1964 OFFICIAL REFEREE EX-AMINATION. Candidates who took part in the 1964 Official Referee Examinations are advised that the examiner's result of the written section are published in this issue. 79 applications were lodged with the A.C.T.A. office, and of the 79 papers issued, 71 were returned. Of those returned within the time specified for the examination, no less than 28 failed to gain the necessary percentage of 90% to entitle them to a pass. Of those who succeeded in passing, only two were equal to a 100% pass. Nine candidates secured 99%. The standard of results was considered by the examiner to be superior to previous examinations, which reflects a better understanding by shooters generally of the requirements of an Official Referee. Successful candidates are now required to arrange with the nearest Official Referee Examiner to their own centre to undergo the practical or oral test. Names and addresses of Official Referee Examiners appear on the page prior to the "full list" publication of registered shooters, which appears in the July 1964 edition. Candidates are reminded that practical tests are required to be completed not later than December 31 next. For the reason that some objection was raised against the Examiner's comments in the 1963 referee examination series, the Examiner has refrained, on this occasion. from commenting on the papers in any way, other than indicating the percentage of points gained for those who passed. For those who failed to pass, only the names are listed.

NOMINATIONS FOR 1965 OFFICES IN A.C.T.A. All interested are notified that nominations for all offices in the Association close at 5 p.m. on Thursday, December 31, 1964. Nominations must be lodged with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, C.1., and late nominations — that is, nominations received after 5 p.m. on December 31 -will, under no circumstances, be accepted. Nomination forms are available from the Secretary, A.C.T.A. Those lodging nominations are reminded that such nominations must be lodged in accordance with Article 27 of the Association Constitution, which reads, "Nominations for all offices in the Association and membership of the Executive Committee must be in writing, signed by the Secretary of the member club or by the delegate member of an unincorporated club making the nomination, and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before the 31st December in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting." It is also mentioned that any nomination received by the Association must have the official backing of the club and not be merely the individual action of the member club delegate or club secretary. In other words, the nomination must be approved by the Committee of the member club before the nomination is lodged. On some occasions in the past, nominations have been received which have not first been approved by the Committee of the candidate's club.

For the information of all, Article 27 of the A.C.T.A. Articles of Association reads, "Nominations for all

offices in the Association and membership of the Executive Committee must be in writing, signed by the Secretary of the member club or by the Delegate member of an Unincorporated Club making the nomination, and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before the thirty-first day of December in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting."

In regard to the foregoing, it is mentioned that for some years past club secretaries have been signing the nomination form. Interested parties should note that only the "Delegate" member of an Unincorporated Club may sign nomination. In cases where the club is a "Corporate body" the club secretary is the correct official to sign the nomination form.

LATE LODGMENT OF COPY AND ADVERTISING. Clubs and officials interested have frequently been reminded, through these columns, re-garding the difficulties which arise when copy is late in arriving at the A.C.T.A. office. The printers have advised that, except in most unusual circumstances, the publication will always be out in plenty of time for the beginning of each month if copy dead-line is strictly adhered to. It has been noted in recent months that some clubs have left their copy, before posting, until it does not reach the A.C.T.A. office until two or three days after closing. This means the same two or three days are lost later at the end of the month. Provided copy is received before dead-line or no later than dead-line, it greatly facilitates the preparation of the copy, the setting by the linotypers, the arrangement of the publcation, the checking of proofs, the actual printing, the stapling, the wrapping and the many other minor duties connected with a publication. If club officials will keep these points in mind and ensure' that copy reaches the A.C.T.A. on time, much of the task of getting the journal into the hands of the shooters not later than the first of each month will be eliminated. It has been noted that many clubs actually "hold" their copy and then

forward same just on dead-line. This means that copy has to be rushed and in some cases no mention can be made in the "Tips and Tails" section. Holding of copy until dead-line does not help—if it is available earlier in the month, by all means forward same to the A.C.T.A. office so that details can be checked and written up.

DECEMBER ISSUE. Advertisers and clubs are reminded that, due to the printing industry vacation, there will be no publication of "News" during the month of January next. This is a regular procedure and has become more of an acute matter since the advent of the additional week's leave granted to all employees. Therefore, advertisers are reminded that all advertising copy for December and January should reach the A.C.T.A. office not later than November 1, 1964. Club officials intending to advertise during the period indicated are requested to give some thought to their requirements and lodge the copy on the dead-line date, or before, if pos-sible. Copy for the February edition, which will appear on or about Feb-ruary 1, will close at the A.C.T.A. office not later than January 5, 1965.

1964 INTERSTATE TEAMS' MATCH. The 1964 Interstate Teams' Match for The "Great Britain & Ireland" Trophy has been won by the Queensland Team, which shot at Atherton, N.Q. The winning combination registered a score of 493/ 500. South Australia was second, 490/500; New South Wales third, 489/500; then followed Victoria, 488/ 500, and Western Australia, 468/500. The Tasmanian Team was disqualified for including an unregistered shooter in their team.

The rule is good, is simple and if carefully analysed, you will agree that it

is as least as fair as the cumbersome pages of 'proof doubles' rules that skeet has."

1964 GRAND AMERICAN HANDICAP

(From REX MILES, Spokane, Washington, U.S.A.)

W. E. Duggan, a 59-year-old railway conductor from Delphos, Ohio, won trapshooting's most prized championship at Vandalia when he took the Grand American Handicap.

Duggan defeated a field of 2,718 better than the previous record entry of 2,527 set a year ago — in the big 100-target event.

Duggan, a native of Etowah in McMinn County, Tenn., broke 99 from the 20 yards to tie with four others and then defeated them in a 25-target shoot-off.


Also with 99's and tied for second after the first shoot-off round were George T. Cline, 20-year-old Louisiand State University senior from Birmingham, Mich.; Russel G. Krause, a 43-year-old truck driver from Mertztown, Pa., and 44-year-old Michael Piricsi of Chagrin Falls, Ohio.

Fifth in the shoot-off was Donald Dusseau of Monroe, Mich., who waited more than 10 hours after posting his 99, before being called for the shootoff.

A 12-year-old, John Edward McKay of Vevay, Indiana, downed 99 targets from 18 yards, to take the first honours in the Preliminary Grand American — an excellent performance for one so young.

Top woman in the Grand American Handicap was Mrs. Rhoda Wolf, wife of a Philadelphia doctor. She broke 91 targets from 21 yards.

Duggan won approximately 10,000 dollars for his few days over the traps.

1964 EUROPAN CHAMPIONSHIP

The European Championships were held at Bologna (Italy) late in June. The European titles at clay pigeons and skeet are organized jointly by the U.I.T. and the F.I.T.A.S.C.

166 contestants, 60 of whom came from the host country Italy, fought for the title in the Clay Pigeon event. Other countries, too, had sent strong contingents to Bologna — mainly in view of the preparations for the Olympic Games. Thus, the contest was entered inter alia by the last two Olympic champions, i.e. the Italian, Galliano Rossini (Melbourne 1956) and the Roumanian, Ion Dumitrescu (Rome 1960), as well as by the World Champions of Oslo 1961 and Cairo 1962, namely Ennio Matarelli (Italy) and Vladimir Zimenco (U.S.S.R.).

The final section of the Clay Pigeon contest presented a rather thrilling aspect: three shooters in the 200-bird programme finished with 190 kills each, while four further entrants, with 189 kills, each came close behind this top group. Ennio Matarelli (Italy), Michel Prevost (France) and Heinz Leibinger (West Germany) had to shoot off for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in a decisive series of 25 birds. In this, 35-year-old Matarelli, having already won the World Championship title at Oslo in 1961, scored his second international victory in his native Bologna by registering 24 kills, followed by Prevost with 22 and Leibinger 20 kills.

Several ties were also scored in the Skeet event. Tsuranov and Worobev (both from the U.S.S.R.) had to shoot off for the title, while Suppli (West Germany) and Boucher (France) had to shoot off for the Bronze medal. NOYEMBER, 1962 Having scored 24/25 each in the first additional series of 25 shoots, Tsuranov and Worobev eventually finished with scores of 25 and 21 respectively, giving Tsuranov a clear victory. The superior top group in the team classifications of the Skeet event was formed by the U.S.S.R., France, and West_Germany.

If the scores collated in the following list of results are not entirely in keeping with those registered on earlier major championship occasions, then the relative incongruity must be ascribed solely to the very extraordinarily great heat which dominated the scene this time. One had to be in an extremely fit condition in order to cope with the task of completing the contest during those hot days without having to incur any particularly noticeable forfeitures.



OUT OF THE PAST Twenty-five Years Ago

A report from London indicated that Australia has run fourth in the first International Match in which first International Match in which Australia competed. Australia scored 1748 points. England was winner with 1878 points, winning from Scot-land 1821, with Wales third, 1756. Ireland was whipper-in with 1725 points. The veteran Welsh shot of the day, Enoch Jenkins, was high-gun with 98/100 points. Standard of shooting in Australia has improved immensely since these days immensely since those days.

The first International in which Australia competed was in the year 1939, and the Home Country Team shot their section of the event in Dublin (Ireland). An extract from a speech by the then President of Irish C.P. Association, Dr. P. J. Keogh, when the scores were announced follows. Dr. Keogh said, "Let me say at once that 1939 will go down in clay pigeon shooting history for two principal reasons.

The first Australian entry under International conditions, and secondly, the really wonderful scoring which took place on Eire's shore near Bray."

All traps were pointing out to sea and excellent shooting conditions prevailed. Australia shot in mid-June at East Burwood - otherwise in the depths of the Victorian winter. Since those days Australia's shooting date has been changed to approximately the first week-end in March with fairly happy results.

H. T. (Boyce) Siddins of St. George Club won the Queensland State double-barrel title at St. George in 1939 against a top-grade class of shooter, including several from Vic-toria (including Melbourne) and parts of New South Wales. The report of the day mentions that Siddins' father bought his son in the Calcutta for 20/- and received a very handsome division in return.

Fifteen Years Ago

Peter Sheridan, now of Robe in South Australia, formerly of Ascot Vale (V.), won the Victorian State Walk-up Championship on the grounds of the Footscray Gun Club in 1949. He grassed 15/25 to take the title and win from Frank Cuatero (Keilor) and "Double-H" (H. Harrison). The late Cliff Bound and A. Douglas divided a 10 birder on the same programme. The Victorian Double-barrel Cham-

pionship, on the grounds of the Co-burg Club, was won by Norman Guy from E. G. Biggs, Fred Burns and Jack McCraith. It was noted that all major State titles at that period were shot from 20 yards.

A. Roberts of St. James (V.) won the Coburg Club's Grand Prix, 36/36, from Vern Dudley, 35/36. Dudley was for several years a member of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A.

Ten Years Ago

At Pooncarie (N.S.W.), over the Murray from Mildura, late in 1954, the Pooncarie Double - barrel Championship was won by the Broken Hill shooter W. A. Commons, with the excellent score of 65/65 from R. A. Richardson (Mildura), 64/65, and John Doyle, 28/30.


At Alexandra in South Australia the Alexandra Club's single-barrel championship was won by the present South Australian representative on the Executive Committee, R. A. Mules. Mules won outright with the only possible.

At Newcastle (N.S.W.), late in 1954, Doug. York of Quirindi, N.S.W., registered a break of 254 straight.

At Sale, in the East Giipsland section of Victoria, Clem Mudford, one of Australia's only two former Olympians, won the Victorian Clay Sparrow Championship from A. C. Tie.

At Queanbeyan (N.S.W.), just outside the National capital of Canberra, the New South Wales Walk-up Championship was won by R. Weston 19/20 (a good score) from R. Sands 18/20, and N. Edlington 16/20.





Shooting accidents are frequently noted through press reports — accidents, in most cases, that should not have happened. These happenings are of perennial problem to responsible sportsmen, which no legislation seems to be able to adequately counter. The present is the season when many younger members of many families could be looking forward to receiving a gun for the Festive occasion — no apology is offered in the following reminder to these young sportsmen and their parents.

It has been observed over the years that lack of proper supervision in the early days of association with the gun is largely responsible for the ultimate gun accident. The exacting course of safety drill should be drummed into the juvenile gun handler before he is ever permitted to even carry a loaded weapon. If the careful safety drill is properly absorbed, safe gun handling becomes second nature. The young shot who lacks parental control in his sporting education is always at a disadvantage, for he must be largely on his own as a self-taught pupil of a subject in which he cannot afford to make mistakes. He must fundamentally understand and always remember that a gun is a lethal weapon and must only be pointed at that which he wishes to kill — if he does this, he is half-way along the road to safe handling and safe shooting.

How anyone can fail to know whether a gun is loaded or not is hard to imagine, yet this feeble excuse is still trotted out as a defence — which, of course, it is not — in the majority of fatal accidents. No one can tell if a gun is unloaded unless he looks inside the breech, and he can only fail to discover this if he forgets

the simple rules: never to pick up a weapon without "breaking" it; never to hand to another or accept from him an unbroken gun; never to enter a house without first extracting the cartridges; never to fail to unload and leave the gun broken at the end of a drive.

The "unloaded" weapon which is often the cause of an accident usually goes off because it is being used for a purpose for which it was never intended. A shotgun is to be employed for shooting and shooting only, not as a walking stick to assist progress over a hedge or stile; a club for despatching wounded game; a towing bar for extracting bogged-down fellow-fowlers, or a tool for probing bushes and forcing an entry amongst thick cover. When not being used in its legitimate role, then let it be put down empty where it will not be tripped over or trodden on, or, if propped against some handy support, well away from clumsy movers and wandering dogs.

Over-eagerness and hasty shooting without regard to possible conse-quences always lead to trouble. As a batsman looks round the field before playing a ball, so should one make sure of the position of the other guns before firing a shot. Just because one's next-door neighbour is out of sight, it does not mean that he is out of range or behind cover thick enough to stop shot pellets. Remember, too, that the latter can ricochet, so if there is any doubt at all, do not shoot. And let us make quite sure of the identity of any target before shooting. A brown trilby with feathers in the band may resemble some exotic game bird at a distance, but the odds are that it will also contain a head.







WALK-UP SHOOTING CONDITIONS

May I crave space in your magazine to comment on your article in July, 1964 — A.C.T.A. News, and to commend R. M. Holtfreter of Northam, W.A., on his article criticising the unsafe practice of shooting "Walk Up" with the gun to the shoulder.

As I understand it, the A.C.T.A. rule clearly states that in Walk-up shooting the gun may be held in "Any position of safety". Yet in the July, 1964, issue of A.C.T.A. News you state: If a shooter is holding his gun in any position other than as adjudged by the referee to be one of safety, then it is the duty of the referee to draw the shooter's attention to the breach of the rules and ensure that correction is made immediately. In the same article you inferred that a body, suspected of being the West Australian Council, were wrong in their insistence that this self-same thing be applied.

The West Australian Council of the Clay Target Shooting Association, in its wisdom, considered this matter at length and, to repeat Mr. Holtfreter's words, "Unanimously agreed that it was unsafe to walk down a shooting track with the gun clamped to the shoulder, gazing fixedly at a traphouse, waiting for the bird to emerge".

I consider that the West Australian Council, in the capacity of "Referee" for around 500 West Australian shooters, rightly took action to instruct clubs in West Australia that the method of shooting with gun-up was unsafe and would be discontinued forthwith.

I heartily agree with Mr. Holtfreter in his interpretation of this particular type of match as a "field" event, and could you or anyone else imagine a shooter walking through a swamp or bush stalking game with the gun "up to the shoulder"? I would most definitely say "No, that would be dangerous." Mr. Editor, I would refer you to a tried and trusted method which has been used by the British and Australian Armies for countless years, and that is the "High Port", a position where the gun is SAFE and can be brought into action at a second's notice.

Furthermore, I am sure a movie film of some shooters adopting the stance of gun to the shoulder would convince even the most stubborn and dogmatic that it is unsafe and rather stupid.


