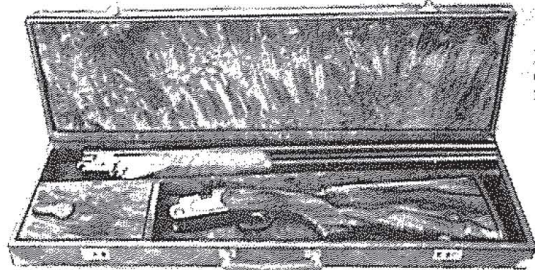

Firearms legislation is very much in the news. South Australia is conducting a review of the 1977 Act, while in New South Wales and Victoria, tighter controls seem certain.

We are reprinting, elsewhere in these pages, a circular from the Sporting Shooters Association — Victorian branch, which sums up the proposed Victorian A.L.P. policy on firearms.

The association's Executive Committee will be discussing a proposal for a \$5 levy on all adult registered shooters throughout Australia, at it's meeting in Sydney at the end of October. This once only levy, if approved, would be used to form a Legislation Fighting Fund, the money would be invested, and could ONLY be used to protect shooters interests.

RUMBEL AND BOYD NEW CHAMPIONS RECORD ATTENDANCE

VICTORIA SUCCESSFUL IN BOTH TEAM SHOOTS

Melbourne Gun Club was the location for the 1981 Olympic Discipline National Championships, held September 4, 5 and 6. First class facilities were provided on this ground, which hosted the 1973 World Championships.

Bob Buchan and his team have had a wealth of experience in conducting this type of shooting.

The entry was a record with 84 shooters contesting the Trench Title and 24 the ISU Skeet crown. The possibility of representing Australia in the 1982 Commonwealth Games obviously had a big effect on the entries, as this event was named as one of the eliminations for the Squad from which the team will be chosen.

Bob Buchan, as Chairman of the International Subcommittee, used the opportunity, with so many ISU shooters gathered together, to explain the method by which the 4 team members for the Commonwealth Games would be selected. He was also able to introduce National Training Squad Manager/coach, Peter Quire.

Friday, September 4.

A cool Melbourne morning with overcast skies greeted the shooters. All States were represented with the exception of Northern Territory. The big guns were to be seen preparing themselves. Ellis, Rumbel, Smith, Berry, Henwood, Crikis, Boyd, Hale, Summers, Long, Porter and Maxwell, all have represented Australia in ISU shooting. Last year's Trench winner, John Harris, from Cunderdin, W.A., had made a rush trip back from overseas to defend his Trench title.

At the end of day one, Jack Henwood (Vic.), led the Trench competition with 73/75, by one target from Vince Mollica. Four shooters were grouped together on 71, while two of the big names, Ellis and Rumbel had dropped five to be together on 70-75.

Boyd and Crikis were sharing the lead in the Skeet on 71-75. Rooke and Summers 70-75, then Blackmore and Thompson 69, with Hale and Lee on 68. At this stage, Victoria led the team event in both Trench and Skeet.

Saturday, September 5.

Day two saw better weather which suited most shooters. The Queenslanders had competed in Townsville the weekend prior to this competition in a temperature of 29°. The contrast in Melbourne was most apparent.

Shooting all his 75 targets, Terry Rumbel had gone to the lead on 145-150. Doug Smith was tied with Ian Buchanan on 144 after they had both improved with 73's to add to their first day 71's. Maxwell and Henwood were next on 143, with Porter on 141. Ellis had again disappointed with 70 to total 140.

The Skeet shooters had started to sort out with Crikis leading on 142, from Boyd and Blackmore 141, Hale 140, and Summers 138. Barney Rooke had dropped out of contention with a disastrous 63, after his good 70 on the first day.

Sunday, September 6.

The last 50 targets to be shot to decide the champions for 1981.

Rumbel, Smith and Buchanan all carded 24's to keep the placings the same with one round to go.

In the Skeet, Boyd had joined Crikis on 165, while Hale, 163, was one target ahead of Summers and Blackmore.

Tension mounted as shooters took to the tracks for the last round of the '81 Championships.

Rumbel and Buchanan ran it clean, while Smith dropped three targets in an uncharacteristic last round display. Henwood moved up to take the Bronze medal with a last round 24. Porter finished with a great 25 to join Smith in equal 4th place.

All attention was now focused on the Skeet fields, where some good scores were being produced. Hale 25, Blackmore 25, Summers 24, Crikis a disappointing 23.

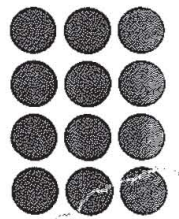
This left Boyd to shoot 24 to win the title, which he did, beating Hale and Crikis by one target.

GROUND ROOTS STUFF

In recent times, many seem to have forgotten the groundwork ELEY did to encourage and support the shooting sports in Australia.

At the date of writing, this letter arrived from Chas. Whitla, who virtually pioneered schoolboy shooting in Victoria. I thought it would be opportune to turn the ELEY REPORT over to Chas for the month.

Dear Sir,

I have been prompted to write this after reading your Eley Report in the ACTA News so that I can put you in the picture as to how all this inter-school shooting started.

Twenty three years ago whilst a teacher at Wangaratta Technical School, I was then secretary of the Wangaratta Branch of the Field & Game Association. We had a great conservation project on at that moment, and who helped us tremendously were a group of Tech lads. In repayment to these lads, we decided to teach them "Safety with Firearms". In fact, one of those lads Dennis Comensoli was the instigator in getting me the B.E.M. this year. Unfortunately he met with a severe accident four years ago, resulting in unfortunate death.

I have a trophy in memory of him on our inter school shoot day when it is presented to the Champion Old Boy.

It was in that year 1958 that the late Newton Thomas gave the first lesson over to school boys in Victoria, at the Wangaratta Gun Club. In 1961, I went to Benalla Tech as Vice-Principal and formed a group of lads similar to Wangaratta.

That year the Wangaratta boys challenged us, and so came the first inter school shoot which was held at Benalla Gun Club. Frank Bennett and Newton, together with Harrie James, came up and brought clay birds and cartridges. Frank was so thrilled with the day, that in front of all of us said, "No matter how big this day gets I.C.I. will grant one free day each year." So this period has gone on through the I.M.I. and now ELEY.

So now this year, on October 22nd, at the Wangaratta Gun Club, the 20th Year Annual will be held. I have already notified Geoff together with Ian and Bruce. Would you please ask them what's coming, etc.

Would like to see you come up for the day; have a chat to Geoff and see what you can do. Good to see you sponsoring these Zones in Victoria. Makes one feel good.

Cheers for now and hope to see you on the 22nd.

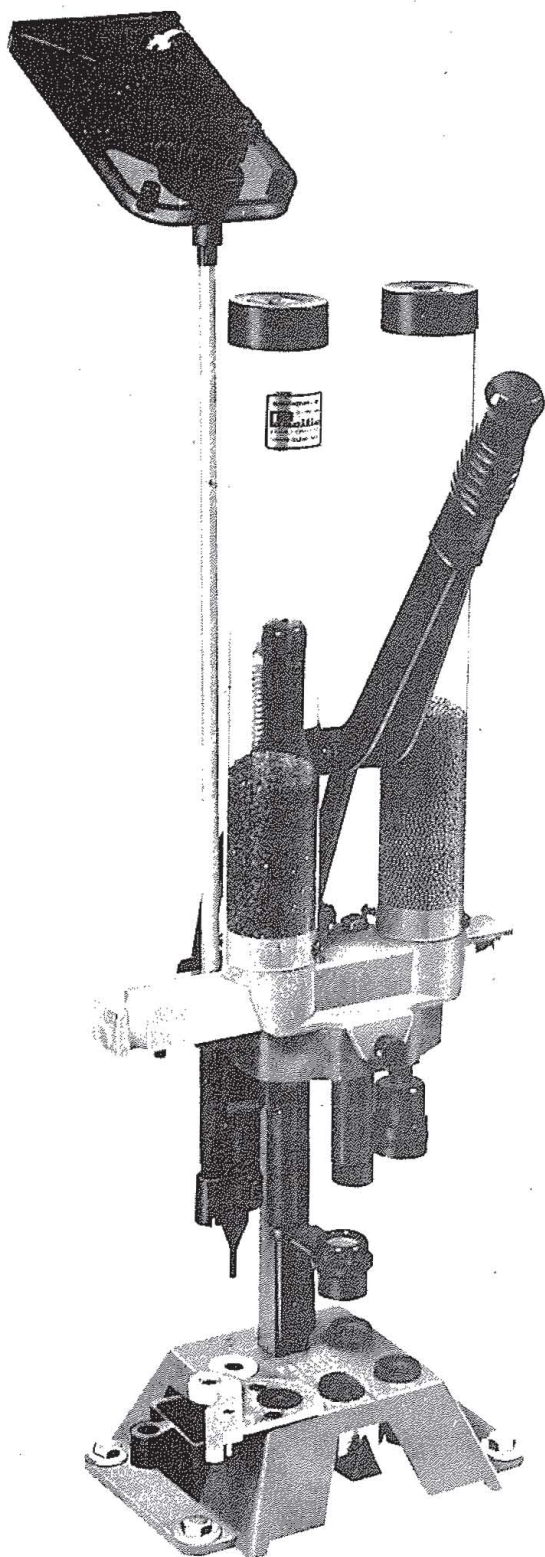

"SKEETIES"

—TO GO IT ALONE IS TIME RIGHT FOR SKEET NATIONAL?

During the course of my travels around the traps, I am constantly being asked by a great number of both DTL and Skeet shooters, when will we have a Skeet National.

I believe, in the interest of our sport and shooters alike, 1983 should be the year to give SKEET the GO IT ALONE treatment.

There is no doubt in my mind that skeet shooting is becoming a section of our sport that is developing in most States. Proof of this is the fact that some States are now conducting their own SKEET Carnivals in preference to just putting on their State title as a fifty target event over a one day program.

In certain areas there is enough shooting in individual disciplines i.e. DTL Skeet and to a lesser degree, ISU shooting, to allow a shooter to select the discipline he wishes to follow, and concentrate solely on that particular type of shooting, if he desires to do so.

Originally when skeet was first introduced at our DTL Nationals, it was believed that by doing so, the opportunity would be given to publicise this sector of our sport and encourage its growth and familiarise it to the general run of the mill DTL competitor.

The evidence is there, that this has been achieved, so now I believe we should take the next step and create an annual Skeet National. There would be many advantages on the plus side, for skeet shooters that is not now available. The situation that now exists, where the National title of 50 targets is being conducted over one day is not satisfactory. The "Fair Dinkum" skeet shooter who shoots nothing but skeet will not travel numerous kilometres, or subject himself to excessive travel costs, just to enter the 50 target National Title, conducted in its present format. If three or four day Skeet National were to be implemented as with our DTL and ISU counterparts, whilst the number of entries in the actual event may be down slightly on previous years, at least the shooter who pays and plays all year round at skeet would attend and make a Skeet National a viable proposition. A 100 a day match under tough competition, giving the skeet shooter a greater number of event targets, as a build up to the National Title, seems to be what he is asking for.

Because the tournament would go over three or four days, there should be no loss of revenue to the National body, due to the alteration.

There are many other factors that would need to be looked at if a change was made. However, I feel they do not create a problem and need no comment here. FACILITIES, there are several clubs now in existence with the necessary layouts to conduct such an event, so why not give it a go?

No doubt the action at first will come in for a lot of criticism. Tell me what new idea in the progress of our sport that doesn't.

What do you think "SKEETIES"?

Events other than the handicap will be shot off 15 metres. There are prizes for first, second, third, ladies and juniors, and a high gun.

Frankston (V) gun club recently ran a shoot that raised \$1000 for Lysterfield.

Currently, ACTA clubs in SE Victoria are making a \$1 surcharge on each competitor at each shoot for three months to assist Lysterfield's defence.

For the same reason, F&G clubs have applied a surcharge to each round shot on F&G grounds.

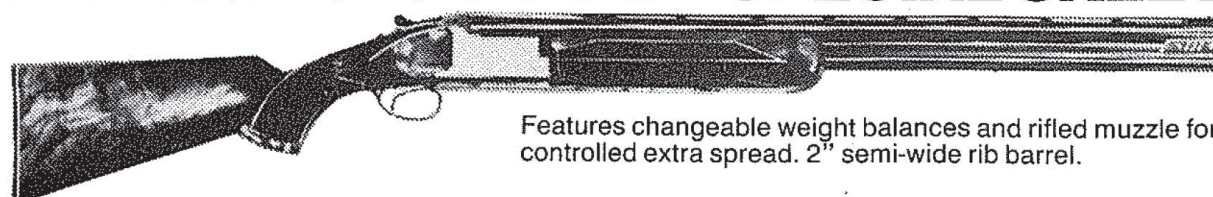

FIREARMS LEGISLATION

"Registration is the machinery of confiscation. In the short term, it is a medium for unjust taxation and personal harassment."

Strong words which headed up a recent information circular from the Sporting Shooters Association — Victorian branch, to all members. The text is re-printed here with the permission of the Sporting Shooters, as it summarizes the Victorian ALP policy on firearms ownership.

★ ★ ★

A few months back, a group representing the shooting sports met with a sub-committee from the ALP Civil Rights and Law Reform Committee to discuss their policy 151. The ALP reps were Jim Kennan, Tom Edmunds, Bob Seates, and Damien Murphy. During the meeting, a little aside took place, the substance of which is as follows;

ALP BOFFIN: (not sure which, but it wasn't Kennan) "We must work towards a general prohibition on firearms".

TOM EDMUNDS (Shadow Minister for Police & Emergency Services) interjecting: "Don't know that I could go along with that".

ALP ARROGANT BOFFIN: "You might have to!!!"

In presenting the expanded policy 151 for approval at the June ALP Conference the Chairman of the Civil Rights and Law Reform Committee, J. Kennan said "They (shooters) believe that the proposed ALP policy was a first step towards a total ban on guns...no matter what was put to them (shooting organisation representatives) by representatives of the ALP they would not be disabused of their belief as to the ulterior motives involved" AND NO WONDER.

It is no secret that the extreme right and the extreme left of politics are anxious to ensure that the vast centre group — the mainstream of society — do not have firearms. They see this as essential to achieving their ultimate goals and are unfortunately assisted in their work by some well meaning people from the centre who neither understand firearms nor the extremists they are helping.

Registration has been proved a failure right here in Victoria. In 19 years of operation here, it was a waste of taxpayers money and police time without having one single redeeming feature. After investigation by the ALL PARTY Statute Law Revision Committee of the Victorian Parliament in 1964 and 1966 IT WAS AXED and replaced by the Shooters Licence — and its abolition was supported by the Victoria Police.

Registration has survived in WA only through lies and deceit and by the WA police deliberately misleading their Minister — to his very great embarrassment. Sir Charles Court has now appointed a QC (Mr O. Dixon) to enquire into that States gun laws and make recommendations.

The only other State with registration (admittedly as yet a mild form of the disease) is South Australia, and they do seem to have found a novel justification for it. At the First National Firearms Conference held in Perth recently, Mr D. Hunt, Asst. Police Commissioner in South Australia, gave a glowing account of the benefits of his State's gun laws, but all the

praise referred to benefits derived from the Shooters Licence. When pressed at question time for some demonstrable benefit from registration he said it had at times helped in the return of lost or stolen firearms to their owners — BIG DEAL!

Colin Greenwood, former Police Superintendent and noted author on gun law, states emphatically that nowhere in the world has research been able to show that registration has anywhere achieved its stated legitimate aims (the illegitimate aim of providing the machinery for confiscation — euphemistically called "reducing the gun inventory" of law abiding citizens — is rarely stated.) REGISTRATION OF LONG GUNS IS MERELY COSMETIC — A WASTEFUL FRAUD DESIGNED TO DECEIVE THE PUBLIC INTO BELIEVING THAT A GOVERNMENT IS TAKING ACTION ON ARMED CRIME WHILE IT SIDESTEPS THE HARD OPTIONS WHICH DO HAVE SOME HOPE OF SUCCESS. And of course, there is the much more sinister long term prospect.

Fine tuning of the existing Shooters Licence system is the only sensible way to go here in Victoria. It regulates the man while registration *pretends* to regulate the object. The Shooters Licence is an inhibiting influence on irresponsible behaviour, it removes the anonymity from the shooter in the field, and is something valuable to him which can be taken away if necessary, thus removing his right to own a firearm. It will not control crime, but nor will registration or any other imposition on the legitimate shooter.

Registration extracts a disproportionately heavy cost from the community in both monetary and social terms. It is ALWAYS disregarded by criminals and unless conducted in draconian fashion, there is even substantial non-compliance by sportsmen. Police time is wasted chasing and harassing legitimate shooters instead of dealing with real problems of the community. While registration offers no benefit to society, it has been very successful in generating anti-police attitudes in normally law abiding people.

If any system of gun control can be shown to have substantial benefit for the community, we would be irresponsible to oppose it. Registration, however, does not fall into this category and in fact it can be shown to be decisively counter productive.

Those who see themselves as manipulating the genuine people in the ALP will just have to excuse our reluctance to assist them with their shifty political fraud. Even if they were to succeed, Labor would not recover from the backlash and the ongoing campaign to have their bad legislation repealed.

At the National Firearms Conference in Perth, Professor F. Zimring, probably the world's foremost *anti-gun* campaigner addressed himself to the shooters at the conference and said "IN AUSTRALIA YOU DO NOT HAVE A GUN PROBLEM — HERE YOU HAVE A MEDIA PROBLEM" and long have we recognised this. Victoria's sportsmen and firearms enthusiasts may yet be called on to make sacrifices so that the true facts can be got across to the general public who are currently being treated like mushrooms nearly every time the gun issue surfaces.

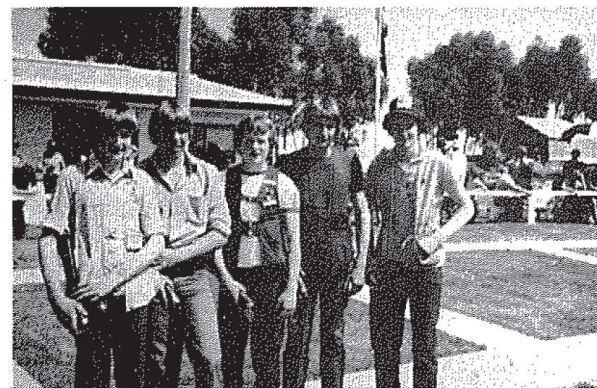


● Jim Gawith, Jeparit, keeping an eye on the cartridges as competitors collect them. Jeparit Gun Club, September 17.

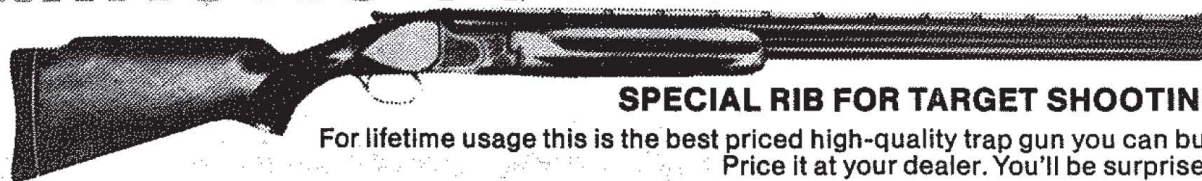

Tamworth Gun Club, situated at picturesque Loomberah, was the venue for the 1981 NSW Trap Carnival.

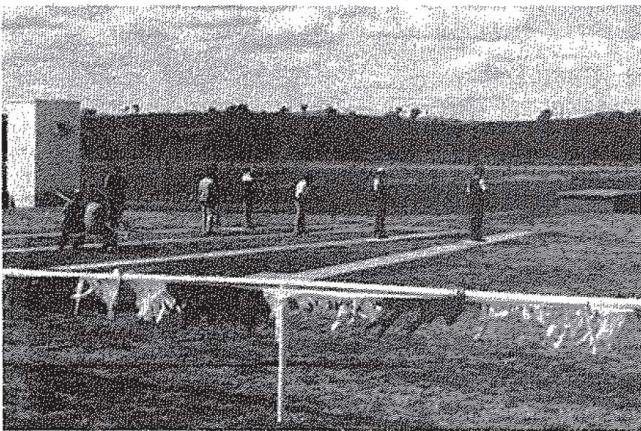
Approximately 200 shooters attended each of the three days, September 4, 5 and 6.

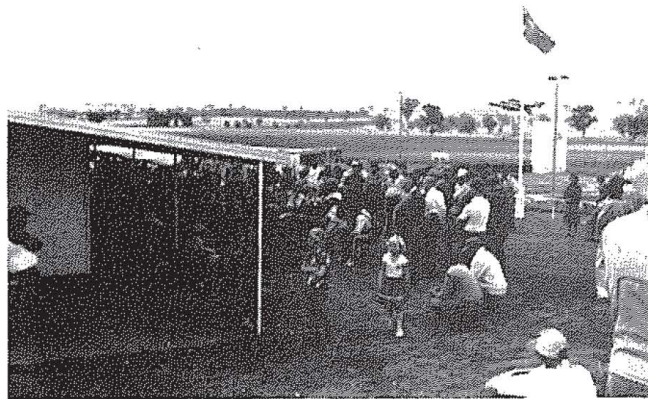
Barry Kable was the winner of the Overall High Gun for the Carnival with 395-400 by one point from John Fuller.

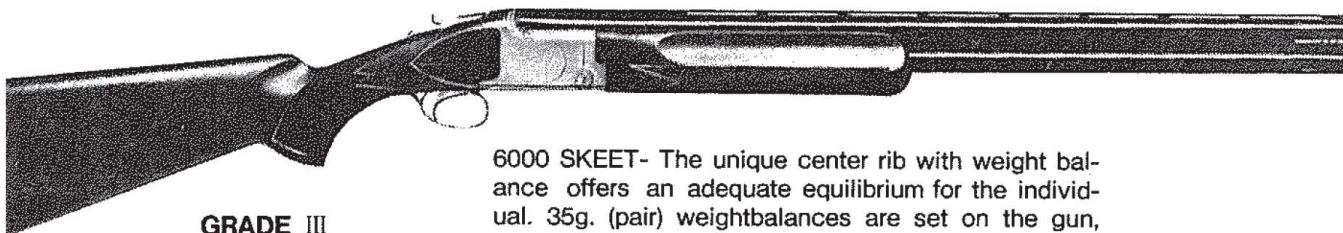

DARWIN GUN CLUB ANNUAL THREE DAY SHOOT

Over 150 shooters from all States helped to make this shoot the most successful yet held in the Northern Territory. The program, pruned from a marathon 1980 event, still proved to be 'too much for too many in too short a time'.

Major sponsors for the shoot were unchanged. Eley Ammunition, Winchester Australia, SKB Firearms and TAA. Ray Mack, Dick Ayers and Brian Mark, Peter Baile, and Peter McIntock were all on hand to present their trophies.

It was pleasing to note the splendid array of trophies donated by local firms and individuals, too many to list for fear of forgetting some.

Northern Territory Minister for Education and Alice Springs Gun Club member, Jim Robertson, completed a hat trick of opening Three Day Shoots when he officiated this year.

The Darwin Gun Club Committee, headed by Bill Horner and Ken Selwood, at present deeply committed to building a huge new clay target complex at Marrara, a Northern suburb of Darwin, dug deeper into their reserves to provide a third skeet layout for the shoot, a layout never again to be used. Over 50 metres of fill converted a gully to the tracks, scaffolding and ply made the traphouse, and temporary wiring had the layout operational.

Trophies and prize money were again records, with over \$5000 being distributed in the Calcutta alone.

Hardest worker on the grounds must surely have been Adrian Cousens, whose self-imposed task as Squad Hustler

Shooters commented on the current handicapping rules, or rather, the lack of them, as many 11 and 12 metre shooters not only won trophies with possibles, but lined up to do it again. If you're good enough to win a major trophy at a major shoot, surely it's good enough for a two metre walk-back each time. Percentage is fine, but trophies are where it's at!

There were too many fine shooting performances during the shoot to single out all but one shooter for individual recognition, the exception being Guy Beddington, who put up a break of 139-139 in the Winchester Tournament and a 67-67 in the final event, a 15 target single barrel Shell Shoot, to walk away with the High Gun trophy.

Organisers, officials, visiting referees and scorers, canteen and office staff, all performed with their usual high degree of efficiency to make the shoot successful socially as well as shootfully.

Remember, shooters, same time next year, but different place, as the Marrara Complex will be in full swing with five DTL's, four skeet, and a Trench layout. See you there!

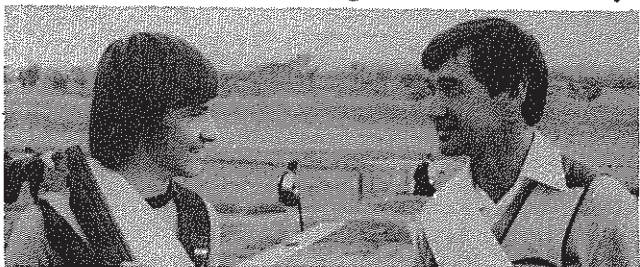

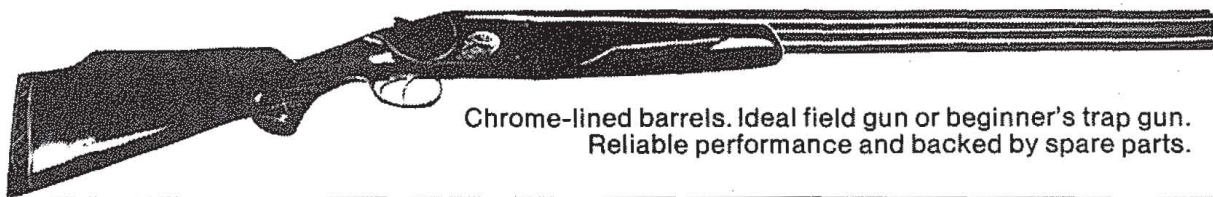

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

As I promised, I have prepared an article for the magazine which I feel is quite persuasive in the cause of non-alignment of the trapshooting fraternity in the question of firearm legislation. I find however, that both the National President and the Victorian State President have expressed the opposite view. These leaders, particularly the latter, tend to shoulder most of the workload with criticism the only feedback. At this time therefore, I will not offer the article in order to avoid disunity.

I hope nevertheless, that these gentlemen will examine the alternative view and perhaps communicate with Phil Brown of the Field and Game Federation rather than place all their eggs in the committed ASA basket. In the absence of 'feedback', our leaders might themselves be misled into indignity; particularly in the light of the impeccable safety record of the ACTA and their own personal standards of firearm discipline and self control.

Aside from this, I wonder what is orchestrating the current lemming-like procession into oblivion. Surely the result of one small skirmish with the Government of New South Wales, cannot be a viable precedent?

On the other hand, I have examined the basis for the Victorian ALP proposals in the light of medico-legal records in this community over some 15 years. A valid method of sampling. Accidents, suicide, violence and above all, undesirable access to firearms are all very real problems as stated.

A body in the bush, his head turned into a bean-bag and his family a community responsibility by a 30-06 in the hands of an idiot, is a far cry from the manicured lawns of the Melbourne Gun Club with its atmosphere of inflexible competence.

The ALP's legislative proposals, as presented to me, are not unreasonable unless one considers that motor vehicle laws are a similar threat to liberty. I think most trapshooters would agree that their self-imposed standards are very close to those suggested. I only mention ALP policy because I have this material placed politely to hand; actually I know nothing of politics, but am certain that ANY reasonable government will inevitably introduce these or similar measures.

All this leads directly to the idea that it is not lunatic-fringe protests over unmeasurable noise levels that has forbidden a shooting ground to the Alexandra Gun Club for four years, and is presently making life difficult for the highly respected Field and Game Federation. Rather, we are feeling the effect of ever growing community concern — something which any politician, professional or amateur, ignores at his peril. So many local properties are now barred to shooting, when a few years ago, fox shooter's for instance, were actually invited. It is not a question of noise, pollution or similar academic matters, but something more akin to old fashioned fear of the too prevalent element of semi-alcoholic maniacs carrying para military weapons.

My personal view is that the trapshooter should opt out of any group that places an umbrella over these irresponsible riflemen, and rather seek unity with the Field and Game Federation whose aims (and guns) are so akin to our own. The

acquisition of the conservation image alone might similarly act to conserve these allied sports for our children. There cannot be serious community concern about a sport which is substantially safer and less polluting than football.

This letter is too long, long like Paul Cains's list of membership of diverse committees! It is a sad reflection upon a system that permits this to occur and I am sympathetic for, but worried about, a man who allows or seeks this burden to be placed. The era when officers purchased their commissions and squandered their regiments in an ill conceived fight for 'liberty' are fortunately over. Or are they? As stated, I fear those who 'rattle the sabre' in some tenuous cause of freedom, when they themselves appear to seek a position that binds others to their will.

Perhaps my esteemed colleague should substantially experience how trapshooters 'bleed internally' in their current quest for mastery of the art of international trap and skeet before risking a fight to the last drop of his 'electorates' blood. Perhaps a less intransigent stance and a will to communicate has more honour than promises to 'fight'.

Above all, with practical experience, Paul Cains might see the need to serve fewer masters and the validity of the argument that non-alignment begins at home. (He did request comment, did he not?) Similarly, I would request comment admitting the possibility that my 'official' view might be modified by a reasoned case.

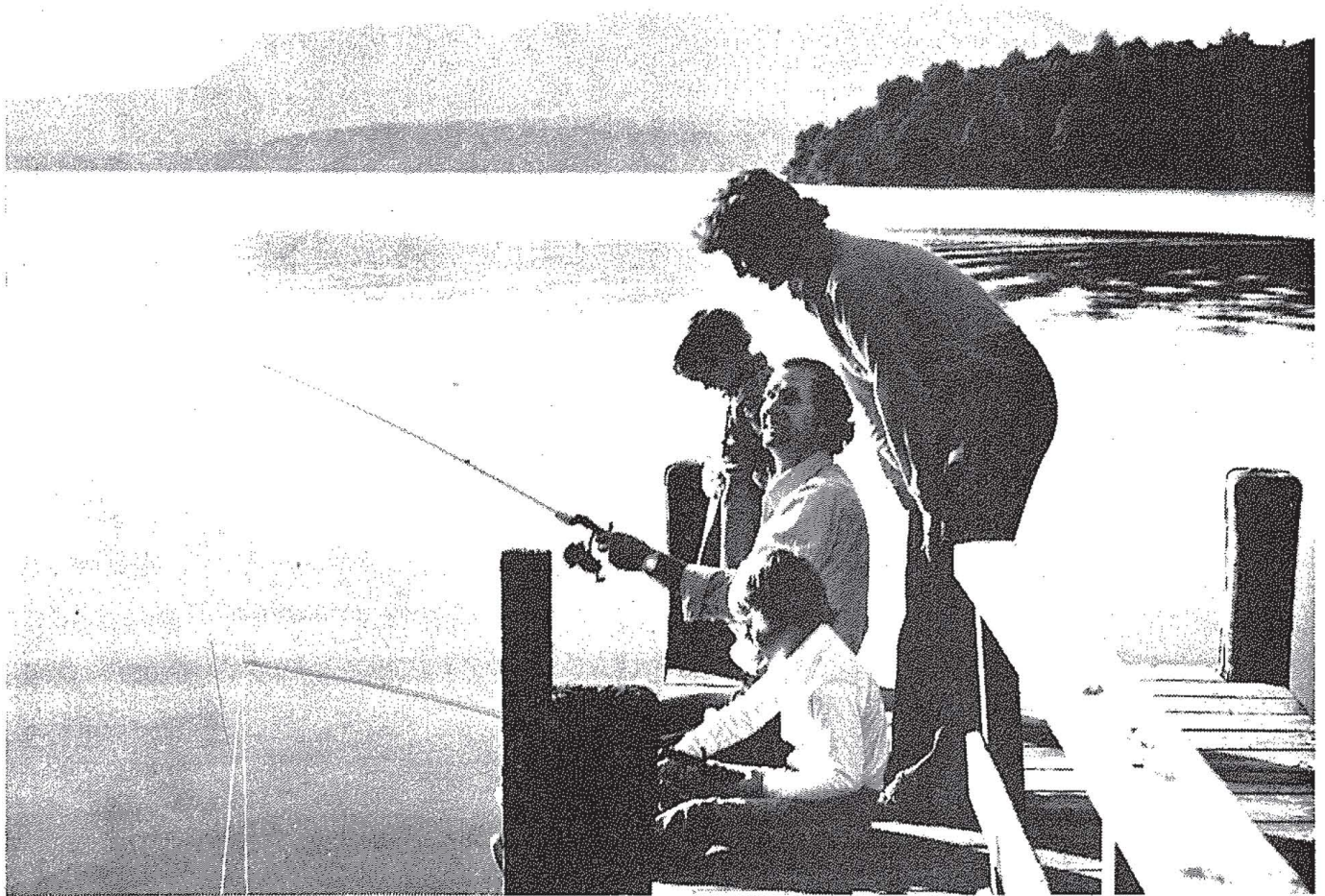

ISU SKEET

By Ian Hale

In this section, we will be concerned with four topics: (1) THE BODY POSITIONS AT VARIOUS SHOOTING STATIONS, (2) MOUNTING THE GUN, (3) HITTING A MOVING TARGET, AND (4) A DISCUSSION OF HELPFUL SHOOTING SUGGESTIONS.

1. Body Positions. (Figure 1)

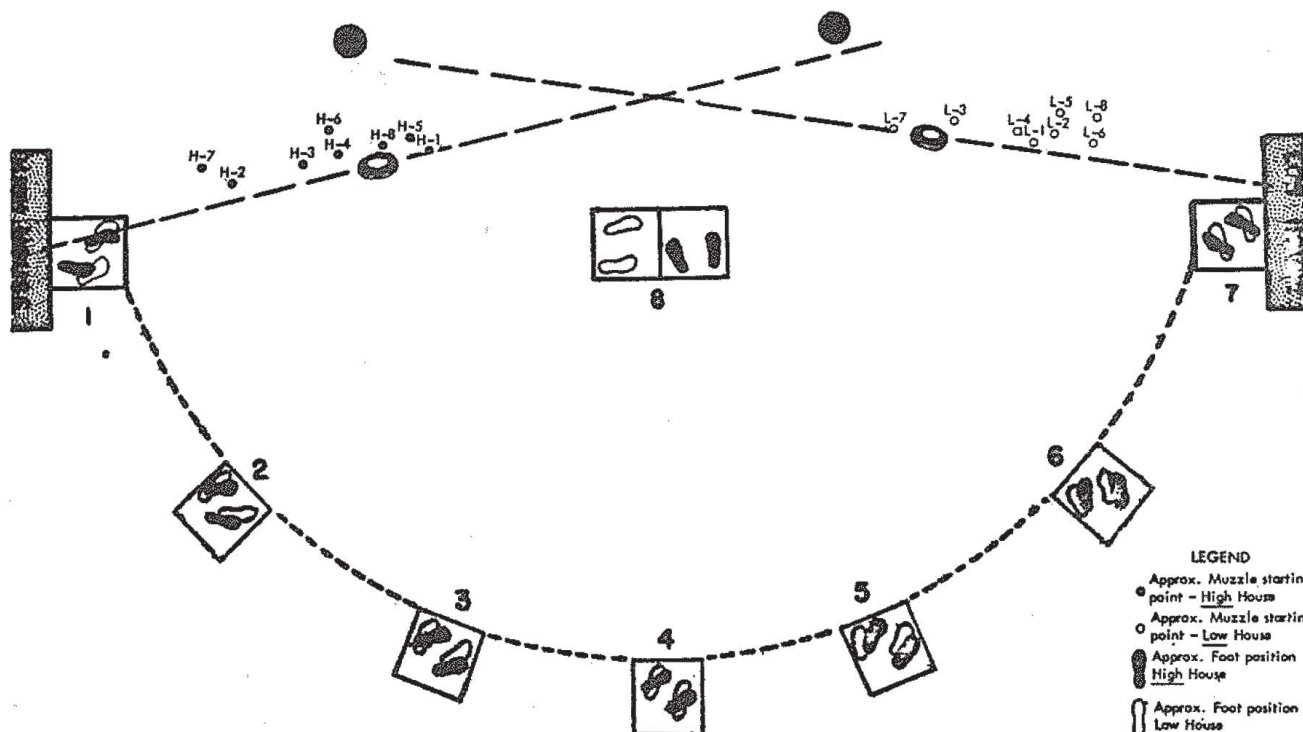
- a) Body position is perhaps the most important single factor in successful skeet shooting. Basically, avoid any body position which requires the use of muscles not normally used in a relaxed standing position while holding a weapon. Extraneous movements or an exaggerated shooting stance may impress the novice, but will contribute nothing to the scoreboard. Most champion skeet shooters are unimpressive to watch. They have eliminated every physical movement and mental process which does not contribute directly to the mechanics of breaking targets.
- b) A proficient skeet shooter must maintain a well-balanced body while swinging, delivering the shot, and following through. To attain a well-balanced body position, certain basic principles must be observed. These basic principles are discussed and will be enlarged upon as each shooting station procedures is described later in this chapter.
 - (1) Insure that the body is relaxed but alert. Body tension is the main cause of a jerky swing.
 - (2) The knees of both legs should be slightly bent. The weight should be evenly on both feet. The body may lean forward from the hips slightly, but do not overexaggerate to the point of being off balance or tense. When the target appears and the swing is started, the weight is shifted from one foot to the other and the entire body swings not just the arms.
 - (3) The feet should be placed a comfortable distance apart. Placing the feet too close together will cause

difficulty in maintaining proper balance. When placed too far apart, they create unnecessary muscular tensions about the body. Any stance which requires extra muscular control is incorrect. The body must be *relaxed, balanced and comfortable*.

- c) Let us now go on a station by station "tour" of the skeet field and show the proper gun and body positions for each target. Refer to the field diagram on page (Figure 1) illustrating recommended foot positions at each station.

1. Station — High House (Figure 2).

- a) Face forward to the target crossing point aligning the body directly beneath an imaginary line of the target flight path. The body should be balanced and comfortable.
- b) Align the gun muzzle on a level with the approximate line of sight (eyes to target crossing point) but no higher. The target will tend to disappear under the barrel as the gun is brought to the shoulder if the muzzle is elevated too high.
- c) Raise the head slightly and look directly forward of the target chute along the imaginary target flight path. Concentration should now be focussed completely upon seeing the target as soon as possible after it is released. CAUTION: Do not raise the head and eyes to a focal point too close to the target chute, as a tendency to shoot behind the bird will result.
- d) As the target emerges, the gun is brought to the shoulder in one smooth movement, coordinating gun, eyes and target for delivery of the shot. Do not rush the shot. CAUTION: More under hold on this target

may be necessary as the shot will be made at a greater range and the bird is beginning to drop.

- e) In shooting doubles, use the same procedure as for singles.

2. Station 2 — High House (Figure 3).

- a) Face toward the target crossing point (See Figure 1). Place the toes of the feet perpendicular to an imaginary line from station 1 thru station 7. The body is balanced, comfortable and physically alert.
- b) Position the gun with the barrel pointing to an area in space 12 to 15 feet from the high house target opening. The muzzle should be held slightly under the target flight path.
- c) Turn the head and look at the target opening area, but do not look directly into the actual opening. Concentrate on broadening the field of vision so as to encompass the entire area immediately around, and forward of, the target chute; thus preventing the eyes from becoming "locked" on the actual target opening. Concentration should be fixed entirely upon seeing the target appear.
- d) As the target emerges, start the gun moving with the target and diagonally upward toward the face and shoulder. Then gun swing and reflex timing is correct, the eyes, gun and target should blend together in one flowing movement for proper delivery of the shot. Do not rush or stab at the target. Accept the fact that this target will break well at the target crossing point and beyond. Smoothness of swing, coordination of eyes, gun, target and follow through are the factors in consistently breaking this most difficult target.
- e) In shooting doubles, the same position is used as for a single target. However, there are two separate shots and the shooter must break the outgoing target before starting back for the incoming house bird. A tendency to shoot too quickly at the outgoing target is more pronounced in international shooting until the shooter develops a smooth, coordinated swing and thus eliminates any feeling of being rushed for the second shot.

3. Station 2 — Low House.

- a) Feet and body positions for shooting station 2 low houses are the same as shooting the high house.
- b) The gun should be positioned to point at an area 12 to 15 feet out from the target opening, keeping the muzzle below the target flight path. Again, as with number one low house, the shooter is afforded plenty of time to view the incoming bird, correctly mount the gun, and deliver the killing shot using standard shooting techniques for this station. However, there is a slightly longer time before this target can be engaged in shooting doubles. For this reason, be alert to the possibility of shooting over the top of the low house bird on doubles, particularly if the target is fading fast.
- c) Station 3 — High House (See Figure 4). Position the gun with the barrel pointing to an area in space 12 to 15 feet from the high house target opening. The muzzle should be held about the target flight path. Turn the head and look just outside the target opening. As the target emerges, start the gun moving with the target and diagonally upward toward the face and shoulder. When the gun swing and reflex timing is correct, the eyes, gun and target should blend together in one flowing movement for proper delivery of the shot.
- d) Station 3 — Low House. Feet and body position for shooting 3 low house are the same as for shooting the high house. Move the gun to a position 12 to 15 feet out from the target opening, keeping the muzzle about the target flight path. As with number two low house, the shooter is afforded plenty of time to view the incoming bird, correctly mount the gun, obtain the proper lead and make the shot. Many shooters will slow the swing or stop the gun and miss the bird. A good follow through will prevent this.

- e) Doubles at Station 3. In shooting doubles, the same position is used as for a single high house target. However, there are two separate shots and the shooter must break the outgoing target before starting back for the incoming low house bird. A tendency to shoot too quickly at the outgoing target is more pronounced in international shooting until the shooter develops a smooth, coordinated swing. The shooter must see the high house target break before he starts his move to the low house target. He should move back through the low house target, see his lead, pull the trigger and follow through.

5. Station 4 — High House.

- a) The technique in breaking targets from high house four is basically the same as high house three or high house 5. The body must be turned further to the right than in American skeet to compensate for the delay in obtaining the proper lead, and the low gun position.
- b) At high house, the gun should be approximately one-third the distance from the target opening to the target crossing point. The muzzle should be slightly below the horizontal flight path.
- c) Again, look directly at the target opening, but not into it. Concentrate on seeing the target appear. Be mentally and physically alert for the target.

6. Station 4 — Low House.

- a) Seeing the target and correctly perceiving its angle of flight becomes more critical when shooting low house targets from station four. The slight delay in shooting from the low gun start may deceive the eyes and cause the gunner to erroneously swing on an upward path, thereby shooting over the top of a target which has actually begun to level out. The upward pitch of a target, even though it's losing velocity and actually sinking, is deceptive and more difficult to perceive when swinging from the low gun position. The shooter should maintain an awareness of this fact and be sure that his impression of the target flight path is not misleading. As with the high house targets at these stations, the gun should be started one-third of the distance from the target opening to the target crossing point and the gun muzzle should not be higher than the path along which the target will fly.
- b) Turn the head and look at the target opening area only, not directly into the actual opening. Concentration is fixed entirely upon seeing the target appear.
- c) When the target emerges, start the gun moving with the bird and raise the gun diagonally upward to the face and shoulder. Do not rush the shot. Again, accept the fact that the target will break well at the target crossing point and beyond. The key factors in breaking these targets are seeing the bird through the shot delivery, a smooth coordinated swing, and a correct follow through.

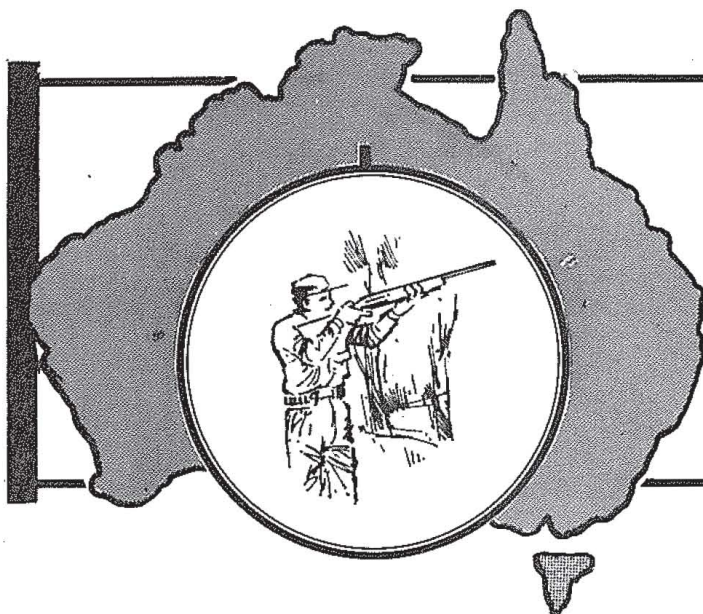
7. Station 5 — High House Singles.

- a) This target is shot when the proper gun target relationship is attained.
- b) The barrel is pointed 15 to 20 feet from the high house target opening and along the target flight path. The muzzle should be no higher than the target flight path, when the target emerges.

8. Station 5 — Low House (Figure 5).

- a) Another of the more difficult and could be the most difficult target in international skeet shooting is low house five.
- b) The gun barrel should be pointed 10 to 12 feet out from the low house. A low muzzle is required so that the target is not lost under the barrel during the swing.
- c) See the target as soon as possible at this station, it is imperative to see the target. Concentrate upon seeing the bird emerge.
- d) When the target appears, start the gun moving with the target smoothly and properly mount the gun. You should not have a breaking point on the field for this target. Break the target when you see the proper gun target relationship and follow through.

- e) Doubles at Station 5. Doubles at station five can be very difficult for some shooters. These doubles are broken the same way as doubles at station three except you must shoot the low house bird first.
- 9. Station 6 — High House.**
- This target is shot when the proper gun-target relationship is attained.
 - The barrel is pointed slightly to the left of station 8 along the target flight path. The muzzle should be at approximate shoulder level and target is broken in the area of half way from station 8 and 7. The principal error in shooting from this station is mounting the gun too quickly and tracking the incoming target too long.
 - In shooting doubles, care should be exercised to incorporate a low hold on this bird along with the normal horizontal lead. This is especially true when a tail wind causes the target to come in lower than usual.
- 10. Station 6 — Low House (Figure 6).**
- Another of the more difficult targets in international skeet shooting is Low House 6, shot approximately the same as High 2.
 - The gun barrel should be pointed 10 to 12 feet out from the low house. A low muzzle is required so that the target is not lost under the barrel during the swing.
 - Seeing the target as quickly as possible is imperative at this position. Hence the eyes must be focussed around the target opening. Again, *do not look directly into opening*. Concentrate upon seeing the bird emerge.
 - When the target appears, start the gun moving up to the shooting positions, smoothly and without rushing the shot. Plan on breaking the target near the target crossing point. Keeping it in view over the barrel throughout the shot requires a smooth swing and follow through.
 - In shooting doubles, maintain the same timing as for a single target. The outgoing target must be broken first before swinging back for the incoming high house bird. Avoid any tendency to rush the first shot. A smooth, coordinated swing will give a clean kill and allow ample time for correct delivery of the second shot.
- 11. Station 7 — Doubles.**
- In shooting doubles at station 7, the shooter should position his body and feet so that when the gun is shouldered it will point in the flight path of the bird. The most common cause for missing a bird at station 7 is shooting too fast or failure to mount the gun properly. Remember mount the gun, break the first bird before you move to the second bird.
- 12. Station 8 — High House (Figure 8).**
- Position of the body and the starting position of the gun are most critical at this station for both high and low houses. In shooting the high house, face the body about 45° right of an imaginary line through the long axis of the shooting stations. Stand along the outside edge and as far back on the station as possible without violating ISU Rules for requiring that both feet be within the shooting station boundary. The body weight is distributed evenly and the shooter is relaxed, but alert.
 - The gun barrel is pointed along the target flight path about two-thirds of the distance from the target crossing point to the target opening. The gun muzzle is held approximately at eye level.
 - Eyes should be focussed in the area immediately forward and slightly to the right of the target opening before calling for the bird.
 - The shooter must move quickly as the target appears, swinging the gun upward along the target flight path while coordinating the gun, eyes and target together in one fast flowing movement. The gun is fired the instant the muzzle catches up with the target and blocks it from your vision.
- 12. Station 8 — Low House (Figure 9).**
- Face station 7 pointing the gun slightly to the left of the target opening. Hold the muzzle low to avoid losing the target under the barrel, concentrate fully on seeing the target emerge. As on Station High House, coordinate the gun, eyes and target together in one fast flowing movement. The gun is fired the instant the muzzle catches up with the target and blocks it from your vision.
- Mounting the Gun.**
- The ready position in international skeet is with the gun butt touching the hip bone. The movement from the starting position to the shooting position is the *most critical movement*.
 - It has been found that by placing the gun butt on the forward edge of the hip bone it is easier to mount the gun with a flowing motion. Having the butt too far alongside the body, or directly on the hip, requires both forward and upward motion in order to shoulder the gun. This creates two separate movements causing the swing to be late and erratic. *Mounting the gun must be coordinated with the swing as one single movement. The gun is always brought up to the face and not the face down on the stock.* Before calling for the target, the shooter must be prepared for the target to appear instantly or any time within three seconds. Be alert and concentrate upon the appearance of the target. If the shooter receives a long (3 second) pull, he must continue intense concentration until the target emerges or the referee rules "No Bird". Never permit the thought that a pull is too long to interrupt concentration. The bird will appear usually at just that instant, catching the shooter mentally unprepared. Be ready for an instant target, *before* calling for the bird. Because of the timing device, it is possible to receive a succession of delayed targets. A shooter who is not alert and ready may then call for (and receive) an instant target and thus be caught off guard. It is almost impossible to catch the target under such conditions, especially at Station 8.
- If the shooter follows the first of the four suggestions for hitting a moving target i.e. picking up the target as soon as possible, he should be ready for the following procedures whenever the target appears.
 - As the bird appears, start moving the gun out from the house, *with* the target.
 - As the gun moves with the target, bring it to the shoulder and face in a coordinated, single movement.
 - See the lead and pull the trigger.
 - Keep that gun moving!
 - International skeet does not lend itself to the techniques of picking a point to break the target. Regardless of practice or skill in gun handling, the gun cannot be mounted from the international position with the same precision on every shot. The good international shooter is aware of this fact and is mentally prepared to adjust his shot accordingly. For example, a bird will occasionally get the jump on the shooter necessitating that he shoot at the target when he gains the correct gun target relationship and *not before*. The target breaking point may vary with each shot and the shooter who tries to "groove" himself will not improve his score.
 - If the hand is extended too far out on the forend, mounting the gun is awkward and the swing is slow. If the hand is too close to the receiver, speed is gained but gun control is sacrificed and the swing tends to be erratic. Therefore, the shooter should experiment and develop an optimum position for gripping the forend. Care also should be taken to insure that the forend is not gripped too tightly.

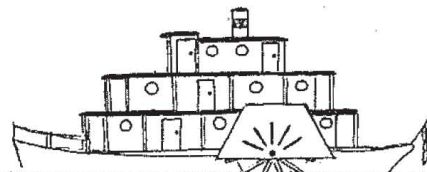

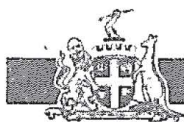

All States to conduct three (3) eliminations of 200 targets each in both Olympic Trench and I.S.U. Skeet. the following procedure must apply:

- Only Olympic Trench, that is the 15 trap trench will be accepted for eliminations.
- All three eliminations for both Olympic Trench and I.S.U. Skeet must be completed by the end of March 1982.
- Results of each elimination must be forwarded to the National Executive Director, arriving within 7 days of completion.
- National office must be informed as to the dates and locations for all three eliminations. These events must be advertised in Clay Target Shooting News. All States are to advise the National office of elimination events, so that they can be featured in an article in Clay Target Shooting News.
- The Trench programs used, that is settings, will be forwarded to each State Coaching Director or I.S.U. Coach, two days prior to each elimination. It then becomes the responsibility of each appointed person to see that the settings are carried out.
- Those shooters who participate in all three eliminations, will be allowed to discard their worst elimination score, e.g. if a shooter shoots 199-200, 156-200, 186-200, he can drop his score of 156-200, giving him a total of 385-400.
- All shooters who have completed their States elimination, must, yes MUST, compete at the I.S.U. Nationals in Brisbane at Easter, 1982.
- States conducting these eliminations are asked, where possible, for the State Championships to be one of these three eliminations.

The reason we are asking for the three eliminations to be completed by the end of March 1982, is that it will give time for the National Training Squad Manager/Coach, Peter Quire, to ascertain the merits of each shooter's score. This information is important, as the 1982/83 National Training Squad will be named after the 1982 I.S.U. Nationals in Brisbane at Easter.

Your International Sub-Committee is doing its utmost to see that all shooters from all States are given the chance to make the National Training Squad. It is from that Squad that we will select shooters to represent Australia in the Commonwealth Games in Brisbane.

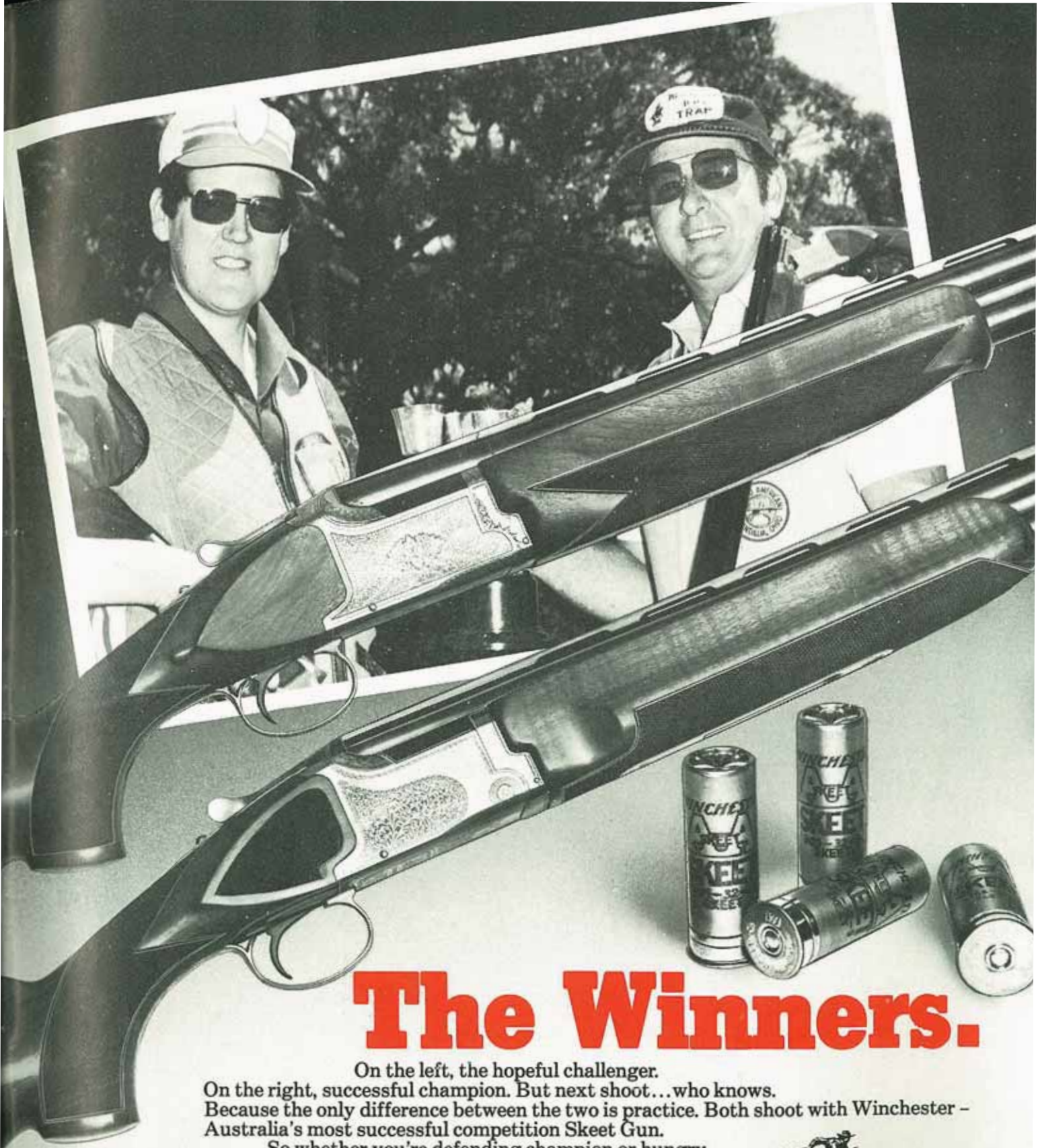
