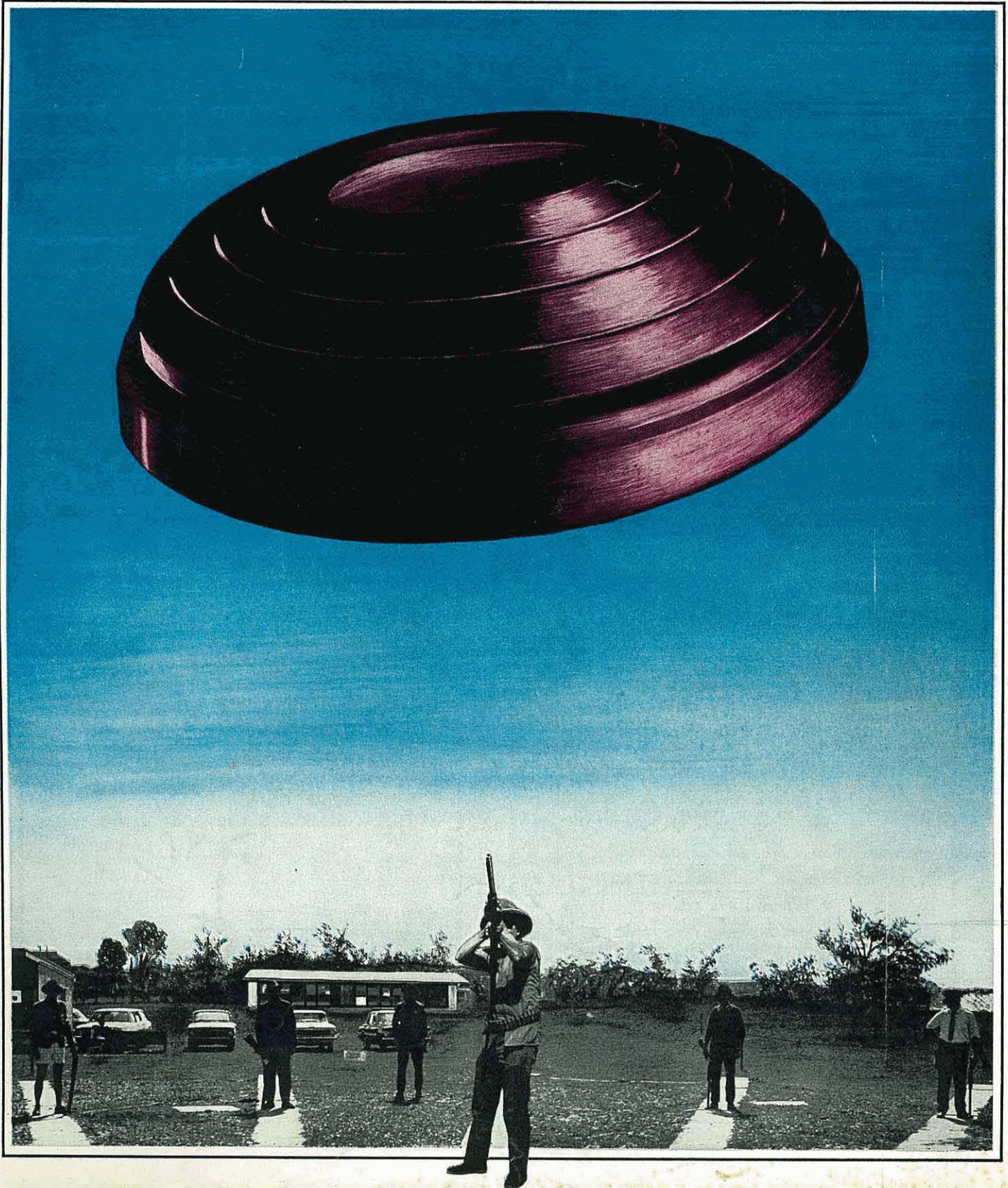

Editor's Notes



As the 1970 Australian National Clay Championships, conducted at the Perth Gun Club, were not concluded until March 5, complete details of the results were not available for publication in this issue. However, full information of the programme will be published in May "Clay Target Shooting News," meanwhile a "STOP PRESS" of the major placegetters is contained in this edition.

Results of the ballots at the 34th Annual General Meeting conducted on March 2 at the Rivervale Hotel, Perth were:—

President: Mr Gordon H. Hall (re-elected unopposed).

Executive Committee: State of Queensland; Mr L. S. R. Stewart (re-elected unopposed).

State of New South Wales; Mr A. E. Cregan, Mr K. S. Soames (re-elected unopposed).

State of Victoria; Messrs A. Pedersen and H. Smith were re-elected.

State of South Australia; Mr R. C. Mules (re-elected unopposed).

State of Tasmania; Mr D. R. Taylor (re-elected unopposed).

State of Western Australia, Mr N. Wells (re-elected unopposed).

Results of the 23rd International Trap Teams' Match shall not be available until all other competing countries have conducted their matches, of which the final series for 1970 shall be at Leamington Spa, Warwickshire, England on Friday, July 17. Australian shooters have a cordial welcome awaiting those who can attend on July 17.

Clubs and shooters alike have responded well to the request for early registration for this 1970 year. All cards have been processed and mailed immediately and Club shooter records have agreed with the Association handicap register.

Rules clarification — the conditions for the Australian National Intermediate Single Barrel Championship were misprinted in the Rules Section of December 1969, "Shooting News" and also in the Rules Brochure in that the competition uses one barrel only.

As the previously advised NSW venue is not now available the 1971 Australian National Clay Target Championships shall be conducted at the Brisbane Gun Club (Queensland) during June to include the Queen's Birthday weekend.

EAR PROTECTION FOR THE SHOOTER

Investigations show that many efficient and acceptable ear protective devices are available providing a range of noise protection sufficient to reduce nearly all excess noise to a safe limit.

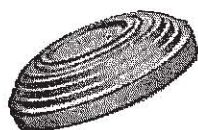
Types of ear protectors available are ear muffs, ear plugs (ear defenders), canal caps and medically approved fibre glass wool. Special fibre glass wool and wax impregnated cotton wool balls are disposable.

Noise from shotguns could cause acoustic trauma or deafness. This takes the early form of ringing in the ears and initially this causes a temporary deafness then the hearing is restored after a few hours.

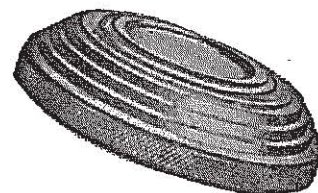
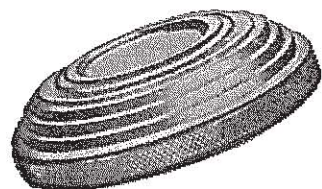
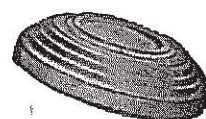
In a comparison between ear muffs and ear plugs, personal preference would be a deciding factor. It could be put forward that most earmuffs would be preferable to plugs because they are relatively easier to make an airtight seal over the large, almost flat surface of the side of the head, rather than is the case with ear plugs, namely inside the narrow irregular shaped ear canal. However a satisfactory ear plug can also give adequate protection. Ear muffs give greater attenuation and are obviously required as the excess noise levels become greater.

For consistent trapshooting, ear muffs are probably the greatest protection available, however, in addition there are various types of plugs, and special fibre glass wool for those shooters who are unable to tolerate the weight and pressure of ear muffs.

It should be remembered that once hearing is lost, there is no regeneration and shooters should give serious thoughts to the wearing of ear protectors when these are so readily available.

DENTIST FINDS MARK IN CLAY PIGEON SHOOTING

A semi-retired dentist who took up clay pigeon shooting only nine years ago won the Northern District DB Night Championship at Newcastle Gun Club.

He is Mr Frank Clarke, 73, of Merewether West.

When Mr Clarke moved to his home at Merewether 20 years ago he decided he would continue his dental practice in a spare room of the house.

Now he mainly fills in as an after-hour dentist and has a small clientele.

Much of his time is spent studying ways of improving his shooting.

He joined Newcastle Gun Club in 1961 and his win on Saturday night was his third major trophy.

He won a competition in Scone three years ago, and a gun at a special shoot in 1967.

Thirty-five shooters competed in the Championship, including top men from Cessnock, Dungog and Scone.

Shooting in a stiff southerly wind, Mr Clarke shot a possible 25/25 and in the following event shot 10/10.

Second was former champion Bill Collis.

Mr Clarke spends a lot of his time reading new techniques on shooting.

He also makes his own cartridges on a machine bought in America.

The machine is semi-automatic and fits the shot, powder and cap by pulling a handle.

Mr Clarke said the machine cost about \$170 but it halved the cost of cartridges.

His son Ian Clarke is President of the Club and another dentist son (Neil Thorn-Clarke) shoots at the Grenfell (NSW) Club.

Mildura Gun Club

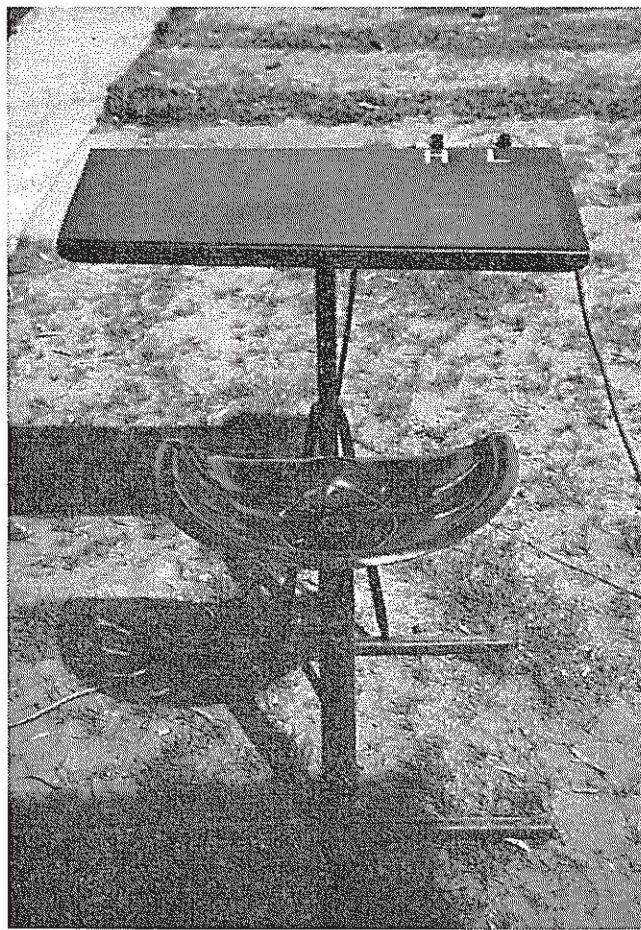
Mildura Gun Club (Vic.) like many other Clubs has a staunch and hard working group.

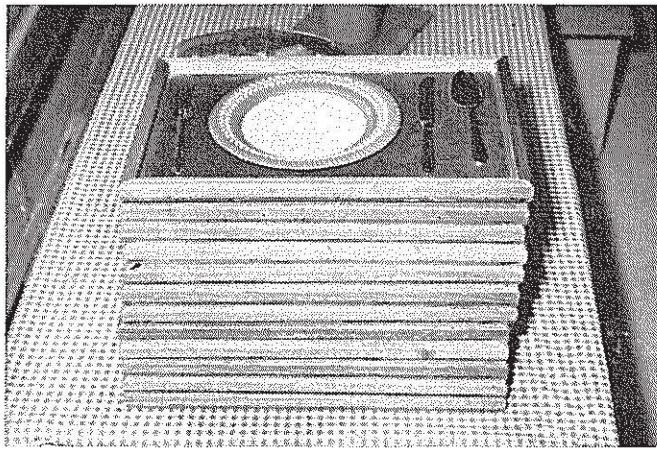
Some of the features, not shown in the following photographs, include seats under a covered walkway behind tracks one and two with a ti-tree brush fence at the rear as a wind break. The adjacent septic toilet and ablution block is first class.

The Club has recently installed a skeet ground and is soon to host a friendly inter-club skeet challenge match with teams from the Melbourne Metropolitan area. Mildura is 350 miles from Melbourne on the

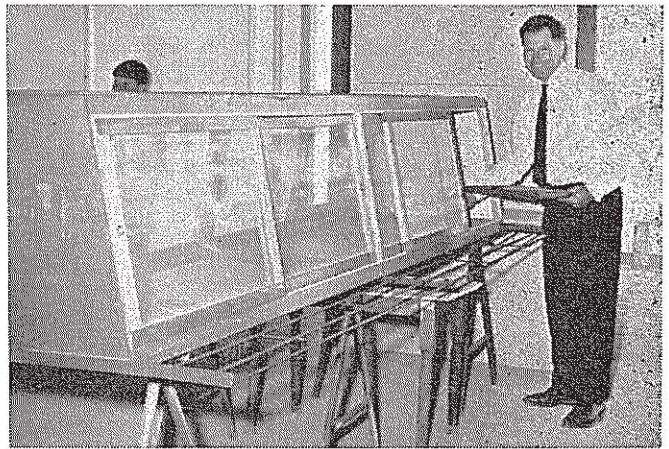
River Murray and is the recognised centre of adjacent South Australia and New South Wales Clubs.

Electric release is essential, of the targets from the high and low trap houses, in skeet shooting. Mildura Gun Club Secretary, L. Connors, designed this easily portable table for the "puller." How many of us when moving from station to station forget the target sequence whether it be singles or doubles or from the high or low trap houses. Note the clearly marked H (High) and L (Low) button release switches. There are very few problems (if any) at Mildura.
