Separately within this publication are the respective finalist placing winners of all Australian National Championships to date.

Each respective State Section of member club shoot reports within this July 1975 publication of ACTA Shooting News commences with a list showing the Rules Examiners registered at this date. Prospective candidates and member clubs concerned are respectfully requested to understand that in the best interests of the sport and the candidates concerned that examinations be not necessarily conducted at a candidate's home grounds, also that referee examiners, whilst also being interested and dedicated to the sport, they are also human in their capacities and are entirely voluntary as to their clay target shooting examining affairs.

At every National Championship Series and often at club shoots in each State, shooters are frequently seen shaking heads in the firm belief, "I thought I hit that one".

During many of these programmes, trappers and enthusiastic helpers seek any unbroken targets found on the ground after the day's shooting — they seek these for practice throwing if and when permitted.

Sometimes up to ten or even twenty targets have been retrieved unbroken yet with shot holes clearly defined.

Then came the knowledgeable remarks and most seem to say that "the clays must have been hot and sticky to let the shot through like that" or "those holes happen when the target has dropped to the ground and falling shot penetrates it".

Conclusive evidence has it that even only a few pellets of moving shot will shatter a spinning airborne target, BUT, when the targets cease to spin they become resilient and so permit the shot to pass through the body content of the target.

The lesson is that these targets cease to spin at the predetermined distance for clay target shooting and at this stage are no part of the competition.

During August 10-14, 1974, some nine Australians flew to Noumea for the New Caledonia Championships. (See October 1974 Shooting News — page 3.)

For this 1975 year it appears (at the time of writing) that some 30 or so, including ladies, might go as a group under Team Leaders, Brian Mark (Sebastopol) and Bill Stone (Australian). Interest has been expressed from shooters in Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania.

The programme will probably include "200 ISU Universal Trench", "200-tgt. ISU Skeet", "100-tgt. American Skeet" and "100-tgt. Ball Trap" — Ball Trap as is our (Australian) "Continental" in that targets are thrown the ISU distance but are not as difficult as "Trench" targets to shoot. These targets are thrown from a single trap which is double oscillating, that is, up and down, plus sideways.

Our New Caledonian friends indicate that they have better facilities than in 1974 and that their grounds will include two trench layouts.

For information, the school children of Noumea are on holidays during mid August so this French-speaking maritime country will be at picnic pitch — as with all countries at such times.

Practice shooting will be from August 9-11, thence the New Caledonia Championships will follow from August 12-15. As our mailbox did not receive the programme until June 2nd, and there was no prior advice or covering letters, we would believe that registered Australian shooters were evidently invited to the FIRST CLAY TARGET GRAND TOURNAMENT HELD IN SOUTH AFRICA.

The venue was the Boulder Hill Gun Club, P.O. Box 297, Pietermaritzburg, 3200, with 100 target events of single barrel, doubles, skeet and Olympic trench over the period, Thursday 19th until Sunday, June 22nd. Shooting licences had to be produced when purchasing the 12-gauge shotgun ammunition.

Shooting rules applicable were:-

- (a) for Skeet and Automatic Trap (Trench) = ISU Regulations.
- (b) for Trap and Trap Doubles C.P.S.A./S.A. Regulations.

Competitors without a class handicap were to compete in the AA section whilst gradings of the shooters are in four categories of AA, A, B, C. Late arrivals for any squad were to be fined three targets for each occurrence. Competitors refusing to score were to be fined one target for each occurrence.

The 100 target events were to be shot consecutively through the four shooting ranges commencing from range one, however, during such an event, competitors would not be required to score between these rounds.

Competitors not being members of the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association of South Africa "add R7.50 for current year's subscription which we will hand to the National Secretary before the shoot". (Note: A South African Rand is about our Australian dollar.)

Night Shooting under floodlights was to be a part of the programme using special white targets.

A film coverage was to be a feature as part of "sport for the South African Circuit" and, using the camera crew as judges, a special prize was for the "best-dressed" shooter for film purposes. Colour, badges and styling were rated as essential if the shooting sport was to rate a place on television. (Editor's Note: Remember "Snozzle" Durante and his classic comment, "you're nuttin' — nuttin' but a nuttin").

Free film shows were to appear daily at the range for ladies and special excursions were available to the Lion Park and Voortrekker Museum.

Night shooting during these 1975 Natal Open Championships was offered with the co-operation of Geiser's Electrical Company — (Night shooting was being tried because of their warm climate).

Sponsors of the whole tournament — the "1st G.M. GRAND" — were General Motors and the local Chevrolet dealers.

An article appeared in the Australian Shooters Journal of May 1975 edition, page 66, under the heading of 'Gun Talk'.

The article included some comments by the writer concerning A.C.T.A. 1975 National Championships at Launceston, Tasmania, in that:-

"If someone had said before the start that the National Double Barrel Championships would be won with a score of 74:74 you would have laughed at him.

But this is exactly what happened. After the incredible 620 straight in Melbourne last year, this years result came as somewhat of an anti-climax. Weather may have had a bit to do with it, but more to the point were the targets. Never have I seen faster targets (except Trench) nor more acute angles. Rules are set down for target flight and one would have expected that at a National Championship series these rules would have been observed — they weren't and it caught a lot of competitors by surprise!"

The writer of the article had obviously not kept abreast of A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules and Amendments as:- 1. Australian sports had been required to convert to metric, and, as of January 1 1975, competitive shotgun shooting at clay targets had conformed to this requirement as prescribed in the A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules as published.

- 2. In converting to metric, common mark shooting at clay targets had been changed from a sixteen yard measurement to a sixteen metre measurement being the distance from the top centre pivot point of the trap to the leading edge of the shooting mark on each shooting lane. Thus, as from January 1 1975, clay target shooters in Australia, when shooting from the new 16 metre common mark, were (and are) shooting some 1.37 metres behind the old 16 yard common mark position.
- 3. However, concerning the Australian section of the 29th International Trap Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Perpetual Trophy, as other competing countries had not converted to metric, and to prevent Australia being self-penalized this Australian section was shot within the angles for, and from the old common mark distance of 16 yards, and the resultant scores were comparable to those of recent years.
- 4. When Australian shotgun shooting changed to metric weights and measurements:-
- (a) Rule 6 (a) was amended from a 45 to 55 yard throwing distance to 45 to 55 metres. Thus it is easily understood that the targets, when thrown, had to initially travel faster to achieve the additionally stipulated distance and in conjunction with the weather conditions of following winds, many shooters and observers appeared to consider that the speed of the targets was difficult to judge. However, repeated checks by the shoot marshals, proved that the targets thrown were kept within the newly prescribed limits at all times.
- (b) Rule 7 was amended from a radius of 50 yards to a radius of 50 metres, and the marking pegs at the 1975 Nationals host grounds (Tasmanian Gun Club) had been repositioned accordingly.

NEWS AND VIEWS

Derby (WA) -22-4-75 - new club officers elected were: Johnno Johnson as President and Milton (Spud) Spurling as Secretary.

Alice Springs (NT) - during a two-day shoot, 2nd-3rd November 1974, T. E. Evans of this club achieved a consecutive break of 157 trap targets, which establishes a new break for the State of Northern Territory.

Dalby (Q) - donor of many items of equipment, staunch supporter and club captain, Fred Flegler, died 7-4-75, whilst holidaying at Coffs Harbour. Fred although ill, carried out all maintenance on the traps, kept the grounds in first class order as would be expected of one of the world's good men in the execution of his feelings for his chosen sport.

H. M. Rothwell has subsequently accepted nomination as Dalby's new club captain.

CLAIM - for the most clay targets broken in a single day. Five U.S.A. shooters each fired 3,000 shotshells at registered targets during a 141/2-hour period. They commenced shortly after dawn on 26-11-74 at Oak Grove, California, and continued until 9.45 p.m., shooting single barrel only; neither guns nor ammunition had malfunctions or misfires. The squad percentages were: .9532 at the end of the first 1,000; .9632 at the end of the second 1,000; thence as darkness arrived it was .8706 for the third 1,000. (With acknowledgments to Trap and Field Magazine and Federal Cartridge Co. of Minnesota.)

The centre eight traps are used for practice.

The programme starts to the east and west of the practice area and ammunition storage is located near these starting points. Motorized transport runs continuously back and forth along the roadway at the rear of the trapline — shooters merely jump on and jump off at their desired trap layouts.

1. New world trapshooting record for the most targets shot in one day -15,000 registered targets in $14\frac{1}{2}$ hours by five shotgun shooters!!

William T. Lafferty, O. N. Hamilton, Gary R. Montcalm, George L. Perry and Jerry C. Vernon each shot 3000 "Federal" shotshells for a squad total of 15,000 A.T.A. registered single targets (and Vernon missed only 80 targets out of his entire 3000).

The shooting began shortly after sunrise on October 26, 1974, at Oak Grove Gun Club in Oak Grove, Louisiana. When the last shot was fired at 9.45 p.m., the five man squad had averaged .9280 per cent accuracy over the entire 15,000 targets. At the end of the first 1000, the squad was averaging .9532 and, amazingly, at the end of the second 1000, the average had jumped to .9602. Even under failing light, through the end of 2,400 targets, the squad average was .9567. For the last 600 targets however, darkness dropped the squad average for the third 1000 to .8706. Throughout the entire day there was not one single misfire or malfunction.

COSTS OF THROWING TARGETS

Most of my life I have been thinking up various ideas to cut the cost of throwing targets and running a club, to keep the costs of shooting as low as possible. Some ideas I've passed along in this column or otherwise. And I've put in more free hours and days on club, state and ATA levels than I like to think about — towards the same end. What I did "for free" no shooter had to pay to have done.

Now I find myself somewhat on the other side of the fence. It isn't that I have given up the idea of keeping shooting costs down, or even that I have quit working at it. It is just that I have been hearing comments from some quarters about clubs making too much "profit" on tournaments and that they are ripping-off the shooters. Many times such comments come from people who haven't the faintest idea as to what it takes to run a big shoot, even a one-day shoot, or to keep a club solvent and in good general condition. Often such people are the kind who wouldn't turn a hand to even serve on a handicap committee one day. Do not get the notion that I am not aware that some clubs and some private shoot operators are gouging the shooters for all they can. I know some who are,

and I've helped put a crimp in some of those activities. What does burn me up is to hear some irresponsible person say that if a club can throw, for example, six cent targets for practice, there isn't any reason it can't throw six cent targets in a tournament — maybe even cheaper due to bigger volume, or at least that the bigger volume should take care of the cost of the trophies. These people just plain do not know what is involved in running a tournament and the costs involved.

For an ordinary practice shoot, or little local event, even if several traps are used, about all the help needed is two boys per trap and an entry taker behind the counter. Score posting and winner picking, if any, as well as sheet carrying, etc., is done by various unpaid shooters or club members.

Consider a tournament, even a one-day shoot using four, eight or twelve traps. What extra, full-time help is needed?

Even the two boys per trap goes up, as a relief crew is usually provided for each four traps. That is a 25 per cent increase in labor cost right there.

That is only the beginning. There may be a line supervisor or trap repairman on the trapline. And the necessary office help really mounts up. One or two girls hand out entry cards, type or stamp them, and type ATA application blanks. After the shoot, they, or others, type the scores on ATA reports. The one entry-taker multiplies into an entry-taker, a cashier doing the figuring, a bulletin board poster, a squadsheet carrier, a squadsheet writer and a squad hustler. One or more parking lot attendants may be needed. Though often ignored, the presence and necessity for these people should be obvious. I have kept extensive cost figures at our club for years, and our labour cost per target thrown jumps 50 per cent over that for practice days. And those people aren't loafing either.

But what is not so obvious, yet adds further costs to tournaments, are several other things. Entry cards, squadsheets, cashier sheets and bulletin sheets must be purchased. Those entry cards have to be marked up and the squadsheets numbered in advance. Programs have to be addressed. The cost of programs and postage on them often amounts to 50 cents to \$1.00 for every shooter who shows up. Payoff sheet preparation and mailing and shoot report preparation costs more money. Incidentally, by printing and mailing only one program for all six of our club registered shoots last year instead of the three separate programs as in former years, we saved enough so that we avoided an increase of one cent per targets for tournaments which would have otherwise been necessary.

There are even other hidden costs which multiply when larger tournaments are held. Tournaments for any club require more land, more traps and other equipment, more building space and facilities than would be needed for just practice and local events. Even insurance goes up. Shooters demand service and a nice place to shoot — and somebody has to pay for it. That somebody is the tournament shooter, of course. These same things apply at the Grand, even to a greater extent."

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

The writer of the above article, Mr Vic Reinders, a lecturer in mathematics at an American university competed in the Australian National Clay Target Championships at Adelaide in 1973, where he shot his half millionth target off 16 yards and was presented with the squad scoresheet as a memento — to the acclamation of all present.

In Australia we are beset by the self same problems as exist in America, Britain or Europe, and, as a guide to our many member clubs, the cost of throwing clay targets is a business happening in that daily costs must be accounted for. These costs are of two types — fixed and progressive and, as such, will vary from club to club for their various respective reasons. Fixed costs include power, insurance, cleaning, maintenance, depreciation, telephone and these occur irrespective of the days of non-shooting. Progressive costs include wages, remunerations and the like as to trap boys and other payments or charges so incurred.

A number of clubs are kind enough to discuss and compare, with each other, their respective operating costs, for mutual sympathy and courteous assistance, and of these the following information is herewith made known, with approval, bearing in mind that size of clubs and their consequent requirements do vary. However, at Melbourne Gun Club, (where product delivery costs may be more static than other areas), during the 1974 year some 372,000 clay targets were thrown, at a cost of ten (10) cents per target. However, for the year 1975 on targets used to date, this cost of throwing each target has risen to 10.5 cents. Melbourne Gun Club uses up to six down-the-line trap layouts, up to four skeet layouts and up to two trench layouts. Separately a pattern plate is available but this is a non-cost item. Through the recent period of economic growth throughout Australia, clubs in general have each experienced similar changed working values, however, not all clubs have the capital equipment available or in use, or even the need for it, which others, because of geography, must provide.

The above information is published for the general interest of all concerned.

Annually since 1966 a Browning under-and-over shotgun has been presented to the highest gun scorer over the main D.T.L. trap events viz., Champion of Champions, Double Barrel, Double Rise, Single Barrel, Australia-New Zealand and the Grand Australian, with the provision that each shooter can gain this award only once. If a shoot-off is necessary to determine the High Gun winner, then the shoot-off shall be conducted as prescribed in A.C.T.A. Rules.

A similar Browning shotgun is presented annually at the Spanish and other National Championships and by common agreement, between the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association and the A.C.T.A., each shooter winner can only gain this award once. To me as a Referee Examiner since 1969, I am now placed in the embarrassing situation with regard to rule changes by not only official referees but also many shooters.

As you will appreciate, I feel it is my responsibility to be able to answer any query which may arise at any time with regard to these rules.

With present changes (I believe I am not the only examiner affected by these) I am no longer in the position to give on-the-spot answers as required, although through the A.C.T.A. News and examiner mailings by you, I endeavour to keep abreast of all amendments.

As shooters and official referees do not possess rule books let alone the many updatings during the last few years, could I then request we consider standing by the changes that have been made for a set period of time before further changes of rules are considered.

The period I would recommend would be from three to five years.

Alternatively five referees in my area plus myself are prepared to forfeit our badges and mail them to you.

In earnest, why can't we have shooting rules like the Americans, the British or the International Union, which consist of approximately FIFTY basic rules from which interpretations are commonly achieved.




