REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF JANUARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any persons joining such Club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

FEES

Club secretaries are reminded that club 1973 affiliation fee of \$10 is due and payable on January 1, 1973.

All club members are reminded that their 1973 Association fees are due and payable through their club secretaries on January 1, 1973.

These for the 1973 year are-

1. \$5 under Articles 14 and 49;

2. Junior shooters — see page 2 herein.

Only subscribers to A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" may send \$5 direct to the Secretary for "Shooting News" publications.

No pro rata rates are accepted and all fees are for the calendar year concerned.

March 1973 "Shooting News" will be mailed only AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS to those financial — that is, those whose fees are actually received by the Secretary as of February 14, 1973.

Shooters who have not marked their cards with their progressive common mark scores throughout 1972 are to be classed by club secretaries as "A" Class shooters in the 1973 registration lists to be forwarded by club secretaries for A.C.T.A. processing.

Some shooters still tend to think in terms of money values and not in the terms or spirit of the competition. A number of shooters have found a wide divergence of their respective handicap rating and their common mark class. This may be so, as the two forms of shooting are quite different in their methods of action and also in their methods of calculation.

NOMINATIONS FOR 1973 OFFICES IN A.C.T.A.

All interested shooters are hereby notified that nominations for all offices in the Association close at 5 p.m. on Friday, December 29, 1972. Nominations must be lodged on the prescribed form with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038S, Melbourne, 3001, Victoria. Any nominations received after this hour or date will not be accepted. Nomination forms are available from the Secretary, A.C.T.A. Nomination forms are only available on application.

Those lodging nominations are reminded that such nominations must be lodged in accordance with Article 27 of the Association Constitution, which reads: "Nominations for all offices in the Association and members of the Executive Committee must be in writing signed by the Secretary of the member Club or by the DELEGATE member of an unincorporated club making the nomination, and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before December 31, in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting."



It is advised that private nominations will be rejected. Nominations received must have the official backing of the club and be approved by the Committee of the member club concerned.

These nominations will be published in February 1973, A.C.T.A. "Shooting News."

March 9 to 14, Australian National Trap and Skeet Championships at Adelaide, South Australia.

The 1973 New Zealand National Championships at the Hamilton G.C., Collins Road, Hamilton, in the North Island, will be in this sequence:—

Friday, April 6, 10 a.m.-4 p.m. — Practice matches as required.

Saturday, April 7, from 10 a.m. — Club open shoots of sweepstakes.

Sunday, April 8, from 9 a.m. — Shotgun trophy shoot — three trophies value \$2,000. 30 Targets off open marks. Nom. \$18.

Monday, April 9, from 9 a.m.—

(1) NZ Skeet Championship — 2 rounds each of 25 targets with two and five-man teams in conjunction—

(2) Rothmans NZ International Trap C'ship, 25 targets.

Tuesday, April 10, from 9 a.m.-

(1) NZ Double Rise C'ship, 15 pairs off 16 yards.

(2) NZ Clay Sparrow C'ship, 25 targets off 16 yards.

Wednesday, April 11, from 9 a.m. — NZ Single Barrel C'ship, 50 targets off 16 yards.

Thursday, April 12, from 9 a.m. — NZ Single Rise C'ship, 50 targets off 18 yards.

Friday, April 13, from 9 a.m. — Qualifying events for International Team.

Saturday, April 14, from 9 a.m. — Mackintosh International Trap Teams' Match.

July 20 — the final section of the 1973 International Trap Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Trophy will be held at Kippen Gun Club, near Stirling in Scotland.

September dates, Australian Shooting Championships, both trap and skeet, under International Shooting Union rules, at Melbourne Gun Club, Victoria.

November 10-15, 1973, World International Shooting Union Championships, both trap and skeet, at the Melbourne Gun Club, Victoria.

For the actual allocation of the 1973 World Shooting Championships, Australia is indebted to the representations made by Messrs P. Garrett of the Australian Shooting Association and Bob Morgan of the Australian Amateur Shotgun Association. They were then ably assisted for language technicalities by A.C.T.A.'s Honorary Vice-President, Mr Jules Steiner. The December, 1972-2 A.C.T.A. deeply appreciates the sincerity and calibre of the presentation of Australia's submission in this regard.

PRINCIPAL SHOOTS SCHEDULED FOR 1974

Australian National Trap and Skeet Championship at Melbourne Gun Club, Lilydale, Victoria (dates to be decided during 1973 nationals).

Xth British Commonwealth Games 1974 — Friday, January 25 to Friday, February 1, at Yaldhurst, Christchurch, in the South Island.

The respective shooting dates at Yaldhurst are — Friday, January 25, at 9 a.m. — shotgun skeet. Saturday, January 26, at 9 a.m. — shotgun skeet. Thursday, January 31, at 9 a.m. — shotgun single rise. Friday, February 1, at 9 a.m. — shotgun single rise.

The attention of all concerned is drawn to the "Separate Laws" section concerning firearms legislation and other matters.

AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING RULES

EFFECTIVE AS OF JANUARY 1, 1973

As decided by the Executive Committee over October 9/10, 1972.

Trap 6: Delete from second sentence — "Rule 6 states that."

Trap 11: Add "The use of release trigger guns by registered A.C.T.A. shooters is prohibited."

Trap 27 (a): Add — "clubs which conduct events which do not comply with the shooting rules are conducting an illegal event and no A.C.T.A. approval will be forthcoming for this type of event."

Trap 39 (a): Add "Should a club choose to shoot a graded event then this event must be shot within the common mark rules."

Trap 45 (c): Add "Any referee or referee examiner who fails to register within any year will have his name automatically removed from the Association's referee or referee examiner lists."

Trap 114: Add "The actual overall scores to be counted, with the results of the points-scoring event to be counted as a figure within the overall result."

Trap 115: Add "The actual overall scores to be counted with the results of the points scoring event to be counted as a figure within the overall result."

Trap 126 (b): Delete existing rule 126 (b) and insert the following:

"126 (b). Team members shall be chosen by an elimination match, 30 targets from 18 yards, 5 lane, squad system, double barrel, points scoring 3 and 2, $1\frac{1}{8}$ oz. shot (32 grains) No. 6 size or lighter, 15 highest scorers to automatically become the State Team, or

Providing there is a State Association, elected by all clubs in the State concerned, that such Association have the jurisdiction to choose their fifteen-man team on the result of an elimination shoot or series."

Trap 128 (a):

"(i) District I.S.U. Championships to be of 50 targets with nominations \$5.

(ii) State I.S.U. Championships to be of 100 targets, with nominations of \$8."

(Note — I.S.U. regulations provide that no member country can conduct a National (i.e., Commonwealth) Championship without prior ratification by the I.S.U.)

Trap rules 137 (a), 138 (a): To read — "a minimum of 20 or a maximum of 30 targets."

Trap 140 (a): To read — "a minimum of 10 pairs or a maximum of 15 pairs."

Trap 149 (a): Add "the minimum rule of 12 shooters applies overall in that where four or less shooters compete in any one class then no handicapping penalty will apply under rule 149 (a)."

Skeet 9: Description to be amended to read "within 18 inches."

Skeet 11: Add "the use of release trigger guns by registered A.C.T.A. shooters is prohibited."

Skeet 85: Add "any referee or referee examiner who fails to register within any year will have his name automatically removed from the Association's referee or referee examination lists."

Skeet 103 (a): Last sentence to read "District — one round of 25 or 50 targets."

Decisions by the Executive Committee on general matters during their October 9/10, 1972 meeting.

1. Decided that trophies be purchased, engraved and despatched in retrospect to the second and third placegetters respectively of the 1972 National Championships.

2. The 1974 National Clay Target Championships will be conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club at dates yet to be decided during the 1973 Nationals.

3. Decided that all future National Championships have an engraved medallion or trophy.

4. The 1973 National Clay Target Championships will be conducted at the South Australian Gun Club at Belmont near the 13 mile post, westwards on the Port Wakefield Road, from Adelaide, over the six successive days of A.M. Friday, March 9, through till P.M. Thursday, March 14.

5. Unanimously adopted the recommendation from the 36th Annual General Meeting, that, effective from January 1, 1973, a charge of 50 cents per shooter per programme or part thereof, be charged by each gun club (excluding the Nationals programmes) and forwarded without deduction together with the shoot report, to A.C.T.A. Secretary within seven days of each shoot and that ten cents of this shoot fee to be then rebated to the clubs concerned.

cerned. (See separate President's Message in this publication.)

6. Decided that the present shooter insurance charge be discontinued as a cost to the shooter as of December 31, 1972, that this charge be borne by the A.C.T.A. and that the coverage be extended to \$200,000. The policy coverage will be published as soon as available.

7. Unanimously agreed:—

(a) To adopting a junior shooter fee of \$1 per junior with nil copies of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" but that this will not be operative until the laws of the respective States on junior shooters are clearly

defined, then, when these are so gazetted, that such junior shooters may compete.

- (b) The age of junior shooters is expected to be defined as being under 18 years.
- (c) Should junior shooters when registering, seek to obtain copies of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" for the balance of that calendar year, then such junior shooter registration fee shall be \$5 per year.
- (d) Registered junior shooters, irrespective of the class of registration fee, would be included in the shooter insurance scheme.
- (e) A.C.T.A. Secretary will not accept junior shooter registrations until directed to make such an announcement in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News." The ages of all junior shooters must be supplied by club secretaries to the A.C.T.A. Secretary on the registration forms.
 - 8. Decided that-
- (i) consequent upon the experience gained in the 1972 probationary year, that the following class groupings have been found to be the most equitable in Australian shooting and that these be adopted as of January 1, 1973:
 A Class = 90% to 100%,
 - B Class = 85% and under 90%,
 - C Class = All under 85%;
- (ii) the recent direction is to continue to apply concerning those shooters who when renewing through club secretaries, their annual shooter registration fees, fail to submit their existing handicap cards complete with progressive common mark scores and percentages, shall be reported to A.C.T.A. Secretary who shall register them as "A" Class shooters.

9. The Executive Committee is concerned that some referees and referee examiners are not deciding in uniformity according to the written and published shooting rules and asks that all possible attendance be made at the Referee Discussion on Rules Interpretations scheduled for Thursday, March 8, at 4 p.m. in the longroom of the South Australian Gun Club.

10. It was unanimously decided that all investigations be made towards reducing costs for the shooters and to this end the following ten avenues be considered:—

- 1. Insuring shooters free of charge.
- 2. No further increase in shooter registration.
- 3. No charge for break badges.
- 4. Reduced nominations for Nationals or increased value of trophies.
- 5. Providing trophies for State Team Shoots.
- 6. Provision of a ground acquisition and maintenance account in preparation for acquiring an A.C.T.A. ground in each State.
- 7. Provision of a travel account in preparation for the time we are able to send a team overseas, i.e., New Zealand or elsewhere.
- 8. Provision in conjunction with above for the provision of blazers, etc., for teams.
- 9. Provision of adequate office facilities to administer the above.
- 10. A 12-month period using the ground or shoot registration would be necessary before we implement any of the above, to enable the A.C.T.A.

to assess the potential financial return from such a move.

(Special Note: See President's Message following Editor's Notes.)

11. Championship badges - Commonwealth, State, District or Club metal badges when being ordered on the official form should designate whether Class A, B or C.

12. (a) That the A.C.T.A./I.S.U. eliminations for the 1973 World Championship entrants by Australia be open to A.C.T.A. registered shooters contesting over 200 targets over two days and having achieved a selection from these for both trap and skeet of four men and two reserves each, the shooters concerned must sign schedule "A" and if each is not prepared to sign then the next in line be accepted.

(b) Probably shoot 75 Saturday, 50 Sunday, 75 Monday, 8/9/10, September 1973, at the Melbourne Gun Club. Reason — cannot shoot in each State be-cause none have the complete I.S.U. equipment, also the Melbourne Gun Club must be assisted to recoup some of their huge installation costs. Nominations to be \$12 with NIL sweepstakes.

(c) Gold Master I.S.U. Badges for 95/100 trap, 96/100 skeet. Details to be approved in Adelaide in March 1973.

13. The Committee (a) discussed a submission and unanimously agreed that a shooter is no longer intermediate or a particular class shooter if he is rehandicapped and therefore he is not subsequently eligible for intermediate or such particular class high gun consideration.

14. Decided to remind referees that if they are on the shooting lanes with a misfire, that the referees instruct the shooter to check the barrels for obstructions before shooting again. There have been two burst barrels in Queensland because of this type of occurrence.

15. In discussing the merits and demerits of referees the Committee overwhelmingly agreed that the quali-. fications of Nationals Referees (whether male or fe-

male) was their prime concern. 16. Decided that A.C.T.A. adopt the new A.C.T.A. Reefer Jacket Coat of Arms showing all the States and that henceforth the A.C.T.A. official reefer jacket be of "Olympic Green" color. (Note: The Coat of Arms is as shown on the centre

page of November 1972, "Shooting News.")

17. The A.C.T.A. Executive Committee will meet in Melbourne on Monday/Tuesday, September 10/11, 1973.

18. Honorary Life Registrations were bestowed on Messrs K. Soames of New South Wales and N. Wells of Western Australia.

21. Directed that we will not accept an insertion in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News," advertising a car shoot. Executive Committee October 9/10, 1972, directions on the conduct of the 1973 Nationals.

1973 AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL CLAY TARGET CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Be conducted by the Association at the grounds of the South Australian Gun Club.

2. The S.A.G.C. is a half mile left of the thirteen mile post westwards from Adelaide on the Port Wakefield Road.

3. (a) The S.A.G.C. may conduct events as eyeopeners over the one and a half days of Wednesday, March 7, through to midday Thursday, March 8 at which time A.C.T.A. Marshal, Trap Mechanic and a Sub-Committee check and set all traps for the following day's commencement.

(b) The S.A.G.C. pre-national programme to in-clude a small handicap, followed by a points score event then a double rise event on the Thursday.

4. The Executive Committee will meet to discuss current clay target matters at 9.30 a.m. Wednesday, March 7 at the Sportsmen's Association, 147 Greenhill Road, Parkside, 5063, telephone 72-1577.

5. The Executive Committee will meet at 1.30 p.m. Thursday, March 8 in the longroom of the South Australian Gun Club for a short period only.

6. At 2.30 p.m. Thursday, March 8 all appointed 1973 Nationals Referees are required to meet in the longroom of the South Australian Gun Club for instruction by the Shoot Marshal and a Sub-Committee.

7. Between 4 p.m. and 5 p.m. Thursday, March 8 in the longroom of the S.A.G.C. will be a meeting of interested shooters for a discussion on the interpretation of shooting rules BUT only appropriately registered trap or skeet referees to speak. (NOTE: speakers to name themselves, their home club and their qualification before further speaking). Meeting Chair-man to be Mr E. Hawkins with Vice-Chairmen Messrs R. Mules and R. Holtfreter - each of whom are both Trap and Skeet Referee Examiners.

8. (a) From 8 p.m. will be a buffet dinner as a get-together - we expect a record attendance from all over Australia, together with a large contingent of New Zealanders and a repeat visit by the members of the 1972 South Seas Safari from USA.

(b) Price will be \$3.50 per person by A.C.T.A. entrance ticket. Tickets sold by A.C.T.A. only at the appointed office at the S.A.G.C., will include food and beverages.

(c) Venue is the Sportsmen's Association, 147 Greenhill Road, Parkside.

Sequence of shooting events:—

Day One — Friday, March 9, 1973:

National Skeet Championship elimination rounds 2 x 25 targets starting at 8.30 a.m. and using two skeet layouts with squads moving from 1st to 2nd layout. Skeet nominations to close at 12 noon Friday.

National Double Rise Championship starting as soon as possible after the Skeet commences, with Double Rise nominations taken from Skeet competitors after they have shot their first round of Skeet :

use for the Skeet and Double Rise events. Trap 7 to be marked to the 27 yard mark.

Day Two - Saturday, March 10, 1973 - commencing at 8.30 a.m.:

National Skeet Championship finals over two layouts - one visit to each and shooting straight through -

all Skeet shooters to nominate before 12 noon Friday. The Grand Australian Handicap and Aust./NZ Skeet Teams' Match.

Day Three — Sunday, March 11, 1973 — commencing 9 a.m.:

National Double Barrel Championship with Grade Championships shot in conjunction. Normal shoot-off procedure, to count for the International Team and for High Guns.

Day Four - Monday, March 12, 1973 - commencing 8.30 a.m.:

National Single Barrel Championship (as for

National Double Barrel). On this Monday night, March 12, 1973, will be the 37th Annual General Meeting of Delegates of Member Clubs - Secretary will be available with registers as of 7 p.m. — The meeting will commence at 7.30 p.m. and continue till 10 p.m., or as arranged. Venue is the Sportsmen's Association, 147 Greenhill Road, Parkside.

Day Five — Tuesday, March 13, 1973:

Aust./NZ C'ship — open to all grades followed by Aust./NZ Trap Teams' Match plus a USA trap team in conjunction (teams of six).

Day Six — Wednesday, March 14, 1973 — (a) DAY TIME:

International Trap Teams' Match for Mackintosh Trophy Event followed by Champion of Champions Cup Event. Shoot-off over six traps, finishing on one trap.

Wednesday, March 14, 1973 — (b) NIGHT TIME:

At the Sportsmen's Association, 147 Greenhill Road, Parkside, from 8 p.m. till 9 p.m. (or earlier) will be the presentation of the following trophies as a climax to the 1973 National Championships. A local South Australian dignitary to officiate with A.C.T.A. President.

Letters of sincerest appreciation on behalf of the Executive Committee have been sent in acknowledgment for these finest of gun trophy donations.

10. The procedure at the Trophy Presentation will be:-

1. (a) Presentation of bannerettes to Acting President, Amateur Trapshooting Association (of America) and to the retiring President, N.Z.G.C.A.

(b) Exchanges of ties by Australia/USA/NZ teams (possibly this may be at S.A.G.C. and is dependent upon visitors).

2. Overall C Grade High Gun Award — special Beretta U/O shotgun.

3. Overall B Grade High Gun Award — SKB gun.

4. Champion of Champions Perpetual Cup and Evans and Balfour Champion of Champions special trophy.

5. International Trap Teams' Match — High Gun scorer award.

6. Overall Trap High Gun Award — Browning Gun.

7. J. Newton Thomas Overall High Gun Perpetual Trophy (best scorer trap events plus skeet).

11. Practice shooting will be permitted—

1. over days Sunday through to Wednesday;

- 2. on trap 7 which will be lane marked from 16 to 27 yards;
- 3. 9 a.m.-12 p.m. daily for D.T.L. trapshooting (or as directed) 10 targets as available;
- 4. 1 p.m.-4 p.m. daily for I.S.U. trapshooting (or as directed) over 25 targets using moveable wooden platform level with the top of the traphouse;
- 5. qualified referees will be in charge;
- 6. practice costs of 10 cents per target D.T.L. or I.S.U. to be signed for in the normal event nominating manner on the personal progressive account recording procedure.

12. Trap — each referee has the right to choose one of each squad at random to assist the referee on the next round or squad. This assistant to sit and watch progress and merely answer any question by the referee on a ruling.

13. Skeet — on sighter targets the procedure to be — every shooter when approaching for the first time will be allowed to look at, or shoot at, both a high and a low target from station one. He then commences his competition and he may sight a high and low from No. 1 Station of the second layout.

14. (a) There will be one overall winner in each championship with each class then to be decided independently for 1st to 5th placings only.

(b) All shoot-offs are to be by normal procedure, that is, shoot for the best overall scorer, who is also the winner of his class, then in classes to achieve 1st, 2nd, 3rd class placings but no shoot-offs for the 4th/ 5th class placings.

(c) IMI to provide the silver "Australia" medallion for the overall winner of each event including skeet.

(d) Winchester to provide a gold medallion for the first placegetter in each of the three classes of A, B, C, within each National Trap Championship.

(e) A.C.T.A. provide Silver and Bronze medallions for 2nd and 3rd in each class of all trap and skeet events, and a special trophy to each of the best three individual scorers over the I.S.U. practice trap.

(f) The Executive Committee acknowledges and accepts with appreciation, the kind action by our adopted US Liaison Officer, Mr Elgin T. Gates, who

(c) (using Elgin Gates' own words dated 30/10/72), "A rather amusing event took place when a 'C' Class Double Rise shooter won our (USA) National Championship at Vandalia last August (1972) — much to the chagrin of the AA, A and B competitors." (Note: With the anticipated acceptance of class

shooting, this statistical situation may soon also occur in Australian shooting, and such a circumstance will be welcomed.)

15. Squad Indicator Boards — one for each trap to show:—

16. (a) Two referees to be operating at all times on each Skeet layout — the first being a qualified Skeet Referee with, as his assistant, a Nationals Trap Referee as his boundary referee.

(b) Each Skeet shooter may look at only one sighter target at Station One. He may shoot at this sighter target with the result no part of the competition.

(c) Boundary pegs for both Trap and Skeet to be clearly placed and marked to avoid interference with concurrent Double Rise event.

(d) Skeet electric release cords to be fully lengthened for referees to walk safely around each layout.

17. Clay Targets — (a) to be color BLACK for both Trap and Skeet.

(b) Shoot Marshal to be Barry Wembridge of Geelong, Victoria.

18. Empty shotshells to be collected and sold by the Marshal or his appointee at \$2 per carton. Cashier to handle all monies and to provide collection card authority to shooter for cancellation by Marshal.

19. All nominations will be in classes where possible:—

- 1. Accepted as a personally signed account charging, payable before the shooter leaves the grounds. NOTE a ten per cent charge will be added to any outstanding accounts.
- For the National Skeet Championship \$9 plus Optional Overall Sweepstakes @ \$1 plus Optional Sweepstakes of \$1 each 25 targets = \$2; Total = \$12 maximum.
- For all National Down-the-Line Trap Championships of Double Barrel, Single Barrel, ANZ Points, Champion of Champions — as for Skeet above = \$12 maximum.

20. Traps — to be Winchester electric oscillating White Flyer types. Damos will be used for skeet.

21. Trophy Distribution — each class will receive the same amounts in each of the A, B, C classes with appropriate amounts to the first five class places only.

22. Optional Sweepstakes will be distributed as is normal procedure.

23. Referee, Scorer and each Competitor of all squads will sign the score sheet as to satisfactory re-cording, before anyone leaves the layout.

24. The progressive scores for high gun trophies to be counted as for the International Teams' Match and not as broken targets. (Note: This is a permanent amendment to rules 114/115.)

25. Gunsmith on the grounds will be Taipan Projectiles of Adelaide — proprietor S. Churches.

26. Caravans — no sleeping caravans on the ground.

Daytime caravans permitted only for manufacturers and A.C.T.A. President under this arrangement.

A new fully equipped caravan park now exists two miles nearer to Adelaide on the Port Wakefield Road — complete with light aircraft field.

27. Cartridges — (a) for the handicap event, up to $1\frac{1}{4}$ ounce loads may be purchased for cash from the gunsmith on the grounds-

(b) For the championship events only those especially branded A.C.T.A., Adelaide, 1973, $1\frac{1}{5}$ ounce load cartridges, as sold by the Association, may be used.

(c) The price of the A.C.T.A. branded cartridges will be published in February. All such championship cartridges will be supplied only on receipt of a numbered cashier's ticket. This includes all ammunition manufacturers' representatives and International Trap Team members.

28. Travel Agents for these 1973 Nationals are Trans Australia Airlines of 144 North Terrace, Adelaide, 5000 — attention Mr John Goslett.

29. (a) The use of release trigger guns by registered A.C.T.A. shooters is prohibited.

(b) Visiting shooters, from overseas, using release trigger guns, must inform the referees before going onto the tracks and these will be noted on the scoresheets.

30. The full Executive Committee unanimously agreed that the qualifications of Nationals Referees, (whether male or female) was their prime concern.

31. No unlicensed raffles will be permitted at the Nationals.

32. Accepted the kind offer of Executive Committeeman, Mr Keith Oldfield of New South Wales, that he provide red caps to be worn by the trappers at the 1973 Nationals.

33. New Zealand shooters competing at the 1973 Australian National Championships will be accepted in these classes:—

11-12 yarders and beginners within 12 months — shoot C Class.

13-15 yarders — shoot B Class.

16 yarders and back — shoot A Class.

34. Subsequent decisions by Executive Sub-Committees:----

35. In the Rules Interpretations section of the Down-the-Line Trap Handicapping Formula, the reasons for and the method of constructing and using a height measuring stick, within rules 6, 46, 47, 52 and 103, are clearly defined.

For the Skeet shooting, it is suggested that clubs produce a measuring device within Skeet Rule 5, 6, 9 and 91. Constructed a thirty-six inch diameter aluminium circle mounted on telescopic (aluminium) pole, which is then mounted at the target crossing point. (Note in still air, legal targets pass within 18 inches, horizontally or vertically, of a point fifteen feet about the target crossing point. The target crossing point is eighteen feet horizontally from the centre of station number 8.) As soon as the traps are set, this height stick is removed, as for the down-the-line checking procedure.

36. A club recently sought class badges for a double rise event but there are no divisions of classes or grades in novelty events.

37. A shooter recently handed back a trophy to the club concerned:—

- (a) to escape handicapping;
- (b) as a gesture to the club that the trophy could be given again.

Decision: The shooter won his section of the contest, the trophy is now his own property; our rules then apply as to its value. What happens subsequently to the actual trophy is an entirely personal affair.

Newcastle - VALE - Club President Dave Mackay, died in July and will be missed at the clubs round the district as well as by his friends he made on his frequent trips to New Zealand — a fine shooter who always tried to foster the sport in younger shooters.

Perth - VALE - George Langford, age 76, on October 24. George was well known to all WA shooters, he was a regular attendant, shooting his two rounds of skeet and a few trap and had recorded possibles on numerous occasions. He would not enter for open skeet events in recent months, knowing that while he could possibly register a 25, the shoot-off might be beyond his physical ability. Mrs Langford has also been a club stalwart in afternoon catering and the club hopes this continues.

President's message

At this stage I feel the time is opportune to sum up the progress made by your Association in recent times.

The ACTA is now recognised as the controlling body of all shotgun shooting in Australia, whether DTL, Skeet, ISU Skeet or ISU Trap.

Within the Association we now have clubs in many parts of Australia with grounds, amenities and equipment, and enthusiastic members, second to none that I have seen anywhere else. It is a true saying that one cannot stand still, or we go backwards.

It has been my personal ambition to see our Association placed on a sound, businesslike financial footing, and to press for progress in all departments of the Association and the shooting sport.

Acting on a direction from the last annual meeting in Griffith, we have implemented the introduction of a 50c per program shoot fee in line with USA, Canada and other countries. The short term effect of this procedure is to enable the ACTA to take in Junior members at \$1.00 per annum, thus helping to promote the sport for the future; secondly to stabilise the Registration fee at \$5.00, quite a feature in these times of ever increasing wages and costs; thirdly, it enables the ACTA to insure every member for up to \$200,000, in accordance with the accepted policy, for no additional cost to the shooter; and lastly, it provides a continuous revenue for the ACTA and importantly for the members clubs, who will receive 10c per shooter per program, reimbursed to them. This should enable clubs to engage a paid Secretary for their shoots and/or provide a fund to improve their amenities for the eventual benefit of all shooters and their families, in a sentence, those who shoot the most, pay the most and in the long term, benefit the most.

The long term effect is to enable your Association to engage effectively in the promotion of our sport by subsidising teams to compete internationally, to promote State associations and assist them financially, to acquire one or more national shooting grounds, to streamline the administration by improved office facilities including possibly computerisation of returns and statistics, which even at this time requires some thousands of entries per week.

With the advent of classes in common mark shooting, I foresee the necessity of even larger grounds, or more than one venue being required for our National titles, with some 110 New Zealanders booked in to Adelaide for the 1973 Nationals, together with a contingent of some 60 from the USA and Canada, and assuming the same number of Australian shooters as were present in Griffith (and I feel this will be exceeded) we would have a field of 450-500 in the main events, a frightening prospect on a 6/7 trap layout. With shooters in "C" class and "B" class now having an opportunity to win a National title or a High Gun in their own class, the members will increase dramatically in the next few years. Gone are the days when we (as shooters) were regarded as a second class sport. now we are fully recognised by Governments as a responsible Association having shooters capable of competing internationally with distinction, e.g., our teams' efforts in Singapore and New Zealand, our performance in the Mackintosh Trophy event, the inclusion of a shotgunner in the Munich Olympics (Sperry Marshall) and finally having been allocated the 1973 World Moving Target Championships, Trap and Skeet at Melbourne Gun Club grounds.

Competitive shotgun shooting is now a sport we can be proud to be associated with, far removed from the original live bird shooting days from which it originated.

On behalf of the members of the Executive, Secretary and staff of the ACTA I extend cordial good wishes for the festive season to all shooters and their families, and a happy and prosperous New Year.

The separate laws on owning or shooting with shotguns in the respective States of the Commonwealth of Australia

QUEENSLAND

Under a 25/10/72 authority of the Under Secretary of the Premier's Department, Brisbane:----

Attention is drawn to Section 11A of the Firearms Acts 1927 to 1967 in that:---

"11A (1) Any person who discharges or carries any firearm on Sunday shall be guilty of an offence against this Act.

(2) The provisions of sub-section one of this section shall not apply to—

- (i) The discharging or carrying of a firearm, while he is actually engaged in the carrying out of the purpose, by a person whose usual and lawful occupation or employment requires for any purpose thereof the use by him of that firearm, but the said provisions shall apply to the discharging and to the carrying of that firearm by that person on all other occasions on Sunday as well as to the discharging and to the carrying by him at whatever time on Sunday of a firearm of a type not usually used by persons in the carrying out of the like purpose;
- (ii) The discharging or carrying of a firearm usually used by persons for the like purpose, by a person for the purpose of and while taking part in a shooting match, competition, or contest wherein objects commonly known as clay pigeons are projected for the purpose of shooting, nor to the carrying of that firearm by him when proceeding to or from that shooting match, competition, or contest:

Provided that sub-paragraph (ii) of this sub-section shall not except from the provisions of sub-section one of this section the carrying of a firearm within any city or town, unless that firearm is either broken or has the bolt thereof removed therefrom, or is otherwise rendered unfit to be discharged."

Supply to Juveniles

It is an offence for any person to sell, hire, give, lend or otherwise supply any firearm or any kind of ammunition to any person under the age of 17 years except where that person is the holder of a permit as abovementioned, in which case, only the type of firearm and ammunition specified in that permit can be supplied to the holder thereof.

NEW SOUTH WALES

Published under the authority of the NSW Government Chief Secretary:----

As of 30/10/72 the (State) Government has approved in principle . . . new legislation to control and regulate the use and possession of firearms, this legislation will not come into effect for some time as it is still in the drafting stage.

Meantime, the following is a statement issued in relation to the proposed changes:----

Proposed Firearms Legislation

The proposed legislation to be introduced into Parliament during the present session is designed to control and regulate the use and possession of firearms in New South Wales.

December, 1972-10

Under the legislation it will be necessary for persons who carry and use firearms outside their own premises to obtain a shooter's licence.

The legislation will also provide that all dealers in firearms be licensed.

A shooter's licence will be necessary only where a rifle or shotgun is carried about or used away from the private property of its owner. It will not be necessary for farmers to obtain a licence unless they wish to use firearms away from their property.

No licence will be required where an employee or guest of an occupier carries or uses a firearm on that person's property.

As is the case with licences for pistols, shooter's licences will be issued by police.

The fee for a shooter's licence will not be fixed until the regulations are introduced at a later stage. However, the Government's intention is that the cost of a licence will be kept to an absolute minimum to cover only the cost of administration and so ensure that no undue hardship will be imposed upon persons shooting for sport and recreation. For this reason there will be no provision in the legislation for the allocation of funds to wildlife conservation.

It is emphasised that the legislation is aimed at indiscriminate and irresponsible shooters and it is felt that the payment of a small fee will not be an undue burden upon the legitimate sporting shooter.

It is proposed that the application for a licence will be in the form of a questionnaire and statutory declaration and will be lodged at the local police station. No delay in the issue of a licence should be encountered.

The age restriction on persons using firearms, at present 16 years, will be raised to 18 years, but provision will be made in the legislation to enable persons under 18 years to be trained in the use of firearms under responsible supervision.

Provision will also be made for the issue of orders against known criminals prohibiting them from possessing firearms.

It is pointed out that the legislation will, in addition, lift the present restriction on Sunday shooting.

Offences under the proposed Bill will include the shortening of firearms, carrying loaded firearms in a street or public place, and trespassing on private property with a firearm.

The Commissioner of Police will be authorised to approve ranges used for the purpose of target shooting by organised gun or rifle clubs other than those formed under the Defence Act which are already controlled by the Army authorities.

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY

Published under authority of the Secretary's Department, Department of the Interior:---

(3) "Gun" includes any lethal firearm . . . from which any shot, bullet or other missile can be discharged."

"Gun Licence" means a gun licence granted under this Ordinance and in force.

(5) (1) Any person, not being the licensee under a gun licence or a pistol licence, who has in his possession any gun or pistol, as the case may be, shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Twenty dollars or imprisonment for three months.

(2) Any person, not being the licensee under a gun licence or a pistol licence who uses or carries any gun or pistol, as the case may be, between the hours of seven ante-meridian and seven postmeridian shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Forty dollars or imprisonment for six months, or both.

(3) Any person, not being the licensee under a gun licence or a pistol licence, who uses or carries any gun or pistol, as the case may be, between the hours of seven post-meridian and seven ante-meridian shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: One hundred dollars or imprisonment for six months, or both.

(4) In any prosecution for an offence under this section, the onus of proof that the defendant is a licensee under a gun licence or pistol licence or that this section does not apply to the defendant shall lie upon the defendant.

(5) This section shall not apply to:-

(a) Naval, Military or Air Force personnel or Commonwealth or State Police.

(b) Any licensed gun dealer or his servant.

(c) Any common carrier or warehouseman.

(d) Any person who uses a gun for the purpose of shooting at a shooting gallery which is under the supervision of a licensee.

(6) (1) . . . the Registrar may, as he thinks fit . . .
(1) (a) Grant a licence to any person who satisfies him that he is not less than sixteen years of age.

(3 to 8) Gun licence may be granted in respect of a particular gun or particular class of gun specified in the licence.

Public Offences Ordinance 1930-1970

40A. (1) Subject to this section, any person who carries firearms on a Sunday in any public place or place of public resort shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Ten dollars.

(2) Nothing in this section shall extend to travellers bona fide carrying firearms for the protection of the lives and property of themselves or their employers on the public roads, or to constables and other persons carrying firearms for lawful purposes.

(3) A prosecution for an offence against this section shall not be commenced after the expiration of ten days from the commission of the offence.

VICTORIA

Under authority of the Acting Under Secretary dated 10/10/72 concerning the:—

"Firearms (Amendment) Act 1972 which is to come into operation on January 1, 1973. The legislation requires all persons who wish to

The legislation requires all persons who wish to purchase, use, possess, or carry a firearm other than a pistol to hold a shooter's licence. When the person is under the age of eighteen years he must obtain a Junior Permit which will authorise him to carry a firearm for the purpose of receiving instruction in its use

whilst in the company and under the control of an adult who is the holder of a shooter's licence."

TASMANIA

Under authority of the Chief Secretary dated 17/10/72.

"Cabinet is to consider at its next meeting the report of an inter-departmental committee which recommends substantial and important changes to the existing law on firearms and related matters.

In the circumstances it would be idle to advise on the present state of the law. It is not to be expected that any existing legislation will be passed before November next."

SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Under authority of the Superintendent of Police Headquarters dated 31/10/72.

"Under the South Australian Firearms Act the use of shotguns for shooting at clay targets is controlled in the same manner as the use of firearms for any other purpose. Generally, persons under 15 years are totally prohibited from taking part and persons between 15 and 18 years and non-British subjects would require a firearms licence to do so. However, the Act provides that in proceedings for an offence against either of these provisions it shall be a defence for the person charged to prove that he used the firearm . . . on the grounds of an incorporated gun or pistol club or registered rifle club.

There is no information to hand in this Department regarding any proposed changes in our Firearms legislation."

WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Under authority of the Minister for Police dated 20/10/72.

"It is advised that all firearms, including shotguns, are required to be licensed in Western Australia. Licences are personal to the holder and, subject to the suitability of applicant, are granted on application to the Officer-in-Charge of the Police Station of the District wherein applicants reside.

A person must have attained the age of 16 years before being eligible to apply for a firearm licence in respect to a shotgun.

It is an offence for any person to have possession of or use a firearm without being the holder of the requisite licence for that firearm. However, it is permissible for a person under the age of 16 years, to use a firearm belonging to and under the supervision of a person licensed under the Act.

A further exemption applies to members of registered Gun Clubs, who may give permission to another person — such as a visitor or other Club member — to use his firearm on a properly constructed clay pigeon range of a registered Gun Club."

Editor's Observations:

- 1. Each individual shooter should obtain a licence for ANY State within which he desires to use his shotgun (or firearm) for either competitive clay target or personal field shooting.
- 2. It is believed that the respective State Governments may be lenient towards the Association applying for a "blanket" approval for registered A.C.T.A., or registered overseas, shooters to attend a national championship programme or the forthcoming world shooting championship, but only in such specific instance.

Open season for protected game shooting within the Commonwealth — 1973

Today in all civilised countries, the taking of fauna is a controlled privilege, not an inherent right. Native fauna is at all times the property of the Crown and is (a) permanently protected, or (b) protected, or (c) pest fauna.

The sale of wild game is forbidden in most States and eggs must not be taken for any purpose.

Complete information is available from the various State Departments as listed. Licences may be obtained from these respective addresses or from the various police stations.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Department of Fisheries and Fauna, 108 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, 6000 (phone 23-4431) from whom a free guide is available.

All visiting interstate or overseas shooters should present current handicap cards, identification papers and firearms at the first police station encountered in Western Australia for licensing.

The only game which may be taken in this State are ducks and quail.

There are two different open seasons for duck shooting:---

1. Throughout the inland and northern areas, there is a continuous season.

2. In the South-West and Eucla Land Divisions, the season may be varied from year to year depending on biological conditions. The season dates and bag limits are announced as soon as a decision is possible each year — and this has not been achieved at the date of going to press. A bag limit of eight ducks per shooter per day probably during the period 6 p.m., 18/12/72 till 8 p.m., 10/1/73. The open season for Stubble Quail only is usually

The open season for Stubble Quail only is usually January 1 to June 30 each year — all other species are protected.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA

Department of Fisheries and Fauna Conservation, G.P.O. Box 901E, Adelaide, 5001.

Note — at the time of going to press, no information had been received from the Department, however the following information, as applicable for previous years is published as a guide.

No person shall-

- (a) shoot at animals or birds on any Sunday;
- (b) have a gun in his possession on any Sunday for the purpose of shooting at animals or birds on that day;
- (c) traps, nets, snares, nooses are prohibited.

Gun licences cost \$2 annually to those over 18 years. A firearms licence for persons under 18 years must be obtained from a Police Station. Gun licences do not authorise persons to shoot without the consent of the owner or occupier.

Dates awaiting confirmation and gazetting were:-

Duck Season — 5 a.m., Saturday, February 24 until 10 p.m., Saturday, June 30.

Bag limit 12 ducks per person per day of the following species only — Wood Duck (Maned Goose, Black, Mountain, Grey Teal, Blue-Winged Shoveller, Pink-Eared, White-Eyed, Chestnut).

Note: Musk, Blue-Billed and Freckled Ducks must not be taken.

Quail Season — beginning April until Saturday, July 28.

Bag limit, 25 per person per day.

Snipe Season — The Australian (Japanese) Snipe Season opened October 1972 and closes early March.

Special Note: No ducks of the species listed above may be sold at any time and all ducks, quail and snipe taken alive during the open season must be released when the season closes.

NORTHERN TERRITORY

Administration — Arid Zone Research Institute, Animal Industry and Agriculture Branch, P.O. Box 291, Alice Springs, 5750.

All shooting laws within Northern Territory are unchanged from previous years.

All firearms must be declared at the nearest police station into Northern Territory, for licensing and/or registering within two days of entry.

Ducks and Geese (except Magpie Geese, Burdekin Ducks and Pigmy Geese) — open season in all of Northern Territory, north of the 18th parallel of south latitude, from July 1, till October 30, annually.

Magpie Geese — open season in all of Northern Territory north of the 18th parallel of south latitude from August 1; to December 30, each year.

Buffalo and marine crocodile or red kangaroo are now protected over the entire Northern Territory and may be shot only under licence.

Other partly protected animal species may be taken after procurement of special licences.

Pests which may be destroyed at any time, other than in sanctuaries, include Feral (wild) rabbits, donkeys, pigs, camels, cats, goats, foxes, dingoes, wedgetailed eagles and snakes of all species.

TASMANIA

National Parks and Wild Life Service, 161 Davey Street, Sandy Bay or P.O. Box 165, Sandy Bay, Tasmania, 7005.

As game seasons are reviewed annually and no further decision is likely until the new 1973 year, the following 1972 decisions are listed hereunder, however:---

The Japanese Snipe open season has been set from October 7, 1972 till January 31, 1973, with 15 bag limit daily, and licence is \$2.

No open season is expected during the 1972 year for Cape Barren Geese, Brush Possum or Black Swan.

Male Deer with branching antlers — February 26 — March 26; Licence \$5; bag limit, one per day; seasonal limit, five.

Wild Duck - 4/3/73 to 31/5/73, Licence \$2; bag limit, 10 per day.

Mutton Bird — South — 10 a.m. March 25 to April 30. North — 27/3/73 to 30/4/73. Licence fee and bag limit — Commercial Licence (North only) \$20, no bag limit. Commercial Catcher's Licence (North only) \$10, no bag limit. Non-Commercial (Season Licence, North only) \$5, no bag limit. Day Licence (whole of State) \$2, 25 birds South; 50 birds North.

Note: North and South are designated by a line running from Sandy Cape on the West Coast to Eddystone Point on the East Coast. Birding on Petrel Islands, Bass Strait restricted to Day Licence only.

Wallaby — April 1 to November 30. Non-Commercial Hunter's Licence \$2 (both Crown and Private Land) — entitles holder to sell not more than 50 skins taken by him during an open season.

Commercial Hunter's Licence \$5, which authorises the taking and selling of the products of Wallaby (meat and skins) during an open season.

Notes: 1. Forester Kangaroos wholly protected, Bennetts and Rufus only may be taken.

2. An open season for Wallaby operates continuously in the Furneaux Group of Islands.

Water Rat — April 1 to September 30, Licence to take and sell skins, \$2. No bag limit.

Brown Quail — May 6 to May 31. Licence \$2; bag limit, 24 per day.

Male Pheasant (King Island only) June 3 to June 11. Licence \$3; bag limit, three per day; seasonal limit 15.

Yellow Wattle Bird season — July 15 to July 31. Licence \$2; bag limit, 15 on opening day; 10 per day for remainder of season.

Brush Possum — July 1 to August 30. Licence to take and sell \$5, no bag limit.

The following dates are tentative as seasonal conditions in New South Wales are exceptionally dry and if this situation continues, hunting restrictions may be imposed.

Duck Season — 6 a.m., February 17 to April 28, 1973. Bag limit, 20 ducks opening day; 10 ducks every other day.

Black Duck, Wood Duck, Grey Teal, Chestnut Teal, Mountain Duck, Pink Ear, Hardhead Shoveller.

Quail Season — May 5 to July 28. Bag limits (subject to change) will be 20 ducks opening day and 10 every other day, 25 quail per day. Species will be Black Duck, Grey Teal, Wood Duck, Hardhead, Shoveller, Pink Ear, Mountain Duck, Chestnut Teal, Brown Quail and Stubble Quail.

Combined duck/quail licence \$4, after 1/1/73 from the above (National Parks, etc.) or any Clerks of Petty Sessions throughout New South Wales.

QUEENSLAND

Department of Primary Industries, William Street, Brisbane, 4000.

Open season fauna permit (personal) \$2. Open season fauna permit (for selling) \$5.

The only game in Queensland are wild duck and the decision for an open season is made annually and usually is from first Saturday in June in South Queensland and from first Saturday in July in Central and North Queensland, both for 3 months.

Shooters must obtain prior permission from the owner or occupier of the land concerned.

Wild Ducks — bag limit, 15 per day per person.

All island forming part of the State of Queensland and certain other areas have been declared sanctuaries.

An open season may be declared from time to time for Black Duck (or Grey or Brown), Grey Teal (Wood, Slender), Hardhead (White-Eyed, White-Winged, Barwing, Brownhead), Maned Goose (Wood Duck), Plumed Tree Duck, Whistling Tree Duck.

An open season is never declared for Green Pigmy Goose, White-Quilled Pigmy Goose (Teal); White-Headed Shelduck (Burdekin or Mangrove), Pied Goose Magpie, Black/White, Blue-Winged Shoveller (Spoon bill, Stinker), Chestnut Teal (Chestnut Breasted, Green Headed, Black or Mountain Teal), Musk Duck (Mould Goose), Pink-Eared Duck (Zebra, Pink-Eyed, Widgeon), Black Swan.

Various open season dates exist (available on application) for Finches, some Parrots and Brush or Scrub Turkeys.

Dear Master Colin,

How nice it is to receive such a nicely handwritten and most clearly worded letter from a nine-year-old.

We would all be pleased to know that you are able and willing to compete against other shooters at your home club at Hawkesbury and will look forward to hearing more of your activities.

What calibre shotgun do you use and do you have a picture of yourself with your gun—I would like to see such a picture because whilst I am so far from you in distance, I still know what is going on in most places.

Briefly I will tell you of this Association and the laws as they affect us.

The Australian Clay Target Association is a company registered in Victoria. The members of the company are the member clubs of Hawkesbury, Perth, Townsville and many others—there are about 250 of them. Shooters belong to these clubs (just like you) and pay through their clubs an annual registration fee for their registration cards. These cards are for the shooter to keep his own record of his shooting results, then the club Secretary looks at the card after the shooter has shot at 500 targets and also at the end of November, when shooters are registering for the New Year.

As of the 1st of January, 1973, the laws of your State of New South Wales are allowing boys, or girls, under 18 years to shoot only if they are under instruction.

Because of this, the Executive Committee of the ACTA (being a group of men chosen by all the shooters in Australia to decide on all our shooting rules and procedures) has also decided that:

1. As from January 1, 1973, boys or girls may register through their club secretaries for \$1.00 for each calendar year, that they will then receive a handicap card but that they would not receive a copy of our monthly publication of ACTA Shooting News (because of the costs of printing and mailing).

- 2. As from January 1, 1973, boys or girls who seek to register and who also seek to have the ACTA Shooting News mailed to themselves, may register through their club secretaries for \$5.00 each calendar year.
- 3. As from January 1, 1973, all registered ACTA shooters will be insured by the Association whilst competing at registered shoots.
- 4. When arranging ACTA registration fees with club secretaries, all shooters must belong to an affiliated member club.

Colin, I am sure that you will be a very good club member and part of this Association, and I will be looking forward to hearing reports of you from time to time.

Meanwhile, the receipt by us of your immediate registration fee would be applied to include the 1973 year.

It is with much pleasure that I am able to report on the School Pupils Clay Target Championships and Interstate Teams' Match. As you probably know by now, it was necessary to transfer these events from Wagga to Wangaratta because of the NSW Firearms Law.

When I first proposed these events with the sponsorship of Winchester Aust. Pty. Ltd., Mr Keith Olive, State Manager for Victoria and Southern NSW and myself thought that probably a maximum of 100 shooters would compete but as the entries continued to come in it could be seen that the response was terrific.

Well on September 16, the pupils travelled to Wangaratta. Girls and boys came from as far as Mansfield to Yarrawonga and Barellan, Junee and Wagga to name just a few. When the count was taken we had some 190 shooters — yes, that is right 190.

Now, with only two traps, the shooting commenced at 9.30 and by 4 o'clock it was all over which shows the very efficient way the Wangaratta Gun Club conducted the programme. One of the most prominent aspects of this shoot was the way that all shooters conducted themselves.

Their gun safety left nothing to be desired. A tribute was paid to them by the Shoot Marshal, Mr Mooney in that he stated he has never refereed for better squads in both safety and conduct and this must be contributed to the Clubs and numerous personnel that have taught these future shooters the responsibility and respect that firearms deserve.

FARMERS ARE SHOOTING; ALL'S WELL ON THE LAND By Tony Maiden

Despite the drought and last week's decline in wool prices, the generally improved rural outlook has persuaded many farmers they can afford to resume one of their more expensive pastimes, sport shooting. Australian ammunition manufacturers report that sales are currently showing their first dramatic leap in years.

Mr R. Seear, managing-director of IMI Australia Ltd., said last week: "Compared with the previous two years, our sales into rural areas have shown a most marked uplift in the last quarter. Mind you, the

ammunition business is not suddenly making enormous profits. But things are more encouraging.

Mr Seear said the increase in sales did not appear to relate to any particular increase in "business" shooting, i.e., the eradication of rabbits and other vermin. Rather, it was possible to determine from shot sizes being ordered that the demand was chiefly for recreational purposes and more particularly, for trap shooting

He said it was difficult to determine the precise reasons for this. The upturn in sales began before wool prices rose so dramatically, and occurred despite absence of relief from drought in many areas.

"I think, though, it must be a reflection of a general improvement in the confidence of the rural community," he said.

IMI's experience is reflected in the turnover of rival ammunition maker, Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd. The managing-director, Mr D. McCall, commented: "There is no doubt that we are doing much better now. Sales started to edge up in March, and by May they had passed the level of May last year. They have continued to improve ever since."

Mr McCall attributed the trend to a return of optimism in country areas after a prolonged bout of almost unrelieved gloom. He believed the Federal Budget - and the widespread and confident predictions which preceded it - was another major factor.

There is no doubt that trap shooting — or clay pigeon shooting — accounts for a large proportion of the sporting ammunition expended each year in Australia. It is, however, an expensive sport and it has certainly waned in recent years.

The manufacturers' decision to promote reloading kits, so that shooters can use one shotgun shell many times, has to some extent helped to insulate shooters against price rises in packaged ammunition. But in the darkest days of the rural crunch, even self-loaders became rarer at country gun clubs. For example, a member of the Berridale Gun Club

in the Southern Tablelands of NSW says numbers at the club's monthly shoot have declined from between 25 and 30 three years ago to an average of fewer than 15 now.

"It isn't that the sport is any less popular," he said. "But many people simple can't afford to shoot at the moment.'

Berridale has yet to notice the revival which the ammunition manufacturers believe is now taking place. But elsewhere there are definite signs that trap shooting is on the up and up.

The Wyarama Gun Club, out west on the Darling River, for example, recently lifted the frequency of its meetings from four a year to six a year without noticeably affecting attendances.

The sport is expected to get a further fillip early next year, when the world amateur trap shooting championships are held at the Melbourne Gun Club.
