The Editor's Notebook



Something more than can be described as a "mile-stone of progress" passes with the publication of the present issue of "A.C.P.S. NEWS". The publication is indicative of the start of a new decade of service to shooters in the fact that the September issue closed the first ten-year period of publication. The initial issue of "News" was published in October, 1947.

Those present at the Executive Committee meeting on 25/7/47, which decided upon the production of a monthly journal, were: Messrs. J. M. Wilson, President (in chair), G. L. Bragg (N.S.W.), V. L. Fankhauser, the late G. H. Watts, J. Bryant Senr., J. O. Cox (N.S.W.), A. F. (Aub.) Johnson and Dick Wightman, and the Association secretary, W. McCullough. The motion to bring about the production was moved by J. O. Cox, and was "that an Association monthly bulletin (similar to the sample blanks submitted) be published." This was seconded by Mr. Bryant. A long discussion took place as to the method of distribution. Ultimately it was decided to make the "bulletin" a free issue to every registered shooter, the first publication to be in Oct., 1947.

The official 1958 Open Championship Allocation is published in this issue. The Allocation was completed by the Executive Committee at its recent meeting in Melbourne. All clubs are informed that the list as published is the "official list" and

should be accepted as such by all concerned. No additional individual advice to clubs regarding the championship allocation for next year will be forwarded.

Clubs and others advertising in this journal are reminded that there will be no publication during the month of January, due to the printer's vacation period. Therefore, all advertising pertaining to the month of January should be included in the December issue. The December issue will appear on or about December 1.

A club recently wrote to the Association, complaining that the governing body had approved of an "open" championship series on its "club shooting date". Both clubs, it appears, are situated within easy travelling distance of the other. The Association, whilst endeavouring at all times to co-operate with clubs in every way, cannot be held responsible for allocating an open shooting date on another's "club" day. The Association allocates only for open events and, providing there is no likelihood of a clash of open events on the day asked for, the Association accordingly approves of the date sought. It is advisable for clubs to take particular note of shooting dates on which other clubs are operating before applying for any specified day. The Association may not always be completely conversant with the actual

geographical lay-out of a town or village and it is quite a simple matter to unwittingly approve of a day which may be unsuitable to another club. It is always difficult to arrange completely free dates for clubs once the football season is over, or just about over. So many clubs immediately begin clammering for dates so that it is frequently impossible to arrange a date on which some club or another is not shooting.

A habit of certain shooters (it happens in most clubs), which has been noted with disapproval, is the spectacle of a shooter, other than the actual competitor, standing behind the competitor, and if the latter misses, the shooter standing at the rear blazes away and frequently breaks the target on the first barrel. To begin with, this action is unsportsmanlike. On many occasions the shooter who misses is a front-marker battling to break a few targets. With the feeling of a better shot waiting at the rear or side to "blast all missed targets", the front-marker or novice quickly loses confidence and his appearance in the event becomes merely a token affair. A competitor is entitled to his rights, even if he misses the target. The competitor has "bought" the bird by virtue of his entry in the event and it remains his even if unbroken. No other individual has any right whatever to "take" a target to which he has no entitlement. Another foolish habit, not so frequently engaged in as the first-mentioned, is the spectacle of five or six shooters lined up and all calling for the bird together. When the target appears, five or six guns fire together. Not one of the five or six knows who broke it and the action serves no useful purpose. Both actions call for attention of club managements and clubs should not hesitate to stamp them out. Many front-markers and novices would thank clubs if these questions are taken in hand.

A country shooter has written the Association and tossed up a few "curly" queries and requested that

same be answered through "News". No. 1: "A shooter comes to our club, wins the main event and is put back 1 yard. He claims he can go to any other club or to his own club and shoot off his Association mark. Say his handicap in the 'News' is 20 yards, we pull him back 1 yard, can he go back to 20 yards at other clubs?" The questioner is apparently not conversant with the regulations governing movement of shooters. If the club in question decides to handicap a shooter who is apparently obviously under-handicapped, this information should be immediately forwarded to the Association (within three days) and the reason for the movement given. The Association officials, providing same is accepted as being a reasonable movement, then adjust the shooter's handicap and the alteration appears in the next issue of "News". It is quite useless to "pull" a shooter and then take no further action and not advise the Association. Such shooter could go on indefinitely without the Association being aware that his mark has been adjusted.

No. 2: "Does the two-division handicap apply to five-bird eye-openers and sweepstakes or only to main events?" The question is not fully explained and no answer can therefore be given. The writer should outline what he means by "a two-division handicap".

No. 3: "Who do the clays, at the end of a day's shoot, belong to, that is those that have been fired at? Some clubs gather them up and use them again. The shooters have paid for them, and I think they should be allowed to pick them up for practice. Am I right or wrong?" This is certainly a "curly" one and a question that has never previously arisen. The shooter certainly pays for his targets and they are released to him in competition. How a shooter could possibly say, at the end of a shoot, which targets were his, and which belonged to someone else, is beyond comprehension. Many clubs do pick up unbroken targets and use them again, and it is generally accepted that any proceeds from such action goes to club funds. The question is bordering on being unanswerable.

"Tips and Tails"



Another report is to hand where in a Western Australian wild duck is believed to have established an Australian record for duck movement. The bird, a grey teal, was banded at the Western Australian Fisheries Department research station

near Dandaragan in January of this year. It recently fell to the guns of hunters in North Queensland. The distance between the station and the point of recovery is over 2,100 miles in a straight line.

Mention of wild duck recalls that the Townsville Club advises that the season in its sector for wild-duck shooting is just finishing; in fact, it closed on September 14. The season of three and a half months has been a particularly good one in the north and practically all members of the Townsville Club who have journeyed out after the birds enjoyed limit bags at each outing. In its return to clay pigeon shooting the Townsville Club advertises a two-day programme for Saturday, November 23, and Sunday, November 24, in this issue. On the opening day shooting will commence at 1 p.m., when the Queensland Skeet Championship is main event. A 9.15 a.m. start has been arranged for Sunday, 24th. The Queensland Mixed Birds at clay sparrows, a £50 Handicap and the North Queensland Double-barrel Championship make up the major items in a very entertaining programme. Everyone knows that the ordinary black crow has few friends. In a recent discussion mention was made of the native cunning displayed by the crow at all times. As an example, how many have noticed or watched a crow approaching an item he has designed to investigate? When approaching such an object the crow will give a sharp look and then whack the object with his bill and immediately jump back. This is a queer jump backwards and one that has probably been unnoticed unless taking particular observation. Why does the crow do this? The act has some protective purpose.

Frequently discussion takes place on the question of the "master eye" when shooting. An English report states that one shooter found that a black disc placed over the left eye enabled the shooter to "kill" every high bird. The report concludes that an elderly shooter, when asked whether he fired with both eyes open or right or left open, answered, "Generally with both eyes shut!"

The fiercest animal known is not the lion, tiger or leopard, but the tiny shrew. It will attack and devour almost any animal up to twice its size and eat its own weight in meat every three hours.

With the approach of the warmer summer months, it is well to take account of the possibilities of snake bite. Everyone who ventures in likely snake country should go prepared for all eventualities. A snake-bite outfit is a "must" with all gear. Mention of snakes recalls that reptiles almost literally walk on the ends of their ribs. The ribs are attached to broad, special scales on the under side of the body. Through a forward and backward motion of the ribs, these scales move the snake along the ground.

Tiny cannibalistic spiders that live by eating each other are said to be the world's highest land animals. They have been found at heights of 22,000 and 23,000 feet on Mount Everest. All plant life ceases 4,000 feet below that height.

Geelong Gun Club on Corio Bay (V.) will shoot the Commonwealth Night Mixed Birds Championship at Geelong on Friday night, November

Another story of a much travelled duck is to hand. The report indicates that a grey teal was banded at Yathroo Station in the Dandaragan district of Western Australia (about 90 miles north of Perth) on January 12, 1957, and the bird was shot 20 miles north-west of Ayr in North Queensland. The distance in a direct line between the banding station and the point of recovery is over 2,100 miles. Another teal banded by the C.S.I.R.O. at Darwin was shot at Meekatharra only 12 days later. Another bird banded at Mildura (V.) was later shot at Darwin (N.T.).

Robinvale Club, on the Murray River not far from Mildura, will shoot on Saturday, November 9, when the Murray Valley Single-barrel title will be the principal event on a well-arranged programme. 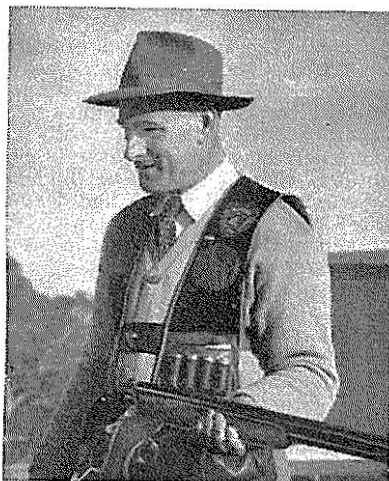

1957 Grand American Handicap

C. R. Crawford, a Chicago businessman, won the 1957 Grand American Handicap at the annual A.T.A. fixture at Vandalia, Ohio, U.S.A., a month or two ago. Crawford stopped 123/125 before gaining the honours. Over the scheduled 100 targets Crawford shot from the 22-yard line. In the shoot-off for the title Crawford outstayed Don Renbarger (Topeka), 98 (tie shoot 20); Harvey H. Blair (Wichita, Kan.), 98 (22), and Cecil Mitch (Lowell, Ind.), 98 (19). Crawford's total was 98 (tie shoot 25). Crawford, although a prominent trapshot for many years, favours the pastime of skin diving as his No. 1 hobby. He is very fond of taking under-water pictures.

Trapshots (seemingly the same in Australia) have plenty of alibis when it comes to discussing their performances. For instance, remarks heard after the event run on these lines, "Did you see that target I dropped wobbling?", "A chip fell out of that target as big as a silver dollar, and the scorer didn't see it", "Those jets flying over made me flinch", "A sweatbee stung me just as I squeezed the trigger", "I wouldn't have missed that target with my re-loads"—these are just a few of the complaints heard.

Vandalia's A.T.A. grounds are well known for plenty of "lead slinging", but few realise that the place is a veritable lead mine. A special machine accomplishes the task of recovering the shot—sometimes concentrated heavily enough to weigh up to two pounds per square foot. After the recent Grand American series eight tons of shot was "mined" from the site and it is expected to finally yield up to 30 tons.

The entry for this year's Grand was 2143, seven above last year's all-time high of 2136. Attendance also topped all previous totals.

The "one-man show" trick shot, Herb Parsons, was a prominent visitor. This man uses no less than 16 guns, ranging from .22 rifles to shotguns, to a .358 big-game rifle to do stunts that leave spectators awed. His array of targets, from spent

.22 cartridges to a handful of clay pigeons, were supplemented by heads of cabbage and lettuce, potatoes, eggs and grapefruit, as well as coins. He promptly made "salad" of the lot. Parsons lays claim to being the "greatest trick shot in the world".

—::—

WILDFOWL IN CANADA

Broods are "popping out all over" according to "The Duckological" of Ducks Unlimited (Canada). This applies to duck and geese in all three provinces. Indications are that a good first hatch, comparable to that of 1952, is coming off. Systematic brood counts will be made later, but right now, with a flying start, mallard and pintail—the earliest nesters—are showing up with hefty broods in daily increasing numbers. The early start—one to two weeks earlier than last year—has helped the birds in many districts to beat the destructive agricultural summer fallowing. In the Strathmore district of southern Alberta, the incubating pintail got a break for a reason new to our experience. The dry weather delayed the sprouting of wild oats, so the farmers held off cultivating until the wild oats were up and could be destroyed. This was a real break for the pintail, which are prone to nest in the stubble much more so than the canny mallard.

Surface water conditions have continued to deteriorate in the southern sections of all three provinces, but the birds largely by-passed the dangerous areas to concentrate in the safer, well-watered central and parkland areas. Scattered throughout the dried-up areas are permanent lakes, rivers and man-made impoundments, including the irrigation districts, and nearly 200 D.U. projects which were designed and located to meet the onset of drought. They are heavily populated with breeding duck and are paying fine dividends.

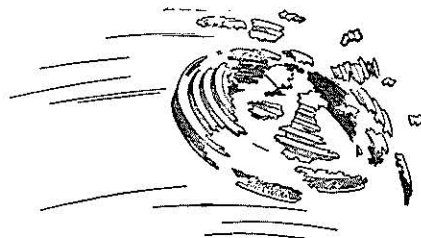

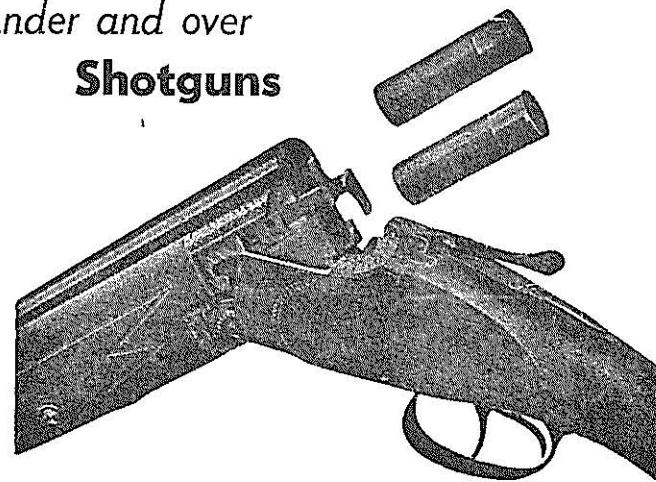
