

Results of the 24th International Trap Teams' Match shall not be available until all other competing countries have conducted their matches, of which, the final section for 1971 shall be at Ashbourne near Dublin, Eire (Ireland) on Friday, July 23, 1971.

A.C.T.A. 1972 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Applications for open championships to be contested during 1972 (that is, Commonwealth, State and District Titles) are required to be lodged under Rule 27 by member Clubs, in writing on the prescribed form number 16, not later than Friday, July 30, 1971.

Such applications shall be collated and submitted to the Executive Committee for consideration and allocation. Member Clubs are requested to measure their applications and to apply only for championships

which can be satisfactorily conducted between January 1 and December 31, 1972.

The allocated championships for the calendar year 1972 shall be published in December 1971 "Clay Target Shooting News."

From this published list of allocations, Clubs then choose their own respective 1972 programmes to include these title events as so allotted, and submit shoot requests (Form 16) to A.C.T.A. for consideration, showing the required date(s) concerned.

Approvals are subject to correct interpretations of A.C.T.A. Rules and are designed to avoid clashing of major programmes with nearby Clubs.


Commonwealth, State or District championships will not be allocated to Clubs who fail to either apply the handicapping formula correctly or who fail to submit handicap returns for each shoot.

No trophies or prize monies may be handed to any shooters without the previous submission of current handicap cards — Rule 18.

I.M.I. Australia Ltd. have kindly had struck a unique round silver badge for presentation to the winner of the Australia-New Zealand (Trap) Championship. A similar badge has been handed to the previous such championship winners (see page 7 of June 1971, A.C.T.A. "Shooting News"), whilst for the years 1962 to 1965 this was a points scoring trophy event only.

The badge is headed A.C.T.A., it is inscribed Australia-New Zealand Championship, with the year concerned and contains five stars depicting the Southern Cross.

Winner's names may be inscribed, as desired, on the reverse of the badges.

A number of Clubs are still using the word "birds" in their reports for this and other publications. It is a request of the Executive Committee, from all public relations connections that Club reports use the word "targets" — and NOT "birds."

Dear Sir,

Perhaps it is a welcome coincidence that, in the issue for April, the little par concerning shooting for enjoyment appears opposite the comprehensive article together with recommendations from Vice-President Jules Steiner.

We have, in fact, two objects of shooting — on the one hand, congenial and social experiences, such as club and inter-club shoots and on the other, highly competitive shooting at international level.

It is perfectly obvious that adopting suggestions (1) and (2) of Jules will ultimately raise the standard in relation to I.S.U. performance, but what of club shoots?

This depends on the outlook of the individual shooter who must ask himself the question "Why do I shoot?" If the answer is "To shoot possibles in events and shoot tremendous scores in shoot-offs," the benefits will be nil. But, if the answer is any of the following: for relaxation, for fun, for social fellowship, to satisfy a personal challenge, to learn to shoot well, to handle a gun, to enjoy keen competition at the highest level, then the benefits will be as follows:—

FOR TRAP

Undoubtedly the challenge is harder, consequently the satisfaction is more rewarding personally and the shooting is more interesting. Because the wind has less effects on the clay targets — they travel in a more uniform ellipse — the shooter gets two ideal shots at the target, there is no excuse for wind and merit has its own reward. It has also been shown that under this method of shooting, shoot-offs are terminated much more quickly; at present, even in a club event, it is not uncommon for a shoot-off to go in the vicinity of a hundred targets.

Long shoot-offs in club events have the disadvantages of:—

- (a) Costing clubs money.
- (b) Costing shooters money.
- (c) Having the bulk of the shooters idle for a long time, the net result being a shortage of time for e.g., an additional novelty event at the end of the programme.

(d) Most double barrel shoot-offs of any great duration do nothing to prove the best shooter on the day — they prove who is the biggest, fittest or strongest of those who have shot the possible — in short, they are an endurance contest.

FOR SKEET

Here the obvious stress is on added competence in gun handling.

The change-over would result in less stereotyped and consequently, more interesting, more challenging, more satisfying shooting.

Clay targets bite the dust at Nui Dat

The Nui Dat Gun Club began operating in March 1970, after several requests from interested soldiers in the Task Force.

The constitution said then "the gun club is designed to provide a recreational facility for members of 1 ATF. Apart from specific regulations, related to 1 ATF safety requirements, the club is to run in accordance with the Australian Clay Target Association Shooting Rules."

A safety survey was carried out in March 1970 and a trap ordered.

Six guns and the trap were paid for by Amenities who have also paid for the cartridges and clay targets.

A shooting trap was built with five concrete walk-up lanes and a concrete-lined trap house.

The six guns purchased by Amenities for the club were B.C. Miroku Stirling shotguns. They are over and under trap guns, model 800.

The club has used both ICI and Winchester shells and the last order placed was for 6,000 clay targets.

The club has about 60 members on its books and about 30 shoot each Sunday afternoon. A typical shoot will see about 800 shells fired through the six guns.

A typical shoot may consist of a five target opener; ten target double barrel event; deauville doubles and a walk-up event.

Many of the members joining the club have never taken part in this type of shooting before.



The John Newton Thomas trophy



This 16½ x 12 inch cup has been rejuvenated and fitted with a new wooden base of timber from a myall tree on the New South Wales property of the donor, John Newton Thomas, of Melbourne.

The cup was originally donated for competition within the Australian Clay Pigeon Trapshooting Association—which since 1961 has been registered as the Australian Clay Target Association.

The inscriptions to date on the cup refer to page 8 of June, 1971, A.C.T.A. Shooting News, and are:

"This cup, one of the earliest given for Clay Target Shooting in Australia, was won by J. W. Sutherland (known as Calrossie), who was my mentor and friend in my early trapshooting career.

It is given in perpetuity for competition at the A.C.T.A. National Championships and is for the best aggregate over all the National Title Events and the Grand Australian Handicap.


