

NOMINATIONS FOR 1972 OFFICES IN A.C.T.A.

All interested shooters are hereby notified that nominations for all offices in the Association close at 5 p.m. on Friday, December 31, 1971. Nominations must be lodged on the prescribed form with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038 S, Melbourne, 3001, Victoria. Any nominations received after this hour or date will not be accepted. Nomination forms are available from the Secretary, A.C.T.A. Nomination forms are only available on application.

Those lodging nominations are reminded that such nominations must be lodged in accordance with Article 27 of the Association Constitution, which reads: "Nominations for all offices in the Association and members of the Executive Committee must be in writing signed by the Secretary of the member Club or by the DELEGATE member of an unincorporated club making the nomination, and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before December 31, in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting."

It is advised that private nominations will be rejected. Nominations received must have the official backing of the club and be approved by the Committee of the member club concerned.

REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY of JANUARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any persons joining such Club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

Club Secretaries and shooters are reminded that all fees for 1972 are due and payable on January 1, 1972. Club affiliation fee is \$10.00 and shooter registration fee of \$5.00 must be forwarded through a Club Secretary. Subscribers (i.e., non-Club members) may send \$5.00 direct to A.C.T.A. for "News" publications only. No pro rata rates are accepted and such fees are for the calendar year concerned.

The POSTCODE reference is vital for all "News" addresses—otherwise your "News" will be rejected by the Postal Authorities.

March, 1972, "News" will be mailed only to shooters financial (actually received by the A.C.T.A. as of February 15, 1972).


PUBLICATION A.C.T.A. "NEWS"

Chinchilla (Q) — Secretary now is R. G. Pharaoh.

Rabaul (TPNG) — "... completely dismasted by the earthquakes and seismic waves," however the 1972 Easter shoot shall proceed as scheduled "when power is rebuilt, track levels re-established and lanes remade."

Toowoomba (Q) — has installed a skeet layout. Secretary now is Allan R. Stewart.

VALE — Mr Sydney Freeman Rowarth, late Honorary Secretary St. Arnaud Gun Club Victoria, died 24/8/71.

Warwick (Q) — Secretary now is J. R. White. Condoblin (NSW) — the Lewis family and the Condoblin Gun Club have jointly donated and established a local "Tom Lawler Memorial Trophy" to commemorate the name of their well known late President who was known at some ninety per cent of clubs in the State of NSW and some interstate clubs. The trophy is perpetual; it is to remain at Condoblin and to be shot for as Deauville Doubles once each year. Replicas go to winners and names are engraved on both the replicas and the shield. There are trophies for second placegetters. The event is 20 pairs of targets shot off 20 yards. Nomination is \$3 per shooter. Select own partners from any registered club in NSW. The first of these contests was to have been at Condoblin on September 26, 1971.

VALE — Bangall (Q) — reports the death of Club President George Russell Poole, who collapsed and died suddenly on July 20 last.

The Club was formed on October 11, 1952, with G. R. Poole as the first President, a position he held

until 1957, when he did not seek re-election. He again accepted the chair from 1960-62, and again from 1966 until the time of his death.

Russell Poole gave more to clay target shooting than he ever got out of it; he helped the Bengall Gun Club, financially and physically, and was always on the look out for ways to help shooting along. A few years ago he introduced shoots for children home from boarding school, and this proved very popular, but the long drought and low wool prices spoilt his scheme. He was a shooter of above average ability, and he shot over a wide range of clubs in Queensland and New South Wales. His passing will be mourned by all clay target shooters who knew him.

VALE — the patron of the Australian Clay Target Association, the late Lieutenant-General Sir William Bridgeford, KBE, CB, CBE, MC, IDC, PSC, died in Brisbane, Queensland, on September 21, 1971. He was a most able man who contributed much to Australia and his company, plus his leadership was enjoyed by all who met or served with him. He was originally an ardent quail shooter and one of the many shooters who remembers those days is Referee Examiner Les Berkefeld of Rabaul, New Ireland, TPNG, of the 3rd Light Horse Regiment in 1930.

The register "Who's Who" lists our late patron through the years as-born July 28, 1894, at Smeaton, Victoria, son of G. Bridgeford. Educated Ballarat High School and graduated Duntroon Military College 1915. Australian Imperial Forces 1915-1919, Military Cross, and was also awarded the Greek Military Cross and the U.S. Legion of Merit. He was married in 1922. Attended Imperial Defence College 1939 and was appointed Military Liaison Officer at Australia House, London, at the outbreak of World War II. Commanded the 25th Australian Infantry Brigade in England in 1940. Appointed Commander of the British Empire 1941. Deputy Adjutant and Quartermaster-General 1 Australian Corps, Middle East, 1941-1942. Commanded 3rd Australian Armoured Division 1943. Deputy Adjutant and Quartermaster-General New Guinea Force 1943-1944. Commanded 3rd Australian Infantry Division, AIF, 1944-1945. Appointed Commander of the Bath 1945. Quartermaster-General, Australian Military Forces, 1946-1950. General Officer Commanding Eastern Command 1951. Commanderin-Chief Occupational Forces, Japan, and of the British Commonwealth Forces, Korea, 1951-1953. Executive Officer, Olympic Games, Melbourne, 1956. Appointed Knight of the British Empire 1956. Listed as a Director of Associated Broadcasting Services Ltd.,

Goulburn Murray TV Ltd., Barrett Bros. Australia Ltd., Queensland B.D. Eagle Star Insurance Ltd. Recreations shooting and golfing. Member Naval and Military Club.

In 1950 in open competition he shot as Major General W. Bridgeford and won the eighth Australian National Clay Target Championship at the Australian Gun Club, East Burwood, Victoria, with the score of 30/30.

EDITOR'S NOTES (continued)

One club sent a trap candidate to a Referee Examiner for testing, BUT, as the candidate was not a registered shooter and thus was not receiving the publication, A.C.T.A. Shooting "News," the candidate could not be aware of current rules and amendments. Consequently the candidate was ineligible. Referee Examiners are entirely honorary and both clubs and shooters alike should respect this situation, and read and execute Rule 45 to the common good.

The 1971 Interstate Trap Teams Match has been won by the South Australian Team with the first, so recorded, score of 500/500 broken trap targets.

The 1971 Interstate Skeet Teams' Match has been won by the Victorian Team with 477/500 broken skeet targets.

The final section of the 1972 International Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Trophy will be held at Corntown Farm, Ewenny, Bridgend, Glamorgan, South Wales, on Friday, July 21, 1972, and the conditions will be unchanged up to and including the year 1975. A cordial invitation is extended to any Australian shooter to attend and more particularly any Australian team shooter.



In 1949, in three successive shoots, won the Geelong Sparrow then Commonwealth and Victorian Starlings titles; 1953 won Geelong Pigeon, then Commonwealth and Victorian Starlings in three successive shoots, shot 25/25, with Fred Burns 24/25 and the late George Cross 23/25.

1971 Australian Interstate D.T.L. Trap Teams' Match

The 1971 Australian Interstate Down-the-line Teams' Match for the "Great Britain and Ireland Trophy" has been won by the South Australian Team with its perfect score of 500/500.

Teams were of 15 shooters of whom only the highest 10 scores were to count. 50 targets per member from 18 yards, double barrel, both barrels equal value, 5 track squad system, shot in two stages of 25 targets per visit over one or two traps but two traps where possible. 5 targets from each track per member before changing tracks. Team members with common scores were finally recorded for placing in the team after using the countback system.

OLYMPIC TRENCH SHOOTING

Down-the-line trap and skeet shooting are shot only in those countries of British or American influence. The rest of the world shoots Olympic Trench and I.S.U. (International Shooting Union) skeet . . . only.

Why? Because Olympic Trench and International Skeet are the internationally recognised and practised forms of clay pigeon (clay target) shooting.

Originally high scores were not common in D-T-L shooting as the old lever-cocked traps, from their irregular and unstable pivoting, produced very variable targets.

Then the electric automatic self angling traps were produced, scores increased and consequently attendances increased. Everyone likes to achieve a satisfying score. Everyone likes the chance to shoot a satisfying score

Down-the-line shooting in America is a little simpler and differs slightly from British/Australian shooting in that their targets only have half the horizontal angle variation (they are 22 degrees either side of centre). But, to offset this, Americans shoot only single barrel, and, in plain terms, how utterly sensible from a cost viewpoint compared with double barrel shooting!

However, recently in America, at a major shoot, some 40-odd shooters each shot and broke over 200 straight targets. The winner had to shoot on to break another 383 targets to eliminate the others. At the USA National Skeet Championship 37 shooters each broke 250/250, then two shooters survived another 1050 targets without missing. Imagine their physical exhaustion—they must have been on the point of collapse.

Do you really believe, that where conditions are so easy, that this type of shooting is really worth while? Clay target shooting is simulated field shooting, which is now becoming less available throughout the world. However, whilst we can still remember game shooting and that of feathered game—quail, snipe or pheasant—why not model ourselves to this actual standard?

Thus, retain our existing D-T-L and skeet methods, of course, but also adopt the European methods as accepted within the Olympic Trench and ISU rules.

In Olympic Trench and International Skeet, the

number who have shot and broken 200 straight targets can be counted on two hands. Thus, a clear winner can be more clearly and satisfactorily decided, and we would retain more of our younger in age or intermediate in capacity shooters within our ranks, because everyone likes competition and we can only have this by competing shoulder-to-shoulder under tough conditions.

Coming into prominence are the American ISU automatic traps and these have already been accepted as official ISU equipment for the Pan-American and Asian Games. The reason for this, as the ACTA submitted through an Australian representative some four years ago, is that this is a multi-angling and elevating ball trap which is far cheaper to purchase, instal and use than the 5-trap universal trap method which uses five fixed angle traps (see page 8, October, 1971, ACTA Shooting "News").

Outlay costs of 5 and 15 trap Olympic installations (see photos on pages 8 and 4 respectively of October, '71, Shooting 'News'') are very expensive complete with "fono-pull" (this accepted name description is self-explanatory). Nimrod, Laporte, Fosse and other such traps vary from \$5000 to \$10,000.

From a practical viewpoint the American traps, when fitted with conversion kits (Winchester White Flyer with kit number 1524A) are available for half these other prices and can be used for regular D-T-L and double rise shooting with little or no maintenance problems. Virtually fit them and forget them.

Additionally of course a self-loading attachment containing some 200 or so targets must ultimately pay for itself in the saving of trapper or pit-boy wages as the referee or the puller merely sends the target on its way by electric release and the self angling cannot be read, as with the older style manual traps in use some years ago.

Further details and comparisons of Olympic, ISU, down-the-line and skeet shooting will be published as soon as space is available.

What shooting do you like? This—or that—or a combination or an alternative? Soon, these may be available.
