







The Editor's Notebook

Shooters and clubs have shooters and clubs have been advised through the columns of this publication in the August issue that a further Official Referee Examination, written test, will take place as from October 1. Those interested are reminded that full names and addresses of intending candidates should be lodged with the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, not later than September 26,



Interested clubs are informed that applications for permission to conduct 1956 Open Championships, that is Commonwealth, State and District titles, close with the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, on September 30. Written applications only. Applications should be written quite apart



from general Association business for the reason that same are dealt with by the Executive Committee during its October meeting. Which means that any correspondence on the point of championships for 1956 should have reference to the subject matter mentioned only. If included among general matter to the Association application is likely to be missed. It is an Executive Committee direction that only clubs making application for titles will be considered. In previous years titles have been allocated, in some cases, where no application had been lodged. In future this will not be done. No application means no consideration when the 1956 Allocation comes up for discussion. The full 1956 Championship Allocation will be published in the 1955 issue of November "News".

By the time this issue reaches readers the 1955 Annual Interstate Match will be well under way in the various States. Tasmania will lead off with the holding of the Tasmanian section of the match at the Tasmanian Section of the match at the Tasmanian Club's grounds at St. Leonards, just outside Launceston, on September 3. New South Wales and Victoria will shoot on the same day, i.e. September 17, when the Bathurst Club and Australian Club will supervise the sections for the States mentioned—although Bath-urst will hold the elimination shoot on the day previous, September 16. The three remaining States will field their teams over the week-end October 1 and 2, in accordance with advertising in this issue. Given fair conditions and normal shooting weather, the match promises to be most interesting and could be the most exciting since the start of the competition, which is actually State Team supremacy. All clubs conducting the contests should ensure that only registered shooters are permitted to take part.

A shooter recently mentioned to the Association that a club, outside Victoria, conducts all its championships on the regulation automatic trap, but that it then reverts to a plus trap for all club shooting. This action is indeed unusual and not the least to say peculiar. Why a club should use a plus trap in preference to an automatic is hard to understand. The automatic trap is the fairest means of releasing targets and should be used at all times in order to provide equity of competition. Whilst a plus trap is a useful stand-by in case of emergency, its functions are indeed limited when compared with the automatic releaser. Clubs are required, by Association direction, to use the automatic trap in championships and major events.

A club has averred that a number of its members maintained that club handicaps "are always 2 yards further back than Association marks". As an instance it was stated that a "shooter on 16 yards club handicap moves forward 2 yards when he competes in an event which

stipulates Association handicaps". There is no tie-up between club handicaps and Association marks, although many recommendations are based on club performances, other than that they bear no relation whatever. Association handicaps are based on performance, club recommendation and what is known of the particular shooter concerned by the Association officials. Some clubs do not co-operate fully with the Asso-ciation in forwarding results and recommendations, and this means that Association officials are compelled to take steps to handicap shooters as considered appropriate. When such action is taken, the whole matter is looked upon from an Australia-wide angle as a whole and not just as the marks would apply to the particular club.

Score sheets received from a club outside Victoria during the month just past revealed the sheets to be marked in a somewhat unusual and peculiar style. When a "kill" was gained by the shooter the score sheets showed the letter "K", whilst for a miss the sheets showed a small dash. This system is rather confusing and irregular. The easiest and simplest way to score is the figure "1" for a kill and "0" for a miss. Recording a "K" when a shooter breaks his target is a cumbersome method and is certainly not recommended by the Association. Score sheets should be marked in a uniform way and clubs in all States should see to it that their scorers are instructed in the correct way of scoring.

ASSOCIATION REFEREE EXAMINATION

The next Official Referee Examination will be held as from October 1, 1955. Candidates are requested to lodge names and full addresses with the Secretary, A.C.P.T.S.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, not later than SEP-TEMBER 26th, 1955. Only registered shooters who are members of an affiliated club are eligible.

Colin Ferguson, the champion West Australian shot and member of the Association Executive Committee, in a resume of activities in the Golden West, provides some interesting information on the sport in that

State. He writes, "When the sport first started over here some years ago, both the standard of gun and shooting was very poor. It has now improved out of all proportion and the standard is high and getting higher with each championship shoot. I think I can safely say that there are a number of shooters of Eastern States and World Standard who will be making their way over to the 1956 National Championships, and I will be very disappointed if we do not have a number in the 1956 International, so some of the boys over there (Eastern States) had better be on their toes if they are desirous of retaining their places. Among country towns in this State who are contemplating clubs are Kojonup (already formed), Narrogin, Mt. Barker, and Albany. Some few months ago the Perth Club purchased some very valuable land seven miles from the G.P.O., with the main (now International) Airport as a background. To start with, four traps are planned, night shooting, club building and everything that opens and shuts. As you know, we have been granted our first Commonwealth Championship, the 1955 Mixed Birds. This will be shot on Sunday, October 2. We would like to see a number of Eastern States shooters take part. I have no doubt that a number would think nothing of boarding a plane and coming over for the week-end. We have much to offer at this particular time. Our Royal Show, wildflowers (although a little early) are really beautiful, not

forgetting the two birds, Emu and Swan; there is nothing better brewed in the Southern Hemisphere. Visitors will not win a fortune, but they will win a mighty lot of good friends and, on behalf of the shooters of this State, we extend a very warm welcome to those who may consider the trip. Always look forward to re-ceiving 'News' and those shooters who have visited the East on various occasions get a big kick out of following the performances of the many good fellows they have had the pleasure of meeting. We consider the efforts by those concerned in trying to get one big club, is the best thing we have read for a long time and, for the benefit of shooting and shooters, we trust this will eventually come about. On behalf of the shooters in W.A. we thank 'News' for the publicity given us in the past and look forward to further publicity in the volumes to come."



wards the end of this last season his wards the end of this last season his shooting, suddenly and for no apparent reason, deteriorated. Up to recently he was doing very nicely—shooting as well as ever in spite of advancing years. Then he began to miss and he adds: "I made a fool of myself at our last shoot and I hardly feel like making a repetition of it (or taking the risk of doing so) again. What, if anything, do you advise me to do?"

As I see it, his case is one which is fairly common to many of us and it should not give any cause for undue depression. I rather think that he is a bit too conscious of the fact that he is no longer young in years, and is reaching the stage when he will place the blame for all his failures (little or big) on this matter. This is, if I may say so, a mistaken idea based on the belief that "anno domini" is bound to get the better of you after a certain age. This is a false notion which has been proved to be false over and over again. Because a man is slowed down a bit by increasing years, he has not necessarily got to shoot worse.

Shooting is a following which, above all, calls for experience. And in much of it experience is of greater practical use than extreme physical activity and fitness. Up to a point, anyway. The good shot knows where and how to stand, how to take his birds at the right point and with the minimum of effort. He may almost be compared to the seasoned boxer in the ring who makes his opponent do the "running around," reserving his energies for what really matters.

I doubt if this reader is really deteriorating. I suspect that he was just "off it" at the end of the season and there was no time left to make good again. There is, however, the chance that his eyesight may have changed in some way and it might be advisable for him to have this checked up. A relative of mine when checked up. A relative of mine, when

A shooter has complained that to- in the sixties, experienced rather similar trouble.

Circumstances, I suppose, alter cases, but I have lately been disappointed to find that one or two friends of my youth have now deserted the gun for the rod. One of them certainly was a good shot and might have become first-class. But now he is a fisherman almost exclusively. After a lapse of many years I met him and expected to hear all about the shooting he had done. But no—it was all about fishing. Much though I respect the followers of the contemplative art and much though I like fishing, I greatly prefer to shoot. A gun means far more to me than the best of far more to me than the best of rods - it always has done so and it always will.

Well, I believe that this is largely a matter of convenience. Facilities for shooting may remain unchanged, but a shooter's circumstances are these days continually altering and other habits are forced upon him. Then he finds that fishing is an ex-cellent sport and so he settles down to fish. Or of course the reverse may happen. What I do notice particularly is that when a man goes over to fishing in middle life, he seldom returns. But I do know that much of


