

Attention is drawn to the two centre pages of this issue. Reprinted, with permission, is an article by U.S. sporting writer Dick Miller, as published in May, 1970, issue of "Guns" magazine in U.S.A.

The decision of I.M.I. Australia Limited to seek usage of this U.S.A. article for publication to Australian shooters is welcomed.

Many laws throughout the various States of Australia are similar yet vary in some degree or other and steps are being made to have uniform interpretations.

Concerning firearms — 1. Some areas limit gun handlers under supervision, to a minimum 14 years of age and gun ownership to a minimum of 17 years. Clubs are advised that advertisements or notices should not mention any young shooters, under the present State legal ages, who may win any large event. A prominent gun club President recently had a visit from the police, asking why a 15-year-older was allowed to shoot although the legal age for the area was 17.

2. Current import requirements concerning the entry or re-entry of firearms into Australia are as published on Page 2 of June, 1970, Clay Target Shooting News.

However registered clay target shooters may achieve immediate clearance of their firearms providing:-

- (1) That for Australian registered shooters, the firearm has been in his possession in Australia and that a current A.C.T.A. handicap card is produced with the firearm to the customs.
- (2) That for visiting shooters from overseas, that a current (e.g., British, New Zealand, U.S.A., etc., issued) handicap or membership card is produced with the firearm together with evidence of proposed participation in an approved shoot or shoots in Australia. The firearms are to be exported within a reasonable period and the importer may be required to give an undertaking to this effect.

Skeet shooting is becoming more popular and a number of clubs are establishing skeet layouts.

A.C.T.A. rules are quite clear to follow and the handicapping method is simple in that by an eighth round of skeet a shooter has established his handicap for the next four skeet rounds. His skeet handicap is then self-adjusting at the end of each successive fourth round BUT, the club conducting each round MUST have the event recorded on the shooter's handicap

One prominent club requires its skeet shooters to lodge skeet handicap cards with the scorer at station number one. At the end of the round, from the skeet scoresheets, the scorer transfers each competitor's score (all his "kills," i.e., his off the gun score) onto the shooter's skeet handicap card record. The shooter then adjusts his own continuous recorded handicap figure with the approval of the referee and scorer. The scorer notes this final figure for the club. Thus the whole procedure relieves club Secretaries yet all concerned have full records of the skeet round that has been conducted.

Shooters and officials must remember at all times that:-

- 1. Off the gun scores are applicable to open skeet championship shooting — (Rule 127).
- 2. Handicaps are applicable only (a) in graded skeet championship shooting for determining grades — (Rule 128). (b) Straight skeet handicap events — (Rule 128).

(e.g.) shooter
$$A = 23 + 2$$
 (or more h'cap) = 25. shooter $B = 25 + Nil$ h'cap = 25. shooter $C = 24 + Nil = 24$.

But in shoots-off for trophies, in the second or other round, when the handicap is used, the shooter drops out. A shooter's full handicap may only be used once throughout one, or over, several skeet rounds comprising the one event — (Rule 133).

Note, however that club handicap events may be conducted under club local rules.

- (c) Skeet sweepstake events (sweepstakes are usually compulsory division — Rule 132).
- 3. Skeet scoring cannot be unfair to any skeet shooter.

The trap handicap method recommended last year is even more simple than the skeet method and is being recorded by several clubs in addition to the existing trap handicapping formula. The recommended method under consideration is readily understandable, and over a period, shooters automatically move into or remain at a particular yardage or grading. The method is used by trapshooters in America and now in Britain.

In New Zealand — The 1970 South Island Championships will be conducted at Invercargill on November 14 and 15, 1970.

The 1971 North Island Championships will be conducted at Hawkes Bay Central Gun Club at Hastings on February 21 and 22, 1971.

Ian Ballinger of the Belfast Gun Club (NZ) has just been awarded the Lonsdale Cup for his shooting performances at Mexico City. This cup is awarded for the outstanding performance of the year to any sport on the Olympic or British Commonwealth Games calendar. The award is made by the Olympic selectors and ranks high in the order of New Zealand's sporting awards. This is the first time a shooter has been selected and one of the few times it has been awarded outside the track events.

Winchester Western Clay Target Tournament

The sponsors, Winchester (Australia) Pty. Ltd. of Geelong have proposed that this next tournament shall be conducted at eighteen separate host clubs throughout the Commonwealth, during the period August 1970 to March 20, 1971. The selection of venues has been designed to attract and provide for all interested shooters in three grades.

The trap events shall be of fifty targets off 16 yards and front markers, mid-markers and back markers may compete in any, or even all, of the separate venues with the only provision that any one shooter is limited to one first trophy in any grade.

Cartridges shall be of individual choice of either factory or home loading of $1\frac{1}{6}$ ounce of shot, with no shot size larger than number 6.

Three trophies are to be won in each of the three grades (21-27, 16-20, 12-15) at each of the 18 locations.

Scores (long run breaks) achieved at each club in each State shall be compared and the highest recorded State Long Run Break shall be awarded a return air ticket to the 1971 Australian National Championships to be held at the Brisbane Gun Club, Queensland during June 1971.

These six State High Gun winners shall shoot, as a squad, at the Brisbane Gun Club on Friday, June 11, 1971, at 100 targets double barrel, kills to count, to establish the overall winner of the 1970/1971 Winchester Clay Target Tournament, using free Winchester shells. This squad of State winners shall be announced in May 1971, A.C.T.A. Shooting News.

Separately a fifty target (two rounds) skeet event shall be conducted at one venue in each State. (Details September News).

Complete details of the trap and skeet sections of the tournament are listed on page 7 of this publication.

Horses for Courses

by Mr Ian Cook, Works Manager of Australia's largest sporting ammunition factory.

One of the better known racing adages is "Horses for Courses." I understand that this suggests that certain horses seem to run their best races on a specific course. I don't propose to enter into any discussion on this matter, but I believe that a similar situation exists with guns and ammunition.

For instance, take a simple case of misfires in rimfire ammunition. The table below summarises the results obtained by firing 100 rounds of four different sorts of ammunition in each of six different rifles and then recording the number of misfires in each test, e.g., Cartridge B in Rifle 1, gave 9 misfires in the 100 rounds fired, while Cartridge D in Rifle 5, gave 19 misfires in the 100 rounds fired.


I should explain that although the cartridges are "normal," the rifles were specially selected for this test because of their tendency to give misfires.

If you study the table you will notice that Cartridge A gave no misfires in three rifles, yet it was the worst of the lot in Rifle No. 2. Rifles 4 and 6 have the least number of misfires overall and although Rifle 4 has more misfires with Cartridges A and C than Rifle 6, with Cartridge D the situation is reversed.

There are other interesting facts you can deduce for your own interest, but the point which emerges is that the combination of rifle and cartridge has a significant effect on performance.

Another area in which the same situation applies is the effect of different combinations of rifle and cartridge on accuracy.

Before presenting the results, I should point out that in testing accuracy we hold the rifle in a vice-rest (see the photograph) and fire a ten shot group. We then express the size of the group as the size of the



smallest circle which encloses the centre of the extreme shots (see photograph). In each test we fired 5/10 shot groups of each cartridge in each rifle.

In this series of tests we took five different types of cartridges and fired them in nine different rifles. With each type of cartridge we tested two different batches, to give a more representative sample. The tests were fired over a range of 75 yards and I have recorded the average group size. Incidentally, all the cartridges were Long Rifle High Velocity of normal field shooting standard.

All sorts of conclusions can be drawn from these results. Look at Cartridge A, Batch No. 2. In Rifles No. 2 and No. 7 it performs very well, but is quite hopeless in Rifle No. 1.

Cartridge A, Batch No. 1 gave the best result in Rifle No. 7, whereas Batch No. 2 gave almost the worst result in the same rifle.

Rifle No. 1 performs quite well with most cartridges but is very bad with Cartridge A.

The average of each cartridge in all rifles varies between 2 9/16 in. and 3 7/16 in., but the average of each rifle with all cartridges varies between 1 7/8 in. and 4 3/4 in. This leaves little doubt as to where the cause of the variation lies.

Once again I will leave it to the reader to make his own further deduction, but I am sure you will all agree that there is some degree of correlation between the cartridge and the rifle, as far as accuracy is concerned.


The other point I would like to mention briefly concerns handloading of shotgun cartridges. The two major manufacturers within Australia supply "matched components," i.e., Primers, Powders, Wads and Shot. They recommend loads using these matched components and leave it to the shooter's discretion to observe the recommendations.

The following tables show results obtained with a variety of Primers and Powders loaded under controlled conditions. This involved hand weighing of powder and shot, although the loading was done on a normal hand loading machine.

As I consider this subject as a matter of some importance I will quote two sets of results. The first of these refers to tests carried out with seven different

types of Primers and one imported Powder which is not used by local manufacturers.

The pressure results are quoted in tons per sq. in., and the velocities are the average given in feet per second over 20 yds. All results are averages of 10 shots.

The variation in velocity is such that I would only regard samples C, F and G as satisfactory. The others are far too low.

On the pressure results the same three samples are getting too high. (The English Rules for proof specify an average of 3.25 t.s.i. as an acceptable maximum for 2 3/4 in. chambered guns). High pressures of course can lead to burst guns, this proving an expensive sort of experiment.

In the table below I have shown the results obtained with three different Primers and three different Powders. Pressure and velocity are expressed as previously, A, B and C Primers were the same as used in the previous test.

Note the effect of combining Primer A with Powder No. 3. See how the pressure increases significantly in comparison to Powder No. 1 and No. 2. Now note that with Primers B and C and Powder No. 3 the pressure drops in comparison to Powder No. 1 and No. 2.

You should also look at the differences in velocity. These are partly due to pressure differences, but it is obvious that Primer A has less effect on velocity than the other Primers.

I have only quoted a few results, but hope that I have made the point that when one starts fiddling with different components the results can be quite variable. In short — matched components are like "horses for courses" — at least you start off on a good thing.



The generation gap and you



PULL!

WHAT RELEVANCE does the much-publicized generation gap have for the clay target sports? When I put together several bits of information I have picked up over the last thirty to sixty days, the generation gap, real or imagined, serious or minimal, seems to have a lot of relevance for the future of the clay target sports.

If the dramatic growth of trap and skeet during the soaring sixties is to extend into the seventies, the assumption follows that there must occur a continued input of live bodies into the games. From where do we get the live bodies? Will all of the new trap and skeet shooters come from the much-maligned ranks of the overthirty generation? For economic reasons as much as any other, it does follow that most new trap and skeet gunners will be over thirty when they take up the games and become active club members.

But, what happens if the under thirty generation completely rejects guns and shooting as a way of life or a form of recreation? It would then seem that the growth of clay target competition would face a downward curve. If the mores and attitudes of the under-thirty group remain constant until and after they cross the magic natal anniversery which is supposed to give them a changed outlook on life, we might be in trouble. I say

that we, meaning devotees of the clay target sports, might be in trouble for several reasons.

Early this year, I talked with a gun shop owner in the city of Berkeley, Calfornia. His shop is located a few blocks from what is admittedly one of the most liberal and activist campuses in the United States. He said that his business with the established shooter and hunter in 1969 was as good or better than it was in the record gun demand year of 1968. But, he said his Christmas gun sales were the worst he had experienced in twenty years of business.

The reasons he gave for the drop in his 1969 Christmas sales get at the crux of our problem. He said that a number of parents had been in the shop looking for appropriate gun gifts, but had returned later and reported that they had learned that the kids were simply not interested and did not want guns at all. One parent did buy his son a gun, gun case, and cleaning kit which was placed under the tree on Christmas morning. When the boy opened his gift, he screamed that this was an immoral and obscene gift, refused to open the rest of his gifts, and stormed from the house for the rest of the day.

There are a lot of conclusions you can draw from this situation or from the behavior of this boy, but one of

them has to be that this boy, and any like him, are not likely to take up trap and skeet later in this decade. At least, the prognosis at this stage is not good. Because it seems to me that it is not only futile but foolish to view with alarm unless you are willing to suggest an alternative or remedial action, I share some thoughts with you who cherish the games of trap an skeet.

I wrote last month's Pull colum which describes in some detail th trap and skeet programs being con ducted in the nation's colleges by th Association of Student Unions before I visisted Berkeley and picked up th bits of information just described. will concede for the record that n all colleges are so ultra liberal as Ca in Berkeley, nor do the communiti in which they are located nourish t sort of violent anti-gun attitu which thrives in the Berkeley clima but I also offer the conclusion tl Cal. and Berkeley are neither alc or unique.

This being the case, it becomes exmore important to support all of collegiate shooting programs (such the excellent one at Indiana Univ sity) with a lot more vigor than are now doing. It seems to me this problem of attracting new sheers being faced by the shooting gais not one we can sweep under rug and say that we will face it wit becomes epidemic. In my judgen that will be too late. We must now with any program that is signed to forestall a crisis in the enties, or eighties.

If the conclusions I have rea are true, (and these conclusions supported by a number of knowle able people in the game) gun clu longer can wait for the new y shooter to show up at the club si via a process of natural selection IMI Australia Ltd. is constantly looking for ways to introduce more people to clay target shooting, that's why in the interests of the sport we use our normal advertising space to reprint this article from 'GUNS' Magazine (U.S.A.).

lubs, state associations, and national issociations must put into operation iome sort of sustained program to attact young people to the clay target games on a regular basis.

There are all sorts of possibilities along these lines, and almost any of hem can make some sort of contribution to stimulating interest. We are told, and observe, that young people are followers. If we can get their leaders to decide that trap and/or skeet is the "in" thing, we ought to be on the way to success. How can we do this? A gun club could, for example, announce that a free shooting and instruction will be offered once a month (or week, depending on resources) for any of several groups, such as class officers, all honor students, athletes scoring the most points in any game, or being selected the athlete of the week, or being named to any sort of honor team. All students winning scholarships in a local area could be the guests of the club for a day of trap or skeet.

The criteria for this kind of approach are endless, and can be tailored to fit any local situation. Club facilities could be made available to any school group for an extra-curricular club organized for shooting. State associations could promote a state championship in trap or skeet with entries solicited from every school in the state. This event could be staged as an extra day or extra event in connection with any and all state tournaments. Winners could go on to compete in either the Grand or the NSSA skeet nationals.

I'm sure that individual shooters can do more than they have been doing to expose more young people to the fun of trap and skeet. How many kids of neighbors, friends, relatives, etc., have you invited to the club at least once?

Some readers will be sure to comment that all these suggestions are worthwile, but whence cometh the money? Benefit shoots are conducted for just about every cause you can think of. What is a more worthy cause than insuring the continued good health of the shooting sports? One dollar more added to the entry fee of any state or national shooting event would not turn away any shooter, but the total dollars so acquired would provide the bread for a lot of the programs I have suggested (and there are many more possibilities than I have mentioned).

There is another prime possibility for changing or molding the thinking of young people with respect to the shooting sports, and that is the burgeoning concern for ecology, which does "turn on" many of the young student activists. During my years with SAAMI, I attended an Outdoor Education Project workshop at Purdue University in Indiana. Ône of the professors told the workshop that he was personally opposed to hunting and shooting, but that his concern for conservation of our natural resources had demonstrated dramatically to him that only the constant demands of hunters and shooters for places to hunt and shoot had saved serious deficiencies in our water table and other ecological considerations. He admitted only the revenue obtained from the 11% excise tax levied on guns and ammunition via the Pitman Act had saved many conservation programs from utter disaster.

Shooters today have never had a more perfect opportunity to constantly remind the ecology activists that the funds generated from our "doing our thing" have made it possible for them to enjoy forests, wetlands, lakes, rivers, and parks for ten or eleven months of the year while we ask only a month or so in return for our very substantial investment and contribution. And, we should not miss a chance to shout from rooftops that all the ammunition we consume at gun clubs generates a lot of revenue for their pet projects with no competition at all from us for the resources.

It is a known fact that you can't often reason a person out of an idea he holds as a result of prejudice, because prejudice is based on emotion rather than reason. But, you can sometimes make progress with such a person on the basis of a conclusion that you share in common, and that's where the contribution made by trap and skeet shooters to preserving our natural resources comes in.

There is a lot we can do, individually and collectively, to keep our clay target games healthy. The time to begin is now. Tomorrow may be much too late.






