

As depicted on the front page of this publication, our 1975 Shotgun Team, as self-selected by their respective scores in the elimination events within our 1975 National Championships at Launceston, assembled at the Tasmanian Gun Club at 8.30 a.m. on Wednesday, March 12, in overcast, but calm weather, then proceeded to their four allocated down-the-line trap layouts to compete and contest as Australia's section of the 1975 International Trap Teams' Match for the Mackintosh Perpetual Trophy.

Each shooter in this 30-man team shoots at 100 targets from 16 yards, using two barrels if desired for each or any target. Scoring is three points for a first barrel "kill" or two points for a second barrel kill. By International agreement, only four traps are used and with shooters in squads of six, the last two squads are "fed in" during the first trap change.

Only the highest 25 scores are to count in each total team score. Scoresheets are sealed immediately they are brought from the tracks and are then collated and despatched by each national secretary to the Secretary, The Clay Pigeon Shooting Association, England, for holding until the final section is contested. The envelopes are then opened and the respective scores from the competing nations are compared.

Contained within this publication are the team and individual scores for the Australian Team. This total score of 7393:7500 won the 1975 Team Match for Australia.

Australia has now won this event 15 times during the 29 times it has been so contested.

National President, Mr Allan Pedersen, and his fellow Executive Committeemen send their praise and compliments to the Team members for their efforts and results.

AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS

Contained within this publication is a reproduction of the Amateur Rules, Schedule 'A' form which must be completed by each shooter who seeks to contest Olympic Games, Commonwealth Games or International Shooting Union Championships.

The form must be completed and signed by the shooter, then verified by the signatures of his club president or club delegate, plus his club secretary, before being mailed to A.C.T.A. for acceptance and notation. Each shooter, newly completing such a form, should also send his current handicap card to A.C.T.A. for the notation "Schedule A" to be added.

Once such a form is lodged by any shooter, the record remains in perpetuity and each annual registration form should contain the Schedule 'A' notation unless for some reason it has to be excluded.

As of September 15, 1975, the respective clay target shotgun shooting clubs in Papua-New Guinea would cease to be a part of any shooting body outside their own country, as, from that date, Papua-New Guinea becomes independent.

We are happy to have had these clubs as members of the Australian Clay Target Association during the recent years and trust that their periods with us have enhanced their clay target shooting procedures, skills and administration.

Elimination and Selection Procedure

for championships and Olympic Games at Montreal, Canada, 1976

A sub-committee was appointed by the A.C.T.A. executive to arrange on Monday, March 10, 1975, eliminations and selection of teams for the I.S.U. World Moving Target Championships in Munich, Western Germany, on 11th to 22nd September, 1975, and for the 1976 Olympic Games at Montreal, Canada.

Members of the sub-committee are Messrs Burgess, Buchan, Taylor and Papps. R. Buchan was appointed convener of meetings.

Olympic Games Final Elimination Selection will be in February, 1976, the actual dates will be published later.

ELIMINATIONS

Location for Trench

All host clubs whose grounds have a 5 Trap or a 15 Trap Trench layout have been approved to conduct these eliminations. It is up to the host clubs as to dates of conducting such events.

Final will be conducted at Melbourne Gun Club at a Februray, 1976 date to be announced.

Trench Host Clubs

Mildura, Victoria, 5 Trap; Colac, Victoria, 5 Trap; Coffs Harbour, N.S.W., 5 Trap; Brisbane, Queensland, 15 Trap; Melbourne, Victoria, 15 Trap; Hobart, Tasmania, 15 Trap; International – Canberra, A.C.T., 15 Trap; Cobar, N.S.W., 5 Trap; plus such other 5 Trap or 15 Trap Trench clubs as may be approved by the Executive Committee.

Location for I.S.U. Skeet Eliminations

All selected host clubs have the correct I.S.U. traps to conduct these eliminations.

Skeet Host Clubs

Perth, W.A.; Melbourne, Victoria; Hobart, Tasmania; Brisbane, Queensland; Hawkesbury, N.S.W.; Wagga, N.S.W.; Queanbeyan-Canberra, N.S.W.; Cobar, N.S.W.; plus such other I.S.U. Skeet clubs as may be approved by the Executive Committee.

Those clubs selected will be responsible for the conduct af area eliminations. A.C.T.A. in conjunction with Melbourne Gun Club will conduct the final for both Trench and Skeet.

Rules for Elimination and Final for both Trench and Skeet

I. Clubs conducting eliminations are required to check that for both Trench and Skeet that each competitor must state before nominating that he will be shooting 100 target eliminations to achieve qualifications to compete in the final.

2. Shooters must shoot at 100 consecutive registered targets in the one day with no practice in between those 100 targets.

3. Clubs and shooters please note: All eliminations or qualifying rounds must be of 100 targets per day. Cost of targets is a Club matter.

4. Competitors must shoot at a minimum of 300 registered targets with a percentage of 85 or better.

5. Competitors may shoot any number of qualifying elimination rounds of 100 targets. Each competitor may delete his lesser rounds, take his highest three rounds that would give him 85 per cent or better average over 300 targets.

6. Contestants seeking selection must compete and qualify in eliminations where the team will be selected.

7. Only competitors who have obtained 85 per cent or better will be invited by the A.C.T.A. to compete in the final.

8. It is the responsibility of the host clubs and competitors to see that scores are correctly recorded and forwarded to the A.C.T.A. office to arrive 14 clear days before the final is conducted, host clubs retain a copy of all score sheets for reference.

9. To compete at the final at Melbourne all competitors must be responsible for their own cost of travel, accommodation etc. as no cost will be incurred by the A.C.T.A. or Melbourne Gun Club.

10. Final selection of the team (at Melbourne Gun Club at a February 1976 date to be advised) will be made after shooting 300 targets over a period of three days, 100 targets on each day. Previous scores over qualifying elimination, 300 targets at host clubs will not be counted.

11. All contestants must have signed and correctly lodged the amateur rules schedule 'A' form.

12. Shoot Marshal is Mr George Bremen.

13. Cartridges must not exceed 32 grams (11/8 ounces).

14. Re-loads will not be accepted in the final.

15. Cartridges will be on sale at the ground at cost.

16. Clay targets will be full orange colour.

17. Cost of entry for the final 300 targets will be published later but it will be kept to a minimum charge.

18. Rules are as prescribed by the I.S.U. (U.I.T.) and must be strictly adhered to. These rules are printed at the rear of the A.C.T.A. Shooting Rules Handbook marked "effective 1973".

19. Meals will be available at the grounds at a reasonable charge to all competitors.

20. Interpretation "round" in this instance is to be 100 consecutive targets in one day at an approved host club.

Final Selection of members of the Australian 1976 Olympic Shotgun Team


1. Team will be a maximum of 2 Trench and 2 Skeet.

4. Shoot Marshall is Referee, George Bremen.






UNPLATED

For many years manufacturers of .22 ammunition have been plating the bullet.

We believe this impaired the accuracy of the rifle by leaving a coating of plating on the inside of the barrel. The photographs above establish this point.

Although the coating that builds up on the inside of the barrel can be removed with a stiff bronze brush it is obviously more convenient for shooters if they don't have to clean the barrel to remove such build-up.

The photographs shown above were taken through a ballistic comparison microscope and show the

difference between the rifling groove in a plated and unplated bullet. Note how the groove in the unplated bullet is almost perfectly smooth whilst the groove in the plated bullet has a torn and pitted appearance. Is it reasonable to assume that the plated bullet has left some residue in the barrel? You be the judge, and in making your decision remember that every top grade accuracy cartridge sold in the world today is unplated.

Note: The two bullets shown in this photograph were fired in the same rifle and the same groove has been photographed.

On July 27, the Finley Gun Club conducted their Annual "Boomerang Shield Shoot" as advertised in News, July edition. Due to 163 shooters attending, we were unable to complete our programme; to those shooters we extend our apologies, although completely beyond our control.

Also, we wish to report that steps have been taken to extend our facilities and ensure that this problem does not occur again.

With the pressure on all day some interesting statistics to hand are: 6,700 clays in 455 minutes over two traps equal 14.72 clays thrown per minute or one clay every 8.15 seconds per trap and no breakdowns. Consumption rate was also rapid with 200 sausages, 100 chops, 196 pies and pasties, 128 hamburgers, 20 loaves of bread, 372 bottles of soft drink, as well as continuous soup and afternoon-tea all day.

AMATEUR RULES

A. The principles of amateurism, laid down in the declaration of the International Olympic Committee at its Congress of 1947 are valid for all members of the International Shooting Union.

B. Money prizes up to \$25U.S. or its equivalent are considered as a compensation for costs. If there is a shooting contest covering several days, money totalling \$100 or its equivalent within the same week are also considered a compensation for costs without detailed specification from the competitors. Money prizes exceding the above-mentioned sums must be given to the club to which the competitor belongs. The competitor may receive from his club only the sum corresponding to his actual costs, which may include:

1. Entrance Fees.

- 2. Ammunition.
- 3. Travelling expenses.
- Costs for meals and lodgings (in relation to the general level and normally not exceeding 10 dollars 4 or 3 pounds or 35 Swiss francs, etc., per day).
- C. This article applies to all categories of shooting supervised by the International Shooting Union.

D. An amateur should not be considered as:

- 1. Anyone who gives an exhibition in marksmanship for any pecuniary reward.
- 2. Anyone whose principal profession is test shooting of guns or ammunition. The operator of a test shooting machine is not necessarily included in this category.
- 3. Anyone who is a professional instructor in shooting.
- 4. Anyone who accepts money prizes in excess of those allowed according to the rules of amateurism.

E. Paragraphs D2 and 3 categories do not apply to a member of the armed forces, who acts as an instructor, if his work is solely educational and cannot be considered as coaching of shooters for competition.

F. The competitor should fulfil the qualifications of amateurism laid down by the National Olympic Committee of his country.

G. In judging the status as an amateur according to article D and E, the activities of the competitor during the past two years should be considered.




The club has almost completed a new facelift and considers its new standard to be one of the best in Australia.
