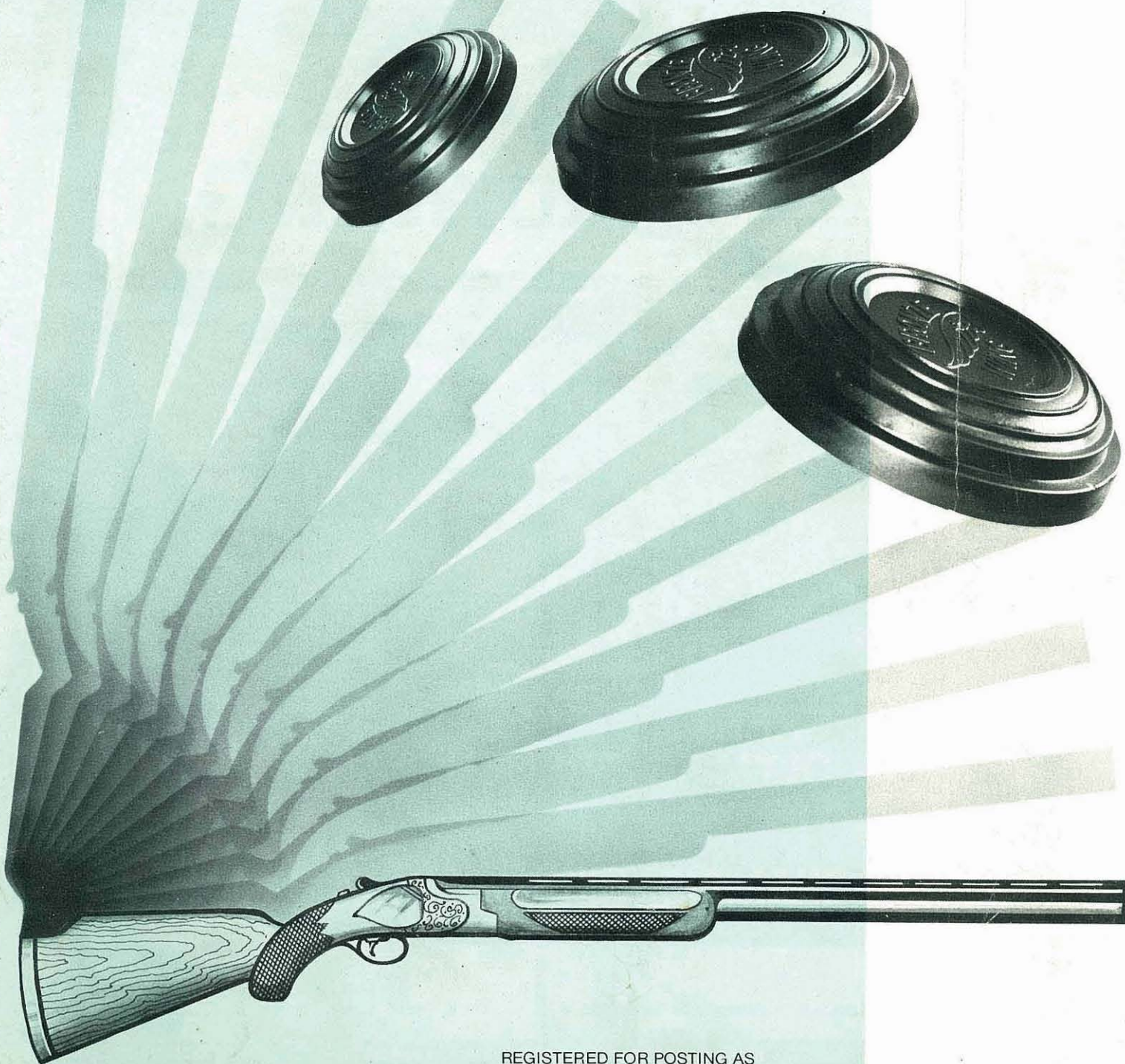

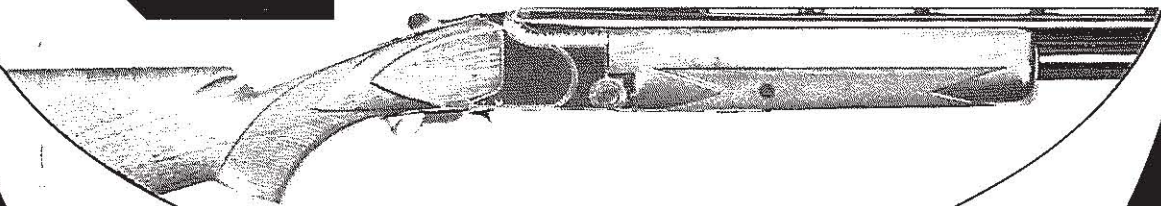

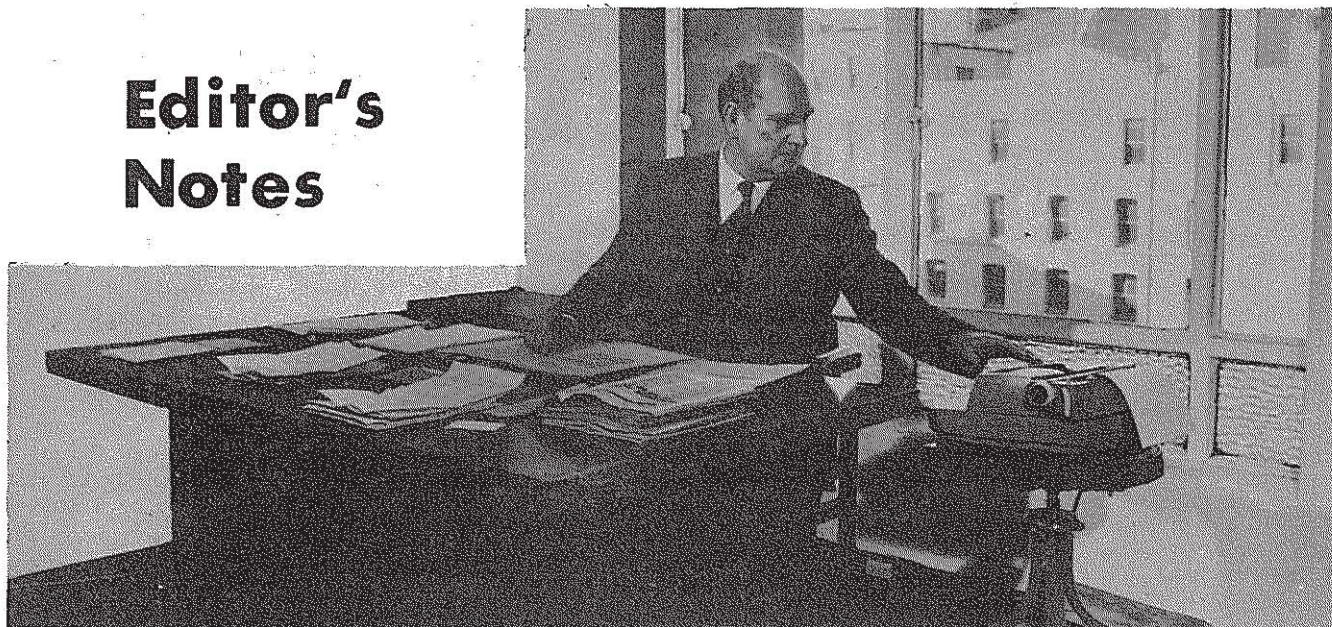

Editor's Notes



Have you arranged your accommodation in Perth, Western Australia, for the 1976 National Championships?

Some shooters have already made their arrangements with the organisers, as advertised, and some have contacted our travel agents, Ansett Airlines.

The accommodation capacity is in demand as several other national bodies are conducting conventions in Perth during the same period.

The 1976 National Championships are scheduled for:

Wednesday, February 25: Skeet over 5 layouts
Thursday, February 26: Double Rise
Friday, February 27: Grand Handicap
Saturday, February 28: Double Barrel
Sunday, February 29: Single Barrel
Monday, March 1: A.N.Z. (Points Decision)
Tuesday, March 2: International Trap Teams' Match followed by Champion of Champions.

In the State of New South Wales, a new Act has been proclaimed which requires:

1. all gun clubs must be approved by the N.S.W. police;
2. all gun clubs must be fenced for safety;
3. all gun clubs must provide a FOUR dimensional set of drawings of the club grounds;
4. a photograph of the grounds must be supplied, as witnessed by the police.

Thus, the attention of all member clubs in the State of New South Wales is drawn to "Act 38 of 1973" plus "Supplement 96 of Thursday, July 17, 1975". Clubs are recommended to make contact accordingly with the senior state police officer of their district.

Shooters are travellers and many clubs do not appear to realize that the regular attendance of club

members at shoots keeps a club in existence, but it is the attraction of visiting shooters which provides the advancement by additional events and the exchange of competition and information.

This aspect is applicable to all states and many are the letters and verbal requests for guidance and assistance received by A.C.T.A. office. There is no doubt that published notices achieve their aim.

STOP PRESS — more complete details will be published later, but, from the September 10, 1975 Executive Committee meeting in Melbourne, it has been decided that:

1. effective from NOW, the inward movement of one metre on re-registration is completely discontinued.

2. the rules will be published in November, 1975 A.C.T.A. Shooting News effective NOW and, as such, are to remain in force for a period of five years without alteration:

(NOTES: (i) the shooting rules will soon be produced in pocket-size rule books which will be then available as follows:-

(a) a free copy of the handbook to member clubs;

(b) a charge will be made to shooters seeking a personal copy of the rules handbook.

(ii) clubs will receive two copies of these shooting rules (as printed in November, 1975) with the suggestion that a set be placed permanently on club notice boards. Two sets are being distributed so that

He has seen many changes in the club during its years of operation from live birds to clays, then night shooting under lights, and finally, the introduction of an automatic electric trap.

All of these changes were introduced to the club by Bert and hard-working members. New Caledonia (Noumea) Championships

11th to 15th August, 1975

Twelve Australian shooters, accompanied by their wives in most cases travelled to Noumea and contested the following events.

Universal Trench (5 trap) — 150 tgt. teams event, 200 tgt. individual, 150 tgt. individual.

American Trench — (similar to Australian Continental) — 150 tgt. individual, 150 tgt. teams event.

ISU Skeet — 100 tgt. individual, 100 tgt. teams event.

The Australians present conducted an elimination on 100 targets at Trench. As there were 12 shooters the New Caledonian Club invited us to submit 3 teams of 4 shooters. At the completion of the eliminations the teams submitted were:

AUSTRALIA: Brian Lowry (Melbourne), Graham Ash (Frankston), Roy Garwood (Hobart) and Barry Nelis (Brisbane).

VICTORIA: Brian Mark (Sebastopol), Alex Bremner (Morwell), Tony Rowe (Australian) and Bill Stone (Australian).

MELBOURNE: Tom Lucas (Melbourne), Brian Flower (Melbourne), Gordon Nelis (Brisbane) and Stan Rentsch (Hamilton).

At the completion of this event the individual championships over 200 targets saw the local champion Jaques Bareth (remembered from our Nationals in Launceston) win the gold medal with a score of 183:200. Tony Rowe from Australian was silver medalist with 181:200 and the bronze medal went to Merv Pratt of New Zealand 178:200 (who had won the 1975 Australian Grand Handicap at Launceston).

The Teams Championship also went to New Caledonia with a total of 528:600. Victoria won the silver medal only 3 points behind on 525:600 and Australia won the bronze with a total of 509:600.

In conjunction with this event was a 150 tgt. Graded Championship for visiting shooters.

A Grade went to Tony Rowe (Aust.) 138:150 from Merv Pratt (NZ) 135:150 and Bill Stone (Aust.) 132:150.

B Grade winner was Barry Nelis (Aust.) 123:150. from Tony Paysic (PNG) 119:150 and Brian Flower (Aust.) 118:150.

C Grade went to David Welch (NZ) 115:150 from Jim Vowles (NZ) 108:150 and Bob Stuart (PNG) 107:150.

The Continental Trap Championship over 150 targets again saw local champion Bareth clear away from the field and record a perfect score of 150:150 and win the gold medal from Barry Nelis 147:150 and Dupuy (New Caledonia) 145:150. Mark, Ash, Lowry

and Stone all finished in equal 4th position on 144:150.

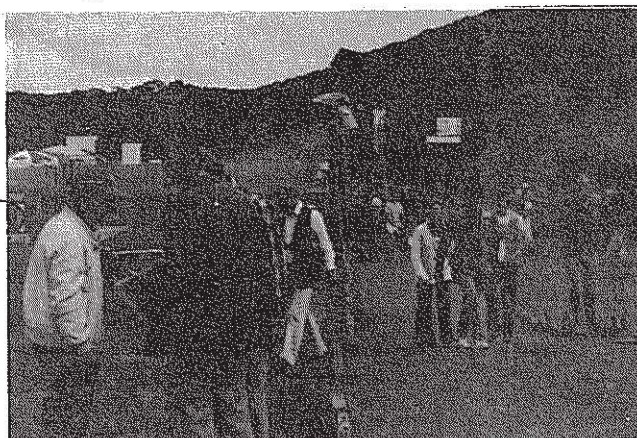
The Teams' Championship on this event again saw New Caledonia win the gold medals with a score of 574:600 from Victoria with a score of 572:600.

The ISU Skeet event of 100 targets saw Graham Webber of New Zealand score 91:100 and win the gold medal from a namesake from New Zealand in Brian Webber 90:100 and Carey from New Caledonia 89:100.

New Zealand also won the Skeet Teams' Championship from New Caledonia.

Australia was represented in the Skeet Teams by Gordon and Barry Nelis, Alex Bremner and Roy Charwood.

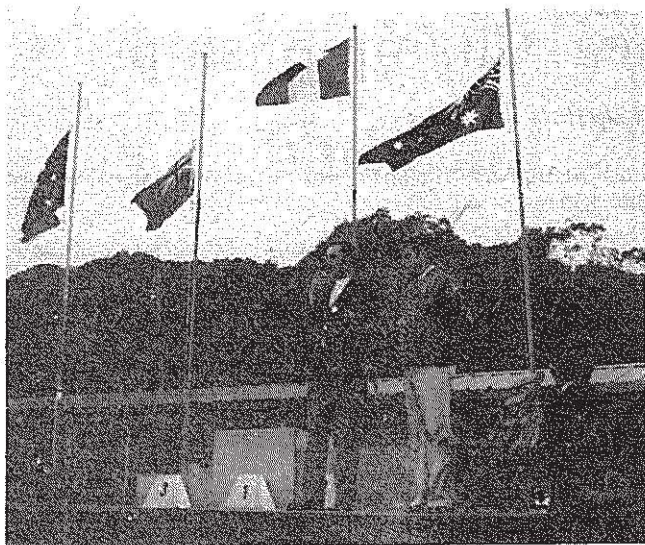

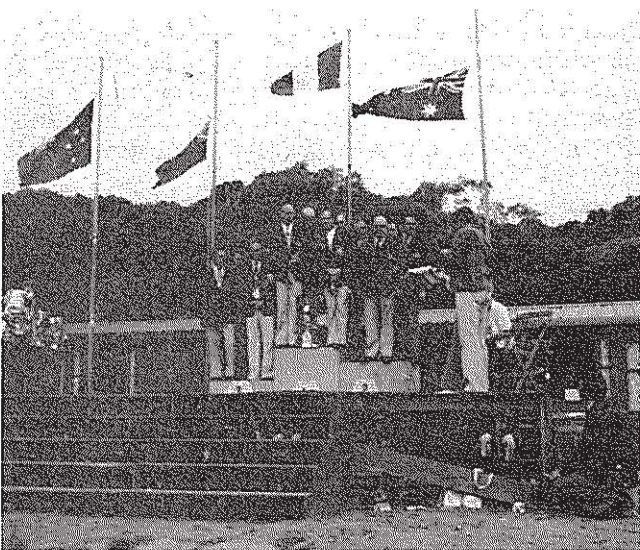
Showing how they carved the Gun Club out of the hill — also the referee and score's box with scoreboard around the top deck and gun racks below.



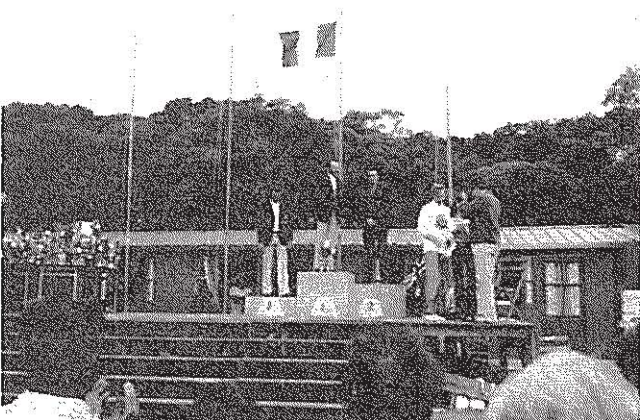

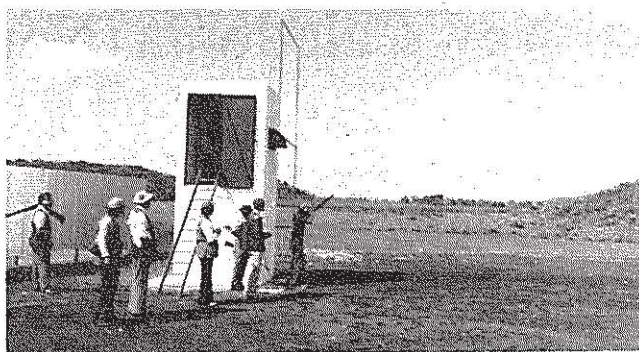
Brian Mark thanking the New Caledonian Club and shooters for their hospitality (standing with Brian is Alan Brousse De La Board).



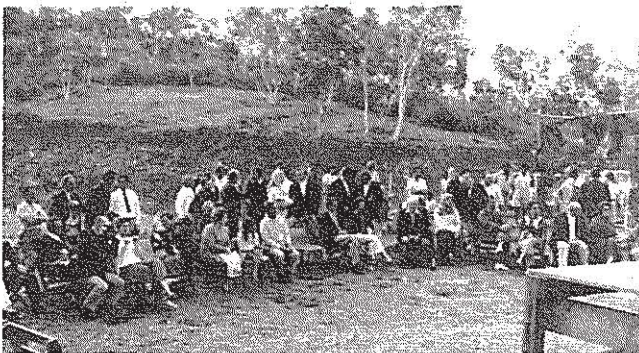

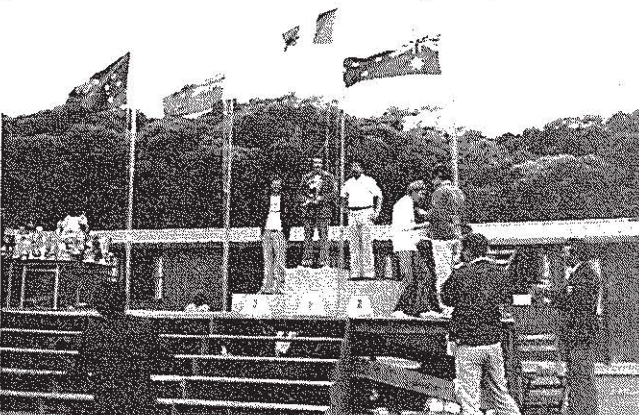

Bird, game and migratory bird regulations in Canada

(With acknowledgments to Lance G. Sim previously of New South Wales but latterly of Edmonton, Alberta, the following information is an extract by A.C.T.A. Secretary from various documentary pamphlets supplied.)

A resident

"Resident" means a person who makes his home and is ordinarily present in Alberta and

(i) Who has resided in Canada for the 12 month period immediately prior to the date of his application for a licence or permit, or

(ii) who has not resided in Canada for the 12 month period immediately prior to the date of his application but is a Canadian citizen domiciled in Alberta, but does not include a tourist, transient or visitor to Alberta.

A non-resident

"Non-Resident" means a person who is not a resident but who makes his home and is ordinarily present in Canada and who has resided in Canada for the 12 month period immediately prior to the date of his application.

"Non-Resident Alien" means any person who is neither a resident nor a non-resident.

Note those sections on important changes and exporting.

Licence fees

WILDLIFE CERTIFICATE (Resident, Non-Resident and Non-Resident Alien) \$3.00. No person shall hunt big game or bird game without a valid and subsisting Wildlife Certificate and a Resources Development Stamp.

Resource Development Stamp Fee \$1.00

Non-Resident and Non-Resident alien

Bird Game (Canadian) \$5.00
Bird Game (Alien)..... 50.00
Bird Game 2.50

It is unlawful for any person to attempt to obtain, have in his possession or make application for more than one of each type of licence in any one year.

Archery licence

All residents and non-residents \$3.00

Archery licences available from Fish and Wildlife offices only.

Lost certificates and licences

A person who loses a licence or a Wildlife Certificate and who proves to the satisfaction of a wildlife officer that the loss was inadvertent, may obtain a substitute certificate from the wildlife officer upon payment to him of the prescribed fee.

Note: Duplicate tags and replacement licences are available only from an office of the Fish and Wildlife Division and are not available from other licence or permit vendors.

Important

Both a Provincial Bird Game Licence and a Canada Migratory Game Bird Hunting Permit are required to hunt waterfowl. (Canada Migratory Game Bird Hunting Permits are obtainable at Post Offices only).

Licence qualifications

A person who has not attained his 14th birthday shall not, either directly or indirectly, apply for or in any way obtain or have in his possession a licence or permit.

A person who has not attained his 16th birthday shall not hunt unless

(a) he is the holder of a licence authorising him to do so where a licence is required by this Act or the regulations, and

(b) he is accompanied by his parent or legal guardian or by a person 18 years of age or over who is so authorised in writing by the parent or legal guardian.

Privately owned land and hunting privileges

"Occupied lands" means:

(a) privately owned lands under cultivation or enclosed by a fence of any kind and not exceeding one section in area upon which the owner or occupant actually resides, and

(b) any other privately owned land which is within one mile of the section referred to in clause (a) and which is owned or leased by the same owner or occupant.

No person shall hunt any wildlife upon or over occupied lands or enter upon such lands for the purpose of doing so, without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof.

Prohibitions

It is unlawful to:

Hunt upland game birds in some wildlife management units without being clothed in scarlet or blaze orange.

Allow another person to use or carry your wildlife certificates, licence or tags.

Carry or have loaded firearm in or on any kind of

vehicle. (No live ammunition can be carried in the breech or chamber.)

Discharge any firearm along or across any highway marked with route number signs.

Discharge a firearm from any vehicle, aircraft or powered boat.

Discharge a firearm within 200 yards, or cause a projectile to pass within 200 yards of any occupied building.

Remove all distinctive evidence of sex and/or species from the carcass of any game until transportation to home or locker plant has been completed.

Hunt any wildlife between one half hour after sunset and one half hour before sunrise.

Hunt using a shotgun in which the magazine and chamber combined will hold more than three rounds of ammunition.

Kill or hunt any migratory game with a firearm loaded with a single bullet.

Use crossbows for hunting.

Use or possess arrows less than 24 inches in length or barbed arrow points.

No person shall chase, molest, injure or kill any wildlife with an all-terrain vehicle.

Important regulation changes for the year

(N.B. This is not a resume of all changes in the regulations for this year.)

Wilderness areas

Three wilderness areas have been created in the mountain regions of the Province. These are WMU's S411, S423, S431. There is no hunting or fishing permitted in these areas.

Sheep River Wildlife Sanctuary

A new wildlife sanctuary has been created in WMU S406. Sportsmen in this WMU are urged to exercise care.

Important firearm restriction

The Wildlife Act has been amended and now provides for restrictions in the use of firearms on private land and along roads.

Section 20(2) of the Wildlife Act now reads: No person shall hunt any wildlife *or discharge any firearm* upon or over occupied lands or enter upon such lands for the purpose of doing so, without the consent of the owner or occupant thereof.

Section 25(5.1) of the Wildlife Act now reads: No person shall

(a) discharge a firearm from, or

(b) cause a projectile from a firearm to pass along or across,

a developed road allowance in any country or Municipal district *unless he is hunting game birds with a shotgun under the authority of a game bird licence issuer pursuant to this Act or the regulations.*

Wildlife and bird sanctuaries

Hunting, trapping and killing wildlife is prohibited at all times. (NOTE: each named area is followed by the WMU number in which it is situated.)

Protected wildlife areas

Subject to the Game Hunting Regulations the hunting or killing of any bird game is prohibited on the following described lakes or over any island in said lakes or within one-half mile of the edge of the waters of the lakes until November 1st.

(Exception — Ministik Lake which is a migratory waterfowl sanctuary and bird hunting is not permitted.)

Rivers

Hunting within 100 yards of the edge of the waters of the Smoky, Little Smoky, Peace, South Saskatchewan, Red Deer, Bow and Old Man Rivers is prohibited, subject to Game Hunting Regulations until November 1st.

Bow and arrow hunting

The holder of a licence to hunt bird game and an Archery Licence may use a bow and arrow for the hunting or killing of bird game during open hunting

seasons anywhere in the Province where bird game hunting is allowed.

Note: Archers require an Archery Licence in addition to any other licences to hunt.

Any bow so used shall have a draw weight of not less than 40 pounds, this being the number of pounds pull required to draw a 28-inch arrow to its head, and capable of projecting an arrow 150 yards.

Any arrow so used shall be tipped with either a sharp broadhead point of not less than one inch in width or a sharp bodkin-type three-bladed point.

Wildlife damage fund

Land owners who suffer damage to crops by wildlife may make application for compensation directly to the Hail Insurance Board. Contact your local Hail Insurance Board Agent. Livestock owners who suffer losses must file a report of loss to the RCMP. Report loss immediately.

Sportsmen — your bucks at work

Wildlife improvement projects under the "Buck for Wildlife" program which was introduced by the Minister of Lands and Forests last year are now underway in the following localities: Upland game birds habitat WMU's G106, G108, G112, G130, G152, P206 and P240. Waterfowl habitat in WMU's F348, G108, P206, P218, P221 and P240.

Deer habitat WMU's P240 and P258. Elk habitat in WMU's S404 and S406. Moose habitat in WMU's F318, F346, F348, F354 and S417. Sheep habitat in WMU's S406. For more information write to the Fish and Wildlife Division, Edmonton.

Unprotected birds

Any resident may hunt, trap or kill on land to which he has the right of access any starling, crow, English sparrow, magpie or blackbird.

All hawks, owls, falcons and eagles are protected by law.

A non-resident Canadian who holds a non-resident Canadian Bird Licence may hunt game birds.

A non-resident alien who holds a non-resident alien bird game licence may hunt game birds.

Exporting big game and game birds

It is unlawful to export in any way any big game animal or game bird or part thereof beyond the boundaries of Alberta without having first obtained an Export Permit. These permits are issued free of charge and may upon completion of an export application be obtained at any Fish and Wildlife office during regular office hours, Monday to Friday, and from some border locations.

The holder of a game bird licence may be issued an export permit for game birds lawfully killed under the authority of such licence provided, (a) that the total aggregate in any year of all upland game birds shall

not exceed 65 but no more than nine of such aggregate total shall be ring-necked pheasants. (b) that the number of migratory game birds do not exceed in any year the declared possession limit.

No export permit for game birds or trophy sheep shall be issued after expiration of 5 days after the close of a season for the species applied for.

No person shall destroy the evidence of sex or species of any game bird until it has been conveyed to his residence or cleared by a wildlife officer.

Leave the wings and head with feathers attached to the carcasses of migratory game birds. Leave the wings attached on upland game birds.

Code of ethics for the hunter

Obey the game laws

Be careful with your gun

Do not be selfish

Never shoot across your partner

Retrieve crippled and wounded wildlife

Try to improve your marksmanship

When meeting a hunter always unload your gun

Take care of your game

Be a gentleman sportsman

Respect the farmer's animals and property

Do not lean a loaded firearm against a tree, stump or building

Always unload a firearm before putting it in the car.

Wildlife damage protection

No insurance policy — no premiums required to provide wildlife damage protection.

1. Wildlife damage compensation can be claimed for damage done by Antelope, Bear, Deer, Ducks, Elk, Geese or Sandhill Cranes.

2. Crops covered by wildlife damage fund are, wheat, oats, barley, flax, rye, field peas, buckwheat and rape and grasses, clover or field corn grown for seed, whether such crops are standing in or swath or in sheaves, either on the ground or in stocks, but not crops in stack or granaries. Neither does it include grazing lands.

3. Maximum compensation — \$25.00 per acre against damage done by wildlife (Sec. 1) on crops described in Section 3.

If you sustain damage from wildlife (Sec. 1) on crops covered in Section 3, proceed as follows:—

(a) Obtain a damage claim from your nearest Alberta Hail Insurance Board Agent. (There are 500 agents in the Province, included in them are Treasury Branches.)

(b) Register your claim on the form he will provide.

(c) Pay the Agent \$25.00 adjustment fee.

(d) Do not harvest your crop until an Insurance Adjuster makes an appraisal of damage.

Note: Loss claims will be paid from a fund developed by the Wildlife Certificate. All licensed

hunters pay the \$3.00 fee as a base for all big game and bird game hunting. This contribution is made for the benefit of farmers sustaining losses from wildlife.

Livestock owners who suffer losses by livestock being shot must file a report of loss to the RCMP. Report loss immediately.

* * *

- In the Province of Alberta migratory game birds lawfully killed may be possessed from the time when they are killed until March 31 next following. The onus of proof that migratory game birds were lawfully killed is on the person who has them in possession.

Other shooting restrictions

- No person shall use a shotgun of any kind capable of holding more than three shells in the magazine and chamber combined; a swivel gun; a machine gun; a battery of guns; a rifle, or shotgun shells loaded with a single bullet; or any weapon other than a long bow and arrow or a shotgun not larger than number 10 gauge.
- No person shall use an aircraft, a sail-boat, a night light, live birds as decoys, mechanically or electrically operated calling devices.
- No person shall hunt within one quarter mile of any area baited with grain or other food.
- No person who possesses birds under permit shall keep or allow such birds to approach within one quarter mile of an area where waterfowl hunting is taking place.
- No person shall shoot migratory game birds from a motor vehicle or wheeled vehicle or from any vehicle to which a draught animal is attached.
- No person shall use a boat, aircraft or motor vehicle to disturb birds with the object of driving them towards a hunter.
- No person shall, while hunting migratory game

birds, have with him, for his own use more than one shotgun at any time unless each shotgun in excess of one is disassembled or unloaded and cased.

- No person shall shoot migratory game birds earlier than one half hour before sunrise or later than one half hour after sunset.

Miscellaneous regulations

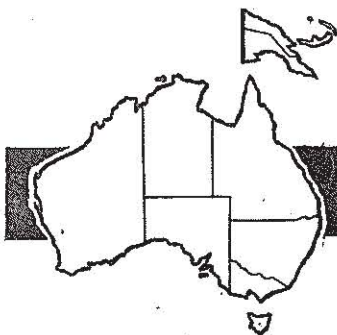
- No person shall possess or transport a migratory game bird unless at least one wing and the plumage thereof remains attached to the bird. Such a wing and plumage may be removed
 - (a) when the bird is prepared for immediate cooking, or
 - (b) after the bird is taken to the residence of the owner for preservation.
- No person shall kill, cripple or wound a migratory game bird without making all reasonable effort to retrieve the bird and include it in his daily bag limit. Immediately upon retrieving it, the bird shall be killed and included in his daily bag limit.
- No person shall hunt migratory birds during any day after he has taken his bag limit.
- No person shall hunt, kill or molest a migratory bird at any time throughout the year except during the open season as described in the schedule.
- No person shall take, injure or destroy the eggs or nests of migratory birds at any time.
- No person shall buy or sell migratory birds or their eggs or nests.
- No person shall waste or wantonly dispose of a migratory game bird killed or retrieved by him or in his possession.

Provincial regulations

- Hunters of migratory game birds are advised to check provincial regulations for additional restrictions.

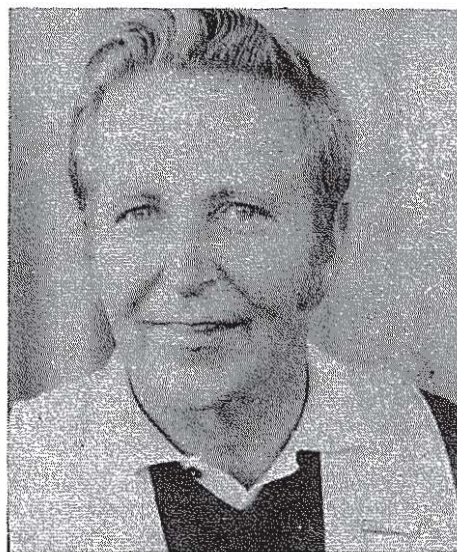
