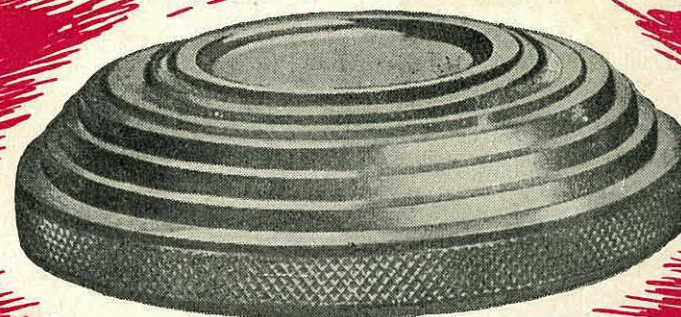

The Editor's Notebook



ADMITTANCE TO ANNUAL MEETING. As is known to all, the Australian Clay Target Association is officially "Australian Clay Target Association Limited". The Association, in fact, being registered as a Company with limited liability under the provisions of the Companies Act 1958, without the addition of the word "Limited" to its name. The Licence for the deletion of the word "Limited" having been granted upon condition that the terms of the Memorandum and Articles of Association submitted and certified to by the Attorney-General are strictly followed.

As will be appreciated, the foregoing indicates that the Articles of Association as approved by the Attorney-General and accepted by the A.C.T.A. are required to be complied with. Clubs not having already appointed representatives or delegates to attend the next Annual Meeting to be held in the R.S.L. Memorial Hall, Scarborough Street, Southport, Q., on Sunday, June 9, 1963 (commencing at 9.30 a.m.) are reminded that certain formalities must be completed before a delegate may attend the meeting.

Firstly the club concerned is required to comply with Article 5 (a) and complete the Acceptance of Membership Schedule under the Common Seal of the Club concerned. Following, Article 6, "Application for Membership," must be completed and lodged with the Association. Then the remainder of Article 5 (c) and Article 16, "Nomination of Delegate", is necessary on the required

form. In addition to Nomination of Delegate the actual delegate must also sign the completed "Notice of Acceptance of Delegates" Form. All the forms indicated refer to "Unincorporated Clubs". In cases where a club is a recognised "Corporate" body all that is necessary for such clubs is the observance of Article 21, "Nomination of Representative".

The necessary forms for the compliance with the foregoing requirements are obtainable from the A.C.T.A. office, and clubs appointing delegates or representatives should apply for any of the forms required. It is pointed out that many clubs have already completed the above-mentioned forms. In such cases no additional lodgment of forms is necessary and the appointee remains the delegate or representative of the respective clubs concerned until the Association is advised and another set of forms is completed.

Clubs are requested to strictly note the matters referred to above in order that the Articles of Association are carried out in compliance with the Companies Act.

WALK-UP CONDITIONS. A club recently wrote the Association requesting information on the following regarding walk-up competition: "After the bird has been released, when the shooter reaches the yardage mark which was drawn for him, can he proceed any further down the lane before he shoots, or must he

stop walking as soon as he sees the clay?"

Rule No. 98 is quite clear on the point. It reads, "Walk-up events shall be shot double-barrel from No. 3 track. The competitor shall load his gun at the 22 yard mark. When ready in this position he commences and continues to walk at a normal walking pace, holding his gun in any position of safety. The puller will release the target between the 20 yard and 15 yard marks, the mark having been previously determined by an indicator or dice." It would seem that a shooter would be penalising himself if he attempted to continue walking once the target has been released. At all events the competitor must shoot immediately the target appears — any additional walking he may do is then immaterial to the competition.

FINAL ADVICE REGARDING PAYMENT OF 1963 DUES. This intimation will serve as a final reminder to all shooters who have, as yet, failed to pay their 1963 registration fees. These shooters are reminded that the fee (30/-) was due on January 1 and should have been paid within 30 days of that date. Those who have failed to pay their registration by the end of this month will be struck off the list of registrations, have their names removed from the mailing list of "News" and will also be ineligible for handicap. All this, of course, means that such shooters have no standing with the Association and cannot compete against registered shooters anywhere in Australia. In recent weeks quite a number of shooters who have received notice of handicap adjustment have forwarded their 1962 cards for notation by the appropriate official at the A.C.T.A. headquarters. These shooters are also reminded that 1962 cards are not now valid and the Association cannot make notations on cards which are not current. The only cards on which notification of handicap adjustment can appear is on a 1963 card, and only 1963 cards will be accepted for such action.

DUTIES OF A CLUB SECRETARY. The A.C.T.A. office has been

asked to define the duties of an affiliated club secretary — what a task! Fundamentally the success or failure of an organisation depends very largely upon the Secretary's drive and initiative. It is the duty of the Secretary to see that club rules are obeyed and in turn see to it that all requirements of the governing body, i.e. the Association, are complied with, particularly in regard to ensuring that all shooters are registered and that result sheets and handicap returns are promptly forwarded to the Association.

tradesmen. In a bold and expensive attempt to recapture past glories — and income — a new form of pigeon shooting is being introduced. Taking the place of live pigeons which came from Spain will be mechanical robot birds which will cost about one sixth of the cost of a live pigeon. The invention is of Belgian origin and the robot pigeon will be released from traps exactly as was its live counterpart. Propeller driven, it will turn into the wind, gain speed over a course of sixty yards and be capable of erratic manoeuvre. A hit on a plate in the machine will make it drop vertically and there will be no question of wounded birds being lost over the boundary. If the robot works as well as has been anticipated, it is unlikely that long series of hits will be registered. More information on this new device is likely to be available in a later issue of this publication.

The new club at Nambour in Queensland, to be eventually known as the Maroochy Club, is still in process of establishment. Organiser is K. T. Henebery of Burnside Road, Nambour. It is likely that the club will start up in the very near future.

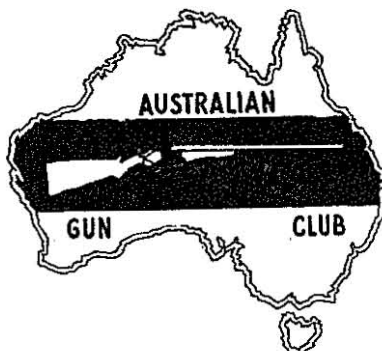

NERVES AND SHOOTING

Nerves play a very important part in shooting. Nerves can be described as being of two kinds. Those which transmit to our limbs the actions dictated by one's brain which enables the shooter to actually shoot, and there are those nerves influenced by the emotions, such as anxiety, fear and excitement. The former are essentially a part of the shooter's make-up, and there is little or nothing that can be done to influence them, though doubtless they determine whether one shoots naturally quick or is a slow shot. There is no doubt usage, resulting from constant shooting practice, keep them tuned up to the highest degree of efficiency of which they are capable. A shooter can do something about controlling excitement, anxiety and fear, which in some measure are common to all who shoot, particularly the beginner.

The beginner must learn to exercise nerve control, and when the actual shooting begins he must banish all extraneous thoughts and concentrate everything on the one object.

Confidence in one's own shooting ability is the surest means of banishing nervousness, but that can only come with practice. Do not dwell on the shot, but do not hurry it.

OUT OF THE PAST

THE LATE LEW. BERTRAM

A Tasmanian shooter recently requested "something in 'Out of the Past' about L. Bertram".

There is not a great deal of information in the press of the middle and late thirties on this shooter, with the single exception of his win in the 1937 Champion of Champions Cup at West Footscray. The now extinct weekly sporting newspaper "The Referee" gave some publicity to his success in this event. The paper states, "L. Bertram won the Champion of Champions Cup at clay pigeons and broke the Australian record of 62 straight by shooting throughout the day, without a miss, and stopping 77 straight. Later he added 19 to this total, making his total 95/96 over two days. An amazing performance." The paper then continues, "Bertram is a garage proprietor at Bentleigh (V.). The event was shot at 50 targets from 18 yds.; the event is the premier match at

clay pigeons for the year." Other comments in the lengthy write-up were, "Bertram has for years pursued his favourite pastime of clay pigeon shooting with the aid of an inexpensive 'Leonard Mills' gun, and it was this firearm that brought him the honours. So good was Bertram's form that he remarked after the event, 'They looked like dinner plates,' yet soon after the start he asked 'The Referee' representative to examine his shooting glasses, as he considered that a blank spot persisted in the left lense." (It is understood Bertram's gun is reputed to have cost £7/10/-.—Ed.) Bertram was for some years President of the Victorian Clay Target Club and was regarded as one of the most ardent supporters of clay pigeon shooting from its inception in Victoria. He was born at Strathfield in the Gippsland area of Victoria and died about 11 years ago when aged about 62 years.

Twenty Five Years Ago

As a result of extensive correspondence between the English Clay Pigeon Shooting Association and the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association (now the Australian Clay Target Association) about this time, information was to hand that it was practically assured that the first "Post International Teams' Match" at clay pigeons would take place in June of that year. Final conditions had not been completed, but it was certain that the English, Irish, Welsh and Scottish Associations had agreed in general to the

proposal put up by the Australian body.

Twenty-five years ago there was discussion as to whether the No. 8 Station in skeet shooting should be adopted in English Rules. Discussion on this point is still current, although the Australian Association has now adopted the No. 8 Station.

The late J. R. Schutt, one of the early guarantors, with several others, of the A.C.T.A., was in fine form at a Nobel fixture at West Footscray. He won a walk-up event after an exciting tie shoot.

At a Coburg fixture Cliff Ingbrisen and Geo. Biggs won a Deauville Doubles contest with the only possible. W. R. Johns and "Blackie" (Roy Blackwood) were runners-up. The club double-barrel championship

Dear Sir,

Referring to the photo in the March issue of the "News" of the remains of a cleaning rod left in a barrel whilst a cartridge was fired, readers may be interested in some details of the occurrence.

I was standing behind the shooter, a novice, to give a little coaching if necessary at the Australian Club (V.), and on the call of pull, the shot sounded louder than usual, and what appeared to be an arrow shot out. I asked the shooter if he had left his cleaning rod in the barrel, but he was quite sure he had not, and on examination of the gun there was no sign of any damage, not even a bulge in the barrel.

However, at the conclusion of the round Frank Johnson, well known to Vic. shooters, and his Labrador "Bozo" hunted around in the grass, and Bozo, with a nice display of sagacity, associated the smell of gun oil with game and retrieved the rod.

As frequently only a small obstruction is sufficient to burst or bulge a barrel, I thought the occurrence a wonderful credit to the strength of the gun, a Browning automatic, though personally I hope to avoid being in the vicinity of such tests.

For those interested in ballistics, the cartridge was a Grand Prix, and the extreme range of the rod was 55 yards.

38th World Championship

The 38th World Championship Shooting series was held at Cairo (Egypt) late in 1962, under the supervision of the Shooting Federation of the United Arab Republic. The flag of the International Shooting Union (U.I.T.), of which the A.C.T.A. is a member, flew in the Nile Valley for the first time. The series was very well managed and was altogether an outstanding success. Over 700 shooters (rifle and clay pigeon) took part.

Shooting conditions were fairly good throughout the series, though winds from the Sahara Desert frequently upset some of the competitors.

An exciting climax was provided by the duel between two of the world's best women clay pigeon shooters, Vladimir Zimenko (U.S.S.R.) and the Maharajah Karni Singh of Bikaner (India). It was necessary to stage four tie-breaker shoots each of 25 rounds before a decision was reached.

The clay pigeon shooting section of the series was held at Dokki in the shadow of the Pyramids, and the skeet section took place at Heliopolis Shooting Club.

Mrs. Mercedes Mata of Venezuela won the ladies' skeet event with 99/100. Dournev of U.S.S.R. broke the world record to win the individual skeet championship with the remarkable score of 200 straight. The U.S.A. Team also broke the world record in the team skeet event with 394/400. Results (main scores only):

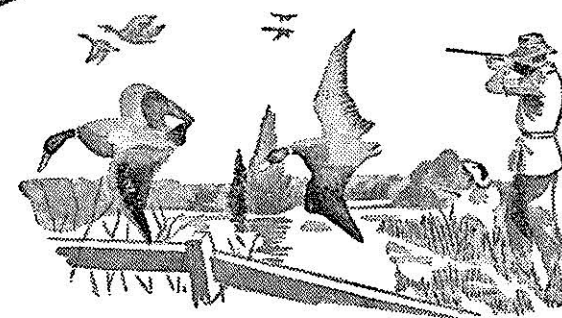

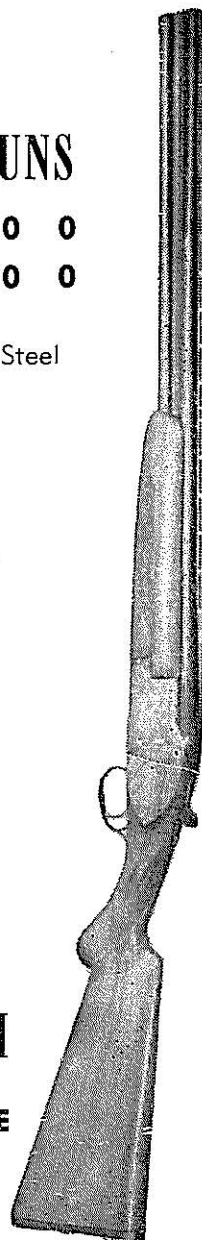

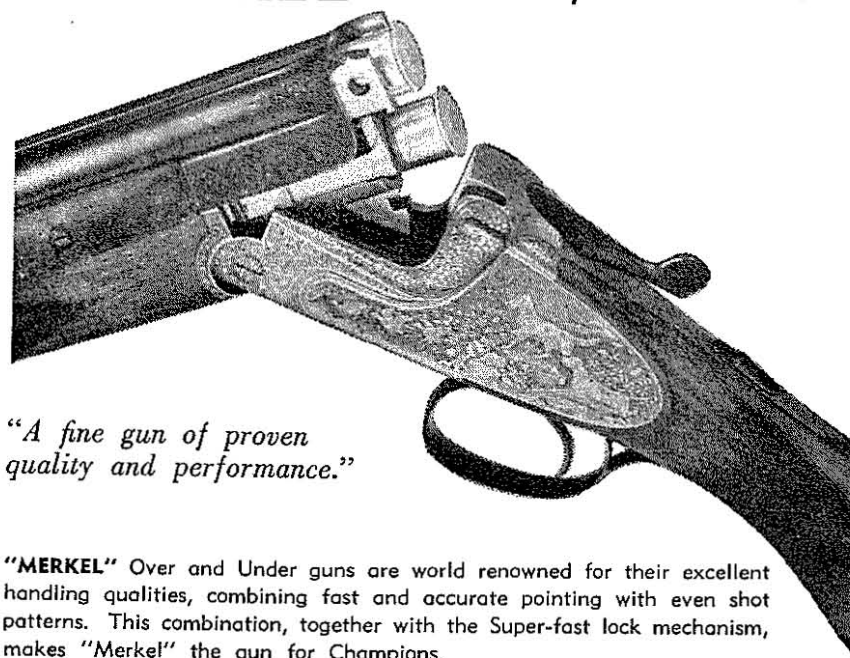
