The Editor's Notebook



Enquiries from New Zealand indicate that quite a number of New Zealand shooters will be present in Melbourne for the Olympic Games, both for the shooting events and the general Olympic programme. The programme arranged by the Association of the Southern Hemisphere Championship and the World Grand Handicap will cater in goodly measure for visitors who are not actually representing their home country in the Games shooting. The two events mentioned will be held on the Friday and Saturday following the Games shooting. Actual dates will be announced later. Again all interested are reminded to ensure that they have adequate accommodation arranged for the period of the Games.

The rules governing the issue of break badges still appears to be obscure, according to the correspondence received at Association headquarters. Firstly, a number of clubs merely make the brief announcement that such and such a shooter has gained a break, or they recommend so and so for a break badge. No sheets are forwarded in confirmation, which means that the Association has to write back to the club requesting the score sheets and other details. All this takes up much time that could be more usefully employed. Then again some clubs send in score sheets which are almost unreadable. This causes confusion which could be easily avoided. The score sheets should be submitted in proper se-

quence with the shooter's name for whom the break badge is claimed, and his score clearly underlined in either red or blue pencil. This course should be followed through each event which concerns the break. By following this action Association officials have little difficulty in picking up and checking off the break. Clubs should note this for future action. Recently (on more than one occasion) break badges have been claimed incorrectly. By this it is meant that badges have been claimed for shooters who are not eligible for break recognition. For instance, several claims have recently been lodged where breaks have been compiled in 16-vard events. whereas the shooter's actual Association mark is further back than 16 yards. It should be clearly understood that break badges are only issued when the shooter records the break "on or behind his Association handicap".

Probably the most glaring case of incorrect procedure recently took place when a club "recommended" a break for a shooter who was not even registered and never had been! This claim got no consideration whatever.

Possibly due to changes in club officials, the question of colours to be used when sashes are being ordered has come up again. For the information of all not conversant with sash ordering, it is pointed out that the official sash makers to the A.C.P.T.S.A. are Messrs. W. Flattely & Son Pty. Ltd., 301 Lonsdale Place, Melbourne, C.1. Colours to be used are: for a Commonwealth championship, royal or navy blue; State championship, red or maroon; District championship, white. Clubs desiring to present sashes for club titles are permitted to use any other colour available, apart from blue, red and white.

The question of approval of open shoots is again under notice. In recent months it has been observed that some clubs have merely "decided" that they will shoot on such and such an occasion and have promptly advertised open shoots on holidays and other occasions without first obtaining Association approval. For the information of all clubs and shooters concerned, it is pointed out

that the Association controls "all holidays and open fixtures" and therefore, before any decision is reached by the clubs interested in shooting events on public holidays, approval should be obtained from the Association. The Association does not wish to be dictatorial in controlling the events and dates stated, but it is emphasised that it is of the utmost importance, in order to avoid clashing of major events and dates, that the Association have a controlling influence on the allocation of major dates and events. The Association headquarters should be advised at all times when a shoot is contemplated on a public holiday, even if the shoot is only a local club affair. Of particular importance, too, is the fact that Association handicaps are required to be used on all "open" days, even if the fixture is a club one only. Only by observance of the closest cooperation with the Association can clubs expect to be rewarded with sound administration.

Hope your boys shot real winning scores at your new location in March. I have a good friend named Don Blow, who lives at Calgary, Alberta, Canada. Had a long talk with him about your International shoot, You will probably be hearing from the Canadians in the near future. Don is a real top-notch shot.

We have just had our Inland Empire Championship Tournament. For a change we had very nice weather. Scores, on the whole, were good. We had 270 shooters using 12 traps. Vera Holdsworth, who resides in Calgary, Canada, did a real job on those 16-yard targets; she topped the field. A 196 was next to her, 198/200-two targets ahead of all the boys and her last 150 straight. She would make a good member of the Canadian team!

The following is a clipping from our paper here;-

"Mrs. Vera Holdsworth, young mother of two from Calgary, Alta., turned in the top score in the Spokane Gun Club's 45th Inland Empire handicap trapshoot tournament.

Mrs. Holdsworth, a member of the 1954 all-Canada trapshoot team, shot 98-100-198 to win class C and outshoot all the men in the field of more than 100 top North-west scattergunners.

Nearest to Mrs. Holdsworth for the day were the two class AA leaders, E. C. Morlan, S.G.C., and Orley Milligan of Portland, who tied with 196s. Milligan's total came on a pair of 98s. while Morlan had 96-100. Morlan won the shoot-off for the trophy with 48 x 50.

The class A championship ended in a three-way tie between Ralph Doerschlag, Sprague; Earl Swift, Lamont, and Delmer White, Almira, at 192, with Swift winning the shoot-off at 49 x 50.

In class B Russ Edgett of Spokane won with a 99-96-195, followed by Wayne Garrett, Wenatchee, and Marvin Hergert, Endicott, at 193.

Ed Humphrey of Colfax edged Dallas Cox, mayor of Hay, Wash.,

188 to 187, for honours in class D. Axel Kludt of Kamiah was third at 185.

In the doubles Morlan was high overall with a 96 for the class B title trophy. Class A went to Stan Brock, Walla Walla, at 90. Waino Heiskari, Orofino; Lew Simonsen, Edmunds, and Delmer White tied for first in class C with 77s.

The shoot-off in class C was won by Heiskari in the windy rain, with $15 \ge 25$.

Mrs. Holdsworth 198 included a string of 150 straight, the best showing of any woman shooter in recent years at the Spokane Gun Club. She will receive, in addition to her winnings, a 100-straight pin from the S.G.C. and a shoulder patch for the 150 string from an arms company.

Careless use of firearms has again been under notice from the number of gun accidents reported in the daily press. Too much emphasis on the careful use of guns and rifles cannot be stressed. Every shooter must be danger conscious

and alive to the fact that a gun of any type is a very deadly weapon. Members of gun clubs should take stock of their rules occasionally and make sure that the fundamental rules of safety are not being "taken for granted". It is very easy to slip into a "don't care" attitude. The sport of clay pigeon shooting cannot afford to have an accident.

Just prior to the 1939 war a club in southern New South Wales experimented with new targets by using large flying black beetles through the club traps. The beetles won the day. It was found that their quick, jerky and unpredictable movement made them a most elusive target. Furthermore, in most cases the beetle disappeared from the shooter's line of vision in double quick time. An American report now has it that there is a sport now in vogue in certain parts of the U.S.A. called Hopper Down. The report continues that it is a game invented for young shots. The weapon used is a .22 shotgun and the targets are flying grasshoppers, which are said to be hard to kill because many of them have been known to carry "considerable lead". The new game is not without its dangers, for besides the harmless grasshoppers, flying beetles and praying mantises, the tyro must reckon with the more kill-or-be-stung insects like the hornet and the wasp. One American writer goes so far as to state that the hoppers are quite palatable. He must be confusing

Longreach Club (Queensland) will shoot the Central Queensland singlebarrel championship on U.S.A. Independence Day, July 4. Mrs. F. Whip, "Amor Downs", Longreach, is secretary of the Longreach Club.

A shooter from a northern area, writing recently to the Association, mentioned that, "As a shooter I wish to congratulate you and your Committee on the very enjoyable shoot you provided for us at Bankstown." It is pleasing to have such a comment after the many complaints regarding the appalling weather which competitors were compelled to put up with during the series.

Many letters having connection with the administrative section of the forthcoming Olympic Games have been received in recent months by the Association. Quite a number of these letters have no reference to shooting whatever. The Association is conducting the "clay target shooting events" only and it has already laid down and advertised details in the literary sections of this publication. Additional advertising will appear from now on outlining in full all information available that has reference to the Olympic Games. It is intended also to arrange for advertising in leading American and English journals which publicise clay pigeon shooting.

Recently in Victoria a club conducted an open "Association" championship which had not been allocated to it, and to make matters worse, an official Association referee was in charge of the fixture. The Association has since received a flood of unsigned letters advising of the shoot and also advising that clubs acting in this way should not be granted renewal of registration. For those "unknown" correspondents and all concerned it is advised that the shoot was completely unauthorised, as was the holding of the "championship". The last-named event has been expunged from the records and the club warned not to repeat the performance.

Bisley Gun Club (England) conducted a 100-bird trial shoot on Sunday, April 15, for those shooters who have noninated for a possible place in Great Britain's Olympic Team of 1956 to compete in Melbourne. No result of the 100 birder is available at moment of writing.

The Executive Committee of the English Clay Pigeon Shooting Association has decided that only those competitors who "shot over at least 500 birds down-the-line in Association events and other major competitions, excluding skeet, shall be considered for a possible place in the team of 30 to represent England at the International Tournament at Cardiff (Wales) at end of June." In addition they must have shot over 300 down-the-line birds by May 31, 1956, at similar club shoots, and also shot over the 200 birds at the English Open Down - the - line Championship at Harrogate on June 1 and 2, 1956.

An appeal letter signed by Lord Burghley and Lt.-General Sir Frederick Browning as Joint Chairmen of the British Olympic Appeals Committee, and by Lord Rupert Nevill, President of the Clay Pigeon Association, has been sent to all affiliated clubs in the Great Britain Associations, together with a donation form. All shooters in Britain have been asked to support the appeal with their donations.

The programme details of shooting arranged by the A.C.P.T.S.A. immediately following the games, appears in the advertising section of this issue. The dates arranged are, as yet, not quite definite, but will probably be fixed for December 6, 7, 8, 1956. As will be noted, the series has been given plenty of thought by the Executive Committee and the

Main items are, of course, the Southern Hemisphere Championship over 200 targets, and the World Grand Handicap over a similar complement of releases. More details will be available as the date of the Olympic Games draws nearer. Meanwhile present advertising should be regarded as preliminary advertising only.

Reports from London indicate that Spencer Colliver, the well - known West Australian shooter, is enjoying a feast of new experiences on his trip of the Continent. Feet and Footwear

Feet are, to my mind, most important to the outdoor man, no matter if he be a hiker, shooting man, or hillclimber. For to have sore or tender feet can be a major calamity, making foot-travel agony and ruining any outing he has been looking forward to, or any holiday he has planned. But by the exercising of certain small precautions with our feet, comfort can be assured.

First, the feet themselves. While on the trip you should change your socks daily and wash your feet each evening. If you have a sedentary job, and early on in your holiday your feet, through this unaccustomed usage, feel sore, you should dust them, and your socks, with foot powder. Make sure that your socks, which should be of wool, are well-fitting and have no rough seams, or lumpy darns. Wool socks are easily washed in warm water and soap, but they take time to dry. Remember to rinse them well, so as not to leave undissolved soap in the weave.

Now the boots or shoes. When walking for any distance over rough ground, your feet swell a little. Room must be left to allow for this and also a medium-thick woollen sock. If, therefore, your normal town shoe has been fitted over fine cotton or nylon mixture hose, you should purchase your outdoor walking footwear one full size longer and wider for comfort.

After buying your boots you must break them in. The usual way is to wear them for short periods of walking until they stretch to suit your own feet. My father once told me how the soldiers in the 1914-18 war ensured a comfortable fitting boot. They put them on, laced them tightly, then stood in four or five inches of water for half an hour. Then they marched about until the boots dried on their feet. I have broken in three pairs of boots that way and all have been very comfortable. So far, I have not taken a cold, but that is a very real risk one has to take.

When shoes are muddy they should be washed and then allowed to dry slowly in the air. Artificial heat rapidly dries out the natural oils in the hide and causes it to shrink, stiffen, and possibly crack. Newspaper stuffed inside a wet shoe will help to dry it. After they are well dry, the boots should be well greased or oiled with a reliable proprietory preparation or Neats Foot Oil. Do not treat them too often, or they will become soft and then lacking in foot support. This greasing is a job best done in a temperate room with the boot slightly warmed to assist the penetration of the oil.

Leather shoes cannot be made entirely water-proof. They may be so when they are new, but in use the seams work and under immersion some water will come through. If you must have completely waterproof footwear, rubber is your material. But it cannot breathe as leather does, so your feet tend to be hot in summer and in the winter they are cold, as condensation cannot escape, so making the foot damp and chilled. Do not treat rubber with any oil or grease.

On the weight of footwear, opinions vary greatly. Some like very heavy shoes and others light. The main variable weight in a shoe is in the sole, so therefore any preference for a certain weight may have to be modified if it has to stand long, hard use without a break for repair. But for normal wear in this country, where repairs can take place as needed, I like a boot of only sufficient weight so that every stone and pebble cannot be felt through the sole and built rigidly enough to give good foot support. I do not like a too heavy boot, as I feel that lifting the extra few ounces on each foot up and forward over 2,000 times in every mile of a day's tramp must add up to quite a load and increase normal walking fatigue.

One word of warning with regard to the purchase of boots. Except for use over very wet, boggy ground do not wear boots too high in the leg. Too much length in the ankle makes them form a wrinkle which bears down at the top of the heel and very (CONT, AT FOOT OF NEXT PAGE.)

Duck's Unlimited

The 19th annual meeting of Ducks Unlimited, Inc., the nation's foremost migratory waterfowl conservation organisation, was held in Kansas City, Mo., on April 6 and 7. In addition to the members of the Ducks Unlimited Board of Trustees in the United States, Directors of its Canadian affiliate — DU (Canada) were also on hand for the meeting of the organisation, at the Hotel Muehlebach.

Outstanding leaders in business and finance, all of them prominent sportsmen and conservationists who serve on the DU Board of Trustees without pay, and who defray their own expenses to attend the meeting, were at the meeting this year. Practically every state in the union was represented by the Trustees and State Chairmen, and these wildfowlers maintain a keen interest not only in the sport of wildfowling, but conservation in general in their respective localities.

Almost \$5,000,000 has been spent by American sportsmen through Ducks Unlimited during the past eighteen years for the actual work of restoring the duck-breeding grounds in the prairie provinces of Canada, and the spectacular flights of wildfowl during the past season was mute testimony of the success of DU's work on the breeding grounds. Federal funds cannot be spent for such purposes outside the nation's borders. Handful? I'll say they are! There were no George Biggs when I learned to shoot half a century back. My lesson was pointing straight at a crossing rabbit, with my right foot slipping into a depression which caused my gun to swing with the bunny and 5 ft. past. To my amazement, the bunny dropped dead. I had learned the fundamental rule of shooting at a moving object the hard way. and there were no more empty bags after that, and so it is with many who take up this sport. They learn the hard way, groping their way along until a similar incident occurs when they find out just where to place that shot. In some cases the incident referred to does not occur and the shooter makes little headway and another potential shooter is lost to the sport.
