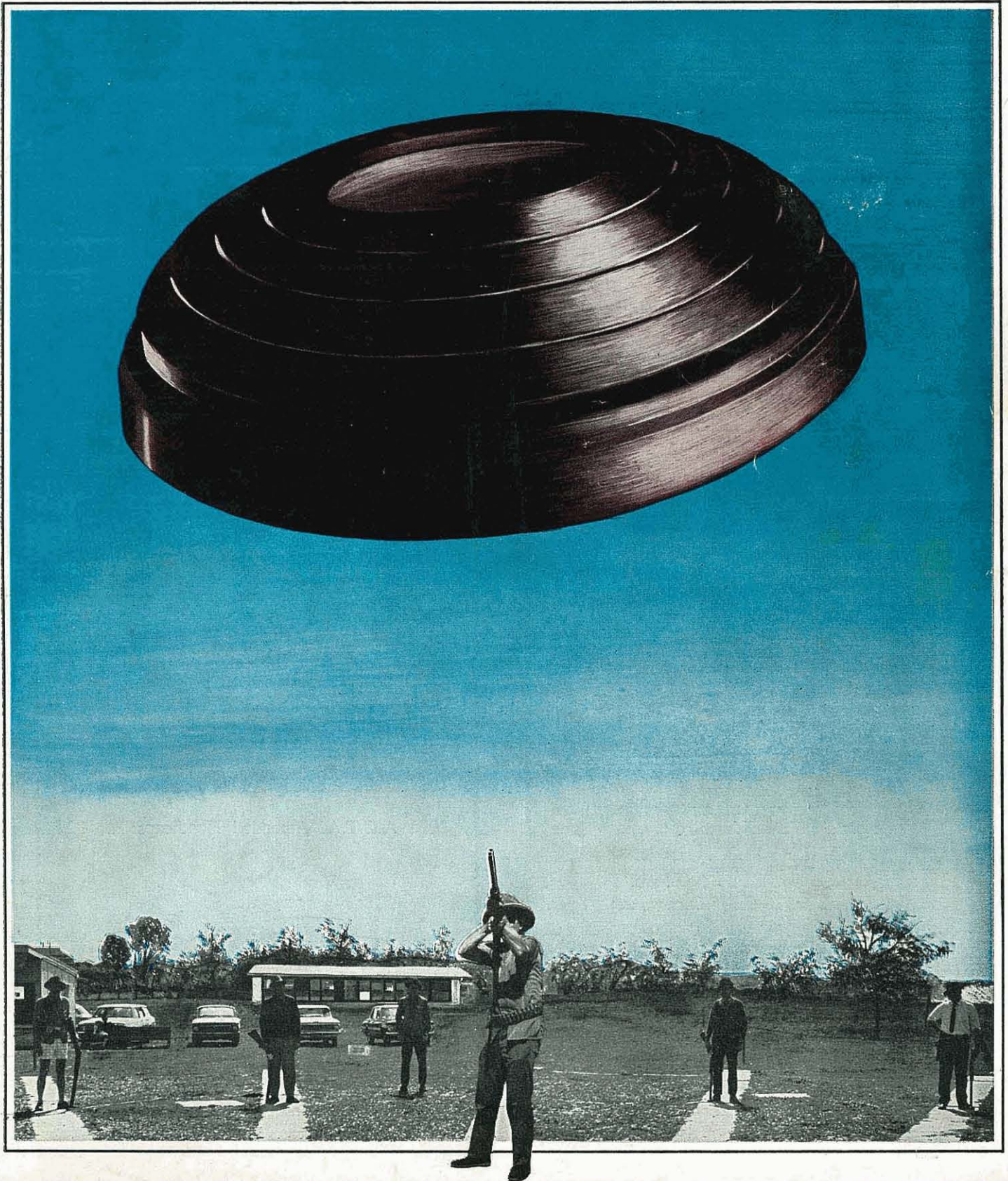

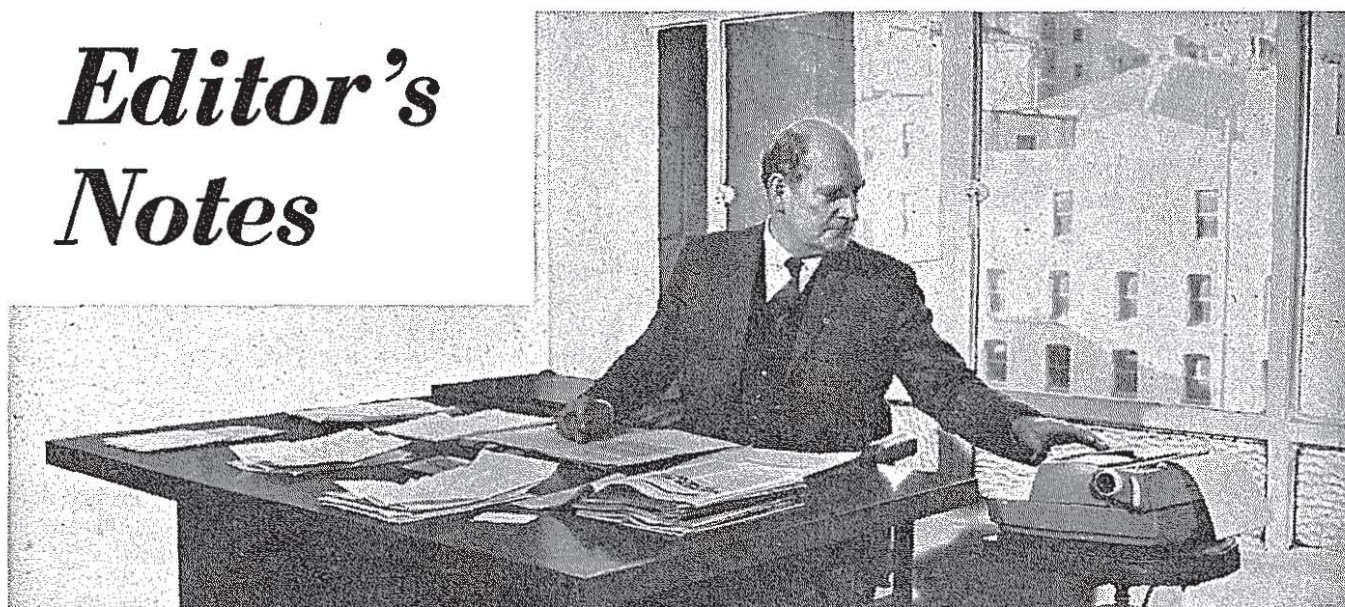

Editor's Notes



Shooters are reminded that a big racing carnival is scheduled for June in Brisbane, consequently accommodation should be booked immediately. Some caravan and motel type accommodation is available through the Brisbane Gun Club, otherwise official accommodation agents are James Patrick & Co. Pty. Ltd., of 431 Queen Street, Brisbane, also "Number-Ten-The-Esplanade, Surfers Paradise" has ample accommodation at special rates for shooters.

The 1970 Australian National Clay Target Championships shall be conducted by the Association at the Brisbane Gun Club, Queensland, over the seven successive days of Saturday, through to Friday, June 12 to 18.

The programme shall proceed in the following order with one major event each day:

FIRST DAY — Saturday, June 12, 1971. Event No. 1: 31st Australian National Champion of Champions Cup followed by \$300 value Double Barrel Handicap (time permitting).

SECOND DAY — Sunday, June 13, 1971. Event No. 2: 19th Australian National Double Barrel Championship and shot in conjunction . . . 24th Australian National Intermediate Double Barrel Championship.

THIRD DAY — Monday, June 14, 1971. Event No. 3: 17th Australian National Single Barrel Championship and shot in conjunction . . . 2nd Australian National Intermediate Single Barrel Championship.

FOURTH DAY — Tuesday, June 15, 1971. Event No. 4: 10th Australia/New Zealand Championship followed by 12th Australia/New Zealand Trap Teams' Match followed by Event No. 5: \$300 value Double Barrel Handicap (time permitting).

FIFTH DAY — Wednesday, June 16, 1971. The Twenty-Fifth International Teams' Match followed by Event No. 6: 11th Australian National Double Rise

Championship and shot in conjunction . . . 2nd Australian National Intermediate Double Rise Championship followed by Event No. 7: \$300 value Double Barrel Handicap (time permitting).

SIXTH DAY — Thursday, June 17, 1971. Event No. 8: The Twenty-Second Grand Australian Handicap and, time permitting a DB Handicap or Sweepstake then, time permitting Skeet Practice — 25 Targets.

SEVENTH DAY — Friday, June 18, 1971. Event No. 9: 2nd Australian National Skeet Championship followed by 6th Australia/New Zealand Skeet Teams' Match.

High Gun (previous such winners excluded) shall be over the six events—Champion of Champions, Double Barrel, Double Rise, Single Barrel, Australia/New Zealand and Grand Australian — kills only to count. Prize winners are not eligible for Yardage Awards.

We have passed our appreciation to the makers of this fine trophy, Messrs Fabrique Nationale of Belgium. Such a "Browning" under-and-over shot gun trophy has been donated annually since 1966 and the agents, Commercial Marketing Co. Pty. Ltd. of Sydney, have already arranged that this shot gun shall be available at the commencement of the 1971 Nationals. The gun is an engraved Special Trap 5 gun and all previous winners of these trophies are excluded from the final selection.

We have agreed to the N.Z.G.C.A. request to conduct the Australia/New Zealand Skeet Teams' Match for the first time in Australia. This is a five-man team event, shooting one round of 25 skeet targets. The team to consist of the five highest Australian scorers in the Australian National Skeet Championship.

A perpetual high gun cup is to be donated for the first time by J. Newton Thomas of Melbourne, who has won, at some stage or other, at least one of each major clay target shooting events conducted within the Commonwealth.

A Stirling Broadrib trophy gun will be presented by Fuller Firearms of Sydney "to any New Zealander who wins any of the five annual Australian Championships."

The 35th Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held in the Clubhouse of the Brisbane Gun Club from 6 p.m. on Monday, June 14, 1971.

Some overseas shooters shall visit the 1971 Australian Championships.

The National Championships trophy prize lists are now at a common basis to avoid the problems of trophy distribution and division. (NOTE — full programme advertisement March and May, 1971, includes descriptive local road map.)

A choice of shot gun cartridges shall be available from the cartridge controllers at a common price in exchange for receipts as issued by the A.C.T.A. Secretary.

Gunsmiths shall be available on the grounds.

Clay targets to be used during the 1971 National Championships shall be **orange** domed for down-the-line trap events and all **black** for the skeet events.

A Referee Discussion Night on rules interpretations shall be held at the Brisbane Gun Club on Friday night, June 11, under the chairmanship of Queensland Executive Committee Member, Mr W. A. Edwards, and two others, yet to be named, to assist in answering the questions.

The Shoot Marshal shall be Mr George Parker of Beerwah, Queensland and Assistant Shoot Marshal shall be Mr Harry Williamson of Apsley, Victoria.

Announcement

Evans & Balfour Pty. Ltd., Gunsmiths of Melbourne, Victoria, who have serviced the shooters for the Club at Hay, N.S.W., during Easter for many years, have reluctantly decided that they will not be attending the shoot this year.

This decision was reached after much careful consideration and discussion with the Hay Gun Club.

Many recent costs which affect us all these days have brought about this decision.

Evans & Balfour Pty. Ltd., through this journal, thank the Hay Gun Club and the many shooters who have gone out of their way to support them over many years.

Some 124 New Zealanders have indicated their intention to attend and compete in the Australian National Championships. This shall be the largest sporting contingent ever to leave New Zealand for any one sporting tournament.

Registered New Zealand shooters will shoot two yards back from their current handicap marks, by arrangement.

As some member clubs have requested that shooter insurance be arranged by the Association, the Executive Committee at its last meeting considered several quotations and decided that the details of the best offer shall be discussed at the 1971 Annual General Meeting.

The Committee suggests that member clubs consider adopting this overall policy which "would provide coverage for bodily injury or damage to property for which they may become legally liable occurring as a result of an accident in connection with the Association's business."

This proposed policy coverage would also provide indemnity for the liability of shooters whilst on the tracks during registered events.

Only member clubs with satisfactory documentation and constitutions in writing under the Companies Act shall be able to have coverage for their shooters and the premiums must be collected from the shooters with registration fees then forwarded accordingly through the A.C.T.A.

Letter to the Editor

Observations on Clay Target and Live Bird Shooting in Europe, Britain and South Africa.

ITALY

Skeet shooting over the years has been established as a very strong competitor against Trap shooting. In International Skeet shooting where the field layout is the same as the American type Skeet, the target is thrown a distance of 71 yards (44 + 27 yards) from the trap houses. The variable time release is 0.3 seconds. The gun butt is kept on the hip until the target appears. Two automatic Skeet layouts are usual, giving shooters seven-day-a-week opportunities, weather permitting, with practice shooting on weekdays. Saturdays and Sundays are for competition shooting.

Only graded shooting A,B,C, is programmed. Except for "Major Open Shoots," Grand Prix, Championships attract large numbers of shooters from all parts of the Continent and abroad.

The spacious clubhouses include bar facilities for entertainment and for relaxation. The facilities are luxurious.

Trap: Trap shooting as we know it here in Australia is non-existent. International or Olympic Trench and the Universal Trap system are used.

Olympic Trench consists of 5 groups of 3 traps each, a total of 15 traps. The five shooting stations are approximately 15 feet apart and 16 yards behind the trap.

Note: No handicap by distance is used. Classes A,B,C,D, are the normal grades.

The target is thrown a distance of 80 yards, the moving speed 90 m.p.h. The height variation is 3 ft. 2 in.-16 ft., at the distance of 30 ft. from the trap centre all within angles of 45 deg. either side of the flight centre line.

Universal or Continental Trap Layout. One single machine throws the target in constantly changing direction and elevation in conformity with the current regulation for Olympic Trap Shooting, at 80 yard minimum distances. This machine is a magazine type holding 350-400 targets, with an electric or acoustic

trigger system. No slow or fast pull with the acoustic system is possible. Trapper boys shortage is noticeable world wide, therefore more and more Clubs are converting to automatic traps. Rounds of 25 targets are shot. Practice round \$1, Competition \$2.50. 50 cents goes for trophy from each shooter. Sash, Medallion or Cup. Normally 1st to 3rd in Open Competition and one trophy per 1st in each Grade.

Student shooting classes are held during the year, then on the final shoot a graduation ceremony is held, each shooter receiving a commemorative medallion from the Minister of Education.

Live Bird Shooting. The Roma Club is the leading club in pigeon shooting in Europe. Magnificent ground and clubhouse facilities in the city itself. The friendliness of the people towards the visitor is A1. Stakes from a few hundred dollars to 30-40,000 dollars. Normal betting with bookies on the ground. The 24th Pigeon Shooting World's Championship in Republica di San Marino in June attracted 495 shooters from all over the world. The guaranteed stake money was \$60,000 or 40 million lira, over the seven-day programme.

AUSTRIA

I.S.U. Skeet, Universal Trap and Olympic Trench.

There are many well equipped clubs in Austria. One privately owned club near Vienna is open seven days a week, one Universal Automatic Trap with acoustic trigger and the Automatic Skeet, a nicely equipped bungalow, bar, etc., gives a very homely feeling.

GERMANY

The well known Wiesbaden Club has three layouts of Skeet and three Olympic Trench. Two Skeet layouts are used by the US Army personnel for American type of Skeet, with 12-20-28 and .410 gauge guns. The third layout is used for I.S.U. Skeet or I.S.U. Trap. There are clubs all over the country, just to mention two — Bad-Toeln and Cologne.

RUMANIA

Bucharest — three Olympic Trenches, two Skeet Layouts. This is the State owned shooting ground 12 miles from the city centre. The small bore pistol and high power ranges are equipped and maintained by the State. Labor is designated. The shooting is under control of the State Physical Education Department. The 1970 European Championship was on this ground. Further clubs are at Brossow, Cluj, Constance.

YUGOSLAVIA, HUNGARY, CZECHOSLOVAKIA

Shooting on the State-owned grounds is somewhat similar to Rumania. The friendliness towards visiting shooters is marked.

BRITAIN

Normal D.T.L. as we know it. Olympic and Universal Trench, I.S.U. Skeet and English seven Station Skeet, field type of championship. Normally any type of shooting according to preference.

The highlight was the British National Championship, which was shot in excellent weather conditions on July 17 and 18, Home Farm, near Leamington Spa. Entry fee £9/0/0 included 125 cartridges. The trap-houses equipped with White Flyer Traps and portable generator stations were supplied by I.C.I. Limited. The shoot was very well organised by Mr Peter Page, Director of the C.P.S.A. and the Shooting Committee. Peter is a wonderful host and long time member of I.C.I.

Shot concurrently by 100 targets on Point Scoring, off 16 yards. Pool shooting continued all day on the No. 5 Trap on Points. One-third was returned in prize money for all possibles in the morning and second lot for afternoon shooting.

The International Banquet and Presentation of Prizes was held at Chesford Grange, Holder, Kellingworth, Warwick.

The small Australian contingent marched in on the tune of Waltzing Matilda.

After formal speeches, including one by "Yours Truly" the entertaining continued until the early hours.

Next day the 30th Annual British Open Championship was shot.

I.C.I. Challenge Trophy, then the series of prizes of the best AA, A, B, C, Class over 100 targets.

The 30th International Teams Match was shot concurrently.

Shooting Schools play a great part for recruiting new shooters into clubs besides the instruction of gun-handling and the traditional hunting with the gun.

SOUTH AFRICA

Durban, Pretoria, Johannesburg, Cape Town, Gun Clubs under the Chairmanship of Mr Cyril Emphy are all equipped with Universal Trench, Skeet layouts and normal D.T.L. The shooting standard is high on I.S.U. Skeet and Trap. The hospitality towards Australian shooters is excellent. Mr Fred Hudson's visit to South Africa was frequently mentioned to me by Cyril and many other shooters. T. Maybury the 1970 overall South African Champion visited the Perth Club late 1969, also returned the hospitality extended to him on his visit to Australia.

IN GENERAL

On my eight months spent in competition on the European, English and South African shooting circuits, I have found shooters all over the world are good sportsmen and excellent mates. Seasoned shooters are dedicated, not drifters, who are thinking about the sports for the present and future generation.

Amenities must be of the highest standard, so that the ladies have entertainment and relaxation, not only the "tea pot."

Ear muffs or protective devices are worn by 90% of the shooters.

Colored targets, Red, Yellow, White are used with natural Black, to suit different grounds.

Trapper difficulties are experienced all over the world, which makes progressive clubs convert to Automatic Traps as soon as they are able to do so.

The clubs are open during weekdays as in weekends, therefore shooters can use the club facilities.

Referees indicate only the lost target by raising the arm, or by a whistle, or the call "repeat" for a "no target."

Classification of shooters grades is done only once in a year.

Each shooter has a record card. Handicapping is only done on ability, not on trophy value.

Common Mark Shooting is universal.

Clubs fees range from \$10-\$100, according to the facilities they offer.

Membership from about 20 to several hundred.

Lady and Junior Members are numerous and exhibit a high standard of shooting.

This report would not be complete without putting forward a recommendation to the A.C.T.A.

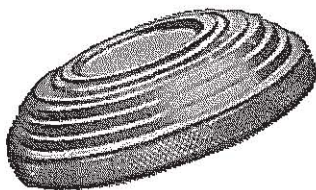
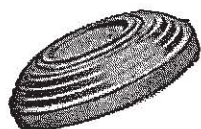
- (a) To re-introduce the I.S.U. Skeet Shooting (Skeet layouts are the same and targets will be available by the time this report goes to press). The American Skeet could remain.
- (b) To introduce Universal or Continental Trap Shooting. (Targets to 80 yards distance. Horizontal variation 4-16 ft. at 30 ft. This would give new Commonwealth, State and District Championships).
- (c) To abolish distance handicapping by trophy value.
- (d) To introduce Common Mark Shooting with classification of the shooters.
- (e) To join up with the Australian Olympic Federation to enable Australian shooters to compete in the Olympic Games and to be able to hold International and World Championships.
- (f) To send selected Australian teams overseas. (To compete and to gain experience internationally).

This recommendation, if adopted, would bring the Australian shooters into line with the rest of the world as it is in other major sports. In all the countries competitors of many nations expressed a desire to visit Australia — with common shooting laws and equipment and speed of travel, these visits should be encouraged for international goodwill and the progress of the sport.

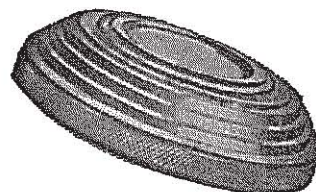

TIPS AND TALES



VALE — Noel Davis, 27 yard shooter and winner of the 1969 National Single Barrel Championship at Geelong, was drowned in a tragic boating accident whilst fishing off Port Campbell, Victoria on 8/3/1971. Noel was a member of the Warrnambool and Noorat Gun Clubs and was a keen Western District shooter.

VALE — Michael Blake of Cressy, Tasmania, age 20 years and a shooter with a trap handicap of 23 yards and skeet handicap of 2, fell from an aluminium dinghy and was drowned in a weir on 6/3/71. His grandfather, Fred Blake, died at the wheel of his car at the end of 1970. Fred Blake was an old and respected shooter who followed the National Clay Target Championships.

Dungog (NSW) — March 14 shoot was cancelled due to breakdown of electric trap and non-availability of the part for at least two months. Next shoot will be mid-June.

Competition for ICI Shield

At the conclusion of the 1st round the RAAF team led by one point with Army second and Navy third.

Early in the second round the RAAF lost two targets which put them in second place, i.e., one behind Army with Navy well back in third place. However by the end of the second round the RAAF team gained a point which made Army and RAAF equal, both with scores of 55/60 and Navy 49/60.

The third round began in a very tense atmosphere and with a great deal of pressure on the shooters. The first break came when Army dropped their second target in the third round which put RAAF one ahead at that time. The advantage of one point to the RAAF team continued until the twelfth target in the round when an unexpected break came, the Army dropped four consecutive targets. Shooting continued to the end of the round with the RAAF finishing on a high note with a perfect score in the final round of 30/30.

The final scores were: 1st RAAF 85/90; 2nd Army 79/90; 3rd Navy 72/90.

At the conclusion of the competition for the I.C.I. Shield the shoot-off to decide "high gun" commenced. Four shooters had scored the possible, two RAAF and two Army. In order of shooting they were Air Cdre. D. Colquhoun, (rank not known) Lovell, Flt. Sgt. D. McKenzie and W/O W. Ford. After a keen shoot-off W/O W. Ford (Army) who shot brilliantly, ran out the winner with a score of 36/36 and Air Cdre. D. Colquhoun runner-up with 35/36.

The concluding event was a twenty target invitation shoot which was won by Flt. Sgt. D. McKenzie and once again the runner-up was Air Cdre. D. Colquhoun.

History and Conditions of the Annual Inter-Services Trapshooting Event

Commencing from a picnic shoot at Laverton (Vic.) early in 1935, it was arranged that this be an annual competition between officers of three services for an I.C.I. donated shield.

Shoots were not held during the years 1938 and 1939 and World War 2 disrupted the continuity from 1939 to 1945. In 1947 the match continued as a competition between officers until 1957 when with the approval of I.C.I. the shield was made available to competition between all ranks.

For the event the contestants are squadded one from each service. Thus, as each service provides a six-man team, then six squads of three shooters successively contest the event. Each shoots at 15 targets, be-

ing three visits to the tracks, each visit is for five targets.

This provides an interesting progressive event for the team members and for the spectators.

Each year the venue changes by rotation and for 1971 the Army at Puckapunyal were hosts. Their grounds were a sight to see as a new (second) trap has been installed complete with night lighting. Vista is good, amenities excellent.

Water tankers prevented any dust hazard by keeping the area sprayed before and during the programme. The day was fine and hot but not unpleasant.

Spectators, present by invitation, enjoyed the luncheon provided by the Army.

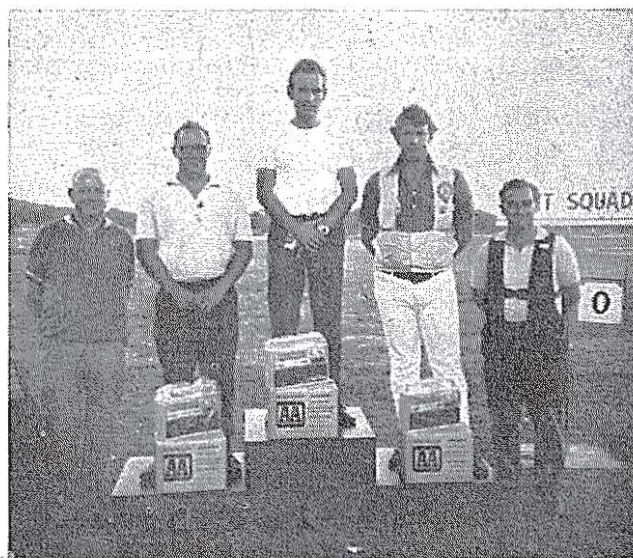
