These shells are all specially loaded and tested by the Company for the A.C.T.A., and it could be said without fear of contradiction that the shells mentioned are without equal in their class anywhere in the world. Altogether the Company does much to assist in the smooth running of the big shoot, and the warmest thanks are extended to I.C.I.A.N.Z. Ltd. for the splendid support at all times given to every section of the shoot.

NEW ASSOCIATION PRESI-DENT. At the recent annual meeting of the A.C.T.A., held on March 12, Mr. John M. Tyquin of Coogee (Sydney) was elected President of the A.C.T.A. for the ensuing year. He succeeds Mr. John Houston of Hay (N.S.W.), who had held the office for some four years. Mr. Tyquin is a supporter of the sport of clay target shooting extending over very many years. In fact, he was one of the competitors at the 1939 Champion of Champions Cup fixture at Bentleigh when the first International Match was shot. A one-time President of the Hobart Club, where he lived prior to being transferred in his business activities to Brisbane, he did much to sponsor the firm establishment of the Hobart Club. Later, after settling in Brisbane, it was not long before he was appointed President of the now well-conducted Brisbane Gun Club. As will be observed, Mr. Tyouin has a wide background of clay target shooting administration and his experience should be in-valuable to the A.C.T.A. The thanks of all are extended to Mr. Houston for his services to the A.C.T.A. as its President for four years.

25th ANNUAL MEETING OF THE A.C.T.A. The 25th Annual Meeting of affiliated club delegates of the A.C.T.A. took place on Sunday, March 12, 1961, at Scott's Hotel, 444 Collins Street, Melbourne, commencing at 10.30 a.m. The President, Mr. J. Houston, was in the chair, and much business applicable to the sport of clay target shooting and the A.C.T.A. was discussed. There was a large attendance of delegates.

Prior to the opening of the annual meeting the Executive Committee held a meeting starting at 9.30 a.m. Many matters were finalized.

Rule 52. All are now informed that RULE 52 has been deleted as from March 12, and all subsequently numbered Rules, following No. 51, are therefore changed to the number previously preceding. The total number of Rules is now 99 and not 100 as published previously. The Executive Committee deleted Rule 52 after much deliberation. The original Rule was included specifically and was not an oversight as had been mentioned.

Rule 31. Rule 31, which up to the present has read as published in the January/February "News", has now been altered 'and should now read: "Rule No. 31. 'No target' shall be declared when a trap is sprung at a material interval of time before or after the call of 'Pull'." The remainder of Rule as previously published has been deleted entirely.

Captain of Australian Team to New Zealand. Mr. D. B. Mott was appointed Captain of the Australian Team to visit New Zealand. The Australian Team to shoot against New Zealand at Hamilton, N.Z., to be selected on the six best scores in an event to be nominated by the Australian Team Captain.

Advertising of Programmes. Clubs were instructed, when advertising money programmes, that they should clearly advertise the distribution of any money prizes.

Auditor. Mr. K. D. Courtney of Temple Court, Melbourne, was reappointed auditor to the Association.

Incorporation of the A.C.T.A. The Association solicitor, Mr. J. D. Muir, attended the meeting at the request of the Executive Committee and addressed the meeting at length. Mr. Muir pointed out the advantages of incorporation and strongly recommended that the A.C.T.A. become a corporate body without undue delay. Many delegates asked questions of Mr. Muir, who explained details to the satisfaction of all. The meeting agreed to advise the Executive Committee to proceed with incorporation details.

Registration Fee. Recommendation by the Executive Committee that shooters' registration fee be increased by 10/- to 30/- per annum. Many speakers spoke both for and against the proposal. It was pointed out that it was many years since an increase had been granted, yet expenses had more than quadrupled since the fee was established at £1 per annum. A two-thirds majority was necessary for the recommendation to be accepted. This was not forthcoming and the motion was lost.

A motion from Camberwell Club that "all referees registered by the A.C.T.A. and all secretaries of affiliated clubs be supplied with all the latest alterations or amendments to the existing Rules of the A.C.T.A. within 30 days of each alteration or amendment that the Executive Committee make from time to time", was lost after brief discussion. It was pointed out that any alterations or amendments to Rules are published in "News" in the first available issue of "News" following the adoption of same.

A motion from the Cobar Club, "That all clubs running money events with a nomination of fifty ( $\pounds$ 50) or more return at least fifty per cent. (50%) of the gross nominations to the winning shooters, to be divided 60%, 30%, 10%", was briefly discussed. On being put to the meeting, the motion was lost.

Hon. Life Vice - President. Mr. W. E. H. Rainbird of Launceston (Tasmania) was unanimously elected a Life Vice-President of the A.C.T.A. Mr. Rainbird's appointment was warmly received and he feelingly responded.

The former Hon. Vice - Presidents were re-elected.

### A.C.T.A. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

The annual A.C.T.A. National Championships and International fixture was staged this year on the grounds of the Melbourne Gun Club at Tottenham (Victoria). This splendidly appointed club and lay-out lent itself admirably to such a big occasion and everyone considered that the shoot was the smoothest and most satisfactory ever conducted by the A.C.T.A.

The series proved truly National and International, just on 300 competitors taking part over the four days. Entries were received from shooters in every State in the Commonwealth of Australia, as well as New Zealand and also New Guinea.

Proceedings opened on the morning of Friday, March 10, when the National Single-barrel Championship was the inaugural event on the programme of four days' competition shooting. For a "working day" this event drew the good entry of 160 a most satisfactory field. As is usual in single - barrel competition, the tie shoot did not take very long to dispose of, with the winner coming out in J. Newton Thomas of I.C.I. Ltd., with a score of 54/55, then followed W. Rodda (Melbourne) 53/ 55, G. Gilfillan (Berry, N.S.W.) 48/ 50, M. Burgess (Cobar, N.S.W.) 51/ 55, Wing-Cdr. Roy Ayre (William-town, N.S.W.) 50/55, H. Belmore (Coburg) 46/50, Don Glover (Essen-(Coburg) 46/50, Don Glover (Essendon, V.) 43/45, E. Cripps (Foster, V.) 43/45, Doug Cumming (Perth, W.A.) 43/45, D. Kimber (Adelaide, S.A.) 43/45, K. Soames (Bathurst, N.S.W.) 43/45, M. Fuller (Sydney) 43/45, K. Mules (Adelaide) 52/55, D. Mayfield (Cavendish, V.) 52/55, K. Paterson (Footscray, V.) 52/55. The yardage awards went: 12/16, L. Witzerman (Hobart, Tas.) 35/40; 17 yards, W. Williamson (Apsley, V.) and F. L. Brown (Warragul, V.) div.; 18 yards, G. Sharrock (Bessiediv.; 18 yards, G. Sharrock (Desse belle, V.); 19 yards, W. Henwood and J. Philiphoff (Perth, W.A.) div.; 20 yards and over, C. Mudford. The State prizes were won: Queensland, div. Sep Stewart (Cunnamulla) and J. Smith (Brisbane); New South Wales, div. N. Singleton (Cobar) and G. H. Bell (Young, N.S.W.); Tasmania, Jack Blake (Cressy, Tas.); South Australia, W. A. Commons (Adelaide). A £100 Handicap concluded the day's proceedings, and this was cut by A. Miller (Apsley, V.), G. A. Smith (Hobart, Tas.), G. Sim (Dookie, V.), H. Weitzel (Northcote, V.), R. Andrews (Keysborough, V.), M. Cripps (Port Franklin, V.), F. Shearer (Reservoir, V.), and G. Gilfillan (Berry, N.S.W.).

The really big day of the series was the National Double - barrel Championship at 60 targets from 16 yards. This event had the added attraction of the first 30 top scorers attraction of the first 30 top scorers going into the Australian Inter-national Team to represent their country on the following Monday. The event, as usual, drew the biggest field of the whole programme, 228 — 24 off the record total established at East Burwood in 1952. This was an excellent entry toking into account excellent entry, taking into account the mild business depression and credit squeezes and other impedimenta to sporting events which now exist. Over the scheduled course of 60 targets, 12 shooters returned possible scores of 60 straight. The tie shoot went to the 110th round before a winner was obtained. The winner, Warren Charlton of Wentworthville (Sydney) carded the only unbroken score of 110 straight and was loudly cheered on his win. Charlton has only been shooting a little over 12 months. Commencing as a 12 yarder, he has worked his way back until he is now on 23 yards. In his own words, "he wishes he was on 27", so keen is he to achieve proficiency at the sport of his choosing. Former Cobar shooter, Doug Osborne, who also now resides in Sydney, was runner-up, 114/115, missing only his 42nd target in the shoot-off. Doug Smith of Charleville (Q.), the 1960 International high-gun for Australia, followed with 113/115. Jack Headon of Hay (N.S.W.) was fourth, 109/ 110. W. Robertson of Coburg next, 108/110, then followed G. D. Thomas (Finley, N.S.W.) 84/85, G. H. Bell (Young, N.S.W.) 75/75, Murray Cripps (Port Franklin, V.) 74/75, A. F. Burns (Footscray, V.) 69/70, I. Holt (Colac, V.) 69/70, W. R.



Millard (Tyrendarra, V.) 69/70, Wing-Cdr. Roy Ayre (Williamtown, N.S.W.) 64/65, with Don Glover, D. Kimber (S.A.) and R. Siede (Cheltenham, V.) in the remaining places. The yardage awards went: 12/16, A. Calandro (Shepparton, V.); 17 yards, div. A. Williamson (V.), A. J. Sheather (Junee, N.S.W.), A. Paddy (New Zealand); 18 yards, W. Abbott (Werribee, V.); 19 yards, D. Taylor (Tas.); 20 yards and over, div. R. Hering (V.) and Fred Shearer (V.). The Ladies' Trophy provided a shootoff between Mrs. V. Jones of Coburg and Mrs. Gary Daly of Deniliquin, with the latter running out top on the 65th round. State prizes went: Queensland, G. Smith; New South Wales, div. A. R. Jamieson (Corowa) and Ron Headon (Hay); Tasmania, div. P. Marshall (Bridgewater) and R. Ward (Dulverton); South Australia, Peter Sheridan (Robe); Western Australia, D. W. Cumming. The Club Teams' Championship was won by the Australian Club Team, comprising Frank Johnson (the official photographer at the shoot), E. G. Biggs, I. Porter and R. Siede. This team aggregated 156/160.

The third day, Monday, March 13, opened with a strong northerly blowing just across the track from the left. The International Team had decided to shoot on No. 4 trap, but in view of the strong wind, moved over to No. 1 trap. The Team faced up to a most difficult marathon of shooting 100 targets per man, and with the elements against them, the aggregate score proved not to be as good as was expected. Both Jack Headon of Hay and Doug Kimber of Adelaide returned scores of 294 points out of 300 - excellent shooting in the conditions. Headon also had the remarkable performance of shooting his 100 straight. Kimber used fewer second barrels than Headon and he also recorded a miss on his 89th target. Without the miss Kimber's points aggregate would have given him the clear high-gun honour. Headon and Kimber then faced up to another 10 rounds to decide top individual honours. Kimber used a second on his third target in the tie shoot and the high-gun deservedly went to Headon, 324/330 points; Kimber, 323/330. The Commonwealth Team Match, four men

In a tie shoot with Don Scowcroft (Sydney) and Doug Smith (Q.), Burns shot right up to his form and won 28/30 pairs from Smith 26/30 and Scowcroft 21/25. The other

One of our present club members, Don Campbell, and myself used to do a lot of bush and range shooting in our youth. One day we were out with a horse and sulky after ducks (before the days of the motor car); Don had a double-barrel "Diamond" hammer gun and I an American single, A. Hopkins and Allen (never heard of one before or since). We had got five ducks each, and driving home in the late afternoon, I was plucking the ducks over the back of the sulky as we jogged along. I said that even if he had a double barrel and I a single, our score was equal, I was still holding him. Don laughed, gave the horse a flick with the reins and said if there were any ducks on the last dam he'd wheel me there. However, there was two teal. We tied up the horse and took up posi-tions. As the teal went up Don bowled one with the first barrel and sent the second barrel after the second. The duck turned out over my second. The duck turned out over my position, flying just right — a real "melon". I gave him the right lead and pulled the trigger. The darned gun did not go off and that duck dropped as dead as a door nail. Had my gun only gone off, I could have claimed it, but Don's shot had scored oll wight and the duck had collapsed all right, and the duck had collapsed when over my position. Dear Bill, The purpose of this letter is to thank the Delegates for appointing me your new President, and I sincerely trust that I will carry out the office in the distinguished manner set me by both Mr. Wilson and Mr. Houston.

Perhaps it may be opportune to briefly advise our members some of the points for consideration at our next Executive Committee Meeting in Adelaide in October.

One of the major items on the Agenda will be the programme for the next International Shoot, and the best date to suit the most shooters.

One suggestion has been to have the shoot at Bankstown, commencing on Wednesday, April 25th (Anzac Day), shooting through until Satur-day. This would have the effect of anybody taking their holidays at Easter to cover major carnivals and see the Sydney Easter Show. This suggestion will be considered by the Executive in October.

A further important problem is that of the cost of the "News", and our normal Executive office costs. The "News" itself for the 11 issues costs something like 22/- per registered shooter to produce, and on top of this we have the normal costs of running the Association, so it would seem there are only two alternatives for the Committee to decide:— (1) To cut the "News" down to

- five issues per year, to the same page size as now, or
- (2) Make a charge of 10/- per registered shooter per annum for the issue of the "News". Perhaps our members would

Editor their thoughts, as it is wrong in principle to spend more than our income.

If the Association had the finance, the possibility of sending an Olympic team to Japan should be investigated, as I am quite certain that, with America accepted in the Olympic team, we should be able to bring sufficient representation to be able to enter an Australian team.

This would need a lot of preparatory organising, but there is no point to it if finance is not available. The Association cannot afford this type of development.

The question of publicity for this sport is also receiving attention, and it is a strange thing in the major Capital- we cannot get newspaper publicity In Hobart, Newcastle, the Gold Coast and country towns, newspapers and radio co-operation is willingly given, and to try and improve the position, particularly for our major cities, the Secretary and I will be in conference with I.C.I. officials. I am hoping that some definite result will be forthcoming from our combined efforts.

I would welcome suggestions from shooters that will lead to the betterment of the sport, and would thank Mr. Morgan of Hobart for sending me the trap details that the Association Solicitor referred to at the Annual Meeting.

# OUT OF THE PAST

# **Twenty Years Ago**

"Duxbac" (Horace G. James), now the proprietor of the old-established gun firm of Donald Mackintosh Pty. Ltd., in Latrobe Street, Melbourne, and one-time Chairman of the original Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association, is reported in May 1941 as having won his 53rd championship. This was gained in a shoot on the old Blackburn grounds (V.) in the Victorian Single - barrel Championship. "Duxbac" ran up the splendid total under single - barrel conditions of 23/25. J. R. (Bobby) Meehan, then a 17-year-old local shooter, was runner-up. Fred Burns and Meehan had each recorded 21/25 (not bad for a 17-year-old), then Burns retired in favour of Meehan, who took second placing. In winning, "Duxbac" missed his 18th and final birds. Then followed G. Biggs 20/25, Bill Bloomfield, Geoff Mason, W. R. Johns 19/25, D. Watson, J. Bryant, the late Harry Ball 18/25. George

He won the Commonwealth Walk - up Championship outright with a score of 19/25. Eric Ball of Colac, who is seldom seen on the tracks these days, was runner-up 25/35. The late Bill Reid of Seymour and the late Jack Cattanach are bracketed with others in a minor-event success.

### TOM JONES OF TULLY N.Q.

The beginning of the 1961 International series at Tottenham was marred by the sudden passing on the shooting tracks of a fine sport, a great shooter, and a fair dinkum Aussie. "Big Tom", as his cobbers knew him, was a "Great Bloke".

Born near Gundagai, he was a son of the Great Australian outdoors, quiet and reserved, a "Rock of Gibraltar" to his many mates.

North Queensland was his adopted

home, and he loved the Tropics. "Big Tom" was a "straight shoot-er" both on and off the tracks.

He was a confirmed batchelor. He founded the Tully Gun Club and played a big part in several other clubs, such as Ingham, Silk-wood, Atherton, Ravenshoe, Dain-tree, Townsville, Ayr, and Charters Towers.

As a duck shooter, Tom had few equals; his keen eyes, knowledge of habits of wild game, sense of direction, ability to stalk, were assets he could always call on when in the bush.

The writer can recall one trip in Western N.S.W. when Tom and himself lived on wild ducks, and averaged one duck per man per day for the three-week period, and then brought back 30 birds, as well as having given away at least another 60 to property owners along the route.

Vale, Tom, old Cobber, you will always add up in our book as a typical Aussie, and you passed on, the way that you would want, on the shooting tracks, with your first love in your hands - your Under/Over "G" Grade Browning, that was part of you, and won for you many a trophy and championship.
