

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Nationals month, in fact two lots of Nationals, as the Olympic Discipline Commonwealth and National Championships are also to be contested in Melbourne in APRIL.

The Commonwealth titles in Olympic Trap and I.S.U. Skeet will be conducted on Saturday April 23, and Sunday April 24, 100 targets each day. Should it not be possible to complete the Commonwealth match in two days, it will be completed on the afternoon of Anzac Day, Monday April 25. The National titles will then commence on Tuesday April 26, and are scheduled to be shot over three days.

The Trap Nationals in Adelaide will commence on Monday April 11. All will be in readiness for the big one and a good crowd is expected.

There is a change in the procedure for cartridge purchase this year, in that cartridges will be included in the cost of nominations for each event. Cartridges available will be Eley, Peters Blue Magic, Rottweil, Scorpio, Winchester AA, and Winchester Nickel plated. Prices will vary depending upon the brand selected.

The Annual General Meeting of the Association will be held on the evening of Wednesday April 13, and the Presentation Dinner at which major awards will be presented, will take place on Saturday April 16.

1983/84 National Training Squad and World Championships Team

Following problems that have arisen regarding Eliminations in certain States, the International Sub-Committee has reluctantly decided to disregard all scores from Eliminations in all States.

Problems arose in one State due to scores not being sent to the National Office, Eliminations not being advertised, floods in Queensland and South Australia prevented some shooters from attending Eliminations.

In order to be fair to all shooters, the International Sub-Committee has had to come to this decision.

The new guidelines for entry into the 1983/84 National Training Squad and the 1983 World Championships Team are as follows:

- Scores over the 400 targets of the 1983 Commonwealth and National Championships in both Olympic Trap and I.S.U. Skeet will be the sole basis for selection of the 1985/84 Squad and World Championship Teams.
- Selection will be on a first past the post basis. If three shooters in each descipline are required for the World team, the first three high scorers in each discipline over the 400 targets will make up the team.
- There are no exceptions to this rule. Recipients of National Athlete Awards will have to finish in the top three to make the team.

The International Sub-Committee regrets that shooters have been forced to compete in Eliminations which are now dis-regarded, but under the circumstances feel that in fairness to all, no other choice was left.

TROUBLE SHOOTING WITH GEORGE BIGGS

Straight Aways and Right Swingers

It matters not whether one is a brilliant shot or not so brilliant, the facts are that we are only human, and from time to time we simply hit a rough patch in our shooting performance wherein it becomes impossible to put a good score together. Usually it's a particular angle of target that starts to worry the shooter. Possibly, more than any other, it's a straight away, sometimes it's the right swinger from lane 5.

In no time at all the shooter finds he is missing it more and more. Finally this target becomes a real monster, to a point where, due to his mental condition, the target is actually lost before he even shoots at it. At this stage he must get help from someone who is qualified to give the right advice. What he really needs is someone to tell him what he must do in order to start breaking these problem targets again. A good coach, by watching him shoot, will be able to see where he has strayed from the simple basics of shooting clay targets.

When the experienced shooter suddenly begins to have trouble with a particular target he simply must go back to the basics and analyze his shooting style. He should firstly check his stance and body position to be certain it has not altered without him being aware of it. If he is missing right or left swingers from lanes one and five, poor stance can be the cause. By restricting body and gun swing, right angle targets are always the enemy of the right hand shooter and vice versa for left handers.

I believe that a right angle target from lane 5 for the right hand shooter is possibly the most difficult of all lanes. Likewise the left angle from lane one for left handers.

These targets are only difficult because the shooter has forgotten the basic procedures necessary for breaking them. The important basic principals of shooting left and right swingers are — see the target as it leaves the trap; swing with it on line, lead, fire and follow through.



 A bad gun mounting position shown in this drawing will cause numerous problems such as — low shooting on straight aways due to the eye being positioned too low on rib.
 The shooter will tend to lift head and face off the stock in order to see more of his targets. Result will be a miss by shooting over. A low gun position can also cause painful bruising of ones cheek.



Poorly fitting guns are the cause of a lot of low performance scoring. I would strongly advise every shooter to have his gun checked for correct fit by a person qualified to advise on the subject. I have a saying which I often repeat, especially to beginner shooters, it goes like this — "in order to shoot the target it is necessary to point the gun exactly where your eye is looking and if your gun is not a good fit this is not consistently possible, and so hitting targets will be difficult." In other words, if your gun does not fit you properly and you have not learnt to mount and point it correctly, you will never become a really good shot.

Straight Aways, especially from lane 3.


Timing is an important factor with this target. A very common reason for missing the straight away, concerns the new shooter who will, naturally enough (unless he is instructed otherwise), move his gun swing to the target much too slowly, he then only reaches the target after it has commenced to descend, and so his shot pattern will go above the target, resulting in a miss.

I always like to demonstrate to the beginner, or any shooter in fact, should his swing up to the target be too slow, by shooting it in a fast and smooth manner with trigger let off at the correct moment before it has reached top flight. Actually, I believe that if every shooter were to look on a straight away as an easy shot and shoot it without hesitation, he would be much more successful. By this I don't mean that we should

snap shoot. There is a vast difference between fast smooth shooting and snap shooting. The latter being a very inaccurate hit and miss style, with a tendency to shoot under.

I have known some shooters to resort to snap shooting, as a last resort, after having failed to overcome the problem of missing a straight away. They finish up from bad to worse until sooner or later someone helps with the problem and they get back into form. Other faults, like lifting one cheek off the stock as you swing up to it, will cause over shooting. A poorly fitting stock will cause this, due to it being too low to combe. Failure to read the correct angle of target travel as it leaves the trap is very often the reason for missing. When this happens the shooter simply does not see the target clearly enough as it is leaving the trap. The resulting shot is usually an inaccurate gun and target alignment. A missed target is the result.

The basic rule here is — look for and see the target within the first 6 to 8 feet of it leaving the trap. It is then much easier

Practice doing this every time you shoot at the target, it will also help build concentration

My advice to the shooter who has developed a problem with either a straight away or a right swinger from lane 5, is to give up trying to correct the fault while shooting competition. You will simply go from bad to worse. It is better to set the trap to throw the troublesome target and practice shooting




Dont' take my word for it, just spend some spare time and research past history, and I think you will see I'm quite correct.

Are we all too busy, in our race through daily life, not to be able to pause for a moment from our greedy indulgences, to make some small effort to honour and preserve our trap shooting history, and the members who made what we have today possible.



SAD BLOW TO SHOOTING

VALE: A GREAT AMBASSADOR & ADMINISTRATOR

It's Saturday morning 5th February, as I sip on a cup of coffee, the phone rings. Picking up the receiver I hear the tel tale trunk call "pips". It's my good friend in Perth, Shirley Hull; just as I'm about to become jovial... she WARNS: "I have some very sad news for you, JULIUS has died!"

"Oh my God!" I mutter, "I just spoke on the phone to him 3
days ago congratulating him on the development of HIS
GREAT DREAM (the International Shooting Complex). He
was elated because the Liberal Government had allocated a

grant for the project.

JULIUS STEINER, shooting sportsman, ambassador at large, who fiercely defended his adopted country, on the world shooting stage, had suffered a massive heart attack. The long hard fight, not only with bureaucracy but often with ("bone heads") small minded men, within our very own ranks, had finally taken it's toll! Shooting had lost one of it's RARE "PRINCE VALIANTS", a gentleman of the highest order and sportsman supreme.

The former tank commader, from Salzburg, Austria, had migrated to Western Australia approximately in 1946, a young man with a dream, he worked and strived and made that dream become a REALITY. He was in many ways more AUSTRALIAN, than many born on her soil. He was the epitome this country is today built on, and one of the many to migrate here and make Australia their home and nation.

JULIUS was one of the founding Fathers of International Shooting (I.S.U.) in Australia, and kept in touch with it when he travelled to it's birthplace EUROPE, each year. Many home grown shooters had their first taste of International shooting,

under the guiding hand of Julius.

Not all that long ago, while on an overseas trip, Julius was badly smashed up in a car accident. With his customary determination and willpower, he made a remarkable recovery. I don't think I can say I have ever seen "Julius Baby", (as many of us affectionately called him) without a smile on his face, such was the fantastic disposition of the man. He spent two days with me (in Sydney) on his way home from the Commonwealth Games in Brisbane, (see front cover C.T.S.N., December 1982, second row, first on the left) a very proud moment for Julius. International I.S.U. competition, had at long last arrived in Australia, and OUR boys, as Julius lovingly called them, had made their mark.

I suppose I can claim to understand Julius better than anyone, (if at all any understanding is needed). His dreams, his goals his effervescent nature; for we are both Saggittarians (which often helps if you get my drift) to have a similar affinity . . . gives you a better understanding - I hope.

Julius Steiner, was the most unselfish man I know and have ever met. I can't recall him saying a bad word about anyone. He was far too busy DOING GOOD, for not only the shooting sports of Western Australia, but the nation as a whole. Most shooters have their own particular little "trade-mark", for instance mine is smoking (cigars), anothers may be his special hat, take Jim Ellis for instance. For Julius, it was a drink of Houghton's White Burgandy wine. Whenever I knew Julius was coming my way, I always made sure I had a good supply on hand. Julius even took me over the HOUGHTON'S vineyards outside PERTH, W.A. on one of my visits to him. This writer hopes the Houghton people, consider bringing out a SPECIAL (JULIUS STEINER) white burgundy vintage this year, as a tribute to their greatest "promoter", and to one of the founding fathers of International shooting in this country.

Sometimes, someone has to pay an EXORBITANT price to uphold the majesty of their DREAMS and ASPIRATIONS, I think that Julius more than paid his dues. I'm sure the people connected with shooting in PERTH, will dedicate the shooting complex, the "JULIUS STEINER INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING GROUND" in his honour. Julius always insisted that Roger D., was to be invited to the opening ceremony, as his special guest. Some how it will not be quite the same without Julius being there in person, though I know he will be there in spirit. I'm more than sure the young brigade will press on where he left off. For me, I'll open a bottle of Houghton's White burgundy, raise my glass in a silent toast, to my old mate (I know that's the way J. S. would have wanted it).

SALUE' JULIUS . . . you have done us proud, dear friend: You may have left us, but shooting will not forget you.


NEW PRODUCTS

"SHOOTING SHORTS" Correspondent C.T.S.NEWS



Over the last few years gun makers have been falling over themselves with new innovations to help the shooter hit that flying target. Such wonders as adjustable ventilated ribs along gun barrels, until now we have the adjustable Reinhart trap stock. (This latest idea is derived from the English idea for measuring a clients gun fit). However, it is a different operation in most areas, as you can see by the photo's. This new stock is available at the moment for a number of guns. Mr Peter Bortolini, that well known trap shooter . . . come stock inventor, from Sydney . . . please note: While in America on a business trip, I noted they have the new stock made to fit a number of well known guns: These include the Beretta A 301; Browning BT .99 and Citori Models, Franchi 2000 series, Remington 1100 and 3200 and the Rottweil 72 and AAT models, plus the Perazzi Single and MX8 Shotguns. 

Stan Collins on 92, Reg Boyce on 91 and Norm Simms on 90 were still in with a chance of winning A grade.


Ian Latter on 88, was doing well in B grade, and Maree Polla-Mounter was leading C grade, also on 88.


It is a neat shooting complex featuring two traps, a universal trench layout and comfortable club rooms.


Saturday, February 19, 1983 Sunday, February 20, 1983

HANDICAPPING NATIONALS 1983

As I have once again been appointed Handicapper for the Nationals and because of the great change in handicapping formulas, I find it necessary to set down guide lines to make it easier for you - the shooter.


This year we have a new design handicap card which should make it a lot easier to keep your progressive scores on. Also each club should by now have an independent club handicapper, this again should make it easier for you and me when checking your cards at the Nationals. Because the new handicapping rules adjustment of cards could be a lengthy process, that is why the following will be strictly enforced:

- 1. All current 1983 handicap cards, regardless of your grade, along with your up to date 1982 card, will be required by me for checking before you nominate (pre Nationals and Nationals).
- 2. All handicap cards must be stamped by me before nominations will be accepted.
- 3. No nomination will be accepted if your handicap card is unavailable unless your grade handicap trap and skeet is confirmed by your club secretary on a statutory declaration form.
- 4. If a statutory declaration form is signed you will be allowed to shoot, but any trophies won will remain with the A.C.T.A. until your handicap and grade is verified by the Executive Committee.
- 5. Unless you are a new shooter or haven't shot for a long period and you present your handicap card not filled in or only with the club stamp and no score (event or targets shot) your handicap will be AA grade, AA or O skeet and 25 metres handicap (this is your responsibility, make sure club secretaries fill in your cards correctly.)
- 6. Any crossouts or errors on cards will not be acceptable.
- 7. If an error is made on your card have your club secretary neatly rule out the error, rewrite it in correctly, stamp and sign it.
- 8. Any obvious low score entered on handicap cards just prior to the nationals that enables a shooter to be down graded, will not be taken into consideration (Rule 106).
- 9. Please watch the handicap board. If your name appears on the board please report to me.
- 10. If you do not wish to be down graded or have your handicap meterage moved forward, please advise.
- 11. I will make myself available for advice on any handicapping problems you might have only on the days of the National Double Rise and the National Single Barrel, not when you nominate, as you can realise I will be too busy with the new adjustments.
- 12. Remember to fill in your cards at all times, i.e. all events other than those not applicable.


The most comfortable is with gun over your shoulder, barrels held by your hand. At this height other people can see your EQUIPMENT, and will not bump into it.


The big NO-NO, is barrels to the rear: This is not only foolish as you can poke people in the face (or eye) but also others may dent your guns barrels.

ANNUAL REPORTS BALANCE SHEET AND ACCOUNTS 31st DECEMBER, 1982

PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE 1983 ANNUAL MEETING



Several factors pertaining to the general operation and administration of our sport, has made 1982 a year of challenge, change and restructure. One most significant, was the formation of the Referee's Association. The benefits from this Association will be evident through 1983 with the implementation of new rules controlling our sport. The recommendations made by this Association may not necessarily be agreed to by all. However the existence of, and criteria governing this council will give greater opportunity for interested members of our Association; to be involved, and assist in altering and improving the rules that govern our sport.

The computer change has been made and 1983 will see your Association operating from its own in-house computer processing service. It is accepted, when fully operational, this will be of great assistance to our administration, as well as lowering excessive computer costs in our general operation that have been experienced in the past.

National Ground - In my previous report to you, I admitted this has been a somewhat disappointing project since the idea was first envisaged in 1979. I have personally made special effort to implement action within this area to assist your Executive in making a final decision. Because of the magnitude of this development and its expected enormous costs to your Association, it should be realized by all, for your Executive to make a decision, all avenues to such a project MUST BE FULLY INVESTIGATED BEFORE A BINDING COMMITMENT IS MADE. I believe, after encountering many delays beyond our control, a responsible decision will soon be reached.

Victoria, after the change in government is facing alterations to its existing legislation. A plus for shotgunners in this state is the fact that their State President and Executive member Bob Buchan, has been invited to sit on the consultative panel, set up by the Cain government to advise on such changes. In the interest of our sport, a heavy responsibility lies with all State Associations and Executive members alike, to keep well conversed on the various governments attitude, to existing firearms legislation within their own state, in case of any likely changes.

As can be seen by our financial statement, there has been a necessity to allocate funds to Victoria from our legislation Levy Reserve. The reserve, with guide lines laid down for its use, has a real purpose, and has already proved its value to clubs experiencing legislation problems.

Our involvement in the sport at International level, particularly World Championships, is a costly exercise. However I believe we should continue to be involved in this area. It should be realised, providing our competitors finish near the top, we gain Government recognition, by way of financial assistance to further develop our sport and our competitors at this level. The publicity received from the end results must also assist inrealising public awareness and acceptance of our sport in general. Shooters to be advantaged by the above are Terry Rumbel, Greg Long, Ian Hale and Alex Crikis. All are to be complimented on attaining recognition by the Federal Government as top International competitors by being accredited with Commonwealth Government Training Grants for 1983.

Our sport through our members participation carried many highlights through 1982. The results of the D.T.L. Team to Great Britain, with Executive Director, Ian Hill as Manager, was a proven venture and of great benefit to the development of our sport in Australia. Congratulations must also go to our 1982 Commonwealth Games Team and Peter Quire our National Coaching Director, who acted as Team Manager Coach. The teams combined performance at the Games was a credit to our sport. The individual and team success of our competitors at the 1982 World Championships in Caracas, Venezuela, with Peter Quire again at the helm, was yet another great achievement and worthy of the highest praise.

The 1982 National Championships were a disappointment in relation to shooter numbers. Attendance was well below expectations. This attributed to a lower than anticipated budgeted profit from the tournament, by some fourteen thousand dollars. The state of the economy no doubt had a bearing over the end results. All National Championships run by the Association should carry a reasonable profit margin to supplement the expenditure required to run our organization. Withstanding all this the gratitude of all is extended to the Queensland State Association and Brisbane Gun Club for their combined effort in organizing and hosting the National Titles. Those responsible for providing the grounds, the administration that conducted the tournament, are to be complimented on the effort.

As can be seen by our Financial Statement, our loss for 1982 is greater than that forecast in our budget. This can be attributed to an unexpected downturn in several areas of our income, namely, advertising in C.T.S.N., profit from 1982 Nationals and general trading, all created by, I believe, the general state of our economy.

To compound this further, coaching, overseas involvement and committee expenses were up on those projected in the 1982 budget. All this will be evident in the financial report. However I believe the year was one of action with constructive results to the benefit of our members.

In closing my report in what has proven to be a tough economic climate, I congratulate my Executive Colleagues for the way in which they have displayed a United National effort in administering, and further developing your Association during 1982.

ANNUAL REPORT 1982

The year has again been one of contrast, with great results internationally for our shooters, a marvellous Commonwealth Games, and the formation of the Referee's Association, as examples of the highlights.

On the low side is the financial result which reflects the deepening recession which overtook the whole country particularly during the latter half of 1982. This is reflected in the downturn in advertising revenue derived from the magazine,

particularly from commercial advertisers.

The profit from the National Championships was far less than expected and the costs involved in sending the team to the world championships in Venezuela were far in excess of budget, again adding to the shortfall. Other items of significant expenditure added to the budget during 1982 were the Referees Association and the conference of State Presidents and Secretaries. The Referees Association had the unenviable task of re-writing much of the rule book. A task that was approached with much thought and dedication. Time will, I'm sure, show that their work has done much to improve the rules for the benefit of all shooters. The successful State Presidents and Secretaries Conference held in Melbourne in September will also have long term benefits in the important area of State Association administration. Many things came out of that conference which are in various stages of development. One item alone which will be of great value to club, zone and state administrations, is the Administration Manual, a comprehensive document that will detail such things as the duties of club secretaries, through to how to organise the National Championships. I mention these things in the context of the financial results to illustrate that despite the sorry state of the economy, the Executive Committee intends to maintain the development of the Association.

Last year I wrote that with registration fees remaining the same for 1982, tighter housekeeping would have to operate. This has had to be balanced against the need to keep

developmental momentum going.

On the brighter side, the appointment of Peter Quire as National Coaching Director from January 1, 1982, recreated the momentum in the coaching area which had slowed during 1981 when we operated without a National Director of Coaching.

As is traditional this report addresses itself to specific areas of activity.

1. International Competition

Australian Shotgunners participated in seven international competitions during 1982.

1.1 International Skeet Teams Match

This was conducted during the National Championships in Brisbane. Competing countries were New Zealand and Australia, with Australia being successful by six targets. Representing Australia were Ray Melville, Geoff Salmon, Guy Beddington, John King and Kevin Perkins.

1.2 International Trap Teams Match

This event too was conducted during the Brisbane Nationals and attracted teams from New Zealand, Papua/New Guinea, New Caledonia, and Australia. Australia was represented by Larry Dimasi, Barry Kable, Don Wilson, Leon Gibson, and Stuart Browning, who were successful in beating New Zealand by three targets.

1.3 Glenn Cup

This match for D.T.L. Teams from New Zealand and Australia was conducted during the New Zealand Nationals and resulted in a win for New Zealand. Representing Australia were Bill Iles, John Whittakers, Kevin Longmore, Stephen Phillips, Peter Flack and Michael McVicar. The Executive Committee would like to express its appreciation of the assistance received from Air New Zealand for this team.

1.4 Mackintosh International Teams Match

For the first time in nine years Australia failed to win the Mackintosh trophy, finishing third to New Zealand and Canada. Scores were New Zealand 7366/7500, Canada 7359, Australia 7348.

1.5 Van Diemens Trophy

Four trap shooters were selected at the Brisbane Nationals to represent Australia in this new shoulder to shoulder team event, conducted as part of the Home Countries International series in Carlisle, Cumbria, U.K., in July. Dr Paul Cains had donated the Van Diemens Trophy for competition between England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and Australia each two years. Bill Iles, Larry Dimasi, Kevin Perkins and Pud Burgess won places in this team which aquitted itself very well in the competition. Scotland were the winners 1184/1200 points from Australia 1183/1200.

1.6 Commonwealth Games

Australia's Terry Rumbel, Jim Ellis, Ian Hale and Alex Crikis turned in a best ever performance in Commonwealth Games by winning a Gold, two Silver and one Bronze medal in the four shotgunning events. Coach Peter Quire is to be congratulated on the performance and his handling of the team in Brisbane.

1.7 43rd World Championships

The 1982 World Championships were held during November in Caracas, Venezuela. We sent a team of seven shooters under Manager/Coach Peter Quire. Performances were first class in both Olympic Trap and I.S.U. Skeet. Terry Rumbel shot-off for the Gold medal after tieing with five others on 197. Greg Long in his first attempt at the Worlds finished 14th with a very good 195. Australia finished 7th in the teams event. In Skeet both Ian Hale and Alex Crikis shot 195/200 to place equal 14th, a top performance. Such was the level of competition that three 199's shot off for the medals.

Again a very busy year internationally.

2. National Competition

The 1982 National Trap and Skeet Championships were conducted at Brisbane Gun Club in May. Attendances were well down on the previous year in Melbourne which did detract somewhat from the atmosphere that surrounds the biggest series on the shooting calendar. The stars were all there however, and fought hard for the titles. The Queensland Clay Target Association did an excellent job in organising these Championships. The Executive Committee thanks all trophy donors for their strong support.

Brisbane Gun Club was also the venue for the National

Olympic Discipline Championships in April.

3. Executive Committee

Mr R. C. Mules of South Australia retired from the Executive Committee in August, after serving for eighteen years. Others to retire were Mr Trevor Reschke (South Australia), Dr Paul Cains (Tasmania). Sitting at the Executive table for the first time in 1982 were Mr Leighton Martin and Mr Brian Growden of South Australia, and Mrs Kaye Woods of Tasmania. National Vice-President Mr Roy Holfreter of Western Australia, was awarded honorary life registration of the Association having served the Executive Committee for 10 years.

The Executive Committee met three times during 1982, at the National Championships in Brisbane in May, and during September and November in Melbourne. All members of the Executive are to be commended for their unselfish dedication to the development of the sport.

4. Government Grants

Grants totalling \$25,000 were received from the Sport Development Program for 1982.

(a) Administration Grant \$3,000

(b) National Coaching Director \$22,000

A further grant of \$10,125 was received for pre-Commonwealth Games training from the Government through the Australian Commonwealth Games Association and the Australian Shooting Association.

Management thanks the Minister responsible for Sport, the Hon. Tom McVeigh, and the Sport and Recreation Division officers in Canberra for their assistance during the year.

5. National Coaching Council

The seven State Directors of Coaching make up this Council under the Chairmanship of National Coaching Director Peter Quire. The Council met in Melbourne during November and made plans for activities in 1983. High on the list is Level 2 Accreditation for Coaches. Earlier in 1982 the Australian Coaching Council had accepted the Association's proposal for the running of Level 2 courses under the Government scheme. Peter Quire had prepared the Level 2 course which was accepted with minor amendments and additions.

The Executive Committee expresses its appreciation for the work done in the coaching area by State, Zone and Club Coaches in 1982.

6. Administration

In-house Micro Computer Equipment was installed in the National Office in the latter part of the year. All membership data is stored in this facility. The change to in-house equipment will give far greater flexibility in operations, and reduce operating costs very significantly.

Mr M. T. Hastie of the Finance Sub-Committee has again been of enormous assitance with advice and help with investment of Association funds.

7. Membership

The number of clubs affiliated during 1982 was 293, an increase of 11 over 1981.

Shooter registrations were marginally down on 1981, which again reflected the worsening economic situation. The high turnover in registered shooters from year to year again showed up, a factor that concerns me greatly. The question still has not been answered as to why shooters register for one or two years and then drop out. This is a serious problem which must be solved before any real gains in membership can be achieved.

8. State Associations

Per capita grants of \$9,560 were returned to State Associations during 1982. Most states are receiving assistance from Government to fund projects. South Australia now has a Secretary/Administrator thanks to the State Government. It is clear that State Associations are now more aware of what assistance is available from Government within the respective States.

9. National Training Squad

The second National Training Squad in the Olympic Disciplines was selected during 1982. The program for the squad included a training camp in Brisbane between the National and Commonwealth I.S.U. Championships, where the services of Mr Jeff Bond, a sports Psychologist from the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra, were used to help our squad members. Eliminations for the Commonwealth Games and World Championship Teams were conducted in Brisbane during June with all squad members again working with Jeff Bond. Much useful information was gained during these exercises, to help future preparation of teams for important competition.

10. Legislation

We had expected that new legislation would have been enacted in Victoria during the year. It is now planned to be introduced in the Autumn session of 1983.

The concept of the establishment of the Legislation Fighting Fund was very well received across Australia. Money from this fund was used during the year to combat unfair actions in two specific cases. The balance sheet gives details of money invested in this fund.

11. Promotion

National President Laurie Connors has again continued the tradition of extensive travel to most parts of Australia, promoting Association policy to as many Clubs and shooters as possible. He has visited Clubs in Western Australia, South Australia, Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland and Northern Territory during 1982.

12. Australian Shooting Association

The A.S.A. was beset by many difficulties during 1982, so progress has been slower than expected towards being fully representative of the shooting sports in Australia. A new constitution was adopted, and the Field and Game Federation of Australia was admitted to the A.S.A. as an affiliate.

The Association is represented on the A.S.A. Council by Mr R. F. Buchan (Vic), and the Executive Director.

13. National Headquarters

The feasibility study to be conducted using the Dubbo site for the collection of the necessary data, has been delayed due to the problems experienced by the A.C.T. Shooting Association in getting the study under way in Canberra. The results of the Canberra study would have saved much work and therefore money in the preparation of the A.C.T.A. study, so the whole matter is deadlocked at this time.




16. Summary

The principal activities of the Association are:-

To promote, develop and encourage the sport of Clay Target Shooting. During the year there was no significant change in those activities.

The Deficit for the year ended 31 December, 1982, was \$(66147). No provision for income tax was necessary.

An amount of \$7929 was transferred during the year to General Travel Fund Reserve and \$11084 was transferred from this reserve for funding the U.K. Trap Team. An amount of \$43900 was transferred during the year to Legislation Levy Reserve and \$6724 was transferred from this reserve for funding legislative matters.

With these exceptions and apart from the normal amounts set aside for depreciation and doubtful debts no other material transfers to or from reserves or provisions have been made during the financial year.

No shares or debentures were issued by the Association during the financial year.

The Memorandum of Association of the Association forbids the payment of a dividend to members.

The Executive Committee took reasonable steps before the Statement of Income and Expenditure and Statement of Assets and Liabilities were made out to ascertain what action had been taken in relation to the writing off of bad debts and the making of provisions for doubtful debts, and to cause all known bad debts to be written off and adequate provision to be made for doubtful debts.

At the date of this report, the Executive Committee is not aware of any circumstances which would render the amount written off for bad debts or the amount of provision for doubtful debts inadequate to any substantial extent.



NEWS

(a regular column produced by the Confederation of Australian Sport)

The sporting community has welcomed the appointment of John Brown as Minister for Sport, Recreation and Tourism in the Federal Government by the Prime Minister, Mr Hawke.

Mr Brown has been a strong supporter of many of the new initiatives promoted by sport. In fact, the Policy he formulated on Sport and Recreation nominates as its targets for achievement the aims of the Master Plan for Sport produced by the Confederation of Australian Sport in 1980.

An especially pleasing feature is the establishment of a separate Ministry for Sport, Recreation and Tourism. A similar department last existed under a Labor Government headed by Mr Gough Whitlam.

The other recommendations picked up from the Master Plan by Labor are shown below.

The Executive Director of the Confederation of Australian Sport, Mr Garry Daly said, "Despite the tight economic conditions that Australia is experiencing, sport must have the level of support proposed by the new Government because of the benefits to the community that arises from a fit, healthy, active and proud sporting nation. The creation of a Ministry for Sport, Recreation and Tourism is tangible evidence of the awareness of the Federal Government of the relevance of sport to Australians. The Confederation looks forward eagerly to consultations with Mr Brown on the programs and initiatives that will ensure Australian sportspeople continue to get the best possible encouragement.

"Sport in Schools is one of the major factors in the Confederation's range of activities, and great encouragement is taken from the Government policy recognition that the sports education program needs to be greatly improved."

The following is a summary of the major proposals listed in the Sport and Recreation Policy adopted by the Australian Labor Party.

- * That a ministry of sport, recreation and tourism be re-established.
- * That the National Institute of Sport is sufficiently funded to complete its armoury of proposed facilities and accommodation in order to properly service Australia's young and highly talented elite performers.
- * In conjunction with the Department of Education and State Governments, that sports education in schools throughout Australia be improved greatly by the provision of extra skilled staff and facilities. Particular emphasis will be placed on the teaching of swimming and water safety skills.
- An increased level of funding in the general sports grants area to enable the National Sporting Associations to adequately administer their sport.
- * Maintenance of the funds made available to the states on a dollar for dollar basis to provide competitive facilities of recognised international standard.
- * Funding on a dollar for dollar basis to local and state governments to enable the building of family leisure centres. Such centres will be built on or near existing school sites, but will be owned and managed by local government for the benefit of the whole community.
- * Sufficient funds are made available to enable more highlytalented Australian athletes to gain international experi-
- * That a national inquiry be instituted, aimed at assessing the community's present and future needs in the provision of passive outdoor recreation infrastructure.
- * The proper financial support of the proposed biennial Austraian games.
- * The formation of a National Sports Commission to oversee the provision of federal assistance to sport at every level.



One of Australia's greatest supporters of Clay Target shooting passed away on Tuesday February 1, 1983 at his home in Barcaldine. He was Robert Hamilton (Bill) Moyse aged 79.

Bill was a foundation member of the Barcaldine Gun Club and was its President for in excess of twenty five years until his retirement in 1978.

He was a life member of the Australian Clay Target Association, Q.C.T.A. and the Barcaldine Gun Club. He was on the A.C.T.A. Executive for many years and travelled extensively throughout the State and interstate to shoots.

He was responsible for initiating many young people to the sport of clay target shooting and under his guidance many a good shot has been produced.

Bill was a great sportsman, being actively engaged in cricket, tennis and golf and was a keen racing follower and horse breeder.

He was educated at the Southport School where he was in the 1st XV football 1920-21, 1st tennis 1921, athletics 1918-20, swimming 1919-21 when he was senior champion 1921, and was a member of two winning Head of the River crews in 1920-21. He saw service in Syria and New Guinea with the AIF's 2/25BN 7th Division.

He was an ex Shire Councillor and Patron of the Gun Club and Golf Club as well as being co-ordinator for the legacy appeal in Barcaldine for many years.

Although a batchelor he had close family ties and is survived by a brother Mick and three sisters Mrs Doris Wedgwood, Mrs Barbara Ferguson and Mrs Kit Willcocks.

He will be sadly missed in Barcaldine and will be remembered as a benefactor, a great sportsman and above all a gentleman.

Jack Collins, a patron of the Bairnsdale Club, died recently. Jack had been a great supporter of clay target shooting for over twenty years and had also greatly assisted Frankston/Australian and Melbourne Gun Clubs.

He will be missed by his many shooting friends.

It is with great sadness that my first correspondence with your organisation is to report the sudden death by heart failure of Julius Steiner on the 5th February, 1983 in Perth, Western Australia.

Following his unsuccessful attempt to hold the 1973 World Moving Target Championships in Perth (subsequently transferred to Melbourne) Jules has single-handedly waged a campaign to acquire a permanent shooting ground in W.A., where all ISU shooting disciplines could develop facilities of a standard suitable for the conducting of World and Olympic titles.

In late 1982 the state government granted some 240 hectares only 18 km north of the city centre. The tragedy of the whole event was that Jules collapsed and died only hours before the first set of transportable skeet houses were scheduled for installation on the new site. He planned the official opening of the I.S.U. shotgun section for Sunday the 6th February.

We can only trust that his dynamic personality and achievements in the face of a multitude of obstacles will inspire others to maintain the necessary impetus to advance the cause of I.S.U. shooting within Western Australia.

Practically the last official engagement was his participation as a jurist in the recent Commonwealth Games in Brisbane.

without the pressure of competition. You will need a packet of shells and a friend with some knowledge of shooting who will be able to see what you are doing or not doing.

Firstly, make sure it's not the gun or the way you mount it to the shoulder, check for proper eye and gun alignment, check eye position on rib. You should be able to see at least half the rib area between the two beads when cheek is snug on the comb. If the eye level is flat along the rib it will cause low shooting on all targets.

These days the trap gun with too high a stock is rare, but we will see a lot with too low a stock especially guns designed for skeet, field and simulated field shooting.
