

The Editor's Notebook



1962 INTERNATIONAL MATCH. The A.C.T.A. is pleased to acknowledge receipt of the following congratulatory letter from the English Clay Pigeon Shooting Association in London. The letter, written under the date of July 16, 1962, reads:

The result of the Match was received with acclamation here, and we send our heartiest congratulations to the Australian Team upon their success, which was obtained with a new record score.

For 1963, the home teams will be shooting at Dublin, Ireland, on 21st

June, and the conditions will be as for 1962, as set out in my letter to you dated 23rd October, 1961, and also in accordance with the 1962 programme which has been sent to you. With kind regards.

It will be noted that Canada, winners in 1960, did not submit an entry in 1962. But there were probably good reasons for this.

Another important feature of the success by Australia in 1962 is that the win was gained with a record winning margin and also a record score under the present points system of deciding the winning combination. As has been previously mentioned, the Australian Team of 1962 lost only 37 targets in 3000 and dropped only 236 points in a possible 9000 points!

APPLICATIONS FOR 1963 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS. Clubs interested are again reminded that applications for 1963 open championships, i.e. Commonwealth, State and District Championships, should be lodged with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, not later than Monday, September 10, 1962.

In connection with Commonwealth titles, (clay sparrow and clay pigeon) will in future probably be allocated on a roster system. Copy of the proposed roster as it will apply in the various States is published (Commonwealth titles only) elsewhere in this issue. The Executive Committee will probably retain this roster for the 1963 allocation and the ensuing years. The roster published is quite easy to follow and its observance by clubs should simplify both applications and ultimate allocation.

INCORRECT DECISIONS. Recently two reports were received by the Association of incorrect decisions given by official referees. In the cases referred to, one shooter using an under-and-over gun and the other an automatic, claimed misfires. The referees concerned took over the guns in each instance, placed them to the shoulder and pulled the trigger. In each case the gun fired, and in each case the referee gave the shooter another target. These decisions were completely wrong and it was wondered by other shooters present that no one protested on the referee's ruling. What apparently happened was that the shooters, in each case, froze on the trigger and then claimed their guns would not fire. Official referees should make very certain that they have a complete knowledge of the Rules.

SILENCE ON SHOOTING MARK. Several reports have reached the Association recently regarding shooting mark behaviour. The reports received indicate that some shooters are prone to talk to their nearest shooting companion and so disturb the concentration of other competitors. Talking on the mark should not be tolerated by the referee. In such instances the referee should quietly draw the offenders' attention with the minimum of gesture and confusion. If the offenders fail to accept the referee's reminder, it is the referee's duty to report the matter to the club management, who should then take up the question with those causing the annoyance. No gun club is expected to be a fortress of decorum, but at the same time noise on the shooting mark should not be tolerated.

1962 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS. In connection with the 1962 World Clay Pigeon Championships at Cairo (Egypt) to be held from October 11 to October 20, 1962, advice has been received from the International Shooting Union (Germany) containing copy of a letter received from the general secretary of the United Arab Republic Shooting Federation. The copy reads, "Cairo, 8th July, 1962. Dear Mr. Zimmerman, With reference to my letter dated 17th June, 1962, I have pleasure to inform you that the United Arab Republic Shooting Federation will participate with 50% on all tickets issued by the UNITED ARAB AIRLINES and flown on its schedule. Therefore, all participants at the 38th World Shooting Championships and visitors accompanying them will be covered by this privilege. May I kindly request

that you approach United Arab Airlines offices in Germany to organize and plan all arrangements to contact all Federations all over the world and to establish the necessary coand to establish the hecessary co-ordination. (Signed) General C. Mehanna, Secretary General U.A.R. Shooting Federation." (Note, Mr. Zimmerman is General Secretary of the International Shooting Union (Union Internationale De Tir). From the foregoing, it would appear that United Arab Airlines have agreed to a discount of 50% on all airline tickets to Cairo for the Championships, applying both to competitors and visitors. The Egyptian piastre (medium of currency) is valued, 41 piastres one U.S. dollar, 100 piastres one English £.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEET-ING. Clubs are reminded again that the next meeting of the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee will be held in Sydney over the dates October 4 and 5 (also on the evening of October 4). Among the many important matters to be discussed will be the programme for the next National Championships and International series at Southport, Queensland, in June, 1963.

Clubs desirous of having matter included on the Agenda of the abovemetioned meeting are advised that such application should reach the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1, not later than Monday, September 10, 1962.

Applications for 1963 Commonwealth; State and District Championships should also reach the A.C.T.A.

ships should also reach the A.C.T.A. Secretary not later than Monday, September 10, 1962.

1963 NEW ZEALAND CHAM-PIONSHIPS. The Secretary, New Zealand Gun Club' Association, Mr. Bill Stewart, has advised that the 1963 New Zealand Championships will be held at Hamilton, N.Z., from April 3 to April 10, 1963. Mr. Stewart adds, "I take this opportunity to invite any of your members to participate in this tournament. I trust we will be able to entertain a large number of your members at

Hamilton next year." Mr. Stewart continued. "I want to congratulate your International Team on their great success this year. I feel that your team's score of 8764 points will remain a record for many years."

SUNDAY SHOOTING IN SYD-NEY. Following a letter from a New South Wales club to the New South Wales Police Department, Sunday shooting at Bankstown, N.S.W., has ceased. This has caused much disappointment. The Royal Aero Club was endeavouring to establish a pointer by shooting on Sundays so that the example could be established to the N.S.W. Government Department controlling gun sports that Sunday gun sport, under proper control, was worthwhile and, therefore, should be permitted. All New South Wales clubs would have benefited had this been established. Now, due to the action stated, no shooting in the State of N.S.W. is permissible.

A report from America advises that a clay target shooting film, or at least a film basically on the sport of clay target shooting, is about to be re-leased for general distribution in U.S.A. and abroad. The film is a commercial enterprise and is

believed the first of its kind. It is a Bill Stern Columbia Pictures sports film and features Remington Arms Co. personnel and products in a series of camera close-ups of all forms of clay target shooting. The film is already in distribution among the U.S.A. Armed Forces. The picture covers scenes at the 1961 Grand American series at Vandalia, Ohio, night shooting (trap), hand thrown trapshooting, skeet and practice shooting off the stern of a power cruiser in Biscayne Bay, Miami. The name of the film is "ON TARGET", and all interested are advised to watch for its release in the respective areas of the Commonwealth - it should be of great interest to Australian clay target shooters, the initial film made for theatrical release.

Apsley Gun Club, named as the "most western club in Victoria", close to the South Australian border, has issued a syllabus for club shoots during the ensuing six months. Occasionally statements are made that rifle shooting slows a shooter up when it comes to smooth bore shooting, similarly that gun shooting is detrimental to the rifle shooter, or that seldom is anyone capable of excelling with both types of weapons. This may be true, or otherwise, on account of physical make-up and temperament, it could appear that certain individuals have an aptitude which favours one form of shooting more than the other. However, skill with weapons depends to a marked extent on general good health, quickness of mental and physical reactions and, basically, good eyesight. These attributes are never the same in any two individuals, neither are there any particular degrees of skill with either the gun or rifle, or both.

great and fast traveller. Dog foxes are slightly heavier than vixens.

Snipe indulge in aerobatics in the spring which result in a curious sound known as "drumming". The snipe rises to a considerable height, then, turning on its side, swoops downwards in an arc, and in so doing, it "drums". The wings remain motionless, but the two outer tail feathers stand out nearly at right angles to the rest, and in the downward swoop the wind resistance to these feathers is believed to produce the "drumming" sound. It can be artificially reproduced by attaching these two feathers to an arrow or to a cork whirled round and round.

The Editor, Clay Target Shooting News. Dear Sir.


There has been conjecture for some time on the comparative standards of Skeet shooting in New Zealand and Australia. It may therefore be of interest to readers to know that a telegraphic match was shot between the Auckland (N.Z.) club and the Australian (V.) club on Saturday, 16/7/62.

Each club was represented by two teams who each shot at 250 birds. The match resulted in a tie between the two No. 1 teams, each club shooting 233/250; however, Auckland No. 2 team lead Aust. (V.) No. 2 team by 231 to 217.

These scores were somewhat lower than expected, as club performances are usually higher than those above; however, tension probably played a part.

Of course, the Auckland teams were not drawn from the whole of N.Z. just as the Aust. (V.) teams were—only drawn from a sector of Aust.; however, it would appear that present Australian Skeet standards are comparable with those in N.Z.

OUT OF THE PAST

Ten Years Ago

From the pages of the September 1952 issue of "News" comes details of shoots at Bathurst, Griffith, Narromine, Queanbeyan, Coff's Harbour, Richmond River (Casino), all in New South Wales, and Charleville (Qld.), Perth (W.A.) and the Melbourne metropolitan clubs. At Charleville (Q.) a shoot in aid of the local C.W.A. produced a return of \$157 to that produced a return of £157 to that cause. The C.W.A. Handicap was cut by T. Akers, John Raleigh, J. W. Raleigh (son and father), Reg Akers (still club Secretary at Charleville), Doug. Smith, J. Hamilton, G. Akers and C. Miller.

At a Coburg shoot Jack Headland (now a member of the Association Executive Committee) won the 20target mixed birds event, 30/30, from Keith Hooker, 29/30, and J. Bryant Junr., 28/29. At the same club Sel. Power won a 10-target event on the 26th round, defeating Miss Barbara Biggs, 25/26, with Tup Pedersen (also a member of the Association Executive Committee) in third place, 22/23. At Camberwell a tyro championship was won by A. G. Stewart, 25/30, from L. Drummond (Seymour), 23/30. An Intermediate Championship at the same club went to the late Lionel Byrne, 17/20, from R. W. Delaney, 16/20. The club Singlebarrel Championship for 1952 of the Australian Club at East Burwood (V.) went to former President, Frank Johnson, 22/25, from H. Phillips, 21/25, and A. C. Tie, 19/21. At the same club a £125 Handicap, with a £75 gun as first trophy, was won by Frank Brown of Dandenong, who shot out 70 shooters before gaining the prize.

The North Coast Championship (N.S.W.) shot at Richmond River (Casino) went to veteran shooter Clarrie Lee (who is still shooting competitively) from Cliff Whitney (South Coast).

The September 1952 issue contains an account by Enoch Jenkins, the famous English trapshot, of his experiences at the Helsinki Olympic

Games, Jenkins finished 14th, Rossini, the winner at the 1956 Games in Melbourne, finished 7th at Helsinki. Jenkins mentioned in his report, "Bravo, Australia, you sent some wonderful athletes, especially Marjorie Jackson, who brought back memories of Jack Donaldson, the 'Blue Streak'. I met Jack many times and shot over traps with him on Cardiff Racecourse." Continuing, Jenkins added, "While shooting my second 25 birds at Helsinki, No. 6 trap broke down. Instead of the trapper hoisting a flag, I was horrified to see a lady's face appear at the end of the trench, when I had my gun covering No. 1 trap; it just shook me up."




