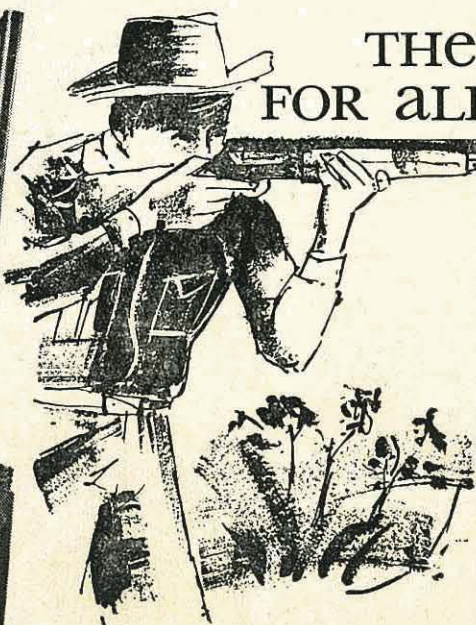

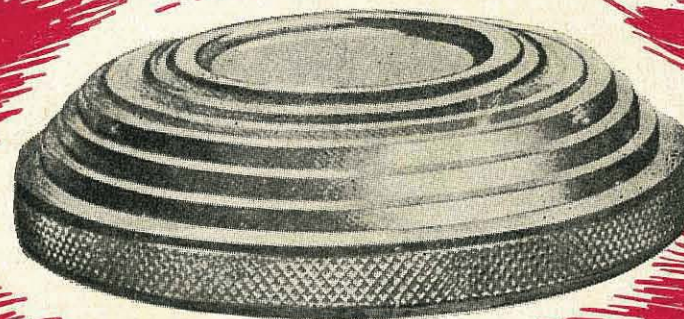

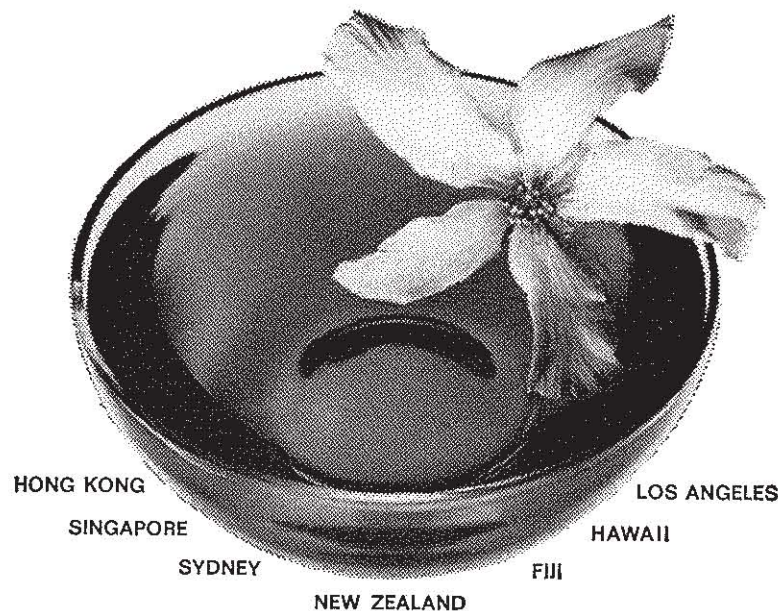

The Editor's Notebook



A.C.T.A. 1967 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS and INTERNATIONAL MATCH will be conducted at the grounds of the Gold Coast Gun Club (formerly the South Coast Gun Club), Queensland, commencing at 8.00 a.m. daily over the five days, Saturday, June 10, until p.m. Wednesday, June 14, inclusive. The programme (which includes the Queen's Birthday holiday on the Monday) has been amended to avoid a carry-over of events and will progress as follows, with the provision that, subject to time permitting each day, a \$300 Cash Handicap event will be added. The first day, Saturday, will see the winner of the coveted Champion of Champions Cup (1966 winner was M. Burgess of Cobarr, N.S.W.). On the second day, Sunday, the National Intermediate Championship (1966 winner, T. Holmes, N.S.W.) will be shot in conjunction with the National Double-Barrel Championship (1966 winner, V. Ryan, Vic.). The third day, Monday, will commence with the National Single-Barrel Championship (1966 winner, D. Glover, Vic.), followed by the National Double Rise Championship (1966 winner, W. Charlton, N.S.W.). On the fourth day, Tuesday, from the Australia - New Zealand Championship, the six top scorers will comprise the Australian team for the Australia - New Zealand Teams' Match. A \$300 Handicap event is then scheduled to take place. For the fifth and final day, the Twenty-first International Teams' Match will be conducted (Australian Team to be the 30 highest aggregate scorers in the Aust.-N.Z. Championship and the Aust. Nat. S.B. and D.B. Champion-

ships — of which only the best 25 scores are to count. Final scores are to be withheld pending complete results from overseas). The last scheduled event is to be the Eighteenth Grand Australian \$550 Handicap. The High Gun Trophy will be a B2, Grade (d), Special Trap 2 model Under and Over shotgun, the broad-rib type with 30-inch barrels, donated annually since 1966 by the makers, Fabrique Nationale of Belgium and Gollin & Co. of Sydney (as agents for N.S.W., Q'land and S. Aust.), with the provision that it may be won only once by any shooter. This will be competed for over the programmed events numbered 1 to 7 inclusive.

During the programme all New Zealand shooters will shoot two yards back from their New Zealand handicaps and ALL SHOOTERS MUST SHOW CURRENT HANDICAP CARDS WHEN NOMINATING FOR EACH EVENT.

The official photographer at the A.C.T.A. National shoots will be F. LANG of P.O. Box 40, TWEED HEADS, N.S.W.

Trophies will be presented daily from a dais after each event.

1967 ANNUAL MEETING

The 1967 Annual Meeting of affiliated club delegates and representa-

tives of member clubs will be held at the Gold Coast Gun Club, Southport, Queensland, commencing 5.30 p.m. on SUNDAY, June 11.

After the presentation of trophies on MONDAY, June 12, shooters are invited to a buffet dinner with refreshments, commencing 5.30 p.m. and completing at 7.30 p.m. at the Gold Coast Gun Club.

In 1967 the New Zealand Championships conducted by the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association will be held in Hamilton, N.Z., during the period April 2 to April 8 inclusive. The team to represent Australia in the New Zealand - Australia Team shoot during this series shall be the six highest Australian scorers in the New Zealand Single Rise Championship. This Australian Team shall consist of these six shooters who will shoot against six New Zealanders at twenty (20) targets per shooter for the Tom Glenn Trophy. Air fares to New Zealand are \$158.70 return (from Sydney) and hotel accommodation is slightly cheaper than comparable accommodation in Australia. It is advisable to book well ahead, as accommodation generally in New Zealand is a little harder to get than in Australia. The visit can be recommended to A.C.T.A. registered shooters who must show their handicap cards when nominating, thence they will shoot from two yards IN FRONT of their Australian handicaps. A cordial invitation comes from the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association to registered Australian shooters to attend this shoot. Accommodation requirements should be directed to Mr. I. K. Ewart, Secretary, Hamilton Gun Club, P.O. Box 281, Hamilton, N.Z.

Shooters are reminded that substantial reductions in air fares to New Zealand are available, subject to very simple conditions. Applications should be made as soon as possible to any AIR NEW ZEALAND office.

Shooters not registered for the 1967 calendar year are again reminded that they are unable to participate in

scheduled events at any affiliated club within the Association whilst they remain unfinancial and as from this (March 1967) publication, their names will be removed from the A.C.T.A. Shooting "News" mailing list. Annual registration fees should be forwarded through the club of which the shooter is a financial member. (See Rule No. 85—Registration of Shooters.)

SHOOTER R. KILPATRICK OF APSLEY, VICTORIA, HAS BEEN DE-REGISTERED BY THE A.C.T.A. AFTER THE CONSIDERATION OF SUBMISSIONS BY THE GEELONG CLAY TARGET CLUB, VICTORIA.

Lakes End Gun Club (Queensland) has gone into recess. Shooters concerned are reminded that they must immediately re-register through and shoot at another club. (See Rule No. 85—Registration of Shooters.)

Rules Interpretations —

1. Rule 43 permits two malfunctions of a gun — referee will then declare "LOST TARGET". All malfunctions or misfires must be noted on score sheets, then on shoot records.

2. All Ties shoot-offs (except Deauville Doubles, which are shot off in squads of two shooters) are shot squad system, in the same manner as the event was shot. All shooters commence on the same trap (except in the case of a major breakdown of the said trap).

Shooters shall be squadded in the same order in which they qualified. Shooters shall close up after each five targets per shooter and shall be re-squadded at the commencement of each run over the trap or traps.

(a) Single - Barrel and Double - Barrel down-the-line (5 tracks) are shot off the same yardage as the elimination event was shot, in squads of 5 or 6, unless insufficient shooters exist for the last squad. First miss-out.

(b) Mixed Birds — squads of 5 or 6 (as for S.B. or D.B.): (i) two targets Double Barrel; (ii) two targets Single Barrel; 5 tracks (first shooter commences on Number One track); (iii) two targets Walk-up (squads of 5 or 6) from the centre track. Number one shooter shoots at one target, he then returns to the rear of the squad, each shooter doing the

same in turn; (iv) Double Rise — two pairs, each target to count as one point. (Total is 10 Points.)

(c) Walk-up (squads of 5 or 6 as in (a) above) to be shot in lots of 5 targets until finality. All shooters shoot from the centre track, Number one shooter shoots at one target — he then returns to the rear of the squad, each shooter doing the same, in turn, as in Rule No. 96.

(d) Deauville Doubles (first miss-out) — shot from tracks 2 and 4, one team of two shooters at a time, as in Rule No. 94.

AT ALL TIMES, A SQUAD IS A SPECIFIC NUMBER OF SHOOTERS, thus:—

squad of 5 = normal down-the-line
squad of 6 = normal down-the-line
last squad of 2 to 6 = normal down-the-line

squad may be up to 10 (5 pairs) for Deauville Doubles, excepting the case of a last squad.

Mr. J. M. Tyquin was Tasmanian Manager of Claude Neon Limited, appointed to Launceston from Melbourne in 1935 and subsequently established the first Hobart factory in 1938.

In 1955 he was appointed Manager of Queensland and was loath to transfer from Tasmania, being President of the Hobart Gun Club and the Civic Club.

Mrs. Tyquin was Hostess of the Hobart Catholic Ball Committee and presented the debutantes to the Governor for some years.

In 1960 Mr. Tyquin was appointed Assistant General Manager of the Company, located in Sydney, and as of 28-2-67 is General Manager and a Director.

Mr. Tyquin has always been a keen gun shot, having won the Commonwealth Double-Barrel and Single-Barrel Championships. After being a Tasmanian and Queensland Committeeman for some years, he was elected National President of the Australian Clay Target Association

in 1960 and continues in this office, with the sport developing and has hopes of fielding an Australian team in the next Olympic Games.

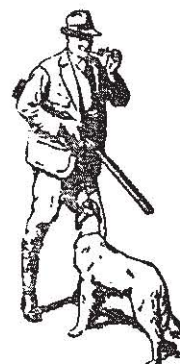

Dear Mr. Berry,

For some time now I have been concerned that the A.C.T.A. has not been amongst sporting bodies looking forward to having competitors going to the next Olympic Games. It seems to me and others I have discussed this matter with that the ultimate aim for all clay-target shooters should be selection in a team to represent Australia at the Olympics. It seems very desirable that this aim should be in the minds of many young shooters coming into our ranks today, and a number of them seem to have the potential to eventually reach the standard required for Olympic selection. Could you perhaps make this matter clear by the following:

(1) By printing in Shooters' "News" the reasons (if any) why we are not eligible to shoot at the Games.

(2) What changes would be necessary in our rules to make us eligible.

(3) Ask that all shooters contact either the Secretary or their Executive member with their views on whether or not they think it desirable that we have a team at the Olympics.

While not many of us have the necessary time or finance to shoot for major prizes such as motor cars, etc., the chance for Olympic selection would be open to almost any shooter

with sufficient ability, as the finance would not all come from the shooter's own pocket.

Dear Mervyn,

It has been my practice for the past three years to attend the annual carnival conducted by the South Coast Gun Club, now called the Gold Coast Gun Club; this year had a special significance, as this club will be host for the National Championships and the International Teams' Match and New Zealand-Australian team shoot in June of this year, and I was particularly interested to shoot over the new grounds and to see the facilities provided for this big programme.

I felt it may be of interest to shooters throughout Australia to have a first-hand, unbiased opinion of the Gold Coast Gun Club's facilities.

Firstly, the club has erected a large brick club pavilion with ample office space and an all-glass front allowing a full view of all five traps; a large area in front of the pavilion is set with lawn and has tables and chairs with umbrellas, allowing the ladies and shooters to rest in comfort between events.

Although more work will be done on the area, there is ample room for car parking, much of it under the shade of trees.

The traps are set facing almost directly eastwards and beyond the 50-yard radius falls away into a valley on the far side of which is an unbroken line of forest.

At first sight I thought the background may have distracted one from the target thrown, but, as the results

of the shoot showed, this was not the case; the club used orange-banded targets and on the first day, in above normal temperature, 29 shooters out of a field of approximately 100 shot the possible. This event was won by K. Cameron of Roma with 174/174.

Over the days of shooting I counted more than 30 individual shooters who shot over 100 breaks; although I do not have the exact figures, I believe this alone speaks for the excellent targets thrown.

I am sure that this year will prove a record year both in attendance and in successful shooting at the National titles in June, and I would like to take this opportunity of congratulating the Gold Coast Gun Club President, Captain and Committee for a well-run shoot, and to thank all concerned for the hospitality extended to my son and myself.

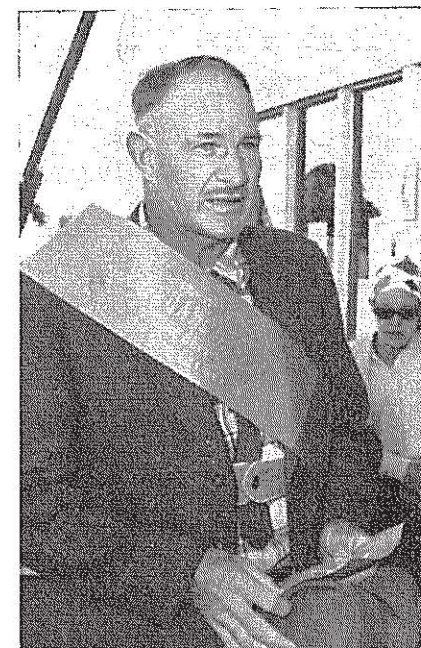
Local flooding and threatening weather reduced attendance to minimum of local shooters. Col. Fuller showed improvement and shot particularly well under the lights.

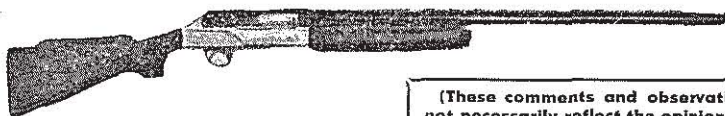

RANDOM SHOTS OF A ROVING SHOOTER



(These comments and observations do not necessarily reflect the opinions of the Executive Committee of the A.C.T.A.).

On the first day of a recent St. George (Qld.) open shoot "Casual Keith" Cameron shot 60/60 to win the South Queensland Double-barrel Championship. He then climbed into a plane, attended a wedding at Too-woomba and was back on the tracks for a 9 a.m. start next morning — shooting in his usual infallible manner, too, though somewhat handicapped by a slight bout of what appeared to be air-sickness and a shuddering aversion to attempting to repeat five times, "The greasy goose-greasers grease the greasy goose." Later in the morning his son flew in and, shortly after landing, succeeded in the difficult task of edging impeccable Don Scowcroft out of the Queensland Mixed Birds Championship.

At the following Moree (N.S.W.) open shoot, Boyce Siddins, President of the St. George Club, and his invaluable wife were flown over by their son Colin, and Bruce Gittoes, suave Secretary to the Boggabri Club, also arrived by air.

Queensland must be the most air-minded of our Eastern States. Shooters, graziers and business-men use the 'planes to shrink their long distances and other hardy inhabitants fly them high to shoot eagles, or awfully low to have a crack at dingoes. I heard of a young chap who raided the Station barn-yard and filled the cockpit with fowls and ducks, releasing the vociferous birds at various heights. The ducks 'planed down to the nearest stretch of water, but the fowls, after starting out steadily enough, appeared to lose their heads and engaged in fatal aerial somersaults. So whether in search of wealth, fun or frivolity, aircraft are becoming more and more widespread, and naturally so in this, one of the most perfect flying climates possible.

The awful sight of a clay sailing serenely on when it should be a delightful black smudge in the sky is very common in single-barrel events. In club shooting, 20 first barrels in a double-barrel event are not unusual, but a "possible" in a similar single-barrel contest rarely entails a shoot-off. In a surprising number of cases the 19's will fight it out. Even in the rarefied atmosphere of an International, Don Glover (Keilor, V.) had no opposition to his 50 straight from 16 yards to take the 1966 National Single-barrel title. In the same event the previous year there were no "possibles", Warren Charlton and John Raleigh scoring 49/50. In this event the nonchalant Doug. Smith (Qld.) dropped two birds, but later brilliantly shot 100 first barrels for the Australian International Team — a double-barrel event.

Discussing this with such seasoned campaigners as Jim Thompson (Cootamundra, N.S.W.), Joe Raleigh (Coff's Harbour, N.S.W.), Clive Evans (Baldanean, Q.), and Don Scowcroft (no fixed abode), many theories were advanced. Lack of confidence engendered by the knowledge that it is "neck or nothing" on the first shot, with no comforting second barrel, seems favoured as the chief offender. Over-carefulness in making the shot also appears to play a part in snapping the egg-shell delicacy of co-ordination which cries "now" to the trigger-finger. Basically it is probably all tied up with usage. We simply do not shoot enough single-barrel events to overcome the attendant inhibitions. This is borne out by the Americans, to whom double-barrel contests are unknown (except Double-rise), but who nevertheless produce amazing breaks. And, in passing, let us not take these American scores lightly. Some Australians tend to deprecate them on the grounds

that their trap angles are very narrow, but, while this is undoubtedly so, let us remember that our "straight-away" birds or near "straight-away's" are probably the grimmest reapers of all. The frank admissions of top New Zealand shooters Jim McKenzie, Peter Matheson and Ron Brown that they were "out of their League" at Vandalia (U.S.A.) when shooting in the "Grand" are also illuminating, and at the same shoot the withering 600 straight single barrels from 16 yards by Gene Sears speaks all languages. Fred Thompson (Moree, N.S.W.), who has warm memories of shooting buddies in America, says that the general reaction to an explanation of our double-barrel events was an astonished "Dawg-gawn!"

There are many who consider that we Australians should do more single-barrel work, and some of their contentions appear valid. It reduces the

cost of shooting, especially for the beginner, and eliminates a tendency towards a "sloppy" first barrel. If rifle shooting can be accepted as a parallel example, there is little doubt that a beginner should be started off with a single-shot weapon. It is the most effective way to discourage the habit of downing a quarry under a barrage of ill-aimed shots.

It may be contended that a gun was not made double to fire two shots at one bird, but rather to bag two birds with two shots. Nevertheless it is a pretty sight to see a quick powdering "second" such as Mal. Burgess (Cobar, N.S.W.) uses. There is a plaintive protest about this shooter, though, to the effect that "Pooge" doesn't have a second barrel at all — only two firsts.

CLAY TARGET SHOOTING IN AUSTRALIA



Today, in all civilized countries, the taking of fauna is a controlled privilege, not an inherent right. Accordingly, mankind has produced a simulated field hunt in CLAY TARGET SHOOTING.

This consists of an object (similar to a saucer), machine moulded, of crushed limestone and hard pitch, which is flung into the air by means of a mechanical device for the shooter to test or show his shooting skill.

Clay targets (also known as clay pigeons) are normally black, but may be painted white for shooting under night lighting or banded yellow for better visibility against poor backgrounds.

Prior to World War I several different enthusiasts commenced shooting at clay targets, and the first recorded group was "The Williamstown and Melbourne Gun Club", formed by Frank Albert Arthur Parker, a Dentist, of Alma Terrace, Newport, Vic., using an 1882 model hand-operated "Expert" trap obtained from the makers, "The Chamberlain Cartridge and Target Company of Cleveland, Ohio, U.S.A." This trap, so engraved, is still maintained in working order by his descendants.

The Club, sited on Kororoit Creek Road where a petroleum refinery now stands, was an adjunct to, hence a break-away from, live-bird shooting and included such famous Australian trapshooters as Jack Sutherland (Calrossie), "Horrie" James (Duxbac), Jack Mews and Frank Tubbs.

The Nobel Clay Target Club was formed post World War I at West

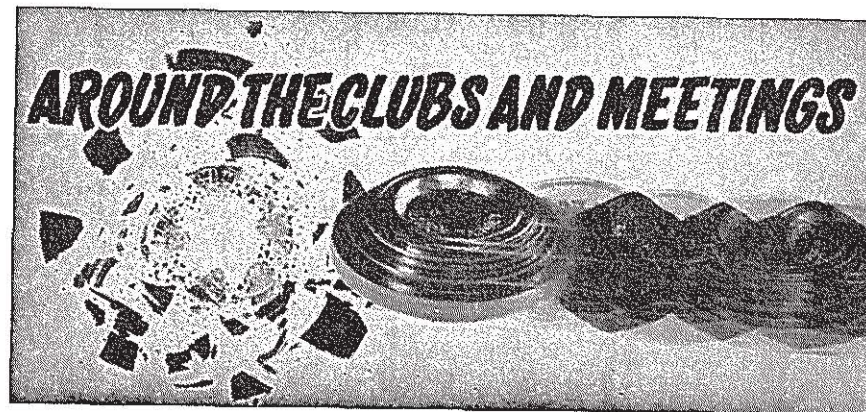
Footscray, with the assistance of the Nobel Company (now known as Imperial Chemical Industries of Australia and New Zealand).

Around 1927, the formation of the Victorian Clay Target Association commenced the organized and ably administered clay pigeon shooting in Australia. Clubs outside Victoria were then invited to join and form a national body—these included the St. George Club of South Queensland, Townsville Club of Northern Queensland, Barellan Club of Southern New South Wales, and the Northern Gun Club (later the Tasmanian Gun Club) at Launceston, Tasmania.

In 1938 Australia was accepted into the International Match against members within the British Commonwealth to compete for the Mackintosh Trophy—this trophy was presented for annual competition by Mr. Donald Mackintosh of Melbourne.

Some 300 clubs throughout the Commonwealth dwindled to five through lack of ammunition during World War II, but quickly re-formed with the Australian Clay Target Association in 1945. In 1947 a bulletin of eight pages was commenced—this has now increased to the hundred-page "Australian Clay Target Shooting News" which is circulated monthly to registered shooters throughout the Commonwealth and overseas.

A team of two shooters represented Australia in the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games, and other Association shooters have represented Australia in the International Shooting Union programmes in Europe.

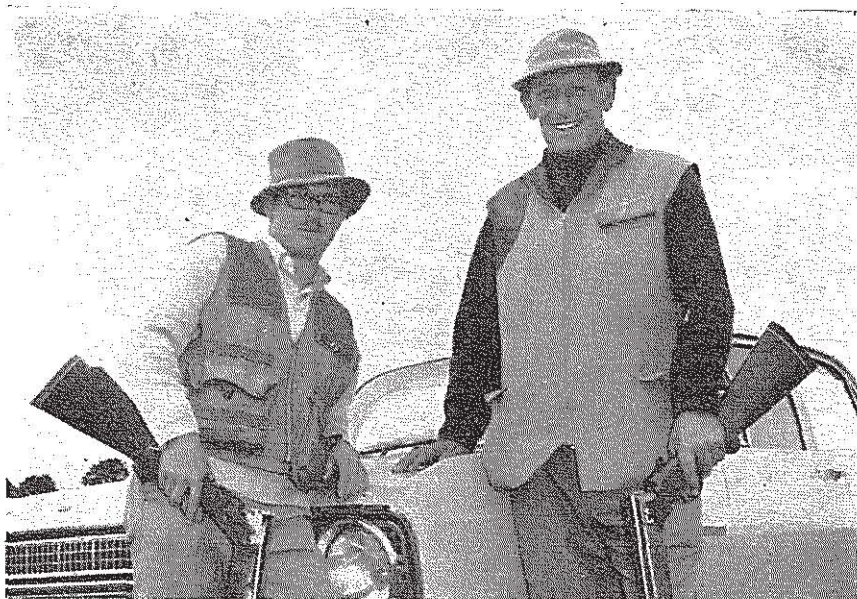

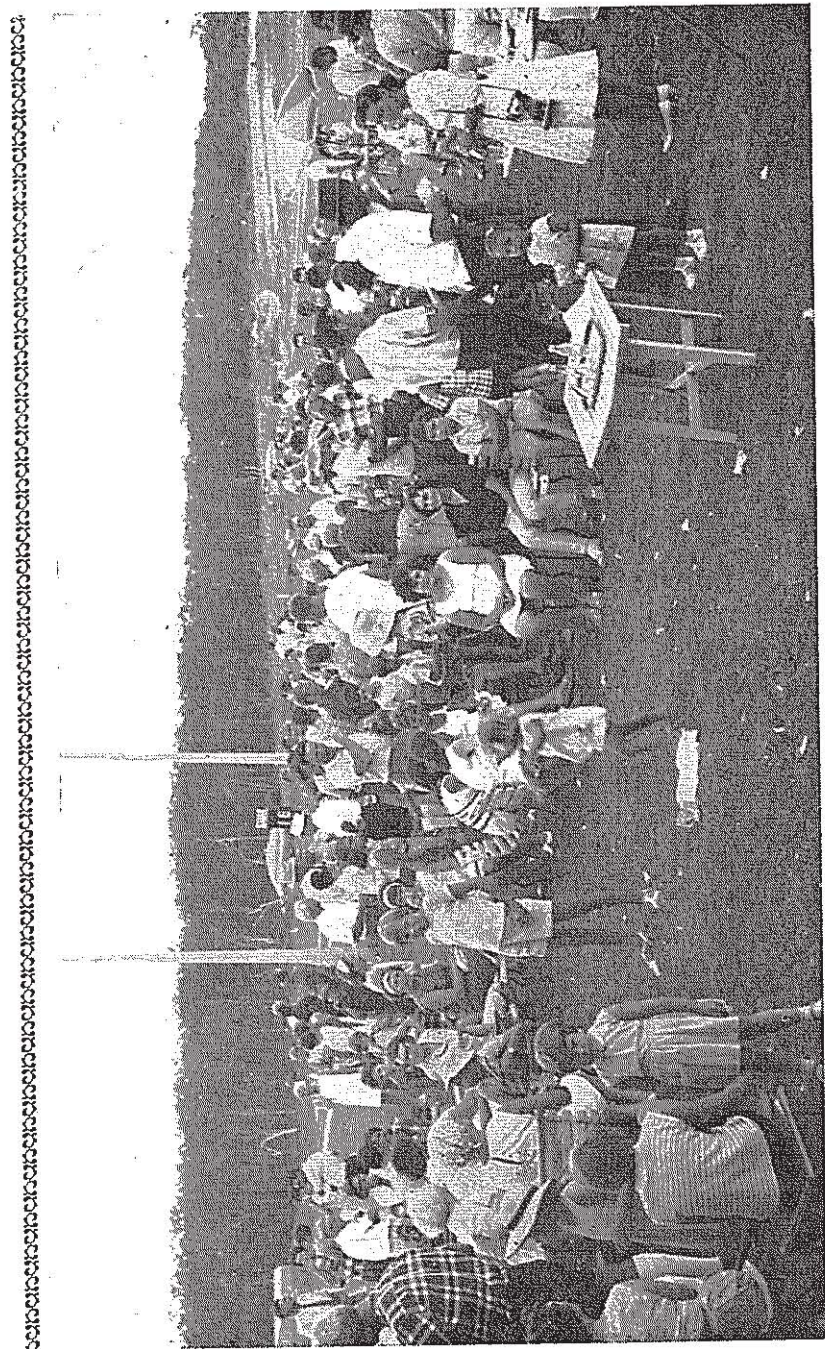
