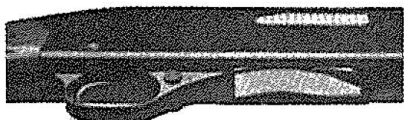

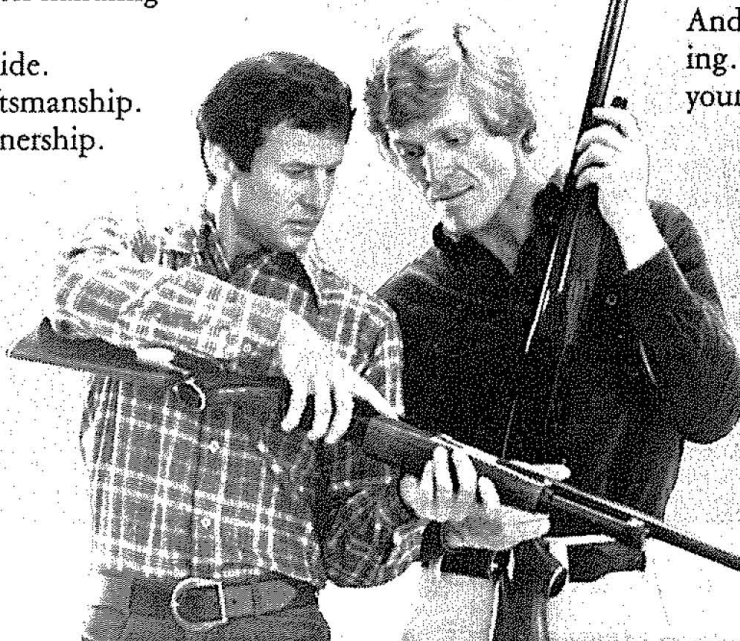

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I had a very interesting phone conversation recently with the wife of a Central Victorian shooter.

She had phoned me to complain that I didn't publish Pro Gun Registration letters in C.T.S.N. she was absolutely right, (with the exception of the Tom Edmunds letter in December C.T.S.N.) I haven't published any, because I haven't received any.

The lady felt that very few shooters in her area were opposed to the registration of firearms, but that this magazine gave the impression that all shooters were violently opposed to it. I don't propose to argue for or against the Victorian A.L.P. policy in this column, but will repeat what I told my caller, if she cares to write a letter to the editor in support of the proposed policy, I will print it, providing the letter meets the usual criteria placed on any letter to the editor, by any editor, of any magazine.

Mr R. F. Buchan, V.C.T.A. President has been appointed to the Interim Consultative Committee of three, established by the Cain Government to look at proposed legislation to implement Labor policy. All shooters and this Association in particular will I am sure benefit greatly from Bob's efforts in this area.

We hear that the new Victorian Legislation will be introduced in the Spring session.

The new Referee's Association met for two days in Melbourne in June. A vast amount of work was done at the meeting, and since, to produce a condensed version of the shooting rules for Referees, as well as re-write much of the complete rule book. The results of these deliberations are still in draft form, but it is hoped to have new rules ready for ratification by the Executive Committee when it next meets in September.

If accepted by the Executive Committee, we can look to big changes in the handicapping formula, grading, and safety rules, one of which will outlaw shooting from the Hip.

THE IMPORTANCE OF PROPER STOCK FIT

By George Biggs

It is impossible to over emphasize the importance of proper gun fit, especially for the competition shooter who wants every shot to count.

Equally important and which goes hand in hand with gun fit, is correct gun mounting.

I never cease to be amazed at the large number of our medium to good shooters that shoot trap and skeet targets who are severely handicapping their shooting performance by continuing to use a gun that is either not a proper fit, or they are not mounting and checking it correctly. Many shooters will buy a gun from over the counter at their local gun shop or from a fellow shooter and pay a big price, thinking that because the gun is highly priced it will automatically shoot the way he wants it to. This is of course not the way it works.

I often see shooters trying to adapt themselves to an illfitting gun in order to get a proper alignment and sight picture, this practice can be successful some of the time but not every time. I have heard it said that a good shot should be good enough to shoot with any gun he picks up! Fact is that very few shooters if any can do just this, remembering that champion shots are not born that way, they only become brilliant by keenness, application, coaching, practice and more practice with the **correct equipment properly fitted**.

A well fitted gun will give greater comfort during the act of firing and will provide for greater gun control, recoil effect will be reduced and greater gun pointing accuracy will develop. The wise shooter will strive for an absolutely perfect gun fit. It is only then he will achieve greater performance and satisfaction.

The problems arising from a badly fitting gun are numerous. These problems are with us whenever a shot-gun is used whether for field or clay targets, because shooting a shotgun is an instinctive pointing action. In other words we don't aim at the target as we would do with a rifle, we simply point the muzzle at the moving target, as one would point a finger, looking only at the target. The trigger is pulled the instant a sight picture of gun and target relationship is formed. Without proper gun fit it is not possible to consistently do all that is necessary in order to shoot well.

Buying a new gun can be something like buying a new suit or new dress "Off the hook", almost always it needs to be altered in some way before we can wear it in the way we want it to look and be comfortable.

The gun manufacturer has exactly the same problem because we are all built differently it is not possible to manufacture a standard gun that would fit everyone, hence the need to have a personal fitting to suit the physical characteristics of the person.

Vital Gun stock statistics are the following:

Length of Pull	Drop of Heel
Angle of Pitch	Drop at Comb
Shape of Comb	

Problems connected with an illfitting stock are many such as loss of gun control during the process of firing, bruised cheek and shoulder, excessive recoil, inaccurate gun pointing, poor alignment of gun and eye and many others.

The young shooters and the lady shooter, because of their physical build will always require specialist gun fitting as well as instruction in the correct way to mount and point a shotgun!

As an example of how gun mounting goes hand in hand with gun fit I'll quote a recent happening —

"A shooter whose gun I had recently fitted and made alterations to both length and pitch rang me one evening with the news that he thought I had made his stock too short. When I inquired about how he had arrived at this

• Note how the eyes are positioned above the guns action, with eyes level in their most efficient way. Head and shoulders are also in a natural upright position. A gun mounted in this way will point where the eyes are looking. All this will only happen when a gun is correctly fitted and properly mounted.



• In this drawing, the shooting eye is below the rib line. Due to his face and head being positioned too far forward and down on a stock that has too much drop at the point of comb. This practice will cause low shooting as well as a bruised cheek.

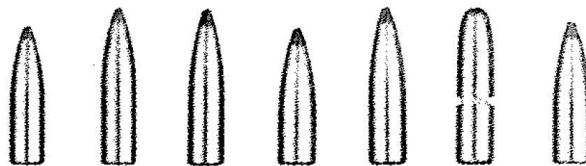

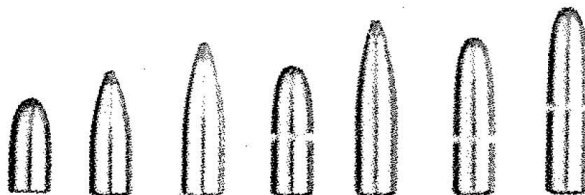

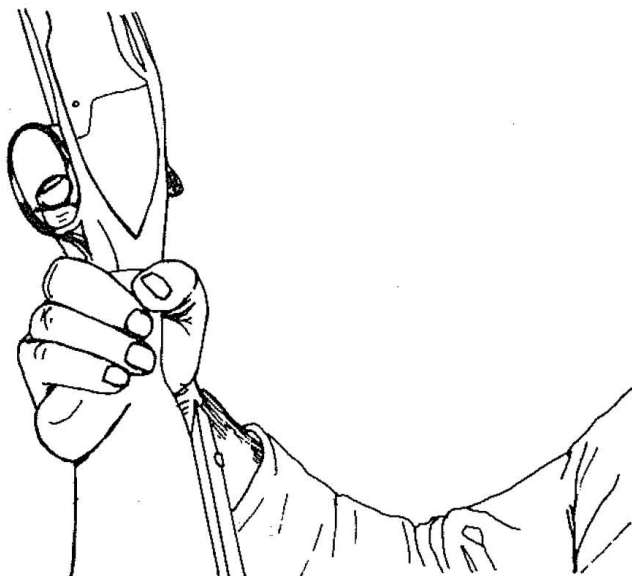

decision he said, well when I fire a shot I get a bump on the nose from my thumb which had not happened prior to the stock being altered. At this point I became aware of what was happening. He was in fact mounting his gun in the same manner he had done before it had been shortened with the butt out on his upper arm, he had forgotten how I had explained that the butt needs to be in on the shoulder where it will be closer to his face for a correct and easy gun-eye alignment. His problem was that because of incorrect mounting he had in fact made a well fitted gun appear to be too short." One other common fault is the incorrect positioning of ones hand around the pistol grip section of stock. This is the hand that more or less controls the gun through its entire movement during the act of mounting and firing. Any inconsistency here will no doubt effect ones performance, even to the point of flinching."

Unfortunately, due to limited space in this magazine it's not possible for me to go to an indepth description of all the problems and remedies associated with gun fitting. However if the reader is still interested he will find interesting reading in my recently published book titled "Trap and Skeet Shooting" available at A.C.T.A. office and most sports stores and book shops or direct from me. Price \$5.95.

In the meantime don't let anyone tell you that proper gun fit is a lot of rubbish because nothing is further from the truth. Fact is that unless your gun fits you properly, and you have been shown the correct technique of gun mounting and gun pointing you can forget about becoming a really good shot!

This position applies even more so when the shooter tries his hand at International Trench and Olympic Skeet, where precision timing, perfect gun fit and gun mounting are so important in order to put good scores on the board. ○



- Correct hand grip. This is the hand that does most in controlling the gun. It must be correctly positioned so as to prevent possible flinching.

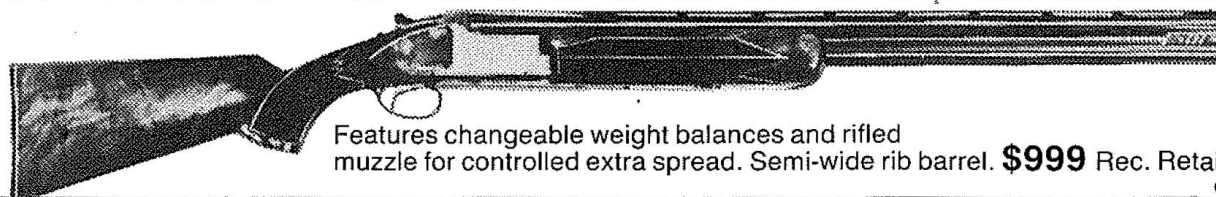

Shooters naturally have voiced their concern on this subject and since the Victorian election, many have been asking "what's next?" A legislation committee has been formed by Race Matthews, Minister for Police and Emergency Services, and it consists of Mr Phillips, Q.C., Chief Superintendent, J. Imbersen, representing the Police Department, Bob Buchan, who is heavily involved in clay target shooting administration at a club, State and National level, and the committee is chaired by Jim Kennan M.L.C. This Committee is now in operation and setting up the legislation for firearms users. Through Bob Buchan, clay target shooters can be sure of having a strong voice on this committee, and we now eagerly await the outcome of the decisions and directions that will come from this council.

Sunday 19th June, 1982

The North West Zone Council met at Callawadda Gun Club. The Zone's involvement with the ELEY school boy/girl shoot to be conducted at Callawadda Gun Club on Thursday 14th October, 1982 was discussed. The Zone Council will donate books, pertaining to shooting, for use in the school library, to all schools represented at this tournament. The project is an annual event for the Zone, and is sponsored by ELEY Ammunition. The Zone has also established a fairly substantial travel account for its shooters. At the next Zone trap carnival to be conducted at Mildura Gun Club, on the 6th and 7th November, 1982, a cash prize of \$100.00 is being offered to each of the five top shooters in the Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Points Championship. Sunday 20th June, 1982

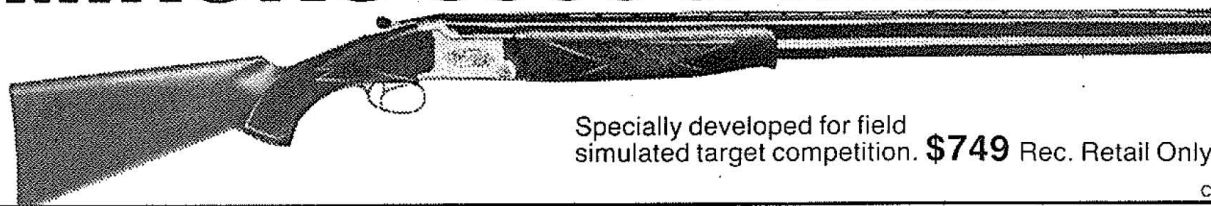

The meeting will commence at 8 p.m. The State President made a special request that all clubs be represented at this meeting.

Monday 21st, Tuesday 22nd June, 1982

The recently formed referees association met on both of these days in Melbourne to confer on the updating of our present rules, and recommend any necessary changes to the next Executive meeting in September 1982. This association has a rather difficult task in front of it. However after observing the association's actions and deliberations over the two days, it was obvious to me excellent results will emerge, providing the recommendations put to the full executive meeting to be held in September, are accepted and implemented. One of the most controversial areas to be fully investigated by the Referees Association, and receive recommendation for change was the present handicap system. All rules in our existing rule book are receiving attention and the Referees Association is making every effort to have the new rules, if accepted, introduced by 1st January, 1983.

SPORT NEWS

"SPORT FOR ALL!" This is the concept which is being offered to all sporting organisations in Australia, following a direct link which has been developed between the Life. Be in it Company, and the Confederation of Australian Sport.

The objective of the program is to use calendar year 1983 as a period during which a major promotional push will be made, using the "Life. be in it" theme, to encourage every Australian to participate in a sporting activity of his choice at his own level of competence.

Such themes as "Play it again" to encourage more mature people to return to a sport played in their younger years, and "Learn to play" to attract novices to a new activity, will be included in the overall strategy.

Many other components of the overall program are currently being planned and this column will be used extensively to keep readers informed.

"SENIOR AUSTRALIA WEEK" The thrust of this "Life. be in it" Company initiative through the Confederation is aimed at the extensive involvement of sport in the "Senior Australia Week" project, recently announced by the organisers, the Australian Council of the Ageing, and the Australian Retired Persons' Association.

Scheduled to run from October 10 to 17, the week has as its theme "Time of Your Life", and is directed at people over 50.

Sporting clubs will be asked to provide special incentives to past participants to return to the sport that had given such satisfaction and enjoyment in years past.

Over the past few months, the Confederation office has been a hive of activity as planning for the 1982 SPORT AUSTRALIA AWARDS has developed.

This year's awards will be the third annual presentation, and will maintain the high standard established in the first two years.

All the 1982 sponsors have taken up an option to support the new series, with TAA once again being the prime sponsor. Individual awards are provided by Adidas, BHP, Coca Cola, Elders - IXL, Hardys Wines, Rank Xerox, and Sports Exacto.

The performance year has been extended beyond the conventional closing date of September 30, due to the Commonwealth Games. The 1982 closing date for qualifying performances has been set at October 10, with closing date for nominations being October 31.

The presentation of 1982 SPORT AUSTRALIA AWARDS will take place at Melbourne's Southern Cross Hotel on Wednesday December 15, and will be nationally televised through the Seven Network.

Presenters will be drawn from past Australian sporting heroes, and full details will be provided at a later time.

The TAA Sports Congress, of which the SPORT AUSTRALIA AWARDS are an integral part will then continue into December 16 and 17, during which the Annual General Meetings of the Confederation of Australian Sport and the CAS Coaches Assembly will be staged.

NATIONAL SPORTS AID FOUNDATION The Confederation has submitted to the Federal Government, a proposal calling for a feasibility study into the concept of a National Sports Aid Foundation to be conducted.

The purpose of the proposal is to find a realistic and firmly based means of providing ongoing financial support for major sports projects.

Currently, the proposal is receiving consideration by the Minister for Home Affairs and Environment, the Hon D. T. McVeigh, who came into the portfolio as a result of the Cabinet reshuffle announced by Prime Minister Fraser in early May.

VISIT BY NOTED EXPATRIATE SPORTS PSYCHOLOGIST During July and August, a series of coaching workshops is being conducted around Australia, featuring one of the best known sports psychologists in the western world.

He is Dr. Brent Rushall, an Australian currently based at Canada's Lakehead University at Thunder Bay.

Dr. Rushall has been brought to Australia as a CAS initiative, and the costs of the visit had been partially underwritten by the State Governments of Queensland, South Australia and Victoria, the Rothmans National Sports Foundation, and the Canberra College of Advanced Education.

The first workshop was held at Melbourne's Monash University during the first weekend in July, and was a complete sellout. Over 180 people crammed into the lecture theatre to hear Dr. Rushall present some very provocative and practical suggestions in relation to motivating athletes to produce higher levels of performance.

Similar workshops were then conducted in Sydney, Brisbane and Adelaide, after which Dr. Rushall then presented a series of lectures at the Canberra Institute of Advanced Education, and the Australian Institute of Sport.

A recent seminar, convened by the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Liberal Party of Victoria with a theme "South Africa — Australia's Policy Options", clearly demonstrated the level of interest in sport reflected by political devotees.

The activity attracted an attendance of around seventy people, who were offered a range of theme activities during the workshop part of the program.

These were: Human Rights Session
Sporting Session
Defence Session

The sports point of view was to be put by Jim Barry, Chairman of the Sports Advisory Council and a Director of the Confederation of Australian Sport, and Garry Daly CAS Executive Director.

Of the total attendance, so few delegates indicated a desire to participate in the sport discussion that the format was changed whereby two general discussion groups were formed. Interestingly enough, one delegate indicating a desire to attend the sporting session was His Excellency, Mr Olu Sanu, High Commissioner for Nigeria.

If it is accepted that the seminar was directed towards people who are politically aware, it quickly becomes obvious that sport was not high in their list of priorities.

There is a vital urgency for politicians and their supporters to be educated that SPORT DOES MATTER. Sportspeople do think . . . and they vote too! Some people seem keen to forget that last bit.

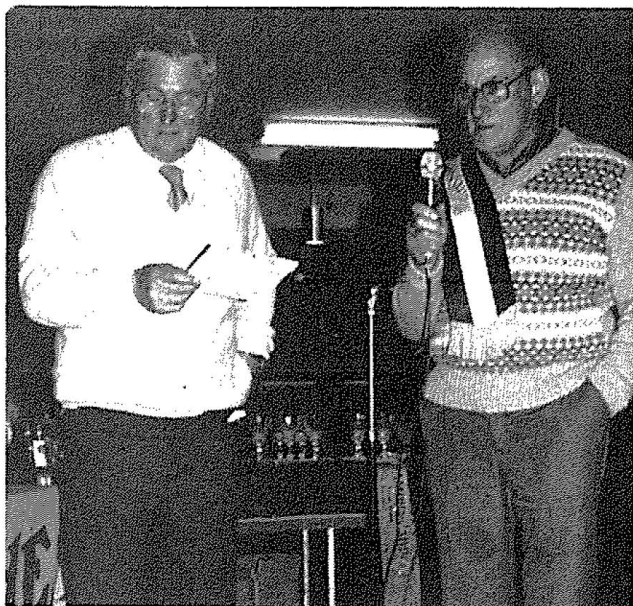

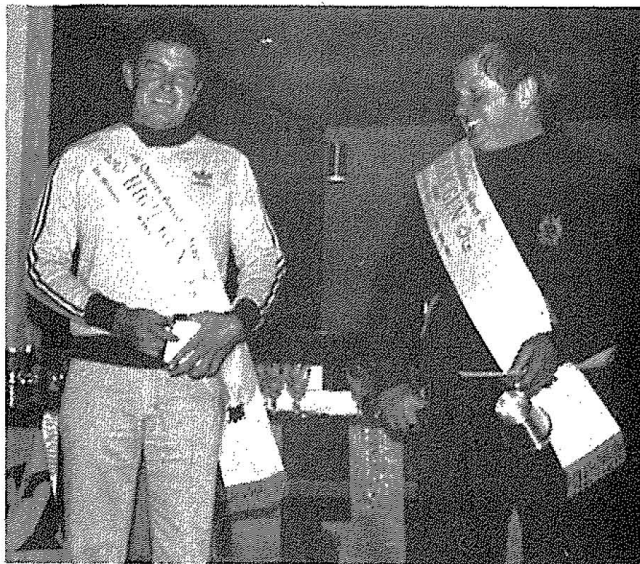

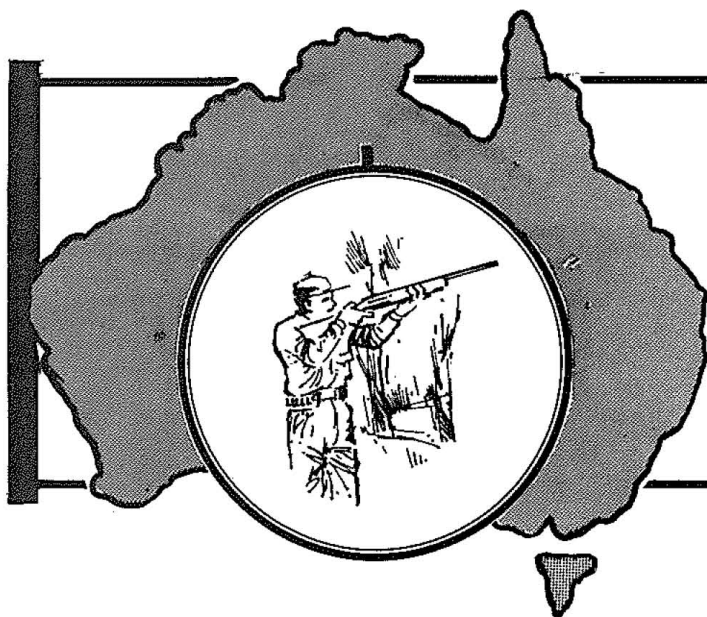

keeping the books balanced and the unloading and loading of large consignments of cartridges.

The use of homeloards at the Nationals would mean a reduction or loss of profit from the sale of cartridges to the A.C.T.A. This could be offset by the possible increase in revenue from increased numbers nominating in events at the Nationals. There would be always a sale for factory loaded cartridges at the Nationals.

When the subject of homeloards for the Nationals is raised the argument is raised that it was defeated at the A.C.T.A. Annual General Meeting at the 1977 Nationals. It is therefore time that it be taken back to the shooters for consideration.

With ever increasing costs associated with this sport and the cost of attending Nationals held Interstate the A.C.T.A. should be looking at all means of reducing the cost to the shooter at the Nationals.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

There are several points in favor of the permitting of the use of homeloaded cartridges for use at the Nationals. I shall endeavour to highlight some of these in point form below:—

1. Cost to the Competitor:

The requirement to use only branded cartridges is probably the biggest deterrent to the average shooter to attend the Nationals. This can be said even when they are held in the shooter's home state.

If a shooter wishes to shoot in one event of 50 targets at the Nationals, he has to purchase at least three packets of cartridges. This applies even in a single barrel event allowing for a sighter and possible malfunctions. The purchase of branded cartridges is likely to cost around double the cost of using homeloaded cartridges.

The price of the Nomination is a major cost to the average shooter without requiring him to pay more for his cartridges.

2. The Myth of Equality of Competition:

One of the main arguments in favor of branded cartridges at the Nationals for all competitors is that all the shells are standard loads ensuring equality of competition. This may be so in the lead content of each cartridge but there are rules to cover incorrectly loaded homeloaded cartridges.

The requirement to use branded cartridges also discriminates against the shooter that uses homeloards throughout the year. He shoots all year with his homeloards and is used to the speed of them but in the Nationals he is required to try and select a cartridge that he hopes will match his homeloards.

The shooter that is "sponsored" or wealthier and can afford to use new cartridges for most of the year must have an advantage over the shooter that is required to change his cartridges for the Nationals.

There is a possibility that there would be more malfunctions using homeloards at the Nationals although there seems to be little trouble in the Grand Australian Handicap where homeloards are permitted. Also there has been a lot of malfunction with branded cartridges at recent Nationals and there are rules to cover this problem.

3. Easier on Referees:

Having had experience at refereeing at the Nationals, I realise that referees have too much to do to worry about the type of cartridge being used. It is almost impossible to detect someone using unbranded cartridges unless there is a malfunction or they are noticed on the ground amongst several hundred spent cases. The permitted use of homeloards would make it easier on the already hard pushed referees.

4. Handling of Cartridges at the Nationals.

This seems to be a problem at most Nationals with the provision of adequate security needed to house the cartridges on the grounds. Problems seem to have arisen in the past concerning areas such as sale and distribution of cartridges,

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

May I be given space as was Bill Delaney given for his remarks in relation to the Victorian State Elections and the possible outcome.

Bill made a general attack on all of the stated 430,000 State registered shooters as being the reason for the Election result.

It would appear that the vast majority of the said shooters felt that shooting generally is a pastime rather than their bread and butter and while we may be faced with changes in legislation in respect to shooters, or those who intend to become shooters, it remains that the genuine shooter has little if anything to be hysterical over.

I am convinced that rather than we Clay Target Shooters becoming entangled in political matters, there is much more we can be doing, united in our endeavours to improve shooting standards for all concerned rather than taking unnecessary steps that could ruin all we have achieved in the past.

I read and was most annoyed at Bill's assumption that it was strictly due to the ALP's political statement made on the matter of firearm control that cost our sister Club Lysterfield, and her supporters a great deal of money to win approval to continue to operate at the present site.

Everyone will no doubt dispute his line of thinking as the legal battle for and against Lysterfield was at Falkland pitch long long before an Election was mooted or any proposed alteration to firearm control discussed.

Trap shooting has become much more costly over the recent years and this is the major reason if there has been a drop off in shooter activity. So can we ask the producers of the necessary components, to reduce prices in an honest endeavour to retain the number of shooters we have at this point of time then maybe we won't lose Mr W. J. Burlison and family Vol. 35 No. 5.

Whilst I have pen in hand may I finish with a paragraph relating to the letter in Vol. 35 No. 5 from Cecil Herbert, in respect to his mentioning America and their methods of trap shooting. We live in Australia and we shoot in Australia so why for Gods sake must we Americanize our shooting standards. There are many other countries who have equal or better methods than the narrow angles and the dead tired targets the Americans shoot at.

Finally after having been connected with trap shooting within the A.C.T.A.'s control for over 25 years it would seem to me that the things wrong with Clay Target Shooting today is that too many Clubs want to get rich, too many shooters

expect to make a living out of trap shooting, and too many critics sit on their rumps give orders and condemn, the real genuine member who mixes success or not with assisting the respective clubs they attend, the social side of trap shooting, and the joy of seeing Clay targets being broken whether it is by themselves or fellow trap shooters.

FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

I am pleased to report that Greg Chan of Darwin has been appointed State Coaching Director for the Northern Territory, congratulations Greg. I am looking forward to meeting the Coaching Team in the Northern Territory soon.

Clay Target Shooting is advantaged in many ways by the National Coaching Scheme. Firstly by providing the sport with coaches at the National, State, Zone and club levels who are of a uniformly high standard, who are recognised by Government authorities, because they are accredited with the Confederation of Australian Sports Coaches Assembly — C.A.S.C.A. They are not just people appointed to coach, but are accredited coaches in a National Scheme that includes all of the major National and International sports, it gives us recognition as a sport of National importance. Since we have joined the C.A.S.C.A. accreditation scheme, clay target shooting has attracted funds and assistance from Government departments both Federal and State.

The framework of C.A.S.C.A. provided the opportunity for coaches to improve their abilities as coaches through coaching seminars and self learning.

In the last two months I have attended two (2) such seminars, one in Tamworth N.S.W. which was organised by Barney Rooke, New South Wales State Coaching Director. This was a wonderful learning experience for all of us in attendance.

Barney utilized the facilities and the personnel of the N.S.W.

Dept. of Sport and Recreation. The representative of the Department was impressed by the standard of our N.S.W. Coaches and the accreditation course work. Western Australia held a Coaching week-end with similar success, with all of us who attended benefiting from the exchange of knowledge. This seminar in Perth was arranged by Tim Catling the W.A. Coaching Director, with the W.A. Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation paying for my air fares. Both these coaching events gave coaches a chance to help each other and to share their experiences, as well as gain new or broader knowledge from speakers. Western Australia now has all of its coaches accredited at Level 1 in the National Coach Accreditation scheme, as has S.A. New South Wales, Queensland and Northern Territory are well on the way.

No coach will be eligible to attain Level II unless they are accredited at Level I, so please coaches, if you are not accredited with C.A.S.C.A. approach your Zone Coach or State Director, while we, as a sport can still make retrospective accreditations for only a payment of \$6.00 which is sent to me with your name and address, I then forward this on with the paper work to C.A.S.C.A. If you are not accredited by October of this year it will be necessary for you to pass and attend a course to attain this accreditation.

It has been a great pleasure for me to meet with so many coaches throughout Australia. I am proud of our Clay Target Coaches and the work they do.

Saturday morning was the start of a very long day — 9 a.m. to 10.30 p.m. Mr Ian Robertson from the Department of Sports and Recreation was our lecturer for most of the day and I wish to state Ian is an extremely talented lecturer. This job was given to Ian at the last minute and to lecture to a group of clay target coaches with no prior knowledge of our sport showed just how good this man is, his ability to communicate and his knowledge of the subjects was very evident by the attention shown by all coaches.

I received many comments afterwards from the coaches about how well they understood Ian on all subjects. Ian covered in his lectures psychology of sports, strength and skill training, physical fitness and sports injury, our sincere thanks to Ian for a first class performance.

Ian Hale, zone coach from Vic. then spoke for the next two hours on sports specific, this is the finer points on the sport and how, by knowledge of the extreme finer points of the game can help the coach to eliminate problems very quickly, and hasten the pupils learning and iron out problems more quickly. He went on and spoke of the different aspects that motivate a sportsman or woman into acquiring the correct skills that will enhance the performance. He then went into the different areas that the coach may encounter at his or her club with learners and competent shooters. It was emphasised that the club coach allot his time properly so that he is a benefit to the people he is coaching and with proper work allotment can still enjoy his own sport.

I must once again congratulate Ian Hale on a well presented lecture, it is always great to listen to a lecturer who really knows his subjects and can present them in a professional way. Thanks Ian for all you did.

Sunday, after breakfast we all headed for the Tamworth Gun Club for practical sports specific on both skeet and trap. The coaches first shot skeet, with Ian Hale and myself teaching the coaches the correct fundamentals of skeet, in both how to shoot it and how to teach it. The video was used and after the coaches had shot a round of skeet, they moved to the club house to look at their performance on film.

The unanimous decision was that video does pick up things that the coach sometimes does not see and when used correctly is a valuable teaching aid.

We were even given the opportunity of teaching a complete novice shooter when Ian Robertson and his wife arrived, very soon we had Ian hitting targets.

Peter Quire with the help of zone coaches Dick Toshack, Rob Ubergang and Col Burt handled the D.T.L., again using video with equal success. The seminar finished up around 3.30 p.m.

I would like to end this report with sincere thanks to the Department of Sports and Recreation for their generous support and for providing a lecturer of the quality of Ian Robertson. Our thanks to Peter Quire, his presence was greatly appreciated by all coaches especially those that took the time to speak to Peter about their problems and achievements. Ian Hale who drove all the way from Melbourne. Pud Burgess and Rob Parker for their tremendous support.

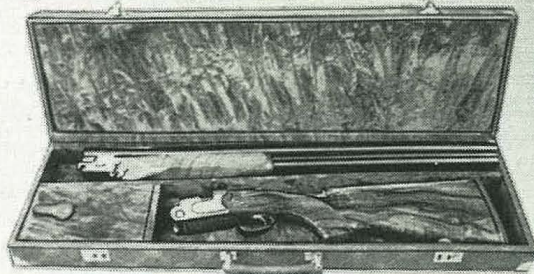
