DELEGATE APPOINTMENT

Affiliated units of the A.C.T.A. are reminded that they are entitled to one delegate (Article 15) to represent their interests at the Annual Meeting. However, delegates can only be accepted providing the Association "Articles of Association" are complied with. This involves the completion of the necessary forms, namely "Acceptance of Membership" (Article 5 (a)), "Nomination of Representative" (Article 21) (in the case of a corporate club), or "Nomination of Delegate" (Articles 5 (c) and 16) (in the case of an unincorporated club), tollowed tinally by "Notice of Acceptance of Delegates." Official printed forms as applicable are obtainable from the A.C.T.A. office. It should be noted that nomination of a representative or member delegate can only be accepted providing all subscriptions and monies due by either the nominee or the club, to the Association, have been paid as provided for in Article 49.

It is also pointed out that where a representative or delegate has been appointed previously, and this has not been officially rescinded, the appointment as previously made will stand, until the Association is advised or instructed otherwise. In accordance with the Articles of Association, clubs cannot appoint a delegate other than on the prescribed form (letters are unacceptable).

Each financial affiliated member club should have a Delegate Entree Card (for unincorporated clubs) or a Representative Card (for incorporated clubs) at the time of the delegate appointment and this entree card . remains valid until the named delegate is changed. These cards should be presented to the scrutineer, on his request, by the respective financial shooter delegates concerned to obtain permission to attend and be eligible to vote at future annual general meetings.

The Delegate Registers will be at marked tables inside the door of the annual meeting room at the Croydon Hotel, Maroondah Highway, Croydon, between 7.30 p.m. and 8 p.m. The registers will be at tables marked according to states. The registers will separately list the member clubs and the registered club delegate. Where a club is not financially affiliated and/or where a delegate is not financially registered, then no vote for that club can be recorded, nor can any such voice be made during the meeting.

GENERAL

It is suggested, and recommended that all shooters complete and sign the "Schedule A" amateur declaration - there are two copies in this publication, one for personal record to be retained by each shooter, the other is perforated for easy removal. It is preferable that this copy, which is required for A.C.T.A. records, is forwarded by your club secretary, with your registration fee.

Within the amateur rules of Olympic Games, British Commonwealth Games and the International Shooting Union, each shooter must have signed and lodged a satisfactory "Schedule A" form with his national body, for appropriate recording.

These rules were accepted by unanimous agreement at the A.C.T.A. Annual General Meetings at Brisbane in June, 1971 and Adelaide in March, 1973, and are contained in the published A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules brochure.

A.C.T.A. maintains these records and also stamps "Schedule A" on the respective handicap cards as, they are issued. Once a "Schedule A" amateur rules declaration form is lodged, then no further declaration is necessary at this stage, as the records are repetitive.

However, should there ever be a challenge on any shooter's amateurism, the onus of charge and proof are between the charger and the shooter concerned.

The New Zealand National Championships will be conducted at Yaldhurst near Christchurch from March 30 to April 6, both days inclusive, meantime the N.Z.G.C.A. has conducted a competition for an air trip to the Australian 1974 National Championships. This was won by Trevor Everret of Christchurch.



The Xth British Commonwealth Games were scheduled for Thursday, January 24, through to February 2, with those first and last days being for the opening and closing ceremonies. Some seats for viewing some of the events were still available.

The organisers of the British Commonwealth Games have received 122 shooter entries from 12 member countries, but the information does not indicate the numbers for each style of shooting:—

Full bore rifle - TR7 - .62 mm Rifle - Match.

1st stage - 2 p.m., January 28.

2nd stage - 1.30 p.m., January 29.

Final stage – 2 p.m., January 30.

Smallbore rifle prone - match - 9 a.m. Jan. 26.

Clay Pigeon — Match — 9 a.m., January 31.

Clay Pigeon - Match - 9 a.m., February 1.

Skeet - Match - 9 a.m., January 25.

Skeet - Match - 9 a.m., January 26.

Free Pistol – Match – 9 a.m., January 29.

Rapid Fire Pistol - Match - 9 a.m., January 29.

This information is acknowledged, with appreciation, to the New Zealand bottlers of Coca Cola who, after a request had been made, have continually kept A.C.T.A. Secretary informed by progressive news reports.

The Australian shotgun entries to these British Commonwealth Games were limited through the Australian Shooting Association and the Australian Olympic Federation, to two trapshooters and two skeet shooters, and, after preliminary competition events throughout Australia under the shooting rules of the Australian Olympic Federation, International Shooting Union and British Commonwealth Games, finalists came to Melbourne in September 1973 for final selection by competition. Selected were: — TRAP

1. Douglas Smith of Brisbane G.C. (Qld.).

2. Warren Charlton of Wagga Wagga (NSW).

SKEET

1. Mark Little (age 17 years) of Metropolitan G.C. (Vic.).

2. Robin Bailey of Perth (WA).

These four shooter selectees had also represented Australia, with others, in the November 1973 World Shooting Championships of the International Shooting Union at Melbourne G.C. and Douglas Smith, with his Trench shooting fellow team members won the 1973 Bronze Medallions against the world's best trench-style shotgun shooters. Shooters Douglas Smith, Warren Charlton, Mark Little and Robin Bailey travel to New Zealand for the Xth B.C. Games under the direction of the Australian Olympic Council with costs met by funds received from Federal and State Government grants, some donations from business and private sources, plus a final levy per competing member nation broken down to a nett amount per competitor per State, per national sporting body. At the time of going to press, these details were not available.

Australia's four shotgun entries will be clad in the full Australian uniform for international competitions as was issued to them for the 1973 I.S.U. World Championships. This uniform comprises hat, green reefer jacket with gold buttons and the Australian Coat of Arms embroidered on the pocket of the left breast, gold (colored) shirt, green tie (also embroidered), tan shoes. The colors of green and gold are Australia's international colors for clothing – green for the country and gold as symbolically from Australia's wattle. An "Australian Teams Fund" account had been established within A.C.T.A. records '' for donations received for such uniforms/badges/master awards, etc.," and the \$221.50, so received from various shooters and a gun

club, has been applied accordingly - by direction of, and with the appreciation of, the Executive Committee.

At the Xth British Commonwealth Games, one of the Australian delegates to the B.C.G. Council is Mr David Hillan of Marino, South Australia, who is Australian Shooting Association delegate to the B.C.G. Council - Mr Hillan is also Secretary of the Small Bore Rifle Association. Mr Hillan is a dedicated shooter and capable organiser with the full confidence of all shooters. The shooting team manager is Mr Tibor Gonczol of Melbourne, Victoria, who has shot as a pistol shooter for Australia in international shooting. Assistant Shooting Team Manager and Coach will be Doctor Robert Godfrey of Kerang, Victoria, who, whilst currently being a pistol shooter, claims to have some previous experience at clay target shooting, however A.C.T.A. records do not contain this name.

The clay target shooting section of the Xth British Commonwealth Games will use standard black clay targets, as used under international conditions (and as used by the A.C.T.A.). The trap and skeet teams and individual events will be contested under the rules of the International Shooting Union as published in A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" and in A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules publications dated 1973.

The skeet at the Xth B.C. Games will be conducted under the I.S.U. Skeet Shooting Rules as published. The trap shooting at the Xth B.C. Games will be conducted under I.S.U. Regulations for Automatic Trap. (Most member nations of the International Shooting Union conduct elimination events — to select their respective shooter individual or feam contestants — over Automatic Traps, as not all countries have trench shooting layouts. Under I.S.U. regulations such eliminations are permitted to national level. Within the British Commonwealth Games, only automatic traps are used.

The A.C.T.A. is grateful for, and appreciative of, its re-entry into full international shooting and is a loyal part of the internationally known parent body of shooting in Australia – the Australian Shooting Association – known as the A.S.A. The A.S.A. is the co-ordinating body, as such, of rifle, pistol and shotgun shooting, through its various member national associations. The A.S.A. immediate office bearers are – President, Mr Gary Armstrong; Vice-President, Mr Ken Swann; Secretary, Mr Peter Garrett; Assistant Secretary, Mr Don Brook – all are, or have been, active shooters of one form or other.

The Amateur Rules Schedule "A" form must be completed and lodged with A.C.T.A. by all contestants for Commonwealth Games, Olympic Games or international shooting selection.

REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BEFORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF JANUARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any such persons joining Club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

FEES

Club secretaries are reminded that club 1974 affiliation fee of \$10 was due and payable on January 1, 1974.

All Club shooter members are reminded that their 1974 Association fees were due and payable through their club secretaries on January 1, 1974.

These shooter registration fees are \$10 for the 1974 calendar year, whilst juniors are registered for \$1 for the year. Juniors receive a handicap card but do not receive any publications of ACTA Shooting News. Registered juniors seeking the publication must register for the full \$10. Irrespective of the class of registration fee, juniors are included in the ACTA Public Liability Insurance Policy as recently published - coverage is to \$200,000 - whilst the premium is borne by the A.C.T.A.

However, where registered A.C.T.A. persons have a common address, and are related, then on request only one copy of "Shooting News" is to be sent to that address and a reduction of \$2 is permitted for the additional registered shooter at the time of registration.

As from 1974, no plastic sleeves will be available for A.C.T.A. handicap cards.

Only subscribers to A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" may send \$8 (see information inside front cover) direct to the Secretary for "Shooting News" publications.

No pro rata rates are accepted and all fees are for the calendar year concerned.

April 1974 "Shooting News" will be mailed by Committee direction only to those financial – that is, those whose fees are actually received by the Secretary as of February 14, 1974.

As from Sept. 1973, all shooters not having paid the full \$10 annual registration fee ceased being mailed further copies of the 1973 publications of A.C.T.A. "Shooting News." (See May, 1973, page 5).

In accordance with our Articles and by direction of the Committee.

In view of production costs and space content, apropos the recent scheduled increases in Australian postal rates, all further publications of the A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" will not contain lists of shooter registrations or handicap amendments but a full list of registrations will be published in the July publication each year.

Shooters who have not marked their cards with their progressive common mark scores throughout 1973 are to be classed by club secretaries as "A" Class shooters in the 1974 registration lists to be forwarded by club secretaries for A.C.T.A. processing.

The 1975 Australian National Clay Target Championships will be conducted at the Tasmanian Gun Club at Launceston, Tasmania, during March, 1975. The actual dates will be decided and made public during the 1974 National Championships at Melbourne, Victoria.

1. The 1974 Australian National Clay Target Championships both trap and skeet will be conducted at the Melbourne Gun Club, near Lilydale, Victoria within the period Wednesday, March 6 to Wednesday, March 13, with one national event daily excepting Sunday which will be a free day. The daily sequence of events will be Skeet, Double Rise, Grand Handicap, Double Barrel, Free Day, Single Barrel; ANZ Points Decision; thence on the last day will be the International Trap Teams' Match and the-Champion of Champions event. The grounds will have 7 × DTL trap layouts of which one will be retained as a spare and for practice shooting. Four of these layouts are superimposed with skeet layouts. \$300 value compulsory division handicap events will be conducted if time is available during the programme.

2.2 National Marshals and Referees are required to meet at the Melbourne Gun Club at 4.30 p.m. T u e s d a y M a r c h 5 f o r r u l e s interpretations/instructions with Executive Committeemen Messrs. Biggs, Holtfreter, Hawkins. Rowe, Mules and Smith present. Trap referees will be rostered as line referees for the skeet event. (Shoot Marshals throughout the programme will be as for 1973.)

2.3 A "Get-together Buffet Dinner" will be held on Tuesday night, March 5 from 7.30 p.m. to 10.00 p.m. at the Croydon Hotel, Maroondah Highway, Croydon. Admission only by entree ticket available from A.C.T.A. office at the Melbourne Gun Club before 5 p.m. — price 3.50 per head. Beverages to be paid for by those concerned C.O.D.

2.4 An open referee discussion meeting may be held at 5 p.m. on Thursday, March 7 at the Melbourne Gun Club after the National Double Rise Championship — to be chaired by Executive Committeeman Mr Noel Massey, with Messrs Hawkins, Burgess, Bobson, Holtfreter present. Entrance charge: NIL.

2.5 The 38th Association Annual General Meeting will be held at the Croydon Hotel, Maroondah Highway, Croydon on Friday night, March 8, from 8 p.m. or as advised.



2.6 A "Trophy Presentation Night" will be held at the Croydon Hotel, Maroondah H'way, Croydon, Wednesday March 13 from 8 p.m. Trophies to be presented will be the High Gun Trophies and Cup plus the Champion of Champions Cup. These presentations will be followed by a "Buffet Supper" at 9 p.m. for which admission will only be by entrance ticket purchased from A.C.T.A. office at the Melbourne Gun Club price \$2.50 per head. Beverages to be paid for by those concerned C.O.D.

Within the 1974 National Championships advertisement elsewhere in this publication, some amendments have been included, whilst in addition the following features are to be observed:

3. Trophies will be presented daily at the conclusion of each event thence on the last day that all high gun trophies plus the Champion of Champions Cup be presented at the trophy presentation meeting prior to supper.

4. A.C.T.A. shoot office will be open 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. at the host club grounds on Tuesday, March 4, being the day prior to the nationals programme commencement, to accept signed shooter nominations for the first day's event and also for successive daily events. All nominations will be shuffled before being squadded for each event. Nomination forms will be provided for shooter completion and lodging.

5. A.C.T.A. will permit daily trap practice shooting - subject to trap availability - limited to 20 targets per shooter at the time of the ticket sale. Practice targets being 10 cents each.

6. Shooters missing a squad will be placed only in the final squad(s) and subsequently, having missed that squad, the shooter missing the first re-allocation forfeits his nomination.

7. Event shoot-offs to be conducted, over traps to be specified, in the order of -

7.1 best overall of the event who is also best in his class;

7.2 best in each of classes A. B. C., to achieve 1st. 2nd, 3rd placings in each class but no shoot-offs for 4th or 5th placings.

8. Cartridges of 1¹/₈ ounces (32 grams) loading to be branded by manufacturers "A.C.T.A. National Championships/Melbourne/1974" and in any national championship only such especially branded cartridges of that current year and venue are permitted.

9. Referee, scorer and each contestant of each squad sign as to the recording of the respective scores as they are completed and before anyone leaves the layout.

10. A daily Jury of three Executive Committeemen will be appointed the day previous and listed on the notice board accordingly.

11. Empty shotshells on the ground are the property of the A.C.T.A. and may be consequently purchased from the marshals by means of tickets purchased from A.C.T.A. office at \$2.00 per cartridge

carton or \$4 per small clay target carton.

12. Daytime use caravans are permitted on the grounds only on application to A.C.T.A. Caravan parks exist at Lilydale, Croydon and Healesville.

13. A light aircraft field is adjacent to the east of the Melbourne Gun Club - distant one mile direct or three miles by road.

14. New Zealand shooter entrants be accepted for class shooting as: 11-12 yarders and beginners within 12 months: shoot C Class; 13-15 yarders: shoot B Class; 16 yarders and back: shoot A Class.

15. Skeet — that every shooter when approaching for the first time, be allowed to look at, or to shoot at, both a high and a low target from station one without endangering any "break" score. He must then commence his part of the competition and may subsequently similarly sight a high and a low target from number one station of the second layout.

16. 1974 National Championship High Gun Trophies will be as defined within the programme provisions of the special shoot advertisement herein.

1973 WORLD MOVING TARGET CHAMPIONSHIPS

(Shotgun shooting sections of Trench and Skeet shooting)

The International Shooting Union allocated these 1973 World Championships to Australia, through its affiliate the Australian Shooting Association.

The Australian Shooting Association through its member body, the Australian Clay Target Association arranged the shooting dates to be November 12 to 22 inclusive with the venue to be the A.C.T.A.'s member club the Melbourne Gun Club.

The first contestants to arrive were the Italians, followed by the Australians, for practice shooting both trench and skeet.

It was obvious that the Italians were highly skilled in this type of competition and this gave us an opportunity to see world-class performances.

During the next few days, all competing teams, from the member nations nominated, arrived, and a true sporting atmosphere had them intermingling immediately.

Sometimes language problems occurred but, shooters the world over have a common means of communication.

In the early days of practice the Russians made it known "we are here to win medals," whilst from Ireland came two shooters — a medical practitioner and a lawyer — who between them epitomised "the leprechauns" and captured us with their humor and outlook.

At no stage was any impression gained from any team that they were regimented - far from it - the teams and their managers entered the practice and the events in a most fascinatingly light-hearted and friendly manner. Their co-operation and help to those of us running the shoot, and relatively new to conducting fully international shooting for the first time, the spirit exceeded all expectations.

This attitude enabled the management to proceed with the refereeing and allied duties with the utmost confidence. It is in fact, to our proud satisfaction, that the shotgun series was completed with the minimum of fuss and it was the first time in the history of the world shooting championships that no formal protest was lodged during the entire programme of trench and skeet. This was expressed with strong emphasis by the International Jury Panel of the International Shooting Union and was quite a "feather for Australia's cap."

The management was congratulated for the condition and suitability of the grounds and layout, the operation of the traps and ancillary equipment, and throughout the shooting days there were no breakdowns or halts of equipment. Special targets were prepared and supplied by IMI Australia Ltd. These targets performed beautifully and broken targets out of the trap were very rare.

Clay targets used in the trench event were full orange (i.e., spray painted over the whole of the domed exterior) whilst those used in the skeet event were conventional black targets.

Most teams brought their own ammunition — the Russians used the old style paper cases which undoubtedly performed well. The South Koreans used Australian-made ammunition, likewise did the New Zealand and the British teams. The European teams relied on their own brands which they had brought with them. There was an array of various colors and types of shotshells at the end of each round.

Shotguns used in almost every instance were the under-and-over type and mostly of single trigger actions. Skeet shooting shotguns were similar to those in standard usage with Australian skeet shooters.

It is quite factual in international competition that if a shooter calls for a target, and shoots at it, he accepts and abides by the result, UNLESS the referee deems that it is an illegal target, in which case the referee signals a no target decision and a same angle replacement target is given immediately.

At the grounds, each team was provided with an individual rest tent. Meals were served by a caterer in a huge steel-framed marquee. These structures and tents were kindly supplied and erected by the army. One of the tents housed Red Cross personnel. Several people made use of this first aid tent for minor abrasions, etc., however, doctors were available at all times.

Shooters and visitors had the use of five especially installed telephones for outward calls. We had had installed a "Telex" teleprinter for the transmission of results as world news.

Shooting scores were recorded for both trench and skeet at three points — the official scorer with his scoresheet was adjacent to the scrambler box; to the rear was a visual miniature scoreboard, operated on a 25 metal disc system, showing white for "Dead" or red for "Lost." Total scores were then marked on the scoreboard. All international shooters gave an understandable call of "Pull" to activate the "phono-pull." There were no verbal exclamations or words on the grounds by the referees as they signalled a "Lost" target by a bleep from a car-type horn, held in the hand.

We were extremely gratified with the performance of our Australian teams, coupled with the fact that the Australian Trench Shooting Team gained third place and so won bronze medallions. These results fully justified Australia's entry into international shotgun shooting competition and the efforts of all involved in ground preparation, fund raising, management and work load generally. These last were borne, in the main, by a small nucleus of Melbourne Gun Club committeemen.

Canada fielded one lady shooter in their trench team. Mexico fielded one lady in their skeet team. Both ladies were of world class shooting ability.

The visiting teams and their managers were invited to a special evening buffet on the night previous to the free day. This is international procedure. The cost of this was met jointly by the Melbourne Gun Club and the A.C.T.A.

At 10.30 a.m. on Tuesday, November 12, 1973, the national flags of some 22 nations, together with a bearer, carrying the name of each country, preceded the respective teams and entrants who marched in national alphabetical order into prepared places on the grounds between the clubhouse and the official dais. All were clad in the recognised and distinctive clothing applicable to their respective countries. The army provided a full band for the occasion.

Mr Gary Armstrong, as President of the Australian Shooting Association, the host body, gave the initial opening address.

The Lord Mayor of Melbourne, Councillor A. Whalley and the President of the Shire of Lillydale, Councillor M. Seymour, welcomed all present.

Doctor Kurt Hasler, President of the International Shooting Union in speaking to those present said, "This is the first time in the history of shooting sports that the world championships are held in Australia and, on behalf of all visitors, I offer all the appreciation and friendship on which all sport is based."

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, Major General Sir Rohan Delacombe spoke most feelingly as the Queen's Representative — "this is the first time that a world shooting contest is in Australia and it give us great encouragement that you (Doctor Hasler and the International Shooting Union) have selected Australia as the host venue of some 20 or so national entries. We now have with us the world's best shooters and we will learn a lot from them and we are appreciative of them having travelled so far to be here. The standards of mental and physical discipline will be a mark for us all and will bring together, feelings over international boundaries which will be with us for many years to come.

I declare the meeting open and may the competition be keen."

During this period, four flags had been flying from separate mastheads adjacent to the dais. From left to right, facing, these were the Australian National Flag, the Governor's personal standard, the flag of the Union Internationale de Tir (the International Shooting Union) and the Italian National Flag.

Shortly after the opening addresses the Governor left the shooting grounds to attend other functions and at the moment of his leaving, his personal standard was lowered and removed.

For the period of the world shooting championships the other three flags were flown from three adjacent mastheads. The Italian National Flag was flown symbolising the venue of the 1972 World Shooting Championships.

The Australian Team Manager Mr Robert Buchan representing the host nation, Australia, moved to a position before the dais to read, and declare, the oath of amateurism on behalf of all competitors and in the name of all judges and officials, in the true spirit of sportsmanship. This declaration was made under a special Australian National Flag which was carried by Australia's youngest shooting team member within this series, skeet shooter Mark Little.

Mr Lee Meerman, President of the Sporting Shooters' Association also gave the oath on behalf of the Running Boar shooters.

The final awards were presented at the victory ceremony and this was most symbolical and colorful in that the teams mounted or stood next to their places, on the presentation dais whilst their national flags were hoisted to the masthead and also whilst their respective national anthems were played. The flags were on separate flagpoles facing the gathering in the same order of 2, 1, 3 as those on the dais.

The closing ceremony was conducted at the grounds and clubhouse of the Sporting Shooters' Association, some 15 miles (24 kilometres) south-east of Melbourne).

Doctor Hasler spoke to all assembled of "the excellent grounds and (gave) credit to the organising committee and the referees in that the jury had no protests to consider. You have two excellent ranges for running boar and clay target shooting and International Shooting Union arrangements are now in five continents and international competitions can now be held more frequently."

A period was then taken up by special mementos and awards - from the Tunku Abdul Rahmin of Malaysia to Mr Robert Buchan; from Russia to the Australian Shooting Association, to the Sporting Shooters' Association and to Mr Buchan; from Doctor Haltsrom and the Swedish Shooting Association on behalf of the King of Sweden - medallions to Mr Peter Garrett of the A.S.A., to Mr Lee Maugher of the Sporting Shooters' Association and to Mr Gary Armstrong. President of the A.S.A.: from Doctor Rieckmann of Hamburg on behalf of the German Shooting Association to Mr G. Armstrong of the A.S.A., and to Messrs R. Fox and R. Buchan of the Melbourne Gun Club; from the Italians, a banner to Mr G. Armstrong and a framed metal plaque to Mr R. Buchan; from the British Shooting Association, a pennant to Mr Buchan and to A.C.T.A. President, Mr G. Hall an engraved silver salver.

The International Shooting Union then gave a parchment award of merit to Melbourne Gun Club personnel – Messrs Rupert Henwood, Russell Fox, William Henwood, William Loney, Geoff Clarke, and to Mrs Betty Biggs. Mrs Biggs is the first lady in any world series to receive such an I.S.U. award.

Half a century with gun and

rod in Victoria

Part two

I shall always remember the evenings we spent round a big fire in the parlour listening to our genial host, who stuttered slightly while he told us of many sporting experiences in this district.

In the mornings his ginger topped son with his unforgettable grin and cheery freckled face, looked after our needs in the way of bait &c before we used to set out for the day. Here I learned that bream fishing was an art, not acquired in a day, and that though plentiful enough, bream are shy fish and have to be angled for and worked for with hands, blistered with unaccustomed rowing; the distances between one good spot and another being often considerable. An incident on one of these excursions earned for me a reputation as a rifle shot to which I was not entitled. We were out on the inlet in a boat and observed a large white bird in the midst of a mob of swans some hundred of yards ahead of us.

I took my Winchtester, set the sight for three hundred yards and fired at the bird. The bullet fell short and the birds started to swim away but did not fly. I handed the rifle to Soilleux. He readjusted the sights and fired and although over fifty years have passed I can still remember the way that bird stretched out its wings upon the water stone dead. A magnificent shot. It turned out to be a domestic goose which had gone wild and taken up with the swans. At little later it made excellent eating. For years afterwards visitors to Curdie's were regaled with the account of how Stanley Argyle made this wonderful shot and told me all about it.

A wallaby drive along the heath like coast country, snaring crays amongst the rocks, and boating in the inlet and up the river made this holiday pass all too quickly although today it still remains a very pleasant memory.

THE SNOWY, THE BROADRIBB AND THE BEMM RIVERS IN 1888

"What do you think of an exploration trip to Eastern Gippsland in the long vacation?" said Bertie Molesworth, a son of Judge Hickman Molesworth, to me toward the end of term in 1887.

Bertie was a Law student at Trinity, an all-round sport and a good fellow in every way. A day or two later three eager young would-be explorers were to be seen poreing over maps, railway time tables &c in an effort to elucidate the difficulties of transport to our starting point on what to us then seemed a great adventure. The third member of the party was Ernest Nicholson, fair-headed, strong as a horse and as full of

mischief as an egg is full of meat. We added a fourth to our number by arousing the enthusiasm of an old Kynetonian school mate Ernest Buscombe who readily agreed to join forces with us.

The great idea was to obtain a light boat and endeavor to penetrate into the wilds of Croajingolong by means of one of the rivers which run into the Southern Ocean in that little known part of Victoria. The Snowy River seemed attractive but was too settled in its lower reaches and too shallow higher ur with too many rapids for passage by boat for any distance inland.

Our choice finally fell upon the Broadribb, a tributary of the Snowy with Marlo at its mouth as our jumping off point.

Our objective once decided upon we concentrated upon the details of our impedimenta with enthusiasm. A light ten and fly stores of all kinds, utensils for cooking and the many tools for camp life, ammunition, fishing tackle and weapons with only absolute necessities in the way of clothes made up a truly formidable list when set out on paper. Looking back upon it now I realise what a lot of fun we all got out of these preliminaries. Just before Xmas we were ready for the road. The first lap of the journey took us by rail to Sale where we stopped over night. Next morning we boarded the little paddle steamer which used to ply on the Gippsland Lakes and steamed down the Thompson and Latrobe Rivers to Lake Wellington, through the Narrows to Lake Victoria and Lake King to Cunningham at the Lakes Entrance. We put up for the night at Roadknights Hotel which was situated about three-quarters of a mile east of the present town and next morning boarded the mail coach and four for Orbost. The road through the Forest was little more than a bush track, winding in and out through the trees.

There was so little room that the swingle bars of the leaders had torn the bark from the trees in many places while the abrupt descent into the many narrow gullies made the track often resemble a switch back railway. In those days there was no Princes Highway through Nowa Nowa at the north end of Lake Tyers. The coach road lay across the bar of the lake a three mile track of loose sand, a considerable part of which had to be negotiated by the coach passengers on foot. The going was heavy all through the forest and horses had to be changed twice before Orbost was reached.

The first view of the Snowy River flats, as we emerged from the forest onto the high ground above Orbost will always be a pleasant memory. After passing through miles of dense timber where the view was limited to the winding track; to come suddenly upon a vista of green pastures and tall maize crops, several miles in width was indeed a wonderful contrast. At Orbost we hired a vehicle and a pair of horses to take us down the ten miles of river to the mouth at Marlo. Here another surprise awaited us for we had not realised the size of the Estuary of the Snowy.

The Marlo Hotel of those days was a very primitive affair with however a warm welcome and good food awaiting us. The proprietor was, if I remember correctly one J. Stirling, whose name is I think still well remembered in those parts. A boat was hired and we set out the following day for what was at least to us a voyage of discovery. A mile or two brought us to the confluence of the Broadribb and Snowy Rivers and after another four or five miles of rather stiff rowing against an ebb tide we pitched our camp amongst some timber with ti tree undergrowth. As the evening wore on we began to realise that our choice of a camping place was not a very happy one. Mosquitoes and sand flies were there in myriads. Shut in as we were, the absence of a breeze of any kind gave the insects full play. To do anything which required the use of both hands, such as cleaning fish or preparing food was to be eaten alive unless another member of the party stood over the worker with a bough or bunch of bracken fern. Sleep in the tent was impossible; so we took to the boat and got out into the middle of the river to escape the attentions of our winged enemies. At dawn we decided to break camp and push on up. the river. A few miles further on we came to a broad expanse of water, Lake Curlip. It looked imposing, being about half a mile across at the widest part but consisted of only a few inches of water upon a foundation of muddy ooze many feet in depth. The channel through the mud was tortuous and impossible to follow. For hours we tried to find our way to the opposite side where the river ran in but without success. To get out and push was dangerous as the mud was soft and apparently very deep. At last we got our little craft into the deep water of the river again and reluctantly decided to return to Marlo and consider our future movements.

On the return journey in the evening our friends the mosquitoes attacked us again. The breeze had died away and the centre of the stream afforded no relief from their attention. Molesworth who had stripped to his singlet while rowing was so badly bitten on his back and shoulders that he developed a feverish attack and was compelled to put in a couple of days confined to his bed.

While considering our future movements we heard that a carter with a dray and three horses was about to set out for Cape Everard carrying stores to the contractor who was building the lighthouse there. We arranged with him to put our gear upon the top of his load and transport us some thirty miles to the ford at the Bemm River. We were informed that there was a

small pub at the ford where we could hire a boat and then row down that river to Sydenham Inlet, a wild spot where fishing and shooting should be good. The dray was heavily laden and when our baggage and gear had been added there was very little room for passengers. Three of us had to pad the hoof while the fourth rode for a few miles, each in turn. The route lay along the coast, mostly sandy heath country, and not particularly interesting. We covered the distance in the day and nightfall found us at the Bemmford pub kept by one Harry Summers. This loney little pub, remote from any settlement and surrounded by timber was remarkably comfortable and its owner hospitable and kindly. From him we hired a heavy ships boat which had been salvaged from the wreck of a ship named the Ridgepark some years before. We also obtained valuable information as to a good camping place at Sydenham Inlet and the whereabouts of fresh water. In the creek just below the house were numerous Lyrebirds and the tune of "There is no luck about the house" whistled freely by a tame magpie on the veranda of the pub was repeated like an echo from the creek. About a quarter of a mile below the ford the Bemm ran in a series of small falls or rapids into the broader tidal river below. Here we found our boat, quite a big affair with heavy sweep like oars, broad in the beam and a stiff load to row against either wind or tide, as we were to find out later to our cost. We got away bright and early the next morning and after a five or six mile row came to the broad waters of the Inlet. According to instructions we coasted along the northern shore of the Inlet for a mile or so until we came to the mount of the Little River, a small stream which wound its way through overhanging ti-tree and through which we forced our unwieldy craft with difficulty. After about half a mile of this we came to an opening in the trees and pitched our camp, on a ridge covered with bastard mahoghany gum trees, fairly close to the waters edge.

The Little River was alive with bream, ravenously hungry, so that we had no difficulty in catching our evening meal of nice sizeable fish. Our supply of drinking water was very limited, consisting only of a five gallon jar and it soon became necessary to replenish it as of course the Little River was tidal at this point. So next morning we rowed our heavy craft up stream until we emerged into a long narrow lake at the head of which we had been informed we would find fresh water. This lake was about two miles in length and in shape something like the letter z. Unlike Lake Curlip on the Broadrib there was a good depth of water and swans and other aquatic birds abounded. As it had come on to blow rather heavily in the direction we were heading for we rigged up a roughly improvised sail with an oar and a canvas tent fly and were soon skudding along in great style without giving a thought as to how were were to get back against the wind. Having filled our water jar we endeavored to get a start for home but by this time the wind had freshened to gale and all our efforts to get off the lea shore were unavailing.

The edges of the lake were too shallow for us to successfully row, push or pole the boat under cover of the ti-tree. Here was a dilemma. Plenty of drinking water in the boat but no food. Our camp miles away with plenty of food but no fresh water. In the end we tied up the boat, filled a small can with water and set out to walk back to camp around the lakes edge, a much greater distance than the route by water by which we had come. The going amongst the trees at the waters edge was very heavy and the undergrowth and scrub further inland so dense that we could not make progress at any pace at all. To try and make a short cut in wild and unknown country where the bracken was often over one's head might have ended in disaster as we carried no compass. It was long after dark when we made the camp. In fact it was so dark that we actually nearly overshot our mark and missed the camp altogether. Next morning the same journey had to be made again to retrieve the boat but as the wind had dropped we met with no difficulties. The water problem however still remained and we determined to row back to Bemm Ford and obtain a larger container than our five gallon jar. A small cask was supplied by Harry Summers and after trundling it along to the boat below the falls, we filled it in the boat and were off once more. The fishing at Sydenham Inlet beggars description. Bream up to three pounds weight, perch, salmon trout, skip jack, mullet and flathead were to be had in abundance but to catch unlimited fish beyond what we could possibly consume soon lost its charm. We were also sufficiently sportsmanlike to refuse to destroy fish just for the fun of playing them on light tackle so we turned our attention to feathered game. Ducks were plentiful but difficult to approach.

Careful study of their habits soon taught us where and when to look for them. A shallow lake nearby was a favorite feeding ground in the dusk of evening and mia mia shelters of boughs made the necessary cover and the camp pot was easily provided for.

The difficulty was to retrieve the game. There was only a skin of water over feet of soft mud similar to what we had experienced at Lake Curlip. Swimming was not possible and with an offshore wind the game often drifted far out from the edge of the water.

We overcame this difficulty in a way that although effective was somewhat dangerous. A bundle of bamboo rushes under ones middle provided the necessary flotation and by dog paddling over the mud we were able to bring the game ashore by gripping the feet of the birds in our teeth like retriever dogs. After one of the efforts we looked like a lot abos in central Australia. As there was no water deep and clean mough for a bath we were compelled to allow the anud to dry on our bodies before resuming our clothes and had to spend a long time in the river at the camp before we were clean again. A week or ten days practically exhausted the charm of this wild spot and we broke camp and returned by the same route that

we had come. The inability to dispose of the game that we shot and the fish that we caught soon destroyed our zest for the chase and our appreciation of this veritable sportsman's paradise.

The following year Molesworth and Nicholson tried out the same spot again but met with disaster. A bushfire came down on their camp whilst they were away and they returned to find that they had lost everything including guns, clothes, bedding and tent.

I did not accompany them on that occasion because I had taken my gun and rifle outside Australia on a trip to Ceylon with another friend Austen Embling. In that spicy Isle I hunted Sambur deer and shot jungle fowl, snipe and crocodiles. I also spent one night on the slopes of Mount Pedrotallagalla at an altitude of about 6,000 feet near Newara Eliya in a vain attempt to bag a cheetah which had been raiding the native villages nearby.

I bought a mangy pariah dog for a bait, tied it up in a small clear space in the moonlight and established myself in a tree along with my Sinhalee servant. It was intensely cold and after sticking it out until the small hours of the morning without any sign of the cheetah I gave it best, released the dog and returned to my hotel. At breakfast that morning I was the source of much hilarity amongst my friends.

Of 50 targets, with broken targets to count, 25 targets per visit, two visits over two layouts using the quick round method. In the event of ties, to be shot-off squad system, first miss-out.

The winner will receive a special commemorative trophy as donated by Evans and Balfour Pty. Ltd., gunsmiths of Melbourne, a silver badge by IMI Australia Ltd. Second and third placegetters will receive silver and bronze A.C.T.A. medallions respectively.

Subject to there being a minimum of three lady contestants, the best lady shooter will receive a silver A.C.T.A. medallion.

Trophy vouchers will be issued on application to the 1st t_0 5th placegetters and to the best lady shooter subject to there being a

minimum of three lady contestants and each placegetter not having won any other award in this event.

Nominations (this event only) \$9 (targets inclusive); Compulsory Sweepstakes overall = \$1; Compulsory Sweepstakes each 25 targets @ 1 = 2; Total = \$12.

Sweepstakes shall be compulsory entry.

Only Association branded cartridges may be used in this event. No entries will be accepted for this event after 10 a.m. Wednesday. All nomination will be squadded after shuffling.

Scores will be recorded and then included only in overall high gun totals.

SECOND DAY

THURSDAY, MARCH 7, 1974 commencing at 8.30 a.m.

Event No. 2

Fourteenth Australian National Double-Rise Championship

The Championship of 25 pairs of targets, shall be shot as a graded event, at 5 pairs double rise from each trap from 16 yards over a 5 trap layout, one visit to the traps and shall be scored as one point for each target. Shooters changing lanes after each shoot. Each competitor shall shoot from the five lanes, squad system. In the event of ties, to be shot-off from centre lane, first miss-out.

The overall winner will receive the J. M. Tyquin Perpetual Cup for 12 months (or until the next National Championship series) and an IMI Australia Limited silver badge,

The first placegetter in each of A, B and C classes will receive a gold medallion from Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd.; second and third such placegetters will receive silver and bronze A.C.T.A. medallions respectively.

Twenty-fifth Grand Australian Handicap of \$1,000 Value

The Handicap shall be shot at 50 clay targets from Association Handicaps, double-barrel, both barrels equal value, squad system, one target from each lane, 25 clay targets each of two visits. In the event of ties, to be shot-off squad system, first miss-out.

\$1,000 value overall divided 1st \$400, 2nd \$200, 3rd \$100, then to those not having won any other award \$30 to the best of 12-13, 14-15, 16-17, 18, 19, 20, 21-23, 24-27 yardages and \$30 to the best lady shooter, providing that a minimum of three lady competitors contest the event, and not having won any other award in this event.

The actual winner of the event will also receive an IMI Australia

Limited silver badge. Second and third placegetters will receive silver and bronze A.C.T.A. medallions respectively.

Subject to there being a minimum of three lady shooters the best lady shooter will receive an A.C.T.A. silver medallion.

Nomination \$10 (Targets inclusive); Compulsory Sweepstake each 25 targets (() \$1 = \$2; Total \$12.

Sweepstakes shall be compulsory entry.

No entries will be accepted for this event after 10 a.m.

All nominations will be squadded after shuffling.

Scores will be recorded by classes purely for high gun totals.

FOURTH DAY

SATURDAY, MARCH 9, 1974 commencing at 8.30 a.m.

Event No. 4

Twenty-second Australian National Double-Barrel Championship

The Championship shall be shot as a graded event at 50 targets from 16 yards, double-barrel, both barrels equal value, broken targets only to count, 25 targets per visit, two visits to the traps. Each competitor to shoot from the five lanes, squad system, shooters to change lanes after each shot. In the event of ties, to be shot-off squad system, first miss-out.

The overall winner will receive the J. M. Wilson Perpetual Cup for 12 months (or until the next National Championship series). A special commemorative trophy as donated by Evans and Balfour Pty. Ltd., Gunsmiths, of Melbourne and an IMI Australıa Ltd., silver badge. The first placegetter in each of A, B and C Classes will receive a gold medallion from Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd. Second and third such placegetters will receive silver and bronze A.C.T.A. medallions respectively. Trophy vouchers will be issued on application to the winner and to the first five placegetters in each of classes A, B, C and to the best lady shooter subject to there being a minimum of three lady contestants and each placegetter not having won any other award in this event.

Nominations (this event only) \$9 (Targets inclusive); Compulsory Sweepstakes overall, \$1; Compulsory Sweepstakes each 25 targets (a) \$1 = \$2; Total \$12.

Sweepstakes shall be compulsory entry.

All nominations will be squadded after shuffling according to classes.

No entries will be accepted for the Australian National Double-Barrel Championship later than 10 a.m. Only Association approved branded cartridges may be used in this event.

Event No. 5

Twentieth Australian National Single-Barrel Championship

The Championship will be shot as a graded event at 50 targets from 16 yards, using one barrel only. The competitor shall load only $_{\oplus}$ one cartridge in his gun, only broken targets to count, 25 targets per visit, two visits to the traps. Each competitor shall shoot from the five lanes, squad system, changing lanes after each shot. In the event of ties, to be shot-off squad system, first miss-out.

The overall winner will receive the W. Rainbird Perpetual Cup for 12 months (or until the next National Championship series) and an IMI Australia Limited silver badge.

The first placegetter in each of A, B and C Classes will receive a gold medallion from Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd. Second and third such placegetters will receive silver and bronze A.C.T.A. medallions respectively.

Trophy vouchers will be issued on application to the winner and to the first five placegetters in each of classes A, B, C and to the best lady shooter subject to there being a minimum of three lady contestants and each placegetter not having won any other award in this event.

Nomination \$9 (Targets inclusive); Compulsory Sweepstake overall, \$1; Compulsory Sweepstake each 25 targets @ 1 = 2; Total \$12.

Sweepstakes shall be compulsory entry.

All nominations will be squadded after shuffling according to classes.

No entries will be accepted for the Australian National Single-Barrel Championship later than 10 a.m. Only Association approved branded cartridges may be used in this event.

SEVENTH DAY

TUESDAY, MARCH 12, 1974 commencing at 8.30 a.m.

Event No. 6

Thirteenth Australia-New Zealand D.T.L. Trap Championship

The Championship shall be shot as a graded event at 50 targets from 16 yards, double-barrel, scoring three points for the first barrel and two points for the second barrel, 25 targets per visit, two visits to the traps. Each competitor to shoot from the five lanes, squad system, changing lanes after each shot. In the event of ties, to be shot-off squad system, first miss-out, points scoring.

The overall winner will receive a silver badge by IMI Australia Ltd.

The first placegetter in each of A, B and C classes will receive a gold medallion from Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd. Second and third such placegetters will receive silver and bronze A.C.T.A, medallions respectively.

Trophy vouchers will be issued on application to the winner and to the first five placegetters in each of classes A, B, C and to the

best lady shooter subject to there being a minimum of three lady contestants and each placegetter not having won any other award in this event.

Nominations \$9 (Targets inclusive); Compulsory Sweepstakes overall, \$1; Compulsory Sweepstake each 25 targets @ \$1 = \$2; Total \$12.

Sweepstakes shall be compulsory entry.

All nominations will be squadded after shuffling according to classes.

No entries for the Australia/New Zealand Championship will be accepted later than 10 a.m. Only Association approved branded cartridges may be used in this event.

EIGHTH DAY

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 13, 1974 commencing at 8.30 a.m.

Twenty-eighth International Trap Teams' Match

Competing teams are England, Scotland, Ireland, Wales. South Africa, Rhodesia, Canada, New Zealand and Australia for the Mackintosh International Trophy, with results by air mail. Conducted under agreement and direction of the International Committee of Great Britain.

AUSTRALIAN TEAM-

30 members, 25 highest scores to count. 100 targets per member from 16 yards. Double-barrel points scoring 3 and 2; 5 lanes squad system, 25 targets per trap over 4 traps, 5 targets from each lane per member before changing lanes. In the event of a tie for High Gun, to be shot-off squad system, first miss-out. International load shells, $1\frac{1}{6}$ oz. shot 32 grams. No. 6 size or smaller, automatic angle traps. Highest possible score for team: 7,500 points.

The team shall be squadded in the order that the respective shooters qualified.

QUALIFICATIONS

Each team member shall be an Australian resident of at least 12 months standing. In the event of a member being unable to take his place in the team, his place will be filled by another shooter, agreed

upon by the Executive Committee.

The 30 highest scorers in the National Double-Barrel of 50 targets; National Single-Barrel of 50 targets and the Australian and New Zealand Championship of 50 targets (this last being points scoring 3 and 2), shall automatically become Australia's International Team. In the event of a tie, to be shot-off squad system, first miss-out.

Highest scorer in the Australian Team will hold the special International High Gun Cup, valued at \$150 (presented by the late J. M. Bauman, Esq., of Brisbane) for 12 months (or until the next International Match) and will be awarded the International High Gun Medallion and an IMI Australia Ltd. Sterling Silver Commemoration Badge.

Every member of the Australian Team will receive the special "International Badge." Only Association approved branded cartridges may be used in this event.

To collect free cartridges, each team member signs a special account at A.C.T.A. office then is issued tickets for packets accordingly.

FOLLOWED BY

Event No. 7

Thirty-fourth Australian National Champion of Champions Cup

(commencing around 11.30 a.m.)

The Championship shall be shot as an open event (i.e., not as a graded event) at 50 targets from 20 yards, double-barrel, both barrels equal value, broken targets only to count, 10 targets per trap over 5 traps shot in one visit. Each competitor to shoot from the five lanes, squad system, changing lanes after each shot. In the event of ties, to be shot-off squad system, first miss-out.

The winner of the Champion of Champions Cup event will have won the Mackintosh Perpetual Cup for 12 months (or until the next National Championship series), a substitute Champion of Champions Cup (presented by Evans & Balfour Pty. Ltd. of Melbourne) and a silver badge by IMI Australia Ltd. Second and third placegetters will receive silver and bronze A.C.T.A. medallions respectively.

Trophy vouchers will be issued, on application, to the first 15 placegetters and to the best lady shooter subject to there being a minimum of three lady contestants and each placegetter not having won any other award in this event.

Nomination \$9 (Targets free); Compulsory Sweepstake 28-Jan/Feb., 1974

overall, \$1; Compulsory Sweepstake each 25 targets @ \$1 = \$2; Total \$12.

Sweepstakes shall be compulsory entry.

All nominations will be squadded after shuffling according to classes.

No entries will be accepted for the Australian National Champion of Champions Cup event after 10 a.m. Only Association approved branded cartridges may be used in this event.

And in Conjunction

Allan Brown Club Trap Teams' Match—open to teams of 5. from any one club; \$5 nomination per team of 5; special nomination form to be lodged the day prior to the event; scores to be taken from the ANZ Points Scoring Championship; winning team to receive an open order for \$15.00 for sporting goods; the perpetual trophy as donated in March 1973 by N.Z.G.C.A. Past President Mr Allan Brown to be retained by A.C.T.A. and the names of the progressive winning clubs to be inscribed thereon.

1. 1973 Registration Cards must be produced when lodging entries for all events listed on the programme.

2. 1974 National High Gun Trophies are: -

2.1 Browning U/O shotgun to the highest overall scorer in the skeet event plus the six major trap events (see rule 115).

2.2 Winchester U/O shotgun to the highest overall scorer in the six major trap events - irrespective of A, B or C grade or class.

2.3 SKB U/O shotgun to the highest scorer of the two remaining grades of trap.

2.4 Beretta Model 57 Trap U/O shotgun to the highest scorer in the third remaining class of the trap events.

2.5 Luigi-Franchi skeet shotgun to the highest scorer in the skeet event.

2.6 Commencing 1974 IMI Australia Ltd. are providing "an IMI Ladies Perpetual High Gun Trophy" with a small trophy for the winner each year. The scores to count will apply to those events wherein three or more lady shooters compete.

3. A, **B** and **C** Trap High Gun Trophies—shall be determined from the highest overall scorers in the six major trap events comprising Double Rise, Grand Australian Handicap, National Double Barrel, Single Barrel, A.N.Z. (points), and Champion of Champions. In the event of ties to be shot-off in the sequence of the programme, five of each type of target with five pairs of double rise, totalling thirty targets per round for this trophy.

4. J. Newton Thomas Overall High Gun Trophy — shall be determined from the highest overall scorers in the six major trap events of Double Rise, Grand Australian Handicap, National Double Barrel, Single Barrel, A.N.Z., Champion of Champions plus the National Skeet. In the event of ties, to be shot-off in the sequence of the programme, five of each type of target, with five pairs of Double Rise, plus a half round of thirteen skeet targets, totalling forty-three targets per round for this trophy.

5. Messrs Fuller Firearms Pty. Ltd. of Sydney will donate a Stirling Broadrib Under and Over shotgun to the first New Zealand shooter to win the Australia-New Zealand Trap Championship.

6. CARTRIDGES: Special cartridges will be available to competitors only. Only these branded cartridges may be used throughout the programme other than for the handicap events. All competitors' cartridges will be subject to examination by Association officials at any time.

7. A.C.T.A. will sell packets of 25 cartridges, \$3.00; cases of 500 cartridges, \$58.

8.1 Clay targets—number one shooter of each squad may observe a target at his first visit and any subsequent visit to any layout. Traps cannot be altered without permission of the shoot marshal.

8.2 Clay targets throughout the programme will be color BLACK.

9. Empty shells on the ground, during the National programme are the property of the A.C.T.A.

10.1 Competitors are to check and sign their scores before leaving the track at the end of each visit. The decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

10.2 All trap squads to be of six shooters with each shooter moving one lane with every target.

11. The adoption of compulsory sweepstakes throughout this programme is applicable only to national championships.

12. REFRESHMENTS: Meals and light refreshments will be available throughout each day from 8 a.m.

13. Cars must be parked within defined areas.

14. NO LIABILITY: The organisers, whilst taking every precaution, do not accept responsibility for any accidental damage to any person or property on the ground, or for safe custody of guns, ammunition, clothing, etc., deposited in the pavilion or elsewhere.

15. Clay Targets for the Champion of Champions Cup and the International Teams' Match are presented by I.M.I. Australia Limited.

16. Cartridges as required for the International Teams' Match are presented by the respective makers IMI Australia Limited and Winchester Australia Pty. Ltd.

17. TRAVEL AGENTS ARE: Ansett Airlines.

18. Gunsmithing facilities will be provided by Evans and Balfour Pty. Ltd., of Melbourne who are accredited Olympic gunsmiths.

19. Should circumstances warrant, the Executive Committee reserves the right to vary the conditions of any event.

AMATEUR RULES

A. The principles of amateurism, laid down in the declaration of the International Olympic Committee at its Congress of 1947 are valid for all members of the International Shooting Union.

B. Money prizes up to \$25U.S. or its equivalent are considered as a compensation for costs. If there is a shooting contest covering several days, money totalling \$100 or its equivalent within the same week are also considered a compensation for costs without detailed specification from the competitors. Money prizes exceding the abovementioned sums must be given to the club to which the competitor belongs. The competitor may receive from his club only the sum corresponding to his actual costs, which may include:

- 1. Entrance Fees.
- 2. Ammunition.
- 3. Travelling expenses.
- Costs for meals and lodgings (in relation to the general level and normally not exceeding 10 dollars or 3 pounds or 35 Swiss francs, etc., per day).

C. This article applies to all categories of shooting supervised by the International Shooting Union. D. An amateur should not be considered as:

- 1. Anyone who gives an exhibition in marksmanship for any pecuniary reward.
- 2. Anyone whose principal profession is test shooting of guns or ammunition. The operator of a test shooting machine is not necessarily included in this category.
- 3. Anyone who is a professional instructor in shooting.

4. Anyone who accepts money prizes in excess of those allowed according to the rules of amateurism. E. Paragraphs D2 and 3 categories do not apply to a member of the armed forces, who acts as an instructor, if his work is solely educational and cannot be considered as coaching of shooters for competition.

F. The competitor should fulfil the qualifications of amateurism laid down by the National Olympic Committee of his country.

G. In judging the status as an amateur according to article D and E, the activities of the competitor during the past two years should be considered.

Public Liability Cover

The following is a copy of a letter as received from Edward Lumley & Sons (Vic.) Pty. Ltd. who, as brokers for the Australian Clay Target Association, placed the public liability cover – as listed on page 8 of June 1973 A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" – with Security and General Insurance Company Limited.

Re: Public Liability Insurance Policy M5/10406.

We refer to a number of conversations with you, over the past year, wherein we have discussed the extent of the cover granted by the above policy, and trust that the following explanation will clarify the situation.

In brief, the Operative clause of the Policy reads as follows: -

To Indemnify the insured association and/or its registered shooter members against their legal liability for accidental bodily injury to persons, and/or damage to property, whilst participating in an organised shoot or acting as individuals at a closed range, which is an Association approved and/or properly licensed range.

Extensions: -

(i) Liability of one Registered Shooter member to another.

(ii) Liability for Food and Drink poisoning.

. Territorial Limits: Anywhere in the Commonwealth of Australia and Territory of Papua and New Guinea.

Our discussions have also concentrated on the question of the establishment of the status of a Registered shooter member. Under Article 49 (a) of the Association's Articles of Association, it is obligatory for member clubs to ensure that no person may enter or compete at any competition or event unless such person is registered with the Association.

On December 26, 1973, a Miroku U/O Shotgun was left at Echuca Gun Club, Victoria. Owner please contact Secretary G. Shawcross, Phone Bamawn ext. 832301. However, as you have pointed out, other persons, who may be competing at a range, would fall into the categories of Honorary and/or visiting shooters.

On discussing this aspect with the Company, it has been resolved that, providing that such persons are included on a Score Card and/or are properly introduced and entered in the Visitors' Book of the Member Club, such persons will be treated as a Registered Shooter Member.
