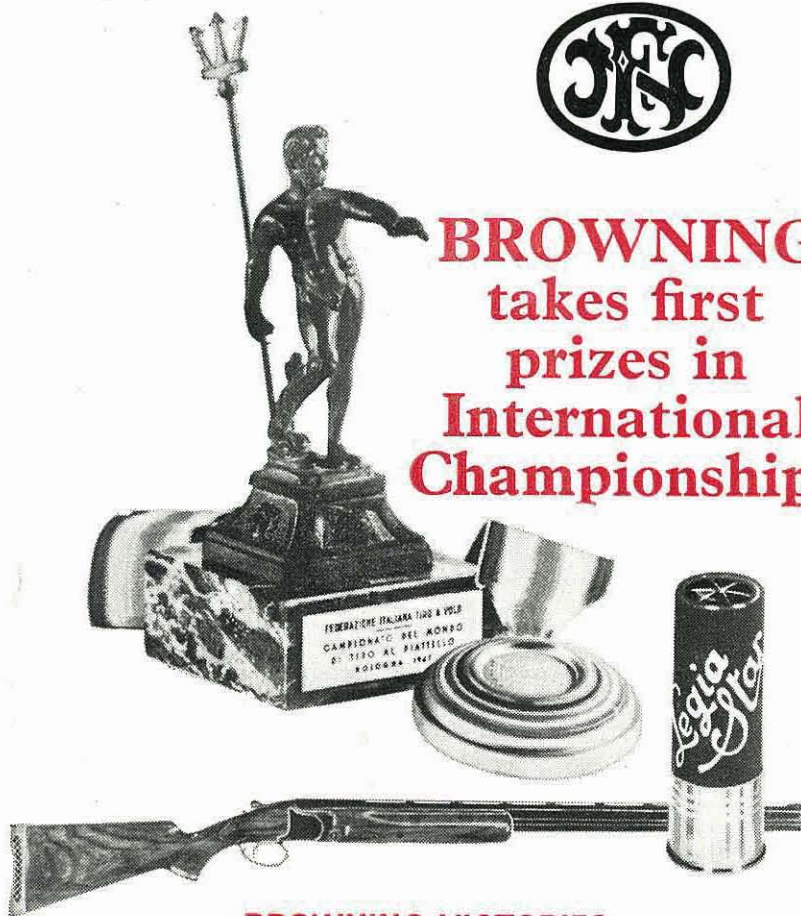

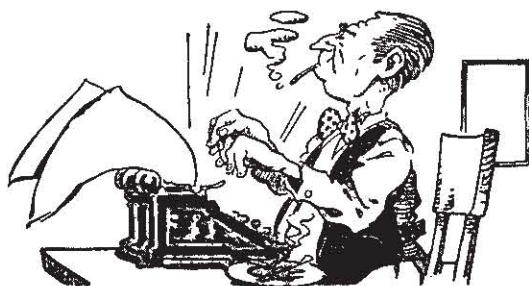
An unknown but potential future champion seen at the 1969 Australian National Trapshooting Championships at Geelong (Vic.), 9 March, 1969.

# The Editor's Notebook



**The A.C.T.A. 33rd Annual General Meeting** of affiliated club delegates and representatives was held at the Carlton Hotel, Geelong, Victoria from 8.30 p.m. until 10.17 p.m. on Sunday, March 9, 1969.

In attendance were 81 shooters as delegates/representatives and a number of observers.

The chairman (a) expressed his sorrow to hear of the road accident to West Australian shooters in Geelong the previous night. They were Nic Tamazoz, Perth, Dave Webb, Albany, and Tex Wells, Busselton.

(b) congratulated the 1968 Australian International Team members for their winning score of 7355/7500 points and Messrs. M. Burgess (Cobar) and S. Marshall (Hobart) for shooting the possible 300/300 points.

(c) congratulated South Australia for winning the Interstate Trap Teams' Match with 495/500.

(d) congratulated Western Australia for winning the Interstate Skeet Teams' Match with 119/125.

(e) congratulated the Australian team for winning the 1968 Australian/New Zealand Trap Teams' Match.

(f) congratulated the Geelong Clay Target Club on the excellence of their grounds and for the smoothness of the shoot.

**Appointment of Auditor** — Mr. R. W. Fox of R. W. Fox, C.A. Gregory and Associates of Moorabbin (Vic.) was re-appointed as Auditor.

Messrs. W. McCullouch and F. Hudson were recommended as Honorary Vice-Presidents of the Association for one year.

The elections for the Executive Committee by the various states were then conducted. Scrutineers of the ballot

papers were R. Burton (Geraldton), F. Lang (Gold Coast), P. Marshall (Hobart). Results were:

**President** — Mr. Gordon H. Hall was elected.

**State of Queensland** — Mr. R. H. Moyle (no opposition).

**State of New South Wales** — Mr. D. B. Mott (no opposition), Mr. K. Oldfield (no opposition).

**State of Victoria** — Mr. E. G. Biggs (no opposition), Mr. E. T. Baldwin (no opposition).

**State of South Australia** — Mr. R. C. Mules (no opposition).

**State of Tasmania** — Mr. D. R. Taylor (no opposition).

**State of Western Australia** — Mr. N. Wells (no opposition).

The meeting decided that the Executive Committee ascertain from member clubs the opinions throughout Australia regarding Olympic shooting.

A.C.T.A. Referees were invited to a discussion on Rules Interpretations on Monday night, March 10 at 8.00 p.m. at the Geelong Clay Target Club. Some 48 interested referees attended and under the Chairmanship of Mr. Gordon Hall the rules for both trap and skeet were discussed at length until 10.30 p.m.

Meetings of the Executive Committee during the Australian National Trapshooting Championships decided:

(a) that the 1970 National Championships be conducted over five days from February 27.

(b) Referees offering their services in Perth can receive payment but reimbursement for accommodation or travel is not available and that honorary referees are permitted to shoot.

(c) that Perth Gun Club would obtain

approval for registered A.C.T.A. trapshooters visting Perth for the 1970 Australian National Trapshooting Championships to use their firearms for trapshooting under the West Australian regulations.

(d-i) that the Trap Handicapping Formula be amended to read "no shooter can be handicapped on a win or division gained in front of his handicap except in graded shoots (see reprint of the formula elsewhere in this publication).

(e) that a State level Continental Trap Double Barrel Championship on which handicapping is applicable be permitted for 1969 (later allocated to Dalby).

(f) that once a shooter passes 16 yards he cannot come back to that mark again.

(g) that clubs have the option of shooting points scoring to promote more

single barrel shooting and eliminate long shoot offs.

(h) that Messrs. R. Burton (Geraldton, W.A.), T. Catling (Katanning, W.A.) and W. Montgomery (Eastern Goldfields, W.A.) be appointed Referee Examiners.

The Commonwealth S.B. Sparrows (night) Championship is allocated to Blackall (Qld.) for 1969.

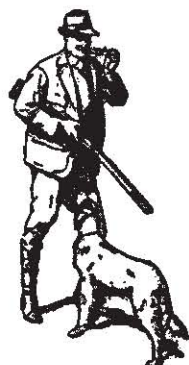

## A.C.T.A. TRAP HANDICAPPING FORMULA

As from January 1, 1969, the following Handicapping Formula, approved by the A.C.T.A. Executive Committee, is effective.

**CASH OR TROPHY VALUE WINS and DIVISIONS (Obtained in ONE EVENT OR AS A TOTAL IN 1 DAY.)**

**12 yarder.** Immediate movement of 1 yard back on receipt of a win of \$2, or division, or equivalent trophy value. (A 12 yarder once having left the mark mentioned cannot be returned to that mark.)

**13 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$4 or equivalent trophy value.

**14 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$7 or equivalent trophy value.

**15 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$10 or equivalent trophy value.

**16 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$13 or equivalent trophy value.

**17 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$15 or equivalent trophy value.

**18 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$17 or equivalent trophy value.

**19 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$19 or equivalent trophy value.

**20 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$20 or equivalent trophy value.

**21 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$22 or equivalent trophy value.

**22 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$24 or equivalent trophy value.

**23 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$26 or equivalent trophy value.

**24 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$28 or equivalent trophy value.

**25 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$30 or equivalent trophy value.

**26 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$32 or equivalent trophy value.

The following will apply to all yardages:

A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$101 to \$300, 2 yards back.

A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$301 to \$400, 3 yards back.

A win or division or equivalent trophy value of \$401 or more, 4 yards back.

### GRADED SHOOTS:

Cash or trophy value wins and/or divisions obtained in any one event or total winnings in any one (1) day.

**12 yarder.** Immediate movement of 1 yard back on receipt of a win of \$4, or division, or equivalent trophy value.

(A 12 yarder once having left the mark mentioned cannot be returned to that mark.)

**13 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$8 or equivalent trophy value.

**14 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$14 or equivalent trophy value.

**15 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$20 or equivalent trophy value.

**16 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$26 or equivalent trophy value.

**17 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$30 or equivalent trophy value.

**18 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$34 or equivalent trophy value.

**19 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$38 or equivalent trophy value.

**20 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$40 or equivalent trophy value.

**21 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$44 or equivalent trophy value.

**22 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$48 or equivalent trophy value.

**23 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$52 or equivalent trophy value.

**24 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$56 or equivalent trophy value.

**25 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$60 or equivalent trophy value.

**26 yarder.** 1 yard back on winning \$64 or equivalent trophy value.

**DEFINITION:** A graded shoot is a competition event (other than a championship) where all competitors shoot from the one or same yard mark and prizes are allocated for various Handicap Yardages.

**OPTIONAL SWEEPSTAKE** winnings and High-gun trophies should **NOT** be included.

Winners of championships or other events gained behind their A.C.T.A. Handicap automatically go back to the mark from which the win or division was obtained.

No shooter can be handicapped on a win or division gained in front of his A.C.T.A. handicap except in graded shoots.

A shooter, once having attained the mark of 16 yards, on merit, cannot come back to that mark again.

### INWARD MOVEMENT

Shooters who compete and shoot right through four consecutive **FULL DAILY PROGRAMMES**, and receive no trophy



or division of any description, may receive inward movement from Club Secretaries (except in case where the shooter concerned is the Secretary, then the President or Club handicapper). Such recommendations must be accompanied by fullest details on the Official Handicap Return Form. No recommendations of more than one (1) yard on each recommendation, unless the shooter is suffering from some physical disability, will be accepted.

No shooter can come forward more than one yard in any six month period.

Recommendations from individuals or personal requests will not be entertained — by order of the Executive Committee.

### GENERAL

Club Presidents and Secretaries are instructed that during any shoot, the management must immediately re-handicap each and every shooter who, for any of the reasons prescribed in the A.C.T.A. Handicapping Formula, qualifies for backward movement off his handicap. Such adjustments are to strictly comply with the Formula. No shooter is to be permitted to compete in another event should he refuse to accept his new mark. Handicap details concerning on-the-spot adjustments are to be forwarded within two days, to the A.C.T.A. official Handicapper for ratification. Should the shooter ignore his latest handicap, irrespective of mark shown in "News", he

will be penalised a further yard if he shoots inside his latest handicap.

Only the Club and Association Handicapper have authority to amend shooters' Handicap Cards.

Club managements have the right to re-handicap any obviously under-handicapped shooter immediately, providing the Association is notified within TWO DAYS and the reason given on a Handicap Return Form. If these details are not completed, such handicap movement cannot be ratified.

No shooter can come forward more than ONE yard in any six month period.

Clubs when registering a shooter for the first time must clearly indicate whether the shooter is a complete novice gun handler, or has had field or other experience, before a 12-yard mark can be approved. Failure to provide this information will result in the shooter being placed on 16 yards.

No handicaps are assessed on Tower, Deauville Doubles, Double-Rise, Walk-Up and Mixed Targets. All other novelty contests to be handicapped in accordance with this Formula.

Club managements are informed that a Handicap Return must accompany every result sheet forwarded to the A.C.T.A. office within SEVEN DAYS of each shoot being held. (Handicap Return Pads are available on application to the A.C.T.A., Box 2038 S, G.P.O., Melbourne, 3001.)

## NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP RESULTS

The 1969 Australian National Trapshooting Championships were conducted in absolutely perfect weather over the six successive days Friday to Wednesday, March 7 to 12 inclusive. Temperatures were in the high 70's to low 90's.

The grounds of the Geelong Clay Target Club were a sight to behold and all present were loud in their praise of the choice of venue. The grounds themselves were in top class condition with five traps operating using Winchester traps. The throwing of targets throughout the programme was faultless and many shooters expressed their praise of these traps. As one prominent shooter has written, "It was one of the most enjoyable and certainly the smoothest run International I have attended."

Shooters with their wives and friends enjoyed full meals at the catering marquee from 7.00 a.m. until 4.00 p.m. daily. The area between traps one and five was kept free from vehicular traffic to enable shooters and spectators full access to the grounds. The new brick clubhouse was made available to shooters and spectators as a rest area. All cars were accommodated on or adjacent to the club grounds.

Event One — The Australian National Champion of Champions event for the Mackintosh Perpetual Cup was shot on Day One, Friday, March 7 under a cloudless sky and commenced at 8.40 a.m. as the sun was reflecting on the water of Corio Bay immediately ahead of the traps which face due east. Some 221 shooters contested the event and four were in a shoot off for the main placings.

First placegetter was Ray Morrison of Victorian Gun Club (V.), 54/54, who received from A.C.T.A. President, Mr. J. M. Tyquin, for 12 months the Mackintosh Champion of Champions Cup and also a personal trophy with the compliments of Evans and Balfour Pty. Ltd., (Melbourne Gunsmiths); second was Vin Ryan of Gosgrove (V.), 53/54; third was Sperry Marshall of Hobart (Tas), 64/65; fourth was J. Newton-Thomas of Melbourne (V.), 63/65; fifth was Brian Kable of New South Wales Gun Club (N.S.W.), 51/52, and the 12/16 yarder was L. Crema of Hawkesbury (N.S.W.), 49/50.

Event Two, a \$300 value 25 target

Double Barrel Cartridge Handicap followed in which 11 shooters shot the possible and divided.

On Saturday, March 8, the Australian National Double Barrel Championship for the J. M. Wilson Perpetual Cup was conducted from 9.10 a.m., because of earlier reflection of the sun on the waters of the bay. Thirty-two shooters shot the possible 50 targets and after a marathon shoot-off until dusk between Doug Smith (Qld.) and Sperry Marshall (Tas.), Doug emerged the winner with 363/363 and Sperry with 362/363. Third placegetter was M. Burgess of Cobar (N.S.W.), 175/176; Ian Campbell of Adelaide, fourth, 171/172; Hilary Baynes of Adelaide, 121/122; and sixth place to Jim Anderson of Melbourne with 101/102. This appears to be a record where a group of some six shooters each shot over 100 targets in an event then had to shoot on to establish the respective placegetters.

In conjunction with the Australian National Double Barrel Championship was the Australian National Intermediate Double Barrel Championship in which from some 56 shooters, 15 year old Geoffrey Mark of Ballarat (V.) shot the possible 50/50 to become the 1969 Intermediate Trapshooting Champion. Second was another young shooter R. Williams of Hay (N.S.W.) with 79/80. Third was R. Barrett of New South Wales Gun Club (N.S.W.), 78/80.

On the third day Sunday, March 9, shooting commenced at 12.15 p.m. as under Victorian State Law clay target shooting is permitted between noon and 6.00 p.m. on Sundays. Event Number 5 the Australian National Double Rise Championship for the J. M. Tyquin Perpetual Cup drew an attendance of 200 shooters with no shooter shooting the possible, but four had gained 47/50. From a shoot-off Tony Salafia of Griffith (N.S.W.), 53/56, was the winner from L. Crema of Hawkesbury (N.S.W.), 52/56, second and R. Mayberry, Metropolitan (V.), 50/54, third.

Event Number 5b (additional) followed. This was amended to be a 20 target Double Barrel Cartridge Handicap and under the Compulsory Division arrangements some 27 shooters divided having shot the possible 20/20 targets.

Day 4, Monday, March 10, Event Number 6, the Australian National Single Barrel Championship for the W. Rainbird Perpetual Cup was commenced at 8.50 a.m. on Monday, March 10. Presentations for this event were made by newly elected A.C.T.A. President, Mr. Gordon Hall, and from seven shooters with a possible 50/50 score the eventual winner was Noel Davis of Noorat (V.) with a score of 57/57. Second placing went to J. Harris of C.M.T. (Cunderdin, W.A.), 56/57. Third was Eric McCullough of Echuca (V.), 55/56. Some 17 shooters shot 49/50 in this event.

Event Number 7 was a \$300 value Double Barrel Cartridge Handicap, Compulsory Divide and 12 shooters shared.

On Day 5, Tuesday, March 11, the Australia/New Zealand Championship was contested from 9.15 a.m. by some 182 shooters. This was a 50 target points scoring event in which four shooters shot and scored the possible 150 points. First placegetter receiving the sash was A. E. (Ted) Wilkinson of Mildura (V.), 198/198. Second was Alf James of Bendigo (V.), 212/213. Third was F. Burns of Werribee (V.) 211/213. A \$300 value Double Barrel Cartridge Handicap followed in which 8 shooters after shooting the possible 25 targets, divided under the Compulsory Division arrangements.

On Day 6, Wednesday, March 12, the Australian Section of the International Teams Match was conducted from 8.10 a.m. Thirty top Australian shooters had progressively shot themselves into the 30 man Australian team to contest this 100 target, double barrel, points scoring event. Scores were immediately sealed and shall not be available until after July 18 when the final section shall com-

pete at Edinburgh, Scotland. It is noted with pride that Australia has already won this coveted event eight times in the last eleven years, and it was strange to see a rabbit amidst all this shooting calmly enjoying the fresh grass in front of track four.

Annually the Association honours the three highest placegetters in the Australian Section of the International Teams' Match.

The High Gun winner receives an Association sash, a sterling silver badge from Messrs. I.C.A.N.Z. Ltd., and he also holds for the following twelve months the J. M. Bauman Gold Cup which is shot for in perpetuity.

Four shooters V. Ryan (Cosgrove, V.), D. McCraith (Australian, V.), M. Burgess (Cobar, N.S.W.) and J. Newton-Thomas (Australian, V.) were equal top scorers. There are many gentlemen among clay target shooters and it was received with acclamation by the hundreds of spectators, the announcement that two of these shooters, J. Newton-Thomas and M. Burgess, who had already won this coveted award several times in the past years would withdraw from the high gun shoot off. From a shoot off Vin Ryan of Cosgrove (V.) emerged the 1969 International High Gun Winner with a score of 321/321 and Don McCraith of Australian (V.) 320/321 was second High Gun Scorer. The crowd showed further appreciation when J. Newton-Thomas conceded third High Gun placing to Malcolm Burgess of Cobar (N.S.W.) 300/300. This was the first time in the long history of clay target shooting in Australia that four shooters shot the full 300/300 score in this points scoring event.

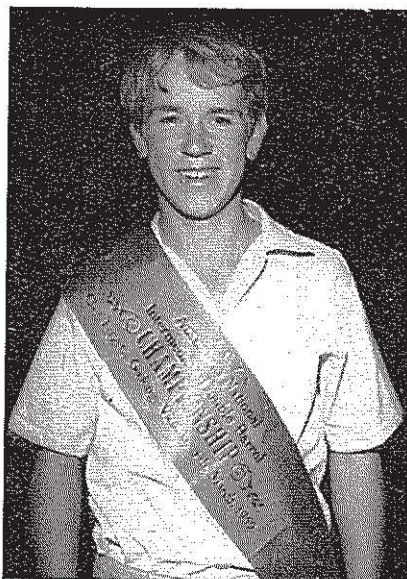

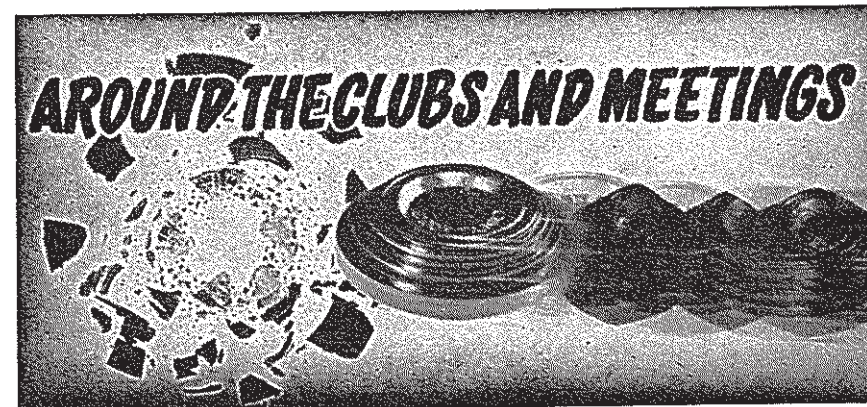
