

ACTA 1971 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1971 (that is, Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged under Rule 27 by member Clubs, in writing on the prescribed form number 16, not later than Friday, July 31, 1970.

Such applications shall be collated and submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation. Member Clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships which can be satisfactorily conducted between January 1 and December 31, 1971.

The allocated championships for the calendar year 1971 shall be published in December 1970 "Clay Target Shooting News."

From this published list of allocations, Clubs then choose their own respective 1971 programmes to include these title events as so allotted, and submit shoot requests (Form 16) to A.C.T.A. for consideration, showing the required date(s) concerned.

Approvals are subject to correct interpretations of A.C.T.A. Rules and are designed to avoid clashing of major programmes with nearby Clubs.

Commonwealth, State or District championships will not be allocated to Clubs who fail to either apply the handicapping formula correctly or who fail to submit handicap returns for each shoot.

No trophies or prize monies may be handed to any shooters without the previous submission of current handicap cards — Rule 18.





Toowoomba (Q) — office-bearers elected or confirmed 3/5/70 were President, J. R. Wickham; Treasurer, Mrs J. Crothers; Secretary, Mrs H. E. Wickham.

In the United States of America a bill, which could be the first step to outlaw the possession and use of handguns in U.S.A. was introduced into the U.S.A. House of Representatives on March 3, 1970. The bill states in its findings that the annual sales of handguns have quadrupled since 1963, "that handguns play a major and disproportionate role (as compared to long guns) in crimes of violence"... "that licensing and restrictions on sale of new handguns will not significantly reduce handgun crime and handgun violence"... "that handguns in the home are not necessarily of great value for self defence." "A pistol club would have a licence granted to it upon application to the treasury for a fee of \$21... members over 21 years of age... club maintaining possession and control of the handguns used... keeping in a secure place." The bill would take effect one year from enactment.

(Statements in the findings undoubtedly were meant to separate the sportsmen into two groups — handguns from long guns).

For the information of all attending the shoot, the Brisbane Gun Club is situated on a portion of the Queensland Rifle Range—thus the respective rifle, pistol and shotgun shooting ranges are within a composite area.

The Brisbane Gun Club is situated on Mount Petrie Road, Belmont. This is nine miles south-east of the Brisbane General Post Office, on the Old Cleveland Road. It is just off the Pacific Highway and only some 35 miles along the highway from the Gold Coast beach

and pleasure resort area.

Value for money accommodation (not available through travel agents or outside sources) may be applied for, direct to the Brisbane Gun Club (see club advertisement for address in this publication). Such accommodation is only available on first applications received basis and is within the following two categories:

- Some shooters may seek recommended bachelor quarters—at the rifle range and within walking distance of the shotgun trap area—is a brick building of motel units containing some 20 rooms which could hold up to 100 (male only) shooters for whom beds, sheets and blankets are provided for about \$8 per shooter per week. Meals are available in the adjacent Queensland Rifle Association clubhouse. These are new units and are clean and comfortable. Toilets and ablution areas are communal.
- 2. For those shooters seeking a close-by caravan park—such a park with facilities, is also part of this Commonwealth-owned shooting area, and sites cost about \$3 per week.

Letters... TO THE EDITOR

EDITOR COMMENT: As costs are a concern of us all, a copy of the following letter was mailed to each of the major sporting ammunition manufacturers in Australia, seeking their comments. The replies, as received, are published hereunder:

To the Editor, Dear Sir,

What a ludicrous situation the sport of trap shooting is developing into. A nation-wide sport enjoyed by thousands of shooters from all walks of life.

But a sport that is continually blighted by unexplained price rises.

There have been three cartridge price rises in the past twelve months with at the same time proportionate increases in home loading components.

To add to this a most recent increase in the price of clay targets.

A Gun Club recently was informed that their cheque for an order for 1000 clays was only sufficient for 800 owing to the price rise, and if the balance of the order was required a further cheque was first needed.

This Club has been dealing with this firm for a good number of years.

Just where can we expect all this to end.

There has been no explanation for this latest steep clay target increase and it is making the running of the Gun Clubs extremely difficult.

With falling attendances and spiralling costs it appears as if the ammunition companies are cutting their own throats.

The Australian Government is not assisting either, for example, the price quoted for a new automatic trap included 50 per cent for taxes.

They claim of course they are protecting the local manufacturer, but need it be 50 per cent?

The problems fall directly into the lap of the shooter. Do we take it like lambs or do we protest loud and strongly?

Thank you for sending us a copy of the letter from Warrnambool Gun Club dated 20th April regarding the cost of trap shooting.

This letter opens with the sentence, "what a ludicrous situation the sport of trap shooting is developing into" and with as much feeling we could say "what a ludicrous profit situation the sport of trap shooting is developing into for ammunition manufacturers."

It is true that there have been three cartridge price increases in the past 12 months but the important point is that these are the only increases since August, 1968, and amount to only 12 per cent in total. In the United States there have been two increases in three months prices were advanced on 1st January by 6 per cent and again on 1st April by a further 4 per cent. The 12 per cent increase since August, 1968, in Australia was justified as a result of increased costs of wages, freight, packing and raw materials such as imported powder and plastic tubing. Over and above these items the industry has had to face up to phenomenal increases in the two principal raw materials—lead and copper. In August, 1968, the price of lead was \$242 per long ton and has now risen to an all time record of \$303, an increase of 25 per cent. In the same period copper has advanced 62 per cent from 45 cents to 73 cents per lb. Shooters will appreciate that ammunition manufacturers consume very large quantities of lead and to a lesser extent, copper.

Back in the early 1950's we made a nominal profit on the sale of clay targets and it has been our long established policy to keep the price as low as possible to assist the promotion of trap shooting. Recently the stage was reached where we could no longer continue to block earlier program and sall clay to refer at a long. to absorb cost increases and sell clay targets at a loss. The recent price increase, which was the first since 1968, has resulted in a reduction in our loss but not a

On the three occasions since 1968 when it became necessary to increase our selling prices a letter was posted to every customer on our books throughout Australia and the following is an extract of the letter sent on the 10th March:

"Despite our continued efforts to achieve cost savings through improved manufacturing techniques, we are severely handicapped by constant rising costs, particularly raw materials. Although there is some possibility that world prices for copper and lead might be more stable in the future the current rates are so high that a price increase on our range of sporting ammunition is inevitable."

In view of the history of manufacturing and selling cost increases and the fact that prices have advanced only 12 per cent since August, 1968, we cannot reconcile the comment made by the Warrnambool Gun Club that it is "a sport that is continually blighted by unexplained price rises."

For over 25 years we have given very solid support to the promotion of trap shooting in Australia, not only by donations of trophies, cartridges and clay targets to individual clubs and to the National Championships each year but also by conducting shooting schools and other promotional work to introduce new shooters to the sport. Each year the cost of our donations and services to the sport has increased.

As we are neither importers nor manufacturers of automatic traps we are not in a position to comment on the statement that the Australian Government is taxing this equipment unduly.

We notice the letter from the Warrnambool Gun Club is addressed to "The Editor" and if it is your intention to publish their letter we have no objection to the publication of our comments.

Our concern over the necessity to increase shotshell prices is equally as great as the concern expressed by Mr Henry whose view is, no doubt, echoed by clubs and shooters throughout Australia.

We seek every possible economy in manufacture in an endeavour to avoid increases, however, we have an equally firm policy of maintaining quality and performance in our product in the belief that shooters, particularly targ t shooters, demand the very best shotshell performance possible.

Substantial rises occurred through 1969 and 1970 in the raw materials which are basic to our industry, i.e., copper, I ad and antimony and the increases, whilst varying on each of the metals, could be instanced at an approximate 60 per cent increase in copper and an increase in the order of 400 per cent in antimony which is used in lead shot to provide the desirable degree of hardness.

In addition to increases in basic materials we have, of course, like all other industry, faced substantial increases is abour costs and the resultant effect of all of the abovementioned factors gave us no alternative but to again price increases.

Again would like to emphasise that every possible economy is consis the necessity to maintain a high standard of the necessity and performance and price increases are on to us.

New South Wales (Collarenebri): 30 target points match shoot for Inter-club Cup, won by Moree by a margin of 7 points.



New Zealand National Championships

The New Zealand National Clay Target Championships were conducted at the Christchurch Gun Club, Galahurst, over April 4 to 11, 1970.

The annual Australia versus New Zealand five-men Skeet Teams' Match was won by New Zealand on April 6 with 119/125 against Australia's 116/125.

The N.Z. National Skeet Championship of 50 targets was won on April 6 by J. R. Thomson, 75/75, of Rotorua, from C. W. Scott, of Kimberley, 73/75. Three layouts were used for the record 150 contestants.

On Tuesday, April 7, R. Burton, 43-year-old lobster fisherman of Geraldton, Western Australia, won the 25 target New Zealand Clay Sparrow Championship off 16 yeads from a field of 208 with 45/45. This is Dick's first such National success in his 11 years of trapshooting although he consistently shoots himself into the Australian International Team for the Mackintosh Trophy. He had travelled 4500 miles to enter the N.Z. Championships.

Also on Tuesday, April 7, J. Marshall, of Balclutha, won the New Zealand Double Rise Championship with the only clean score of 30/30 targets off 16 yards. There were 28 squads of shooters in this event.

The N.Z. Single Barrel Championship of 50 targets off 16 yards was won on April 8 by 63-year-old Wild Life Department officer, R. W. S. Cavanagh, of Wellington, with the only possible score registered out of the field of 200 shooters. This is his first National title win after 40 years of competition shooting.

The N.Z. Single Rise Championship of 50 targets off 18 yards is the Blue Riband event of N.Z. and, on April 9, this was won by retired Auckland taxi driver S. F. Scott, 69/69, from a field of 255.

The N.Z. Junior Single Rise Championship for the Cameron Hogarth Cup and held in conjunction with the senior match, was won by C. Tahau (Tokaroa).

This single rise event was the final event for the 1970 N.Z. Champion of Champion's Title—winner was B. J. Anderson (Mount Maunganui) with his aggregate 199/205.

The Browning shotgun donated annually by the Messrs Fabrique Nationale d'Armes de Guerre of Belgium in conjunction with their N.Z. agents, Messrs Gollin & Co. Ltd., for the highest scorer over the five N.Z. championships — Clay Sparrow, Double Rise, Skeet, Single Rise, Single Barrel—was won by B. J. Anderson (Mount Maunganui).







Modern cartridge design

The "BANG" is about the only thing common between today's shotgun cartridges and those of only a few years ago. In fact improvements have come so fast that some shooters have not yet become accustomed to the improved cartridges. Some are even suspicious of the performance of new shells.

Less than 100 years separates us from the first centrefire shotshell cartridge which followed somewhat the same progress in centrefire rifle cartridges. In this short time there have been many cartridge developments of significance to followers of the art of wing shooting.

Perhaps the greatest improvement to shotgunning was the invention and application of "choking" to guns. In 1866 William R. Pape, an English gunmaker, was granted a patent for what he specifically referred to as "choke boring." However it is a matter of controversy who actually invented the choke as W. W. Greener wrote that choke had been experimented with a century before Pape. So it is with many of the shooting innovations of the last 50 years. And it is in this period that all of the sophisticated developments have occurred.

Apart from choking and battery cup staynless priming, undoubtedly the greatest advances have taken place in the last few years with the introduction, first of plastic cartridge cases and about the same time of shot protecting collars. These followed the previous major advance in 1945 when Winchester U.S.A. first introduced overpowder cup wads which eliminated the chance of "blown patterns" for all time.

Few shooters today fail to appreciate the advantages of plastic cartridge cases. Four years ago extremely wet conditions at the National Championships at South-Port, Queensland, caused a great deal of trouble with case swelling, and many cartridges became so wet they broke down. This devil has now been laid to rest with plastic cases.

Probably the last remaining devil to be tackled is that relating to shot protecting devices incorporated in the new type plastic wads found in modern shotshells. These wads have probably been subjected to more scrutiny by shooters than any other advances in design and application.

The advantages of shot protecting wads are twofold. Firstly, they always incorporate the overpowder cup wad design first introduced by Winchester in 1945, and secondly they keep the shot on the outside of the shot column (which is otherwise normally in contact with the barrel) safely protected from wear and distortion by cushioning it in plastic.

Who would buy a shotshell that had 10% of the shot with a flat side? Well that's what happens in shells that don't have shot protecting devices; 10% of the shot has been deformed by the time it leaves the barrel.

It's simply this: the only function of shot protecting collars is to protect shot. The result is that all of the shot flies true within the pattern. Simple logic only is needed to show that if 10% of the shot is damaged and leaves the pattern (with plain shells) then 10%

more shot would be in the pattern if protected from damage.

The effect of choke in controlling the size of effective pattern is not affected by shot protectors. In straight language the effect is to place more shot (10%) within a pattern of a given size not to reduce the size of the pattern.

Probably some misunderstanding comes about by the use of the word "Pattern." "Pattern" does not mean the widest spread of shot. Rather it means the widest spread of organised shot which can reliably be expected in the target area. That 10% of shot which protectors bring into the pattern, previously was not in it and in fact was mostly so far from the target as to be wasted completely.

Actually there is perhaps no better proof of theories than the "proof of the pudding" test. Prior to the introduction of shot protecting devices the Australian break record stood in the vicinity of 360 and breaks of 100 were rather uncommon. Within a short period of the introduction of the AA cartridge to Australia the break record jumped to 501 unbroken, made by Kevin Heywood. Soon after this the break record moved to 544 unbroken, held jointly by Newton Thomas and Jim Anderson. Apart from the AAs which Anderson used prior to running out of cartridges both shooters used Blue Star plastic shells which incorporate a shot protecting wad.

In the recent Winchester Claybird Tournament two breaks surpassed the 544. They were 732 shot by J. Henwood at Melbourne Gun Club who, apart from the qualifying round (when he used AA cased reloads), used Winchester AA factory shells, and Tim Catling, of Perth, who used AA factory shells after the qualifying round to make a total break for the day with shells containing shot protecting wads of 697.

No shell not containing an overpowder cup and shot protecting wad has come near this performance in Australian competition.

So much for the "proof of the pudding" test except to say that skeet records have similarly been broken by shot protecting wadded shells. Ray Wighton, of Oatlands, Tasmania, using AA shells recently shot 156 skeet straight to surpass the Australian skeet record held by Roy Falshaw who used fully Winchester componented AA reloads and AA factory shells in his achievement of 149 straight.

There is no doubt that today's shotgun shooter is far better off in being able to achieve outstanding results than only a few years ago. Better still, both Australian ammunition companies have themselves geared to make superior cartridges and shooters still have a choice of brand.

Which is the best brand of cartridge? That is a question best left to the shooter but there is no doubt about the superior functioning and performance of combined shot protectors and plastic cartridges.






At the left of the picture some two inches of the shotgun barrel are visible. A ruler was secured above the barrel for the high-speed camera to record the distances at which the respective happenings took place. At 14 in. from the muzzle the shot collar is actually free of the shot.




The shot in its protecting plastic collar has just left the gun muzzle by some two inches.



Some six inches from the gun barrel the shot protecting collar is beginning to open whilst the shot continues onward.



At 18 inches from the gun barrel the collar is opening rapidly.




At 24 inches from the gunbarrel, the shot protecting wad, still in its compressed form, is slowing to the rear and is clear of the shot.



Twenty-eight inches from the gun barrel the collar has fulfilled its purpose. Wind pressure folds its sides backwards whilst the shot continues in its path with no distortion in any pellet.
