REGISTERED SHOOTERS

Article 49 of the Articles of Association of the Australian Clay Target Association states: (a) The Association shall keep a register of shooters and no person may enter or compete at any Association competition or event conducted by a member Club of which a Delegate is a member of the Association unless such person is registered with the Association and is not in arrears with his subscription.

(b) Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall BE-FORE THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF JANUARY IN EACH YEAR supply the Secretary with a full and accurate list of all members and shooters registered with such Club for the year commencing on the first day of January of such year and shall at the same time remit to the Secretary the subscriptions of such Club members and shooters. Each member Club and each member who is the Delegate of an unincorporated Club shall also promptly forward to the Secretary of the Association the names and subscriptions of any such persons joining Club or registering as shooters after the thirty-first day of January in any year.

FEES

Club secretaries are reminded that club 1975 affiliation fee of \$10 is due and payable on January 1, 1975.

All club shooter members are reminded that their 1975 Association fees are due and payable through their club secretaries on January 1, 1975.

These shooter registration fees are \$10 for the 1975 calendar year, whilst juniors are registered for \$1 for the year. Juniors receive a handicap card but do not receive any publications of ACTA Shooting News. Registered juniors seeking the publication must register for the full \$10. Irrespective of the class of registration fee, juniors are included in the ACTA Public Liability Insurance Policy as recently published

- coverage is to \$200,000 - whilst the premium is borne by the A.C.T.A.

However, where registered A.C.T.A. persons have a common address, and are related, then on request only one copy of Shooting News is to be sent and a reduction of \$2 is permitted for the additional registered shooter at the time of registration.

Only subscribers to A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" may send \$8 direct to the Secretary for "Shooting News" publications.

No pro rata rates are accepted and all fees are for the calendar year concerned.

April 1975 "Shooting News" will be mailed only to those financial—that is, those whose fees are actually received by the Secretary as of February 14, 1975.

In view of production costs and space content, apropos the recent scheduled increases in Australian postal rates, all further publications of the A.C.T.A. "Shooting News" will not contain lists of shooter registrations or handicap amendments but a full list of registrations will be published in one publication each year.

Shooters who have not marked their cards with their progressive common mark scores throughout 1974 are to be classed by club secretaries as "A" Class shooters in the 1975 registration lists to be forwarded by club secretaries for A.C.T.A. processing.

Separately within this publication are the 1975 A.C.T.A. championship allocations as decided by the Executive Committee.

Also contained within this publication is an abridged report of the August/September, 1974, visit to U.S.A. and Canada by a group of Australian shotgun shooters led by "Barney" Rooke of Wagga Wagga, N.S.W., with a further section of descriptive photographs.

NOMINATIONS FOR 1975 OFFICES IN A.C.T.A.

All interested shooters are hereby notified that nominations for all offices in the Association close at 5 p.m. on Tuesday, December 31, 1974. Nominations must be lodged on the prescribed form with the Secretary, A.C.T.A., G.P.O. Box 2038S, Melbourne, Victoria, 3001. Any nominations received after this hour or date will not be accepted. Nomination forms are available from the Secretary, A.C.T.A. Nomination forms are only available on application.

Those lodging nominations are reminded that such nominations must be lodged in accordance with Article 27 of the Association Constitution, which reads: "Nominations for all offices in the Association and members of the Executive Committee must be in writing signed by the Secretary of the member Club or by the DELE-GATE member of an unincorporated club making the nomination, and must reach the Secretary of the Association on or before December 31, in each year prior to the Annual General Meeting."

It is advised that private nominations will be rejected. Nominations received must have the official backing of the club and be approved by the Committee of the member club concerned.

These nominations will be published in February 1975 A.C.T.A. "Shooting News."

All member clubs have a copy of the Association Memorandum and Articles of Association including the amendments unanimously decided by the March 1974 Annual General Meeting.

One of these amendments (Article 24 (a)) increased the Executive Committee as of the 1975 year by three—being one additional member for each of the States of Queensland (previously 3), South Australia (previously 1), and Western Australia (previously 1).

As Article 26 provides that half of the Committee retire annually, the following is the situation for the 1975 year:

Note: According to the Articles, the Association Vice-President is elected annually by the Committee from amongst the elected Committeemen meeting as soon as convenient immediately following each annual general meeting.

The 41st World Shooting Championships within the International Shooting Union (full results page ??) were conducted in Switzerland during September and at the time of going to press for this publication Australian shooter Jim Ellis of South-West Gun Club, Western Australia, achieved 4th placing in the open trench title whilst the Australian team of four trench shooters is reported to have achieved 10th placing in the teams' section.

World shooting championships are conducted annually by a National Member Association within the International Shooting Union and Australia was the venue in 1973. However the I.S.U. restricts such tournaments to include only selected sections and at Melbourne, Australia, in 1973 only shotgun and running boar sections were contested. For other years, the I.S.U. conducts world championships of all shooting types—thus, smallbore rifle, pistol, running boar and shotgun sections were contested in Switzerland during September, 1974.

In 1977 the world clay pigeon shooting championships will be conducted in the French Riviera resort of Antibes. This was decided during the recent 41st World Shooting Championships.

To all club secretaries and advertisers alike, copy for all publications closes on the first day of the month preceding the date of publication.

Australia has been beset by many labour stoppages during 1974 and it has been necessary to fully adhere to this copy closing deadline to ensure production and to maintain mailing schedules.

As no January publication is made because of annual vacations within the printing industry, all concerned are hereby requested to lodge copy — for December by November 1 actual — for January/ February by December 1 actual. Late submissions then are self-inflicted problems for those concerned.

It is hereby recorded that the increased Australian Post Office mailing charges apply as from October 1, 1974, and these new mailing rates greatly affect all publications as to their respective total page weight.

EXTRACTS FROM THE A.C.T.A. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING OF OCTOBER 7, 8, 9

1. During the 1975 National Championships programme, scheduled for March 4 to 12 at the Tasmanian Gun Club, Evandale, near Launceston, Tasmania:

- (a) All shooters will be "required to present their 1974 handicap cards plus, where available, their 1975 handicap cards to substantiate their 'B' and 'C' class gradings."
- (b) A "Texan" reloader as kindly donated by F. C. Lovelock Pty. Ltd. will take the place of cash as the first prize in the Grand Australian Handicap event.
- (c) The shoot marshal will announce that no closed guns are to be carried or pointed on the grounds other than as provided in the shooting rules.

GENERAL

2. Clubs when lodging 1975 shooter registrations with A.C.T.A. are asked to show on the forms the latest 1974 handicap yardage of each respective shooter whereupon A.C.T.A. will convert to metric and will also grant the one metre inward for the 1975 registration renewal. It is to be noted that no shooter can come inward by this method to 11 metres (or to the existing 12 yards).

3. Apropos the 1973 National Skeet Championship at Adelaide on 10/3/1973, an A.C.T.A. break record

of 154/154 is confirmed as having been established under the shooting rules by shooter Gerry Wiliams of U.S.A.

(Note: The skeet score of 158/158 established over March 9/10 by K. Lowry is disallowed under the shooting rules although purely by circumstances Lowry was scheduled to be in the skeet shoot off during the afternoon of March 10 (skeet second day) but during March 10 morning he was called to shoot the scheduled D-T-L Handicap event wherein he had been squadded as a back marker.)

4. (a) As from 1st January, 1975, clubs must use metric handicap marks on the shooting lanes and targets must be thrown to the metric measurements of legal targets.

(b) All new installations must be constructed to the new metric measurements but it is not intended that existing traphouses or tower shooting stations be reconstructed.

(c) Separately within this publication are the respective amendments to A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules concerning the adoption of metric measurements and weights.

(d) With the conversion of our shooting rules to metric, referees will need to closely study the amendments and become familiar with the new terms, target distances, etc. The enthusiasm of our active referees is greatly appreciated by the Executive Committee and Australian referees enjoy a reputation world-wide of which they can be proud. However there are probably some referees who for various reasons feel they do not want to try to keep up with the change and do not want to be embarrassed by the fact that they wear a referee's badge.

Our Rules Supervisors and Referee Examiners will gladly discuss any problems encountered by individual referees but perhaps it might be an ideal opportunity for those who wish to do so to return their badges and lighten their responsibilities.

5. Effective from January 1, 1975, some amendments to A.C.T.A. down-the-line trap shooting rules will be published in December, 1974, A.C.T.A. "Shooting News."

6. That in any shoot off where one squad still remains in a contest whilst another squad is reduced to one shooter before that shoot off round is completed, that a pacemaker be not allowed and the conditions in Rule 97 shall apply.

7. That the present ordering/manufacturing/mailing method—concerning CHAMPIONSHIP BADGES —be discontinued in view of ever increasing production costs and production delays, and to maintain championship badges to clubs at existing price that A.C.T.A. order badges of blank surround in bulk then sell them to clubs at existing price, giving immediate delivery with provision for clubs to have local jeweller add the required engraving and so enable clubs to have the appropriate badge so available for presentation at any shoot.

8. Attention all Referee Examiners.—It is requested that no further Referee Trap or Referee Skeet Examinations be considered until or unless the Referee Examiner concerned has been so authorised by a Rules Supervisor. This decision is designed to achieve a

uniformity of rules interpretations throughout the Commonwealth.

9. Recommendation to the A.C.T.A. 1975 scheduled Annual General Meeting "to discuss an increase of member club annual registration fee to \$25 (as provided in Article 14), effective as of 1st January, 1976."

10. Clay target shooting is a sport in which each of us is dependent on the other for its continuance.

Such a system can only succeed when all of its sections function smoothly and one of the breakdowns of our system has been the voluntary marking of performances on cards for grading purposes.

The majority of shooters do this honestly but unfortuantely there are some who take advantage of the system and there are others who think that shooters are taking advantage of the system.

The known instances of cheating and the rumours of those who think that something is wrong is undermining the morale of all shooters to the stage of causing upheaval.

It is in the interest of club managements to see that clay target shooting prospers and an appeal is made to every club to co-operate in this requirement that they be responsible for collecting cards and marking them. If all clubs unite on this action they will be doing something positive to produce harmony for the betterment of the sport.

This publication contains a FINAL RESULTS list of the trench shooting section of the 41st World Shooting Championships conducted in Switzerland during September, 1974, by the International Shooting Union.

The 1975 national championship allocations are published herein, meanwhile those for the Riverina area of New South Wales will not be available for publication appearance till December "Shooting News." The 1975 Interstate Trap Teams' Match has been won by the New South Wales team with 1480/1500 of scores to count.

Full details will be published in December, meanwhile the respective State team total scores were:

Some 31 Australians went to America for the "Grand American" and included were Mr Alan Pedersen, A.C.T.A. Vice-President, and Executive Committee member Mr Harry Williamson, all travelling as private individuals.

The first shoot on the tour was at Bob Taylor's Gun Club in Las Vegas where the team was met at the airport by Elgin Gates and his sons, Randy and Butch plus Ila Taylor, and how great it was to be met in a strange country by familiar faces. Elgin saw us on the bus which took us to our hotel and the temperature at this time of day was 103 degrees.

After nominating and being classified to our grades Elgin had arranged a 25 target practice round complete with shells. Each of us had been put on 22 yards and A grade, which is standard procedure for newcomers at all clubs. All events except Double Rise are shot single barrel in U.S.A. and Canada. The best scores from the Australians was a 95/100 by Gordon Wakefield, who shot the first 50 straight. Badges and shells were supplied by Elgin Gates for the Australian team and the Australians gave ties for the U.S.A. shooters. After the shoot the teams went to the Frontier Hotel for trophy presentations.

In the doubles our best was again Gordon Wakefield with 88; Peter Caddy and Jack Williamson shot 84/100. Two of our shooters received a surprise as Don Maher won the Veterans Double Rise Trophy and Tup Pedersen had won the Veterans 16 yards Trophy. Elgin Gates presented the Australian team with their trophies on behalf of the U.S. shooters, saying that it did not matter who won, it was the spirit and competition between the two countries that counted. An Australian sash (donated by Barney Rooke) was presented to Don Bonalis for High Gun from the Australian shooters.

Our next shoot was at Milwaukee in the State of Wisconsin. We arrived late Sunday night to be met at the airport by the grand old man of trapshooting, Vic Reinders, and his Wife Tommy. On Tuesday morning we all arrived at the Weukesha (pronounced Walkashore) Gun Club at 9 a.m. and the first thing we noticed when our bus pulled up was the big sign on the front door which read "Down Under Day— Welcome Aussies." Vic Reinders produced what he calls "Fun Events," it is a 5 position skeet. All 25 targets are shot from stations 2-6 and doubles are shot from all stations. It is mainly designed to speed up skeet shooting. A full squad completes a round in ten minutes.

A trophy was given for the 1st and 2nd in a 10 pair Double Rise and 25 target international style event plus two High Gun trophies for the Australian shooters. The Americans were shooting for their own trophies plus an Australian sash for High Gun. The teams event saw the Australians come out the winners AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS for the only win in teams events for the entire tour. The High Gun trophies were for overall and events 2-4. The overall was won by Barney Rooke and this was a Remington 12 gauge shotgun (donated by Bud Archer); 2nd overall was Gordon Wakefield who won a 12 gauge shotgun case. The second High Gun was a silver dollar mounted as a key ring and donated by Herchel Cheek and this was won by Barney Rooke. The Australian sash was won by Bud Archer and he was later seen wearing it proudly around at the Grand and he stated he was "just as proud as if he had won the Grand American."

From Milwaukee the team headed to Vandalia and this is what we had all come to see. It consists of 58 traps in a line. During the "Grand" there were three million two hundred thousands targets thrown, representing some four million shotshells and 70 tons of leadshot. The Australians did not win any big events at the "Grand" but they shot some very good scores.

The first two days were on the International targets and here Jack Williamson shot 96/100 and Barney Rooke 95/100. The event was won by Brit Robinson of U.S.A. with 99/100 and was of 175 entries.

On the second day, with 391 entries, the 100 International event was won by Francis Foster after a miss and out shoot off with Frank Little, both had shot 98/100. Following this was a 100 targets off 16 yards with 212 entries. Remembering all U.S. championship events are shot single barrel, the best Australian score was 98/100 by Gordon Wakefield. The event was won by Rayl Stafford with a perfect 100 followed by 125 in the shoot off.

Day Three: With 732 entries for 300 targets (100 16 yards, 100 handicap and 50 pairs DR). The Australian best scorers were Barney Rooke with 98, then Gordon Wakefield 93 and Ted Wilkinson 92. Tup Pedersen was the only Australian entry in the handicap and his score was 70/100. In doubles Wakefield and Rooke scored 83/100. Don Bonallas won the Double Rise with 100/100.

Day Four: 200 targets off 16 yards followed by 100 handicap targets. Best Australian scorers were Wake-field, 96 + 97 = 193, and Rooke 94 + 99 = 193. The only Australian shooter in the handicap was Rooke with 85/100. All Australian shooters had to shoot A Grade for 16 yards and Double Rise and from 25 yards for handicap. (This is normal procedure for newcomers at the "Grand American Series" unless the newcomers have established A.T.A. ratings.)

Day Five: 200 targets off 16 yards—best Australian was B. Rooke who very proudly received his first 100 straight pin and finishing with 100 + 96 = 196/200. Elgin Gates was shooting in the same squad and thinking that this was the first Australian to shoot 100 straight at the "Grand American," missed his own last target, scoring 199/200. Total entries 1870.

Day Six: 100 handicap, 100 Double Rise. Very few Australians entered this day but the best were Bill Abbott and Peter Caddy, shooting 81 and 83 in the handicap, and in the doubles Rooke and Wakefield shot 86 and 85 respectively.

Day Seven: This event being 200 targets off 16 yards and winner to receive the Australian badge and the five highest scores from Australia to receive a badge given by Elgin Gates. Here we saw Wakefield shoot his first 100 straight and go on to 141 before he missed, finishing with 195/200. Entries were 2344 and the event was won by Hiram Bradley with a perfect 200 plus 75 in the shoot off.

Day Eight: For us it was a day of 100 handicap targets and this was won with 98/100. A point of interest was that all scores of 94 and above received extra yardage as in the U.S. it is not how much you win but how many you beat and a combination of the high scores.

Day Nine: The day of the "Grand American Handicap"—a record of 804 squads. We were all squadded early as we had to leave for Vancouver at lunch time. Best Australian scores were John Forsythe 83, Bill Abbott and Rooke with 82. The "Grand" this year was won by John Steffen with 99 plus 25 in the shoot off.

Before leaving the description of the "Grand," I would like to mention a few points of interest that are different to our type of shooting. Firstly, all traps are Winchester White Flyers with interrupters and they are used in No. 3 hole for oscillations. Squads are of five shooters and shooting five targets per lane before moving. The scorer, puller and referee are one and the same person and usually a college girl, and what a marvellous job they do. Targets are thrown 48 to 52 yards between 9 and 12 feet high, distant 10 yards from the traphouse. All targets used were coloured an iridescent orange.

Slow or fast pulls in America are up to the shooter to refuse—if you shoot you abide by the result and the referee has the final say as to a slow or fast pull. At no time did I see anyone using this to advantage. Baulks are never given to a shooter; it is the responsibility of the shooter not to shoot if he has been interfered with. All other shooting rules are basically the same as ours.

Practice shooting is a very important part of the American shooter's day. At all clubs one or more traps are set aside to be used for practice. At Vandalia on some days 10 traps were used and a long wait to get on them. Ask Ted Wilkinson how long the wait was!

Leaving Vandalia the team flew to Chicago, changing planes, and on to Vancouver. The team was met at the Vancouver Airport by Deb and Alma Oliver and final plans were made for the shoot. We arrived at the Vancouver Gun Club about noon. The program was 50 targets Canadian style which are the same as in U.S.A., 50 targets Australian style, all 16 yards, and 25 pairs Double Rise, and again the five highest Australian scores made up the Australian team. Joe Denvers was the proud winner of the Australian sash for High Gun. All the Australian shooters received a memento trophy inscribed "Klawowya" Vancouver Gun Club, 1974. "Klawowya" means welcome. All the ladies received a brooch resembling the flower of the Dogwood Tree.

After the barbecue of real Canadian salmon our group very reluctantly boarded the bus saying cheerio to our Canadian friends, vowing to return again some time.

After a couple of days sightseeing in San Francisco and Honolulu we were met at the Maui (pronounced Mowee) Airport by Michael Baldwin and his eldest son. Maui Gun Club has only two traps and is situated down in a gully. The wind sure made the targets dance about and our scores on the average were a bit lower than on the mainland. The time now had come to say "Aloha" and to fly back to Sydney.

(Editor's Note.—Since 1972, Winchester White Flyer traps distributed in Australia have been fitted with interrupters and in Australia the number 3 hole is used on days of headwinds whilst the number 4 hole is most generally used as we shoot within wider angles than do the Americans.)
