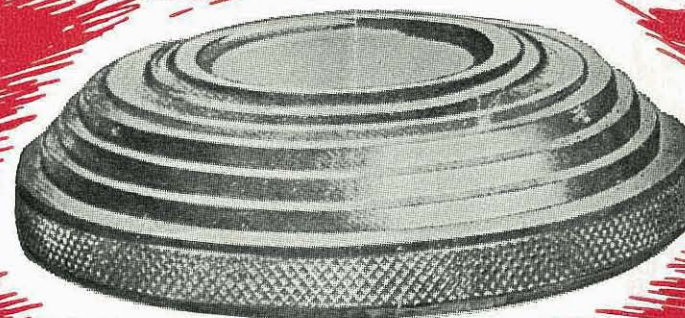

The Editor's Notebook



A.C.T.A. 1970 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1970 (that is Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged, under Rule 27 by member clubs, in writing on the prescribed form number 16, not later than Friday, August 29, 1969.

Such applications are then collated and submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation. The allocated championships for the calendar year 1970 shall then be published in December 1969 Clay Target Shooting News.

Clubs then choose their considered

1970 programmes to include these allotted title events and submit shoot requests (Form 16) for consideration, showing the required date(s) concerned.

Approvals are subject to correct interpretations of A.C.T.A. Rules and are designed to avoid clashing of major programmes with nearby clubs.

Member clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted between January 1 and December 31, 1970.

Commonwealth, State or District Championships will not be allocated to clubs who fail either to apply the handicapping formula or to submit handicap returns for each shoot.

No trophies or prize monies may be handed to any shooters without the previous submission of current handicap cards — see Rule 18.

1970 AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL TRAP-SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Never before has the National Title Series been conducted in Western Australia and our attendance figures are expected to equal those established at each of the other venues.

Most of us leave things till the last possible minute, but all concerned are requested to make travel and/or accommodation bookings to Perth NOW, to include the five successive days of clay target shooting scheduled for February 28 to March 4, 1970.

This could be the trip that you have been waiting for and we believe that nothing has been left to chance. The weather should be good, the Perth Gun Club grounds dazzle in their brilliance and every facility has been checked, tested and re-checked.

Perth and its environs have much to offer before, during and after the Nationals and, yet to be publicized are some other interesting sportsman/shooter attractions. (Would you be interested in going duck shooting and/

or out fishing for lobster or Spanish mackerel?)

A referee discussion night will probably be held to assist a broader understanding and common interpretation of our clay target shooting rules for both trap and skeet followers.

Perth Gun Club will probably conduct a barbecue during one evening when everyone will leave the guns in their cases and get down to really meeting each other over a cooked chop, sausage or steak.

At this stage it's later than you think and time is advancing on us all, so please start your preparations and

1. Book your accommodation and travel (we recommend the specialists who advertise with us — Patrick Travel Service of 35 William Street, Melbourne (phone 61-2941) or their interstate offices, 35 Pitt Street, Sydney (phone 27-6611) or Maritime Building, 431 Queen Street, Brisbane (phone 311-871).

2. Note that the Western Australian State Laws require that all firearms must be registered in that State, so the procedure is:— "All shooters must present handicap cards and firearms at the FIRST police station encountered in Western Australia for the purpose of licensing. Licences will permit the use of firearms for both competition and sport by the holder."

(EDITOR'S NOTES:

(a) Licence is \$1.00 per shooter, which covers each of your trap, your skeet and field shotguns.

or arrive Perth by sea or air at, say, 2 a.m., the Police would probably appreciate you delaying your licencing call until after 10.00 a.m.)

3. A further State law may be enacted during 1969 requiring a \$2.00 duck shooting licence by each prospective duck shooter.

(EDITOR'S NOTE: Open season for duck shooting in W.A. varies slightly from region to region, but usually encompasses a period commencing mid-January through till April 30.)

4. WOULD ALL SHOOTERS, IRRESPECTIVE OF WHETHER GOING TO PERTH FOR THE 1970 NATIONALS, OR NOT, PLEASE FORWARD 1970 SHOOTER REGISTRATION FEES THROUGH YOUR GUN CLUB SECRETARY DURING NOVEMBER OR DECEMBER OF THIS YEAR 1969, SO THAT 1970 HANDICAP CARDS CAN BE PROCESSED TO BE WITH YOU FOR THE NEW YEAR COMMENCEMENT AND FOR THE POLICE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE 1970 NATIONALS.

5. Mark your calendar — Perth February 28 to March 4 — and make your arrangements. (Otherwise — pull up the ladder, Jack, we've made arrangements for ourselves.)

CLAY TARGET SHOOTING ON SUNDAYS — STATE OF VICTORIA

Permission is subject to approval by the Victorian Government Chief Secretary through the controlling central body (in this case, the A.C.T.A.) and such approval is for

(a) a specific date or dates during the year July 1st to the following June 30;

(b) shooting only at clay targets between the hours of 12.00 noon and 6.00 p.m. on Sundays.

The A.C.T.A. forwards its considered support, when requested, with the prescribed application forms.

At least six weeks in advance of the Sunday shoot date concerned, clubs must submit through A.C.T.A.:

1. Standard A.C.T.A. shoot request form number 16 (green), showing proposed programme and date(s) concerned.

2. "Sunday shooting" forms number 40 (white). (NOTE: Four copies must be completed, of which the club secretary is to lodge one with the club's local municipal authority, another with the officer-in-charge of the Police station nearest to the gun club range, thence two copies to A.C.T.A. for submission to the Chief Secretary's office.)

When Chief Secretary approval (or otherwise) is received, A.C.T.A. will advise the club of the decision.

It was decided to hold the first shoot on a proclaimed public holiday (King's Birthday)."

KERANG (V.) — Prominent shooter Rex Peacock, who is currently on an overseas tour, is reported by our friends across the Pacific, the Amateur Trap-shooting Association of America, "We were very pleased to have your Mr. Rex Peacock join us for the Ohio State shoot on the grounds at Vandalia last week. A Victorian State break record of 122 straight skeet targets was established by Keith Paterson, a member of the Metropolitan Clay Target Club, on June 14 at the Metropolitan C.T. Club; however, this was eclipsed by Roy Fallshaw, a member of Australian G.C. (now in recess), at the Geelong Clay Target Club on June 19, 1969, with his score of 149/150 targets.

SKEET AT BRISBANE GUN CLUB

June 22 saw the first 100-target Skeet Day conducted by the Brisbane Gun Club on their grounds at Belmont, Qld.

Skeet was introduced to Brisbane for the Winchester Tournament last year on a single lay-out using the 1956 Olympic traps, much converted, as the basis.

Popularity of the sport grew rather quickly, so during their trip to Geelong for the 1969 Nationals, Bill Edwards, Club President, and Ian Mathieson, Club Skeet Captain, negotiated the purchase of a set of Winchester Auto-loading Skeet traps.

These were installed in April and have been proven highly successful, particularly with the new Bronze-wing targets I.C.I. have produced.

Perth Gun Club, like Brisbane, is highly efficient and progressive and vied with Brisbane for the purchase of the only set of Winchester Skeet traps available. When Brisbane were successful with their purchase, Jules Steiner, Perth's President, threw out a challenge to Bill Edwards for a 1,000-target Skeet match.

Perth ran up a score of 931/1000 a few weeks ago when they conducted

their shoot, at which they had more than 60 shooters, the top ten comprising the club's team.

Brisbane put up the quite respectable score of 917/1000 on June 22, when 30 shooters attended.

We recommend to any enterprising club which may be contemplating the introduction of Skeet to go ahead, as the sport complements trap shooting and definitely brings in new shooters.

The Queensland State Skeet Championship will be conducted at Brisbane over the second week-end of our mammoth August Exhibition Shoot and we invite all shooters from the frigid South to come up and enjoy the hospitality of Queensland, the sunshine State.

When issued, the licences will permit the use of the firearms for both competition and sport by the holder.

The matter of the "Shooter's Licence" is one between the shooter and the Fauna Protection authorities.

After the last event we were treated to a supper that was absolutely superb. The ladies have the thanks from all who attended. Geraldton would not be the same club without the friendly, enthusiastic support from their women-folk.

At Charters Towers (Q.) the Queensland Walk-up Championship was won in brilliant style by Sam Bell of Pow-lathanga, who registered 22/25 to win outright.

The now seldom heard of Jerilderie Club, over the Murray in New South Wales, was opened at this period in 1949 by Jock Wilson, the then President of the A.C.T.A. Eighty-one shooters attended and the Melbourne shooter, Jack McCraith, won the main event.

At Sale (V.) George Biggs won the Gippsland Double-barrel Championship with the only 20 straight.

Fred Burns (Footscray, V.) won the 1949 Champion of Champions Cup event with the splendid score of 59/60.

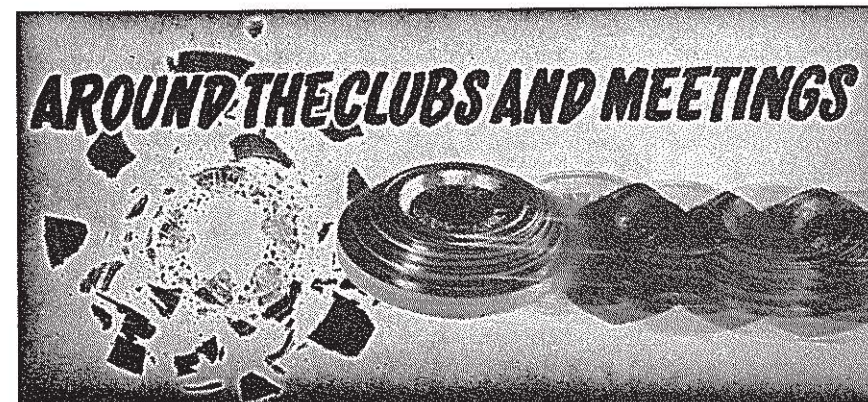
