Target Association to be held in the Ex-Servicemen's Bowling Club, Griffith, New South Wales at 6 p.m. on Monday, March 13, 1972.

#### DELEGATE APPOINTMENT

Affiliated units of the A.C.T.A. are reminded that they are entitled to one delegate (Article 15) to represent their interests at the Annual Meeting. However, delegates can only be accepted providing the Association "Articles of Association" are complied with. This involves the completion of the necessary forms, namely "Acceptance of Membership" (Article 5 (a)), "Nomination of Representative" (Article 21) (in the case of a corporate club), or "Nomination of Delegate" (Articles 5 (c) and 16) (in the case of an unincorporated club), followed finally by "Notice of Acceptance of Delegates." Official printed forms as applicable are obtainable from the A.C.T.A. office. It should be noted that nomination of a representative or member delegate can only be accepted providing all subscriptions and monies due by either the nominee or the club, to the Association, have been paid as provided for in Article 49.

It is also pointed out that where a representative or delegate has been appointed previously, and this has not been officially rescinded, the appointment as previously made will stand, until the Association is advised or instructed otherwise. In accordance with the Articles of Association, clubs cannot appoint a delegate other than on the prescribed form (letters are unacceptable).

Each financial affiliated member club was mailed a Delegate Entree Card (for unincorporated clubs) or a Representative Card (for incorporated clubs) at the time of the delegate appointment and this entree card remains valid until the named delegate is changed. These cards must be presented by the respective financial shooter delegates concerned to obtain permission to attend and be eligible to vote at future annual general meetings.

#### 1972 ANNUAL MEETING

The 1972 annual meeting of affiliated club delegates and representatives of member clubs will be held in a special room of the Ex-Servicemen's Bowling Club, Griffith, New South Wales, at 6 p.m. on Monday, March 13, 1972.

Only such items as submitted within the Association Articles and published on the Agenda shall be discussed. A.C.T.A. Secretary shall be available at 5.30 p.m.

During the two days, Thursday/Friday, March 9/10, 1972, the Griffith Gun Club will conduct a series of events as eye-openers for the 1972 Australian Nationals and this club programme will include:—

On Thursday, March 9, a special 16 yard event sponsored by the Rice Marketing Board of New South Wales

On Friday, March 10, the finals of the 1971/1972 Winchester Tournament in Australia, both trap and skeet sections, and, in any section of this Winchester Tournament, if shooters shoot in front of their handicaps, then no handicap penalty will be applied.

The 1972 Australian National Clay Target Championships will then be conducted by the Association on the grounds of the Griffith Gun Club, some three miles to the North-West of the town, on the edge of the aerodrome. This will be a seven consecutive day programme commencing at 8 a.m. daily (or as directed) over Saturday, March 11 to Friday, March 17, inclusive.

Weather should be windless, sunny and muggy, temperature around 90 deg. or more. Rain is not expected. Shooters will be facing a little South of East. Vista is clear for one mile over the aerodrome and it is the club's usual practice to spread rice husks over the area in front of the traphouses to give equality of vision and to lessen weed growth.

We shall be shooting over six electric oscillating traps, all "Winchesters." There will be a seventh trap layout as a spare — this will be fitted with a "Damo" electric oscillating trap but the tracks will only be marked for 16 yards common mark shooting.

Catering will be within a specially erected, removable, steel building. A full range of meals will be available, at normal prices as submitted to, and approved by, the Association. These will be available from 8 a.m. till 4 p.m. daily over March 9 to 17, inclusive. Menu includes hot meals, cold meals, snacks, or even just a cup of tea.

A licensed bar will be contained in a separate building. The bar will close immediately after the scheduled shooting each day.

Gunsmith will be Noel King of Griffith, who will have all shooting requisites and facilities available. Shooters may purchase cartridges for handicap events only from the gunsmith, as provided within our shooting rules.

Scoreboard will be a double-sided, raised affair, roofed either side. It is provided with the compliments of I.M.I. Australia Limited.

Squad Indicator Board will be supplied and donated by Winchester Australia Pty. Limited — this will provide for the six squads facing up at any given time, and, for shooter guidance/preparation, the scoreboard will indicate each squad to specific tracks by—

and so on, over the six trap layout.

A.C.T.A. sashes will be handed p.m. daily as directed by the A.C.T.A. National President, Mr Gordon Hall, to the winner of each of the respective scheduled events, but neither winners, nor placegetters, throughout the Championships will receive physical trophies, but, in lieu, they will each receive a "trophy credit" on a sliding scale (in proportion to the nominations received) over the 1st to 15th placegetters in each major event, with provision for a best lady shooter's trophy voucher.

For the three Intermediate Events and the Skeet Event, the trophy credits will be on a separate sliding scale to the 1st to 5th placegetters in these events. 1st, 2nd and 3rd in all events cannot be divided. They must be shot to finality. Yardages and State awards are discontinued.

Especially branded cartridges will be sold by the A.C.T.A. Cashier in the usual manner by means of—

- (a) especially numbered strip tickets for \$2.60 per packet of 25; or
- (b) especially numbered larger/distinctive tickets for \$2.50 per packet of 25, being 500 cartridges/ case lots for \$50.

Only these especially branded cartridges are to be used in the Championship events.

I.M.I. and Winchester will each distribute their respective cartridges from 12 ft. x 12 ft. areas,

Empty shells on the ground are the property of the A.C.T.A. and distribution will be via the Shoot Marshals.

Clay targets will be color BLACK throughout the trap and skeet sections of the programme.

The Skeet events will be contested over the two days Thursday, Friday, March 16/17, to complete the programme. Two skeet layouts will be used.

The public are invited, but, no person can enter the property without permission. Undesirables can be evicted by the Association, and no trading is permitted on the grounds other than that approved, in writing with the gunsmith, the caterers, or the cartridge

manufacturers, each from the so allotted distribution point.

Car parking — access can be two ways out of the

- (a) up the hill, round past the golf course then round the length and one end of the aerodrome. I feel the simplest is the other, via a few corners, straight to the club, BUT, as the designer of Griffith also designed Canberra, please do not get lost in the circles;
- (b) a VIP area will be restricted to Executive Committee, Gunsmith and Shoot Staff via the gate nearer the clubhouse;
- (c) ample general parking is available in the car park via the first double gate on the town side of the grounds.

No sleeping caravans other than gunsmith and caterer are permitted on the grounds — the club grounds are A.C.T.A. property throughout the National programme. Thus, day use caravans for cartridge and gun suppliers only will be contained in the fenced area behind traps 6 and 7 — that is, the Northern sector beyond the clubhouse.

Sleeping caravans can be accommodated—

- (a) at no cost in a tree covered area on the town side of trap one, BUT, the nearest toilet/water facilities are at the club some 200 to 300 yards distant;
- (b) at the Griffith Showgrounds where some power connections are available — this is the recommended area. There is no public caravan park in the town. The nearest is at Darlington Point, some twenty miles south.

Griffith town centre is under three miles from the club. The club is on the edge of the airport. Feeder air services operate to Sydney only. No air services to Melbourne. A daily road bus service runs to Melbourne.

All shooters present, must present 1972 handicap cards, none of which would have been issued without the 90 cent shooter insurance premium being paid this insurance covers all visitors and honorary members. Also if clubs have no constitutions, etc., in writing, then no cards are issued.

A separate account will be kept for every shooter throughout the programme. Shooters may pay as they nominate or as they finish.

Flags — the Australian flag and the A.C.T.A. flag will be flown from the crosstrees daily between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Transport Services—

- (a) a feeder air service exists Sydney to Griffth but no flights are scheduled southwards. Some problems exist for Tasmanians and those from South and Western Australia;
- (b) railways Melbourne to Griffith two routes via Tocumwal or via Albury from Spencer Street Station, Melbourne, not Wednesdays or Satur-
- (c) road motor from Whights Tourist Services, 100 Flinders Street, Monday to Saturday.

Shoot Personnel — at this stage we have sufficient recommended and checked referees both trap and skeet, and these have been confirmed in writing.

Shoot Marshals will be Mr Harry Williamson of Apsley, Victoria and Lieutenant Wal Murphy of H.M.A.S. Cerberus.

Those marked \* will also referee the skeet rounds. Mr Allan Wembridge will be the Trap Mechanic.

Should additional referees be required they will be co-opted by the Marshals as directed by the A.C.T.A. Secretary.

All Nationals Referees are required to meet in the clubhouse at 2 p.m. Friday, March 10, for instructions.

The decisions of the Referees and the Marshals whilst on the tracks are final. (Rule 46). A Marshal must be present at each shoot-off in addition to the check scorer.

Public Address System — This is for use only by the Marshals, A.C.T.A. Secretary and A.C.T.A. President, to commence the shoots, to bestow trophies and in extreme cases only, for special announcements.

Should any shooter or visitor be required for a message, his name must be put on the scoreboard, then, that person must see that his name is erased when he has the message.

Overseas Visitors — Our friend, Mr Elgin Gates of USA, will be practising at Griffith from March 9.

A special contingent of about 50 is expected to be with us from USA over the two days Monday/ Tuesday, March 13/14, to include the A.T.A. permanent Manager Mr Hugh McKinley, A.T.A. Editress Mrs Betty Ann Foxworthy, plus at least one past A.T.A. President. Some of the party will include the various wives/husbands. They then depart by bus for a tour of Winchester, Geelong plant, before flying home to USA, via Auckland, New Zealand.

According to letters received we may have some shooters from Singapore with us.

On Friday night, March 10, at 7 p.m. will be a "gettogether buffet dinner" in a large private room at the Ex-Servicemen's Club for the shooters and friends to meet, with shooters paying own meals.

The 1972 National Championships sequence will be:

Saturday, March 11 — Grand Australian Handicap, plus a \$300 Handicap, if possible.

Sunday, March 12 — National DB and Inter DB.


Monday, March 13 — National SB and Inter SB.

Tuesday, March 14 — Aust./N.Z. DTL Trap Championship, plus a \$300 Handicap, if possible.

Wednesday, March 15 — International DTL Trap Teams' Match followed by National Champion of Champions event.

Thursday, March 16 — National DR and Inter DR and in conjunction National Skeet.

Friday, March 17 — National Skeet to finality.



Note that the programme does not include either an ANZ Trap Teams' Match or an ANZ Skeet Teams' Match as by agreement, these are hosted in either country by alternate years, or by other agreement, and for 1972 these shall be conducted in New Zealand.

A.C.T.A. office will commence taking nominations (these and sweepstake prices as for 1971 at Brisbane) between 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. daily, commencing Friday, March 10, to prepare the first squads for the scoreboard and for an easy 8 a.m. start by the Marshals. Nominations will then be taken between 8.30 and 10 a.m. the next morning(s) up till almost the end of the first round. Cashier will then close and re-open daily, for payouts only, between 4 p.m. and 5 p.m.

On Monday night, March 13, at 6 p.m. will be the 36th Annual A.C.T.A. General Meeting in the special large private room at the Ex-Servicemen's Bowling Club. When the Annual Meeting ceases around 8 p.m., individual meals may be purchased by the club delegates in the main dining room at the Ex-Servicemen's (main) Club, opposite the bowling club.

On Tuesday, March 14, from 6.30 p.m. a winetasting barbecue will be held at Calamia Winery, one mile out. A nominal price of \$1.50 to be paid by shooters. This is designed so that shooters and overseas visitors alike, can relax over a hot chop or piece of steak, away from the shooting.

agents Commercial Marketing P/L of Sydney, the Browning Trap High Gun Trophy will be handed by our National President Mr Hall, on their behalf, to the highest scorer over the six trap events of Gd. H'cap, Nat. DB, SB, ANZ, Ch. of Ch. and DR events.

Should there be tied scores over the totals of these named trap events, then the shoot-off procedure for the Browning Trap High Gun Trophy shall be the best of 30 targets, from 5 targets in the method and sequence of each of the major programmed events as follows:—

5 targets off Handicaps
5 targets DB from 16 yards
5 targets SB from 16 yards
5 pairs DR from 16 yards
5 targets DB from 20 yards

Being the best of 30 targets.

Concerning the Newton Thomas Overall High Gun Cup, this is to be handed to the best scorer over the Grand Handicap, National DB, SB, ANZ (points), Ch. of Ch., DR and the Skeet event. In the event of ties to be shot-off as for the Browning High Gun Trophy plus a half round (13) of skeet targets, totalling the best of 43 targets.

There will be a Stirling U/O Shotgun available to the first New Zealander to win the ANZ Trap Championship. This kind offer is from Fuller Firearms P/L of Sydney.

For the International Trap Teams' Match on day five (Wednesday, March 15), the team shall be named as soon as possible after the Australia/New Zealand Trap Teams' Match on the Tuesday.

Team of 30 members, in six squads each of five shooters, over four tracks from the 16 yard mark, five targets from each track per shooter before changing tracks. Each shooter is permitted up to five practice targets before the competition. Members to shoot at 100 targets in 4 x 25 target stages, points scoring 3 and 2. Only the highest 25 scores of points are to count. Scores shall be sealed immediately for mail despatch to England — the results should be published in September "Shooting News."

The squad shooting sequence for this Teams' Match over four traps is to be:—

Squad 1 shoots tracks in this order 1 2 3 4 Squad 2 shoots tracks in this order 2 3 4 1 Squad 3 shoots tracks in this order 3 4 1 2 Squad 4 shoots tracks in this order 4 1 2 3 Squad 5 shoots tracks in this order 1 2 3 4 Squad 6 shoots tracks in this order 3 4 1 2 with squads 5 and 6 feeding in at the first trap change.

All squads shall then have an even and regular respite whilst preserving the overall continuity of the match.

A choice of either, or both, of two brands of cartridges shall be available free to the International Team members. Special Australian Team Badges will be presented by A.C.T.A. President, to the assembled team, before photographs are permitted.

The final section of the 1972 International Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Trophy will be held at Corntown Farm, Ewenny, Bridgend, Glamorgan, South Wales, on Friday, July 21, 1972, and the conditions will be unchanged up to and including the year 1975. A cordial invitation is extended to any Australian shooter to attend and more particularly any Australian team shooter.

The 1972 New Zealand National Championships will be conducted at Timaru betwen April 8 and 15.

The 1973 Australian National Clay Target Championships will be conducted by the Association at the South Australian Gun Club, at dates yet to be decided.

#### 1972 CHAMPIONSHIP ALLOCATIONS

#### Tasmania:

- 1. State Tower Championship withdrawn from Hobart G.C. at their request, and re-allocated to Victorian G.C. who have two towers.
- 2. State Walk-Up Championship previously unallocated, is now awaiting a shoot date by Bothwell G.C.

Reports in writing have been lodged concerning the conduct of shoots at Deniliquin, NSW on 16/10/1971 and at Narrabri, NSW on 28/11/71.

At each of these shoots, shooters have walked off the tracks during a competition, after missing a target or targets, and none of the shooters were front markers or newcomers.

Rule 43 is quite clear in its wording that "All members of a squad shall remain at the firing track until the last shot of the squad is fired."

Not only is such a happening unsportsmanlike, but, each shooter has a moral obligation to his fellow competitors, the referee, the host club and to the spectators for the standard of his conduct and attitude. Should these shooters repeat these actions, they shall be named publicly and also could be subject to Article 34 (f) which provides that the Executive Committee may refuse entry at any meeting, competition or event.





Horsham (V) — annual meeting 18/11/71 office bearers elected were President, Ern Smith; Vice-Pres., John Hinneberg, Walter Oliver; Secretary, Bert Robinson; Ass. Sec., Max Gribben.

OPEN SEASON in Western Australia — a free Duck Shooter's Guide is available on application direct to The Department of Fisheries and Fauna, 108 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, WA, 6000. The duck season opens 6 p.m. Saturday, December 18, 1971 and closes at midnight Sunday, February 13, 1972 — these are corrected dates from those supplied for publishing in December "Shooting News."

Bag limit (a) under no circumstances to exceed 10 ducks per person per day; (b) bag not to contain more than six ducks that are not Wood Ducks (Maned Geese) and/or Mountain Ducks, i.e., if no Wood or Mountain Ducks, the bag limit shall be six.

Possession limit: opening day — 10 ducks; after opening day — 20 ducks.

The State of Western Australia is divided into areas. Wild ducks may ONLY be taken by using a licensed shotgun fired from the shoulder. It is illegal to use any motor vehicle, power boat, aircraft or other device to drive wild ducks over or in front of other shooters. Electric torches, spotlights or lamps may not be used in the taking of ducks. Traps or snares may not be used. Wild ducks may not be kept in captivity. Eggs of wild duck may not be taken. The sale of ducks is forbidden. Hunting bags may not be pooled.

**Ballandean (Q)** — sends compliments to all and notice that the club is in recess until March 1972. (Note — this is because of primary production demands each year.)

Hobart (Tas.) — have relinquished the 1972 Commonwealth Tower Championship and this has been offered to the Victorian Gun Club (V) which has two towers.

Lae (TPNG) — short history — "now situated on Lutheran Mission land, 4½ miles from Lae Post Office over a good gravel road. The club started 11/7/1963 on information from Norman Camps of Mount Hagen,

and using a trap procured by Norm Osborn. Some truly fierce and ancient fowling pieces were used on the opening day. With the advice and help of A.C.T.A. we were able to get into the right drill of clay target shooting. Continual heavy rains washed out earlier grounds at the mouth of the Markham River.

Some rooster in the Department of Lands, evidently terrified of shotguns, refused an application for a club lease on the grounds that it would constitute a potential hazard to passing sea traffic. Could be that the sight of the remains of the Japanese troopship beached nearby after the guns of RAAF Beaufighters forced her to beach to save sinking, influenced his decision.

General decision was then that all these be placed on tables within the clubhouse but the quantity of water (it covered some miles) really surpassed all expectations. Again the carpet must be shampooed, the underfelt is now unusable. A piano floated then finished upside down on two tables. The refrigerator floated.

An aluminium dinghy was even brought into the clubhouse during salvaging. Some 16,000 clay targets were caked with brown mud and had to be handwashed in luke-warm water and detergent, by a team of ten club members.

The club may build a retaining wall round the clubhouse or it may raise the roof and build another floor level well above this new recorded water mark. Meantime shooting recommenced at the end of November at the club.

# Australian trapshooting as experienced by an American shooter

When my family and I attended the Australian National Championships in Brisbane last June, we found Australian hospitality to be warm and friendly. The competition was keen and the shooting events, while somewhat strange to us, were extremely interesting and enjoyable.

Our trip was preceded by nine months of correspondence with Mr C. M. Berry, the National Secretary and Editor of the "Australian Clay Target Shooting News," the official monthly publication of the Australian Clay Target Association. We also corresponded with Mr Fred Hudson, of Sydney, one of the few Australian shooters who have attended the Grand.

I subscribed to the "News" in order to familiarise myself with Australian shooting as much as possible before our trip, and I also asked for a copy of their shooting rules which I studied from cover to cover several times.

ling to yourself. To get the picture completely, turn to page 20 of our 1971 A.T.A. rule book, diagram II. Australian machines are set to throw targets from D to H instead of E to G where we throw them,

Rules on ammunition: At the National Champion-ships only factory ammo can be used, and must be bought on the grounds the same as at Vandalia. Price is about the same as in the U.S. Each shell is stamped on the side for identification, i.e., BRISBANE 1971. For all events except handicap, the shot charge is limited to 1-1/8 oz. of shot. Here, all similarity to U.S. rules comes to an end.

Any shot size, including No. 6 or smaller, can be used. There is no restriction on the powder load, and I can tell you that Australians like the big bang!

Before anyone gets excited, let me say that of the two shotshell manufacturers on the grounds, Winchester supplied regular AA trap loads as we know them,

For the general interest and information of A.T.A. shooters, and particularly those who plan to go on the South Sea Safari next March, I will describe and clarify Australian trapshooting as best I can.

For all practical purposes, the trap houses, weight and size of targets, height and distance thrown, and the shooting stations are the same as in the U.S. with two important exceptions:

- (1) Instead of the shooting walkways beginning at 16 yards and extending back to 27 yards, Australian walkways (called tracks) begin at 12 yards from the trap and extend to 27 yards. More about this later.
- (2) The trap machines Winchester-Western are usually used at the National Championships are set in the No. 5 hole, producing angles of 45 degrees to the left and right of centre in contrast to our maximum angles of approximately 22 degrees.

The first target I fired at in Australia from post one was a maximum right angle. Instead of being straight-a-way as in the U.S. it was a pretty sharp right angle. The same target from post five will leave you mumb-

 $2\frac{3}{4}$  and 3 dram,  $7\frac{1}{2}$ , 8, and 9. We used these and could tell no difference between them and U.S. loads. I.M.I., the Australian firm, supplied shells that shot just as well. The power equivalent in drams was not marked, but felt like a  $3\frac{1}{4}$ - $3\frac{1}{2}$  dram load when I used them.

For handicap events, 1½ oz. of shot is permitted, again no restriction on powder load. Shells similar to those allowed in Vandalia for the International Clay Pigeon events can be used. For those who have always had a yen to pulverise clay targets with a big bang, Australia is the place. Loads up to 3½ drams of powder are available. They are, however, a bit tough on the shoulder. Reloads are permitted at other than National Championship events.

There are many kind of novelty and club events shot in Australia, including some where miniature-sized targets are used. Rather than attempt a resume of all types of shooting, I will describe and explain the National Championship events.

The National Single Barrel Championship consists of 50 targets, two rounds of 25 each from 16 yards. One shot is fired at each target, the same as our own 16 yard events. There are no classes in Australia, so

everybody is shooting against the entire field. (The Association is now in the process of creating classes for the first time, based on averages, and which will probably be in effect for the 1972 season.) There are six shooters per squad with the sixth man standing behind the shooter on post one when the event starts. The procedure is to shoot one target from each post, wait until the man on your right has fired, then move over to that post. The squad rotates this way until the round of 25 targets is completed. This method of shooting one target from each post is used for all events. All ties in this and other events are shot off on a sudden-death or miss-and-out basis.

The National Double Barrel Championship, Australia's most popular event, is shot exactly the same way, 50 targets from 16 yards, but *two* shots can be used. The target is scored if broken by either shot. At Brisbane, 78 shooters broke the 50 straight (shades of Vandalia 1968) and the eventual winner broke another 198 in the shoot-off.

The Australian-New Zealand Down the Line Trap Championship is exactly the same as the double barrel event; 50 targets from 16 yards, but with one novel difference. The score is determined by a point system. Three points if the target is broken with the first shot. If the first shot misses and the target is then broken with the second shot, two points. Point total is the score.

The Australian Double Rise Championship consists of 25 pairs of doubles, one pair from each post, rotating squad as previous described.

The Champion of Champions Cup consists of 50 targets from 20 yards. ALL shooters, regardless of their handicap yardage, must shoot from 20 yards. Again, two shots are allowed to break each target which is scored if broken by either shot. As in all two shot events, there is no penalty if you chip the target with the first shot, then hit it again with the second shot (it is a dead target with the first shot).

The Grand Australian Handicap is 50 targets, one target per post as in other events, two shots to break it. Handicap yardages from 12 yards to 27 yards.

These six events comprise the National Trap Championships, 300 targets total. The Skeet Nationals are held on the next day after the trap events are over.

Several Australian-New Zealand team matches are shot in conjunction with the above events as are several intermediate championships which are restricted to shooters whose handicap does not exceed 16 yards. Our A.T.A. handicap cards will be accepted, but since our minimum handicap is 18 yards, no American shooter will be eligible for the intermediate events.

The Australian handicapping formula is quite complicated, and yardage movements have previously been based entirely on the value of the trophies or winnings.

The Executive Committee is now making extensive changes in the rules, with plans to create classes, A, B, C and D, by percentage averages very similar to our own; and a much simpler method of handicapping than the previous trophy values. These new rule

changes should be available about the first of the year so there is little point in giving a detailed description of the old system.

In Australia, being a referee is considered to be a position of honor. Referees must be registered and duly examined and qualified by referee examiners. Official badges are issued. They do the pulling and calling and administer the rules. Someone else writes down the score. In this matter (and in a few other areas), Australia is ahead of us by a country mile and we could do well to learn something.

While it can obviously happen, we never had anything that resembled a slow or a fast pull. They were superb! On the other hand, the shooter must take any whole target that comes out of the trap when he calls pull. Only the referee can call "no target," and he will do so in the event he should accidentally give a fast or a slow pull or a broken target comes out of the trap, and for a number of other reasons, generally the same as our own "no target" rules.

The rules on "lost target" are very similar to our own with one notable exception for the single barrel event which might "throw" American shooters. In America it is general practice for a shooter using an over/under gun to put an empty case in the barrel he is not using so as to prevent putting a loaded shell in the wrong barrel and thus losing a target. Here is the rule: 74. "Lost target" shall be called if in single barrel shooting the competitor loads two cartridges into the gun. A competitor is allowed to load one cartridge only and is not permitted to load an empty shell or dummy cartridge.

Double rules are very similar to A.T.A. rules, and the rules on dusted targets (lost), dented primers, misfires, etc, are much the same as ours.

The referee calls the result of each target, i.e., "Lost," "No target," or "Kill." (They are planning to use another word such as "score" rather than kill since Australia also has its share of anti-gun, anti-hunt, anti-everything groups who are constantly looking for something to hang a protest on, and even "killing" a clay target might give them a wedge.)

I think it is worth quoting the rules regarding referees which will give an indication of the efficient way the shooting is administered:

# DUTIES OF OFFICIAL REFEREES AT ALL TOURNAMENTS

- 100. He must have complete knowledge of the Rules of the A.C.T.A. and shall adjudicate the competition at all times as set out by the management.
- 101. It is his responsibility to announce the conditions as set out in the Rules for each event before the competition commences, also to displace shooters to their correct firing lanes.
- 102. As shooting proceeds he must observe that shooters are standing on their correct yardage, not shooting out of turn, handling their guns with safety, and using the correct shells as laid down for each individual event.

- 103. He must at all times observe that the trap is releasing regulation targets and may at any time challenge the heights or angles thrown.
- 104. The referee must distinctly and loudly announce the result of each shot and shall decide all other issues which arise in relation to the direct competition.
- 105. The referee must be efficient and alert at all times and it is most important that he should gain the confidence and respect of each and every competitor.

Among other interesting innovations such as one target from each post, the double barrel events, the excellent referee-pullers, one that I like is that the referee, at the beginning of an event, allows each competitor on the squad to shoot at one target as a sort of quick warm-up before officially starting the event.

Because most of the shooting in Australia is double barrel, i.e., two shots allowed at each target, my guess is that 95 per cent of the competitors are using over/under guns. We saw only one pump gun and a few autoloaders.

I believe I have covered most of the major differences between Australian and U.S. trapshooting, but should anyone going on the trip have specific questions not covered here, please feel free to write to my business address, 1492 Highland Street, Needles, California, 92363, or phone 714-326-3783, and I believe I can answer them.

Appended is a short glossary of Australian trap-shooting terms:

Nominate—to enter an event.

Down-the-line—regular trapshooting.

Visit to the trap-shooting a round.

Tracks or lanes—walkway from 12 to 27 yards.

SB, single barrel—one shot at each target.

DB, double barrel-two shots at each target.

DR, double rise —doubles.

Squad system—six-man squads, shooting one target on each post.

Kill—dead bird.

CD, compulsory division—ties divide the purse and/ or option.

Possible—to go straight or shoot a perfect score. Sashes—trophy award, a wide ribbon to go over the shoulder, usually having the event stamped in gold lettering.

EO, eye-opener—a short or preliminary club event, usually 5, 10 or 20 targets.

Eye-eyes—Australian pronunciation for AA shells. Sweeps or sweepstakes—purse.

Optional sweeps—options.

Points—16 yard targets, two shots, 3 points for first shot kill, 2 points for second shot kill.

Graded shoot—all competitors shoot from the same mark, but prizes or trophies are awarded to the high shooters of various yardage groups.

Swifties—sandbaggers (yep, they have 'em too).


