



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

1982 National Championships

Arrangements for the 1982 National Trap and Skeet Championships at Brisbane Gun Club May 12 to May 19, are being finalised at the moment.

The Organising Committee met at Brisbane Gun Club on Friday February 26, when many of the details were agreed upon to ensure the success of this Tournament, the biggest in the shooting calendar.

Some changes have been made to the format, which will benefit shooters. The change that will please most shooters is that all trap events will be shot in one visit to the traps, i.e., 50 targets, moving five traps between rounds.

The Champion of Champions event will also be conducted in one visit, shooting at 25 targets Double Barrel, 25 targets Single Barrel and 25 targets Points Score, moving a minimum

of three traps between rounds.

Shooters are reminded of the need to present 1981 and 1982 registration cards to the official handicapper, Ken Holman, **BEFORE** nominating. Nominations will **NOT** be accepted unless registration cards have been verified and stamped by the handicapper. Ken's office will be open on Tuesday, May 11, to enable this verification to take place.

Shooters will be able to purchase cartridges on this day, and

practice traps will be available.

The Executive Committee has decided that shooters who refuse to act as scorers, or fail to make alternative arrangments when called upon to do so, will be penalised one target. The use of re-loads will **NOT** be permitted at the 1982

The use of re-loads will **NOT** be permitted at the 1982 National Championships, and no cartridges may be returned or exchanged after purchase. However, mixed lots may be purchased.

Nominations for ladies and juniors have been reduced 50% and shooters in these categories will be able to win all trophies that are applicable to every competitor.

Juniors should note that they assume senior status on the 17th birthday, however, no further Annual registration fee

will be charged until the next fiscal year.

The 1982 Nationals will conclude with a Gala dinner, to be held at the Greek Community Centre in Brisbane, on the evening of Wednesday May 19. Presentation of trophies will take place to all the overall winners, at this function. Tickets at \$15.00, will be on sale at the A.C.T.A. and the Q.C.T.A. Information Centres at the Nationals.

SHOOTERS DON'T GO IT ALONE WITH A SEPARATE SKEET NATIONALS — THERE IS AN ALTERNATIVE

I am concerned that there is a move to divide our competitors who support all facets of the game we play in busting clay targets into several factions, but the main problem would be a division between our grass roots supporters who shoot DTL and Australian (or American) Skeet, on their way to participation in the Olympic disciplines, if they have the ability or the inclination to do so.

People who know me would realise that I am not one to stand in the way of progress or to inhibit in any way the majority of shooters enjoying this sport. However I believe that the National Skeet Championship should be of the same number of targets as the other events and available to all at the one venue at the one time.

Without wishing to appear parochial I would like to make a few comments on the development of Skeet in this country as I know it. In W.A. most Clubs put in their first Skeet layout before their second DTL and most have at least two at the present time. In the 1960's there would probably have been more clubs shooting Skeet in this State than any other. This prompted the W.A.C.T.A. which was inaugurated in 1954 and had the foresight to promote this facet of the sport, to push for the inclusion of Skeet at the Nationals. The result was that the 1st National Skeet was conducted in Perth in 1970, over 5 layouts. The game did not need publicising here but I am sure it received a boost in the other States, by becoming a National event. It has now become part of the scene at most clubs throughout the country, and at the recent W.A.C.T.A. Carnival at which both trap and skeet teams were selected, less than 6 shooters made both. I doubt very much that any of these could afford the time expense or hassle at home to attend two Nationals in the one year, in different States, at different times. Further, let us face the situation fairly and squarely.

Until a National Ground is established with better facilities than elsewhere National events should progress in turn to those States who have the grounds, equipment and ability to run them, regardless of whether they are separated or not, and if the latter case prevails should be on a North-South, East-West basis.

The problem in our country, with its vast distances, is one of cost, and an example is that the cheapest fare W.A.C.T.A. could organise to the Brisbane Nationals was \$848.00, for seven days with Bed and breakfast. Add the other costs to this and it puts a second trip out of the question.

It has been said in support of the move to separate these events that the Skeet shooters will not travel the distances and pay these costs for only a 50 target event, and if this is the only event they shoot I would have to agree that this is not fair. However there is a compromise that could be made and I would suggest that instead of the National Skeet being shot first that it be the last event, still incorporating the overall High Gun, and that further Skeet events be conducted at the same venue over a further two days culminating in a prestige event similar to our DTL Champions of Champions. This would allow Skeet and DTL competitors to contest the Nationals Skeet, and any other events they wish without the enormous expense of two venues. It would also prove the viability of a separate Skeet Nationals.

I realise this will not be printed in time to have any bearing on the poll being conducted by A.C.T.A. but the matter will be discussed at an Executive meeting in Brisbane and your comments to your Executive member on this proposal would be appreciated.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

I would be pleased if you could see your way clear to include this letter in the Shooting News as I feel it affects all shooters.

re HANDICAPPING & GRADING.

Now that the full implications of the changes to the rules regarding handicapping are starting to show up would it be reasonable to ask the Rules Committee to please explain to all shooters (through the magazine) why these changes were made. One could be forgiven for thinking that it was done to eliminate the new and novice shooters. For example how on earth can a novice 14M shooter compete against an A Grade 14m shooter. It has become necessary for some Clubs to eliminate front marker trophies as they found they were going to 14M A & B Grade shooters. Something I feel sure was never intended.

Why was the front marker changed to 14M. We have never been told why this was done and what it was intended to achieve. It now means that we have too many A & B Grade 14M Shooters. How would you like to be a C Grade 16M Shooter and have to pay high nominations to shoot against an A Grade 14M shooter in a handicap event. I think it is time we were given a full and frank explanation.

In an endeavour to be constructive might I suggest that the following changes be made immediately to the Rules so that we may offer genuine encouragement to new shooters and a deterrant to the proverbial bush rangers that are becoming all to prevalent in this so called SPORT.

- 1. Set a minimum meterage for all grades. e.g. A Grade should not shoot handicap in front of 18M. B Grade 15M.
 - 2. Restore front marker to 11M instead of 14M.
- 3. Reinstate the old handicap rule, i.e. When the trophy value equals or exceeds your handicap you lose a metre. Still keep the present rule to run in conjunction with the old but drop the percentage to 90%. The present percentage is too severe.
- I feel that to maintain the number of shooters it is imperative that these changes be considered now and if necessary an emergency meeting of the Rules Committee should be called to do so. The present system is being treated as a very sick joke by far too many shooters at present to allow it to continue any longer. Each month we see more and more shooters dropping out.





MONDAY 8th, TUESDAY 9th FEBRUARY, 1982







The State Double Barrel title went to South Australian Executive member Trevor Reschke. Trevor shot 138/138 to win the title. Bill Iles, Victoria, ran out of opposition at 63-64 and added another State title to his long list of Championships in the Single Barrel.

Dick Ayers, South Australian Winchester representative, supported by his wife Rhonda, were busy organising the forty one entries in the Winchester School Boy/Girl Championship. Scot Hetherington (Mt. Gambier) came out the winner of this event for 1982.

The Eley Point Score Junior Championship conducted in the State saw Darren Hera-Singh from Lake Albert, 145/145 points, take out this title.

In my numerous travels around the traps, I have often heard the remark "WEST IS BEST", so it was no wonder I found myself heading for Perth to attend the West Australian Skeet and Trap Carnival, conducted by the West Australian Clay Target Association, at the Perth Gun Club. I apreciated one-time Executive member, Robin Bailey, meeting me at the airport and continuing to provide me with transport to and from the gun club. Many thanks Robin.

The weather was warm, but a strong breeze blowing each day of the shoot kept the high temperature bearable and pleasant for shooting. The first day of the shoot was allocated to those interested in skeet shooting. One hundred and four entries were recorded in the event, and one of them was 1981 Australian Skeet Champion, Adrian Cousens. 





Dear Sir;

Re: VICTORIAN SPORTS AID FOUNDATION

I wish first to take this opportunity to thank you for the financial assistance given to me to develop my shooting athletic career.

I must apologise for the long delay in submitting this report but work, family, and shooting commitments on my return after four weeks absence have been heavy.

But mostly I wanted more time to think about and put into practice some of the things, advice, and theories, that I have gained overseas before writing my submission.

I was very fortunate to have been given permission to train and attend a Clinic at Fort Benning, the Headquarters of the United States Army Markmanship Unit in Georgia, which is considered to be one of the best Training Camps in the World. To achieve this I had to leave early so that I could attend the Clinic and the International match held in Georgia between the 2nd and the 4th October, 1981. On the 29th September, I left Melbourne and after 38 hours travelling arrived at Fort Benning on the 30th September, 1981. On the 1st October, 1981, I had some practice, between the 2nd and 4th October I competed in the match at Georgia with the following result.

My result of 196/200 bettered my previous highest score of 195/200 shot in International competition at the South Pacific Regional Games.

On the 5th, 6th and 7th October, 1981, I attended the Clinic which was very beneficial to me, as I learnt and had discussions on the following subjects:

- (c) Factor influencing physical fitness
- (d) Physical training programs

Some of the above subjects have already been discussed with our National Training Squad Manager/Coach, Mr Peter Quire since my return to Australia.

Between the 8th to the 15th October, I had practice and

training with the American team.


On the 16th October I left the U.S.A. for Tucuman, Argentina, where the World Championships were held. I arrived at Tucuman on the 18th October, 1981. Between the 18th, 19th and 20th, I had a rest period. Having been away from home nearly three weeks, I started to feel down and being the only Australian, a bit lonely.

On the 21st I had some official practice with scores 70/75, 70/75 and 45/50, total 185/200, which was well below my average. I was having trouble shooting the clay targets at close range. On the 25th, the World Championship match had started. Total competitiors 88. My score was 69/75, 68/75, 49/50, total 186/200 Place 44th.

On the 28th October, 1981, I left Tucuman and after 72 hours travelling, arrived in Melbourne on the 1st November, 1981.

On Saturday the 7th and Sunday the 8th November, 1981, I attended a meeting with Mr Peter Quire our National Coaching Director, Mr George Biggs, Victoria State Coaching Director and Mr Bob Buchan, Chairman of the International Sub-Committee for discussions about my trip.

Further on the 15th November, 1981, I competed in the Victorian (American Skeet) State titles and again a disappointed score — an average score of 92/100 missing targets at close range. At present I hold the 1981 Victoria State Titles in the international Discipline — the average score of 97/100.

This lead me to having my gun checked by a Gun Smith and it was found to be shooting 2ft. out of line at the distance of 30 metres. The cause of the above — my gun must have been dropped, causing my barrels to be 3/1000th" out. I am pleased to say that on the 5th December, 1981, after re-alignment of my gun, I shot a total score of 148/150.

Please note that I do not use the above as an excuse for my low score in the World Championships, but as an example, if this was the cause, I and the management have the responsibility to make sure that this could not happen again.

It is very difficult to have full control of your guns, as in many countries guns are picked up by the Police or the Federation who check them, deliver to the shooting range—anything can happen.

I hope that this information will be of some assistance to future competitiors.

The following are a few points I wish to make.

 Travelling time and time away from home to be cut down as short as possible.

If possible, travel with a full team or at least one other competitor, as moral support is very important.

 Ensure your equipment is checked at all times, if possible have a back-up gun and take it with you.

4. Think positive and set your goal very high, win the world titles and not the competition in between or after.

You must discipline yourself and train to peak at the right time for the big event and forget other minor events.

- 6. If possible, take your own Coach with you. Someone who can correct a mistake made under pressure so that it will not be repeated, someone to arrange your travelling, accommodation, training etc., as it is very hard to try to compete without having to worry about the rest.
- 7. More support and International experience is required as one mistake made in World Championship or International Competitions does register and is very hard to forget, there is a lot to learn.
- 8. Do not make excuses for your bad results. The one responsibility to make sure that you are 100% fit at all times and sure of where you are going.

My travelling expenses were as follows—

The Grant of \$1400.00 was therefore most acceptable and

helped to defray the overall cost.

I include a copy of the score result of the 1981 World Championship and a Coaching Manual from the United States Army Marksmanship Unit, for your records.

In conclusion, I should like to express my thanks to the Victoria Sports Aid Foundation.

The International Sub-Committee held its meeting at the Park Royal in Canberra during the Australia Day week-end.

Bill Stevens attended for his first meeting, it was unfortunate that another new member in Jim Scott could not attend on account of sickness in the family.

We are aware that our sport is lacking in U.I.T. Judges and every effort is being made to overcome this position. In the next few months we hope we will have some good news.

Team Manager and Assistant Team manager for the 1982 I.S.U. World Championships in Caracas has been announced, Peter Anderson Team Manager, Neville Sayers as Assistant Team Manager. Peter Quire was the A.C.T.A. nomination, but we hope for a better result next time.

Commonwealth Games.

It appears all is going according to plans for our own shooting section.

At Easter, those shooters who will be attending our own I.S.U. National Championships will witness a full dress-rehearsal for the Commonwealth Games, in fact they will have the drug caravan in attendance — please do not become alarmed.

Shooters who are attending the Nationals can stay on for the Commonwealth Championships, the program is advertised in Shooters News.

Team shooting will be a highlight at these Nationals, each State will be fielding a four man team in both Trench and I.S.U. Skeet. It is pleasing to hear that some States are funding their teams.

Funding for Commonwealth Games pre-Games Training.

These shooters who are fortunate to qualify for pre-Games training will receive financial help from the Federal Government.

Proposal for Trips in Skeet to the U.S.A. in 1983.

Further International competition for standard disciplines, example Glenn Cup, Mackintosh, U.S.A. etc., up to 1986, an article for Clay Target Shooting News, and the possibility of standard discipline training squads will appear in Clay Target Shooting News. I am delighted at the submission presented by Jim Scott for the above proposed trips. Thanks Jim.

Your International Sub-Committee has recommended to the Executive that in order to fund overseas trips in Standard disciplines, nominations at State Carnivals and National Championships be increased to cover this cost.

The Sub-Committee drew up a proposed budget to fund training camps prior to the Commonwealth Games, it was agreed that an amount of approximately \$15,000 would be expended in this way. We are sure that the Government will help much more.

We also looked at the cost of sending a team to the Caracas — World Championships as well as meetings and Publicity-Media Consultants.

Where is our INCOME going to come from some of you will ask. This year's United Kingdom D.T.L. team will be covered by the General Travel Fund, and the extra amount added to nominations of certain events at the National Championships as well as sponsors.

From 1983, these Championships will be run by the National Association, and in the long term, I.S.U. shooting will benefit greatly.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir.

There has recently been some correspondance regarding the desirability of allowing some groups of shooters to enter events at a reduced charge. As one of the shooters who is being asked to finance this situation, I submit the following comments:-

(a) Except for a limited number of events, trophies presented by Gun Clubs are financed by shooters.

(b) It is discriminatory for any one group to be expected to pay for others.

(c) It might in fact be illegal for such discrimination to be practiced in Australia(?)

(d) The grading system is to even out the variation in performance of individuals.

Included in the groups which benefit from the reduced costs

(1) Junior shooters

(2) Women shooters

(3) Veterans (over 60 years)

(1) Junior Shooters.

Probably the best case can be made out for these people. However, when I was younger, I would have liked to race motor cars, boats and fly planes, but did not have a sponsor. As I got older and could have indulged in perhaps one of these, I discovered that the inclination declined. The real problem was that when I had to part with the hard cash, the rewards were assessed as not sufficient.

How often have you seen juniors who, when Dad was paying the bill were keen shooters. When the time came to pay his/her own way, the situation changed and the sport became

Juniors are not necessarily lacking in ability — to think this is a delusion. Remember that in recent times, a junior was the national Double Barrel Champion.

(2) Women shooters.

Women have struggled hard for equality, both financially and socially. Having achieved it, they are now asked to revert but only in part.

I work alongside women who receive equal pay to men. Why am I then asked to pay my own way when shooting and then also contribute for a women shooter?

The one about trying to encourage shooting as a family sport is good in principal, but is is a fact of life that clay target shooting can be an expensive sport. I wonder how many average families on a single income are competing regularly? If the woman works, then it seems reasonable to expect her to pay her own way.

Discounted prices are not usually related to sex. By this I mean that women pay the same for petrol, food and other products. Should shooting be any different?

I do not accept that women are necessarily inferior in shooting ability, otherwise they would all be "C" grade trap shooters and 10 handicap skeet shooters. It should be remembered that a lot of men are in this category.

(3) Veteran Shooters.

Probably of all the groups who indulge in clay target shooting, the veteran is best able to pay his way. Gone are the days of mortgages (particularly with todays high interest rates) and costs associated with raising and educating children.

This group also includes some with highly developed skills. One of the attractions of Australian type trap and skeet is that shooters can be competitive to a ripe old age.

In support of this, it might be noted that the Victorian Skeet Championship has been won 3 out of the last 4 years by veteran shooters. During or about this time, the National Skeet Championship was also won by a veteran shooter.

Assuming that it is considered right for people to participate in sport with part of their costs being loaded against other competitors, then when I become a veteran (In 4 years) I submit that other shooters should subsidise my car running costs and motel accommodation in addition to nominations (in for a penny in for a pound).






Mr Benzoni pictured with part of the target producing machinery.

IT'S GOOD FUN SHOOTING DOUBLES

by George Biggs Vic State Coach

There is no doubt that shooting double rise targets and scoring well is not the easiest form of clay target shooting — simply, because we don't apply the basic fundamentals that must be understood and used in order to turn in better scores.

To become good double rise shooters we must first learn how it should be done and then practice and more practice until our timing is perfect because timing is of the utmost

importance.

It's a great pity that the average Australian shooter doesn't get a greater opportunity to shoot more often at double rise. How many times have we heard shooters ay, after having shot the National Double Rise Championship, at the Nationals each year, "I don't know why I bother to shoot this event, it's only the second time this year I've shot doubles". No wonder we don't shoot well, we simply don't get the practice.

Lack of practice and experience is certainly the reason that we rarely see a possible 50/50 doubles at our National Championships. The remedy of course, is for clubs to promote

double rise events.

I well remember my earlier days of shooting when almost every week we were able to shoot a doubles event at one club or another. Not only did it give us a different challenge, which added more interest to the day's shooting, it also contributes to making us a better all round shot because we just simply have to learn to concentrate more on doing what is necessary in order to hit more targets.

The doubles shooter must keep perfect control of his body movements with each shot. His gun must be well fitted and his gun mounting and handling must also be spot on. If this detail is correct, he will then have no problems keeping his cheek snug on the comb throughout the process of shooting both targets. Lifting one's cheek off the comb in order to look more for the second target will result in a complete miss due

to over shooting.

All kinds of funny things happen when the inexperienced shooter first takes up double rise. The most common practice is to snap shoot the first target and then swing across to the second, and follow it while he decides where and how he will break it. Unfortunately it's not possible to connect with a moving target in this way. It is usually the second shot that wrecks our score at doubles and it all comes back to timing. We really don't have time to be precise and careful. Shooting moving targets is a case for instinctive action and pointing the gun muzzle at the correct spot where the shot pattern will intercept the target.

Successful doubles shooting calls for a complete understanding of what action is necessary or in other words one should form a mental picture of correct procedure routine for shooting each double. From the five different firing points, this routine should apply every time he prepares to shoot at the target. Our mental picture should go something like this:

Firstly the shooter must have complete confidence in himself. He must believe that if he does the things he knows he should do in the correct way, he will be well on the way to turning in winning scores. This positive thinking must always be present in competition.


The first detail of our correct procedure routine when on the firing line is:

Correct stance, and body balance; Gun mounting and gun control;

Gun and eye alignment.

These fundamentals will contribute greatly to the successful shooting of doubles.


Next procedure is correct gun point on the trap house. Eyes should focus in readyness to see the target, then move out with the target, establish lead, fire and follow through. This procedure routine should occupy your thinking completely, during your time at the firing line. Not only will this state of mind help you develop concentration, it will also help overcome a build up of tension and nervousness which is a constant wrecker of good scores.



No. 1 drawing shows a double rise shot at station one shooting from right to left. In this case it is necessary for stance to be positioned so that after firing firstly at the straight away target we can, without restriction, swing smoothly and quickly across to break the second target before it has actually reached the top of its flight.

Dotted line denotes gun travel


Denotes gun hold on trap house




No. 2 Body position and stance for no. 2 station will be very similar to no. 1. The right target will be almost a straight away. Care must be taken not to jump at the target and not to lift your head for the second target, as you swing across.




Experience has convinced me that, for the right hand shooter, it is more natural and easier to shoot the right target first and then swing across to the left target. Some shooters will argue that the better way is to shoot at the right target first from station 1, 2, 3, then take the left target first from 4 and 5 claiming that in this order the straight away target is shot first. This enables the second target to be shot quicker. In theory this may sound good, but in actual practice it's not so good, simply because it is more difficult for the right hander




No. 3 This station provides us with a double where we have right and left angles to cope with. However we know where each target is going and so we can position our gun for the first target on line of flight above the trap house. As the gun travels up to the target it must brush past the target on the right side in order to correctly intercept. Do not blot out the target with our muzzle, if you do you'll shoot too high.




No. 4 This station gives the shooter an opportunity to use his feet and body position to advantage. At station 4 we have a right angle target for the first shot and we know exactly where the target comes from and its angle of flight. Gun point position is on line of angle just out from the trap house as shown on sketch. This knowledge will enable the shooter to break the first target in good, fast time then swing across to break the second target before it reaches top of flight.



In any case, keep constantly in mind that correct stance and body position will be one of your greatest assets. Seeing the targets leaving the trap after you call is without doubt the most essential basic detail to remember. I'm convinced that if we can see the target bright and clear leaving the trap at six to eight feet out we are more than half way to breaking it. When targets are not seen clearly as they leave the trap house, our gun pointing will be slow, uncertain and inaccurate.



No. 5 Station will be shot very similar to No. 4 only that stance and body position should be such so as to favour the second target. A good stance position on all stations is to position yourself for shooting the second target. This will mean winding back the body somewhat to shoot the first target, then unwinding as you come across for the second shot. It's somewhat like skeet where the body is used to help swing and follow through.

SPORT NEWS

NATIONAL SPORTS PLAN

After many years of talk, consensus seems to have been reached between the Government and sport that a national plan for sport is necessary.

Significant steps in the progress towards agreement included a meeting between the Prime Minister, Mr Fraser and senior representatives of Australia's leading sports organisa-

tions, which was held last December.

More recently, the Confederation of Australian Sport was invited to be represented at a meeting of a sub-committee of SCOR — the Standing Committee on Recreation — at which detailed planning for the development of the plan was given a high priority. This is thought to be the first time that a sporting body has been present at such a meeting and therefore represents a significant first.

The overall management of the project is in the hands of a small committee convened by the Confederation of Australian Sport which will include representatives of the Australian Olympic Federation, the Australian Commonwealth Games Association, the Sports Advisory Council, the Department of Home Affairs and Environment, the Australian Institute of

Sport and State Governments.

Agreement has been reached that an appropriate starting point for the project would be to use the document titled "MASTER PLAN FOR SPORT — MARCH 1980" which was produced by the Confederation after filtering a vast amount of data collected from sportspeople throughout Australia.

The first meeting will decide the course of action but it seems that the next step will be to seek comments from all levels of sport, including local, state and national Governments, in a bid to update and further refine the document.

This move represents a purposeful step towards filling the need for a common direction to be given to sport in Australia.

AUSTRALIA GAMES UP AND RUNNING

The Australia Games project, long talked about in theory, is about to become a reality.

At its February meeting, the Australia Games Board of Management approved the appointment of an Executive Director to be located in Sydney.

He is David Mazitelli, who until recently, was with the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation in Victoria. David

commenced his new duties on 1st March.

The idea of an Australia Games, a multi-sports national festival, was first promoted by the Confederation back in 1978 and it convened meetings of interested groups in 1979, following a survey of sporting bodies. The next move was a feasibility study which was commissioned following the establishment of a Board of Management.

An allocation of \$50,000 in the 1981/82 Federal Budget facilitated the establishment of a Directorate and a formal invitation has been extended to the NSW Government to host the first Australia Games in late 1983 or early 1984.

MORE MONEY NEEDED

Since 1976, when the Confederation was first formed, the extent of Federal Government funding for sport has grown quite dramatically. In 1981/82, the total Budget allocation to sport exceeded \$19.6 million.

However, the amounts provided under the various headings still fall short of the requirements of sport. This seems to reflect a lack of understanding by parliamentarians of the

urgency and nature of sports' needs.

Overseas experience shows that there is a relationship between mans' participation in sport and community health. It therefore is not unreasonable to claim that putting greater effort into getting Australia's "Norms" off their backsides and taking up a recreational activity would be of overall benefit to the community.

To achieve such an objective requires more public funds, from **all** levels of Government. It is a widely held belief that the Federal Government should lead the way and this is where sports administrators and coaches need to become more active.

Every opportunity should be taken to keep politicians fully informed on benefits arising from particular programs. These can be used as an example of the gains that could be achieved if greater funding support was available.

Federal politicians are already giving some thought to 1982/83 budget priorities and the interests of Australia's six million sportspeople must be made uppermost in their mind.

You can play a part by "educating" your Federal (and State) Members of Parliament, and sport generally stands to make substantial gains.

PLEASE ACT NOW!

DOMESTIC AIRLINE DOWNTURN

In July, 1980, when effectively all air travel concessions were withdrawn from sporting federations, there was a vast amount of "buck passing" when it came to identifying the decision maker so that blame could be placed.

The move cost sport an estimated \$4 million and one hardly needed to be a Rhodes Scholar to realise that the immediate response would be a downturn in sports' use of airline services.

From recent press reports, it seems that the problem has become far more widespread.

Travel agents are reportedly upset by a withdrawal of their concessions and are re-directing holiday traffic to destinations other than those serviced by domestic airlines. In other words, overseas holidays and cruises are said to be receiving priority over Australian resorts.

The Confederation has maintained a constant liaison with both major domestic airlines in a concerted attempt to have concessions restored to sport, but has met with only limited success

CAS has embarked on a project of collecting enough information to equip it to negotiate an agreement on the basis of bulk sports travel.

The response from sport to this initiative has been most encouraging and perhaps it will result in a general increase in the number of sporting backsides in airline seats.



JANUARY 30, 31 & FEBRUARY 1, 1982

With a world class score of 221 out of 225, Jim Ellis from A.C.T. International, won the Australian Capital Territory Australia Day Olympic Trench Championship, held at A.C.T. International Gun Club on the Australia Day long week-end.

An equally fine score of 220 out of 225 was shot by the ever reliable John Maxwell from Illawarra Gun Club, to take second place and the Special Achievement in Sport medallion.

Irrepressible Terry Rumbel from Taree-Wingham won third place with 194, two targets clear from Greg Long from Frankston.

Shooting began at a lively pace with five of the six twenty fives to be recorded in the first round, were shot by squads two and three. All eyes focussed on Jim Ellis as this was his best start in any Australia Day Championship.

After fifty targets Keven Loy from Royal Aero had sneaked ahead to be the clear leader at this early stage on 50.

It appeared likely that this was going to be a closely fought contest and at the end of day one, three shooters shared the lead.

Kevin Loy, John Maxwell and Terry Rumbel were looking good on 74, followed by Jim Ellis on 73, and Bruce Noll and Greg Long on 72.

Day two began in slow fashion, in direct contrast to the opening day. Ellis Rumbel & Maxwell each carded 25's — all looking good at this stage.

This was the way shooting was to proceed over the next day and a half, and at the end of day two, these three Australian representatives began to creep ahead, demonstrating their cool ability to shoot well under extreme pressure.

Each had shot 148 out of 150, Ellis carding 75 straight on the second day.

Greg Long was clear leader in AA grade with a fine 145, Kevin Loy had A grade in hand at this stage with 143. The leaders in B & C grades were Brian Shandley from Frankston and John Geale from Downside-International respectively.

The air was electric on day three as the competition began. Could Ellis continue on his winning way? Could he win his first Australia Day Championship?

Four hours later and the competition was almost over. Ellis and Maxwell had tied on 196 and a shoot-off was necessary to determine the overall winner. Clyde Hawkins from N.S.W. Gun Club and Lex Lane from A.C.T. International also had to shoot-off to determine second place in B grade. Each had shot 176.

In a fine exhibition of pressure shooting, Jim Ellis emerged as the victor by the narrowest of margins — one target. John Maxwell produced his personal best score of 196/200 and 24 in the shoot-off to take second and the Special Achievement in Sport medallion, donated by the Sports council.



Sunday November 8, 1981, saw 190 shooters nominate for the Annual Cherry Tree Pool Field Championship.

The Katanning Club was formed in 1950 and was the first Club in W.A. to affiliate with the A.C.T.A.

In 1951 the Club held its first Open Championship week-end and to entertain the visitors on the Sunday, (shooting was on the Saturday and Monday) pionic was held on the Con Kowald property at Cherry Tree Pool and was much enjoyed by all.

1952 saw a similar picnic, but with a six target Fun Event, as well. It was great to see the better shooter with a balloon tied to his gun barrel or a piece of cardboard slipped over the barrels to restrict the vision a little. More fun was had in this vein in 1953 and 1954. With safety becoming a problem as numbers increased, it was suggested by the late Ernest Clegg (later to become a life member of the club) that a Championship event be organised, and from this humble, funloving beginning, Cherry Tree Pool Field Championship was born.

We are proud of the fact that Cherry Tree is the "father" of all other field events now being run in Australia.

The first field numbering more than 100 was registered in 1964 and then in 1977 over 200 nominated. It is interesting to note that, as yet, a possible has never been shot.

Cherry Tree has always had a happy, informal atmosphere and although shooters battle like tigers, they have always made the day a pleasant one to attend.




To mark the event, four Club Championships were shot for, all of which were keenly contested.



FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

Peter Quire

I would like to talk about our coaching set up in the Clay Target Association.

There are 4 levels as most of you would already know. These are a National Coaching Director, which is my post, and I see it as one of a Co-ordinator and a conveyor of information, State Directors, who are in control of the coaching scene in their respective States and have the local knowledge to be able to run the coaching set-up in their States to the best advantage.

Zone Coaches are responsible for coaching within their own Zones. The very size of Australian States and the complete differences from zone to zone make it essential that there be Zone Coaches. Lastly, I come to the Club Coach and it is the Club Coach I would like to talk about here.

The Club Coach bears the brunt of the work-load. It is essential for the future of our sport to have a Coach in hand at Club level. The Coach can make a new shooter at ease and make them feel that the skill and enjoyment of clay target shooting is a possibility for them.

The Club Coach is many things rolled into one, a public relations officer, a mine of information, not only on the skills of the sport, but on safety and the rules and etiquette of clay target shooting. He is, as well, an amateur psychologist, giving encouragement when it is needed, some one who remembers how embarrasing it was to be a beginner, terrified of doing the wrong thing, and how confusing it was to get advice from every club member, which was often at variance with previous advice.



In these days of falling membership at clubs, it is my view that the Club Coach is a most important member of the club Administration.

With the support and help of the other members of the coaching team, the Club Coach promotes our sport and sets a uniform level of basic skills, whether he is in Kalgoorlie or Charters Towers.

I would like to conclude by adding a personal note of greeting to all Club and Zone Coaches, and hope that at some time in the near future, I am able to meet at least some of you.
