A.C.T.A. 1969 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1969 (that is Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged, in writing on the prescribed championship form, not later than Friday, August 30, 1968. Such applications shall be collated and submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation.

Member clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted between Jan. 1 and Dec. 31, 1969.

A number of clubs are amending shooter handicap cards, but are not forwarding returns to A.C.T.A. This lack of information being submitted for A.C.T.A. records and publication in the "News" is causing much shooter annoyance and dissatisfaction with particular club reporting.

Owing to some shooters taking an unfair advantage of the new inward handicap provisions, a safety clause is now added until the Executive Committee meeting in October. This is to the effect that NO SHOOTER CAN COME FORWARD MORE THAN TWO YARDS in any six months' period. Any shooter who obtained more concessions than two yards forward at last December handicap must submit his card to his club for re-marking and he must shoot not closer than two yards on his handicap at the 1st January, 1968.

The Maranoa Double-barrel Championship was shot the first event. R. Dean, Nicholson and R. Perkins were the only ones left after the first hour, and then Perkins left with about 70. Then Dean and Nicholson got-off for the record. They were both using Western AA. 1½ oz. targets. R. Dean's Browning automatic broke a small spring and it would load only if he was very careful, and with great strain and loading careful, he did it. Dean won with 388/388, Nicholson 387/388. Dean missed in the eye-opener and Nicholson had all his, so he had 392. Dean, with one in eye-opener and shot 4 in the \$200 Handicap, gave him the Record for Queensland at 393.

A very fine effort by two good shots.

RULES INTERPRETATIONS

Problem

Dated 6/5/68 from Brewarrina, N.S.W.—

Two shooters were in the running for Intermediate High Gun (16 yds.). The first shooter, shooting from 16 yards, had a win in excess of \$13.00 and was re-handicapped in accordance with the A.C.T.A. handicapping formula, putting him on 17 yards for the rest of the shoot.

On completion of the programme, it was seen that this shooter would have won the Intermediate High Gun had he not been re-handicapped (he did not win the over-all High Gun).

There was some argument over whether, having commenced shooting the programme on 16 yards, he was eligible for the Intermediate High Gun or not.

Decision

Shooter who starts shooting on 16 yards then has a win in excess of 13 dollars, Penalty one (1) yard. This shooter is immediately a 17-yard shooter and is therefore not eligible for Intermediate High Gun.

Commencing to shoot at any programme from 16 yards has no bearing whatever in the awarding of the Intermediate High Gun or, for that matter, any intermediate prize; in your particular case the shooter proved he was not an intermediate shooter when he won a prize or prizes in excess of \$13.00.

1968 NEW ZEALAND TRAP-SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIPS CONDUCTED AT TIMARU

Eleven Australians competed in the 1968 New Zealand National Championships. Those who had shot previously in New Zealand were M. Fuller and F. Hudson (N.S.W.G.C.), D. D. Mackay (Newcastle, N.S.W.), Harry McDiarmid (Guyra, N.S.W.). The new-comers to New Zealand were F. Apted (Victorian G.C.), G. Kable, E. R. Troy (N.S.W.G.C.), A. L. Mar-stella (Gold Coast, Qld.), G. D. C. Seccombe (Coff's Harbour, N.S.W.), G. Smith (Croydon, V.), C. D. Wel-lington (Burdekin, Qld.).

Results throughout the programme were:---

30/3/68. — 15-target Handicap, 135 entries. Australians who shot the possible were G. Smith (Victorian G.C.), A. L. Marstella (South-port, Qld.), E. Troy, M. Fuller (N.S.W.G.C.).

--- 25-target Sweepstake, 141 entries. H. McDiarmid (N.S.W.) shot the possible.

--- 20-target S.B. Handicap, 136 entries. G. Kable, M. Fuller shot the possible.

31/3/68 --- Grand Motor Car Troby shoot, 25 targets off open marks, 120 entries: won by 23 - year - old Kurow motor mechanic, Trevor Appleby. Of 120 entries, 46 shot the possible, but Appleby, a front marker , targets in succession off 18 yards with little success to his credit, was fresh from 14 months in Australia. and shot brilliantly to win the V.W. car.

- 25-target Skeet, 118 entries-possibles included M. Fuller, F. Hudson and E. Troy.

- 15-target Single Rise Handicap, 54 entries. M. Fuller shot the possible.

After two days of low-lying fog, conditions cleared, with an absence of wind.

1/4/68 — 1968 N.Z. Skeet Championship (2 rounds each 25 targets), 137 entries - won by G. W. Shaw (Auckland) on the second round. Seven shot the possible, twelve shot forty-nine, twelve shot forty-eight.

2/4/68 - 1968 N.Z. Clay Sparrow Championship (25 targets off 16 yards) was won by south-lander J. McKenzie (Seaward Downs). Mc-Kenzie and Shaw (who had won the skeet title) were the only competi-tors from the field of 173 to shoot the possible.

- 1968 N.Z. Double Rise Championship (15 pairs off 16 yards), 168 entries, was won by C. F. Gunn (Hastings) with the only possible.

3/4/68 — 1968 N.Z. Single-barrel Championship (50 targets off 16 yards), 158 entries-three possibles: G. Smith (Victorian G.C., Aust.), T. A. Everett (Christchurch) and G. Holmes (Methven). Smith produced the best Australian performance in this tournament and was only downed on the eighth target by the winner, J. R. Thomson (Rotorua), who now has four N.Z. titles to his credit. Seven shooters shot 49.

4/4/68 — 1968 N.Z. Single Rise Championship (50 targets off 18 yards), 222 entries, was won by E. F. Baldock (Greymouth), who shot 107 from R. J. Wasley (Fielding) for second, and H. C. Walker (Haka-taramea) and M. J. Fuller (N.S.W., Aust.) for equal third placing. In conjunction with this event was the N.Z. Junior Single Rise Championship for the best 11 to 13 yd. shooter - this was won by West Coaster V. J. Petersen of Hokitika.

The 1969 New Zealand National Championships will be conducted at Hamilton from Mar. 23 to Mar. 29.

A Cameron - Hogarth Trophy has been allocated to the New Zealand Junior Single Rise Championship, which as from 1968 is to be run in conjunction with the New Zealand Single Rise Ch'ship. This Ch'ship will be awarded each year to the best performer in the New Zealand Single Rise Championship, whose Open Handicap mark is 11, 12 or 13. Any shooter eligible to compete for this title must produce his handicap certificate at time of entry. The winner of this event will receive a trophy order to the value of 20 cents from each entry in the New Zealand Single

Rise Championship, the runner-up to receive a trophy order to the value of 10 cents from each entry. Shoots off if necessary will be held accord-ing to New Zealand Single Rise Championship Conditions.

Following an offer by Mr. M. J. Fuller of Sydney, the Stirling Broadrib Shotgun will now be presented to the first New Zealander winning any of the five annual Australian National Trapshooting Championships.

The Cowra Club was formed on the 22nd December, 1954.

The club functioned with one plus trap on a site approximately 1¹/₂ miles north of Cowra on the Canowindra Road. It was moved to its present location on the Cowra Aerodrome, approximately 2 miles south-west of Cowra on the main Sydney-Adelaide (Mid-Western) Highway on the 28th August, 1955.

Two automatic traps were installed 28/8/1955 and 7/4/1961, and were replaced 1/5/1968 by a Damo Continental and a Damo Standard Trap. Lights were installed 6/10/1963.

Facilities:

- Clubhouse 30' x 40' surrounds sealed with bitumen — kitchen fitted with gas heating, refrigeration and stainless steel sink, cupboards, etc.
- Tracks. 2 sets of cement tracks to 27 yards, all surrounds sealed with bitumen.

Traps. 2 (see above) fitted with additional circuit breakers.

- Lights. Set of 6 Philips N.V. 35 mirror reflected floodlights each throwing 300,000 C.P. of light (total 1,800,000 C.P.).
- Power Plant. 25 K.V.A. 3 phase lighting plant, complete with underground wiring.
- Work to be completed: Skeet and third trap in course of completion — to be completed in 1967 or when finance available. Two electric traps are to be installed in 1968.

Cowra Club is situated on 5 acres of ground which is under the direct control of the Club, fully fenced with steel posts and wire netting. An avenue of 12 plane trees have been planted for shade purposes and are now approximately 15' high.

The Club employs a paid Secretary and a paid ground attendant, who mows the entire area of the Club each month and maintains all facilities in first-class order.
