1964 AFFILIATED CLUBS. In this issue is published a complete list of affiliated A.C.T.A. clubs, together with the names and addresses of their respective secretaries. The list is as complete as possible. It has been found that some clubs change their officials without notifying the Association, as a result of which incorrect details of club can be occasionally published. All clubs are reminded that names of main officials should be made available to the Association immediately any change is made.

WIDELY DIFFERENT ANGLE. Some comment has been received regarding targets which are thrown somewhat irregularly and are given as "lost" by referees. In this connection those interested are referred to Rule 49, Widely Different Angle, which reads, "When a target is thrown either way outside the prescribed limit of the angles, height and distance in single target shooting, it shall be deemed to be thrown at a widely different angle and 'No target' shall be declared."

A report has been received that a club referee has been giving "lost target" when actually the targets have not even been reaching the regulation distance and also keeping low before veering off to the right. Obviously the trap is at fault in this case and should be immediately adjusted. The referee should have given the "no target" decision.

SHOOTING AT TARGETS ONLY. Recently at a club a new shooter was observed firing at several birds which

happened to be in flight near the clay target releasing trap. It was found, also, that the birds the shooter concerned fired at were protected native Australian fauna. The shooter, quite disregarding the extreme danger such an act involved, actually fired across the shooting tracks. Such action should not be countenanced on any ground and any person caught acting in such an obviously dangerous manner should be disciplined and, if considered appropriate, disqualified either for the day or a specified period. There is a By-Law of the A.C.T.A. which instructs affiliated clubs to immediately disqualify any shooter who shoots at anything on the shooting ground other than actual targets or the testing plate. Clubs would do well to instruct their shooters accordingly and insist, at all times, on absolute safety rules as the initial requisite of the club.

SHOOTING-UP. A club in a northern area has written the Association requesting enlightenment on Rule 84, which refers to "shooting up". Rule 84 is quite implicit on this point and reads, "Shooting up after the first round of a competition is not permitted in any circumstances, except in the instance of shooters taking part in the annual International Match". The Rule is really selfexplanatory and means just what is written into it. In other words, it means that no shooter can come along after the first round of a competition has been completed and then be permitted to "shoot-up" in order to catch up with the progress of the rest of

the field in that competition. There have been instances of shooters arriving late — in some cases on purpose — to obtain the advantage of better light or wind conditions, and being allowed to shoot-up, then running out winner of the event. The Rule prohibits these shooters from "getting round" the regulations and in many cases gaining great advantage by such action.

INTERFERENCE WITH REFER-EES. A shooter from a northern area has written the Association along the following lines, "I was refereeing when a competitor fired at a target with both barrels. The target was well dusted on the first and missed with the second. I quickly realised that in accordance with Rule 25, a dusted target is not a broken target and therefore gave lost target as my decision. A couple of spectators at the rear of the track called out, 'No, no, it was killed on the first.' Thinking these spectators may have seen something I had missed, I changed my mind and gave the shooter the benefit of a possible doubt. My de-

cision in the first place was honest according to an optician, my evesight is very good. After further discussion I decided to write and complain about 'by-standers' calling to the referee." In this case the referee should have stuck to his guns and again declared "lost target". It is pointed out that the referee has the final decision in such matters, and providing he is reliable and well known to the club management for his honest decisions. he should not be subjected to a tirade from spectators at the rear of the shooting track, who, in many cases, are as far back as a further 30 yards behind the referee. Once the referee has given his decision, it must stand and only he can alter it. Instances have been known of shooters missing have been known of shooters missing out in a big tie shoot, coming back off the track well satisfied they were out of the competition, and then being advised by some individuals at the rear to protest. Spectators are, by and large, not in a true position to judge a referee's decision, and no referee should ever allow himself to be influenced by self-appointed check referees at the rear referees at the rear.

Over the years frequent reports come to hand of the marvellous shooting exploits of sportsmen of the past. From an English report comes the following, which makes for wonderment as to where all the game came from. First in the report is the mention of the prowess of the late King George V, who was regarded as one of the finest game shots of his time. It is understood that the late King George V had little opportunity for big game shooting, yet when he visited Nepal in 1911 he shot from the back of an elephant at moving tigers and other game in the un-familiar surroundings of long grass, his skill impressed by the fact that he killed almost all his beasts with the master shot, of a bullet in the neck at the base of the skull. Surely the effort of a master gunman! In India the Marquess of Ripon is reported to have killed, between 1880 and 1882 on his two visits to India, and 1882 on his two visits to India, 11 tiger, 2 rhinoceros, 19 sambur, 177 other deer, and 97 pig, effective evidence of his mastery with the rifle. Snipe shooting in Scotland is best on the Islands adjacent to the coast. For its size Tiree in the Inner Hebrides is regarded as the most productive. There, in November 1945, Major L. A. Clowes and the Hon. J. B. Coventry killed 1,427 snipe in ten days, the best day yielding 207. On the same island, Lord Elphinstone and Mr. J. D. Cobbold, shooting on seven full days and two half-days between October 25 to November 3, 1906, killed 1,108 snipe, the best day being on October 29, when 249 were killed. The same two guns shooting on eleven days in 1908 shot 1,292 snipe, the best day yielding 217, and shooting there alone on January 30, 1915. Mr. J. D. Cobbold killed 151.

Sir Hugh Gladstone, in his book, "Record Bags and Shooting Records,' mentions that one gun (not named), shooting for part of the season 1908-9 in the Orkney Islands, killed 2,344 snipe, 411 jack-snipe, and 1 great snipe. More than half the bag was made in twenty-eight days, and the largest bag made in any one day was on September 23, 1908, when 76 snipe and 2 jack-snipe were killed. Evidently this gun was a great snipe enthusiast, for every bird shot was individually weighed.

The snipe shooting on Islay is as remarkable as the woodcock shooting, and Mr. J. G. Morrison has had many

days there with bags of over a hundred to his own gun. I believe his best day - which is also, I think, the British record — was on October 1, 1934, when he killed 192 snipe, 3 grouse, 3 blackgame, 103 pheasants, 2 partridges, 2 teal, 2 golden plover, 1 woodpigeon, 19 hares and 19 rabbits, a total of 346 head. He left home at about 7.50 a.m., accompanied by three retrievers, a spaniel, two lads, and a lorry, which served as a game-cart and cartridge magazine. As the day proved exceptional for snipe, he continued till 7.35 p.m. He used one gun throughout and fired 831 cartridges.

The remarkable thing about that day was that the snipe total was achieved in the course of making such a mixed bag, but that is one of the characteristics of much Scottish shooting which adds so much to its attractions and to its demands on our skill as shots.

## SOME TIPS on DOUBLES SHOOTING

By M. KEMMERLY, who has shot 100 doubles in the U.S. Grand American Handicap.

(From "Trap and Field", U.S.A.)

I can tell you plenty that will help you shoot better doubles, but you have to try these things for yourself. Everyone has his own way of approaching the problem, but there is one important item on which all top doubles shots should agree. That is what is the most important and simple secret to breaking a good doubles score — the first bird.

The first bird is the secret to it all. You have to get the first bird immediately so you still have time to swing to the second and get it on the rise. Therefore it is exceedingly important that you be ready for a straight-away shot at that bird.

Now this diagram (Fig. 1) I've drawn shows where I stand when the field is as it should be, as indicated by A. If the field is a little to the right, you will have to move a short bit to the left side of station one to compensate for this (as indicated by B). Conversely, if the field is to the left, move a short distance to the right (C).

The symbols on the diagram indicate where I stand for each shot, depending on how the birds are thrown.

Why do I change positions just a few inches at the posts as shown? The whole principle is to shoot the first bird fast, fast, fast, and a little bit faster in order to shoot that second bird when it is still in its arc. You can, and should, lead the second bird a little like a singles target, but if you shoot the first one that way, you won't be able to get to the second one as fast.

You can shoot that first bird fast if you get it lined up like a straight-

away. Make it a spot shot on the first bird, and track the second one. You may think shooting doubles is "spot, spot", but it isn't. It's "spot, track". Ride the second bird; you have a better chance of getting it. If you shoot the first bird slowly, then you have to spot the second, lowering your chances of hitting it, because it's had time to get farther out.

I shoot the right bird first on positions Nos. 1, 2 and 3, and the left first on Nos. 4 and 5. That's because that is your straight-away bird. Now I prefer to start on position No. 1, so that I'll only have to change from right to left once during the round. My second choice is to begin on post No. 4, where I also have to change only once. On any other position you change your sequence of shooting twice.

I shoot a Model 32 Remington with a 32" barrel. I prefer a gun with a lot of weight so that the recoil forces the gun straight back and not up. If the recoil forces the gun back and UP, your second shot is harder.

My first barrel is between cylinder and modified. You should be breaking that first doubles target from 25 to 27 yards out, so with a tighter choke than modified, you are handicapping yourself. You definitely need a full choke on the second barrel.

I shoot light load No. 8's on both shots unless there is a strong wind of 20 m.p.h. or more, then I use No. 75's in the second barrel. The reason for the light loads on both shots wherever possible is because then the recoil on the first shot is not very punishing and your head is still on the stock for the second bird.



I also would not suggest heavy loads on the second shot because the difference in recoil, the unevenness of it, will make you start raising your head. You unconsciously start noticing that difference in recoil and you will start lifting your head on the second shot.

As far as stance goes, I position my feet like the diagram here (Fig. 2). I stand for the second bird. I'll face the first and be prepared to unwind for the second. I have a little trouble with the right-hand bird on No. 5, so I compensate for it a little more. A 1" or 2" difference on the firing line can make a four or five-foot difference out where you're breaking the target.

I definitely recommend a straight stance — no crouching or bending. You must be able to pivot with your knees, ankles and waist.

For trigger pull, I recommend about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  lbs. on the bottom barrel and  $3\frac{1}{4}$  to  $3\frac{1}{2}$  on the top. The reason why you have a light pull on the first barrel is you will have a tendency to shoot it much faster, which is back to our secret of getting that first bird fast to get the second bird at all.

When I sight the gun, I hold it slightly below the level of my eye. You want to keep your gun swinging in an arc, like the arc of a golfer. If the arc is out of shape, you're going to slice or hook, and that's what happens here. The arc has to be level. If you hold your gun too low, you'll have to move the gun too high to get on the bird.

For the drop of the stock I recommend a little less drop than the ordinary trap gun to keep the first shot from kicking the head up, so you'll be in line for that second bird. I recommend not straighter than  $1\frac{3}{2}$ " at the comb.

The down pitch should be about  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " to  $1\frac{3}{4}$ ". A pitch down has a tendency to throw the stock up on the face more and to hold the head on the stock for that second shot; too much pitch upward has a tendency to drop down and the face leaves the stock.

Along this line, I suggest not using powder. It makes your cheek slippery for the second shot. You need to have your head firmly on the stock after the first shot goes off.

A few more tips - I recommend gloves for the right hand and prefer them for both. Gloves keep the gun firm in your body, face and hands throughout both shots, with no slipping whatsoever. Another thing I do to get a better grip-I take some grass and twist a little around the pistol grip of the stock. It acts as resin does for a pitcher in baseball. I do this before each trap. Many shooters will remember Julius Petty, a great shot. He always used to get down on his hands and knees and rub the palms of his hands in grass and dirt before he shot to help keep them from slipping on the stock.

The last thing I can think of to tell you about is heat - wave distortion. I've solved this by dyeing sponge rubber black and putting it between the barrel and my ventilated rib. Between each field I let water run down the rib sideways.

That's all I can think of. I can't guarantee it'll work for you, but it's worked for me.
