria fell away to a very poor score, registering 430/500. It may be mentioned in regard to Victoria, however, that the day selected for the shoot turned out very badly. A howling north-westerly gale prevailed almost throughout the shoot and this factor greatly upset many of those contesting the honours. The Western Australian score was equal to that produced by Tasmania, 472/500. Again a great improvement on the initial essay into the competition by the West Australians.

Details of the 1955 Championship Allocation appears in another section of this issue. Affiliated clubs are requested to accept the published list as official and arrange to conduct the events allotted. For those officials



not quite familiar with conditions, it is mentioned that dates for all open championships (and open events) must be approved by the Association before same can be held. Open championships are those championships as listed in the 1955 Allocation. Open events are events in which over £50 in prize money is allocated for any one particular event.

A Victorian country shooter recently complained to the Association that he took part in a local competition recently, and was the last shooter. He broke 9 straight in a 10 birder, then most of his squad left the track, as also did the puller. Later the President of the club returned and pulled the shooter's final bird, which he missed. The shooter concerned asked for a ruling. The whole question is one of club management. If the circumstances are as stated, the club management comes in for serious condemnation. In the first place the squad members should not have left the track until all competitors had completed shooting, also the fact that the puller deserted his post, apparently without instructions, is again wrong. Clubs are reminded that they have a duty to all competitors, and managements should maintain a firm control at all times.

From New South Wales comes an advice which reads, "There are a lot of unregistered shooters around these parts, who shoot at bush and picnic meetings, therefore, they have

no handicap and shoot on 12 yards, which we consider unfair to handicapped shooters. Is there any way to force these shooters on to a handicap? If so, could you write it up in the next issue of 'News'?" The registration matter is simple. No shooter, under any circumstances, is allowed to compete against registered men. If shooters who are unregistered turn up at a shoot, they should not be allowed to compete until their dues have been accepted by the club on behalf of the Association. Also, if they have no handicap and are unknown, it is an Association ruling that they must start on 16 yards. It is in the registered shooter's hands to see that the rules of the Association are obeyed. The fact that a shooter has no handicap does not entitle him to shoot off 12 yards; in fact, it rather emphasises the fact that his capabilities are unknown and, therefore, should be placed at once on 16 yards. It does not take long to assess how good or otherwise a shooter is if the foregoing procedure is adopted.

In the event of a tie in mixed bird championships (open), the conditions lay down that the competitors must shoot at "two double-barrel, two single-barrel, two walk-up and two double-rise." A report mentions that the conditions are at "three" under the aforementioned conditions, which is incorrect. This applies to Commonwealth, State and District events.

The annual Association National Championships and International Match will be held over the period 11th, 12th, 14th and 15th of March, 1955, at East Burwood (Victoria). It will be noted that an additional day has been taken for the 1955 series, as well as one night shoot. The major new event will be the National Single-barrel championship, which will start at 10.30 a.m. on the morning of March 11. The night shoot will follow on March 11. The Association annual meeting of affiliated

club delegates will be held on Sunday, March 13th, 1955, commencing at 10.30 a.m., at Scott's Hotel, 444 Collins Street, Melbourne, C.I. Nominations for all offices in the Association and all notices of motion, having reference to the rules, must be in the hands of the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.I., not later than 6 p.m. on December 31st, 1954.

Clubs are informed that in future no breaks will be recognised which have not been completed in one day, or two consecutive days of the same shoot. By the latter portion of the foregoing it is meant that a club conducting a two-day shoot, a shooter may carry his break on, under down-the-line, D.B. or S.B. conditions only, during the period of shoot. Shooting in any other type of competition ends the break.

"Tips" and "Tails"

The Tamworth Club in New South Wales is building a new ground and the club intends to install up-to-date night lighting. The new lay-out is on flat, open country.
