



perpetual trophy to be awarded, commencing 1969, to the winner of the New Zealand Junior Single Rise Championship shot in conjunction with the National Single Rise title event each year.

The 1969 International Teams match shall be contested under the same conditions as for 1968 but the final division shall be conducted by the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association at Edinburgh, Scotland, on Friday, 18 July, 1969. A cordial invitation is extended to any A.C.T.A. shooter able to visit Scotland at that time.

commencing 9.00 a.m.

100 Target Double Barrel Trap Event
shot in 4 x 25 visits of the 16 yard mark (D.T.L.) — Nomination Fee \$15.00 per shooter.

PROVISIONS — (full details October News).

1. One sighter per shooter at first visit to first trap only.
2. Kills only to count (i.e. 100/100 possible) but countback by points system will adjudicate ties.
3. Scores recorded in classes:
Class 1 = 24-27 yards
Class 2 = 20-23 yards
Class 3 = 17-19 yards

The Mackintosh Trophy conditions from 1966 until 1970 inclusive are as follows:—

Teams of 30 to be pre-selected before the shooting match. Each team member to shoot at 100 down-the-line (16 yard) targets, in squads of five, in four 25-bird stages, one stage from each of four automatic angle traps. Scoring conditions: 3 points for a 1st barrel kill and 2 points for a 2nd barrel kill. The top 25 scores in the team to count for the competition (i.e. Highest possible score — 7500 points).

RULES INTERPRETATIONS

PROBLEM

A shooter calls for a target everything goes correctly up to the cartridge, the primer goes off but the report from the cartridge is definitely weak and the plastic wad stayed in the barrel.

DECISION

A shooter called for a target, pulled the trigger, the primer went off but the report from the gun was very weak and the wad still remained in the barrel. The correct decision is "No Target" as the cartridge was faulty. Rule 41 does not

apply in this case. Irrespective of who loaded the cartridges, factory or home, it is obvious the cartridge was faulty and the shooter in this instance should not be penalised.

This is a very difficult decision for a referee to make and referees in making their decision of a weak cartridge should not be completely guided by the sound the gun makes when fired. The only conclusive proof the referee can have that the cartridge is weak is if the wad remains in the barrel.



CLUB HISTORIES

PERTH (WESTERN AUSTRALIA)

Over September 28/29 the Perth Gun Club will conduct the Koojan Anniversary Handicap within its carnival as part of the 10th Anniversary at the club's new grounds.

Ten years of steady progress have produced five D-T-L traps in line on a level deck, all fitted with electric equipment. Skeet Tower and night shooting are also catered for whilst well grassed lawns surround the clubhouse. Toilets are septic and the club has its own bore and reticulation system.

Other than scheduled programmes, the club is open for practice every Saturday afternoon, plus Wednesdays for mid-week shooting and some 200,000 targets are thrown annually.

In the 1968 National Championships at Adelaide was a shooter who had commenced clay target shooting only


two years before. He shot his way into the Australian Team for the 22nd International Teams' Match.

The photographs show the Tower which is sufficiently back from the 27 yard mark of the tracks of trap number 5. The skeet safety fence is on wheels and can be towed away easily.

With the skeet safety fences in position DTL shooting can take place whilst skeet is being shot on the adjoining layout. For night shooting, additional floodlighting is installed below the "deck level" on both sides of the trap houses. The tower also carries a bracket overhead for attachment of a floodlight.

A service road exists between the front of the traphouses and the ornamental lake so the replenishment of clay targets is a simple matter from a motor vehicle. Piers just out in front of each trap with installations for checking heights of targets. Distance and angle markers are on the far side of the lake.

In 1936 the first shoot of the Camberwell Clay Target Club was held in Ferndale Park, Glen Iris Road, Camberwell. The club then moved to Thomsons Road, Bulleen where it remained until 1936. The pavilion which is still in existence was built by early members from bluestone pitchers with council assistance.

The club went into recess during World War II when the site was occupied by a searchlight unit which succeeded in damaging the club installations, then in 1945, the club when reformed, received £26 compensation from the Defence Department.

Small shoots were conducted until 1964 when suburban expansion required the club to move to its present site of 32 acres, in the Yarra Valley at Yering, leased from the Lands Department.

Some \$10,000 have been spent and the club now has a skeet layout plus three down-the-line traps with room for another three if required plus the beginning of a brick clubhouse. Throughout the more than 30 years of existence, not one serious accident has occurred — this speaks volumes for the value of correct training in the handling of firearms and the administration of the A.C.T.A. safety regulations.

DUTIES OF A REFEREE

It is most necessary that adequate preparations are made to assist the smooth running of a shoot and the duties of the referee in charge on the setting up of the traps. Rule 57 states that the target must be 9 feet from the ground, when 10 yards from the trap, with a margin of tolerance of 18 inches above or below.

There is a tendency among officials to set the trap at 10 feet 6 inches and say that they are within the permissible tolerance. This is not so. The trap so set has no tolerance above, and has 3 feet tolerance below the 9 feet bar. In all cases the trap should be set to throw targets 9 feet high when 10 yards from the trap and should be altered immediately weather conditions cause clays to be thrown outside these limits. All too few clubs set their traps so that they cannot lower them to cope with an oncoming wind.


Traps should be adjusted so that both extreme right and left clays are

thrown at the same angles from the centre. It is quite a simple matter to do this, by standing on No. 1 track and observing at what angle the right target is thrown and then going to No. 5 track and checking on the left target.


On the height of targets—all too few clubs have correct height sticks. These should have a horizontal bar at 9 feet high and another two: one at 7'6" and another at 10'6". To judge the correct heights, referees should stand at right angles to the marker so they can see at what height the targets cross the marker.

If this procedure is carried out prior to the eye-opener event (and/or when weather or trap breakdowns necessitate adjustments), then very little problems should occur during the conduct of any programme.

To construct a height stick within Rule 57, obtain either old water pipe or timber and fashion as follows:—
