





SECRETARY'S NOTES

What a let-down to revert to a two-color cover in this issue of C.T.S.N. However, we were delighted with the response to our May issue — advertisers also reported a very good response and

this is encouraging.

The gloss is taken off the "happy feeling" by the tremendous amount of media pressure being placed on our sport, especially in New South Wales and Victoria. In both States, the Chief Secretary has made a statement in which the claim is made that amendments to the Firearms Act will be considered in an attempt to "close the existing loopholes"! The question which really requires an answer is "Where is the existing legislation breaking down?"

We don't deny that there is a community problem involving the mis-use of firearms - but it is a people problem, not a gun problem. We are all shocked at the fatal shooting of a policeman in New South Wales recently - but the question is, would that crime have been prevented by more stringent controls? I sug-

gest the answer is NO!

Why is it that these waves of public hysteria don't swamp us every time there is a fatal traffic accident? Simply because the motor car is socially acceptable and doesn't attract the stigma that firearms seem to do. The message here seems to be to get more strength into our shooting Associations. In this respect we make another plea to all our members to encourage their shooting friends to take out membership with one of the many shooting or hunting organisations. The A.C.T.A. office will be pleased to offer assistance in this regard. Furthermore, we need to develop better training programs for the younger people in the com-munity. We should aim to train every youngster to respect firearms, and handle them safely and responsibly.

But the most immediate need is to encourage Magistrates and Judges to adopt a tougher attitude on penalties. No responsible firearms user has need to fear harsh penalties - on the other hand, we will reap many benefits from working to ensure that the user of firearms whose activities result in a breach of the law should suffer a heavy penalty. In these inflationary times, a \$10 or \$20 monetary penalty is of no significance at all - so let's all push for harsher penalties to be applied to those who bring our sport

into disrepute.

LEGISLATION MOVES IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA

There is currently a great amount of legislative activity in the three South Eastern mainland States. The South Australian Parliament passed a new Firearms Act during its Autumn sitting. One of the major grounds for concern is that a large part of the operative details of the Act have been left to regulation. The worry here is that regulations can be changed much more easily than Statutes. Furthermore, it is made unnecessarily difficult from a shooter education point of view by having to disseminate information relating to an Act as well as regulations.

MEDIA ATTACKS

It is becoming the policy of the A.C.T.A. to respond to some of the attacks levelled at hunters and shooters through the media. The response takes the form of a low key request for further details, or alternatively puts the A.C.T.A. viewpoint. Because of the geographic location of the National Office it is logical that most of this type of activity will be restricted to Victoria. We are therefore seeking members help in identification of any such media problems in other States (remember, accuracy in your report is vitally important) to enable our "response policy" to be

CHANGES OF ADDRESS

The Administrative Staff are most encouraged by the dramatic improvement which has occurred in advice of changes of address. A true indication of the effect of the improvement can be taken from the fact that in October 1976, we were regularly receiving large quantities of CTSN returned marked "left address". Following distribution of the May issue, we have had only eight copies returned.

READERS' CONTRIBUTIONS

Elsewhere in this issue, we have published two reports on the New Zealand Nationals. Normally, we try to avoid duplication. but in this instance, both reports contain information of interest so "in they went". We are grateful to Bob Wilson and "Barney" Rooke for their literary efforts.

REGISTRATION CARDS

It is most rewarding to see the renewed interest at Club level regarding the presentation of current handicap cards by shooters when nominating. Some Clubs have been of great assistance in helping to resolve problems relating to unfinancial members — the results prove the value of this exercise. Too many Club Committees seem to feel that a competitor will take offence if asked to produce a card - in fact the reverse is the case, so let's get rid of the woolly thinking and make full use of current membership cards. We will play our part by issuing new or duplicate cards promptly - requests for duplicate cards should come through a Club Secretary - please note that there is no charge for a duplicate card.

Talking about the enthusiasm of some Club Secretaries, we received a handicap report recently from a major Club which showed a prominent Victorian shooter with a revised handicap

mark of 26 metres!



TRAPSHOOTING WITH ELGIN GATES



Any trapshooter with a fair amount of experience, knows that targets will vary from one field to another and from trap to trap. There are subtle differences in the flight of targets even with perfect conditions. With wind and other weather variations the differences are compounded.

I used to think that one of the secrets of successful trapshooting was to find a certain zone or spot in which to shoot the target, reasoning that if I could "zero-in" there and practise until I perfected my move, it would then be only a matter of making the same shot at all targets all the time, at any and all fields and traps. How naive!

I soon abandoned this idea with the realisation that each trap and field is different and the targets likewise. Not radically so, but still different.

What I prefer to do now, is to stand behind the trap on which I am going to shoot and watch ten or fifteen targets thrown for the squad ahead. This gives me a chance to study the height and angles, to check the height of the traphouse, whether the left or right angles are higher or lower than the other side, to see how far to the left and right of the centre of the traphouse the maximum angles appear. If, for example, the trap is set near the front of the house, the targets will appear two or three feet to the left or right of centre, but if the trap is set farther back inside the house, they will appear near each corner, a spread of seven or eight feet. And I've even shot over traphouses where the extreme right and left angles appeared at the side of the house.

The point is, know what you are going to be shooting at before walking out on the track for a championship event and suddenly miss two or three before realising they are different targets than the last trap or different from those you shot last week in another town.

Time and again I've seen top shooters shoot possibles on say, trap one and two, then walk out on trap three assuming the targets will be exactly the same as on trap one and two; and miss one or two before realising the truth. I've done it myself.

If possible, study the targets coming out of each trap before shooting on it. If you can't, then watch the targets closely when your own squad begins to shoot. If you are on position one, as I often am, and haven't had a chance to see the targets, you must be particularly alert and mentally ready for anything that comes out.

In more simple terms, you are shooting targets one at a time. Ask yourself if you can break *one* target. If the answer is affirmative, then do it again, whether the event is five, ten, twenty or fifty targets. Each one is an event all by itself. Each one can be the winning target — and often is!

the winning target — and often is!
In reality, trapshooting is a game of one target, especially in the championship events. The winner breaks one more target than the rest, and in a shoot-off the game is the same. The eventual winner breaks one more than the rest of the competitors — and one at a time!

Now let's go back to studying the targets before shooting them and bring in factors such as wind. A stiff wind from behind, flattens out and knocks them down quickly. This is where the high gun shooter has a particular advantage. Instead of doing what would seem to be the natural thing by holding an even lower gun to compensate for the lower targets, I hold a higher gun than normal. Why? Because I want to have the gun up and waiting where the wind starts to flatten the targets and I shoot them at that point with little or no upward movement of the gun. By holding a low gun under these conditions you instinctively start up after the target with a normal move, and momentum—as mentioned in the last column—takes you over the target in spite of your best intentions.

By the same token, the only time I shoot a low gun at "down the line" trap is when there is a strong incoming wind, taking the targets high. I know it sounds just the opposite of what should be logical; a high gun for low targets and a low gun for high targets.


The idea of the low gun for high targets is to get on the target as soon as it clears the traphouse and ride it up to match its speed before firing.

Try these moves on the practise trap some day when the wind is blowing. It may work for you. Whatever the circumstances, try to study a few targets coming out of each trap you are going to shoot over. It will pay dividends.

JUNIOR TRAINING

Anthony Morgan, a member of the Corio Bay Gun Club, has been shooting for four years, and recently had his first success in adult competition. At Geelong last December, four weeks after his four-teenth birthday, he won a skeet handicap shooting 32-38 to take out the event.

Anthony has been doing most of his shooting with the V.F.&G.A. and last year attended a coaching course run by the Geelong branch of the F.&G. Association and assisted by J. Newton Thomas. His shooting performances have improved markedly as a result,





1977 INTER SERVICES TRAP SHOOTING COMPETITION


- 1. The annual trap shooting competition between the three armed services for the IMI Shield was held on Wednesday 9th March 1977. The Army was the host service for the inter-service sports this year and consequently the event was held at the Puckapunyal Area Army Gun Club.
- Weather conditions for the entire day were near perfect for shooting, the grounds were in excellent condition and the refreshments and catering arrangements were enjoyed by all who were fortunate enough to be present.

The practice shooting by all competitors before lunch, gave little indication of the strengths, or weaknesses, of the respective teams, but it must be admitted that competitors, officials and spectators did not anticipate the tense struggle which developed as the competition progressed. Who could have expected a repetition of the 1976 event at HMAS Cerberus, when Army won by one after each team had shot at 90 targets.


The first round commenced with all three members of the first squad returning a perfect score, then in the second squad Navy were unfortunate with two lost targets. The squads to follow to the end of the first round resulted in Navy losing nine more targets, Army two and Air Force two so the round ended with the scores Navy 19, Army 28, Air 28.

At this time the indications were that the finish was going to be close and indeed it was with the lead changing during the second round. The first two Army and Air Squads shot perfect scores then Air dropped a target in the third squad, Army one in front. The fourth squad shot all five targets then the fifth squad saw the scores level with Army dropping two targets and Air Force 1. Army dropped two more targets in the last squad and the scores at the completion of the second round were Navy 38, Army 54 and Air 56.

The last round commenced with the competitors really under pressure, Army determined to whittle down the Air Force lead and Air just as determined to hang on. The first squad again returned a clean sheet whilst the second squad was not so profi-

cient, Navy lost another four targets, Army a clean score and Air lost one target; Air Force now led by one target. The third squad saw Navy break all five targets whilst Army and Air both lost one target. The fourth squad lined up and Navy lost one target and Army and Air finished with clean sheets. The last two squads broke all targets and the scores at the conclusion of the event were Navy 63, Army 83 and Air Force 84.

The competition ended, as did the 1976 event, in a very tense atmosphere and created tremendous interest and excitement amongst the many spectators and supporters of each Service team. These tense and close finishes we have witnessed the last two series are great for competition but no good for the nerves.

Air Force won the competition by one target and now hold the IMI Shield for the next 12 months when they will be called upon to defend it on their "home ground" at Point Cook during March 1978.


At the conclusion of the teams event, the shoot-off to decide the "High Gun" commenced. Four shooters had a perfect score and, in order of shooting, were Able Seaman M. McKean (Navy), Sergeant A. Chandler (Air), Corporal E. Johnson (Army) and Squadron Leader E. Fowler (Air). The shoot-off was conducted under "miss" and "out" and the first to go was Fowler, to be followed one target later by McKean. Chandler and Johnson then continued on until Johnson missed his 30th target, Chandler having already broken his target took the "High Gun" title with the excellent score of 30-30.

The last event on the program was a 10-target invitation shoot which was open to competitors, officials and spectators. Several participants broke all 10 targets including Sergeant Alan Chandler. However Chandler missed his first target in the shootoff and finished off the day with the excellent score of 40-41 after breaking 37 targets before he had to "pull a second", a fine effort from a shooter who has been most consistent for many years. 

The caption for this column has been altered, because, as our sport develops, and as the overseas connections of the Australian Clay Target Association extend so further opportunities to compete in American Skeet and D.T.L. events occur - this means that the column is no longer exclusively for ISU type events.

To provide substantiation for the change, let us talk about the 1978 Grand American at Vandalia in U.S.A. Whilst in New Zealand recently "Barney" Rooke of Wagga had exploratory talks with American officials in an attempt to overcome the handicap barriers which face Australian shooters who visit America. The present thinking is that three of four venues should be chosen where Australian shooters who intend to visit the Grand American can shoot a minimum of 500 registered targets over traps set to American specifications. The idea is still in the embryo stage but it does have some value. More news will be published when it becomes available. Meanwhile, any shooters interested could advise the National Secretary, to enable some assessment to be made of the level of interest.

The Antibes scene is developing, with the final qualifying round for skeet being completed at Melbourne Gun Club on May 14th and 15th. The Trench final qualifying round will be held at the same Club over the weekend of June 18th and 19th. Melbourne Gun Club Committee has also arranged a fund raising exercise which it is hoped will raise a worthwhile sum of money. Further enquiries can be made either direct to the Club or through the National Office.


a score of 15-16 took home the 'C' grade trophy.

Sir,-

The headline "Every one is a killer" is certainly eye-catching which I guess was the whole idea, but it should also cover cars fists, feet, picket fences, knives and so on. These are all lethal ir the wrong hands.

That Mr Wilkinson is now "licensed to kill" I find rather disconcerting. When I purchased my permit (for use in clay target shooting), the thought of killing someone did not enter my head.

I think he should also know that pigeons are not legal game. A \$2 permit does not make a gunman. Surely this is ruled by the mentality of the offender. I cannot imagine someone who wishes to kill going to a police station to obtain a permit before committing a crime.

I think the problem goes much deeper than is reported in the article.

I think one answer is to have stricter penalties for the people who have been convicted or are charged with crimes of violence, not necessarily connected with firearms.

I have been a member of a clay target gun club for about eight months now and have found all the members of that club and others I have visited - people with permits and who own firearms - have no interest in violence.

We are there for sport, and I do not like to be bracketed with people who are "licensed to kill". We are trained to be very safety-conscious and rules are very strict.

Mr Wilkinson, as one who is quoted in a widely read publication, should not make such sweeping and exaggerated statements.

RELOADING -**Questions and Answers!**

We recently received a series of questions on reloading from Jim Draper of Wodonga. We submitted the questions to lan Cook, Manager of Sporting Division of IMI Aust. Ltd.

The results are reproduced below. Ian has kindly offered his services on a regular basis to answer technical questions, provided that he is NOT asked to make competitive comparisons. This is a great chance to get answers to those questions on ammo. and reloading which have been baffling you for years.

Q. Is it possible that different batches of the same type can be of different density?

A. Yes, it is possible that different batches (blends) of the same powder type will throw different weights from the same powder bush. However, these differences would not have a significant effect on ballistics.

Q. Since reloading presses deliver powder by volume and not by weight, how does the manufacturer ensure that his various batches of the same type will perform as advertised? eg. x grams of z powder from a certain bush size will produce y FPs behind 32 gram of shot.

A. Reloading powder is "blended" from several smaller batches of powder. Nobel Shotgun Powders, for instance, are made by blending about 6 by 1000lb batches to produce a blend of 6000lbs. By careful selection of the six different batches the manufacturer can produce a powder with the desired density and ballistic performance.

Q. Does shot shell powder kept for any length of time

change its characteristics?

- Nobel Shotgun Powders, and indeed all Nobel Powders are heat tested by the State Government Explosives Department at 160°F (71°C) for one hour before they are passed for use in this country. They can be rejected if they show any signs of decomposition — for the record, we have never had one batch rejected. Storage at higher temperatures - which would be regarded as completely abnormal - may cause the powder to decompose. Ideal conditions for storage are 70°F (20°C) and 65% Relative Humidity, and under these conditions the powder should be stable for many years.
- Q. Can the powder become drier or moister, or more fiery when kept for any length of time, even under ideal storage conditions?
- A. Modern powders are relatively stable under most normal conditions of storage which would be experienced in Australia. We would not regard storage in the sun at Marble Bar as being normal, but storage inside a house or reasonably ventilated garage or workship would be quite satisfactory. The main enemies of powder are water, oil or grease.

Q. What are the main factors which influence uniformity and effectiveness of shot pattern at say 32 metres (35 yards) in breaking clays?

Hardness and sphericity, with hardness being of the most importance. The harder the shot, the tigher the patterns.

STOP PRESS

It is now known that the letter reprinted in the adjacent column was written by a woman. This is further evidence of the strength which our sport can gain from attracting new members, including as many girls as possible.

At the risk of harping, we draw to our members' attention once more that our sport, and the interests of firearm users generally, is under greater pressure from legislators today than at any previous time in our history.

The situation has been reached where shooting and hunting interests need to be publicly promoted. To be effective, such a promotion must emphasise the "responsibility" side of activities, we need to identify the 5% of firearms users who are bringing the rest of us into disrepute.

Our objectives in any publicity campaign could be defined broadly as:

- (a) Liaise with legislators to ensure the fairest possible deal for responsible firearms users.
- (b) Develop a greater awareness amongst firearms users of their need to become members of one of the Shooting Associations.
- (c) Educate the general public to accept shooting hunting as an enjoyable, fun-filled healthy outdoor recreation. Intelligently worded letters to the media will help!

FIELD & GAME ASSOC. SHARES A COMMON PROBLEM

The concern being felt within the ACTA regarding the antiattitude being shown by the media generally is reflected in the following statement which appeared in a Field & Game magazine when the Cape Barren Geese controvery was at its' height. There is a lot of sense in Jeff, Latch's statement...

A PERSONAL VIEW

(by Jeff Latch, Pres. Pt Phillip Region, Victorian Field & Game Association).

The recent culling of the Cape Barren geese on Flinders Island resulted in the news media undertaking an inflammatory campaign against hunting and game management principles, to a degree that has rarely been surpassed in its complete disregard of the facts and taken to a stage that borders on dishonesty.

The management principles on which the decision to cull the flocks was based and the evidence as to why the management project became necessary was adequately and fully explained by by Dr. Dorwood, Associate Professor of Zoology, Monash University, and Mr N. Batt (Minister administering the National Parks and Wildlife Act, Tasmania) and supported by most if not all authority conservation bodies.

Reservations were held by some as to whether hunters would be the best available means to implement the culling and suggestions were seriously made that game management staff could best perform this task.

Predictably, all of the superficial, and presumably vegetarian conservationists, newspapers and anybody else who wouldn't know a goose from a galah seized on this suggestion and em-

barked on the great witch hunt. Once again, reason was discarded in favour of the sentimental and comfortable approach to killing. Reason would tell us that people who hunt to shoot moving winged quarry would be more efficient at the task than people who don't. However, as previously stated, reason was discarded and we find that some selfstyled naturalists and others have somehow magically endowed game management staff with an ability to hunt and shoot better than those who have pursued game since boyhood. This ability to juxtapose and do mental flip flops appears to be endemic amongst a number of naturalists and conservationists who seem unwilling or unable to face the facts of life and/or death that their reputed study of nature should have taught them, or are they simply afraid of uninformed public opinion and instead of being honest to the science they purport to follow simply allow themselves to be browbeaten by sentimentalists and so take the least line of resistance to achieve a given end?

Perhaps such an opinion could be considered harsh when weighed against the pressures brought to bear by the verbal and visual traffickers of "news" who mounted such a blatantly prejudiced campaign against those who take pride in the ethical and legal pursuit of game. However, this seems a flimsy reason upon which a firmly based principle should be discarded.

What other conclusion can be reached when sections of the informed community publicly decry hunting when for many years controlled hunting has been acknowledged as a cheap (to the community at large), selective instrument of game management in most countries of the world.

It is an affront to my dignity as a man and as a member of the society of human animals to which we all belong, for people who have chosen other means of physical, intellectual and aesthetic stimulation who seek to impose their trendy views to divorce me from my heritage of the land, its fauna and the natural world of nature that was first disclosed to me as a boy when rabbiting with my parent.

For those possibly well meaning but misguided conservationists who cannot understand such feelings and who believe that controlled hunting reduces game to dangerous levels, I would endeavour to have them read more literature on the subject, but for the others who want hunting stopped simply because they believe it is cruel I have no sympathy whatever as it is my view, based on a lifetime of personal experience, that it is invariably the hunter, as it most certainly was in this State, who first dug deep into his pocket, got off his tail and did something practical about the conservation of all game and non-game species. It was Victorian hunters who asked for and got much tougher game laws, more research into wildlife and its habitat, a chain of Game Reserves (to protect wildlife), the Game Licence and a host of projects, still continuing, some millions of dollars and dedication unlimited when most people didn't know the

meaning of the word conservation.

I get very annoyed and despondent when it sometimes seems that all the good that hunters have achieved may well go for nought if the noisy preservationist has his say. I get really mad when I further consider the incalculable damage they will do to research and wildlife conservation if they have their way and eliminate hunting, for then one of man's most fulfilling pursuits will have been taken from him and with it in time the motivation that has enabled him to achieve so much in a short space of time, and don't forget the money he is still contributing. Of equal importance, I believe, will be the secondary effect of the hypothetical removal of hunters from the scene. The voice of the preservationist would now alone be heard and woe betide any researcher who collected and whose findings did not conform to the new rules possibly now to be called inhibited research projects.

Infairness one must also indulge in some self criticisms and for opening our eyes and minds we must credit our strongest critics who have by their extremism made at least this person aware of our inability to respond quickly to those whose main pursuit in life seems to be that of writing emotional letters and to those professionals who have unlimited time to write the words for which they are paid.

It seems to me that the time has arrived when hunters, those who believe it to be a part of game management and those whose interest in hunting is financial, or any combination of the three, must soon be prepared to stand up and be counted, throw off the fatalistic acceptance of anti-shooting propaganda, get off the fence and firmly and frequently make their view heard—persistently.

Persistence is not subject to inflation, it is free and pays great dividends.

THE TWO GREENERS

Part 2

William Greener's son William Wellington Greener discovered with most other gun makers, that the first of the pin fire guns had a short life, and with the coming of the first true centre fire cartridges, a discovery by Mr Daw in 1861, began with many other well and lesser known gun makers a veritable flood of improvements in breech loading firearms.

The younger Greener patented his self-acting striker gun, no doubt was influenced by the weakness of coiled springs firing pin release, and so devised the ingenious lifting out of the firing pins by direct contact of lugged hammers on which the firing pins "rode out". A truly efficient piece of work. But as the coiled spring quality improved, Greener quickly followed with the rebounding hammer gun with its dolls head extension top bite and bar locks known as a Treble Grip Gun. But none of this was important, as his patented cross bolt produced as a top bolt in 1865, which after years of patient improving, came out in 1873. It was a combination of new top bolt (a round hole in the rib extension to receive the cross bolt) plus improved bottom locking mechanism.

This was the wonder hammer gun called the Treble Wedge Fast, which over the years that followed, was acclaimed as one of the strongest standing breech loading actions.

The greatest compliment was that this method was copied by other makers of renown with variations, and used in those days of the heavy express rifles, with a great deal of lasting satisfaction.

I have an old catalogue dated 1892 which quotes such a shot gun Double Barrel 12G costing 13 guineas, and a double rifle at 25 guineas.

Next we see the development of the hammerless gun, firstly with Treble Wedge Fast action with patent Box locks and side safety, and newly designed cocking device, as the barrels were dropped for reloading the cocking rod effected the cocking, it was named "Facile Princeps" meaning "easily first". The price range for these in 1912 was between 70 and 20 guineas, according to engraving and finish. At this time Greeners Factory at St. Mary's, Birmingham, was known as the biggest sporting gun factory in the world, as they catered for every need of the shooters. Over 100 models of various rifles, shot guns, and revolvers were being sold, in addition ammunition and accessories were manufactured.

Greener went on to better guns with his unique hammerless ejection shot guns and rifles in 1880, where the inventor capitalised on the clever method of using the one set of locks to fire the gun and eject the empty shells.

This model gun was used in every possible climatic condition throughout the world and never found wanting, and sold in many thousands.

There was a period from 1874 onwards when Greener found time to develop a satisfactory method of choke boring shot guns but that subject deserves a little space of its own.

This will be one of the largest Skeet programs ever to be held in Australia and is sure to draw a great deal of support. An Inter Zone Teams Match will be in-

cluded in the program.

One of the problems faced by Victorians is that shooting on Sundays is illegal (except where a special approval has been granted by the Chief Secretary). Some Victorian Clubs who shoot Saturday nights are placing all these approvals at risk by continuing to shoot after midnight. This is a selfish attitude and Club's co-operation in meeting the midnight "curfew" is being sought. This request also applies to mid-week shoots, particularly in cases where Club Shooting Grounds are close to settled areas.

TASMANIAN AMATEUR SHOTGUN ASSN.

The T.A.S.A. is to be congratulated on the encouragement it has given to Tasmanian Clubs to request registration cards to be presented by shooters when nominating. The result has been an almost 100% acceptance — come on, you mainland States, there is a challenge here.

N.S.W. CLAY TARGET ASSOCIATION

The Association has acknowledged the benefits to Clubs and shooters to accrue from the "IMI Waratah State Classic" series. The first round at Taree-Wingham has been completed and the attendance indicated that shooters are in strong support.

A co-ordinating body called the N.S.W. Shooting Association has been formed with which the N.S.W. C.T.A. has affiliated. The purpose of the new body is to enable the shooting and hunting sports to speak as one in areas where strength of numbers is important. The new member of A.C.T.A. Executive Committee, Mr Harry Somers is the Treasurer.

A Planning Committee has been formed to promote the 1977 National Championships. Its first meeting will be held at Griffith on 15th May. Also on promotion, a N.S.W. Coaching Council is now operating and comprises "Pud" Burgess, Bruce Noll, Merv

Lyons and Jim Scott.

An exciting development in shooting is occurring at Campbelltown, just outside Sydney. Currently, the Campbelltown Municipal Council is considering a proposal to set up a joint shooting complex, almed at providing facilities for all types of competitive shooting. The objective is to produce a composite facility of Olympic standard. The site is 87 acres

The following statement is taken from the April Newsletter of the N.S.W. C.T.A. and should be considered by all our mem-

bers.

"MORALE IN GENERAL".

I believe there is a general uplift occurring in our sport at the present time. Attendances at major shoots at locations known for their organising are well up and there does not appear to be as many growls among shooters and from club managements as there had been.

Much of the credit for our uplift in morale must go to the new A.C.T.A. Secretary with his dealings with clubs and with his edit-

ing of the Shooting News.


But we can all play a part in making our sport a more enjoyable pastime and one of the ways that clubs can contribute is by insisting that shooters present their card and by seeing that the cards are marked. If all clubs strictly carried out these duties we would eventually stop the gripes among shooters of Joe Blow being underhandicapped or in the wrong grade. Individual shooters can play their part by making sure they present their card, by seeing that it is marked and by making sure they receive the handicap adjustments they have earned.

Frequently incidents arise which eventually end up with an Executive Committeeman to sort out. One such recent incident involved the writing of nine letters and some 500 miles of travel by the parties concerned before the matter was resolved. If the club concerned had made a handicap adjustment on the shooters card at the time of his win all of the incident would have been

avoided

We must all play our part to ensure the smooth running and enjoyment of our sport."


