



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Trap Nationals Adelaide

As we move closer to the Nationals, it's timely to mention a few of the changes that will take place at Adelaide.

Firstly a reminder that Black targets will be used, and that all events will be conducted in one visit to the trap. For these Nationals the 50 targets will be shot on the one trap.

Shooters will pause after 25 targets to refill pockets with shells but enough ammunition must be taken to the layout to cover the 50 targets.

All events will be shot 5 targets per lane before changing lanes including shoot-offs, where miss and out will still apply.

Veterans will be those shooters 65 years of age and over at the time of the Nationals, and Juniors will be those under 17 years at that time. Ladies and Juniors will be charged half nominations and will be eligible to win all trophies applicable to any competitor.

The Nationals will be shot in four grades, AA, A, B, and C.

New Rules

A month has gone by under the new shooting rules, the comments from around the country are generally favourable. Despite fears in some minds, the rule regarding refusals has been well accepted, and is working well. Not so I am told is the "wad in the barrel" rule, this one seems to be the big talking point.

The Referee's Association delegates are currently looking at some of the rules to clarify the interpretation.

ELEY — NEWTON THOMAS AWARD

Clubs are reminded that nominations for the 1983 Eley — Newton Thomas Award close with the National office on March 31.

This award which was first presented at the 1982 National Championships, is for the person who has done most to promote Clay Target Shooting in the previous twelve months.

Nominations should be supported by full documentation, so that the Executive Committee may select the winner at a meeting during the National Championships in Adelaide. The award will be presented at the Presentation Dinner following the Championships. ○

HANDICAPPING NATIONALS 1983

As I have once again been appointed Handicapper for the Nationals and because of the great change in handicapping formulas, I find it necessary to set down guide lines to make it easier for you — the shooter.

This year we have a new design handicap card which should make it a lot easier to keep your progressive scores on. Also each club should by now have an independent club handicapper, this again should make it easier for you and me when checking your cards at the Nationals. Because the new handicapping rules adjustment of cards could be a lengthy process, that is why the following will be strictly enforced:

1. All current 1983 handicap cards, regardless of your grade, along with your up to date 1982 card, will be required by me for checking before you nominate (pre Nationals and Nationals).

2. All handicap cards must be stamped by me before nominations will be accepted.

3. No nomination will be accepted if your handicap card is unavailable unless your grade handicap trap and skeet is confirmed by your club secretary on a statutory declaration form.

4. If a statutory declaration form is signed you will be allowed to shoot, but any trophies won will remain with the A.C.T.A. until your handicap and grade is verified by the Executive Committee.

5. Unless you are a new shooter or haven't shot for a long period and you present your handicap card not filled in or only with the club stamp and no score (event or targets shot) your handicap will be AA grade, AA or O skeet and 25 metres handicap (this is your responsibility, make sure club secretaries fill in your cards correctly.)

6. Any crossouts or errors on cards will not be acceptable.

7. If an error is made on your card have your club secretary neatly rule out the error, rewrite it in correctly, stamp and sign it.

8. Any obvious low score entered on handicap cards just prior to the nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration (Rule 106).

9. Please watch the handicap board. If your name appears on the board please report to me.

10. If you do not wish to be down graded or have your handicap meterage moved forward, please advise.


11. I will make myself available for advice on any handicapping problems you might have only on the days of the National Double Rise and the National Single Barrel, not when you nominate, as you can realise I will be too busy with the new adjustments.

12. Remember to fill in your cards at all times, i.e. all events other than those not applicable.

Good shooting and see you in Adelaide.




• Peter Wilson pictured with the Newton Thomas Junior Award Medal for 1982.




• Victorian Executive member Bob Buchan made the Presentation to Peter Wilson.

AN AGE OF IMMATURITY:



On the 7th November 1982 at the Sunshine Coast Gun Club, the first ever Inter-Schools Teams Match was conducted.

Students came from Miami High School, Palm Beach/Currumbin High School, Caloundra High School, and one representative from Kenmore High School.

This was the start of something really big in the Q.C.T.A. Arena, with over thirty students in all attending. The Terranora Lakes gun club has been coaching the two Gold Coast High Schools students, and they proved too strong for the local boys.

The students all shot three five target S.B. elimination events, to be selected into their school team. Winchester Australia donated a beautiful Perpetual Trophy, plus individual trophies for the winning team members. Our sincere THANKS go to Mr B. Dupuy who also donated the cartridges for the teams event. This Association is proud to be associated with a Company who supports Junior Shooting as strongly as Winchester has done.

The winning team was MIAMI HIGH SCHOOL with a score of 69/100.

Their team consisted of B. McNamara; J. Anderson; R. Watson; S. Wyatt; T. Roseblatt; P. Fray.

Palm Beach Team came second and Caloundra came third.

The High Gun Winner for the Day was B. McNamara of Miami with a score of 29/35. The Runner-up trophy went to D. Dupuy who represented Kenmore High School 24/35. The Most Improved on the Day went to J. Francis of Caloundra.

The day was enjoyed by the shooters as well as they watched the boys compete and according to Miami High School spokesman, they don't intend to relinquish this trophy easily. So all Schools had better be prepared to shoot very well next year when the event will take place at the Terranora Lakes Gun Club on the 6th November 1983.

Spokesmen for the Terranora Lakes Gun Club Mr B. Riddler has asked shooters from other clubs in Q'land to take up the challenge and compete with their local school students next year.

The obvious reason given by most clubs is the lack of time by shooters to assist during school hours. Well here is a challenge for you, Terranora Lakes can do two Schools, surely you can do it for one. Here is a chance for clubs to use the services of many of our veteran shooters who have retired. I am sure, if they were asked, they would be delighted and welcome the opportunity to participate in the sport in this manner. Think about it and discuss it with your club members.

It is also a great way to introduce new members to our sport, and to give it GOOD PUBLICITY. As a result of this activity at Terranora, 2500 students from two High Schools, are at least aware that the sport exists. This is a good start in the right direction. One other fact is the media in general. There is hardly ever any good publicity connected with

firearms these days, so this type of promotion must rub some good off onto the clubs which become involved.

Bob Riddler believes that the time has come where we must show the community at large that, not only do we say that we are a responsible organization, but that we are doing something to prove it. Safe gun handling has to be taught so let us stand up in the community in which we live and do our bit to bring this about.

The problem of distance in Queensland is NO PROBLEM, if enough other schools show interest, this event will be held on a Postal system for schools which can not attend the club where the Match is being conducted.

The students, coaches and club officials who attended this the first match look forward to meeting new faces at the next INTERSCHOOL TEAMS MATCH to be held at the Terranora Lakes Gun Club on 6th NOVEMBER 1983.

Before closing this report I would like to express this Associations Sincere Thanks to all shooters who assisted, and particularly to Bob Riddler for his above comments.

A number of their traps are installed and in operation at many clubs I have attended. They are economical to buy and throw a good target. Their new model was in operation at the shoot, and I was given the opportunity to inspect the machine. It sells at about \$1,800.00 including tax, and has a proven performance over all tests. Ararat Gun Club conducted their first shoot for 1983, under rough windy conditions, the weather did not deter shooters from entering the events. 



Sunday January 23, 1983



Monday 24 to Friday 28 January, 1983

With the first month of 1983 nearly over, I had reason to spend a few days at the A.C.T.A. office. The new rules implemented at the beginning of this year, although discussed at every club, I have attended, seem to me, to be well accepted by shooters and club administrators generally. The club is undoubtedly one of the best equipped in Australia for clay target shooting, and requires a large voluntary work force to operate an afternoon club shoot. FROM THE DESK OF THE NATIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

This month I would like to talk briefly about the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme. The State Directors and Zone Coaches have done an excellent job, in that the Australian Clay Target Association now has 191 Coaches accredited at Level 1 in the National Scheme. All accreditations are now directed by the State Directors through me, as National Coaching Director. This enables me to keep a register of all the accredited Coaches, and chase up problems with C.A.S.C.A., whose registration fee is now \$8 not \$6.

All State Coaching Directors, who are, by the way members of the Clay Target Association National Coaching Council, now have copies of the Level 2 Course which has been accepted by C.A.S.C.A. and the Department of Home Affairs. The Directors also have the reference reading material that accompanies the course. It is hoped that Zone Coaches in particular will be interested in Attaining Level 2 status.

I will be looking forward to meeting many of you at the Nationals again this year, hopefully most of the State Coaching Directors will also be present, all of whom are always willing to give advice if asked.

The Coach in the sport of Clay Target Shooting holds a very important place in the administration structure. Our sport, as I keep telling those not familiar with it, has no bars of age or sex or physical make up, as do many other sports. It is safe, and we don't see the bad sportsmanship so obvious in some sports. It has a large social enjoyment element, this being so the Coach acts not only as a teacher of skills, but to increase the enjoyment of the sport by all kinds of people at many levels.



SATURDAY NIGHT FEVER:

A couple of my younger shooting mates consider themselves disco-denizens, . . . and even go so far as to fancy themselves pretty hot stuff at the disco-beat. It came as no surprise to me to learn, that when a fire broke out in a well known city disco, that all the dancers which just happened to include my feet stamping shooting exponent mates, did not notice it. So infected with the boogie fever, that they thought the blaze was an opulent special effect.

First the room filled up with smoke, Groovy. Then an inch of water flooded the dance floor, Far out, outrageous. Then, to top it off six truly intense MACHO-MEN marched across the dance floor all wearing exciting fire helmets and black-rubber raincoats. Wow. It was only then that one of our eagle-eyed shooting mates at long last spotted the rest of the act . . . real big red FIRE TRUCKS, parked on the street below, with red lights flashing. I have it from good authority, at this point in time our clay busters came to their alleged senses . . . and split the scene.

SAINT, SINNER AND DIRTY HARRY!!!

The best form of defence they tell me, is attack. Walking along minding my own business at a gun club not long ago, I came face to face with a new shooter and his cheap pump gun pointing right at me WITH THE ACTION CLOSED. Letting out a . . . "Yaaarggh-mug" — more from shock than anything, and as the blood rushed back into my momentarily ashen face, I blurted out . . . "Whatsortashotgunnerwouldyabe??" without so much as one breath in between.

I favoured him with a look of sardonic contempt, in a manner befitting a James BOND, arched one eyebrow in a somewhat quizzical look of amazement at his gun-handling manners, and fixed him with the chill blue eyes of a Clint Eastwood, as I added. MASTER YOUR CONCENTRATION TO WIN:

Success in any sporting endeavour, requires the ability to achieve mental discipline. In shooting it's one of the major factors in failure or success. Last month I covered the PERSONALITY factor. Here we can take it one step further, and cover the dual quality next along from a good personality. Total concentration under competition pressure. If you think your the only gunner with this problem, let me assure you that if you take note, you're not the only shooter with this problem. The shotgunner who has never experienced MATCH PRESSURE . . . has never been in line to win a match. The dividing line between winning and nearly winning can be so very thin in clay target shooting. Mostly it's due to one shooters ability to control his thinking, his mental discipline. Your champion shot, more than not is the guy with the very cool personality, who has mastered his ability to have total control over his emotions and ANXIETIES . . . going right on to perform within his capabilities. Notice, I highlighted anxieties. If you can't control your emotions . . . you stand little chance of going into the championship class. You will also find that emotional and physical upsets encountered under competitive stress have different effects on each and every one of us. A good coach if he is worth his salt . . . will

Yet it takes but a moment, but the memory of the giver lasts a long time. None is so rich or mighty that he can get along without it, and none is so poor, yet he or she can be made "rich" by it. A SMILE, creates happiness in the home, fosters good will in business and club, is also the countersign of friendship. It can bring rest to the weary, cheer to the DISCOURAGED, sunshine to the sad, and is to my way of thinking one of nature's best ANTIDOTES for trouble. Yet it cannot be bought, begged or borrowed, for it is something that is of no value to anyone until it is given away. Ever notice how some people are too tired to give you a SMILE. Give them one of yours, as none needs a SMILE so much as he who has no more to give.

Looking forward to being with you next month, and remember lets make 1983 a better year for all . . . and BE KIND TO EACH OTHER.


