EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

As these notes are written, the New Rules have been operating for only four days. A couple of reports to hand indicate a smooth transition from the old to the new.

Of particular interest to me is the acceptance of the rule regarding refusals, as there has been much comment since the New Rules were published. At two shoots over the New Year weekend the total of refusals was one, and this was a very obvious fast pull.

It's early days but the first reactions are promising.

What has 1983 got in store for clay target shooters. Legislation will still be a big talking point. Victoria will certainly have new Firearms legislation this year, as it did not make the Parliament in the Spring session of 1982. Other States? - we'll have to wait and see. There were a few rumblings from the Queensland police late in 1982, and New South Wales is reportedly waiting to see the Victorian

legislation before making a move. We are all aware of the economic situation throughout the country, no doubt this will have some effect on clay target shooting. I am interested that some clubs are meeting the problem head on, by arranging economy days where shooters compete for badges instead of trophies, at reduced nominations. An interesting move this one, and one which is bound to spread. I'm told the atmosphere at such shoots is excellent, with everybody shooting for fun and enjoying themselves. This is what sport and recreation is all about for the majority of people. Let it long continue.

We have the Trap Nationals in Adelaide in April, plans are well advanced for staging the series.

The first Skeet Nationals are planned for Melbourne in November, with the dedicated skeeties keen to make this four day affair a success.

The ISU shooters will gather in Melbourne around the latter part of April to contest the Commonwealth and National titles in Skeet and Trap. The World Moving Target Championships will be held in Edmonton, Canada, in June and there will probably be an Olympic warm-up in Los Angeles in July/ August, so plenty will be happening in readiness for 1984.

HANDICAPPING **NATIONALS 1983**

As I have once again been appointed Handicapper for the Nationals and because of the great change in handicapping formulas, I find it necessary to set down guide lines to make it easier for you - the shooter.

This year we have a new design handicap card which should make it a lot easier to keep your progressive scores on. Also each club should by now have an independent club handicapper, this again should make it easier for you and me when checking your cards at the Nationals. Because the new handicapping rules adjustment of cards could be a lengthy process, that is why the following will be strictly enforced:

1. All current 1983 handicap cards, regardless of your grade, along with your up to date 1982 card, will be required by me for checking before you nominate (pre Nationals and Nationals).

2. All handicap cards must be stamped by me before nominations will be accepted.

3. No nomination will be accepted if your handicap card is unavailable unless your grade handicap trap and skeet is confirmed by your club secretary on a statutory declaration form.

4. If a statutory declaration form is signed you will be allowed to shoot, but any trophies won will remain with the A.C.T.A. until your handicap and grade is verified by the Executive Committee.

5. Unless you are a new shooter or haven't shot for a long period and you present your handicap card not filled in or only with the club stamp and no score (event or targets shot) your handicap will be AA grade, AA or O skeet and 25 metres handicap (this is your responsibility, make sure club secretaries fill in your cards correctly.)

6. Any crossouts or errors on cards will not be acceptable. 7. If an error is made on your card have your club secretary neatly rule out the error, rewrite it in correctly, stamp and sign it.

8. Any obvious low score entered on handicap cards just prior to the nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration (Rule 106).

9. Please watch the handicap board. If your name appears on the board please report to me.

10. If you do not wish to be down graded or have your handicap meterage moved forward, please advise.

11. I will make myself available for advice on any handicapping problems you might have only on the days of the National Double Rise and the National Single Barrel, not when you nominate, as you can realise I will be too busy with the new adjustments.

12. Remember to fill in your cards at all times, i.e. all events other than those not applicable.

Good shooting and see you in Adelaide.

GUN SAFETY: THE FIRST AMENDMENT:

All registered members of a gun club and the A.C.T.A. must accept the shared responsibility of always policing the new comers to their clubs. Learners must learn and clubs must have new shooters. The A.C.T.A. can only survive with lots of new blood being invited and accepted into the network of clubs Australia wide.

A rather shocking incident has happened before this writers eyes twice in the last few years. The last one just a few weeks ago. Fate (if you care to call it that) had me standing within close proximity, in each of these two individual, but identical incidents. By being alert and acting swiftly and with conviction, I hope I managed to save a very disastrous accident from taking place.

A (learner) shooter on the tracks, fired (in each case) one shot from his gun (then placed the unbroken gun's barrels down on his foot) before opening its action, thus rendering the gun safe again. (In both cases there was a second cartridge in the chamber). Plus, in both cases the referee and or coach failed to notice these incidents; I'm sure there is no need for me to elaborate on their chances of staying strongtwo-footed-young men for long, with such a stupid habit. Sure, I blame each of them for such mental incompetence. But I also take to task, the clubs who fail to take and accept care for new shooters joining their ranks.

No matter if the shooter has shot in the field or not. This further emphasises my complaint of long. No referee or coach should handle a squad without the assistance of a scorer, thereby allowing the referee, full visual command of the shooters under his control.

Just in case you did not know it, that's why there is a referee there in the first place. To control the shooters. Plus, and this is a big plus: No new shooters should be left without an experienced member, preferably a senior member, to ensure the vital pointers of safety are first and paramount at all times.

Makes you wonder how many times acts of non-safety go un-noticed!!!

• A major factor that is often missing from some clubs, but which is foremost at Marconi, is atmosphere. It's a commodity you can't buy, borrow or steal. You either have it, or you don't. You can't show it as a tax-deduction, and you can't include it in a stock-take of your clubs capital equipment.

A gun club or any business for that matter, may have the most modern machinery, the most established location and the best advertising campaign around. Why do many clubs and businesses fail (putting aside poor business management a moment). Often the reason they fail and go into a down turn is lack of that one invisible commodity, atmosphere, and the

AROUND THE TRAPS

Sunday, November 28, 1982

Under the Chairmanship of our National Coaching Director, Peter Quire, the National Coaching Council met in Mebourne. All States were represented by their State Coaching Directors. They were: NSW Barney Rooke, Victoria George Biggs, South Australia Peter Quire, Western Australia Tim Catling, Queensland Bill Stevens, Tasmania Robbie Elmer and the Northern Territory Greg Chan.

All States reported on coaching activities within their States, with the Northern Territory showing great progress after suffering from lack of interest through not having the services of a State Coaching Director for more than 12 months.

It was reported from this State they would be conducting their first ever Coaching Seminar in December, 1982 at the Katherine Gun Club, with all their club coaches being present. National Coaching Director, Peter Quire, was also to be in attendance to add assistance.

A point I observed from this meeting was the fact, all States should have an assistant or junior State Coaching Director, working in conjunction with their elected State Coaching Director, to enable a carry on situaton, should the need arise.

Some State Coaching Directors that have been operating for several years now, and given excellent service to coaching, have indicated they intend to relinquish their positions. The wealth of knowledge these fellows hold on our sport in coaching should be passed on to whoever is likely to fill their positon. This could be achieved by attaining the services of an assistant or Junior Coaching Director in all States.

National Coaching Director, Peter Quire presented the Associations Level 2 Coaching Accreditation course outline. This will be implemented in all States and I strongly recommend all coaches interested to make the time and effort necessary to gain level 2 accreditation. The course is not a push-over, however, I feel dedicated coaches will attain Level 2 Accreditation.

All coaching projects conducted by State, Zones or Clubs should be recorded and forwarded to the National Coaching Director, to assist in compiling statistics on our coaching activities throughout Australia. It is also valued information that can be used when making applicaton for grants and financial assistance to the various Government departments, at Federal and State level.

It was reported at the recent Coaching Council meeting, under our coaching scheme, of the coaching seminars recorded, some 183 coaching sessions took place throughout Australia using 714.5 hours of time, and costing \$11,716.30. 2,184 experienced shooters and 2,600 novice shooters received some form of assistance from Australian Clay Target Association accredited coaches.

Sunday, November 28, 1982

After the State Coaching Council meeting had concluded I took a run out to Melbourne Gun Club. Melbourne were conducting a club shoot with Wangaratta Gun Club as their guests. Inter-club visits are made by both clubs each year, and have been going on for nine years. Wangaratta is 235 kilometres from Melbourne and a bus is used to transport shooters and others who like to make the trip to the host club.

My arrival time saw the end of the shooting program, as well as the presentation of trophies to the various winners by Melbourne Gun Club President, Bob Buchan. Wangaratta honoured their club colors by winning the inter-club DTL team shoot. The team consisted of Dick English, Bob Barron, Gary Robertson, Brian North and Kevin "Grumpy" Law, their combined score 375-400.

Melbourne, known as one of the top skeet shooting clubs around, to the delight of President Bob, won the skeet team challenge. Paul Krumins, Alan Blease, Ian Hale, Brian Thomson and Gil Farish made up the team and shot 239-250 to beat Wangaratta.

REFEREE AND SCORERS CHAIR

Vic Reinders from Waukesha Gun Club Wisconsin, USA, is known to many Australian Clay Target shooters.

He recently sent details to Tim Catling, Western Australian Coaching Director, of a referee and scorers chair in use at his club in the U.S.

Brief details of manufacture, measurements etc, follow:

Frame made from 1 inch water pipe, with all joints welded. The shape of the feet, rounded instead of square corners make it easier to slide the chair around. The board to hold the squad sheets is hinged to an angle iron welded to the top of the front legs of the chair. It can be raised to make it easier for the scorer to get in and out.

The pipe frame of the chair is 45 inches wide at the bottom and 22 inches at the top. The greatest dimension front to back is 49 inches. It is 21 inches from the ground to the top of the foot rest, and 42 inches to the top of the seat, which is 24 inches wide. It is 39 inches to the top of the angle iron to which the score board is hinged. Note the wire basket behind the seat, with its two sections. This is for squad sheets. The hinged score board support is made of plywood, and has a "track" into which a masonite board is slid. This sliding board holds the score sheets with a hinged wooden or plastic strip, top and bottom. Ô

This remarkable man travelled to clubs all over the state, not only with myself, but with many of his mates from the NSW Gun Club. I'm proud to be able to say, Jimmy and myself shared not only a common interest, but a comradeship beyond the firing line. His happy, straight-forward nature, and consideration to me, could be best described as similar to a father and son relationship.

When I first joined the clay target sports, it was Jimmy Hastie who took me under his wing and put the polish on my rough edges. If today, I can walk onto the tracks in a shooting event and perform the correct way, it is thanks to his unstinting teaching ability. He set a shining example to all, and his ability as a referee is legendary. No matter if you were the world's best shot, or just an average weekend shooter, Jimmy treated them all on equal terms. Strict to the point of perfection, he was the sports ultimate clay shooting referee. I don't think there is a shooter of stature, in this country who has not shot under his command, at some time in their life. Coincidentally, we shared the same birthday, November 26th. Coincidentally, he passed away on that day. He fired his last shot in competition with this scribe, at the opening of the new Illawarra Gun Club, back around 1976. The event was a Deauville Doubles championship. Jimmy partnered me, and I'm sure any who remember that day will recall how I missed one of my clays with both barrels.

Jimmy shot his and swung over to smash my still unbroken clay two feet from the ground. The thunder of applause all the watchers gave him will be the way I would like to always remember him. Besides, it's the way Jimmy would have wanted it. The good times, the happy times, the shared experience we all remember over the comb of a good shot gun.

Shooters from the NSW Gun Club joined his wonderful and loving lifetime companion and wife Vera, at the chapel of the Northern Suburbs Crematorium on Monday, November 29, to pay their respects. Jimmy Hastie may have left us . . . but he will not be forgotten. We have all been richly rewarded by his presence among us, but more than that, we can all call ourselves fortunate men, because we were privileged to call him our friend. We will never see his like again.

NATIONAL ATHLETE AWARD SCHEME GRANTS FOR 1983 ANNOUNCED

A number of Australia's successful athletes at the Brisbane Commonwealth Games have been offered financial awards by the Commonwealth Government to encourage them to continue in their sport and improve their performances.

The awards, under the Government's National Athlete Award Scheme, were announced by the Minister for Home Affairs and Environment, Mr Tom McVeigh.

Among those athletes receiving awards are Robert de Castella, winner of the memorable Brisbane marathon, Lisa Curry who won three gold medals in swimming in Brisbane. and the members of Australia's gold medal pursuit cycling team.

Mr McVeigh said that the Scheme operated on two levels. "The majority of funds are allocated to Australia's world

ranked amateur athletes and teams to help compensate them for the costs associated with their sporting careers. "A limited number of awards go to young sportspeople who

have demonstrated outstanding potential and are likely soon to become world ranked."

Awards for individuals range from \$1000 to \$3500 and the team awards are from \$4000 to \$12 000.

"The scheme has been operating since 1981 and its success in this time has been very encouraging," the Minister said.

"Many of the athletes who performed so well in Brisbane received awards under the Scheme in 1981 and 1982 and a number of them have told the Government the awards contributed to their success.

The awards have been based on a review of performances of all current amateur Australian sportsmen and sportswomen who have achieved international recognition in the past year.

While many awards have gone to well known sporting identities, lesser known athletes in sports such as trampoline, barefoot water skiing and powerlifting also have received assistance.

Among the 10 teams assisted are the Australian Men's Basketball team, which was placed fifth in the recent world championship and the Australian Men's Hockey team which is currently defending its No 2 world ranking in the Esanda World Tournament in Melbourne.

A list of athletes and teams who have been granted awards for 1982 is attached.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Ian,

Over many more years than I care to think of, I have listened to and read of advice by experts, how to successfully shoot clay targets. They have a variety of methods to deal with, "left swingers, right swingers, quartering targets and even one particular target was said to have "a Hook." Just how that came about I am not too certain, unless it was to make things easier for the shooter or shooters who in despair decided as I have often heard "to give it all up ad go fishing!!"

Out of all this one basic rule on which nearly everyone agrees is "it is necessary to keep ones eye above the rib and to do this place two pennies on the rib over the action. In order to gauge the correct eye level above the rib.
